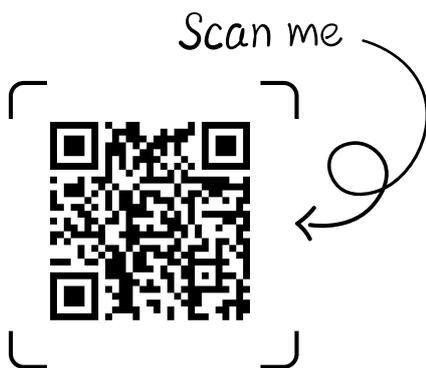

# DAISY CHAIN SCARF

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Thank you for choosing to knit The Daisy chain scarf. A playful project for all seasons.

Inspired by the charm of daisy chains and the feeling of a warm breeze, this little scarf is designed to add a sweet touch to any outfit.

Knitted from tip to tip, it grows to a soft point in the middle before tapering again, with petal like motifs and tiny bobbles forming a summery pattern that runs along its length. An i-cord edge gives it a clean, modern finish, and the length is adjustable depending on how you'd like to wear it. Try it knotted once at the neck, tucked into a jacket, or worn long and loose on cooler evenings.

Made in my Devon 4ply yarn which is a soft blend of Exmoor Blueface and Romney, it's light and breezy, with just enough texture to show off the detail. A perfect project for slow afternoons, or whenever your hands need something simple and sweet to work on.



# PATTERN DETAILS

Sizes: One size (see instructions on page 5 & 6 for adding repeats)

Finished measurements:

Sample 1: Length 109 cm/ 43"

Width 24.5 cm/ 9.75"

Sample 2: Length 150 cm/ 59"

Width 41 cm/ 16"

Needles: Size 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles, 40 cm/16" or 80 cm/32" long or needle size to obtain gauge

Cable needle if not using the 'no cable needle' method

Notions: Tapestry needle, cable needle, stitch markers

Gauge: 14 sts x 28 rows = 5.7 cm x 9 cm/2.25" x 3.5" in motif

Yarn: Annabel Williams Devon 4ply (4ply weight, 80% Romney, 20% Exmoor Blueface, 400 m/437.5 yds per 100g/3.5oz skein) 1 skein

The light green sample in colourway *Picnic Blanket* was knit without the midsection increases and decreases to make a narrow scarf. It used 240 m / 262.5 yds (1 skein).

The pale pink sample in colourway *Pink Daisy* was knit with extra midsection repeats to make a longer shawl. It used 460 m / 503 yds (2 skeins).

## Notes before you begin

I-cord edges can feel tight when working increases or decreases closely. In both samples, an "i-cord boost" was used to add stretch to the work every 10 rows or so - [Stretchier I-Cord Edge](#)

# ABBREVIATIONS

2/2/2 LPC	Slip 2 sts to cn and hold to front, slip next 2 sts to second cn and hold to back, k2 from LH needle, p2 from back cn, k2 from front cn
3 DC B	Purl 1. [Knit into next st, leaving the LH needle in place, knit into st on the RH needle], 3 times, keeping original st on LH needle. YO, pull through all 3 loops. Bring yarn to front of work, then purl original st from LH needle.
cn	Cable needle
K	Knit
K2tog	Knit 2 sts together
LH	Left hand
m1l	make 1 left
m1p	make 1 left purl
m1r	make 1 right
P	Purl
pm	Place marker
P2tog	Purl 2 sts together
RH	Right hand

sl	Slip stitch(es) purlwise

# INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 3 sts using the long-tail cast-on.

## Set up

Row 1 (WS): P all sts

Row 2 (RS): K1, m1r, k1, m1l, k1 (2 sts increased, 5 sts)

Row 3: P2, k1, p2

Row 4: K2, m1r, p1, m1l, k2 (2 sts increased, 7 sts)

Row 5: P3, k1, p3

Row 6: K3, m1p, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 8 sts)

Row 7: P3, k2, sl3 wyif

## Note

The edge stitches at each end are not shown in the charts but are included in the written instructions below. If not following the written instructions, work Rows 1 - 28 of Chart A, with the first 4 and last 4 sts of every row worked as follows:

