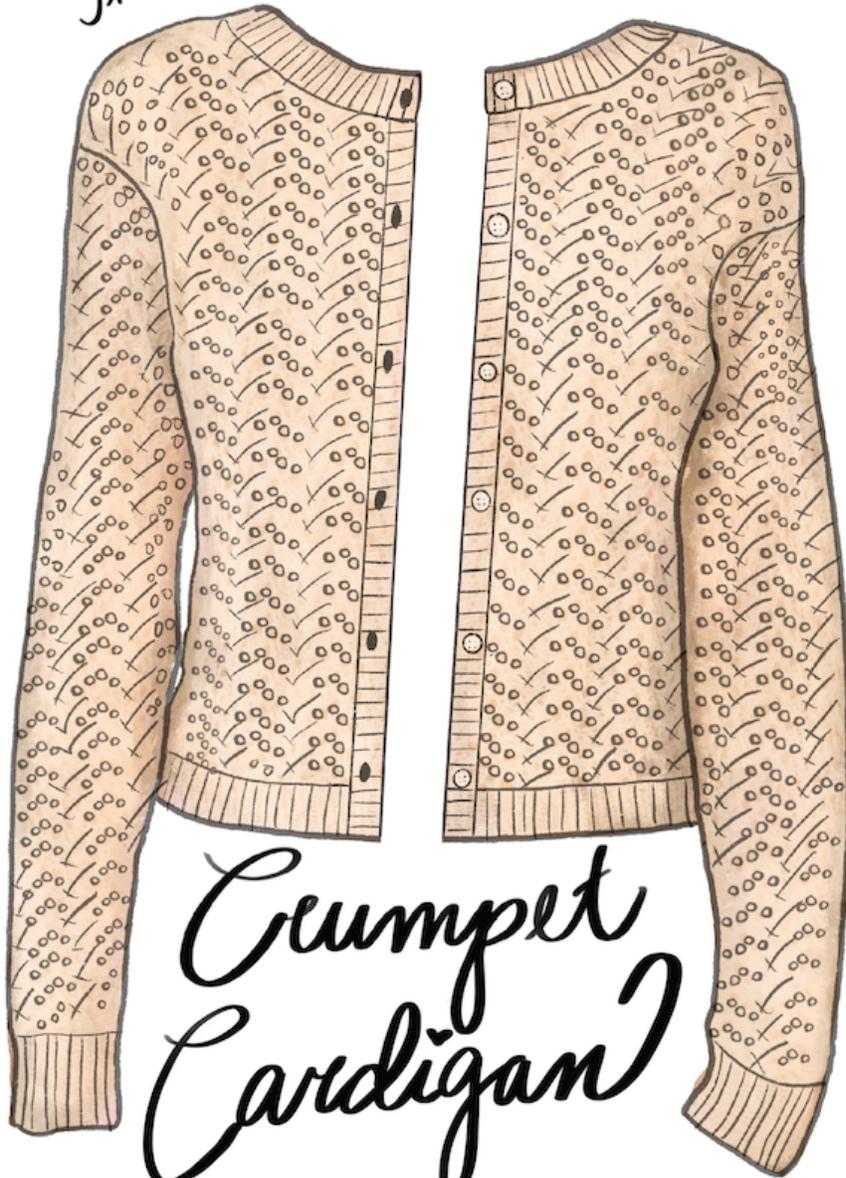

Crumpet Cardigan

by Park Williams

An elegant lace cardigan to wear while sipping your afternoon tea and eating your crumpets. Knit from the top down with a simple 7-stitch lace motif, you will be shocked at how quickly this drop sleeve cardigan works up. Pair it with the Crumpet Camisole for a darling matching set moment. Perfect for any season and any reason!

#CrumpetCardigan

Needles & Notions:

Size US 7 / 4.5mm circular needles*

Size US 5 / 3.75mm needles (for bottom ribbing and cuffs)

Size US 3 / 3.25 needles (for button band and neck ribbing)

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, stitch holders/scrap yarn, 6 to 8 buttons (1/2" in diameter), sewing needle

* cable length will vary based on size

Sizing:

XS(S, M, L, XL) (XXL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL)

Finished Chest Measurement:

35.5(39, 42.5, 46, 49.5) (53, 56.5, 60, 67) inches;

90.25[99, 108, 116.75, 125.75] [134.5, 143.5, 152.5, 170.25] cm

This garment is meant to be worn with 1-5" / 5-15 cm positive ease. I am wearing the garment with 2" / 5 cm positive ease. If you want a tighter fit you can choose a size with some negative ease, but in this case, you will most likely want to place more buttons to avoid the button band pulling.

