

Double Knit Scarf



▣ Gauge & Materials

| | |
|----------------|--|
| Yarn | Cardiff Classic 112 m / 25 g 300 m / 67 g SAMPLE: Beige: #509(Silver) / Brown: #511(Brown) / Navy: #647(Cosmo) |
| Needles | Circular needles 4.0 mm [US6](Needle length: 11 cm [5"]~) + Cable length: 60 cm [24"] or Knitting needles 4.0 mm[US6] |
| Others | Waste yarn or a stitch holder, Tapestry needle, Crochet hook (for finishing) |
| Gauge | 25 sts × 29 rows = 10 × 10 cm [4 × 4"] in double knitting on 4.0 mm [US6] needles, after wet blocking. For reference (10 × 10 cm [4 × 4"] / 4.0 mm [US6] needle): Stockinette stitch 22 sts × 33 rows (after wet blocking) Refer to "How to Check Gauge" |

▣ About Yarn

This scarf is knitted using Cardiff Classic yarn. The yarn is irresistibly soft and light. Its luxurious texture makes your project look and feel as beautiful as something purchased from a high-end boutique, so I highly recommend it.

▣ How to Check Gauge

This scarf is entirely knitted using double knitting technique. The method allows you to knit both the front and back layers simultaneously, creating a seamless double-layered fabric. Though the scarf is knitted using double knitting, I recommend checking your gauge in stockinette to be time efficient.

Stockinette Stitch Gauge / Measured with a swatch (Needle size: 4.0 mm [US6]):

Knit a 15 cm [6"] square swatch in stockinette stitch. After washing, lay it flat to dry and check the gauge.

Before blocking : 23 sts × 33 rows

After blocking : 22 sts × 33 rows

For reference:

Double Knitting Gauge / Measured from the finished scarf

Before blocking: 23 sts × 31 rows / After blocking: 25 sts × 29 rows



▣ Sizes & Blocking



You can adjust the size by changing the length. (The width is one size.)
Refer to P3 and try it on to determine your preferred length.

Blocking is recommended, as it results in a smooth, beautiful fabric. However, keep in mind that the size may change slightly after blocking.
The measurements provided above reflect the actual size before and after blocking: the width shrank by 1.5 cm [1/2"], and the length increased by 4 cm [1 1/2"].* With this in mind, I recommend finishing the scarf slightly shorter than your desired length.

*These measurements are based on using Cardiff Classic yarn. Results may vary depending on the yarn you choose.

▣ Abbreviations

- K - Knit
- P - Purl
- RS - Right side
- sl1 wyif - Slip 1 purlwise with yarn in front
- st(s) - Stitch(es)
- WS - Wrong side


Using the Italian (tubular) cast-on technique, cast on 72 sts as follows:
First, leave a tail of yarn about 100 cm [40"], make a slip knot for the first st, and repeat *K1, P1* 35 times then K1.

row 1 (RS):
sl1 wyif, K1 Repeat *~* to end.

row 2 (WS):
sl1 wyif, K1 Repeat *~* to end.

Repeat rows 1-2 until you have worked 8 cm [3 1/4"], finishing with row 2.
(Note: On RS, the cast on yarn tail is on the right side. On WS, the cast on yarn tail is on the left side.)

From here, you will create slits for passing the ends of the scarf.

row 1 (RS):
 sl1 wyif, K1 repeat *~* 12 times (= 24sts), Turn.

row 2 (WS):
 sl1 wyif, K1 repeat *~* to the end.

Repeat rows 1-2 until you reach 8 cm [3¼"],
 ending with row 1.

Leaving the working yarn hanging loose, work the
 next and the last 24 sts in the same manner.

On the next WS, join the separated parts.
 sl1 wyif, K1 repeat *~* to the end(= 72 sts).

From the next row, repeat as follows:
 sl1 wyif, K1 repeat *~* until the end.

When you have reached 68 ~ 72 cm [26¾" ~
 28¾"] or your desired length* from the cast-on
 edge, ending with WS, finish with tubular
 bind-off.



▢ Finishing and Blocking

Weave in all ends. For the slits, break the yarn and threading the yarn ends through the two layers of double knitted fabric. Please refer to the video below.

Follow the yarn instructions for washing.
 Lay it flat to dry to prevent vertical stretching.



★ Length Guide (Measurements: before blocking)

Please try it on to determine the fit.

- 72 cm [28¼"]
 A unisex length. When worn by a woman, one side may be slightly longer, as shown in the picture on the right. This length is versatile, allowing you to wrap it loosely or over a coat.
- 70 cm [27½"]
 For those who prefer to wrap it snugly.
 (recommended for women's size L)
- 68cm [26¾"]
 For those who prefer to wrap it snugly.
 (recommended for women's size M)



Usually wear size M~L,
 height 175 cm [5'9"]



Usually wear size S,
 height 160 cm [5'3"]

The photos above show a comparison between men and women wearing a scarf with a length of 72 cm [28¼"] (76 cm [30"] after washing).
