




## Crochet pattern By Marina Ayueva

### Currant Romper *#currant\_romper\_crochet*

Sizes:

3 months, 6 months, 12 months, 18  
months, 2 years, 3 years

#### Construction drawing



#### **Yarns and notions:**

Yarn: Air DROPS (150m/50g) – 2(2,3,3,3,4) balls.

Hook: 3.00 mm (for the main body) and 2.50 (for the ribbings) or any to obtain gauge and half-size smaller one for the ribbings.

Notions: measuring tape, scissors, 8 buttons, stitch markers, tapestry needle.


**Gauge on larger hook:** make a gauge swatch 20 sts \* 20 rows in single crochet stitch, wet-block and measure: **10cm\*10,7cm [4\*4.2"]**

#### Finished measurements in cm and inches (after blocking)

## Construction

The romper is made as a one-piece (see the drawing below), beginning from the back side ribbing (blue arrow), then gusset, front panel and straps, then the piece is folded in the gusset area, leg openings are done and the buttons are sewn in. You will see the general information on this page and later, then stitch key and charts and after that main instructions for each size separately, which say precisely what to do. I kindly ask you to read through the whole text before you begin, it really helps imagine the needed steps and understand the instructions better. Good luck and happy crocheting!



### Stitches and abbreviations:

st(s) – stitch(es);  
 sc – single crochet;  
 dc – double crochet;  
 FPdc – Front post double crochet  
 BPdc – Back post double crochet;

FPtr – Front post treble crochet;

RS – right side;

WS – wrong side;

Pattern “Currant” – follow the chart instructions when you see these words;

2 rows below – these words mean that the next stitch (it’s usually a Front Post stitch) will go into the Post Stitch in the row previous to the last one – not in WS row, but the RS row under it.

### Stitch key



– ch



– turning ch



– sc



– dc



– sl st



– **sc2tog** – decrease: 2 singles together;



– FPdc



– BPdc;



– FPTr



– **Bobble** – 5-7 trebles together in 1 stitch;

please, note, that this stitch is made in a stitch 2 rows below, usually another FPTr of a RS row.



– *right-sided twist*: skip 1 st, FPTr in st 2 rows below, FPTr in skipped st 2 rows below above the 1<sup>st</sup> FPTr.



– *left-sided twist*: skip st, FPTr in st 2 rows below, FPTr in skipped stitch 2 rows below behind the 1<sup>st</sup> FPTr.


Right-sided twist and left-sided twist are used on both sides of the pattern “Currant” on RS rows only, thus, we skip singles of the WS row and make both post stitches in stitches of another RS row (2 rows below). Please, enjoy the video-instructions to be sure you’re making everything right.

### Charts used in the pattern

This pattern uses 2 main patterns: [ribbing 2\\*2 \(click to see the video-instructions\)](#) and [Pattern "Currant" for 3-18 months \(click to see the video-instructions\)](#) or [Pattern "Currant" for 2-3 years \(click to see the video-instructions\)](#) (choose the needed Pattern “Currant” depending on the size you’re working on)

**Important note:** 2 turning chains in the beginning of the row/round substitute the sc stitch and 3 turning chains in the beginning of the row substitute the dc stitch. Include the turning chains as 1 stitch in the stitch count.

**Chart 1. Ribbing 2\*2**




Stitch number must be multiple to 2 in a row and to 4 in a round.

Row 1 (RS): ch-3 to begin, turn, dc in each stitch

Row 2 (WS): ch-3 to begin, turn, [BPdc in next 2 dc, FPdc in next 2 dc]\*repeat, end up with a dc in turning chains.

Row 3 (RS): ch-3 to begin, turn, [FPdc in next 2 BPdc, BPdc in next 2 FPdc]\*repeat, end up with a dc in turning ch.

**Chart 2. Pattern “Currant” for sizes 3-18 months**



Row 1 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 7 sc, FPtr in next 2 sc 2 rows below, sc in next 7 sc, left-sided twist.

Row 2,4,...14 (WS) and all even: 20 sc (1 sc in next 20 stitches).

Row 3 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 5 sc, FPtr in 1<sup>st</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 5 sc, left-sided twist.

Row 5 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, left-sided twist.


Row 7 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, left-sided twist.

Row 9 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, left-sided twist.

