CROCHET DUCKLING

FINISHED SIZE Approx. 11cm tall

YARN A Any 4- or 5-ply or fine DK wool, alpaca, cotton or cashmere yarn

YARN B Any 3- or 4-ply wool, alpaca, cotton or cashmere yarn

I used:

Yellow duckling - A - DROPS SKY - shade 17 Curry;

B - DROPS SAFRAN - shade 01 Desert Rose

Beige duckling - A - CARDIFF CLASSIC CASHMERE - shade 700 Futon;

B - CARDIFF CLASSIC CASHMERE - shade 550 Tadeo

- You'll also need a length of darker shade yarn for the nostrils

HOOK 2mm and 1.8mm - favourites are KnitPro Soft Grip Crochet Hook and Tulip Etimo Crochet Hook

TENSION 18 stitches and 22 rows to 5cm (2in) over double crochet (dc) using 2.00mm hook and yarn A

EXTRAS Pair 7mm black toy safety eyes with metal washers; toy filling (*I use felt tops*); scissors and yarn-sewing needle, coloured stitch markers

PATTERN NOTES & TIPS:

- . The first chain (1CH) at the beginning of the row or round does not count as a stitch throughout the whole pattern
- . Unless otherwise stated a slipped stitch doesn't count as a stitch

CROCHET PATTERN NOTES

DC – double crochet: insert hook from front to back into the centre of the second chain from the hook. Wrap the yarn, from back to front, around the hook, draw the yarn through the chain (*2 loops on hook*). Yarn over once again and draw the thread through both loops.

(NOTE: Same as US sc)

TR– treble crochet: yarn over hook then insert hook from front to back into the centre of the second chain from the hook (*3 loops on hook*). Wrap the yarn, from back to front, around the hook, draw the yarn through first 2 loops on the hook. Wrap the yarn around the hook again, draw the yarn through 2 loops on the hook. *(NOTE: Same as US dc)*

inc – increase one stitch by working 2 dc in same stitch

inc2 – increase one stitch by working 2 dc in same stitch over two consecutive stitches

inc3 – increase one stitch by working 2 dc in same stitch over three consecutive stitches, etc, etc

dec – decrease one stitch by working 2 dc together

dec2 – decrease one stitch by working 2 dc together over four consecutive stitches

dec3 – decrease one stitch by working 2 dc together over six consecutive stitches, etc, etc

Skip – miss out the number of stitches you are required to 'skip'; for example "skip three" counting from the last dc worked miss out three dc stitches and work a dc stitch into the very next stitch, in this case the 4th stitch

Slip – hook into stitch, yarn over hook and pull the stitch through the stitch on the hook

WS – wrong side

Before you begin, cut approx. 30cm yarn **B** and thread up a yarn sewing needle.

HEAD TOP

Head Top is worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), starting at the Top of the Head and working towards the Read End as follows:

Starting at the Top of the Head with yarn **A** and 2mm hook continue as follows:

Rnd 1. Start with a magic ring, ch1 to secure the ring then dc 6 into the ring. - *See Figs. 1, 2, 3 & 4*

Pull the tail end gently to close the ring. - *See Fig. 5*

NOTE: FOR EACH CLOSURE OF EACH ROUND work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 (chain) to start the next round. - *See Fig. 6*

If you wish to mark the beginning/ end of each round place a stitch marker on the slip stitch moving the same marker each time you start a new round. - See Fig. 9

Rnd 2. Inc6 (12dc). - *See Fig. 7*

Tie and cut the tail end.

Rnd 3. *Dc1, inc; repeat from * to end of round (18dc). - *See Fig. 8*

Rnd 4. Inc7, dc4, inc7

Rnds 5-6. Dc32

Rnd 7. *Dc6, dec; repeat from * to end of round. - *See Figs. 10 & 11*

Rnd 8. Dc28. - *See Fig. 12*

On the next round have ready two markers for **Eye Position Markers** and place each (PM = *place marker*) as follows:

Rnd 9. Dc9, PM in front loop of 9th dc (*for Right Eye Marker*), dc2, dec3, dc3, PM in front loop of last (3rd) dc (*for Left Eye Marker*), dc 8 (25dc). - *See Fig. 13*

On the next round have ready one marker for the **Beak Top Position Marker** and place it as follows:

Rnd 10. Dc13, place marker in front loop of 13th dc (*for Beak Top Marker*), dc12

