



DEW DROPS SCARF

An airy lace pattern creates eye-catching graphic lines on this lovely, lightweight scarf.

It has been designed to beautifully showcase your most precious skein of fingering weight, hand-dyed yarn.

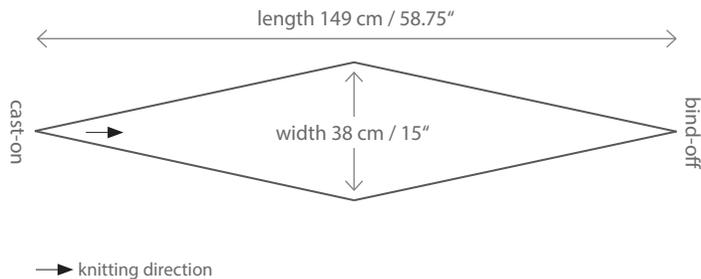

SHAPE & MEASUREMENTS

Dew Drops Scarf is a long sideways-knit shawllette or scarf. You start knitting at one tip, then work your way across to the opposite tip, creating an elongated diamond shape by first increasing and then decreasing along the edges.

The schematic shows the finished shape and the measurements of the sample:



MATERIALS & GAUGE

Yarn: Designed for a single 100 g-skein of fingering weight yarn. The pattern is easily adjustable for other yarn weights and/or yardages.

Yarn used for sample:

Pink Queen Yarns Eliza (fingering weight, 69% Silk, 21% Baby Suri, 10% Nylon, 100 g = 350 m / 383 yd), 0.95 skeins used (95 g = 333 m / 363 yd) in colourway Feivel.

Gauge: Is not critical for this project, but differences will affect yardage requirements and the finished size.

Gauge on sample: 24 sts x 36 rows = 10 x 10 cm / 4 x 4" in eyelet pattern after light blocking.

Needles: 3.5 mm / US 4 or size to obtain gauge.

Notions: Stitch markers, scales to weigh your yarn, tapestry needle, blocking tools.

NOTES

This scarf features a wonderful lace or eyelet pattern that creates striking diagonal lines which are framed by a garter border. The direction of those lines mirrors in the middle for an eye-catching graphic effect.

This pattern has been designed to showcase a precious skein of fluffy fingering weight, hand-dyed yarn. It provides lots of options for easy adjustments though if you wish to use a different yarn weight and/or make a smaller/larger scarf according to the yardage you have available.

The edges are worked with a built-in i-cord edging. Please be careful to work your edge stitches fairly loosely so they can stretch properly.

As pages 6 - 7 (charts) are laid out in portrait format, I suggest printing those separately to avoid any printer confusion.

I hope you'll enjoy knitting this pattern!

ABBREVIATIONS

k	= knit	p	= purl
k2tog	= knit 2 sts together (1 st decreased)	rep	= repeat

m1L	= "make 1 left", left leaning increase: Lift strand between the needles from <i>front to back</i> and knit into the back loop. (1 st increased)	sl1wyif	= slip 1 st with yarn in front of work
m1R	= "make 1 right", right leaning increase: Lift strand between the needles from <i>back to front</i> and knit into the front loop. (1 st increased)	sl3wyif	= slip 3 sts with yarn in front of work
		ssk	= slip slip knit: Slip next 2 sts knitwise, one at a time, then knit these 2 sts together through the back loops. (1 st decreased)
		st(s)	= stitch(es)
		WS	= wrong side of work

HOW TO MAKE THE SCARF

The pattern contains fully written as well as charted instructions, so you can choose which you prefer to work from. The row numbering is the same on both versions. That way, you can work from one and also use the other as reference if you like. Please follow the directions on page 3.

The scarf starts at one tip and is worked with increases along the edges until half of the yarn is used up. The second half is then worked with decreases ending on the opposite tip.

I highly recommend you wash and gently block your finished scarf to the shape shown in the schematic as this will even out the stitches and give the knitted fabric a nice drape.



DIRECTIONS

Please make sure you weigh your yarn before you start. If you have plenty of yardage and would just like to work your scarf the same as the original sample, you don't need to do this, but this pattern is easily customizable to the yardage you have available or your desired size. So, to be able to take advantage of this flexibility, I recommend weighing your yarn to start with and then after each repeat to calculate how many more repeats you'll be able to knit.

