

# CRAFTY INTENTIONS

Developed by Megan Lapp aka Crafty Intentions, this pattern is for a Sea Serpent!! It is recommended for Intermediate to Advanced skill level or above. A Sea Serpent from this pattern is 10 INCHES tall from top of head to bottom of foot, 25 INCHES long from nose to tail, and body is 3 INCHES wide. This pattern is written in U.S. terminology. Have fun!

Tail Fins (2): 46 yds  
Head Ornamentation Scales: 18 yds  
Back Scales: 16 yds  
Fin Ears (2): 13 yds  
Eyelids (2): 3 yds

G (4.0mm) Hook

24mm Safety Eyes

3 pieces of 18-inch 18-gauge paper wrapped stem wire, or alternative that is strong yet moldable

Darning Needle

Polyfil

## Glossary of Terms:

[Brackets]	Brackets [like this] are used to indicate that these stitches are BLO or FLO. Ex.: BLO [SC 6]
&	Located between two stitches, the & indicates that both stitches are made into the same stitch, as an increase – but with two different types of stitches.
< or >	Indicates the stitch will start (<) or finish (>) in the same stitch as the last stitch or the next stitch.
<Dec>	Beginning in the SAME stitch as your last stitch, make a decrease stitch into that and the next stitch, then into the same stitch that the decrease stitch ends in, begin your next stitch. 2 Dec in 3 SC	Make one decrease as normal, make the second decrease starting in the SAME stitch as the 1st decrease and in the next single crochet.
BLO [ ]	Back Loop Only  <b>**Pro-Tip:</b> The rows with FLO or BLO stitches will be structured with brackets [ ]. The brackets will enclose any and all stitches that the FLO or BLO instruction should apply to. EG: FLO [SC 3], SC 3 would mean three Single

FLO [ ]	Front Loop Only  <b>**Pro-Tip:</b> The rows with FLO or BLO stitches will be structured with brackets [ ]. The brackets will enclose any and all stitches that the FLO or BLO instruction should apply to. EG: FLO [SC 3], SC 3 would mean three Single crochet stitches in the FLO and then three normal SC
FP HDC	Front Post Half Double Crochet YO, insert hook from front to back to front around post of corresponding stitch below, YO, pull up, YO, pull through all remaining loops
Half Trip	Half Triple Crochet. YO twice, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through all remaining loops
Half Trip Dec	Half Triple Crochet Decrease. YO twice, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through all remaining loops
Half Trip Inc	Half Triple Crochet Increase.

	Two Half Trip stitches into the same stitch
HDC	Half Double Crochet. YO, insert hook into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through all three loops
HDC Dec	Half Double Crochet Decrease. YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through all four loops
HDC/DC Dec	YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through all three loops
HDC/SC Dec	YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, Insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through all three loops
Inc	Increase, 2 stitches in one space. Assume all increases are SC increases, unless otherwise specified
Invisible Triple SC Decrease	Invisible Triple Single Crochet Decrease, single crochet decrease across three stitches in the front loop only. Insert hook into the FLO of the first stitch, do not YO, Insert hook into the FLO of the second stitch, do not YO. Insert hook into the FLO of the third stitch, YO pull through three loops, YO pull through remaining loops
OC	Original Chain This refers to the very first set of Chain stitches you made to start the piece you're working on.
Picot	Ch 3, Sl St in the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Ch from Hook
SC	Single Crochet
SC/HDC Dec	Single Crochet/Half Double Crochet Decrease Insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, Pull through all remaining stitches
SC/HDC/DC Dec	Insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up,

	YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through all four loops

Sk St	Skip Stitch
Sl St	Slip Stitch
Sl St to beginning Stitch, Ch 1	JOINING: Most of this pattern is written with a Slip Stitch, Chain 1 joining method for each row. This DOES affect the shape of each piece, but in a minor way, as the piece was written with the seam shift in mind. If you prefer to crochet in spiral/in the round you are welcome to try it but I do not guarantee that all asymmetrical sections will come out exactly as shown. Triple Dec/ Triple SC Dec	Triple Decrease/Triple Single Crochet Decrease One stitch combining three spaces using single crochet. (Insert in next stitch space, YO, pull up) x 3, YO, pull through all four loops
Triple Crochet	YO twice, insert into next stitch, YO, pull up, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through 2 loops, YO, pull through all remaining loops
YO	Yarn Over