Rnd 11. Dc5, inc4, dc7, inc4, dc5

Rnd 12. Dc33

Rnd 13. Dc5, [dec, dc1] twice, dec, dc7, [dec, dc1] twice, dec, dc5 (27dc)

On the next round have ready one marker for the **Beak Bottom Position Marker** and place it as follows:

Rnd 14. Dc14, PM in front loop of 14th dc (*for Beak Bottom Marker*), dc3, make a slip stitch into 1ch from start of the round. - *See Fig. 14*

After Rnd 14, remove the hook whilst you add the eyes as follows:

Take the threaded-up yarn sewing needle, insert the yarn sewing needle into the same stitch as one of the eye markers pull yarn through leaving a longish tail end then make a stitch at the same place to secure the yarn.

Remove the eye marker.

Pass the needle into the crochet and out at the other eye marker. - *See Fig. 15*

Remove the other eye marker.

Pull the yarn to squish the head to about 1.4cm/ 1/2inch width apart from the inside of the head. - *See Fig. 16*

Make another stitch to fully secure the thread and the 'head squish' and then pass the thread inside the head to hide it away.

Thread up the remaining tail end and pass that inside the head to hide it away.

Knot the two ends that are inside the head and trim or bundle the ends inside the head.

Insert the toy eyes into the centre of the head squish at either side and secure the eyes with the backings. - *See Figs. 17 & 18*







Resume your crochet as follows

Return the hook to the last crochet stitch from Rnd 14, make a slip stitch in first place, ch1 and continue with Rnd 15 as follows:

Rnd 15. Dc2, dec, dc3, [dec, dc1] three times, dec, dc3, dec, dc2 (19dc)

Rnd 16. Dc3, dec, dc1, dec, dc3, dec, dc1, dec, dc3 (15dc)

Rnds 17-18. Dc15

Stuff the Head before continuing with the Body and Rnd 19, as follows. - See Fig. 19:

Rnd 19. [Inc, dc1] twice, inc, dc5, [inc, dc1] twice, inc (21dc)

Rnd 20. [Dc1, inc] twice, dc3, [inc, dc2] twice, inc, dc3, [inc, dc1] twice (28dc)

Rnd 21. [Dc1, inc] twice, dc4, inc, dc3, inc, dc2, inc, dc3, inc, dc4, [inc, dc1] twice

Rnd 22. Dc36

Rnd 23. [Dc1, inc] three times, dc4, [inc, dc2] five times, inc, dc4, [inc, dc1] three times

Rnds 24-26. Dc48

Rnd 27. Dc15, [dec, dc1] twice, dec, dc2, [dec, dc1] twice, dec, dc15

Rnd 28. Dc42

Rnd 29. Dc14, [dec, dc 1] four times, dec, dc14

Rnd 30. Dc37

Rnd 31. Dc5, dc6 into the **back loops only**, dc4, dec, dc3, dec, dc4, dc6 into the **back loops only**, dc5. - See Figs. 20 & 21

Rnd 32. Dc35

Rnd 33. Dc2, inc2, dc9, inc, dc7, inc, dc9, inc2, dc2

Rnd 34. Dc41

Rnd 35. Dc2, inc2, dc11, inc, dc9, inc, dc11, inc2, dc2

Rnd 36. Dc47

Rnd 37. Dc2, inc2, dc13, inc, dc11, inc, dc13, inc2, dc2

Rnd 38. Dc53

Rnd 39. Dc1, inc3, dc15, inc, dc13, inc, dc15, inc3, dc1

Rnds 40-42. Dc61

Create Left and Right Leg Spaces as follows:

Rnd 43. Dc2, inc2, dc8, skip 8, dc21, skip 8, dc8, inc2, dc2 (49dc). - See Figs. 22, 23 & 24

Rnd 44. Dc3, inc2, dc12, dec, dc2, dec, dc3, dec, dc2, dec, dc12, inc2, dc3

Separate the Tail as follows:

Before starting the next round, slip stitch in first place then:

Rnd 45 (and into rnd 46). Slip stitch first 7dc, dc4, [dec, dc3] five times, dec, dc4, skip 14 (includes 7 slip stitches from beginning of the round/ does not include the slip stitch/1ch that started the round) (29dc). - See Fig. 25

NOTE: For the last few rounds don't slip stitch and don't ch1 at the start and end of each round, just continue as follows:

