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Cowls



NORTHERN LIGHTS COWL

This cowl is made extra-long in a repeating textured pattern so you can pull it up over your ears on chilly days.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size small; changes for medium are in [].

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

13 inches wide x 14 inches long (*small*) [14¼ inches wide x 15½ inches long (*medium*)]

MATERIALS

- Knit Picks Gloss Fingering Yarn super fine (fingering) weight merino wool/silk yarn (1¾ oz/220 yds/50g per hank): 4 [5] hanks #25015 robot
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

In pattern: 10 dc = 2 inches; 8 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

COWL

Rnd 1: Ch 139 [145], being careful not to twist ch, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each ch around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (139 [145] dc)

Rnds 2–5: Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), [fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, bpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnds 6–8: Ch 2, [fpdc around next 3 sts, bpdc around next 3 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnds 9–11: Ch 2, [bpdc around next 3 sts, fpdc around next 3 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnds 12–53 [12–59]: [Rep rnds 6–11] 7 [8] times.

Rnds 54–58 [60–64]: Ch 2, [fpdc around next st, bpdc around next st] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. At end of last rnd, fasten off. 



STAR STITCH COWL

You will get loads of practice working the star stitch for this cowl, so choose a fun color-changing yarn to help keep your interest. A unique stitch pattern adds texture to this lace scarf, a perfect lightweight accessory.



SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

9 inches wide x 49½ inches in circumference

MATERIALS

- Crystal Palace Yarns Mochi Plus medium (worsted) weight merino wool/nylon yarn (1¾ oz/95 yds/50g per ball):
3 balls #555 tapestry rainbow
- Size M/N/13/9mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

5 stars = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Piece is worked back and forth and sewn together.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

COWL

Row 1 (RS): Ch 129, pull up lp in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 chs (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1 (makes hole above st, beg star completed), [insert hook in hole, yo, pull up lp, insert hook through the last of the 6 sts, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in same ch as last worked in, yo, pull up lp, pull up lps in each of next 2 chs (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1 (star completed)] across to last ch, hdc in last ch, turn. (62 stars)

Row 2 (WS): Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), 2 hdc in each hole above each star across, ending with hdc in turning ch, turn. (126 hdc)

Row 3: Ch 3, pull up lps in 2nd and 3rd chs from hook, pull up lps in first 3 hdc (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1, [insert hook in hole, yo, pull up lp, insert hook through last st of last star, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in last worked st, yo, pull up lp, pull lps in next 2 hdc (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1] across, hdc in last st, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 9 inches, ending with row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew ends of rows tog. **CW**

MAN'S DICKEY

Even men get chilly in the winter months. Help them stay warm with this simple neck warmer.



SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given for men's size small; changes for medium and large are in [].

FINISHED MEASUREMENT

Neck: 22 inches (*small*) [24 inches (*medium*), 26 inches (*large*)]

MATERIALS

- Caron Simply Soft Heather medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (5 oz/250 yds/142g per skein):
1 skein #9502 truffle heather
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

14 sc = 4 inches; 18 sc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Work all sections separately and then sew together. Front contains some neck shaping for a more comfortable fit.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-1 at beginning of row or round doesn't count as a stitch.

SPECIAL STITCH

Single crochet join (sc join): Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

DICKEY

BACK

Row 1: Ch 50 [57, 65], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (49 [56, 64] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1 (*see Pattern Notes*), sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 10 [11, 12] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

FRONT

Row 1: Ch 50 [57, 65], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (49 [56, 64] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 7 [8, 9] inches from beg.

FIRST NECK SHAPING

Next row: Ch 1, sc in first 14 [15, 17] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Next row: Ch 1, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sts, sc in each st across, turn. (13 [14, 16] sc)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last 2 rows twice. (11 [12, 14] sc at end of last row)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last row until piece measures same as Back. At end of last row, fasten off.

2ND NECK SHAPING

Next row: Sk center 21 [26, 30] sts from First Neck Shaping, **sc join** (*see Special Stitch*) in next st, sc in each st across, turn. (14, 15, 17) sc

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across with sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (13 [14, 16] sc)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last 2 rows twice. (11 [12, 14] sc at end of last row)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last row until piece measures same as Back. At end of last row, fasten off.

TURTLENECK

Row 1: Ch 27 [29, 31], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (26 [28, 30] sc)

Row 2: Working in **back lps** (*see Stitch Guide*), ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last row until piece measures 22 [24, 26] inches, slightly stretched.

Next row: Holding last row and first row tog, working through both thicknesses, ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.

Sew Turtleneck in neck opening on Front and Back.

EDGING

Rnd 1: With RS facing, sc join in Back left corner, evenly sp sc around entire outer edge with 3 sc in each corner, join with sl st in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each st around, with 3 sc in each corner center st, join with sl st in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**



COLD WIND DICKEY

This cowl is fun to stitch with its color-changing yarn, shifting stitch patterns, floral adornments and interesting shape.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

28 inches long x 29 inches in circumference

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Boutique Unforgettable medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/269 yds/100g per ball): 3 balls #3977 sunrise
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch markers
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

In pattern: 5 3-dc cl = 4 inches;
10 rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet, chain-1, unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

3-double crochet cluster (3-dc cl):

Keeping last lp of each dc on hook, work 3 dc all in same ch-1 sp, yo and draw through 4 lps on hook.

PATTERN STITCHES

Main pattern

Row 1 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in first hdc, *ch 1, **3-dc cl** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * to last ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3-dc cl in last ch-1 sp, ch 1, 2 dc in last st, turn. (10 3-dc cls, 2 dc each side)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), *(hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, hdc in last st, turn.

Increase rows

Row 3 (inc): Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), *3-dc cl in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * to last ch-1 sp, 3-dc cl in last sp, ch 1, dc in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Row 4 (inc): Ch 2, hdc in first dc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in first ch-1 sp (before first 3-dc cl), *(hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in last ch-1 sp (in 4th ch from previous row), 2 hdc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Even rows

Row 3 (even): Ch 3, *3-dc cl in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * to last ch-1 sp, 3-dc cl in last sp, dc in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Row 4 (even): Ch 2, hdc in first dc, sk first 3-dc cl, *(hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, sk last 3-dc cl, 2 hdc in last dc, turn.

Decrease rows

Row 3 (dec): Ch 3, *3-dc cl in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * to last ch-1 sp, 3-dc cl in last sp, dc in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Row 4 (dec): Ch 2, sk first 3-dc cl, hdc in first ch-1 sp, *(hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across to ch-1 sp before last 3-dc cl, hdc in last ch-1 sp, sk last 3-dc cl, hdc in last dc, turn.

DICKEY

FRONT & BACK

Make 2.

Ch 25 loosely.

Row 1 (WS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn. (24 sc)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2, hdc in first sc, *sk next sc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next sc, rep from * to last 2 sc, sk next sc, 2 hdc in last sc, turn.

Rows 4–23: Work in **main pattern** (see *Pattern Stitches*) [rows 1–4 with **increase rows** (see *Pattern Stitches*) 3 and 4] 5 times.

Place a marker each side to mark top of split.

Rows 24–31: Work in main pattern [rows 1–4 with **even rows** (see *Pattern Stitches*) 3 and 4] 2 times.

Rows 32–39: Work in main pattern [rows 1–4 with **decrease rows** (see *Pattern Stitches*) 3 and 4] 2 times.

Work in main pattern [rows 1–4 with even rows 3 and 4] until piece measures approximately 28 inches. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Seam tog sides from markers to top edge.

EDGING

Row 1: With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in any bottom corner to work up edge of split, ch 3, work dc evenly up along the side to top of split and down along other side to corner on first row of the other panel, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each dc across. Fasten off.

Rep rows 1–3 along the sides of the split opening on the other side.

FLOWER

Make 2.

Row 1: Leaving an 8-inch tail, ch 20, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn. (19 sc)



Row 2: Ch 2, *sk next sc, 5 dc in next sc, rep from * 5 times, **sk next sc, 6 tr in next sc, rep from ** 4 times, ch 3, sl st in last sc on row. Fasten off, leaving an 8-inch tail.

Roll strip as a spiral into a Flower with dc section in the center.

Tie tog the 2 tails in the back of Flower, and use tails to attach Flower to Cowl. [CW](#)

GOLDEN SPARKLE COWL

Take the chill away on cool evenings with this easy-to-stitch design.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Top: Approximately 30 inches in circumference

Bottom: Approximately 34 inches in circumference

Length: Approximately 26 inches

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Hopsotch medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (4 oz/210 yds/113g per skein): 3 skeins #7950 scooter
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

4 hdc = 1 inch; 3 V-st rnds = approximately 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round does not count as a stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as a double crochet and chain-2 space unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as a double crochet and chain-1 space unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning V-stitch (beg V-st): Ch 5 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in indicated st or sp.

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 2, dc) in indicated st or sp.

Beginning decrease V-stitch (beg dec V-st): Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in indicated sp.

Decrease V-stitch (dec V-st): (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated sp.

COWL

Rnd 1: Beg at bottom edge, ch 120, being careful not to twist ch, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each ch around, join in top of ch-2. (120 hdc)

Rnd 2: **Beg V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in same st, sk next 2 hdc, (**V-st**—see *Special Stitches* in next hdc, sk next 2 hdc) around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (40 V-sts)

Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-2 sp of first V-st, beg V-st in same sp, V-st in ch-2 sp of each V-st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.


Rnds 4–27: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 28: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, **beg dec V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sp, **dec V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-2 sp of each rem V-st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (40 dec V-sts)

Rnd 29: Sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg dec V-st in same sp, dec V-st in ch-1 sp of each rem dec V-st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4.

Rnds 30–37: Rep rnd 29.

Rnd 38: Sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 2 (counts as a hdc), hdc in same sp, 2 hdc in ch-1 sp of each dec V-st around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off. (80 hdc)



FAIR ISLE COWL

This extra-wide cowl made with bulky yarn will keep you warm and cozy, and the fair isle crochet looks amazing.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

13½ inches wide x 34 inches in circumference

MATERIALS

- Universal Yarn Deluxe Chunky bulky (chunky) weight wool yarn (3½ oz/120 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein each #3711 madder red, #1900 ebony and #91879 natural
- Universal Yarn Classic Chunky bulky (chunky) weight yarn (3½ oz/131 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #60726 ocean wave
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

16 sc = 5½ inches; 9½ sc rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Cowl is worked in continuous rounds. Do not join unless specified; mark beginning of rounds.