You'll use one half of your yarn for the Increase Section and the other half for the Decrease Section.

Please use the written instructions on pages 4 - 5 or the charts on pages 6 - 7 and follow the directions below.



1) INCREASE SECTION

Cast on 7 sts using the long-tail method and work Rows 1 - 78 from the **INCREASE TIP**.

24 sts increased = 31 sts total.

Then work and repeat Rows 79 - 114 from the **INCREASE MAIN PART** until you've used up half of your yarn or reached your desired final length for the Increase Section (which will be half of your total scarf length).

Please weigh your yarn after each repeat to see how much you've used so far. You need to save the same amount of yarn for the second half of your scarf.

You can stop this part after several different rows before starting to decrease, depending on your liking or the yardage you have available. The table below shows where you can stop and also with which row to start the decrease section accordingly.

For my sample I worked five full repeats (+ 5 x 12 sts) and then another Rows 79 - 84 (+ 2 sts).
62 sts increased if worked as per sample = 93 sts total.

2) DECREASE SECTION

Start the **DECREASE MAIN PART** with the row specified in the table above and work up to Row 36.

Then work and repeat Rows 1 - 36 from the **DECREASE MAIN PART** until you have **33 sts left after a Row 36**.

For my sample I worked Rows 33 - 36 (- 0 sts) and then Rows 1 - 36 five times (- 5 x 12 sts).
60 sts decreased if worked as per sample = 33 sts total.

Then work Rows 37 - 114 from the **DECREASE TIP**.
26 sts decreased = 7 sts total.

Bind off all sts as follows:
k3tog, k1, lift first st on right hand needle over second st.
k3tog, lift first st over second st.

Cut your yarn. Pull yarn end through to secure and weave in your yarn ends.

Enjoy your new scarf!

WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS - INCREASE SECTION

INCREASE TIP

Row 1 (RS): K4, sl3wyif.

Row 2 (WS): K4, sl3wyif.

Rows 3 - 6: Repeat Rows 1 - 2.

Row 7: K3, m1L, k1, m1R, sl3wyif. (9 sts)

Rows 8 - 12: K6, sl3wyif.

Row 13: K3, m1L, k3, m1R, sl3wyif. (11 sts)

Rows 14 - 18: K8, sl3wyif.

Row 19: K3, m1L, k5, m1R, sl3wyif. (13 sts)

Rows 20 - 24: K10, sl3wyif.

Row 25: K3, m1L, k7, m1R, sl3wyif. (15 sts)

Rows 26 - 30: K12, sl3wyif.

Row 31: K3, m1L, k9, m1R, sl3wyif. (17 sts)

Rows 32 - 36: K14, sl3wyif.

Row 37: K3, m1L, k11, m1R, sl3wyif. (19 sts)

Row 38: K9, p1, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 39: K16, sl3wyif.

Rows 40 - 41: Repeat rows 38 - 39.

Row 42: Repeat row 38.

Row 43: K9, m1L, k1, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (21 sts)

Row 44: K9, p3, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 45: K18, sl3wyif.

Rows 46 - 47: Repeat rows 44 - 45.

Row 48: Repeat row 44.

Row 49: K9, m1L, k3, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (23 sts)

Row 50: K9, p5, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 51: K20, sl3wyif.

Row 52: Repeat row 50.

Row 53: K10, k2tog, yo, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 54: Repeat row 50.

Row 55: K9, m1L, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (25 sts)

Row 56: K9, p7, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 57: K9, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 58: Repeat row 56.

Row 59: K22, sl3wyif.

Row 60: Repeat row 56.

Row 61: K9, m1L, k7, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (27 sts)

Row 62: K9, p9, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 63: K24, sl3wyif.

Row 64: Repeat row 62.

Row 65: K12, k2tog, yo, k10, sl3wyif.

Row 66: Repeat row 62.

Row 67: K9, m1L, k2, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k2, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (29 sts)

Row 68: K9, p11, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 69: K11, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 70: Repeat row 68.

Row 71: K10, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 72: Repeat row 68.