Rnd 46. Dc1, dec, dc6, dec, dc7, dec, dc6, dec, dc1 (25dc)

Rnd 47. Dc1, dec, [dc2, dec] twice, dc3, [dec, dc2] twice, dec, dc1 (19dc)

Stop here, remove the hook and stuff the duckling firmly before commencing as follows. - See Fig. 26:

Rnd 48. Dc1, dec, dc2, dec, dc5, dec, dc2, dec, dc1 (15dc)

Rnd 49. [Dc1, dec] twice, dc3, [dec, dc1] twice (11dc)

Rnd 50. [Dec] five times, slip stitch last dc

After the 50th round remove the yarn from the hook, cut yarn leaving approx. 20cm/ 8in of tail end. Thread up a yarn needle with the tail end and pass the threaded-up needle through the last stitch (*the slip stitch*) of Rnd 50.

Pull through, then working into front loops only, pass the needle into each of the next 5 front loops. - See Fig. 27

Pull up to gather so closing the hole.

Pass the end into the body to secure the end and trim where it emerges. - See Fig. 28



Both Legs are similarly worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), picking up the crochet from the leg openings at the sides of the body as follows:

Working around the outermost edge of one of the leg openings in a row, with yarn B insert the hook into the corner of the crochet leg and begin with a chain to start the Round 1:

Left Leg

With the duckling's belly facing you, working around the outermost edge of the Left Leg Opening, with yarn B and 2mm hook insert the hook into the corner of the crochet, nearest the belly and just before the 8 leg space sts, pull yarn through and begin with a chain to start the Round 1. - See Fig. 29:

Rnd 1. Into the 8 Left Leg Space sts: Dec, dc4, dec, end with slip stitch(*) into the next stitch then slip stitch into 1 ch from the start, Ch1. - See Fig. 30

****Rnd 2** Dc6, ignore the next slip stitch(*)

NOTE: As before work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 (chain) to start the next round.

Rnds 3-5. Dc6

Rnd 6. Dc2, dec, dc2 (5sts)

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, thread the end through the slip stitch and pull through. - See Fig. 31.**

Right Leg

With the duckling's head towardsn you, working around the outermost edge of the Right Leg Opening, with yarn B insert the hook into the corner of the crochet, nearest the back and just before the 8 leg space sts, pull yarn through and begin with a chain to start the Round 1. - See Figs. 32 & 33:

Rnd 1. Into the 8 Right Leg Space sts: Dec, dc4, dec, end with slip stitch(*) into the next stitch then slip stitch into 1 ch from the start, Ch1

Continue to work Right Leg as Left Leg from ** to ***.



WINGS *make 2*

Both Wings are similarly worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), starting at the Tip of the Wing and working towards the Wing Top as follows:

Starting at the Tip of the Wing with yarn A and 2mm hook continue as follows:

Rnd 1. Start with a magic ring, ch1 to secure the ring then dc 6 into the ring
Pull the tail end gently to close the ring
Tie and cut the thread end.

As before work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 (chain) to start the next round.

To mark the end of each round place a stitch marker on the slip stitch moving the same marker each time before you start a new round.

Rnd 2. Inc6 (12dc)

Rnd 3. *Dc1, inc; repeat from * to end of round (18dc)

Rnd 4. [Dc1, inc] twice, [dc2, dec] twice, dc2, [inc, dc1] twice (20dc)

Rnd 5. [Dc2, dec] twice, dc4, [dec2, dc2] twice (16dc)

Rnd 6. [Dc2, dec] twice, [dec, dc2] twice (12dc)

Rnd 7. Dc5, dec, dc5 (11dc)

Rnd 8. Dc4, inc3, dc4 (14dc)

Rnd 9. Dc3, dec, dc4, dec, dc3, end with slip stitch in 1ch (12dc)

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, pass the end through the slip stitch and pull through.

Join the Top Wing Seam

Flatten the wing. - *See Fig. 34*

Thread up the tail end into a yarn sewing needle.

*Pass the sewing needle from back to front into the first stitch nearest the tail end on the back of the wing then pass it into the stitch in front of it, on the front of the wing (as if to sandwich the top wing edges by over-sewing both edges together). - *See Figs. 35 &*

Join the Left Wing to the Body

Have the duckling's body laying on its left side. Tail towards you.

