

## Étole 6 points



### Required Materials :

- Approximately 700 m of Merino Fingering (in 400 m / 100 g skeins)
- Approximately 700 m of Mohair Lace (in 450 m / 50 g skeins)
- 4.5 mm knitting needles
- Blocking tools
- Stitch markers
- 2 cable needles

### Approximate dimensions (excluding fringes)

- length : 165 cm
- width : 45 cm



It is made up of 6 different knitting stitches.

To make it, I used approximately together 700 m of fingering merino (leftover skeins of 400 m per 100 g) and approximately 700 m of white mohair lace (in 450 m per 100 g skeins) to give the knitting some texture and depth.

There is no sample, as each stitch pattern is completely different, but the final blocking step will bring out its full beauty.

**Each pattern section is separated by the following 28-row section :**  
**(ALWAYS begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches)**

- Rows 1 to 6:** Stockinette stitch (1 knit row, 1 purl row)  
**Row 7:** *K2tog, YO* – repeat from \* to \*  
**Row 8:** Purl all stitches  
**Row 9:** Knit all stitches  
**Row 10:** Purl all stitches  
**Row 11:** *K2tog, YO* – repeat from \* to \*  
**Rows 12 to 17:** Stockinette stitch (1 knit row, 1 purl row)  
**Row 18:** *K2tog, YO* – repeat from \* to \*  
**Row 19:** Purl all stitches  
**Row 20:** Knit all stitches  
**Row 21:** Purl all stitches  
**Row 22:** *K2tog, YO* – repeat from \* to \*  
**Rows 23 to 28:** Stockinette stitch (1 knit row, 1 purl row)

## Instructions :

needles 4,5 – cast on 94 stitches  
Knit 2 rows in garter stitch

### Pattern 1 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **12 rows**. With **94 stitches** including 4 edge stitches, you will repeat the **5-stitch pattern 18 times** across the width of the stole – **place a stitch marker** between each 5-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches.



#### 5-Stitch Pattern over 6 Rows:

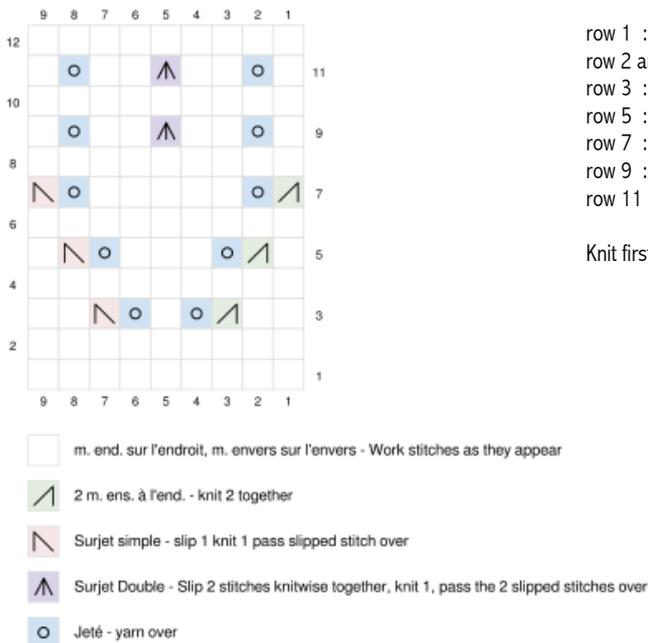
Row 1: *P2, K3*  
Row 2 and all even rows (WS): Purl all stitches  
Row 3: *P2, K3*  
Row 5: *P2, YO, K3tog, YO*

Repeat the 28-row separator pattern from page 1

### Pattern 2 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **22 rows (check the note)**. With **94 stitches** including 4 edge stitches, you will repeat the **9-stitch pattern 10 times** across the width of the stole – **place a stitch marker** between each 9-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches.



row 1 : K9  
row 2 and all even rows : Work stitches as they appear  
row 3 : K2 – K2TOG - YO – K1 - YO – SL1, K1, PSSO – K2  
row 5 : K1 – K2TOG - YO – K3 - YO - SL1, K1, PSSO – K1  
row 7 : K2TOG. - YO - K5 - YO - SL1, K1, PSSO  
row 9 : K1- YO - K2 - SL2 K1 P2SO- K2 - YO - K1  
row 11 : K1 - YO - K2 - SL2 K1 P2SO- K2 - YO - K1

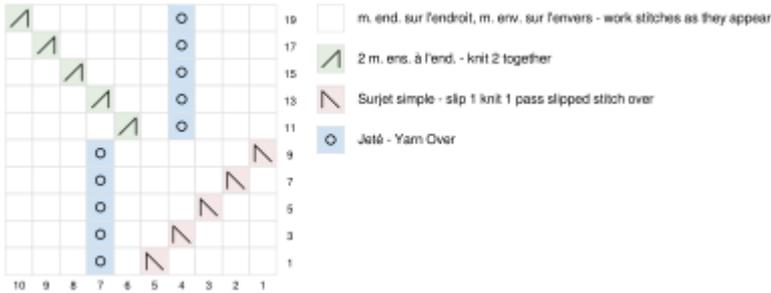
Knit first the rows 1 to 12 and repeat from rows 3 to 12

