


Ellenkantarellens Cat Sofa organizer

☞ In this pattern I have used #4 Medium, Worsted acrylic yarn. I have used crochet hook 4.0 mm. It makes me happy if you want to sell things made from my pattern.....just don't forget to mention that it's a pattern from ellenkantarellen! Cat:

(Lilac, White & Grey acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The Cat is worked in one piece with continuous rounds and single crochet only!

☞ Start with Lilac yarn!

- Rnd.1** 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 1)
Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12)
Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18)
Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
Rnd.5 { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
Rnd.6 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.7 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.8 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)
Rnd.9 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)
Rnd.10 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 2)
Rnd.11-20 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 10 rnds (60) (fig 3)
Rnd.21 { dec, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54) (fig 4, 5)
Rnd.22 { dec, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)
Rnd.23 { dec, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.24 { dec, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.25 { dec, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
Rnd.26 { dec, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24) (fig 6)
Rnd.27 in BLO: { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30) (fig 7-9)
Rnd.28 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.29 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.30 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48) (fig 11, 12)

👉 Now you are going to work back and forth with rows instead of around (the opening on the back)!
Place a stitch marker on each side to make this super easy!

Rnd.31 30 sc (30) (fig 13), ch 1 (turning chain), turn (fig 14)

Rnd.32 30 sc (30) (fig 15-17)

Change to White yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn (fig 18)

Rnd.33-34 { 30 sc, ch1 (turning chain), turn } x 2 rows (30) (fig 19, 20)

Change to Lilac yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn

Rnd.35-39 { 30 sc, ch1 (turning chain), turn } x 5 rows (30) (fig 21)

Rnd.40 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of row (6 times) (36) (fig 22, 23)

Change to White yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn

Rnd.41-42 { 36 sc, ch 1 (turning chain), turn } x 2 rows (36) (fig 24)

Change to Lilac yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn

Rnd.43-48 { 36 sc, ch1 (turning chain), turn } x 6 rows (36) (fig 25)

Change to White yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn

Rnd.49-50 { 36 sc, ch 1 (turning chain), turn } x 2 rows (36) (fig 26)

Change to Lilac yarn! ch 1 (turning chain), turn

Rnd.51 36 sc, ch 12 (48) (fig 27, 28)

☞ Next rnd you make a sc in the first st of the rnd to connect the chain to the other side and continue working in rounds:

Rnd.52 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (both scs and chains) (48) (fig 29-33)

Rnd.53 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54) (fig 34)

Rnd.54 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 35)

Rnd.55 { inc, 9 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (66) (fig 36)

Rnd.56 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (66) (fig 37)



☞ Next rnd you are going to make another color change, but you don't want the change to show so you make half a rnd with lilac and then change to white (ä the color change ends up on the bottom!)

Rnd.57 24 sc (fig 38), **change to White yarn**, 42 sc (66) (fig 39, 40)

Rnd.58 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (66) (fig 41)

Rnd.59 24 sc (fig 42), **change to Lilac yarn**, 42 sc (66) (fig 43-45)

Rnd.60-68 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 9 rnds (66) (fig 46, 47)



- Rnd.69** { dec, 9 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 48, 49)
- Rnd.70** { dec, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)
- Rnd.71** { dec, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48) (fig 50)
- Rnd.72** { dec, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42) (fig 51)
- Rnd.73** { dec, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
- Rnd.74** { dec, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
- Rnd.75** { dec, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
- Rnd.76** { dec, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18) (fig 52)



👉 Now you are going to continue making the tail. Stuff the bottom, and the tail as you go!

- Rnd.77-82** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (18) (fig 53)
Change to White yarn! Start the round at the bottom so the color change doesn't show!
- Rnd.83-84** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (18) (fig 54, 55)
Change to Lilac yarn!
- Rnd.85-90** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (18) (fig 56)
Change to White yarn!
- Rnd.91-92** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (18) (fig 57)

Change to Lilac yarn!

Rnd.93-98 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (18)

Change to White yarn!

Rnd.99-100 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (18)

Change to Lilac yarn!

Rnd.101-106 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (18)

Change to White yarn!

Rnd.107-108 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (18)

Change to Lilac yarn!

Rnd.109-114 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (18)

Change to White yarn!