Have the left wing so that the tail end that you sewed the seam with is to your left. Lay the wing seam against the stitches that were worked into the back only/ the stitches that created the slight ridge.

*Working from the duckling's head end to duckling's tail end and working into the front of the 'ridge' stitches, join the wing to the body by over-sewing the stitches from the wing top seam to the front of the ridge stitches.

Flip the wing up and then repeat the process to join the underside of the wing to the body. - See Figs. 37, 38 & 39

Pass the tail end into the body to hide it away.**

NOTE: The Wing isn't stuffed.

Join the Right Wing to the Body

Have the duckling's body laying on its right side. Tail towards you.

Have the right wing so that the tail end that you sewed the seam with is to your right. Lay the wing seam against the stitches that were worked into the back only/ the stitches that created the slight ridge.

Join Right Wing to Body as Left Wing from * to **.

Over-sew the front of the wing top seam to the front stitches from the body 'ridge'

BEAK

The Beak is worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), starting at the Tip of the Beak and working towards the Beak Top as follows:

Starting at the Tip of the Beak with yarn **B** and 1.8mm hook continue as follows:

Rnd 1. Start with a magic ring, ch1 to secure the ring then dc 4 into the ring
Pull the tail end gently to close the ring

NOTE: As before work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 to start the next round.

Rnd 2. Dc1, inc2, dc1

Rnd 3. Dc6

Rnd 4. Dc2, inc2, dc2

Rnd 5. Dc8

Rnd 6. Dc3, inc2, dc3

Rnds 7-8. Dc10

Rnd 9. Dc3, inc4, dc3 (14dc)

Rnd 10. Dc14

Rnd 11. Dc5, inc4, dc5, end with slip stitch in 1ch (18dc)

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, pass the end through the slip stitch and pull through.

To join Beak to Head

Flatten the beak so that the tail end lies in the centre of the bottom of the beak. - *See Fig. 40*

Thread the tail end into a yarn sewing needle.

Pass the needle into the same stitch as Beak Bottom Marker, pull through. - *See Fig. 41*

Remove the Beak Bottom Marker.

Make a stitch into the bottom of the beak then pass the threaded-up yarn into the head to emerge at the same stitch as the Beak Top Marker. - *See Fig. 42*

Remove the Beak Top Marker.

Make a stitch into the top of the beak, at the front of the stitch which is the centre top of the beak. - *See Fig. 43*

Squash the beak so that the sides splay out a little and pass the threaded-up yarn into the outer most edge of one side the side of the beak. - *See 'A' Fig. 44*

Make a stitch into the head work. - *See 'B' Fig. 44*

Do the same on the other side of the beak - at this stage you have, in effect, sewn down 4 corners of the beak; bottom, top, left-side, right-side.

Now join the un-sewn parts of the beak neatly and symmetrically onto the head. - *See Figs. 45 & 46*

Add Nostrils

Complete the beak by threading up a length of darker yarn and working two straight line embroidered lines for nostrils. Secure the thread from the nostrils inside the head and trim the ends. - *See Fig. 47*

Apply a little shaping with your fingers to create that slight up-turned look. - *See Fig. 48*

NOTE: My Beak isn't stuffed although if you feel it needs it add a little of your yarn endings

WEBBED FEET *make 2*

Both Webbed Feet are similarly worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), starting at the heel and working towards the front of the foot as follows:

Starting at the Heel with yarn **B** and 1.8mm hook continue as follows:

Rnd 1. Start with a magic ring, ch1 to secure the ring then dc 6 into the ring

Pull the tail end gently to close the ring

NOTE: As before work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 (chain) to start the next round.

Rnd 2. Inc6 (12dc)

Rnd 3. *Dc1, inc; repeat from * to end of round (18dc)

Rnd 4. Dc3, inc3, dc6, inc3, dc3 (24dc)

Rnd 5. Dc3, [inc, dc1] three times, dc6, [inc, dc1] three times, dc3 (30dc)

Rnd 6. Dc3, [inc, dc2] three times, dc6, [inc, dc2] three times, dc3 (36dc)

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, pass the end through the slip stitch and pull through.

To join Foot Top and Bottom

Fold the foot so that the tail end matches with the centre of the front semi-circle (*this front semi-circle becomes the top of the foot*). - See Fig. 49

Thread up the tail end into a yarn sewing needle.