Edge Stitch Instructions (for all rows following the set-up):

RS: K3, p1, sm, [chart], sm, p1, sl3 wyib

WS: P3, k1, sm, [chart], sm, k1, sl3 wyif

### Chart A section

Row 1 (RS): K3, p1, pm, m1l, pm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 9 sts)  
Row 2 (WS): P3, k1, sm, k all sts, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 3: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 10 sts)  
Row 4: Repeat row 2  
Row 5: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p2, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 11 sts)  
Row 6: Repeat row 2  
Row 7: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p3, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 12 sts)  
Row 8: Repeat row 2  
Row 9: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p4, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 13 sts)  
Row 10: Repeat row 2  
Row 11: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p5, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 14 sts)  
Row 12: Repeat row 2  
Row 13: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p6, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 15 sts)  
Row 14: P3, k1, sm, k4, p2, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 15: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p1, k1, yo, ssk, p3, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 16 sts)  
Row 16: P3, k1, sm, k3, p3, k2, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 17: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p2, k2, yo, ssk, p2, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 17 sts)  
Row 18: P3, k1, sm, k2, p4, k3, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 19: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k1, p2, k3, yo, ssk, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 18 sts)  
Row 20: P3, k1, sm, k1, p5, k2, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 21: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p2, yo, ssk, k3, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 19 sts)  
Row 22: P3, k1, sm, k1, p4, k4, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 23: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p4, yo, ssk, k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 20 sts)

Row 24: P3, k1, sm, k1, p3, k6, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 25: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p6, yo, ssk, k1, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 21 sts)  
Row 26: P3, k1, sm, k1, p2, k8, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 27: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2, p3, 3 DC B, p3, k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (2 sts increased, 23 sts)  
Row 28: P3, k1, sm, k1, p2, k3, k2tog, k4, p2, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif (1 st decreased, 22 sts)

You now have a total of 22 sts on your needles and are ready to move onto Chart B.

### Chart B section

#### Following the chart

Work Rows 1 - 28 of Chart B, working the outlined pattern repeat once, with the first 4 and last 4 sts of every row worked as follows:

RS: K3, p1, sm, [chart], sm, p1, sl3 wyib  
WS: P3, k1, sm, [chart], sm, k1, sl3 wyif

#### Following the written instructions

Rows 1 - 28. Work the instructions in square brackets once.

Row 1 (RS): K3, p1, sm, m1l, [p1, k1, yo, ssk, p6, k2tog, yo, k1, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 23 sts)  
Row 2 (WS): P3, k1, sm, [k1, p3, k6, p3, k1], k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 3: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p1, [p1, k2, yo, ssk, p4, k2tog, yo, k2, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 24 sts)  
Row 4: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p4, k4, p4, k1], k2, sm, k1, sl3 wyif  
Row 5: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k1, p1, [p1, k3, yo,

ssk, p2, k2tog, yo, k3, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 25 sts)

Row 6: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p5, k2, p5, k1], k1, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 7: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p1, [p1, yo, ssk, k3, p2, k3, k2tog, yo, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 26 sts)

Row 8: P3, k1, sm, [(k2, p4) × 2, k2], k2, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 9: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p2, [p2, yo, ssk, k2, p2, k2, k2tog, yo, p2], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 27 sts)

Row 10: P3, k1, sm, [k3, p3, k2, p3, k3], k3, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 11: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p3, [p3, yo, ssk, k1, p2, k1, k2tog, yo, p3], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 28 sts)

Row 12: P3, k1, sm, [k4, p2, k2, p2, k4], k4, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 13: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2, p3, [3 DC B, p3, 2/2/2 LPC, p3], p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (2 sts increased, 30 sts)

Row 14: P3, k1, sm, [k4, p2, k2, p2, k3, k2tog], k4, p2, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif (1 sts decreased, 29 sts)

Row 15: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p1, k1, yo, ssk, p3, [p3, k2tog, yo, k1, p2, k1, yo, ssk, p3], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 30 sts)