Row 73: K9, m1L, k2tog, yo, k7, yo, ssk, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (31 sts)

Row 74: K9, p13, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 75: K9, k2tog, yo, k9, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 76: Repeat row 74.

Row 77: K14, k2tog, yo, k12, sl3wyif.

Row 78: K9, p7, **place centre marker (m)**, p6, k6, sl3wyif.

INCREASE MAIN PART

From now on, work as follows:

RS: Always work (**repeat 1**) until you reach the centre marker, slip marker, k1, then work (**repeat 2**).

Please note: In Rows 89, 101 and 113 [!] the marker will sit in between the 2 sts you'll work as a k2tog. Once you get to 1 st before the marker, slip this st to the right hand needle and

remove your marker. Then slip the st back to the left hand needle and work k2tog. Place marker, then work yo, k1. Now, work repeat 2.

WS: Those rows are all purl between the garter borders, so just slip the centre marker as you come to it.

Row 79 (RS): K9, m1L, (**k4, k2tog, yo**) rep to m, k1, (**yo, ssk, k4**) rep to last 9 sts, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 80 (WS) and all following WS rows: K9, p to last 9 sts, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 81: K10, (**k3, k2tog, yo, k1**) rep to m, k1, (**k1, yo, ssk, k3**) rep to last 10 sts, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 83: K10, (**k2, k2tog, yo, k2**) rep to m, k1, (**k2, yo, ssk, k2**) rep to last 10 sts, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 85: K9, m1L, k1, (**k1, k2tog, yo, k3**) rep to m, k1, (**k3, yo, ssk, k1**) rep to last 10 sts, k1, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 87: K11, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 11 sts, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 89 [!]: K10, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 10 sts, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 91: K9, m1L, k2tog, yo, (**k4, k2tog, yo**) rep to m, k1, (**yo, ssk, k4**) rep to last 11 sts, yo, ssk, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 93: K9, k2tog, yo, k1, (**k3, k2tog, yo, k1**) rep to m, k1, (**k1, yo, ssk, k3**) rep to last 12 sts, k1, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 95: K12, (**k2, k2tog, yo, k2**) rep to m, k1, (**k2, yo, ssk, k2**) rep to last 12 sts, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 97: K9, m1L, k3, (**k1, k2tog, yo, k3**) rep to m, k1, (**k3, yo, ssk, k1**) rep to last 12 sts, k3, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 99: K13, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 13 sts, k10, sl3wyif.

Row 101 [!]: K12, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 12 sts, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 103: K9, m1L, k2, k2tog, yo, (**k4, k2tog, yo**) rep to m, k1, (**yo, ssk, k4**) rep to last 13 sts, yo, ssk, k2, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 105: K11, k2tog, yo, k1, (**k3, k2tog, yo, k1**) rep to m, k1, (**k1, yo, ssk, k3**) rep to last 14 sts, k1, yo, ssk, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 107: K10, k2tog, yo, k2, (**k2, k2tog, yo, k2**) rep to m, k1, (**k2, yo, ssk, k2**) rep to last 14 sts, k2, yo, ssk, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 109: K9, m1L, k2tog, yo, k3, (**k1, k2tog, yo, k3**) rep to m, k1, (**k3, yo, ssk, k1**) rep to last 14 sts, k3, yo, ssk, m1R, k6, sl3wyif. (+ 2 sts)

Row 111: K9, k2tog, yo, k4, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 15 sts, k4, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 113 [!]: K14, (**k2tog, yo, k4**) rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, (**k4, yo, ssk**) rep to last 14 sts, k11, sl3wyif.

Row 114 (WS): Repeat row 80.

WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS - DECREASE SECTION

DECREASE MAIN PART

Please note: For this part, the centre marker will sit in between the 2 sts you'll work as a k2tog in Rows 1, 13 and 25 [!]. Remove and replace the marker here as established.

Row 1 (RS) [!]: K8, ssk, k5, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 15 sts, k5, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 2 (WS) and all following WS rows: K9, p to last 9 sts, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 3: K13, k2tog, yo, *(k4, k2tog, yo)* rep to m, k1, *(yo, ssk, k4)* rep to last 15 sts, yo, ssk, k10, sl3wyif.

