## Dug Hat and Mittens

Here is the pattern for an adorable little hat and a pair of elegant mittens, both adorned with a decorative smock pattern that adds a delicate and modern touch. The hat and mittens are knitted in the softest blend of our organic merino wool, Önlings No 4, and the delicate silk mohair, Önlings No 10. The perfect set for chilly days, with the clear blue winter sky as a backdrop and the frost gently making its arrival. A warm and stylish set that embraces both comfort and beauty

### Hashtags

### Sizes

(S)M/L

### Hat

Height: (20)25 cm / (8)9½ inches

Circumference: (43)48 cm / (17)18 inches

### Mittens

Length: (24)26 cm / (9½)9¼ inches

Circumference: (19)22 cm / (7½)8¾ inches

### Materials

(100)100 g / (2) 2 balls of Önlings No 4, 100% fine organic merino wool, 50 g = app. 219 yards (200 meters)

(50)50 g / (2) 2 balls of Önlings No 10, 70% mohair, 30% silk, 25 g = app. 230 yards (210 meters)

This project is worked with a strand of each quality held together

**Recommended needles** circular needles sizes 3½ and 4 mm / US 4 and 6

Dobble-pointed needles sizes 3½ and 4 mm / US 4 and 6, unless using the Magic Loop method

5 markers

Scrap yarn in a contrasting color

### Gauge

23 sts and 28 rows in pattern on needle size 4 mm = 10 x 10 cm / US 6 = 4 x 4 inches

### Procedure

The hat and mittens are worked in the round, from the bottom up. Cast on stitches and work a rib edge, then switch to the wrap pattern and knit straight up, after which decreases are worked in the pattern, and stitches are bound off. The mittens are worked the same wrap pattern, but on the mittens, a contrasting yarn is worked in the middle of the work for the thumb. Finally, the

stitches from the contrasting yarn are picked up, and the thumb is knitted. The pattern may cause the hat and mittens to 'twist' slightly, but this can be straightened when washed and steamed afterwards.

### Explanations and Abbreviations

We have included all common explanations and abbreviations at the back of the pattern, so check there if there's something you don't understand or are unsure about. Below you'll find the explanations that are used specifically in this pattern **TIP!** If there's something you don't understand, try reading it out loud to yourself; that often helps.

### Abbreviations

beg – begin(ing)

cm – centimeter(s)

k – knit

k2tog – (decrease) knit 2 stitches together

M1 – Make 1 stitch (increase). Lift the strand of yarn running between the stitches onto the needle, then knit it through the back loop.

p – purl

p2tog – (decrease) purl 2 stitches together

PM – place marker

rnd(s) – round(s)

RS – right side

st(s) – stitch(es)

SM – slip marker


tog – together

bYO – backward yarn over

SSK – Slip, Slip, Knit (decrease). Slip two stitches one at a time as if to knit. Insert the left needle into the fronts of these two stitches and knit them together through the back loops.

### Wrap pattern

Yarn overs are worked backward = bYo , see illustration below:

Rnd 1: \*\*p 1, \*bYO, k 2, wrap the 2 knitted sts with the bYO\*, knit from \* to \* until 1 st before marker, p 1, SM\*\*, repeat from \*\* to \*\* to end of rnd.

Rnd 2: Work sts as set. (k knit sts and p purl sts)

Rnd 3: \*\*p 1, k 1, \*bYO, k 2, wrap the 2 knitted sts with the bYO\*, knit from \* to \* until 2 sts before marker, k 1, p 1, SM\*\*, repeat from \*\* to \*\* to end of rnd.

Rnd 4: Work sts as set.

Repeat rnds 1- 4 for pattern.

### Hat

Cast on (100)100 sts on needle size 3½ mm / US 4 with a strand of each quality.

Join for working in the rnd and PM to mark beg of rnd.

Work 6 cm / 2¼ inches rib as follows:

P 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat from \* to \* until 1 st before end of rnd, p 1.

Knit 1 rnd and place additional 4 markers for the pattern repeat division as follows:

**Size S:** \*P 1, k 18, p 1, PM\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of rnd.

**Size M/L:** \*P 1, k 2, M1, k 14, M1, k 2, p 1, PM\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of rnd.

There are now (100)110 sts on the rnd.