Leave a 6-inch end when fastening off yarn.

Each round is worked carrying unused color across wrong side. Solid color rounds have a 2nd strand of same color carried on wrong side.

If you are right-handed, read every row of chart from right to left.


If you are left-handed, read every row of chart from left to right.

COWL

Rnd 1: With madder red, ch 96 loosely, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, **carrying a strand of bittersweet on WS** (see *Pattern Notes*) and working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each ch across. **Do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*). (96 sc)

Note: Place stitch marker in first st of rnd, moving up as work progresses. For following rnds, follow **chart** (see Chart) for color changes and work in back lps.

Rnds 2–31: Ch 1, sc in each sc around. At end of last rnd, fasten off. **CW**

BAVARIAN COWL

This cowl is a fun way to play with a stitch you might not be too familiar with while you experiment with color combinations.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

14 inches wide x 42 inches in circumference

MATERIALS

- Filatura Di Crosa Charly bulky (chunky) weight wool yarn (1¾ oz/71 yds/50g per ball):
3 balls each #1162 sand (A), #1669 taupe heather (B) and #1683 chestnut heather (C)
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

1½ shells = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Shell: (4 tr, ch 1, 4 tr) in place indicated.

8-back post treble decrease (8-bptr dec): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, **bptr** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next 4 sts, sk sc between shells and working on next shell, bptr around next 4 sts, yo and draw through all lps on hook.

Single crochet join (sc join): Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

COWL

Rnd 1: With A, ch 128, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, ch 1, sc in same ch as joining, sk next 3 chs, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, sk next 3 chs, sc

in next ch, [sc in next ch, sk next 3 chs, shell in next ch, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch] 15 times, join in first sc. Fasten off. (16 shells, 32 sc)

Rnd 2: Sc join B in any ch-1 sp, ch 5, **8-bptr dec** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 5, [sc in ch-1 sp of next shell, ch 5, 8-bptr dec, ch 5] 14 times, join in first sc. (16 8-bptr dec, 16 sc, 32 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, shell in the top of next 8-bptr dec, [sc in next sc, shell in the top of next 8-bptr dec] 15 times, join in first sc. Fasten off. (16 shells, 16 sc)

Rnds 4 & 5: With C, rep rnds 2 and 3.

Rnds 6 & 7: With A, rep rnds 2 and 3.

Rnds 8 & 9: With B, rep rnds 2 and 3.

Rnds 10–15: Rep rnds 4–9.

Rnds 16–18: Rep rnds 4–6. At end of rnd 18, fasten off. 

SCATTERED PIXELS COWL

Learn the ins and outs of corner-to-corner crochet while creating a beautifully patterned cowl.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

7 inches wide x 30¾ inches long

MATERIALS

- Cascade Yarns Cherub DK light (DK) weight nylon/acrylic yarn (1¾ oz/180 yds/50g per skein):
 - 2 skeins #17 grey (MC)
 - 1 skein #33 peacock (CC)
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Bobbins (optional)
- Tapestry needle
- 1⅞-inch black button: 3
- Sewing needle and coordinating thread



GAUGE

6 pattern rows = 4-inch radius from start

PATTERN NOTES

Pattern is written with basic stitch instructions. Refer to the graph as needed to complete the cowl.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Skipped 2 chains at beginning of row counts as a chain-2 space unless otherwise stated.

Work all color changes when you slip stitch into the chain-2 space of a new block.

Work all color changes on the wrong side of the cowl.

When working color changes on odd-numbered rows, slip stitch into the chain-2 space from the back side.

When ending all decrease rows, work the slip stitch into the last chain-2 space from the back side.

The last increase row is the longest diagonal row shown on the graph.

Carry or float Main Color.

If using small bobbins of contrasting color for sections marked on the bobbin graph. For Bobbin A, make 12 with 24-inch lengths of peacock and for Bobbin B, make 9 with 84-inch lengths of peacock.

SPECIAL STITCH


Single crochet join (sc join): Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

COWL

Note: Rows 1–16 are inc rows. Starting with row 2, each row will be increased by 1 block.

Row 1 (WS): Using CC as shown on graph, ch 5, working into **back bar of chs** (see illustration), dc in **3rd ch from hook** (see Pattern Notes), dc in next 2 chs. (1 block)





Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (RS): Ch 5, turn, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 2 chs, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp. (2 blocks)

Row 3: Ch 5, turn, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 2 chs, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in each ch-2 sp across. (3 blocks)

Rows 4–16: Rep row 3, following graph for **color changes** (see *Pattern Notes*). (16 blocks at end of last row)

Note: On rows 17–36, the number of blocks rem the same on each row.

Row 17: Ch 5, turn, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 2 chs, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in each ch-2 sp across to last ch-2 sp, sl st in last ch-2 sp, turn. (16 blocks)

Row 18: Sl st in each dc across to next ch-2 sp, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in each rem ch-2 sp across, turn. (16 blocks)

Rows 19–58: [Rep rows 17 and 18] 20 times.

Row 59: Rep row 17.

Note: Rows 60–73 are decrease rows. One block will be decreased on each row until there are 2 blocks left on row 73.

Row 60: Sl st in each dc across to next ch-2 sp, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in each rem ch-2 sp across to last ch-2 sp, **sl st in last ch-2 sp** (see *Pattern Notes*), turn. (15 blocks)

Rows 61–73: Rep row 60. (2 blocks at end of last row)

Row 74: Sl st in each dc across to next ch-2 sp, (sl st, ch 2, 3 dc) in ch-2 sp, sl st in last ch-2 sp. Fasten off. (1 block)

BUTTON EDGE

Hold cowl with RS facing and short edge to right.

Row 1 (RS): Using MC, **sc join** (see *Special Stitch*) in first horizontal dc on right-hand short edge, sc in same st, sc in bottom of next vertical dc, work 2 sc into side of each rem horizontal dc and 1 sc into rem bottom of each vertical dc across, turn. (40 sts)



Cowls

Row 2: Ch 1, sl st in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st across, turn.

Rows 4–9: [Rep rows 2 and 3] 3 times. At end of last row, fasten off.

BUTTONHOLE EDGE

Hold cowl with RS facing and unworked short edge to left.

Row 1 (RS): Using MC, sc join in st on far right of short edge, work 1 sc into top of each vertical dc and 2 sc into each ch-2 sp across, turn. (40 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sl st in back lp of each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st across, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3.


Row 6: Ch 1, sl st in back lp of next 4 sts, *ch 4 (*buttonhole made*), sk next 4 sts, sl st in back lp of next 10 sts*, rep from * to *, ch 4, sk next 4 sts, sl st in back lp of each rem st across, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st and ch across, turn.






- King Cole Baby Alpaca DK light (DK) weight baby alpaca yarn (1¾ oz/110 yds/50g per ball):
1 ball each #503 charcoal (A), #501 fawn (B) and #1788 sunset (C)
- Size 1/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Locking stitch marker
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

In tapestry pattern: 16 sc = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Move marker up as each round progresses.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

A chart is provided for those preferring to work pattern stitch from a chart. Refer to chart as needed.

When referring to chart, change color to next color in chart in last pull through on previous stitch. Work around the strand of color not in use.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning cluster (beg cl): Ch 3, sk next st, dc in next st.

Cluster (cl): Holding last lp of each dc on hook, dc in next st, sk next st, dc in next st, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook.

COWL

With A, ch 88, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in **front lp** (see Stitch Guide) of each ch around to last ch, continue working dc in **back lp** (see Stitch Guide) of each ch around, join in top of beg ch-3. (176 dc)

Rnd 2: Beg cl (see Special Stitches), ch 3, sk next dc, [cl (see Special Stitches) in next 3 dc, ch 3, sk next dc] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (44 cls, 44 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: Sl st in first ch of next ch-3 sp, beg cl in first and 3rd ch of same ch-3 sp, ch 3, [cl in first and 3rd ch in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join in top of first cl.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, 4 dc in next 2 ch-3 sps, [5 dc in next sp, 4 dc in next sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (198 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in back lp of same st as beg ch-1, **place marker** (see Pattern Notes) in sc made to mark beg of rnd, sc in back lp of each dc around, join in first sc.

TAPESTRY BORDER

Note: Start each rnd working into back lp of same st as first ch and working in back lps of each sc around.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, [with A, sc in first/next 5 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with A, sc in next 5 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with A, sc in next 3 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with A, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, [with A, sc in first/next 4 sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with A, sc in next 4 sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; with A, sc in next 2 sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; with A, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, [with A, sc in first/next 5 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with A, sc in next 3 sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; {with A, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next sc} twice, with A, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, [with A, sc in first/next 2 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with A, sc in next 7 sc;



with B, sc in next 3 sc; with A, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with A, sc in next sc] around, join in first sc changing to C.

Rnd 10: Ch 1, [with C, sc in first/next sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with C, sc in next 9 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc in next 4 sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 11: Ch 1, [with C, sc in first/next 2 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc in next 7 sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with C, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with C, sc in next sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 12: Ch 1, [with C, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc

in next 2 sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; {with C, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next sc with B} twice; with C, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc. (209 sc)

Rnd 13: Ch 1, [with C, sc in next 6 sc; with B, sc in next 3 sc; with C, sc in next 3 sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; with C, sc in next sc; with B, sc in next 2 sc; with C, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc.

Rnd 14: Ch 1, [with C, sc in next 7 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc in next 3 sc; with B, sc in next sc; with C, sc in next 2 sc] around, join in first sc. (220 sc)


Rnd 15: Ch 1, sc in back lp of same st as first ch and in back lp of each sc around, join in first sc.

Rnd 16: Ch 1, sc through both lps of same st as first ch and through both lps of each sc around, join in first sc, changing color to B.

Rnd 17: Ch 3, dc in each sc around, join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnds 18 & 19: Ch 3, [fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next 2 dc, bpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next 2 dc] around to last 3 dc, fpdc around next 2 dc, bpdc around last dc, join in top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off. **CW**

Rnds 3–23: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first st. Do not turn. At end of rnd 23, fasten off. Push all bobbles to RS.





COWL

With A ch 66, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch.

Rnd 1: 1 sc in each ch around, join in first sc. (66 sc)

Note: Work all following rnds in **back lps only** (see *Stitch Guide*).

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each sc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B by drawing lp through.

Rnd 3: [With B, sc in first/next st; with C, sc in next st] around, changing to A in last pull through. **Do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*).

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around, join in first sc at beg of rnd.

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in each sc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, change to C by drawing lp through.