Repeat the 28-row separator pattern from page 1

### Pattern 3 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **40 rows**. With **94 stitches** including 4 edge stitches, you will repeat the **10-stitch pattern 9 times** across the width of the stole – **place a stitch marker** between each 10-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches



row1 : K4 – SL1, K1, PSSO – K1 – YO – K3  
 row 2 and all even rows : Work stitches as they appear  
 row3 : K3 – SL1, K1, PSSO – K2 – YO – K3 .  
 row5 : K2 – SL1, K1, PSSO – K3 – YO – K3  
 row7 : K1 – SL1, K1, PSSO – K4 – YO – K3  
 row9 : SL1, K1, PSSO – K5 – YO – K3  
 row11 : K3 - YO - K1 – K2TOG – K4  
 row13 : K3 - YO - K2 – K2TOG – K3  
 row15 : K3 - YO - K3 – K2TOG – K2  
 row17 : K3 - YO - K4 – K2TOG – K1  
 row19 : K3 - YO - K5 – K2TOG

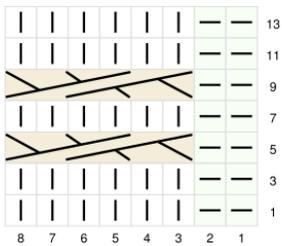
### Pattern 4 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **28 rows**. With **94 stitches** including 6 edge stitches, you will repeat the **8-stitch pattern 11 times** across the width of the stole – **place a stitch marker** between each 8-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 3 edge stitches

Instructions for 2/2/2 cable (crossing 6 stitches) :

Slip 2 stitches onto a cable needle and hold to the **front** of the work.  
 Slip the next 2 stitches onto another cable needle and hold to the **back** of the work.  
 Knit the next 2 stitches.  
 Then knit the 2 stitches from the **back** cable needle, followed by the 2 stitches from the **front** cable needle.



Row 1: P2, K6  
 row 2 and all even rows : Work stitches as they appear  
 Row3 : P2 – K6  
 Row5 : P2 – 2/2/2 cable  
 Row7 : P2 – K6  
 Row9 : P2 – 2/2/2 cable  
 Row11 : P2 – K6  
 Row13 : P2 – K6

### Pattern 5 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **36 rows**. With **94 stitches** including 4 edge stitches, you will repeat the **5-stitch pattern 18 times** across the width of the stole – **place a stitch marker** between each 5-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches



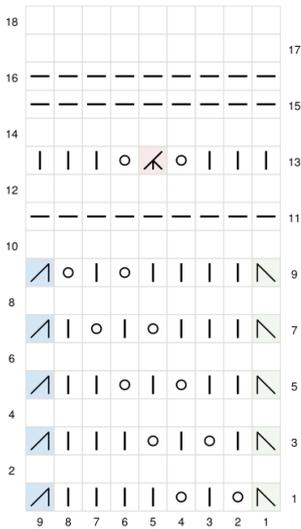
Row 1 : K2TOG – P2  
 row 2 and all even rows : Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 3 : K2TOG – P2  
 Row 5 : 2 stitches cable (Slip 1 stitch to a cable needle and hold at back, knit 1, then knit the stitch from the cable needle) – K2  
 Row 7 : K2TOG. – YO – K2  
 Row 9 : YO – K2 – K2TOG.  
 Row 11 : K2 – K2TOG. – YO  
 Row 13 : SL1 K1 PSSO – K2 – YO  
 Row 15 : YO – SL1 K1 PSSO – K2  
 Row 17 : K1. - YO – SL1 K1 PSSO – K1.

### Pattern 6 :

Work the pattern **twice**, i.e., over **36 rows**. With **94 stitches** including 4 edge stitches, you will repeat the **9-stitch pattern 10 times** across the width of the stole. Place a stitch marker between each 9-stitch section.

Begin and end each row with 2 edge stitches



Row 1: SL1, K1, PSSO -, YO, K1, YO, K4, K2tog  
 Row 2: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 3: SL1, K1, PSSO -, K1, YO, K1, YO, K3, K2tog  
 Row 4: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 5: SL1, K1, PSSO -, K2, YO, K1, YO, K2, K2tog  
 Row 6: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 7: SL1, K1, PSSO -, K3, YO, K1, YO, K1, K2tog  
 Row 8: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 9: SL1, K1, PSSO -, K4, YO, K1, YO, K2tog  
 Row 10: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 11: Purl all stitches  
 Row 12: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 13: K3, YO, K3tog, YO, K3  
 Row 14: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 15: Purl all stitches  
 Row 16: Purl all stitches  
 Row 17: Work stitches as they appear  
 Row 18: Work stitches as they appear

- M.end. sur endr. m.env. sur envers - Work stitches as they appear
- Maille Endroit - Knit
- Maille Envers - Purl
- jeté - Yarn Over
- Surjet simple - Slip 1 Knit 1 Pass slipped stitch over
- 2 m. ens. à l'end. - knit 2 together
- tricoter 3 m.ensemble - knit 3 together

Finish your stole by weaving in the loose ends with a tapestry needle. Then block your stole to bring out its full beauty.

You can choose whether or not to add fringes.

In my case, I added fringes made of several strands of yarn, each approximately 30 cm long and folded in half.

1. Wrap the yarn around a sturdy piece of cardboard or a book. The support should match the desired length of your fringes.
2. Wrap the yarn as many times as needed, making sure the strands lie flat and don't overlap.
3. Use scissors to cut the strands along the top edge of the cardboard so they are all the same length.
4. Take several strands, fold them in half, insert your crochet hook into the edge of your work, pull the folded strands through, and close to form the fringe.