**NOTE!** The last marker is already placed at beg of rnd.

The pattern repeat described above is worked over (20)22 sts and repeated 5 times per rnd.

Change to needle size 4 mm / US 6 and work pattern until the hat measures (16)21 cm / (6¼)8¼ inches, ending with rnd 1.



### Decreases at the crown of the hat

Next round: \*p2tog, k until 2 sts before marker, p2tog, SM\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Next round: \*\*p 1, bYO, k 2, wrap the 2 knitted sts with the bYO\*, repeat from \* to \* until 1 st before marker, p 1, SM\*\*, repeat from \*\* to \*\* to end of rnd.

Repeat these 2 rnds until 4 sts remain per pattern repeat.

Break the yarn with a slightly longer yarn end and knit a rnd as follows:

\*k 2 tog, pull the yarn end through, SSK, pull the yarn end through, remove marker\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Turn the hat inside out, sew the yarn end through all sts twice, tighten and sew in ends.

### Mittens

Cast on (40)48 sts on needles size 3½ mm / US 4 with a strand of each quality.

Join for working in the rnd and PM to mark beg of rnd.

Work 6 cm / 2¼ inches rib as follows:

P 1, \*k 2, p 2\*, repeat from \* to \* until 1 st before end of rnd, p 1.

Knit 1 rnd and place 1 additional marker for the pattern repeat division as follows:

\*P 1, k 2, M1, k 14, M1, k 2, p 1\*, PM, repeat from \* to \* once more.

There are now (44)52 sts on the rnd.

**NOTE!** The pattern repeat described above is worked over (22)26 sts and repeated twice per rnd.

Change to needle size 4 mm / US 6 and work pattern until the mitten measures (12)13 cm / (4¾)5 inches, ending with rnd 1 or 3.

On next rnd thumb sts are placed on scarp yarn as follows:

**Left mitten:** Work the first (12)15 sts as set, with contrasting scrap yarn k (7)8 sts, break scrap yarn. Slip the (7)8 sts back to the left needle and knit the sts, work sts as set to end of rnd.

**Right mitten:** Work the first (3)3 sts as set, with contrasting scrap yarn k (7)8 sts, break scrap yarn. Slip

the (7)8 sts back to the left needle and knit the sts, work sts as set to end of rnd.

Continue in pattern until the mitten measures (21)21.5 cm / (8¼)8½ inches or (3)4.5 cm / (1¼)1¾ inches before full length.

Try the mitten on, if it needs to be shorter or longer, adjust the length here. Ending with rnd 1.

### Decreases on the top of the mitten

Next round: \*p2tog, k until 2 sts before marker, p2tog, SM\*, repeat from \* to \* once more.

Next round: \*\*p 1, bYO, k 2, wrap the 2 knitted sts with the bYO\*, repeat from \* to \* until 1 st before marker, p 1, SM\*\*, repeat from \*\* to \*\* once more.

Repeat these 2 rnds until (12)12 sts remain per pattern repeat.

There are (24)24 sts on the rnd.

Ending with rnd without decreases, work next rnd as follows:

\*k2tog, k until 2 sts before marker, SSK\*, repeat from \* to \* once more.

Break the yarn with a slightly longer yarn end, placing the remaining 10 sts for each pattern repeat on each needle.

Graft tog the top of the mitten from RS and sew in the ends.

### Thumb

Slip sts from scrap yarn to needle size 4 mm / US 6, picking up 1 extra st at each side.

There are (16)18 sts on the rnd.

Knit in the rnd, at the same time k2tog the 2 extra sts with the neighboring sts on the 1. rnd.

There are now (14)16 sts on the rnd.

When thumb measures approx. 6 cm / 2¼ inches, knit all sts k2tog to end rnd.

Break yarn and sew through remaining sts, tighten and sew in ends on the WS.

### Finishing

Wash hat and mitten and stretch it to the right measurements, straighten it out so it does not twist and let it dry flat. Steam it when it is dry.