Rnd 6: Sc in each st around, changing to D in last pull through.

Rnd 7: Sc in each st around, changing to C in last pull through.

Rnds 8–11: [Rep rnds 6 and 7] twice.

Rnds 12 & 13: Sc in each st around, changing to B in last pull through on last rnd.

Rnd 14: [With B, sc in first/next st; with A, sc in next 2 sts] around, changing to A in last pull through.

Rnd 15: [With A, sc in first/next 2 sts; with B, sc in next st] around, changing to A in last pull through.

Rnd 16: With A, sc in first st; [with B, sc in next st; with A, sc in next 2 sts] around to last 2 sts, with B, sc in next st; with A, sc in next st, changing to B in last pull through.

Rnd 17: [With B, sc in first/next st; with A, sc in next 2 sts] around, changing to A in last pull through.

Rnds 18 & 19: Rep rnds 15 and 16, changing to B in last pull through on last rnd.

Rnd 20: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc.

Rnd 21: Ch 3, dc in each sc around, join in 3rd ch at beg ch-3.

Rnd 22: Ch 1, sc in each st around, changing to C in last st, join in first sc at beg of rnd.

Rnd 23: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc at beg of rnd.

Rnd 24: [{With C, sc in first/next 2 sts; with D, sc in next st}] 3 times, with C, sc in next 2 sts] around.

Rnd 25: [With C, sc in first/next st; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; {with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next st}] twice, with C, sc in next st; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next st] around, changing to D in last pull through.

Rnd 26: [With D, sc in first/next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 3 sts; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with D, sc in next st] around, changing to C in last pull through.

Rnd 27: [With C, sc in first/next 2 sts; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 5 sts; with D, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts] around, changing to D in last pull through.

Rnd 28: Rep rnd 26.

Rnd 29: Rep rnd 25.

Rnd 30: Rep rnd 24.

Rnd 31: Ch 1, sc in each st around, changing to B in last pull through.

Rnd 32: Ch 1, sc in each st around.

Rnds 33 & 34: [With B, sc in first/next sc; with C, sc in next sc] around, changing to C in last st of last rnd, join in first sc at beg of rnd.

Rnd 35: Ch 3, dc in each sc around, join in 3rd ch at beg of rnd, change to A by drawing lp through.

Rep rnds 1–35 until piece measures approximately 60 inches.

3 skeins #9890 gray
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Square = 2½ inches; 20 dc = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round or row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

HAT

SQUARE

Make 16 [18].

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 6, **join** (see Pattern Notes) to form a ring, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in ring, ch 3, [3 dc in ring, ch 3] 3 times, join

in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, sl st in next 2 dc. (12 dc, 4 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 2: Sl st in ch-3 sp, (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same ch-3 sp, ch 1, [(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 1] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, sl st in next 2 dc. (24 dc, 4 ch-3 sps, 4 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-3 sp, (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, [(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (36 dc, 4 ch-3 sps, 8 ch-1 sps)

JOINING SQUARES

Join 2 circles of 8 [9] Squares. Work Squares tog in a strip, first holding 2 Squares tog as follows: *working through both thicknesses, insert hook through corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp] 3 times. Fasten off*. Holding next Square tog with previous Square, rep from * to * until 8 [9] squares are attached. Holding first and last Squares tog to form a ring, rep from * to *. Rep with 8 [9] more Squares to form 2nd ring of Squares to form the body of the Hat. Holding 2 circles of Squares tog and working through both thicknesses, join yarn with sc in corner ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch sp] around, joining Squares tog. Fasten off.

CROWN

Rnd 1: Join yarn in any ch sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch sp, work 3 dc in each ch sp around Squares of Hat, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (96 [108] dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnds 3–5: Rep rnd 2.

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 [6] dc, **dc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 dc, [dc in next 6 {7} dc, dc dec in next 2 dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (84 [96] dc)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 [5] dc, dc dec in next 2 dc, [dc in next 5 {6} dc, dc dec in next 2 dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (72 [84] dc)

Rnds 8–12 [8–13]: Rep rnd 7, working 1 less dc between each dc dec for each rnd. (12 dc)

Fasten off, leaving an 8-inch tail.

Weave tail through rem 12 dc, pull tight and fasten off.



BOTTOM EDGING

Rnd 1: Join in lower edge of Hat, ch 1, work 4 sc in each ch sp around, join in beg sc. (128 [144] sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, dec 16 [20] sc evenly sp around, join in beg sc. (112 [124] sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 3, dc in first ch of ch-3, sk next sc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.

Fasten off.

POMPOM

Make a 2-inch Pompom and attach to top of hat.

COWL

SQUARE

Make 36.

Rnds 1–3: Rep rnds 1–3 of Square for Hat.

JOINING SQUARES

Join Squares in same manner as for Hat, joining 12 rows of 3 Squares each.

Row 1: Now working in rows along one short end of joined Squares, join in one corner ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same sp, [3 dc in next ch sp] across to last corner ch-3 sp, 3 dc in last corner ch-3 sp, turn. (36 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

Rep row 2 until piece measures 60 inches. Fasten off.

Sew short ends tog to form ring.

EDGING

Rnd 1 (RS): Join in edge at beg of Square section, ch 1, work 4 sc in each ch sp to end of Squares, work 3 sc in each 2 dc around rem edge, join in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, working in sts across Square section of Cowl, [sc in next 4 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] across, working in sts across dc section of Cowl, sc in each sc across, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 3, dc in first ch of ch-3, sk next sc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rep Edging on opposite edge of Cowl.

MATERIALS

- James C. Brett Marble DK light (DK) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/262 yds/100g per skein): 4 skeins #MT32 green/red/yellow variegated
- Size 1/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

3¼ shells = 4 inches; 7 pattern rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Increases are worked with shells in spaces between pairs of double crochet stitches.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in indicated st or sp.

WRAP

Foundation row: Loosely ch 202, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (201 sc)

Row 1 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as ch 3, *sk 4 sts, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, rep from * across to last 5 sc, sk 4 sts, 2 dc in last sc, turn. Place marker in 20th shell marking center. (39 shells)

Rows 2 & 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as ch 3, shell in each ch sp across to last st, 2 dc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, shell in sp before first shell (*inc made*—see *Pattern Notes*), shell in each ch sp across to center shell, shell in sp before center shell (*inc made*), shell in ch sp in center shell, shell in sp before next shell (*inc made*), shell in each ch sp across to last 2 dc, shell in sp before last 2 dc (*inc made*), dc in last st, turn. (43 shells)

Row 5: Rep row 2.

Rows 6–33: [Rep rows 2–5] 7 times. Fasten off. (71 shells after row 33)

Weave in ends. 



AUTUMN MIST WRAP

Easy stitching and a fun color-shifting yarn come together to create this beautiful wrap.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

4 balls #303 namaste neutrals
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

16 dc = 4 inches; 10 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-1 at beginning of row counts as first single crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

WRAP

BODY

Row 1: Ch 235, dc in 4th ch from hook (*sk 3 chs count as first dc*), [ch 1, sk 1 ch, dc in next ch] across to last ch, dc in last ch, turn. (115 ch-1 sps, 118 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each dc and ch-1 sp across, working last dc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (233 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next dc, *[ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 22 times, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (69 ch-1 sps, 164 dc)

Row 4: Ch 3, dc in next 5 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times**, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, rep from * to ** once, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in next dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 22 times, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 6: Rep row 4.

Row 7: Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch-1 sp and dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk next dc**, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, rep from * 21 times, rep from * to ** once, dc in next 3 dc and in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rows 8–10: Ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times**, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, rep from * to ** once, dc in next 2 dc and in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 11: Ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc), *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk next dc**, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, rep from * 21 times, rep from * to ** once, dc in next dc and in top of ch-3, turn.

Row 12: Rep row 5.

Row 13: Rep row 4.

Row 14: Rep row 5.

Row 15: Ch 3, dc next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk

next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, rep from * 21 times, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 16: Ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in next 4 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc and in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 17: Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next 5 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in top of ch-3, turn.

Row 18: Rep row 16.

Row 19: Ch 3, dc next dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, rep from * 21 times, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc and in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 20: Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next 5 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 21: Ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in next 4 dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next 4 dc, rep from * 21 times, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc and in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 22: Rep row 20.

Row 23: Ch 3, dc in next dc, *[ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch-1 sp and dc, rep from * 22 times, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rows 24–26: Rep rows 4–6.

Row 27: Rep row 2. (233 dc)

Rows 28–30: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, working last dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rows 31–55: Rep rows 3–27.

Row 56: Ch 3, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, dc in last dc, turn. Do not fasten off. (115 ch-1 sps, 118 dc)

BORDER

Foundation rnd: Ch 1 (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in each dc and ch-1 sp across, ch 1, rotate work, 2 sc in side of each row across short side of body, ch 1, rotate work, sc in unworked foundation lps of each dc and ch-1 sp across, ch 1, rotate work, 2 sc in side of each row across rem short side of body, ch 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg ch-1. Do not fasten off. (490 sc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

RUFFLES

Turn to work on short side of body.

Row 1: Sl st in ch-1 sp just made, ch 3, dc in each sc across to next ch-1 sp, dc in ch-1 sp, turn. (114 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) only of each dc across, dc in top of ch-3, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, working in back lps only, 2 dc in next dc, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc] across, working last 2 dc in top of ch-3, turn. (171 dc)

Rows 4 & 5: Rep row 2.

Row 6: Ch 3, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] across, working last dc in top of ch-3, turn. (256 dc)

Rows 7 & 8: Rep row 2.

Row 9: Rep row 3. (384 dc)

Rows 10 & 11: Rep row 2.

Row 12: Ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, [dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc] across, turn. (512 dc)

Rows 13–15: Rep row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

Join yarn in ch-1 corner of other short edge of body. Rep ruffles rows 1–15.

FINISHING

Block body to 22½ inches x 56 inches; do not block ruffles. **CW**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

16 inches wide x 50 inches long, excluding fringe

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Roll With It Mélangé medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (5¼ oz/389 yds/150g per cake):
2 cakes #E890-0573 theater
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

5 rows = 2½ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Work in multiple of 3 plus 2 stitches to make it longer.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

WRAP

Row 1: Ch 141, dc in the 4th ch from hook (*first 3 chs count as first dc*), dc in each ch across, turn. (139 dc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, [ch 4, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc] across, turn. (47 sc, 46 ch-4 sps)

Row 3: **Ch 5** (*see Pattern Notes*), sc in next ch-4 sp, (ch 4, sc) in each ch-4 sp across, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn. (2 ch-2 sps, 2 dc, 46 sc, 46 ch-4 sps)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first dc, (ch 4, sc) in each ch-4 sp across, turn. (46 sc, 46 ch-4 sps)

Row 5: **Ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), 3 dc in each ch-4 sp across, sc in last sc, turn. (139 dc, 1 sc)

Row 6: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next 2 dc] across to last 2 sts, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in last st, turn. (93 dc, 46 ch-1 sps)

Row 7: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in each dc and each ch-1 sp across, ending with dc in last st, turn. (139 dc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2–7] 5 times.