Row 16: P3, k1, sm, [k3, p3, k2, p3, k3], k3, p3, k2, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 17: K3, p1, sm, m1l, p2, k2, yo, ssk, p2, [p2, k2tog, yo, k2, p2, k2, yo, ssk, p2], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 31 sts)

Row 18: P3, k1, sm, [(k2, p4) × 2, k2], k2, p4, k3, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 19: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k1, p2, k3, yo, ssk, p1, [p1, k2tog, yo, k3, p2, k3, yo, ssk, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 32 sts)

Row 20: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p5, k2, p5, k1], k1, p5, k2, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 21: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p2, yo, ssk, k3, p1, [p1, k3, k2tog, yo, p2, yo, ssk, k3, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 33 sts)

Row 22: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p4, k4, p4, k1], k1, p4, k4, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 23: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p4, yo, ssk, k2, p1, [p1, k2, k2tog, yo, p4, yo, ssk, k2, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 34 sts)

Row 24: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p3, k6, p3, k1], k1, p3, k6, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 25: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2tog, yo, p6, yo, ssk, k1, p1, [p1, k1, k2tog, yo, p6, yo, ssk, k1, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st increased, 35 sts)

Row 26: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p2, k8, p2, k1], k1, p2, k8, p1, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 27: K3, p1, sm, m1l, k2, p3, 3 DC B, p3, [2/2/2 LPC, p3, 3 DC B, p3], k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (3 sts increased, 38 sts)

Row 28: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p2, k3, k2tog, k4, p2, k1], k1, p2, k3, k2tog, k4, p2, k1, sm, k1, sl3 wyif (2 sts decreased, 36 sts)

### Following the chart

Work Rows 1–28 of Chart B four more times, working the 14-stitch section marked in red one additional time each repeat.

### Following the written instructions

Work Rows 1-28 above four more times, continuing to increase by 1 stitch on every right-side row and working the instructions in the square brackets one additional time per repeat.

At this point, you will have 92 stitches on your needles and be ready to move on to Chart C.

### Midpoint Instructions: Optional repeats and adjusting for length

You've now reached the midpoint of your scarf. From here, you have two options:

1. Proceed to Chart C and begin working the decreases as written.
2. Add extra length by working the 28-stitch/28-row pattern marked in red on Chart B as many times as you like, ending with Row 28.

If you choose to add length, you can:

- Work the 28-row repeats with increases, continuing the shaping to create a pointed shawl shape.
- Omit the increases for a flat midsection and a longer, more rectangular scarf.

**Tip:** If you include increases in these additional repeats, make a note of how many repeats you add. You'll need to mirror the same number of repeats with decreases in Chart C. If you omit the increases, no adjustment is needed for Chart C.

### **Cable row adjustment (for repeats without increases)**

If a repeat begins with a cable and you are not increasing:

- Start of Row: Work the first 3 sts as per the previous row.
- End of Repeat: Replace the last 3 sts of the repeat with the cable.
- Final 3 sts: Work in established pattern.

### **Following the charted instructions (No increases)**

If following the charted instructions without increasing:

- Work the first 4 and last 4 sts of every row as established.
- Work full repeats of the 28-row repeat.
- For Row 13: You will not be able to work the first 3 DC: Replace this with a p1 (so you start the repeat with p4 only for the first time working the boxed

stitches). After you have completed the last repeat you should have 5 sts left on the needle. Work these as p1, p1, sl3 wyib.

- For Row 27, you will not be able to work the first cable. Replace these 3 stitches with p1, k2. After you have completed the last repeat, you should have 7 sts left on the needle; work these as k2, p1, p1, sl3 wyib.

### **Following the written instructions (No increases)**

If following the written instructions without increasing:

- Work only the stitches in square brackets.
- Work the first 4 and last 4 sts of every row as established.
- Work full repeats of the 28-row repeat.
- Replace the written Row 13 instructions with the row below:
- Row 13: K3, p1, sm, p4, 2/2/2 LPC, p3, (3 DC B, p3, 2/2/2 LPC, p3), p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib
- Replace the written Row 27 instructions with the row below:  
Row 27: K3, p1, sm, p1, k2, p3, 3 DC B, p3, k2, p1, (2/2/2 LC, p4, 3DC B, p4), k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib

### **Chart C section - Decreases**

#### **Following the chart**

The decreases are not shown in Chart C. Work Rows 1 - 28, working the stitch pattern repeat marked in red on Chart C four times or one less than the number of times you have for Chart B. Work the first 4 and last 4 sts of every row worked as follows:

RS: K3, p2tog, [chart], sm, p1, sl3 wyib  
WS: P3, k1, sm, [chart], k1, sl3 wyif

## Following the written instructions

Work Rows 1 - 28, working the instructions in parentheses four times or for one less than the number of times you have for Chart B.