Gauge: 16 stitches and 24 rows/4" on a US 7 / 4.5mm, in the lace stitch*, blocked.

Yarn:

The Wandering Flock Cotton Lino

Sport weight

Cotton/Silk/Linen/Alpaca Blend

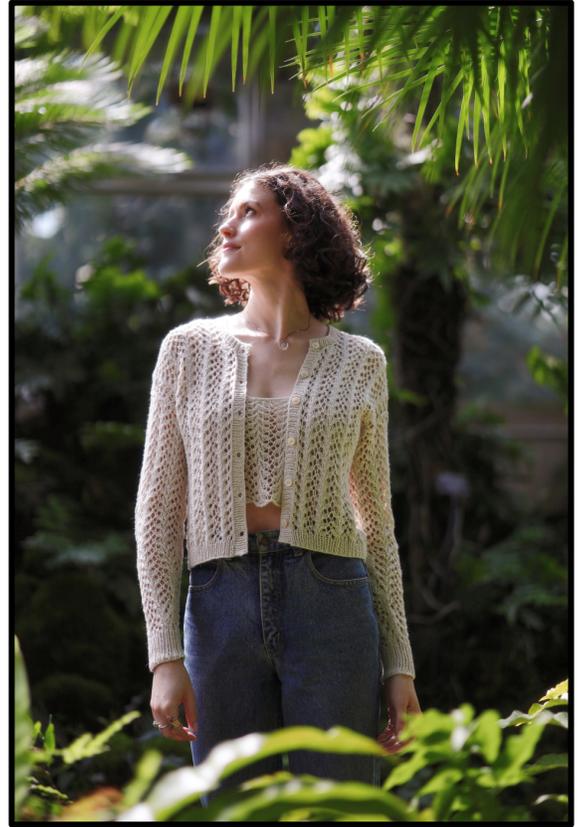
Color- Lilac

OR any yarn that gets gauge!

Yardage:

595(655, 700, 730, 815) (880, 945, 1030, 1150) yards

544[599, 640, 668, 745] [805, 864, 942, 1052] meters



Abbreviations:

BOR: beginning of round

CO: cast on (in your preferred method)

k: knit

k2tog: knit two stitches together (Decreases one stitch)

m1L: make one left. With the left needle, pick up from front to back the horizontal bar between the stitch you are about to knit and the stitch you just knit. Knit into the back of this stitch. (Increases one stitch)

m1R: make one right. With the left needle, pick up from back to front the horizontal bar between the stitch you are about to knit and the stitch you just knit. Knit into the front of this stitch. (Increases one stitch)

p: purl

pm: place marker

rm: remove marker

RS: right side of work

slm: slip marker

ssk: slip one stitch knit-wise, slip another stitch knit-wise, knit those two stitches together through the back loop (Decreases one stitch)

st(s): stitch(es)

WS: wrong side of work

yo: yarn over (Increases one stitch)

Notes:

- Gauge Swatch: Cast on 29 stitches and use the following 4 Row Repeat until your desired height:
 - Row 1 (RS): k4, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to the last 4 stitches, k4.
 - Row 2 (WS): k4, purl to the last 4 stitches, k4.
 - Row 3 (RS): k4, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to the last 4 stitches, k4.
 - Row 4 (WS): k4, purl to the last 4 stitches, k4.
- BLOCK YOUR GAUGE SWATCH!!!!
 - Lacework opens up and changes A LOT with blocking, so do not skip this step!!!!
- The lacework in-between the garter stitch borders should measure out to about 5.25" / 13.33 cm across post-blocking and without losing too much height by overly stretching it. 21 stitches over 5.25" / 13.33 cm means you hit the goal stitch gauge of 16 stitches/ 4"! Make sure you are on track for row gauge as well and you are good to go!
- The lace charts can be found on page 9 and have accompanying written instructions if you prefer to work that way.
- If the even rows are not shown in a chart that means you will knit those rows when working in the round or purl those rows when working flat. Do not forget that Chart #2 ends with an unlisted knit round (Round 28).
- Stitch markers are your friends for lace!!! If you find that you need a little help keeping track of your repeats or find that your lace is going awry, place stitch markers between each 7-stitch repeat to help keep things in order.
- Modifications: As with any garment, you may wish to modify the yoke depth, body length, or sleeve length. Just remember that lacework opens up a lot with blocking both width-wise and length-wise, so I recommend steam or spray blocking sections where you want to get a more accurate idea of the length before moving onto the next section.