At end of last row, fasten off.

FRINGE

Cut 192 strands, each 11 inches in length.

Holding 4 strands tog, fold in half, insert hook in st, draw strands through at fold to form lp on hook, draw ends through lp on hook, pull ends gently to secure.

Evenly place 21 fringes along each end of Wrap. Trim even. 

VOLVORETA STOLE

A few balls of a special slightly fuzzy yarn add drape and elegance to this unique wrap.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

17½ inches wide x 66 inches long, excluding ornaments

MATERIALS

- Universal Yarn Swiss Mohair super fine (fingering) weight acrylic/mohair/nylon yarn (3½ oz/601 yds/100g per ball):
3 balls #2503 ram
- Sizes D/3/3.25mm and G/6/4mm crochet hooks
- Fiberfill
- Yarn needle



GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project; however, a lofty fabric with drape is desirable.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

STOLE BODY

Row 1: With size G hook, ch 108, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (107 sc)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 4 dc in first sc, [sk next sc, dc in next sc] 7 times, sk next 2 sc, *11 dc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, dc in next sc, [sk next sc, dc in next sc] 6 times**, sk next 2 sc, rep from * across to last 2 sts, ending at **, sk next sc, 5 dc in last sc, turn. (107 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each dc across, turn.

Rows 4–149: [Rep rows 2 and 3] 73 times. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

ORNAMENTS

Make 14.

Rnd 1: With size D hook, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 8 sc in ring, join in first sc. (8 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same st, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 3 times, sc in next st, join in first sc. (11 sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc.

Rnds 4–6: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in first st, [**sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 5 times, join in first sc. (6 sts)

Fill Ornament with fiberfill.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, join in first sc. Leaving 6-inch tail, fasten off. Weave in ends.

ASSEMBLY

Thread 6-inch tail of yarn from ornament into yarn needle, run needle through tops of last 3 sts from rnd 8 and pull tight. Sew Ornaments firmly to points made by fan stitches (7 across each end of Stole).

GAUGE

In pattern: 6 V-sts = 5 inches; 8 rows = 5 inches

Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row does not count as a stitch unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Increase V-stitch (inc V-st): ([Dc, ch 1] twice, dc) in indicated place.

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated place.

Shell: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in indicated sp.

Fan: ([Dc, ch 1] 3 times, dc) in indicated sp.

V-stitch shell (V-st shell): V-st 3 times in indicated sp.

SHAWL

Foundation row: Ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *ch 3, turn, dc in top of last sc, ch 1, turn, sc in top of last dc, rep from * 31 times. Do not turn. (31 dc, 32 sc)

Row 1: Working across side of foundation row, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, **inc V-st**—see *Special Stitches*) in side of first sc, *sk next dc row, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in side of next sc, rep from * 29 times, sk last dc row, (inc V-st, dc) in side of sc, turn. (2 inc V-sts, 30 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in next st, V-st next ch-1 sp, *V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, V-st in sp between V-sts, V-st in ch-1 sp of next V-st, rep from * 14 times, V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (51 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in first st, sk next st, inc V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in ch-1 sp of each V-st across to last V-st, inc V-st in ch-1 sp of last V-st, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (2 inc V-sts, 49 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 4: Ch 3, dc in first st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in ch-1 sp of each V-st across to inc V-st, V-st in next ch-1 sp of inc V-st, V-st in next st, V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (55 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 5: Rep row 3. (2 inc V-sts, 53 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 6: Rep row 4. (59 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 7: Ch 3, dc in first st, inc V-st in next ch-1 sp, V-st in ch-1 sp of next 3 V-sts, *V-st in sp between V-sts, V-st in ch-1 sp of next 3 V-sts, rep from * 17 times, inc V-st in next ch-1 sp, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (2 inc V-sts, 75 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 8: Rep row 4. (81 V-sts, 2 dc)

Rows 9–16: [Rep rows 3 and 4] 4 times. (97 V-sts, 2 dc at end of last row)

Row 17: Ch 3, dc in first st, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, [V-st in next 7 ch-1 sps, shell in next ch-1 sp] 12 times, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (13 shells, 84 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 18: Ch 3, dc in first st, shell in next ch-1 sp, [V-st in next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp, V-st in next 3 ch-1 sps, shell in next ch-1 sp, V-st in next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp] 12 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (37 shells, 60 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 19: Ch 3, dc in first st, shell in next ch-1 sp, [V-st in next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp] 48 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (49 shells, 48 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 20: Ch 3, dc in first st, shell in next ch-1 sp, *shell in next 2 ch-1 sps, [V-st in next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp] twice, shell in next 2 ch-1 sps, rep from * 11 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (73 shells, 24 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 21: Ch 3, dc in first st, shell in each ch-1 sp across, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (97 shells, 2 dc)

Row 22: Ch 3, dc in first st, **fan** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, [shell in next 3 ch-1 sps, fan in next ch-1 sp] 24 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (25 fans, 72 shells, 2 dc)

Row 23: Ch 3, dc in first st, sk next ch-1 sp, fan in next ch-1 sp, [sk next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp, fan in next ch-1 sp, shell in next ch-1 sp, sk next ch-1 sp, fan in next ch-1 sp] 24 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (49 fans, 48 shells, 2 dc)

Row 24: Ch 3, dc in first st, sk next ch-1 sp, fan in next ch-1 sp, [fan in next ch-1 sp, sk next ch-1 sp, fan in next ch-1 sp] 48 times,

Wraps

sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (97 fans, 2 dc)

Row 25: Ch 3, dc in first st, sk next ch-1 sp, **V-st shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, [sk next 2 ch-1 sps, fan in next ch-1 sp, sk next 2 ch-1 sps, V-st shell in next ch-1 sp] 48 times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (48 fans, 49 V-st shells, 2 dc)


Row 26: Ch 1, sl st in first st, sk next ch-1 sp, V-st shell in next ch-1 sp, [sk next 2 ch-1 sps, V-st shell in next ch-1 sp] 96 times, sk next 3 sts, sl st in last st, turn. (97 V-st shells, 2 sl sts)

Row 27: Ch 2, *sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, sk next 2 sts, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next

ch-1 sp, ch 3, sk next 2 sts, sc in next ch-1 sp**, sl st in sp between V-st shells, rep from * 96 times, ending last rep at **, ch 2, sl st in top of last dc in row 25. Fasten off. (388 sc, 98 sl sts, 194 ch-3 sps, 99 ch-2 sps)

FINISHING

Block gently as desired.

22 [24, 26] inches wide x 55 [59, 63] inches long

MATERIALS

- Plymouth Yarn Encore Dynamo medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/200 yds/100g per ball):
 - 5 [6, 6] balls #42 Persian empire
- Size L/11/8mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Locking stitch markers
- Shawl pin
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

In Ribbing: 11 sts = 4 inches; 12 rows = 4 inches

In Seed St: 10 sts = 4 inches; 10 rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-1 at end of every row before turning work counterclockwise (*clockwise for left-handed crocheters*).





 - 2 skeins #0003 dusky mauve
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Motif = 3½ inches, after blocking

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Refer to Stitch Diagram as needed.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Motifs are worked in joined rounds with right side always facing; do not turn unless otherwise stated.

Motifs are joined using join-as-you-go technique.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 space unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Popcorn (pc): 5 dc in indicated st, drop lp from hook, insert hook in first dc, pick up dropped lp and draw through st.

Chain-7 join (ch-7 join): Ch 3, sl st in corner ch-7 sp on adjacent Motif, ch 3.

Chain-5 join (ch-5 join): Ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp on adjacent Motif, ch 2.

Single crochet join (sc join): Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

SHAWLETTE

FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1: Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 11 dc in ring, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of beg ch-3. (12 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 3, sc in next st] 11 times, ch 3, join in first sc. (12 sc, 12 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: Sl st in first ch-3 sp, **ch 6** (see *Pattern Notes*), **pc** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 5 times, pc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (6 dc, 12 ch-3 sps, 6 pc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st] twice, ch 7 (*corner made*), *[sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, ch 5] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, ch 7 (*corner made*), rep from * around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (12 sc, 8 ch-5 sps, 4 corner ch-7 sps)

NEXT MOTIF

Getting started: The working Motif is joined to each neighboring Motif along adjacent sides while working ch-5 sps and at adjacent corners while working ch-7 sps. Hold neighboring Motifs with RS facing and sts aligned.

Rnds 1–3: Rep rnds 1–3 of First Motif.

Rnd 4 (joining rnd): Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st] twice, **ch-7 join** (see *Special Stitches*), *[sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, **ch-5 join** (see *Special Stitches*)] twice, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, ch-7 join, rep from * along all adjacent

sides, **sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, [ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next st] twice, ch 7 (corner made), rep from ** around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Make a total of 28 Next Motifs, joining according to Placement Diagram.





Fun embroidery stitches add a little extra beauty to this cabled pocket wrap, but if embroidery isn't your cup of tea feel free to leave the stitches off.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

18 inches wide x 60 inches long

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Yarns Pound of Love medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (16 oz/1,020 yds/454g per ball):
1 ball #150 Oxford grey
- Lion Brand Yarns Vanna's Palettes medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (1/3 oz/17 yds/10g per ball):
1 package #203 earthy containing 1 ball each bright red, medium orange, chartreuse, medium green, olive green, medium brown, dark brown and cream
- Size 1/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

17 sts = 4 inches; 13 rows = 4 inches in alternating rows of dc and hdc

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of row does not count as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

PATTERN STITCHES

Horseshoe Cable (multiple of 12 sts)

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), sk first 3 sts, *fptr (see Stitch Guide) around next 3 sts, working behind sts just made, fptr around 3 sk sts, sk next 3 sts, fptr around next 3 sts, working in front of sts just made, fptr around 3 sk sts*, hdc across to last 12 sts, sk next 3 sts, rep between * once.

Row 2: Ch 2, bpd around first 12 sts, hdc across to last 12 sts, bpd around last 12 sts.