Row 5: K12, k2tog, yo, k1, *(k3, k2tog, yo, k1)* rep to m, k1, *(k1, yo, ssk, k3)* rep to last 15 sts, k1, yo, ssk, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 7: K8, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, *(k2, k2tog, yo, k2)* rep to m, k1, *(k2, yo, ssk, k2)* rep to last 15 sts, k2, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 9: K9, k2tog, yo, k3, *(k1, k2tog, yo, k3)* rep to m, k1, *(k3, yo, ssk, k1)* rep to last 14 sts, k3, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 11: K14, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 14 sts, k11, sl3wyif.

Row 13 [!]: K8, ssk, k3, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 13 sts, k3, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 15: K11, k2tog, yo, *(k4, k2tog, yo)* rep to m, k1, *(yo, ssk, k4)* rep to last 13 sts, yo, ssk, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 17: K10, k2tog, yo, k1, *(k3, k2tog, yo, k1)* rep to m, k1, *(k1, yo, ssk, k3)* rep to last 13 sts, k1, yo, ssk, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 19: K8, ssk, k3, *(k2, k2tog, yo, k2)* rep to m, k1, *(k2, yo, ssk, k2)* rep to last 13 sts, k3, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 21: K12, *(k1, k2tog, yo, k3)* rep to m, k1, *(k3, yo, ssk, k1)* rep to last 12 sts, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 23: K12, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 12 sts, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 25 [!]: K8, ssk, k1, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k2tog, yo, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 11 sts, k1, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 27: K9, k2tog, yo, *(k4, k2tog, yo)* rep to m, k1, *(yo, ssk, k4)* rep to last 11 sts, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 29: K11, *(k3, k2tog, yo, k1)* rep to m, k1, *(k1, yo, ssk, k3)* rep to last 11 sts, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 31: K8, ssk, k1, *(k2, k2tog, yo, k2)* rep to m, k1, *(k2, yo, ssk, k2)* rep to last 11 sts, k1, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (- 2 sts)

Row 33: K10, *(k1, k2tog, yo, k3)* rep to m, k1, *(k3, yo, ssk, k1)* rep to last 10 sts, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 35: K10, *(k2tog, yo, k4)* rep to m, k1, *(k4, yo, ssk)* rep to last 10 sts, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 36 (WS): Repeat Row 2.

DECREASE TIP

Remove your centre marker now before continuing with Row 37.

Row 37 (RS): K8, ssk, k5, k2tog, yo, k6, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (31 sts)

Row 38 (WS): K9, p13, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 39: K13, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k10, sl3wyif.

Row 40: Repeat row 38.

Row 41: K12, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k9, sl3wyif.

Row 42: Repeat row 38.

Row 43: K8, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (29 sts)

Row 44: K9, p11, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 45: K9, k2tog, yo, k7, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 46: Repeat row 44.

Row 47: K26, sl3wyif.

Row 48: Repeat row 44.

Row 49: K8, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo, k4, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (27 sts)

Row 50: K9, p9, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 51: K11, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k8, sl3wyif.

Row 52: Repeat row 50.

Row 53: K10, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k7, sl3wyif.

Row 54: Repeat row 50.

Row 55: K8, ssk, k7, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (25 sts)

Row 56: K9, p7, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 57: K22, sl3wyif.

Rows 58 - 59: Repeat rows 56 - 57.

Row 60: Repeat row 56.

Row 61: K8, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (23 sts)

Row 62: K9, p5, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 63: K9, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 64: Repeat row 62.

Row 65: K20, sl3wyif.

Row 66: Repeat row 62.

Row 67: K8, ssk, k3, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (21 sts)

Row 68: K9, p3, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 69: K18, sl3wyif.

Rows 70 - 71: Repeat rows 68 - 69.

Row 72: Repeat row 68.

Row 73: K8, ssk, k1, k2tog, k5, sl3wyif. (19 sts)

Row 74: K9, p1, k6, sl3wyif.

Row 75: K16, sl3wyif.

Rows 76 - 77: Repeat rows 74 - 75.

Row 78: Repeat row 74.

