

Ellenkantarellens Dog Sofa organizer

☞ In this pattern I have used #4 Medium, Worsted acrylic yarn. I have used crochet hook 4.0 mm. It makes me happy if you want to sell things made from my pattern.....just don't forget to mention that it's a pattern from ellenkantarellen! Dog:

(Brown & White acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The Dog is worked in one piece with continuous rounds and single crochet only!

☞ Start with Brown yarn!

- Rnd.1** 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 1)
Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12)
Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18)
Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
Rnd.5 { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
Rnd.6 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.7 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.8 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)
Rnd.9 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)
Rnd.10 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 2)
Rnd.11-20 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 10 rnds (60) (fig 3)
Rnd.21 { dec, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54) (fig 4, 5)
Rnd.22 { dec, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)
Rnd.23 { dec, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.24 { dec, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.25 { dec, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
Rnd.26 { dec, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24) (fig 6)
Rnd.27 in BLO: { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30) (fig 7-9)
Rnd.28 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
Rnd.29 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
Rnd.30 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48) (fig 11, 12)





☞ Now you are going to work back and forth with rows instead of around (the opening on the back)!
Place a stitch marker on each side to make this super easy!

Row.31-48 { 36 sc (fig 13), ch 1 (turning chain), turn (fig 14) } x 18 rows (36)

Row.49 36 sc, ch 12 (48) (fig 20)



☞ Next rnd you make a sc in the first st of the rnd to connect the chain to the other side and continue working in rounds:


Rnd.50 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (both scs and chains) (48) (fig 22-25)

Rnd.51 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54) (fig 26, 27)

Rnd.52 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 28, 29)

Rnd.53 { inc, 9 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (66) (fig 30, 31)

Rnd.54-66 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 13 rnds (66) (fig 32)



- Rnd.67** { dec, 9 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 33, 34)
- Rnd.68** { dec, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)
- Rnd.69** { dec, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48) (fig 35)
- Rnd.70** { dec, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)
- Rnd.71** { dec, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
- Rnd.72** { dec, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
- Rnd.73** { dec, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
- Rnd.74** { dec, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18) (fig 36, 37)



☞ Now you are going to continue making the tail. Stuff the bottom, and the tail as you go!


Rnd.75-107 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 33 rnds (18) (fig 38)

☞ Change to White yarn!

Rnd.108-119 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 12 rnds (18) (fig 39)

Rnd.120 { dec, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12) (fig 40)

☞ Fasten off, weave a needle through remaining sts and pull tight (fig 41), weave in ends! (fig 42)



Bowl: (Brown acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The bowl is worked in one piece with continuous rounds and with single crochet only! (right side facing in)

Rnd.1 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 1)

Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12)

Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18)

Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)

Rnd.5 { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)

Rnd.6 { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)

Rnd.7 { inc, 5 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (42)


Rnd.8 { inc, 6 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (48)

Rnd.9 { inc, 7 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (54)

Rnd.10 { inc, 8 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (60) (fig 43)

Rnd.11 in FLO: 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd (60) (fig 44-46)

Rnd.12-18 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 7 rnds (60) (fig 47)




👉 Now you are going to crochet the bowl to the back of the dog! You make scs along the long sides and the short side (bottom) and sew the last short side (neck)!

👉 Place the “Bowl” in the back of the dog (fig 48). Now you are going to crochet the bowl to the opening with scs. Pull the loop on the bowl through the stitch to the right of the dogs head (fig 49, 50), 18 sc along the first long side through both layers (fig 51, 52), 12 sc along the bottom (fig 53), and 18 sc along next long side (fig 54), stuff lightly around the bowl (not in the bottom) to shape it (fig 55, 56). Now you are going to sew the opening closed by sewing through both layers (bowl and neck) and through the back of the head (fig 57-61) [click here for VIDEO](#)



👉 Now you are going to make some stitches up and down around the bottom of the bowl approximately 8 rows from the middle out (through both the bottom of the bowl and the dog) (fig 62-66) [click here for VIDEO](#)



Blanket: (Your choice of color acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The Blanket is worked in rows with dcs only! You make a rectangle and then fold the short ends towards the middle make the pockets.

You end each row with a turning chain (ch 2) - this doesn't count as a stitch on the next row!

☞ Start with Brown yarn!

Row.1 ch 45, 1 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 42 dc (43) (fig 67-70), ch 2 (turning chain), turn (fig 71)

Row.2-3 { 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 2 rows (43) (fig 72)

☞ Change to White yarn before the last turning chain!

Row.4 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn (43) (fig 73)

☞ Change to Brown yarn before the turning chain!

Row.5-7 { 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 72-75)

☞ Change to White yarn before the last turning chain!

Row.8 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn (43) (fig 73)

☞ Change to Brown yarn before the turning chain!

Row.9-65 { 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 57 rows (43) (fig 75)

☞ Change to White yarn before the last turning chain!

Row.66 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn (43) (fig 73)

☞ Change to Brown yarn before the turning chain!

Row.67-69 { 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 72-75)

☞ Change to White yarn before the last turning chain!


Row.70 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn (43) (fig 73)

☞ Change to Brown yarn before the turning chain!

Row.71-73 { 1 dc in each st to the end of rnd, ch 2 (turning chain), turn } x 3 rows (43) (fig 72-75)
skip the last turning chain!

(measure the blanket on your couch, you may make more rows for the blanket!)

☞ Fasten off and weave in ends!