Remove the first stitch marker during Row 1 below.

Row 1 (RS): K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p6, k2tog, yo, k1, p1, [p1, k1, yo, ssk, p6, k2tog, yo, k1, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 91 sts)

Row 2 (WS): P3, k1, sm, [k1, p3, k6, p3, k1], k1, p3, k6, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 3: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p4, k2tog, yo, k2, p1, [p1, k2, yo, ssk, p4, k2tog, yo, k2, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 90 sts)

Row 4: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p4, k4, p4, k1], k1, p4, k4, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 5: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p2, k2tog, yo, k3, p1, [p1, k3, yo, ssk, p2, k2tog, yo, k3, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 89 sts)

Row 6: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p5, k2, p5, k1], k1, p5, k2, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 7: K3, p2tog, p1, k1, p2, k3, k2tog, yo, p1, [p1, yo, ssk, k3, p2, k3, k2tog, yo, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 88 sts)

Row 8: P3, k1, sm, [(k2, p4) × 2, k2], k2, p4, k2, p1, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 9: K3, p2tog, p3, k2, k2tog, yo, p2, [p2, yo, ssk, k2, p2, k2, k2tog, yo, p2], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 87 sts)

Row 10: P3, k1, sm, [k3, p3, k2, p3, k3], k3, p3, k3, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 11: K3, p2tog, p2, k1, k2tog, yo, p3, [p3, yo, ssk, k1, p2, k1, k2tog, yo, p3], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 86 sts)

Row 12: P3, k1, sm, [k4, p2, k2, p2, k4], k4, p2, k2, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 13: K3, p2tog, p1, k2, p3, [3 DC B, p3, 2/2/2 LPC, p3], p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (89

sts)

Row 14: P3, k1, sm, [k4, p2, k2, p2, k3, k2tog], k4, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif (4 sts decreased, 85 sts)

Rows 15: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p3, [p3, k2tog, yo, k1, p2, k1, yo, ssk, p3], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 84 sts)

Row 16: P3, k1, sm, [k3, p3, k2, p3, k3], k3, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 17: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p2, [p2, k2tog, yo, k2, p2, k2, yo, ssk, p2], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 83 sts)

Row 18: P3, k1, sm, [(k2, p4) × 2, k2], k2, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 19: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p1, [p1, k2tog, yo, k3, p2, k3, yo, ssk, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 82 sts)

Row 20: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p5, k2, p5, k1], k1, p2, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 21: K3, p2tog, p1, k1, p1, [p1, k3, k2tog, yo, p2, yo, ssk, k3, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 81 sts)

Row 22: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p4, k4, p4, k1], k1, p1, k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 23: K3, p2tog, p2, [p1, k2, k2tog, yo, p4, yo, ssk, k2, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 80 sts)

Row 24: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p3, k6, p3, k1], k2, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 25: K3, p2tog, p1, [p1, k1, k2tog, yo, p6, yo, ssk, k1, p1], sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 79 sts)

Row 26: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p2, k8, p2, k1], k1, k1, sl3 wyif

Row 27: K3, p2tog, p1, k2, [p3, 3 DC B, p3, 2/2/2 LPC], p3, 3 DC B, p3, k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (82 sts)

Row 28: P3, k1, sm, [k1, p2, k3, k2tog, k4, p2, k1], k1, sl3 wyif (4 sts decreased, 78 sts)

## Following the chart

Work Rows 1–28 of Chart C four more times, repeating the 14-stitch section red

boxed repeat one fewer time per repeat. For the last repeat here, you will not work the stitches in the red boxed repeat at all and will instead only work the stitches outside the marked repeat.