Cast-On/Back Shoulders:

Using a US 7 / 4.5mm needle, CO 67(67, 81, 81, 95) (95, 109, 109, 123) stitches. *Do not join in the round.*

Set-Up Row (WS): p2, pm, purl to last two stitches, pm, p2.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 8(9, 9, 9, 10) (10, 11, 11, 12) *more* times.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Break yarn and transfer these live stitches to a holder.

Left Front:

When looking at the RS of the back with the stitches we just placed on a holder at the bottom and the cast on edge at the top, we will be picking up the leftmost stitches from the cast on edge for the left front.

On the RS of the back cast on row, count 25(25, 32, 32, 32) (32, 39, 39, 46) stitches from the *LEFT EDGE*.

Using a US 7 / 4.5mm needle, starting from the middle and working towards the outer edge, pick up and knit those 25(25, 32, 32, 32) (32, 39, 39, 46) stitches.

Set-Up Row (WS): p2, pm, purl to last two stitches, pm, p2.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl

Repeat Rows 1-4, 6(6, 7, 7, 7) (7, 7, 7, 7) *more* times.

Neck Shaping:

Sizes XS(S, M, L, -)(-, -, -, -):

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2. (Increased 1 stitch)

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, k1, m1R, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2 (Increased 2 stitches)

Row 4 (WS): Purl

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, k1, m1R, k1, m1R, k1, m1R, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2
(Increased 4 stitches)

Row 6 (WS): p2, slm, purl to marker, rm, p7, pm, p2.

Row 7 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 8 (WS): Purl.

Hook a removable stitch marker into the edge stitch on the button band side of Row 8.

Sizes - (-, -, -, XL)(XXL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL):

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2. (Increased 1 stitch)

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, k1, m1R, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2 (Increased 2 stitches)

Row 4 (WS): Purl

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, k1, m1R, k1, m1R, k1, m1R, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2
(Increased 4 stitches)

Row 6 (WS): Purl

Increase Row (RS): k2, m1R, k1, slm, work Row 3
of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2. (Increased 7 stitches)

Row 8 (WS): p2, slm, purl to marker, rm, p14, pm, p2.

Hook a removable stitch marker into the edge stitch on the button band side of Row 8.

[32(32, 39, 39, 46) (46, 53, 53, 60) stitches total]

Left Front (Continued):

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 3(4, 4, 4, 5) (5, 6, 7, 8) *more* times.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.
Break yarn and either transfer these live stitches to a holder or keep them on the needle as you work the Right Front.

Right Front:

Using a US 7 / 4.5mm circular needle and working from the armhole edge to neck on the RS of the cast on row of the back, pick up and knit 25(25, 32, 32, 32) (32, 39, 39, 46) stitches.

Set-Up Row (WS): p2, pm, purl to last two stitches, pm, p2.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 6(6, 7, 7, 7) (7, 7, 7, 7) *more* times.

Neck Shaping:

Sizes XS(S, M, L, -)(-, -, -, -):

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, m1L, k2. (Increased 1 stitch)

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, m1L, k1, m1L, k2. (Increased 2 stitches)

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, rm, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, pm, k2.
(Increased 4 stitches)

Row 6 (WS): Purl.

Row 7 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 8 (WS): Purl.

Hook a removable stitch marker into the edge stitch on the button band side of Row 8.

Sizes - (-, -, -, XL)(XXL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL):

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, m1L, k2. (Increased 1 stitch)

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, m1L, k1, m1L, k2. (Increased 2 stitches)

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k2.
(Increased 4 stitches)

Row 6 (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, rm, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, k1, m1L, pm, k2. (Increased 7 stitches)

Row 8 (WS): Purl.

Hook a removable stitch marker into the edge stitch on the button band side of Row 8.