<p><b>**Note:</b> You will be adding a Spinal wire into the Body of the Sea Serpent. The wire will need to be long enough to extend from the tail tip to the nose of the sea serpent. You will need to insert it as you go. I recommend you use lengths of 18” paper-wrapped 18g (or 16g) stem wire. Err on the side of heavier, stiffer wire for better pose-ability. You can start inserting the wire as early or late as you want, but I recommend starting no later than about Row 100. The wire should be oriented at the back of the serpent body, where the spine would be. This is opposite the short rows building up the chest beginning in row 99.</p> <p><b>**Pro-Tip:</b> When you first insert the wire, bend the wire over itself by several inches so that the wire inserted into the tail tip is bent over on itself. This will help to prevent the wire from poking out the end of the tail tip.</p> <p><b>**Pro-Tip:</b> If you do not have a wire long enough to extend the full length of the Sea Serpent body, you will need to use multiple wires and attach them together end to end, overlapping them by at least 4-5 inches. Secure the wires together using your preferred method; I recommend wrapping the wires together with thin strips of duct tape.</p> <p><b>**Note:</b> From here on, you should stuff the Body as you go. The tail tip to about this point does not need to be stuffed (if you stuff it at all, do it very lightly, you do not want to change the shape of the crochet work with the stuffing). Stuff the tail as you go from here medium-firmly until you get to about Row 100. From there you want the Body to be firmly stuffed, but also do not warp the shaping of the crochet work. You will also need to balance stuffing the body with polyfil with keeping the wire in place.</p>

<p><b>**Note: Starting in Row 99 and onward, you will follow every part of every row to create short rows of built up stitches. For more on this technique, please see this YouTube video: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sh5T-idiwm8&amp;t=3s">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sh5T-idiwm8&amp;t=3s</a></b></p> <p><b>You will sometimes work beyond your starting stitch. Work only into the tops of the stitches, not into the sides of stitches. Each sub-row (i.e. 99A., 99B., 99C., etc.) will have its own italicized stitch count in the column just to the left of the official stitch count row. This sub-row stitch count will tell you exactly how many stitches you made in the sub-row (The stitch count for Sub-Row 99A. is <i>[10]</i>).</b></p> <p><b>The final stitch count in the official stitch count row will tell you how many stitches are available around the “top” edge of the work when all of the row (and all short rows) are complete. (The official stitch count for Row 99 is [24]).</b></p>

# Sea Serpent Head

## Tools:

- Body color yarn
- 'G' (4 mm) hook
- 24mm safety eyes

Make 1

	<p><b>**Pro-tip:</b> If you are using a gradient or color-change yarn and would like the body of the Sea Serpent to seamlessly transition between colors from nose to tail tip, use the following instructions. First, starting with the yarn you just cut to fasten off the Sea Serpent body, measure out 15 yards of yarn (DO NOT CUT), and then begin crocheting the head at that point in the length, and use it up to the end of the yarn. This may be a little unwieldy to start crocheting from the middle of a piece of yarn, and crochet using the “tail” up, but it guarantees that you work your way back along the yarn color gradient to the color that the Sea Serpent body ended with at the neck.</p> <p>The 15 yards of yarn is an approximate measure of yarn and may be affected by weight of yarn, size of hook, and your particular tension. You may need to adjust this to be slightly longer or shorter as necessary to blend in the color transition; this is why you do not cut the yarn to start. You need to verify that the 15 yards is enough to make the head by your hand. You do not need to allow for a long tail if the tail of the neck of the Sea Serpent body is long enough to sew the Sea Serpent head to the body.</p>	Stitch count



2.	Pin the Webbed Feet to the bottom of the feet (see photos). Sew in place along each of the four claws, weave in ends.
3.	Pin the Legs in place (see photos). Sew in place, weave in ends. The upper part of the leg should barely be stuffed, and you should stretch it and press it closely to the body of the Sea Serpent. See the pinning and sewing videos on YouTube for guidance. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EXcIcw2viO4">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EXcIcw2viO4</a>
4.	Pin the Eyelids in place (see photos), sew in place, weave in ends.
5.	Pin the Back Scales in place, sew to attach, weave in ends.
6.	Pin the Tail fins in place and sew to attach.
7.	Pin the small side fins in place at about mid-tail. Sew to attach, weave in ends.
8.	Pin the middle side fins in place at about where the rear legs would be if the sea Serpent had rear legs. Sew to attach, weave in ends.
9.	Pin to attach the front leg fins. Sew to attach, weave in ends.
10.	Pin to attach the head fin ornamentation, sew to attach, weave in ends.
11.	Pin the ear fins in place; sew to attach, weave in ends.