Rnd.115-116 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (18) (fig 58)

Change to Grey yarn!

Rnd.117-121 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 5 rnds (18)

Rnd.122 { dec, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12) (fig 59)


☞ Fasten off, weave a needle through remaining sts and pull tight (fig 60, 61), weave in ends! (fig 62, 63)



Bowl: (Lilac acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)


☞ The bowl is worked in one piece with continuous rounds and with single crochet only!
(right side facing in)


- Rnd.1** 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 1)
Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12)
Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18)
Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
Rnd.5 { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
Rnd.6 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.7 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.8 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)
Rnd.9 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)
Rnd.10 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 64)
Rnd.11 in FLO: 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (60) (fig 65-67)
Rnd.12-18 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 7 rnds (60) (fig 68)




☞ Now you are going to crochet the bowl to the back of the cat! You have more stitches on the body than on the bowl so along the long sides you need to make every other stitch an increase on the body and in one stitch in the bowl!

☞ Place the “Bowl” in the back of the cat (fig 69). Now you are going to crochet the bowl to the opening with scs. Pull the loop on the bowl through the stitch to the right of the cats head (fig 70, 71), ch 1 now make 15 sc evenly spread along the side of the opening (fig 72, 73), 12 sc along the next side (bottom) (fig 74), 15 sc evenly spread along the next side (fig 75, 76), stuff around the sides lightly (fig 77, 78). Now you are going to sew the opening closed by sewing through both layers (bowl and neck) and through the back of the head (fig 79-83) [click here for VIDEO](#)





👉 Now you are going to make some stitches up and down around the bottom of the bowl approximately 8 rows from the middle out (through both the bottom of the bowl and the cat) (fig 84-90) [click here for VIDEO](#)




Blanket: (Lilac & White acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

👉 The Blanket is worked in rows with dcs only!
 You end each row with a turning chain (ch 2) - this doesn't count as a stitch on the next row!

☞ Lilac yarn!

- Row.1** ch 45, 1 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 42 dc (43) (fig 91-94), ch 2 (turning chain), turn (fig 95)
Row.2-46 { 1 dc in each st to the end of row, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 45 rows (43) (fig 96-98)
(skip the last turning chain!)
(mesasure the blanket on your couch, you may make more rows for the blanket!)



☞ **POCKET Make 2!**

☞ Start with Lilac yarn!

- Row.1** ch 45, 1 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 42 dc (43) (fig 41-94), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
Row.2-4 { 1 dc in each st to the end of row, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 99)
Change to White yarn before the last turning chain! (fig 100, 101)
Row.5 1 dc in each st to the end of row (43) (fig 102), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
Change to Lilac yarn before the last turning chain!
Row.6-8 { 1 dc in each st to the end of row, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 103)
Change to White yarn before the last turning chain!
Row.9 1 dc in each st to the end of row (43) (fig 104), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
Change to Lilac yarn before the last turning chain!
Row.10-12 { 1 dc in each st to the end of row, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 105)
(skip the last turning chain!)

☞ Fasten off and weave in ends on one part, leave the loop on the other to continue with when attaching the pockets to the blanket! (fig 106)



Now you are going to attach the pockets to the blanket. Place one pocket on each short end on the blanket and crochet scs around the blanket (right side facing you), 2 scs for every row with dcs (along the long sides), and 1 sc in each stitch along the short ends (fig 107-118)

Fasten off and weave in ends!



Arms: (Lilac & White acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm) Make 2!

☞ The arms are worked in one piece with continuous rounds and with single crochet only!

☞ Start with Lilac yarn!

- Rnd.1** 5 sc in a mr (5) (fig 119)
Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (10) (fig 120)
Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (15)
Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (20) (fig 121)
Rnd.5-9 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 5 rnds (20) (fig 122)
Change to White yarn!
Rnd.10-11 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 2 rnds (20) (fig 123)
Change to Lilac yarn!
Rnd.12-17 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 6 rnds (20) (fig 5)

☞ Stuff the arms lightly (fig 125). Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing! (fig 126)




Ears: (Lilac acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm) Make 2!

☞ The ears are worked in one piece with continuous rounds and single crochet only!