[32(32, 39, 39, 46) (46, 53, 53, 60) stitches total]

Right Front (Continued):

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-4, 3(4, 4, 4, 5) (5, 6, 7, 8) *more* times.

Row 1 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Joining Front & Back:

Joining Row (WS): P2, slm, purl across the right front to the next marker, rm, p2. Using the Backwards Loop method, CO 3(10, 3, 10, 3) (10, 3, 10, 10) stitches, then p2 from the back panel, rm, purl across the back panel to the next marker, rm, p2, Backwards Loop CO 3(10, 3, 10, 3) (10, 3, 10, 10) stitches. Purl the first 2 stitches of the left panel, rm, purl across the left panel to the next marker, slm, p2.

[137(151, 165, 179, 193) (207, 221, 235, 263) stitches total]

Row 1 (WS): k2, slm, work Row 1 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Row 3 (RS): k2, slm, work Row 3 of Chart #1 to marker, slm, k2.

Row 4 (WS): Purl.

Work Rows 1-4 of Chart #1, 12(12, 12, 12, 13) (14, 14, 15, 15) *more* times.

For additional length, continue working Rows 1-4 of Chart #1 until the cardigan is about 1" / 2.5 cm shorter than your desired length.

Change to US 5 / 3.75mm needles.

Row 1 (RS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Row 2 (WS): (k1, p1) to last stitch, k1.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2, 3 *more* times.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Sleeves:

Using a size US 7 / 4.5mm circular needle, beginning at the middle of the armpit and working clockwise, pick up and knit 56(63, 63, 63, 70) (70, 77, 77, 84) stitches around the armhole. Place a BOR marker and join in the round.

Pick up 34(37, 37, 37, 40) (40, 44, 46, 48) stitches along the front and 22(26, 26, 26, 30) (30, 33, 31, 36) stitches along the back. This will end up being a pick up rate of about 1 stitch out of every 2 rows.

Sleeve Decrease Rounds:

Work Rows 1-4 of Chart #1, 15(10, 10, 12, 8) (8, 7, 7, 3) times.

Shoulder width, arm length and personal preference greatly vary, so you may wish to adjust the sleeve length. I recommend making your modifications in this section by consulting the size schematic, double checking your row gauge (post-blocking because the lacework opens up a lot!) and then adding or subtracting Chart #1 repeats accordingly.

Work Rounds 1-28 of Chart #2 (Sleeve Decreases), 1(2, 2, 1, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) times.

[42(35, 35, 49, 42) (42, 49, 49, 56) stitches total]

Sizes XS(-, -, L, -)(-, -, -, 5XL):

Work Rounds 1-14 of Chart #2 (Sleeve Decreases) once more.

[34(-, -, 41, -) (-, -, -, 48) stitches total]

Cuffs:

Change to a size US 5 / 3.75mm circular needle.

Sizes - (S, M, L, -)(-, 3XL, 4XL, -):

Set Up Round: k2tog, p1, (k1, p1) to end. (Decreased 1 stitch)

[-(34, 34, 40, -) (-, 48, 48, -) stitches total]

All Sizes:

Work in 1x1 ribbing (k1, p1) for 14 rows.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Button band:

Left Front (Button side):

Using size US 3 / 3.25mm circular needles, starting at the top of the cardigan where we hooked the removable marker, and working on the RS of the fabric, pick up and knit 80(84, 84, 84, 92) (96, 100, 108, 112) stitches along the left edge of the cardigan.

This will be at a rate of 1 to 1 (one stitch for every row). The exact number of stitches is not important so long as you end up with an even number and you pick up the same amount of stitches for both sides of the button band.

Row 1 (WS): (p1, k1) to end.

Row 2 (RS): (p1, k1) to end.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2, 2 *more* times.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Set one button aside for the neckline. Starting with the bottom button about 1.25" away from the hem, lay your remaining buttons out on this side of the button band spaced to your preference. Once you have eyeballed the buttons, go in and count how many stitches are between each button and make necessary adjustments to ensure you have them distributed as evenly as possible and making sure each button is placed on a knit column of the ribbing.

I used 6 buttons total. Use as many or as few as you would like! 6 buttons will probably be sufficient for the smaller sizes and 8 buttons will probably be sufficient for the larger sizes. If your sweater has negative ease, you will most likely want to place more buttons to avoid any pulling of the button band.

