## MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 54 (60) cm / 21.25 (23.5) inches

Length: 39 (39) cm / 15.5 (15.5) inches

## PATTERN INFORMATION

The Dorthea Cowl is worked from the bottom up. First, you knit the two identical ribbed edges, then join them together to continue working stranded knitting in the round according to the chart.

Circular needles 3.5 and 4.5 mm, 40 cm

1 stitch marker

**YARN QUALITY** **Natural Wool**, COPENHAGEN Fibers

100% Wool

50 g = 91 m

 **Brushed Alpaca**, COPENHAGEN Fibers

52% Alpaca, 23% Wool, 25% Polyamide

50 g = 110 m

**GAUGE**20 sts x 22 r = 10 x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in color work  
using needles 4.5 mmAlways use the needle size that gives you the  
correct gauge in both height and width,  
measured after washing and blocking.**ABBREVIATIONS**

St(s) = stitch(es)

R = row(s)

K = knit

P = purl

P2tog = purl 2 sts together

PM = place marker

Sl1wyif = slip 1 stitch with yarn in front as if to  
purlM1L =( make one left) Pick up the bar between  
two stitches front to back using the left-hand  
needle. Knit this bar through the back loop.M1LP = (make one left, purl) Pick up the bar  
between two stitches front to back using the  
left-hand needle. Purl this bar through the back  
loop.M1R = (make one right) Pick up the bar between  
two stitches back to front using the left-hand  
needle. Knit this bar through the front loop.M1RP = (make one right, purl) Pick up the bar  
between two stitches back to front using the  
left-hand needle. Purl this bar through the front  
loop.

## TECHNIQUES

### Stranded knitting with color dominance

When you knit with more than one color, it is important to hold the yarns the same way throughout the entire project, as it greatly affects how the pattern appears—especially with vertical stripes. Always let the same color be the dominant, making your colorwork appear even and clear.

The dominant color should lie closest to the work, meaning closest to you and the needle. When you carry both yarns over your left index finger, place the dominant color towards the palm of your hand. The other color should be placed farther out, for example over your index and middle finger, towards the nails.

On the wrong side, the strands must run in the same order to keep the dominance consistent. Be mindful to hold the yarns the same way even when working from the wrong side.

If there is a long distance between stitches in the same color, you may need to trap the yarns on the back. Do this by crossing the yarns one way before a stitch and back again after the stitch.

# PATTERN

## RIBBED EDGES

CO 43 (49) sts on circular needles 3.5 using color B and the long-tail cast-on. Work back and forth in rib stitch with two selvedge stitches in each side as follows:

1. row (wrong side): sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.
2. row (right side): k2, [p1, k1] until 3 sts remain, p1, k2.
3. row: sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.
- 4.-5. row: continue in rib stitch working sts as they appear between the 2 selvedge sts in each side.
6. row: k2, p1, k1, M1LP, work sts as they appear until 4 sts remain, M1RP, k1, p1, k2. 2 sts increased.
7. row: sl2wyif, k1, p1, k2, work sts as they appear until 6 sts remain, k2, p1, k1, sl2wyif.
8. row: k2, p1, k1, p1, M1L, work sts as they appear until 5 sts remain, M1R, p1, k1, p1, k2. 2 sts increased.
9. row: sl2wyif, [k1, p1] until 3 sts remain, k1, sl2wyif.
- 10.-15. row: continue in rib stitch working sts as they appear between the 2 selvedge sts in each side.

Repeat 6.-15. row a total of 3 times = 55 (61) sts. Continue in rib stitch until work measures 12 cm / 4.75 inches.

Let work rest and make one more ribbed edge the same way.

## COWL

Join the two ribbed edges on circular needles 3.5 mm and work in the round as follows: sl1wyif, PM for beg of round, \*work 53 (59) sts in rib stitch as sts appear, p2tog, \* repeat from \* to \* 1 more time = 108 (120) sts.

Change to circular needles 4.5 and start working the colorwork pattern in the round according to the chart. Work the 12 sts a total of 9 (10) times on each round until the 51 rows of the chart have been worked. The chart is read from the bottom up, right to left.


## RIBBED EDGE

Change to circular needles 3.5 and color B. Knit 1 round and then work 4 cm / 1.5 inches of rib stitch in the round [k1, p1]. On the next round BO loosely in rib stitch.

## FINISHING

Weave in all ends. Wash according to the yarn's label and block to measurements.