### Following the written Instructions

Work Rows 1-28 above four more times, continuing to decrease by 1 stitch on every right-side row and working the instructions in the square brackets one fewer time per repeat.

At this point, you will have 22 stitches on your needles and be ready to move on to Chart D.

### Chart D section

#### Note

If not following the written instructions, work Rows 1 - 26 of Chart D, working the first 4 sts and the last 4 sts as established.

Row 1 (RS): K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p6, k2tog, yo, k1, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 21 sts)

Row 2 (WS): P3, k1, sm, k1, p3, k6, p2, k2, sl3 wyif

Row 3: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p4, k2tog, yo, k2, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 20 sts)

Row 4: P3, k1, sm, k1, p4, k4, p1, k3, sl3 wyif

Row 5: K3, p2tog, p1, yo, ssk, p2, k2tog, yo, k3, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 19 sts)

Row 6: P3, k1, sm, k1, p5, k2, p2, k2, sl3 wyif

Row 7: K3, p2tog, p1, k1, p2, k3, k2tog, yo, p1, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 18 sts)

Row 8: P3, k1, sm, k2, p4, k2, p1, k2, sl3 wyif

Row 9: K3, p2tog, p3, k2, k2tog, yo, p2, sm,

p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 17 sts)

Row 10: P3, k1, sm, k3, p3, k4, sl3 wyif

Row 11: K3, p2tog, p2, k1, k2tog, yo, p3, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 16 sts)

Row 12: P3, k1, sm, k4, p2, k3, sl3 wyif

Row 13: K3, p2tog, purl to marker, sm, p1, sl3 wyib (1 st decreased, 15 sts)

Row 14: P3, k1, sm, knit to last 3 sts, sl3 wyif

Rows 15 - 26: Repeat rows 13 - 14 (9 sts)

### Final rows and finishing

Row 1 (RS): K3, p2tog, p1, sl3 wyib (8 sts)

Row 2 (WS): P3, k2tog, sl3 wyif (7 sts)

Row 3: K2, k2tog, k3 (6 sts)

Row 4: P2, p2tog, p2 (5 sts)

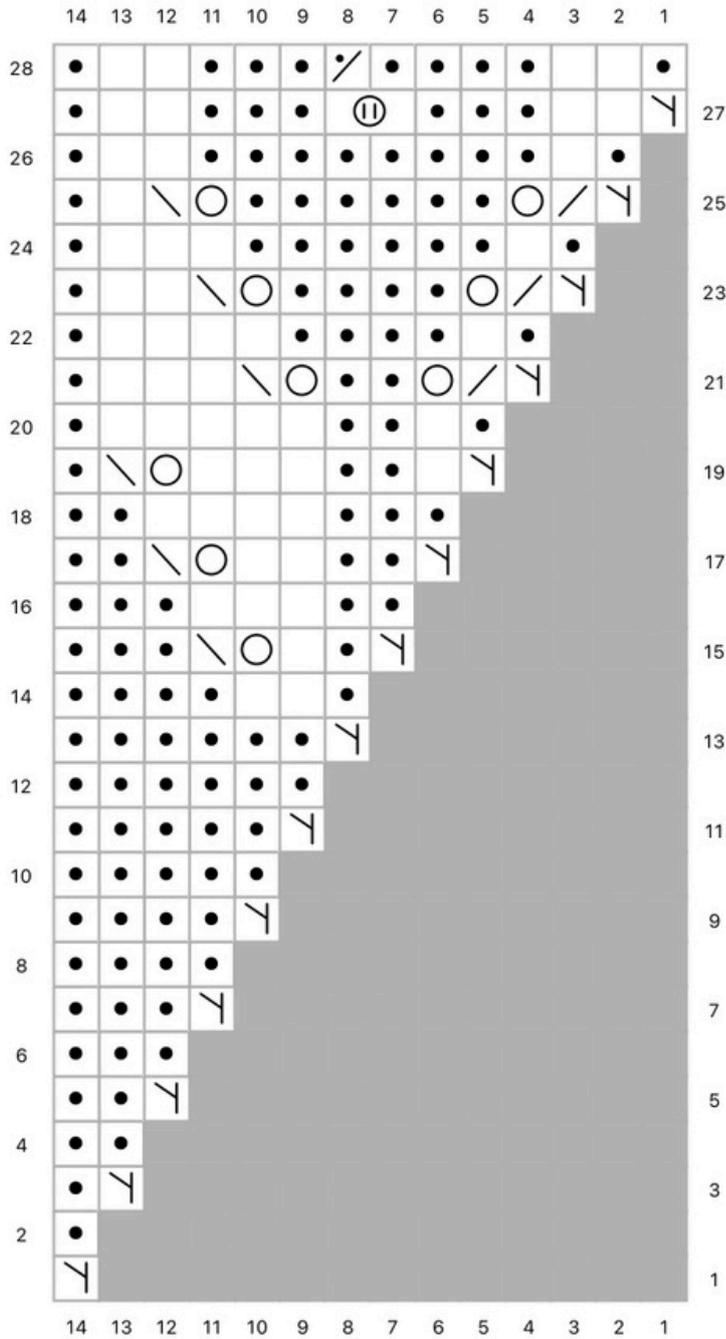
Row 5: K2tog, k1, k2tog (3 sts)