I placed my last button about 1.25" from the bottom hem, and then the remaining 4 buttons about 2" apart (my 4th button was placed 2" from the top of the button band). Once I have eyeballed the measurements, I go in and count how many stitches are between the buttons, aiming to have the same amount to stitches between all the buttons.

Once you have your buttons placed (not sewn), hook removable stitch markers into the knit column of ribbing for each button to act as placeholders.

Right Front (Buttonhole side):

Using size US 3 / 3.25mm circular needles, starting at the bind off at the hem of the cardigan, and working on the RS of the fabric, pick up and knit 80(84, 84, 84, 92) (96, 100, 108, 112) stitches along the right edge of the cardigan, ending at the removable marker.

This will be at a rate of 1 to 1 (one stitch for every row). The exact number of stitches is not important so long as you end up with an even number and you pick up the same amount of stitches for both sides of the button band.

Row 1 (WS): (k1, p1) to end.

Row 2 (RS): (k1, p1) to end.

Row 3 (WS): (k1, p1) to end.

Set up for the buttonhole row by hooking removable stitch markers into the corresponding stitches on this side of the button band as we marked for the buttons on the other side. The stitch markers should be hooked in the exact same knit column of ribbing on both sides of the bands when you are done.

Row 4 (RS): (k1, p1) to the first removable marker, *yo, k2tog. (k1, p1) to the next removable marker, Repeat from the * to the last marker, yo, k2tog. Work (k1, p1) to the end of your row.

Row 5 (WS): (k1, p1) to end.

Row 6 (RS): (k1, p1) to end.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Neckline:

Using size US 3 / 3.25mm circular needles, working on the RS of the fabric and beginning at the right front edge, pick up and knit 6(6, 6, 6, 6) (6, 6, 6, 6) stitches along the button band ribbing, 35(35, 39, 39, 40) (40, 40, 40, 40) stitches along the right side neck, 19(19, 19, 19, 31) (31, 31, 31, 31) stitches along the back neck, 35(35, 39, 39, 40) (40, 40, 40, 40) stitches along left side neck, 6(6, 6, 6, 6) (6, 6, 6, 6) stitches along the button band ribbing.

This will end up being a pick up rate of about 1 to 1 around the neckline. Your exact number of stitches does not matter, just so long as you picked up fairly evenly and end up with an odd number. If you would like to pull your neckline in even further, pick up a few less stitches in this step.

[101(101, 109, 109, 123) (123, 123, 123, 123) stitches total]

Sizes XS(S, M, L, -)(-, -, -, -):

Row 1 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Button Hole Row (RS): k1, p1, k1, yo, k2tog, (p1, k1) to end.

Row 3 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Row 4 (RS): (k1, p1) to last stitch, k1.

Row 5 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Sizes -(, -, -, XL)(XXL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL):

Row 1 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Row 2 (RS): (k1, p1) to last stitch, k1.

Row 3 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Button Hole Row (RS): k1, p1, k1, yo, k2tog, (p1, k1) to end.

Row 5 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Row 6 (RS): (k1, p1) to last stitch, k1.

Row 7 (WS): (p1, k1) to last stitch, p1.

Bind-off in pattern.

If you are feeling fancy, you can bind off using the Tubular Bind Off Method!

Finishing:

Sew on your buttons using the removable stitch markers we placed as your guides.

Sew the top button 5 stitches from the edge.

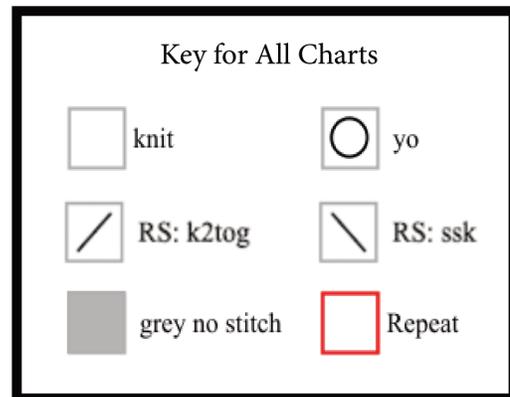
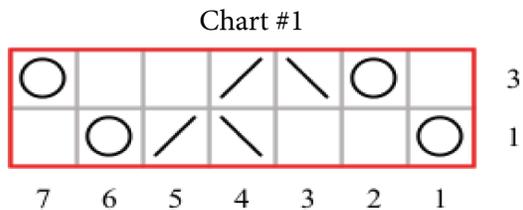
Weave in ends.