Row 3: Ch 2, fpdc (see Stitch Guide) around first 12 sts, dc across to last 12 sts, fpdc around last 12 sts.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Rep rows 1–4 for Horseshoe Cable Pattern.

Reverse Horseshoe Cable (multiple of 12 sts)

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2, sk first 3 sts, *fptr around first 3 sts, working in front of sts just made, fptr around 3 sk sts, sk next 3 sts, fptr around next 3 sts, working behind sts just made, fptr around 3 sk sts*, hdc across to last 12 sts, sk next 3 sts, rep between * once.

Row 2: Ch 2, bpd around first 12 sts, hdc across to last 12 sts, bpd around last 12 sts.

Row 3: Ch 2, fpdc around first 12 sts, dc across to last 12 sts, fpdc around last 12 sts.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Rep rows 1–4 for Reverse Horseshoe Cable Pattern.

WRAP

FIRST HALF

SHAPE POCKET

Row 1: With Oxford grey, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in st, turn. (2 sc)

Rows 3–5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in last st, turn. (3 sc)

Rows 7–9: Rep rows 3–5.

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in last st, turn. (4 sc)

Rows 11–18: Rep rows 7–10. (6 sc)

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.



Row 20: Rep row 10. (7 sc)

Rows 21–38: Rep rows 19 and 20. (16 sc)

Row 39: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, sc in each st across, turn. (17 sc)

Row 40: Rep row 10. (18 sc)

Rows 41–50: Rep rows 39 and 40. (28 sc)

POCKET

Row 1: Ch 33, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each st across, turn. (60 sc)

Work even in sc until pocket measures 6 inches, ending on a WS row, turn.

BODY

FIRST HALF


Foundation row 1 (RS): Ch 14, dc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs do not count as a st here and throughout*), dc in each ch and st across. (72 dc)

Foundation row 2: Ch 14, dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each rem ch, dc in next 60 sts, **bpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around last 12 sts. (72 dc, 12 bpdc)





Work even in sc until pocket measures 6 inches, ending on a RS row.

Rows 4–13: Rep rows 2 and 3. (16 sc)

Row 14: Rep row 2. (15 sc)

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 16–33: Rep last 2 rows. (6 sc)

Row 34: Rep row 2. (5 sc)

Rows 35–37: Rep row 15.

Rows 38–45: Rep rows 34–37. (3 sc)

Row 46: Rep row 3. (2 sc)

Rows 47–49: Rep row 15.

Row 50: Ch 1, sc dec in 2 rem sts. Fasten off. (1 sc)

FINISHING

Block to measurements.

Fold up pockets and sew in place.

EMBROIDERY

Using red, randomly st **spirals** (*see Spiral diagram*) using running stitches.

Using shades of green, embroider **leaves** (*see Leaf diagram*) using backstitches for the stem, stem stitches for outline of each leaf and straight stitches for veins.

Using orange and cream, st **small flowers** (*see Small Flower diagram*) using lazy daisy stitches for petals and French knots for centers.

Using cream, medium brown and dark brown, st **large flowers** (*see Large Flower diagram*) in different lengths of lazy daisy stitches for petals in each color. Using a contrasting color, embroider straight stitches for stamens, work 2 petals in lazy daisy stitches between the different lengths of the previously made lazy daisy petals and French knots for center and tops of stamens. **cw**

4 skeins #7803 blue bayou
- Size L/11/8mm Tunisian crochet hook, minimum length of 14 inches, or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Size L hook: 15 pattern sts = 4 inches;
13 pattern rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Wrap is made vertically from 1 short edge to other short edge.

Last loop on hook is counted as first loop of next row unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Tunisian purl stitch (TPS): Bring yarn to front of work; insert hook under next front vertical bar, yo, pull lp through. The stitch is wrapped with front yarn.

Tunisian twisted purl stitch (TTPS): With yarn in front, insert hook from front of work to back under back vertical bar, pulling back vertical bar toward front of work, yo, pull lp through. The stitch is wrapped with front yarn.

Tunisian knit stitch (TKS): Insert hook from front to back between front and back vertical bars of same st, yo, pull lp through.

Tunisian cross stitch (TCS): Sk next ch-1 sp, insert hook from front to back under next ch-1 sp, yo, pull lp through, insert hook from front to back under ch-1 sp just sk, yo, pull lp through (2 sts created).

Tunisian puff stitch (puff): Insert hook from front to back under ch-1 sp, yo, pull lp through, yo, insert hook from front to back under same ch-1 sp, yo, pull lp through (3 sts created).



- A.** Sk first vertical bar, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **3 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **18 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **3 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **TKS** (50 lps on hook);

- B.** ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 10 times, ch 1, yo, pull through 4 lps (3 sts closed here and throughout), ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 22 times, ch 1, yo, pull through 4 lps on hook, ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 11 times.

Row 7:

- A.** Sk first vertical bar, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **TCS** (see Special Stitches), **2 TTPS**, **18 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **TCS**, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **TKS** (48 lps on hook);

- B.** ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 11 times, ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 24 times, ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 12 times.

Row 8:

- A.** Sk first vertical bar, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **puff** (see Special Stitches), **2 TTPS**, **18 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **puff**, **2 TTPS**, **6 TKS**, **2 TTPS**, **TKS** (50 lps on hook);

- B.** ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice, **RLC** (see Special Stitches), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 10 times, **RLC**, **LLC** (see Special Stitches), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 10 times, **RLC**, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times.

Rows 16–199: [Rep rows 8–15] 23 times.

Rows 200–204: Rep rows 8–12.

- B.** ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] across.

Row 206:

- A.** Sk first vertical bar, TPS across (*50 lps on hook*);
- B.** ch 1, [yo, pull through 2 lps] across.

Row 207: Rep row 206.

Final row: Sk first vertical bar, insert hook in next st as for TPS, yo, pull lp through st and through lp on hook (*sl st made*), sl st as for TPS across to last st, sl st as for TKS in last st. Fasten off. CW



Row 9: Ch 1, *sc, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * across, sc in turning ch, turn. (201 sts)

Change to wizard.

Row 10: Ch 2, dc in first st, ch 1, sk next ch-1 and sc, *puff (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc; rep from * across, dc in turning ch, turn.

Change to foliage.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each st and ch-1 sp across to last 2, sk last ch-1 sp, sc in last st, turn. (200 sts)

Row 12: Rep row 8.

Row 13: Rep row 3.

Change to chameleon.

Row 14: Rep row 4.

Row 15: Rep row 3.

Change to beech.

Rows 16 & 17: Rep rows 14 and 15.

Change to wizard.

Row 18: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 19: Ch 2, hdc in back bar of each st across, turn.

Change to chameleon.

Row 20: Ch 2, dc in first st, ch 1, sk 1 st, *bobble (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * across, dc in turning ch. (201 sts)

Change to wizard.

Row 21: Ch 2, hdc in each st and ch-1 sp across to last 2, sk last ch-1 sp, hdc in last st, turn. (200 sts)

Rows 22–61: [Rep rows 2–21] twice.

Rows 62–72: Rep rows 2–12.

Fasten off.

SMALL RECTANGLE Make 2.

Row 1: First foundation hdc, 99 next foundation hdc, turn. (100 sts)

Rows 2–21: Rep rows 2–21 of Large Rectangle.

Rows 22–32: Rep rows 2–12 of Large Rectangle.





Row 2: Ch 1, back lp (see *Stitch Guide*) sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, front lp sc across, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3, turn.

Row 6: Rep row 2, change to color B (see *Stitch Guide*), turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, *sc in first sc, picot sc (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, rep from * to last st, sc in last st, change to color C, turn.

Row 8: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk first sc, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 9: Rep row 8, change to color A, turn.

Rows 10 & 11: Ch 1, sc in each st across, change to color D after row 11, turn.

Row 14: Ch 1, *sc in first 2 sc, fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st 3 rows below, sk sc in row 13 behind fpdc, sc in next sc; rep from * across, ending with sc in last sc, turn.

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in each st across, change to color E, turn.

Row 16: Ch 3, sk first sc, dc in each st across, change to color B, turn.

Row 17: Rep row 7, change to color C, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each st across, change to color F, turn.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 8, sk next 3 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, change to color C, turn.

Row 20: Ch 1, *sc in first sc, working behind ch-8, tr in next 3 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, turn.



Row 21: Ch 1, *sc in first 2 sts, sc in next tr catching ch-8 lp, sc in next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep with sc in last 2 sc, turn.

Rows 22–29: [Rep rows 18–21] twice, change to color B after row 29.

Row 30: Ch 3, sk first st, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 31: Rep row 30, change to color D, turn.

Row 32: Ch 3, sk first st, dc in each st across, change to color A, turn.

Row 33: Ch 1, sc in first dc, *tr in next dc, sc in next dc, rep from * across, ending with sc in top of beg ch-3, change to color D, turn.

Row 34: Rep row 32, change to color E, turn.

Row 35: Rep row 33, change to color D, turn.

Row 36: Rep row 34, change to color A, turn.

Row 37: Rep row 33, change to color D, turn.

Row 38: Rep row 32, change to color C, turn.

Row 39: Rep row 32, change to color A, turn.

Rows 40–45: Rep rows 10–15 using F as A, change to color E after row 45.

Row 46: Rep row 32, change to color A, turn.

Row 47: Ch 1, front lp sc across, ending with sc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rep rows 2–47 for pattern until piece measures approximately 80 inches from beg, ending last rep after row 31.


Last Row: With A, ch 4, sk first st, *dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * across, ending with dc in last st, fasten off.

Block to finished measurements.

FINISHING

Attach **fringe** (see illustration) in each ch-1 sp along short ends, alternating 1 strand each of colors A, B and C and colors B, C and D.

Trim fringe evenly. **CW**

4 skeins #596 trade winds
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

14 sts = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Picot: Ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook.

SCARF

Row 1: Ch 42, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [dc in next ch, sc in next ch] across, turn. (41 sts)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next sc, sc in next dc] across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 60 inches from beg.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds in sts and in ends of rows, ch 1, evenly sp sc around outer edge so Scarf lies flat, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc.

Rnd 2: [Picot (see *Special Stitch*), sk next st, sl st in next 2 sts] around, adjusting your sts so that you work picot in corner, join in joining sl st of last rnd. Fasten off.