Row 6: P3tog, pull yarn up through loop.

Weave in ends

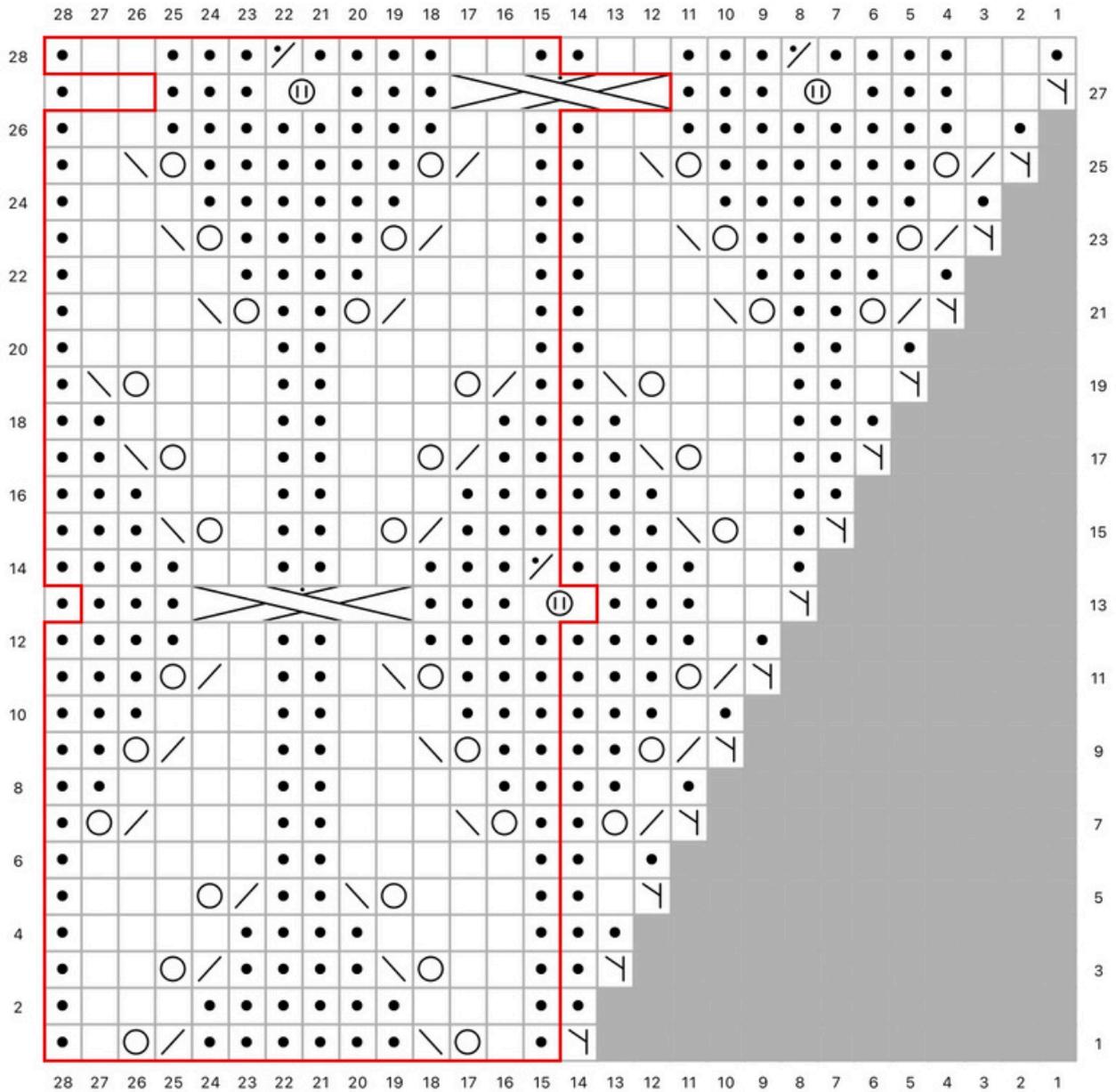
Wash and block to the measurements given on page 2. Consider using blocking wires and pins when blocking to reveal the motif to its fullest.