Row 11 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 4 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 4 sc, left-sided twist.

Row 13 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 4 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 4 sc, left-sided twist.

**Chart 3. Pattern “Currant” for sizes 2,3 years**



Row 1 (RS): right-sided twist, sc in next 8 sc, FPtr in next 2 sc 2 rows below, sc in next 8 sc, left-sided twist.

**Row 2,4,...14 (WS) and all even: 22 sc (1 sc in next 22 stitches).**

Row 3 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 6 sc, FPtr in 1<sup>st</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 6 sc, *left-sided twist*.

Row 5 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 4 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 4 sc, *left-sided twist*.

Row 7 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 3 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, *left-sided twist*.

Row 9 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 2 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in 2<sup>nd</sup> FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, *left-sided twist*.

Row 11 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 5 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 5 sc, *left-sided twist*.

Row 13 (RS): *right-sided twist*, sc in next 5 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, FPtr in next 2 FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 2 sc, bobble in FPtr 2 rows below, sc in next 5 sc, *left-sided twist*.

50 row: 2 turning ch, 35 sc.

Make buttonholes in rows 51-52, 63-64, 75-76:

51 (63, 75) rows: 2 turning ch, 2 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 3 sc, 20 sts of pattern «Currant» (beginning from the 1<sup>st</sup> row of the chart), 3 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 3 sc;

52 (64, 76) rows: 2 turning ch, 35 sc;

53-62, 65-74, 77-94 rows:

-in RS rows: 2 turning ch, 7 sc, 20 sts of pattern «Currant», 8 sc;

-in WS rows: 2 turning ch, 35 sc.

Your last row is 94th, don't break the yarn, proceed with the Straps instructions.

## 6 months

Cast on 86 ch.

Your last row is 116th, don't break the yarn, proceed with the Straps instructions.

 70 row: 2 turning ch, 43 sc.  
 Make buttonholes in rows 69-70, 85-86, 99-100.  
 71 (85, 99) rows: 2 turning ch, 2 sc, 2 ch(skip 2 sts of the row below), 6 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 6 sc, 2 ch, 3 sc;  
 72 (86, 100) rows: 2 turning ch, 43 sc;  
 73-84, 87-98, 101-120 rows:

-in RS rows: 2 turning ch, 10 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 11 sc;

-in WS rows: 2 turning ch, 43 sc.

Your last row is 120th, don't break the yarn, proceed with the Straps instructions.

### 3 years

Cast on 102 ch.

Make 3 rows of 2\*2 ribbing following Chart 1.

1-32 row: 2 turning ch, 101 sc;

33 row: 2 turning ch, 93 sc (8 sts left);

34 row: 2 turning ch, 85 sc (8 sts left);

35 row: 2 turning ch, 80 sc (5 sts left);

36 row: 2 turning ch, 75 sc (5 sts left);

37 row: 2 turning ch, 70 sc (5 sts left);

38 row: 2 turning ch, 65 sc (5 sts left);

39 row: 2 turning ch, 60 sc (5 sts left);

40 row: 2 turning ch, 55 sc (5 sts left);

41 row: 2 turning ch, 50 sc (5 sts left);

42 row: 2 turning ch, 45 sc (5 sts left);

43 row: 2 turning ch, 40 sc (5 sts left);

44 row: 2 turning ch, 35 sc (5 sts left);

45 row: 2 turning ch, 32 sc (3 sts left);

46 row: 2 turning ch, 29 sc (3 sts left);

47 row: 2 turning ch, 27 sc (2 sts left);

48 row: 2 turning ch, 25 sc (2 sts left);

49 row: 2 turning ch, 23 sc (2 sts left);

50 row: 2 turning ch, 21 sc (2 sts left);

51 row: 2 turning ch, 19 sc (2 sts left);

52 row: 2 turning ch, 17 sc (2 sts left);

53 row: 2 turning ch, 7 sc, 2 FPdc, 8 sc;

54 row: 2 turning ch, 17 sc;

55 row: 2 turning ch, 7 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 8 sc;

56 row: 2 turning ch, 17 sc;

57 row: 2 turning ch, 7 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 8 sc;

58 row: 2 turning ch, 17 sc;

59 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 7 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 8 sc, increase;