POCKET

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 40, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [dc in next ch, sc in next ch] across, turn. (39 sts)

Row 2: Ch 3, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next sc, sc in next dc] across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 11 inches from beg.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds in sts and in ends of rows, ch 1, evenly sp sc around outer edge so Pocket lies flat, join in beg sc.

Rnd 2: [Picot, sk next st, sl st in each of next 2 sts] around, adjusting your sts so that you work picot in corner, join in joining sl st of last rnd. Fasten off.

Center and sew one Pocket on each end as shown in photo.

WASABI POPCORN SCARF

Design by *Bendy Carter*

Choose a self-stripping or color-blocking yarn to create the look of this scarf while adding texture with popcorn stitches.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

6½ inches wide x 44 inches long

MATERIALS

- Premier Yarns Sweet Roll medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (5 oz/245 yds/140g per ball):



- 1 ball #26 wasabi pop
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

16 sts = 4 inches; 7 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

If there isn't enough yarn to repeat pattern rows 44 times, repeat pattern rows as many times as yarn will allow.


SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning popcorn (beg pc): Ch 1, sc in first dc, 2 sc in next dc, drop lp from hook, insert hook in beg ch-1, draw dropped lp through.

Popcorn (pc): 2 sc in next 2 dc, drop lp from hook, insert hook in first sc made, draw dropped lp through.

SCARF

Row 1 (WS): Leaving 24-inch strand at beg, ch 28, dc in **back bar** (see illustration) of 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as a dc), [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in back bar of next 2 chs] 6 times, turn. (26 sts)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (RS): Beg pc (see *Special Stitches*), [ch 3, sk next 2 chs, **pc** (see *Special Stitches*)] 6 times, turn. (7 pc)

Row 3 (WS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in pc, [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, dc in next pc] 6 times, turn. (26 sts)

Rows 4–91: [Rep rows 2 and 3] **44 times** (see *Pattern Notes*). Fasten off at end of last row, leaving a 24-inch strand.


FINISHING

Fold rows 1–10 to back of work so foundation ch is touching row 20. Using long strand, sew beg ch to back of row 20.

Fold last row to back of work. Using long strand, sew in place.

- Caron Simply Soft Paints medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (4 oz/200 yds/170g per skein):
3 skeins #0009 sticks & stones (see *Pattern Notes*)
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

Hat: 6 dc = 2 inches

Scarf: 12 dc = 4 inches; 8 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

If making only one of the set, the beanie requires 1 skein of yarn and the scarf requires 2 skeins of yarn.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

BEANIE

Rnd 1: Ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, ch 2 (*does not count as st*), 11 dc in ring, join in beg ch-2. (11 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (*doesn't count as st here and throughout*), 2 dc in each dc around, join in beg ch-2. (22 dc)

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (44 dc)

Rnds 4–6: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 7: Ch 2, [2 dc in next st, dc in next 3 sts] around, join in beg ch-2. (55 dc)

Rnd 8: Ch 2, dc in each st around, join in beg ch-2.

Rnds 9 & 10: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 11: Ch 2, dc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. (55 dc)

Rnd 12: Ch 2, [fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc, dc in next dc] around, join in beg ch-2.

Rnds 13–18: Ch 2, [fpdc around fpdc, dc in next dc] around, join in beg ch-2.

Rnd 19: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

SCARF

HALF

Make 2.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 26, dc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs count as a dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (25 dc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each dc across, turn.

Rows 3–40: Rep row 2.

Row 41: Ch 2, [fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Row 42: Ch 2, [bpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Rows 43–46: [Rep rows 41 and 42] twice.

Row 47: Rep row 41.

Row 48: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With RS tog, sew row 1 of one Half to row 1 of 2nd Half. 

MOTLEY HUES SAMPLER SCARF

Design by *Debra Arch*

Made using self-striping worsted-weight yarn, this richly textured color-block scarf pairs each color with a different stitch pattern.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

8 inches wide x 101 inches long

MATERIALS

- Plymouth Yarn Hot Cakes medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (7 oz/404 yds/200g per skein):
1 skein #0001 autumn mix
- Plymouth Yarn Encore Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/200 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #466 quarry
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- 62 safety pins or stitch markers
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

9 sc = 2 inches; 8 sc rows = 2 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Repeat rows of each block are worked as many times as needed until just before the yarn changes to the next color, making sure last row is completely stitched with the current color. It is not important which row of the repeat is the final row.

Fasten off current autumn mix color and cut away any excess between current and next autumn mix yarn color.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Begin each block with the next color of autumn mix yarn.

Chain-1 at beginning of rows does not count as first single crochet.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Single crochet join (sc join): Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

Treble crochet join (tr join): Place slip knot on hook, yo twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up lp, [yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo and draw through rem 2 lps on hook.

Treble in last skipped stitch (tr in last sk st): Ch 1, working behind last tr made, insert hook in last sk st directly to right, yo, pull up lp and complete as a tr.

Double crochet join (dc join): Place slip knot on hook, yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up lp, yo and draw through 2 lps on hook, yo and draw through rem 2 lps on hook.

SCARF

FIRST SECTION

BLOCK 1

Row 1 (RS): With autumn mix, ch 27, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (26 sc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in next st, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts] across, turn. (14 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp] 5 times, dc in next 2 sts, turn. (16 dc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3] until next yarn color (see *Pattern Notes*). **Fasten off autumn mix** (see *Pattern Notes*).

ACCENT STRIPE

Row 1: With RS facing and quarry, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) to first st, work 1 sc in each st and 2 sc in each ch-2 sp across, turn. (26 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1 (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in each st across. Fasten off quarry.

BLOCKS 2 & 8

Row 1: Beg with autumn mix (see *Pattern Notes*) and RS facing, sc join in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] 12 times, sc in last st, turn. (14 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp] 12 times, sc in last st, turn. (14 sc)

Next rows: Rep row 2 until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Row 1: With RS facing and quarry, sc join in first st, [sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next st] across, turn. (26 sc)

Row 2: Rep row 2 of Block 1 Accent Stripe

BLOCKS 3 & 9

Row 1: With RS facing and next autumn mix color, **tr join** (see *Special Stitches*) in first st, [sk next 2 sts, tr in next st, ch 1, **tr in last sk st** (see *Special Stitches*)] across, tr in last st, turn. (18 tr)

Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next st, sk next ch, tr in next st, ch 1, tr in last sk st, [sk next st, sk next ch, tr in next st, ch 1, tr in last sk st] 7 times, tr in next st, turn. (18 tr)

Next rows: Rep row 2 until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Rows 1 & 2: Rep same as for Blocks 2 and 8 Accent Stripe.



BLOCKS 4 & 10

Row 1: With RS facing and next autumn mix color, **dc join** (see *Special Stitches*) in first st, dc in each st across, turn. (26 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around post of next st, fpdc around post of each st across to last st, dc in next st, turn. (2 dc, 24 fpdc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 1 and 2] until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Row 1: With RS facing and quarry, sc join in first st, sc in each st across, turn. (26 sc)

Row 2: Rep row 2 of Block 1 Accent Stripe.

BLOCKS 5 & 11

Row 1: With RS facing and next autumn mix color, sc join in first st, sc in next 2 sts, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] 7 times, sc in next 2 sts, turn. (12 sc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in next 2 sts, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next st] 7 times, dc in next 2 sts, turn. (12 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st and in next 2 sts, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next st] 7 times, sc in next 2 sts, turn. (12 sc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3] until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Rows 1 & 2: Rep rows 1 and 2 of Block 1 Accent Stripe.

BLOCKS 6 & 12

Row 1: With RS facing and next autumn mix color, sc join in first st, sc in each st across, turn. (26 sc)

Row 2: Ch 4, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), tr in each st across, turn. (26 tr)

Row 3: Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in first st and in each st across, turn. (26 sc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3] until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Rows 1 & 2: Rep rows 1 and 2 of Blocks 4 and 10 Accent Stripe.

BLOCKS 7 & 13

Row 1: With next autumn mix color and RS facing, dc join in first st, dc in next st, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts] across, turn. (14 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp] 5 times, dc in next 2 sts, turn. (16 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next st, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts] across, turn. (14 dc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3] until next yarn color. Fasten off autumn mix.

ACCENT STRIPE

Rep same as for Block 1 Accent Stripe.

2ND SCARF SECTION

Beg with Block 2, rep rows and Accent Stripes of Blocks 2–7 of First Scarf Section, ending with last row of Block 7. Do not work Accent Stripe following Block 7. Fasten off autumn mix.

FINISHING

Block scarf to 6¼ inches wide by approximately 98 inches long. Allow to dry thoroughly.

Note: Depending upon your desired length, scarf may be shorter.

Fold Scarf in half lengthwise and mark center fold at each long side edge with a safety pin or stitch marker.

Bring Scarf ends to marked center and place pins in center folds to mark quarter sections. Fold each quarter section in half and use pins to mark center fold to divide Scarf into 8 equal sections.

Fold each ¼ section in half and mark center fold to create 16 equal sections.

Fold each ⅛ section in half and mark center fold to create 32 equal sections.

BORDER

Rnd 1: With quarry and RS facing, dc join in first st of last row made, dc in same st, dc in next 24 sts, 2 dc in last st, ch 2, *working in ends of rows, 2 dc in end of first row, work 9 dc evenly sp to first marker, [work 10 dc evenly sp to next marker] across long side edge to next corner, dc in same place where last st was made, ch 2**, working in opposite side of foundation ch, 2 dc in first ch, dc in next 24 chs, 2 dc in last ch, ch 2, rep from * to ** once, join to first dc of rnd. (700 dc)

Stitch count will vary depending upon Scarf finished length.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, [dc in back lp of next st, dc in front lp of next st] across to first corner ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in first ch-2 sp, *[dc in back lp of next st, dc in front lp of next st] across to next corner ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around, join to top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (Stitch count will be last rnd total sts plus 16 more dc)

 - 1 skein each #636-133AS cinnamon stick, #636-172T olive and #636-125Y taupe
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

15 dc = 4 inches; 12 dc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Scarf is made in two halves which are then seamed together.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: ([Dc, ch 1] 3 times, dc) in indicated st or sp.

SCARF

SCARF HALF

Make 2 (see Pattern Notes).

SHELL PATTERN

Row 1: With cinnamon stick, ch 32, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to olive, turn. Fasten off cinnamon stick. (31 sc)



Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in sc at base of ch-3, *sk next 4 sc**, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in last sc, turn. (5 shells)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in st at base of ch-3, shell in center ch-1 sp of next 5 shells, 2 dc in last st, turn.