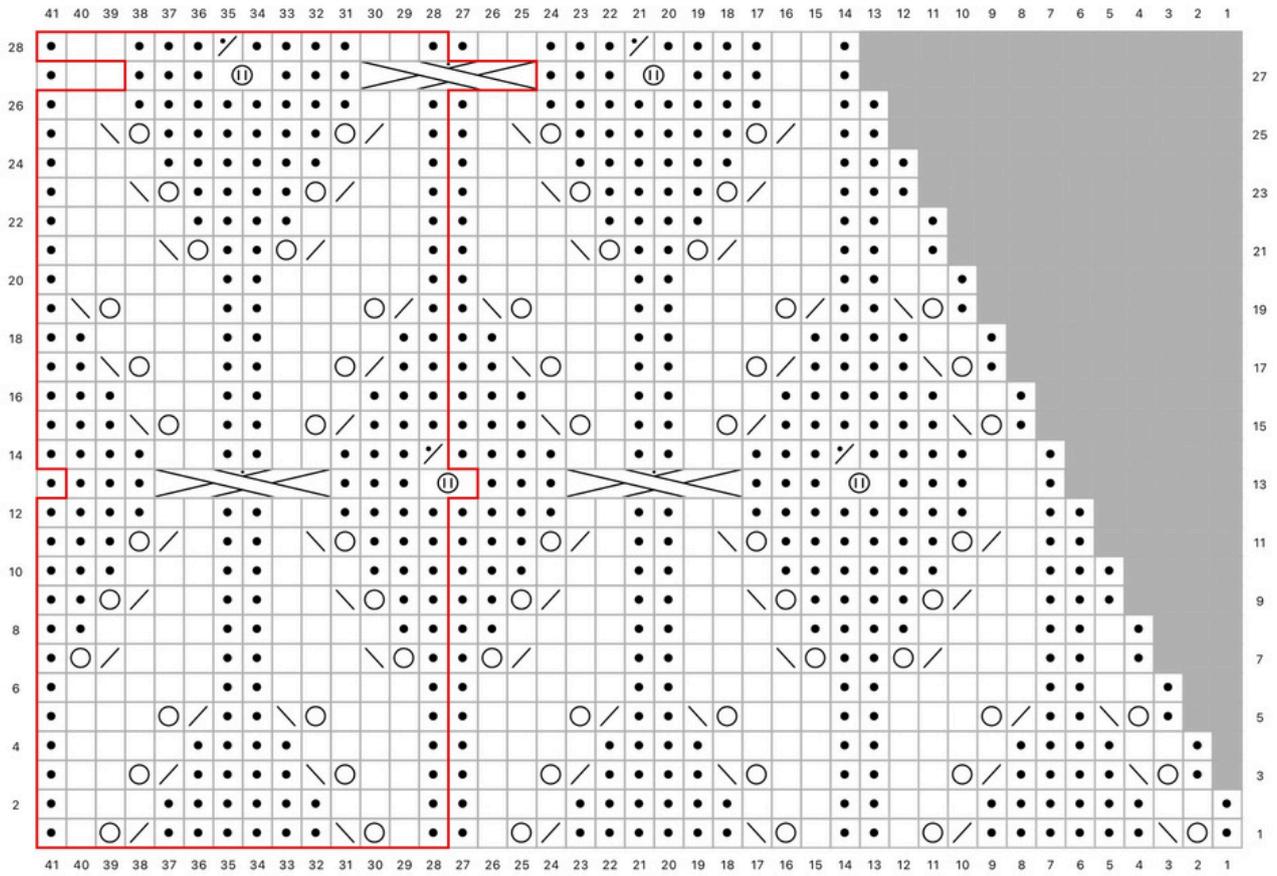