60 row: 2 turning ch, 19 sc;

61 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 8 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 9 sc, increase;

62 row: 2 turning ch, 21 sc;

63 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 9 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 10 sc, increase;

64 row: 2 turning ch, 23 sc;

65 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 2 FPdc, 8 sc, 2 FPtr 2 rows below, 8 sc, 2 FPdc, 1 sc, increase;

66 row: 2 turning ch, 25 sc;

67 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 1 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant» (beginning from the 1st row of the chart), 2 sc, increase;

68 row: 2 turning ch, 27 sc;

69 row: 2 turning ch, increase, 2 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 3 sc, increase;

70 row: 2 turning ch, 29 sc;

71 row: 2 turning ch, 3 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 4 sc, 8 ch;

72 row: 2 turning ch, sc in each ch (total 7), 30 sc, 8 ch;

73 row: 2 turning ch, sc in each ch (total 7), 4 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 12 sc;

74 row: 2 turning ch, 45 sc;

Make buttonholes in rows 75-76, 91-92, 107-108.

75 (91, 107) rows: 2 turning ch, 2 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 7 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 7 sc, 2 ch, 3 sc;

76 (92, 108) rows: 2 turning ch, 45 sc;

77-90, 94-106, 109-130 rows:

-in RS rows: 2 turning ch, 11 sc, 22 sts of pattern «Currant», 12 sc;

-in WS rows: 2 turning ch, 45 sc.

Your last row is 130th, don't break the yarn, proceed with the Straps instructions.

## Straps

*Right strap:* put the item in front of you with the RS facing, ch-2 (turning chains) and make 1 sc in next 7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 11) sts (total width of a strap is 8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 12) sts), turn. Make 44 (46, 50, 50, 56, 56) more turning rows and then proceed with the last 6 rows with the buttonholes as follows:

### 3 months:

-RS row: 2 turning ch, 2 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 3 sc;

-WS row: 2 turning ch, 7 sc

### 6 months:

-RS row: 2 turning ch, 2 sc, 3 ch (skip 3 sts of the row below), 3 sc;

-WS row: 2 turning ch, 8 sc;

### 12 months:

-RS row: 2 turning ch, 3 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 4 sc;

-WS row: 2 turning ch, 9 sc

### 18 months and 2 years:

-RS row: 2 turning ch, 3 sc, 3 ch (skip 3 sts of the row below), 4 sc;

-WS row: 2 turning ch, 10 sc;

### 3 years:

-RS row: 2 turning ch, 4 sc, 2 ch (skip 2 sts of the row below), 5 sc;


-WS row: 2 turning ch, 11 sc.

Now we're finishing the strap with a triangle shaping for the next 6 rows: make 2sc together decreases in the beginning and the end of RS rows, and sc in each st in WS rows. Cut off.

*Left strap:* Count 8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 12) from the left side of the front with the RS facing, fix working yarn into the last one and go with: 2 turning ch, 7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 11) sc. Repeat instructions as for the right strap.


### Leg openings:

Fold the piece: the back sides of the back towards the center (along **vertical green lines** on the drawing below) and the front panel above the back along the gusset area (see the **horizontal green line** on the drawing below) with the RS side facing and make sure the edge 8 stitches of the front on both sides are above the corresponding 8 sts of the back side (**red horizontal lines** on the drawing below), so that your romper now looks like that:




Fix a new working yarn in the bottom of the gusset where the romper folds and proceed with the edging (consists of 3 turning rounds):






- sc of the first round of leg opening



On a straight edge, with no increases  
make 3sc out of 4 rows



On an edge with increases also make 3sc  
out of 4 rows



On an edge with decreases make 1  
additional sc in the first st of a cropped  
row

When you reach the place of the overlap, insert the hook through both panels, thus, sewing them together for all 8 sts. Count the stitches in the round as you go, it should be a multiple of 4. Make 2 more rounds with BPdc and FPdc ribbing, as the chart says. Cut off. Repeat for the second leg opening.

Sew in the buttons: you have 2 on the back side ribbing, parallel to the straps; 3 on each side of the folded part of the back, corresponding to the buttonholes on the front panel. If you want to tighten the “waist” area, you can sew in the buttons a little bit farer from the edge.

Weave in all the loose ends, wet-block the romper.