Rep row 3 until piece measures 12 inches, ending with a WS row.

Next row: Ch 1, sc in first 2 dc, ch 2, sk next dc, ch 1 and dc, sc in center ch-1 sp of

next shell, *ch 2, dc in sp between current and next shell, ch 2, sc in center ch-1 sp of next shell, rep from * across, ending with ch 2, sk next dc, ch 1 and dc of last shell, sc in last 2 sts, turn. (9 sc, 4 dc, 10 ch sps)

Last row: Ch 3, dc in each st and 2 dc in each ch-2 sp across, change color to taupe, turn. (33 dc)

WAVE PATTERN

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each dc across, turn. (33 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, tr in next st] twice, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st**, ch 1, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st and ch sp across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), *tr in next st, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] twice, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, tr in next st**, ch 1, sk next st, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, tr in last st, turn.

Row 6: Rep row 5.

Rows 7 & 8: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Row 9: Rep row 2.

Rows 10–25: [Rep rows 2–9] twice.

Row 26 & 27: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Row 28: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, change color to cinnamon stick, turn.

CROSS BLOCK PATTERN

Row 1: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.


Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 4, sk next 3 sts, sc in next dc, *ch 4, sk next 2 sts, sc in next dc, ch 4, sk next 3 sts, sc in next dc, rep from * across, turn. (9 ch sps)

Row 3: Ch 5 (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in first ch-4 sp, ch 2, *4 dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, rep from * across to last sc, dc in last sc, turn. (18 dc, 5 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 4, sk next ch sp and sc, *sc in ch before next dc group, ch 4, sc in ch after dc group, ch 4, rep from * across to last ch sp, sk last ch sp, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn. (10 sc)

Row 5: Ch 3, *4 dc in next ch sp**, ch 2, sc in next ch sp, ch 2, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in last sc, turn. (22 dc, 4 sc)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 4, sk next 4 dc, *sc in next ch, ch 4, sc in ch before next dc group, ch 4, sk next 4 dc, rep from *

across, ending with sc in last dc, turn. (9 ch sps)

Rows 7–18: [Rep rows 3–6] 3 times.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 3 sc in first ch sp, *sc in next sc, 2 sc in next ch sp, sc in next sc, 3 sc in next ch sp, rep from * across, ending with sc in last st.

Last row: Ch 1 (doesn't count as a st), hdc in first and each st across. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

With WS tog using invisible seam and working in back lps only, sew Cross Block Pattern ends tog. **CW**

STITCH KEY

- Chain (ch)
- Work into chain, not into chain space
- + Single crochet (sc)
- ⌋ Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⌋ Double crochet (dc)
- ⌋ Treble crochet (tr)

ROOT BEER POST SCARF

GAUGE

14 sts = 5 inches; 6 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES


Post puff: [Yo, insert hook from front to back to front around post of dc just made, yo, draw through] twice, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

Lark's Head Knot: Hold 2 matching color strands tog, fold in half, with WS facing insert hook in end of row, place center of strands on hook and draw through, wrap

ends of strands over hook, draw through lp on hook, pull ends to tighten.

SCARF

Row 1 (RS): Ch 188, dc in **back bar** (see illustration) of 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as a dc), dc in back bar of each rem ch across, turn. (186 dc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), [dc in next st, **post puff** (see Special Stitches), sk next st] across to last st, dc in last st, turn. (92 post puffs)

Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk post puff, 2 dc in next dc st] across to last 3 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (186 dc)

Rows 4–9: [Rep rows 2 and 3] 3 times. Fasten off at end of last row.

FRINGE

Matching colors to row ends, cut 2 10-inch strands for first and last row end. Cut 4 10-inch strands for all other row ends. (32 strands for each end of scarf)

On each short end of Scarf, place one **Lark's Head Knot** (see Special Stitches) on first and last row end; place 2 Lark's Head Knots on all other row ends.

Trim fringe as desired. **CW**

- Lion Brand Homespun bulky (chunky) weight acrylic/ polyester yarn (6 oz/185 yds/ 170g per skein):
 - 1 skein #368 Montana sky
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle and thread
- 1-inch wooden buttons: 2



GAUGE

11 sts = 4 inches; 7 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet, unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet, chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Puff stitch (puff st): [Yo, insert hook in st, draw up lp] 4 times, yo, draw through all 9 lps on hook.

NECK WARMER

Row 1: Starting at neckline, ch 68, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs counts as first hdc*), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (67 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), sk next st, [hdc in next st, sk next st, ch 1] across, ending with hdc in top of ch-2, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2 (*see Pattern Notes*), **puff st** (*see Special Stitch*) in next ch-1 sp, sk next hdc, ch 1] across, ending with puff st in ch-1 sp, hdc in top of ch-2, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, sk puff st, [hdc in next ch-1 sp, sk next puff st, ch 1] across, ending with hdc in top of ch-2, turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, [hdc in next ch-1 sp, hdc in next hdc] across, ending with hdc in ch-1 sp, hdc in top of ch-2, turn.

Rows 6–9: Rep rows 2–5. At the end of row 9, fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew first button to row 1 near 3rd st and 2nd button to row 1 near 10th st. Button Neck Warmer by using natural sps at end of rows 2 and 8 on opposite side edge of rows. **CW**

GAUGE

Size H hook: 9 hdc = 2 inches;
8 rows = 2½ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

When working post stitches, always skip stitch behind post stitch.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.



Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next 2 sts, [hdc in next st, bpdc around next 4 sts] 3 times, hdc in next st, bpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, **FWD Cbl A** (see *Special Stitches*), [hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts] 3 times, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Rows 5 & 6: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Row 7: Rep row 3.

Row 8: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, **FWD Cbl B** (see *Special Stitches*), [hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts] twice, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 9: Rep row 3.

Row 10: Rep row 8.

Row 11: Rep row 3.

Row 12: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st, **FWD Cbl B**, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 13: Rep row 3.

Row 14: Rep row 12.

Row 15: Rep row 3.

Row 16: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, [fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st] twice, **FWD Cbl B**, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 17: Rep row 3.

Row 18: Rep row 16.

Row 19: Rep row 3.

Row 20: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, [hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts] 3 times, hdc in next st, **FWD Cbl A**, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 21: Rep row 3.

Row 22: Rep row 20.

Row 23: Rep row 3.

Row 24: Ch 1, hdc in next 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, [fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st] twice, **FWD Cbl B**, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 25: Rep row 3.

Row 26: Rep row 24.

Row 27: Rep row 3.

Row 28: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st, **FWD Cbl B**, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.

Row 29: Rep row 3.

Row 30: Rep row 28.

Row 31: Rep row 3.

Row 32: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next st, **FWD Cbl B**, [hdc in next st, fpdc around next 4 sts] twice, hdc in next st, fpdc around next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, turn.



Row 33: Rep row 3.

Row 34: Rep row 32.

Row 35: Rep row 3.

Rows 36–195: [Rep rows 4–35] 5 times.

Rows 196–199: Rep rows 4–7.

EDGING

Rnd 1 (RS): Now working in rnds, ch 1, 3 sc in first st, sc in next 22 sts, 3 sc in next st,

working across next side in sides of rows, [sc in next row, 2 sc in next row] across, working across next side in unused lps of foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in next 22 chs, 3 sc in next ch, working across next side in sides of rows, [sc in next row, 2 sc in

next row] across, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (646 sts)

Rnd 2 (optional): Sl st in each st around, remove lp from hook, insert hook under first sl st, place lp back on hook and pull through first st. Fasten off.

Fair isle crochet adds a colorful patterned touch to this otherwise basic accessory.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

13 inches wide x 75 inches long

MATERIALS

- Universal Yarn Deluxe Worsted medium (worsted) weight wool yarn (3½ oz/220 yds/100g per skein):
 - 6 skeins #3669 Caribbean sea
 - 1 skein each #91476 fire red, #41795 nectarine, #12270 natural and #71006 white ash
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

14 sc and 16 sc rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

SCARF

Row 1: With Caribbean sea, ch 49, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (48 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Rows 3–300: Rep row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

POCKET

Make 2.

Row 1: With Caribbean sea and leaving a 3-inch end, ch 35, **carrying a 2nd strand of Caribbean sea underneath** (see *Pattern Notes*), working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across. Leaving a 3-inch end of both yarns, fasten off.

Note: For following rows, follow chart for color changes and work in back lps.

Row 2: Make slip knot on hook and join yarn with sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across. Fasten off.

Rows 3–32: Rep row 2.

BORDER

Row 1: With RS facing and last row at top, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) Caribbean sea in end of last row at left-hand edge, working across side in ends of rows, sc in each row across, working across foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in each ch across to last ch, 3 sc in last ch, working across next side in ends of rows, sc in each row across to last row, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, working 3 sc in 2nd sc of each 3-sc group, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, working 3 sc in 2nd sc of each 3-sc group. Fasten off.

Trim ends to just short of Border.

FINISHING

Referring to photo for placement, sew Pockets on Scarf.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.


Leave a 6-inch end or length specified when fastening off yarn.

Confident Beginner

SIZE

8 inches x 80 inches, excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Moda Dea Tweedle Dee bulky (chunky) weight acrylic/wool/rayon yarn (3½ oz/155 yds/100g per skein):
3 skeins #8906 cinnamon twist
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

(2 dc, ch 2, sc) = 3 inches; 9 rows = 6 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SCARF

Row 1 (RS): Ch 22, (dc, ch 2, dc) in 4th ch from hook, *sk next 2 chs, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in next ch, rep from * across, turn.

Row 2: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 2, sc) in same sp, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in each rem ch-2 sp across, turn.

Rows 3–119: Rep row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Fold piece in half with WS tog. For hood, starting at top center, sew through both thicknesses for 10 inches on 1 side only.

HOOD EDGING

Note: Mark 15th row on each side from center row at top of hood.

Row 1 (RS): Hold piece with RS facing and edge of hood at top, join yarn in end of marked row on right-hand side of center, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, sc) in same sp, *sk next row, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in next row, rep from * 14 times, leaving rem rows unworked, turn.

Row 2: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, sc) in same sp, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in each rem ch-2 sp across. Fasten off.

FRINGE

Cut 42 pieces of yarn, each 11 inches long. For each knot of fringe, fold 3 strands in half. From RS, draw folded end through first ch-2 sp on 1 short end. Draw ends through fold and tighten knot. Place knots in rem ch-2 sps on both short ends. Trim ends even. 