Join top semi-circle to bottom semi-circle/ top foot to bottom foot by sewing the front stitches from top to bottom all around the edges. - See Fig. 50

Embroider three straight lines over the top of the foot for a webbed foot detail. - See Fig. 51

To join Foot to Leg

Place the end of the leg on top of the top of the foot/ heel end, secure a length of threaded-up yarn and neatly sew the leg edge in place onto the top of the foot securely before passing the tail ends into the body to hide them. - See Figs. 52 & 53

The Foot should be joined so that it sits at an almost right-angle to the leg. - See Fig. 54

Join Tail Seam

This is the last seam to sew so if you wish to add more stuffing into the body and tail - tweezers are good for this, then this is the past opportunity to do so.

Working on the front stitches only, secure a length of threaded-up yarn and join the tail seam by joining the two edges together before passing the tail ends into the body to hide them. - See Fig. 55





SWEATER

FINISHED SIZE Designed to fit Crochet Duckling

YARN A Any 3 or 4-ply/ lace-weight or fingering, wool, alpaca, cotton or cashmere yarn

YARN B Any 3 or 4-ply wool, alpaca, cotton or cashmere yarn

I used:

A - RICO COTTON MERINO LACE - shade 001 Ecrú; **B** - RICO COTTON MERINO LACE - shade 005 Light Blue

HOOK 2mm

TENSION 18 stitches and 22 rows to 5cm over double crochet (dc) using 2.00mm hook and yarn A

SWEATER

The Sweater is worked in rounds of double crochet (dc), starting at the waist edge and working towards the collar as follows:

Starting at the Waist Edge with yarn B and 2mm hook continue as follows:

Row 1. Start with a foundation chain - ch55

Row 2. Ch3 (*as turning chain*), tr55

Join in round, taking care not to twist the row, as follows:

Rnd 1. Slip stitch in top of 3ch, ch1, dc55 in each dc from previous row

Join yarn B, do not cut yarn A

NOTE: FOR EACH CLOSURE OF EACH ROUND work a slip stitch through first place then Ch1 (*chain*) to start the next round.

If you wish, to mark the beginning/ end of each round place a stitch marker on the slip stitch moving the same marker each time you start a new round.

Rnd 2. Dc55

Work with yarn A and B alternatively over next round only as follows:

Rnd 3. *Yarn A, dc1, yarn B, dc1* repeat from * to * around

Cut yarn B, work with yarn A only as follows:

Rnd 4. Dc55

Create Left and Right Sleeve Spaces as follows:

Rnd 5. Dc10, ch7, skip 8, dc19, ch7, skip 8, dc10 (53dc)

Rnd 6. Dc10, dc1 in each 7ch, dc19, dc1 in each 7ch, dc10

Rnd 7. Dc53

Rnd 8. [Dc4, dec] twice, dc29, [dec, dc4] twice

Rnd 9. Dc49

Rnd 10. [Dc3, dec] twice, dc25, [dec, dc3] twice

Rnd 11. Dc45

Rnd 12. [Dc2, dec] twice, dc21, [dec, dc2] twice

Rnds 13-16. Dc41

Create V neck as follows:

Rnd 17. Dc19, slip stitch in next 3 sts, dc19

NOTE: I placed a stitch marker in the centre of the three slipped stitches to mark the centre of the 'V'

Rnd 18. [Dc1, dec] twice, dc11, slip stitch in next st, slip stitch in next 3 slip sts, slip stitch in next st (*5 slip sts all together*), dc11, [dec, dc1] twice

Rnds 19-20. Dc15, slip stitch in next 5 slip sts, dc15

Rnd 21. [Dc3, dec] three times, slip stitch in next 5 slip sts, [dec, dc3] three times

Rnd 22. [Dc2, dec] three times, dc11, slip stitch in next 5 slip sts, [dec, dc2] three times (*18dc*)

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, pass the end through the slip stitch from the beginning of the round and pull through.

Weave the tail end into the WS of the crochet.

COLLAR

With yarn A insert hook into the slip stitch from the end of the previous round, pull through, 3ch, dc9, then into the 5 slip st: tr, dc, slip st, dc, tr, continue to the end with dc9

Cut yarn leaving a longish tail-end, pass the end through the slip stitch from the beginning of the round and pull through.

Weave the tail end into the WS of the crochet.

Join the beginning and end from the first row of the Waist Edge with a few neat over-sew stitches.

Weave the tail end into the WS of the crochet.

DOT PEBBLES KNITS