☞ Now you are going to fold the edges in to make the pockets. Fold the short sides in towards the middle 12 rows in on each side (fig 76), pull up a loop in the lower right corner on one side (fig 77) and crochet along the long side, 2 sc på in each row, (through both layers where the pockets are) (fig 78, 79), repeat on the other side
Fasten off and weave in ends! (fig 80)



Arms: (Brown & White acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm) Make 2!

☞ The arms are worked in one piece with continuous rounds and with single crochet only!

☞ Start with White yarn!

Rnd.1 5 sc in a mr (5) (fig 81)

Rnd.2 { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (10) (fig 82)

Rnd.3 { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (15)

Rnd.4 { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (5 times) (20) (fig 83)

Rnd.5-8 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 4 rnds (20) (fig 85)

☞ Change to Brown yarn!

Rnd.9-18 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 10 rnds (20) (fig 85, 86)

☞ Stuff the arms lightly (fig 87). Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing!




Ears: (Brown acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm) Make 2!

☞ The ears are worked in one piece with rows of half double crochet and ends with single crochet around the ear for a neat edge!

- Row.1** ch 15, 1 hdc in 3rd ch from hook (fig 88-90), 12 hdc (13) (fig 91), ch 2 (turning chain), turn (fig 92)
- Row.2** 11 hdc, dec (12) (fig 93-95), ch 2 (turning chain), (fig 96), turn
- Row.3** 10 hdc, dec (11) (fig 97, 98), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.4** 9 hdc, dec (10) (fig 99), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.5** 8 hdc, dec (9) (fig 100), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.6** 7 hdc, dec (8) (fig 101), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.7** 6 hdc, dec (7), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.8** 5 hdc, dec (6), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.9** 4 hdc, dec (5), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.10** 3 hdc, dec (4), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.11** 2 hdc, dec (3), ch 2 (turning chain), turn
- Row.12** 1 hdc, dec (2) (fig 102), ch 1

☞ No continue working to the left making sc around the edge of the ear (1 sc in each st) (fig 103-106), end with a slst, fasten off and weave in ends! (fig 107)






Nose: (Brown acrylic yarn & crochet hook 4.0 mm)

☞ The nose is worked in one piece with continuous rounds and single crochet only!

- Rnd.1** 6 sc in a mr (6) (fig 1)
- Rnd.2** { inc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (12)
- Rnd.3** { inc, 1 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (18)
- Rnd.4** { inc, 2 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (24)
- Rnd.5** { inc, 3 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (30)
- Rnd.6** { inc, 4 sc } repeat to the end of rnd (6 times) (36)
- Rnd.7-10** 1 sc in each st to the end of rnd x 4 rnds (36) (fig 109)



☞ Fasten off leaving a yarn tail for sewing!!

☞ Place the Dog on the middle of the blanket with half of the head on the blanket and half outside (fig 110, 111), now turn the work over and sew the blanket to the bottom of the Dog (turn the work over once in a while to make sure that the stitches doesn't show), make the stitches through the blanket and to the bottom of the cat in a rectangle (the green marking) (fig 112)



☞ Now you are going to sew the arms to the blanket! Place the arms along the long side of the blanket on each side of the head (approx 4 rows between the arms) and sew through the opening of the arms and side of the blanket (fig 113-117)



➡ Now pin the nose to the face! Place it with the upper edge of the nose 1 row from the middle of and up (fig 118), and sew it on along the outer edge (fig 119,120), stuff before closing up! (fig 121, 122)



➡ Embroider the nose with black acrylic yarn! Make a triangle with the point down from the middle of the nose and up over 3 rows and 5 stitches wide (fig 123, 124). "Fill" the nose with vertical stitches (fig 125-127) fasten off and weave in the ends!



➡ Now pin the right ear to the dogs head right side facing out (see the scs around the edge)! Place it with the bottom 11 rows back from the outer edge of the nose (fig 128), and with the opposite side 10 stitches down and 3 rows back (you want it to be a little bit rounded in the back)(fig 129, 130), sew it to the head up and down along the bottom of the ear and into head (fig 131), repeat on the other side (fig 132)



👉 And now a final touch to the nose! Wrap a strand of black yarn around the nose from the point of the black piece straight down to the bottom of the nose, tie off and run the ends through the nose to hide them (fig 133-136)



👉 Now embroider the sleeping eyes! Mark the shape of the eyelid with 4 pins, starting 2 rows from the middle of the face approx 2 stitches out on each side (Pin 1, inner corner of the eye), next pin 2 rows up 1 stitch out (Pin 2), the next pin one stitch out (Pin 3), and the last pin 1 stitch out and down in line with the first pin (Pin 4) (fig 137)



👉 Insert the needle in any stitch on the side of the head and out in the stitch where you have the pin in the inner corner of the eye (Pin 1) (fig 138), insert the needle in the outer corner of the eye (Pin 4), and come out where you have Pin 3 (2nd from the outer corner) (fig 139), wrap the needle around the yarn and insert the needle in the same spot and out again where you have the last pin (2) (fig 140), wrap the needle around the yarn and back again to the same stitch, and out where you inserted the needle in the beginning (fig 141, 142)

Tie off and run the needle through the head to hide the yarn ends
Repeat on the other side (fig 143-147)

☞ If you want to have smaller things in the pockets you can make vertical seams on the pocket. I made 2 seams on one side with approximately 14 sts between the seams (for remote controls etc), and left the other side as is (for a book or ipad) (fig 145-148)