BRIAR ROSE HOODED SCARF

The fun stitch pattern along the front edges of this hooded scarf give a bit of pizzazz to an otherwise fairly straightforward design.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

12 inches wide x 86 inches long

MATERIALS

- Premier Yarns Anti-Pilling Everyday Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (4 oz/203 yds/113g per skein):
5 skeins #100-28 mustard
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

12 hdc = 4 inches; 10 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Depending on where they are placed, the 3-double crochet clusters form either vertical or horizontal clusters. Both clusters are made the same; they are just placed in different stitches.

After a vertical 3-double crochet cluster is completed, you will chain 3; the first chain-3 forms the eye of the cluster. The next cluster is made in this "eye" (which

forms the horizontal cluster). There is no chain after a completed horizontal cluster.

Scarf and hood are made in 2 identical pieces and sewn at the top and partway down the side to form hood.

SPECIAL STITCH


3-double crochet cluster (3-dc cl):

[Yo, insert hook into specified st, yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo and draw through all 4 lps on hook.

SCARF

FIRST HALF

Foundation row: Ch 132, starting in 3rd ch from hook (starting in 3rd ch forms hdc at beg of row) and working in the **back bar of ch** (see illustration), hdc in each ch across row, turn. (131 hdc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), sk first hdc, hdc in each hdc across row, hdc in turning ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sk first 2 hdc, *3-dc cl (see Special Stitch) in next hdc, ch 3, 3-dc cl in eye of cl just made (see Pattern Notes), sk next 2 hdc, rep from * across row, end with 3-dc cl, ch 1, sk next hdc, dc in top of turning ch, turn. (43 vertical cls, 42 horizontal cls)

Row 3: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), sk first dc, 3-dc cl in top of first cl, *ch 2, sk next horizontal cl, 3-dc cl in next cl, rep from *





Scarves

across, end with ch 1, dc in top of turning ch, turn. (43 vertical cls)

Row 4: Ch 2, sk first dc, hdc in first ch-1 sp, hdc in first cl, *2 hdc in next ch-2 sp, hdc in next cl, rep from * across, end with hdc in ch-1 sp, hdc in top of turning ch, turn. (131 hdc)

Row 5: Ch 2, sk first hdc, hdc in each hdc across row, hdc in top of turning ch, turn. (131 hdc)

Rep row 5 until piece measures 12 inches, fasten off.

2ND HALF

Make another piece the same as first half.

POCKET

Make 2.

Ch 30.

Work rows 1–5 same as scarf on 29 sts.

After row 2 there will be 9 vertical cls and 8 horizontal cls.

After row 3 there will be 9 vertical cls.

After rows 4 and 5 there will be 29 hdc.

Continue until pocket measures 10 inches, then fasten off.


FINISHING

Sew 2 short ends of scarf tog to form top of hood, sew seam 14 inches down from top seam to form back of hood.



TASSEL

Before starting tassel, cut a 2-yd piece of yarn and a 15-inch piece of yarn, set aside for tying. Wrap yarn 30 times around a 5-inch piece of cardboard. Take the 2-yd length of yarn and tie top of wrapped yarn, so that you have 1 yd on each side of knot. Cut bottom of wrapped yarn across and remove cardboard. Take the 15-inch length and use it to tie tassel about 1 inch down from top. Tie securely and combine the ends in the tassel. Using the double strands of yarn at top, crochet a ch 10 sts long, fasten off, trim bottom and attach to hood. If blocking is desired, place garment on a padded surface, sprinkle lightly with water, pat into shape and allow to dry. **cw**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SCARF

Row 1: Ch 41, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (40 sc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3 (RS): Ch 3, fpdc (see Stitch Guide) in next 6 dc, dc in next 8 dc, fpdc in next 10 dc, dc in next 8 dc, fpdc in next 6 dc, dc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, bpdc (see Stitch Guide) in next 6 sts, hdc in next 8 dc, bpdc in next 10 sts, hdc in next 8 dc, bpdc in next 6 sts, dc in last st, turn.

Rows 5–12: [Rep rows 3 and 4] 4 times.

Row 13: Ch 3, sk 3 sts, **fptr** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 3 sts, fptr in 3 sk sts, dc in next 8 hdc, sk next 5 sts, fptr in next 5 sts, fptr in 5 sk sts, dc in next 8 hdc, sk next 3 sts, fptr in next 3 sts, fptr in 3 sk sts, dc in last st, turn.

Row 14: Ch 3, bpdC in next 6 sts, hdc in next 8 dc, bpdC in next 10 sts, hdc in next 8 dc, bpdC in next 6 sts, dc in last st, turn.

[Rep rows 3–14] 13 times.

[Rep rows 3–12] once.

Last row: Ch 1, sc in each st across.
Fasten off.

HOOD

Foundation row: Ch 87, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (86 sc)

Row 1 (WS): Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st across, turn.

Rows 3–6: [Rep rows 1 and 2] twice.

Inc row (WS): Ch 3, dc in next 7 sts, *2 dc in next 5 sts, dc in next 8 sts, rep from * across, turn. (116 dc)

SHAPING

Row 1 (RS): Ch 3, dc in next 7 sts, *fpdc in next 10 sts, dc in next 8 sts, rep from * across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in next 7 sts, *bpdC in next 10 sts, hdc in next 8 sts, rep from * across, turn.

Rows 3–6: [Rep rows 1 and 2] twice.

Row 7: Ch 3, dc in next 7 sts, *sk next 5 sts, fptr in next 5 sts, fptr in 5 sk sts, dc in next 8 sts, rep from * across, turn.

Row 8: Rep row 2.

Rows 9 & 10: Rep rows 1 and 2.

Row 11: Ch 3, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, dc in next 5 sts, *fpdc in next 10 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in next 6 sts, rep from * across, turn. (109 sts)

Row 12: Ch 2, **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, *bpdC in next

10 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, rep from * across, turn. (102 sts)

Rows 13–24: [Rep rows 1–12] once working with 6 sts between each cable. (88 sts after row 24)

Rows 25 & 26:

Rep rows 1 and 2.

Piece should now measure approximately 12½ inches. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Fold hood double and sew halves of last row tog matching sts.


Mark center of Scarf and pin to back seam on Hood. Pin side

edges of Hood along the side of Scarf on each side of center, matching cable twists on Hood and Scarf so they line up. Sew with fine stitches.

Weave in ends.

POMPOM

Wrap yarn around 3 fingers 50 times. Slide yarn off fingers and tie tightly around center of wraps. Cut ends of wrapped yarn. Trim and fluff to desired shape. Sew to tip of Hood.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Leave stitch behind front post treble crochet unworked unless otherwise stated.

When following Chart while working back and forth rows, odd-numbered rows are worked from right to left and even-numbered rows are worked from left to right.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Front post double treble crochet decrease (fpdtr dec)

Holding back last lp of each st on hook, **fpdtr** (see *Stitch Guide*) around post st 3 sts to right, fpdtr

around post st 1 st to left, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Single crochet join (sc join): Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 2 dc as indicated in instructions or on Chart, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Beginning open block (beg open block): Ch 4 (*counts as first dc and ch-1*), sk first st or ch, dc in next st.

Open block: Ch 1, sk next st or ch, dc in next st.

Solid block: Cl in next st or ch, dc in next st.

Attaching open block: Ch 1, dc in crochet piece.

NECK WARMER

GRANNY SQUARE

Make 6.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, [ch 3 (*corner*), 3 dc in ring] 3 times, ch 2, join with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, forming last corner ch sp.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, *fptr (see *Stitch Guide*) around first dc of next dc group, dc in same dc as fptr, dc in next 2 sts, fptr around last dc in same dc group**, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next corner ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, dc in same corner ch sp as beg ch-3, ch 2, join with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, *fptr around next dc, dc in next 3 sts, **fpdtr dec** (see *Special Stitches*), working behind fpdtr dec, dc in same dc as last dc worked, dc in next 2 sts, fptr around

last dc before corner**, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, dc in same corner ch sp as beg ch-3, ch 2, join with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, *fptr around next dc, dc in same st as fptr worked around, [fptr around next st, dc in next st] 5 times, fptr around same st as last dc made**, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, dc in same corner ch sp as beg ch-3, ch 3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Sew Granny Squares tog side by side in long strip.

EDGING

With RS facing, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) in corner ch sp on bottom edge, sc in same ch sp as beg sc, *[sc in next 15 sts and chs, sc in next corner ch sp, sc in seam, sc in next corner ch sp on next Granny Square] 5 times, [sc in next 15 sts and chs**, (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in next corner ch sp] twice, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 2 sc in same ch sp as joining sc, ch 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in joining sc. Fasten off.

FILET FRINGE

As you work the **chart** (see *Filet Fringe Chart, Pattern Notes and Special Stitches*) you will be connecting the fringe to one long edge of the Granny Square strip, using row 1 written instructions as a guide for working from chart to end of strip.

Row 1: Join in first st of first square, ch 4 (*counts as first dc and ch-1*), **cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in 4th ch from hook, sk next st on square, sl st in next st on square, ch 1, sk next st, sl st in next st on square, turn.






Next rows: Continue attaching to design, if at design edge at end of row, omit last dc on open or solid block, sk next st on square, sl st in next st, ch 1, sk next st on square, sl st in next st, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew 1 button in each corner at bottom of last Granny Square. Use corner ch sps of first Granny Square for buttonholes. **cw**






Example of 2-sc dec

SKILL LEVELS

BEGINNER

These projects are for first-time crocheters and use basic stitches (chain, single crochet, double crochet, treble crochet, slip stitches, half double crochet), with little or no shaping. Beginner projects combine basic stitches in short pattern sequences and may require identifying back and front loops of stitches, the back bar of chains, and the right and wrong side of work. Skills include simple increasing and decreasing for each basic stitch as well as skipping stitches, working multiple stitches into one stitch and simple color changes.

CONFIDENT BEGINNER

These projects use basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns and row repeats, more technical types of color changes, and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot pads, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within the Confident Beginner skill category, as well as patterns that require the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

INTERMEDIATE

These projects incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing. Intermediate patterns may require the ability to read more advanced stitch pattern charts, such as lace and cable charts.

ADVANCED

These projects utilize a wide variety of stitches and techniques such as those outlined in other skill categories, as well as detailed colorwork, shaping, construction and finishing. Advanced projects may require an intuitive understanding of a pattern or chart, and also include advanced stitches and techniques, as well as intricate methods such as intarsia, cables, lace, stranded colorwork with numerous color changes, and advanced shaping and construction techniques.