- Rnd.1** 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 127)
Rnd.2 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (9) (fig 128)
Rnd.3 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (12) (fig 129)
Rnd.4 { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (15) (fig 130)
Rnd.5 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (18)
Rnd.6 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (21)
Rnd.7 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (24)
Rnd.8 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (3 times) (27) (fig 131, 132)

☞ Sew the opening closed (fig 133, 134). Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing! (fig 135)




Muzzle:



(White & Black acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The nose are worked in one piece with continuous rounds and single crochet only!

- Rnd.1** ch 10 (fig 136), inc in 2nd ch from hook (fig 137, 138), 7 sc (fig 139), inc in the last ch (fig 140), continue working on the opposite side of the chain and the scs you just made, inc (fig 141), 7 sc (fig 142), inc (fig 143) (22)
- Rnd.2** 1 sc, inc, 7 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc, 7 sc, inc, 1 sc (26) (fig 144)
- Rnd.3** 2 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 3 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 1 sc (30) (fig 145)
- Rnd.4** 3 sc, inc, 9 sc, inc, 4 sc, inc, 9 sc, inc, 1 sc (34) (fig 146)
- Rnd.5-7** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 3 rnds (34) (fig 147)
- Rnd.8** 3 sc, dec, 9 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 9 sc, dec, 1 sc (30) (fig 148)
- Rnd.9** 2 sc, dec, 8 sc, dec, 3 sc, dec, 8 sc, dec, 1 sc (26) (fig 149)
- Rnd.10** 1 sc, dec, 7 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec, 7 sc, dec, 1 sc (22) (fig 150)

☞ Sew the opening closed and stuff lightly before closing up! (fig 151-154) Tie off leaving a yarn tail (fig). Wrap the yarn tail around the middle of the nose (fig 155) and make a knot (fig 156). Cut a strand of black yarn and wrap it around the nose and tie on the backside (fig 157)






Nose: (Pink acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

Rnd.1 6 sc in a mr (6),
end with a slst in the first sc made (fig 158)


👉 Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing!




☞ Place the pink nose slightly above the middle of the muzzle and sew it on with a couple of stitches! (fig 159-161)



☞ Place the Cat on the middle of the blanket with half of the head on the blanket and half outside (fig 162, 63), now turn the work over and sew the blanket to the bottom of the cat (turn the work over once in a while to make sure that the stitches doesn't show), make the stitches through the blanket and to the bottom of the cat in a rectangle (the green marking) (fig 164-166)




☞ Now you are going to sew the arms to the blanket! Place the arms along the long side of the blanket on each side of the head (approx 4 rows between the arms) and sew through the opening of the arms and side of the blanket (fig 167-174)



👉 Now pin and sew the ears to the head! Place the ears approximately 13 rows from the front back, and with 4 stitches between (fig 167-174), sew the ear to the head along the bottom edge of the ear (fig 175-179)




👉 Pin the nose to the face (you don't have to do this but I think it is easier to see the placing of the eyes if you do!)
 Mark the shape of the eyelid with 4 pins, starting 2 rows from the middle of the face approx 2 stitches out on each side (Pin 1, inner corner of the eye), next pin 2 rows up 1 stitch out (Pin 2), the next pin one stitch out (Pin 3), and the last pin 1 stitch out and down in line with the first pin (Pin 4) (fig 175-179)



👉 Insert the needle in any stitch on the side of the head and out in the stitch where you have the pin in the inner corner of the eye (Pin 1) (fig 181), insert the needle in the outer corner of the eye (Pin 4), and come out where you have Pin 3 (2nd from the outer corner) (fig 182), wrap the needle around the yarn and insert the needle in the same spot and out again where you have the last pin (2) (fig 183), wrap the needle around the yarn and back again to the same stitch, and out where you inserted the needle in the beginning (fig 184, 185)

Tie off and run the needle through the head to hide the yarn ends

Repeat on the other side (fig 186-190)







☞ And now the final steps!

Make sure you are happy with the placement of the nose. I have the upper edge of the nose in line with the center of the face (fig 191), sew the nose to the head back and forth through nose and head along the outer edge of the nose (fig 192-195)



☞ If you want to have smaller things in the pockets you can make a vertical seam on the pocket I have made one (fig 192-195)
