



EOWYN TEE

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as is also forbidden the sale of socks knit from this pattern.

The Eowyn Tee is a short, oversized shirt with lace elements on the shoulders and the ends.

The instructions can be knitted tighter or looser in 7 cm increments. I indicate 3 sizes, I wear size 2 with 50 cm positive ease.

SIZES

1, 2, 3

Chest circumference of the finished sweater 126, 140, 154 cm

GAUGE

23 st x 34 rows = 10 x 10 cm in stockinette, after wet blocking.

Should the gauge be bigger or smaller, adapt the size of the needles.

MATERIAL

Yarn

Erika Knight – Studio Linen

ca. 900, 1050, 1200 m

Feel free to pick any favourite yarn matching the gauge.

Needles

2,5 and 3.5mm 40cm (or a set of 2,5 and 3.5mm double-pointed needles) and

3,5 80cm-long circular needles

5 stitch markers, 1 tapestry needle

ABBREVIATIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

st	stitch
k	knit
kbl	Knit from back of loop
p	purl
yo	Yarn over
rd/rds	round(s)
BOR	Begin of the round
RS	right side of the work
WS	wrong side of the work
Nd	needle
M	stitch marker
k2tog	knit 2 stiches together
SKP	Slip 1, knit 1, pass slip stitch over
k3tog	Knit three stitches together
S2KP	Slip 2, knit 1 and pass two slip stitches over
Sk2togP	Slip 1, knit 2 stitches together, pass the slip stitch over
S2k3togP	Slip2, knit 3 stitches together, pass the slip stitches over
DS	DS: double stitch, used in German short rows. Knit the next stitch, turn your work. Bring the yarn to the front of the work, slip the first stitch as if to purl, then bring the yarn up and over the right needle to the back and pull tight to create a double stitch. When you reach this double stitch later, knit or purl through both legs of the stitches as if it were one stitch.
GSR (German short rows)	see explanations for the DS and tips below.

INSTRUCTIONS

Yoke:

all sizes:

With the short 2,5 mm needle, cast on 140 st and join in the round, being careful not to twist the stitches, Place 1th M (BOR)

Rd 1: k to end

Switch to 3,5 mm needles.

Rd 2 (place M): *k1, p1 * 12 times, k1 (= 25st), place 2nd M, p17, place 3rd M, *k1, p1 * 28 times, k1 (= 57 st), place 4th M, p17, place 5th M, *k1, p1 * 12 times (=24 st), BOR

Rd 3 (German short rows):

1. **RS:** * k1, p1 * k1 until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, p1, k2, turn.

1. **WS:** DS, p1, k1, SM 2, Yo, kYo, * p1, k1 * until 5th M, Yo, SM 5, k1, p2, turn.

2. **RS:** DS, k1, p1, SM 5, Yo, pYo, * k1, p1 * until 2nd M (kYo), Yo, SM 2, p1, k1, kDS, k4, turn.

2. **WS:** DS, p5, k1, SM 2, Yo, pYo, * p1, k1 * until 5th M (pYo), Yo, SM 5, k1, p1, pDS, p4, turn.

3. **RS:** DS, k5, p1, SM 5, Yo, pYo, *k1, p1 * until BOR.

There are now 148 st on the needles (2 x 57 st for back and front, 2 x 17 st for the sleeves)

Rd 4: * k1, p1 * k1, until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, p1, k5, kDS, k9, p1, SM 3, Yo, *k1, p1 *,k1 until 4th M, Yo, SM 4, p1, k9, kDS, k5, p1, SM 5, Yo, kYo, *p1, k1 * p1 until BOR.

Rd 5: * k1, p1 * until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, 17 st CHART A, SM 3, Yo, pYo, *k1, p1 * until 4th M, Yo, SM 4, 17 st CHART A, SM 5, Yo, pYo, * k1, p1, * until BOR.

Rd 6: * k1, p1 * k1 until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, 17 st CHART A, SM 3, Yo, kYo, * p1, k1 * until 4th M, Yo, SM 4, 17 st CHART A, SM 5, Yo, kYo, * p1, k1 * p1 until BOR.

Repeat Rd 5 and 6 until you finished Rd 16 in CHART A.

Next Rd (German short rows):

1. **RS:** * k1, p1 * until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, 17 st CHART A (Rd 17), SM 3, Yo, k4, turn.

1. **WS:** DS, p3. pYo, Yo, SM 3, k1, p15, k1, SM 2, Yo, pYo, p until 5th M, Yo, SM 5, k1, p15, k1, SM 4, p4, turn.

2 **RS:** DS, k3, kYo, Yo, SM 4, p1, k15, p1, SM 5, Yo, kYo, k until BOR.

Next Rd : k until 2nd M, Yo, SM 2, 17 st CHART A (repeat rds 1-18), SM 3, Yo, k until 4th M, Yo, SM 4, 17 st CHART A, SM 5, Yo, k until BOR.

Repeat this rd until there are 324, 356, 388 st on the needle (or until desired wide in 16 st steps (308, 340, 372 and so on))

Back and Front:

Now first work the backside in back and forth rows (remove M 2-5 (BOR remains in the middle of the back piece)):

Rw 1: k until 2nd M, turn.

Rw 2 (and all WS rows): S1 as if to purl (yarn in front), p until 5th M, turn.

Rw 3 (and all RS rows): S1 as if to knit (yarn in back) k until 2nd M.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 17, 19, 21 times, then knit row 2 again. Break Yarn.

Now put the back part on hold. Slip the 17 stitches CHART A onto a stitch holder or scrap yarn and work the front piece in the same way as the back piece, but don't break yarn, turn.

Now continue to work in rounds:

Rd 1: knit 145, 161, 177 st front side, make 7 st new, knit 145, 161, 177 st back side, make 7 st new. There are now 304, 336, 368 st (or the chosen number of stitches (divisible by 16)) on thr needles.


Knit in stockinette until the work measures 11, 12, 13 cm (measured from the armpit) or until the desired length minus 9 cm.

Now work CHART B. Repeat the CHART 20, 21, 22 times.

After rd 33 cast off all stitches by knitting them.

12 Round 19 (FIRST DECREASE):
11 BOR, knit the first 3 st together, than knit to the
10 end of the round (following CHART B), pass the
9 last 2 stitches before the BOR over the 3 knitted
8 together (= 5 st together).




Sleeves:

Starting in the middle of the armpit, pick up 21, 23, 25 stitches from the edge of the armhole, then continue to work the 17 stitches from the holder in CHART A, pick up 22, 24, 26 stitches from the edge of the armhole, place M (BOR).

Continue knitting the sleeves to the desired length, at the same time for the sleeve cuff in the last repetition of CHART A from round 12, work the stitches outside the CHART A in the cuff pattern * k1, p1*

After round 18 cast off all stitches by knitting them.

SCHEMATIC



A : $\frac{1}{2}$ Chest circumference: 63, 70, 77 cm

B: Length from armpit: 21, 22, 23 cm

C: Total length: 50, 51, 52 cm

D: $\frac{1}{2}$ armcut: 13, 14, 15 cm

Cut and carefully weave in all yarn ends. Wet block your knitting.