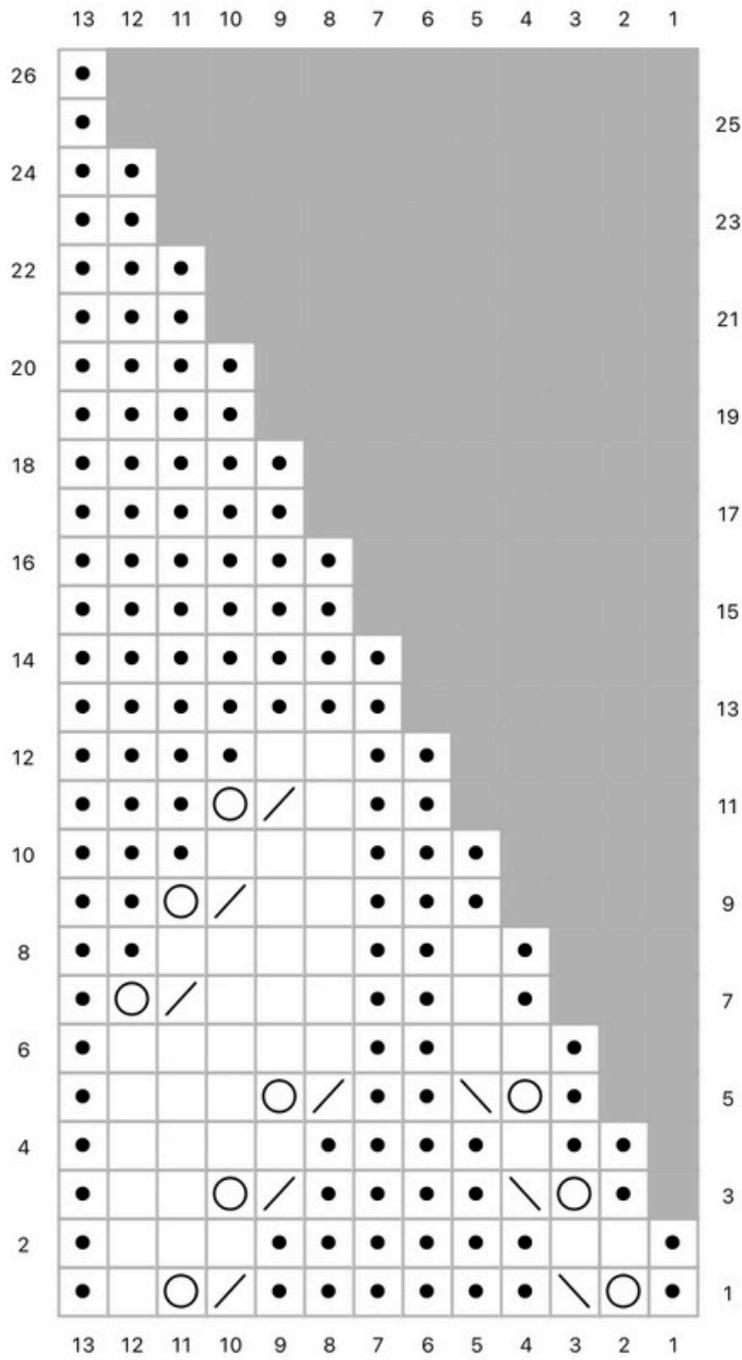