Block.

I highly recommend wet blocking this cardigan to open up the lacework!!! You will be so happy with how gorgeous your stitches end up!!!! You also can use blocking to manipulate the cardigan length-wise or width-wise in various sections to achieve your ideal fit.

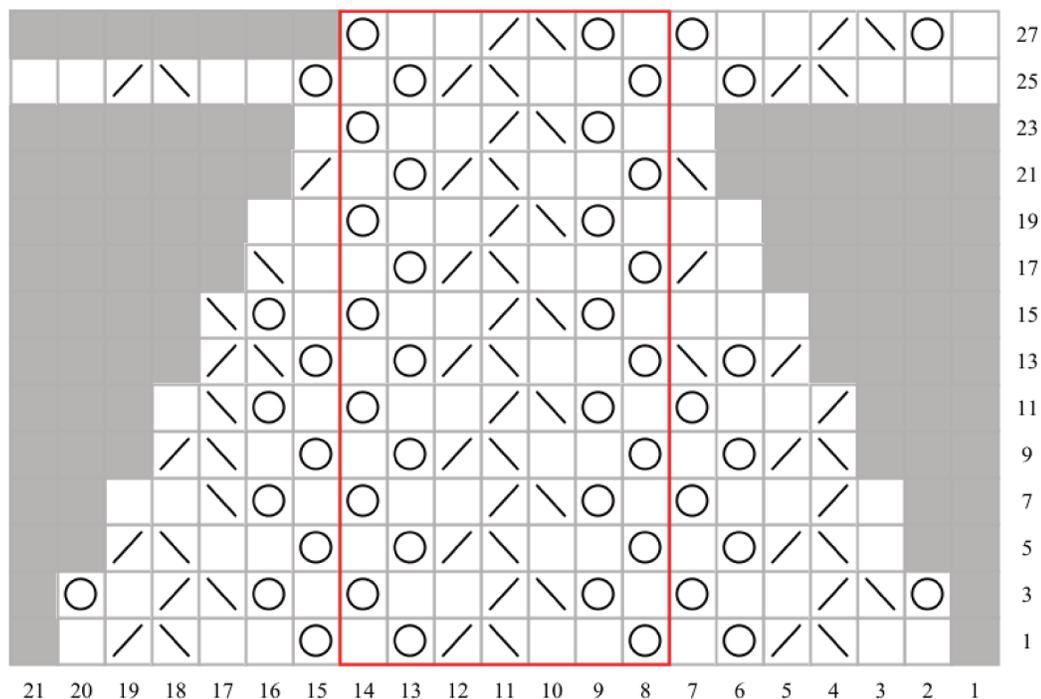

Written Instructions for Chart #1:

Row 1: (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat to BOR.
 Row 2 & all subsequent even rounds: Knit when working in the round or purl when working flat.
 Row 3: (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat to BOR.
 Row 4: Knit when working in the round or purl when working flat.

Chart #2 (Sleeve Decreases)



Written Instructions for Chart #2:

Round 1: k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 7 stitches, yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, k1.
 Round 2 & all subsequent even rows: Knit.
 Round 3: yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last 6 stitches, k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k1, yo.
 Round 5: k1, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 6 stitches, yo, k2, ssk, k2tog.
 Round 7: k1, k2tog, k2, yo, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last 5 stitches, k1, yo, ssk, k2.
 Round 9: ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 5 stitches, yo, k1, ssk, k2tog.
 Round 11: k2tog, k2, yo, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last 4 stitches, k1, yo, ssk, k1.
 Round 13: k2tog, yo, ssk, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 4 stitches, yo, ssk, k2tog.
 Round 15: k3, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last 3 stitches, k1, yo, ssk.
 Round 17: k1, k2tog, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 3 stitches, k1, ssk.
 Round 19: k2, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last 2 stitches, k2.
 Round 21: ssk, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 2 stitches, k2tog.
 Round 23: k1, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to last stitch, k1.
 Round 25: k3, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1), repeat parentheses to last 8 stitches, yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2.
 Round 27: k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, (k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo), repeat parentheses to end.
