



Fiery Temper

Top-down, seamless, comfortable pullover knit in a textured stitch pattern with high collar and side vents

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Fiery Temper is a top-down, seamless, comfortable pullover knit in a textured stitch pattern with high collar and side vents. Upper back part is worked first from shoulders to the underarms, the shoulders are shaped with short rows.

The stitches of the fronts are picked up from the cast on edges of the back shoulders. Fronts are worked separately to the bottom of the neck opening, then the pieces are joined together and worked in one piece to the underarms.

Then the back and front are joined and worked in one piece in the round to the hem, where the pieces are separated again and the ribbed hems are worked back and forth in rows.

The stitches of the sleeves are picked up around the armhole and the sleeves are worked to the cuff in the round. You can knit them in stockinette stitch or in 1x1 rib with interesting double decreases.

The body is worked in a stitch pattern that doesn't require purling in the round, with a simple trick the fabric will be textured and 3-dimensional. This stitch pattern is especially great for the variegated yarns.

Skill level: Intermediate

Necessary skills: Working in the round with dpns or magic loop, working short rows, picking up stitches.

To fit bust:

Yarn:

Malabrigo Yarn Rios (100% Merino, 192 m /210 y per skein)

Needles:

- 80 cm/32" circular needle each size 4.0 mm/ US 6 and 3.5 mm/ US 4 (or size to obtain gauge)
- 40 cm/16" circular needle or double pointed needles (dpns) each size 4.0 mm/ US 6 and 3.5 mm/ US 4 for working in small circumference (or size to obtain gauge) (optional)

Notions:

- spare circular needle or waste yarn for holding stitches
- 2 stitch markers: 1 red, 1 blue
- 2 removable markers: 1 red, 1 blue
- cable needle for the double decreases (optional)
- 80 cm/32" and 40 cm/16" circular needle or double pointed needles (dpns) size 3.0 mm/ US 2½ for the tubular bind off (optional)

Gauge:

18 sts and 26 rounds = 10x10 cm/4"x4" in Stockinette Stitch knit in the round (sleeves) with larger needle after blocking
16 sts and 36 rows = 10x10 cm/4"x4" in Textured Stitch Pattern knit flat (upper body) with larger needle after blocking
16 sts and 36 rounds = 10x10 cm/4"x4" in Textured Stitch Pattern knit in the round (body) with larger needle after blocking
20 sts and 26 rounds = 10x10 cm/4"x4" in 1x1 Rib knit in the round (sleeves) with larger needle after blocking
Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

How to measure row gauge: measure the row gauge from the RS, 3 stitches within a knit column count as 4 rows/rounds.

Notes: If your experience is, that your gauge is tighter when you work in small circumference I would recommend to use a larger needle for the sleeves.

Textured Stitch Pattern:

Worked flat over an odd number of stitches
Row 1 (WS) and every WS row: P to the end of row.
Row 2 (RS): K1, [K1 below, K1] to the end of row.
Row 4 (RS): K2, [K1 below, K1] to the last st, K1.
Repeat Rows 1-4.

Worked in the round over an even number of stitches
Round 1: Knit.
Round 2: [K1, K1 below] to the end of round.
Round 3: Knit.
Round 4: [K1 below, K1] to the end of round.
Repeat Rounds 1-4.

Special Abbreviations:

EOR / Lst+K1 – Work the 2–sts pattern repeat as many times as you can to the end of row; or to the last stitch, and knit the last stitch.

marker / Lstbm+K1 – Work the 2–sts pattern repeat as many times as you can to the marker; or to the last stitch before the marker, and knit the last stitch.

DDR – Right Leaning Double Decrease: sl1 wyib, sl1 wyib from the left needle onto a cable needle and hold in front, sl1 wyib, slip back the 1 st from the cable needle onto the left needle, slip back the 2 slipped sts from the right needle onto the left needle, p2tog, k2tog.

DDL – Left Leaning Double Decrease: sl1 wyib, sl1 wyib from the left needle onto a cable needle and hold in back, sl1 wyib, slip back the 1 st from the cable needle onto the left needle, slip back the 2 slipped sts from the right needle onto the left needle, ssk, ssp.