Row 79: K3, ssk, k9, k2tog, sl3wyif. (17 sts)

Rows 80 - 84: K14, sl3wyif.

Row 85: K3, ssk, k7, k2tog, sl3wyif. (15 sts)

Rows 86 - 90: K12, sl3wyif.

Row 91: K3, ssk, k5, k2tog, sl3wyif. (13 sts)

Rows 92 - 96: K10, sl3wyif.

Row 97: K3, ssk, k3, k2tog, sl3wyif. (11 sts)

Rows 98 - 102: K8, sl3wyif.

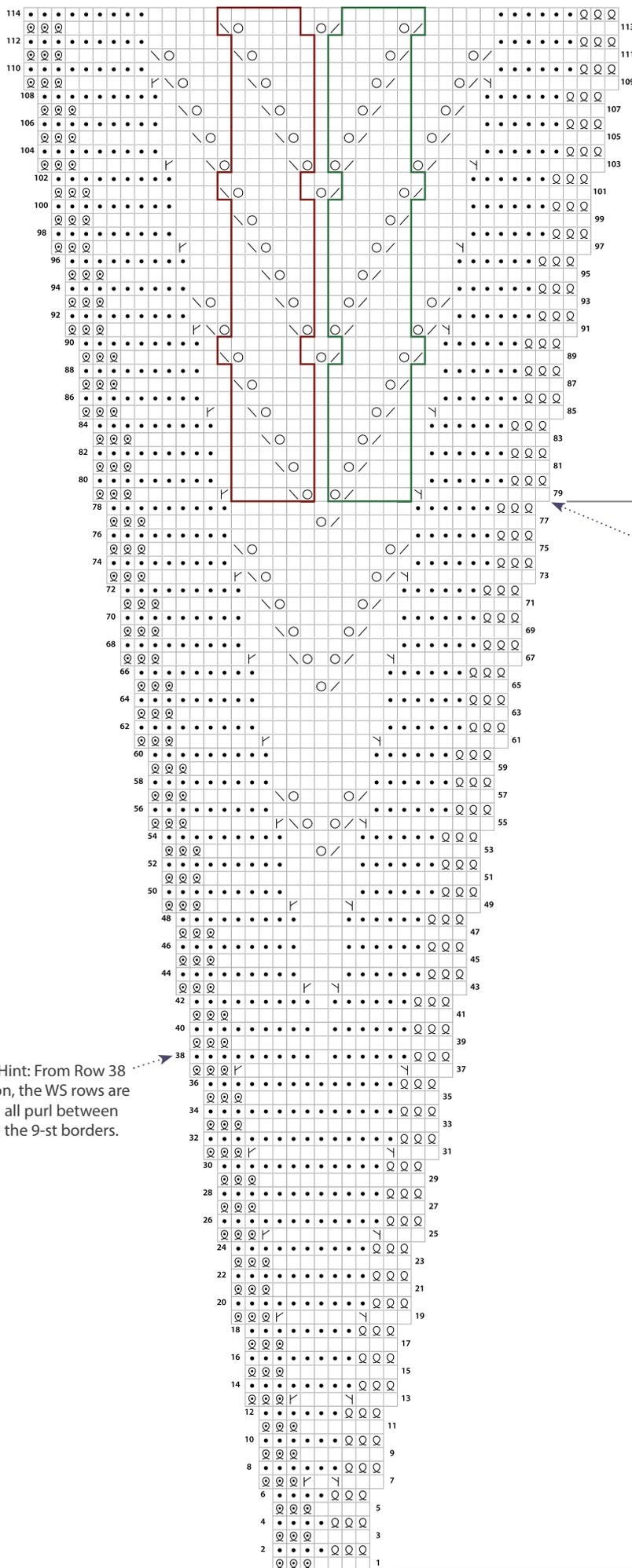
Row 103: K3, ssk, k1, k2tog, sl3wyif. (9 sts)

Rows 104 - 108: K6, sl3wyif.

Row 109: K3, centred double decrease (= Slip 2 sts together knitwise, k1, then pass slipped sts over.), sl3wyif. (7 sts)

Rows 110 - 114: K4, sl3wyif.

Note for all charts:

Use these charts while following the main directions on page 3.

Please make sure you always use the corresponding chart and rows for each section.

All odd-numbered rows are RS rows (read from right to left).

All even-numbered rows are WS rows (read from left to right).

Before you start Row 79, place a marker in the middle, so you have 15 sts before and 16 sts after the marker.

From now on, work as follows:

RS: Always work repeat 1 until you reach the centre marker, slip marker, k1, then work repeat 2.

Please note: In Rows 89, 101 and 113 this marker will sit in between the 2 sts you'll work as a k2tog. Once you get to 1 st before the marker, slip this st to the right hand needle and remove your marker. Then slip the st back to the left hand needle and work k2tog. Place marker, then work yo, k1. Now, work repeat 2.

WS: Those rows are all purl between the garter borders, so just slip the centre marker as you come to it.

Hint: From Row 38 on, the WS rows are all purl between the 9-st borders.

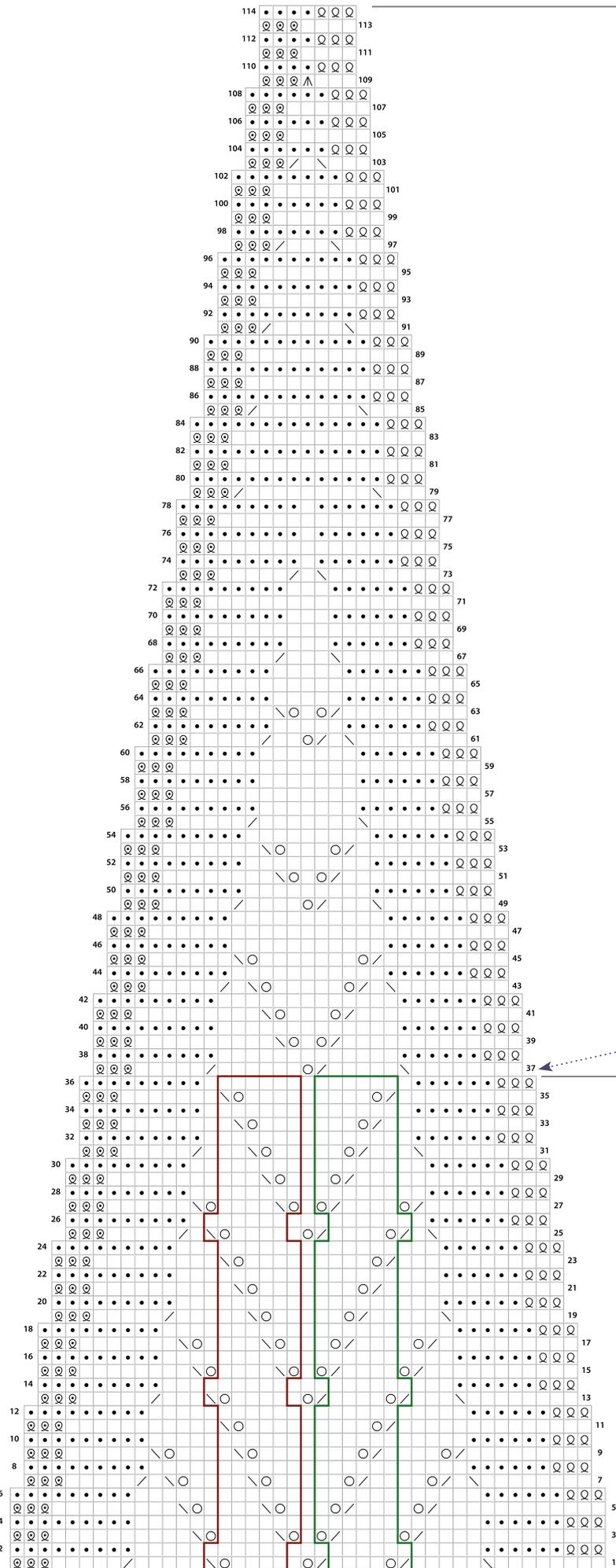

When you start Row 37, you can remove your centre marker.

Please note: For this part, the centre marker will sit in between the 2 sts you'll work as a k2tog in Rows 1, 13 and 25. Remove and replace the marker here as established.