INSTRUCTIONS

UPPER BODY

Back

With larger circular needle cast on 93 (97: 101: 105: 109: 113: 117: 121: 125: 129) sts. Place 1–1 removable marker (or fasten a small piece of waste yarn) into the 33rd (34th: 36th: 37th: 38th: 40th: 41st: 43rd: 44th: 45th) sts from both ends. These markers denote the inner edge of the left and right shoulders.

Row 1 (RS): K to the end of row.

Shaping the shoulders and back neckline with short rows and setting up the stitch pattern:

Row 1 (WS): P33 (33: 35: 37: 37: 39: 41: 43: 43: 45), w&t.

Row 2 (RS): K1, [K1below, K1] 3 (3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 4) times, w&t.

Row 3 (WS): P12 (12: 12: 12: 12: 12: 12: 12: 12: 14), P wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, w&t.

Row 4 (RS): K1, [K1below, K1] 8 (8: 9: 9: 9: 9: 9: 9: 9: 10) times, K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, w&t.

Row 5 (WS): P to the end of row, P wrap together with wrapped st as it appears.

Row 6 (RS): [K2, K1below, K1, K1below] 5 (5: 4: 3: 3: 2: 1: 0: 0: 0) time(s), [K2, K1below, K1, K1below, K1, K1below] 1 (1: 2: 3: 3: 4: 5: 6: 6: 5) time(s), [K2, K1below, K1, K1below, K1, K1below, K1, K1below] 0 (0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 1) time, K1, w&t.

Row 7 (WS): P7 (7: 7: 7: 7: 7: 7: 7: 7: 9), w&t.

Row 8 (RS): [K1below, K1] 6 (6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 7) times, K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, w&t.

Row 9 (WS): P17 (17: 19: 19: 19: 19: 19: 19: 19: 21), P wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, w&t.

Row 10 (RS): [K1below, K1] to the second wrapped st and K wraps together with wrapped sts as they appear, [K1below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 11 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 12 (RS): [K1below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 13 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 14 (RS): [K1below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 15 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 4: 4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 16 (RS): [K1below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 3) times, K1.

Row 17 (WS): P to the end of row, P wrap together with wrapped st as it appears.

Row 18 (RS): K1, [K1below, K1] to the end of row.

Row 19 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 20 (RS): K2, [K1below, K1] to the last st, K1.

Row 21 (WS): P to the end of row.

These last 4 rows establish textured stitch pattern.

Continue to work as established, work 40 (42: 44: 46: 48: 50: 54: 58: 60: 62) more rows, ending with a WS row. Back should measure approx. 13.5 (14: 14.5: 15.5: 16: 16.5: 17.5: 18.5: 19: 19.5) cm / 5¼ (5½: 5¾: 6: 6¼: 6½: 7: 7¼: 7½: 7¾) inches from the cast on edge measured along the side of the piece.

Break yarn, and slip the stitches of the Back onto a spare needle or waste yarn.

Left front

With RS of Back facing, using larger circular needle pick up and knit 1 st from between the marked st and the st before it (this will be the inner edge st), remove marker and pick up and knit 33 (34: 36: 37: 38: 40: 41: 43: 44: 45) sts from the cast on edge of the left shoulder.

34 (35: 37: 38: 39: 41: 42: 44: 45: 46) sts

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Shaping the left shoulder with short rows:

Row 1 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 2 (RS): K2 (1: 1: 2: 7: 7: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1 below, K1] 3 (4: 4: 3: 4: 4: 3: 3: 4: 4) times, w&t.

Row 3 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 4 (RS): K1 (2: 2: 1: 2: 2: 7: 1: 2: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1 below, K1] 2 (2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 5 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 6 (RS): K2 (1: 1: 2: 7: 7: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1 below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 7 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 8 (RS): K1 (2: 2: 1: 2: 2: 7: 1: 2: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1 below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 9 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 10 (RS): K2 (1: 1: 2: 7: 7: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the wrapped st and K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, [K1 below, K1] 2 (2: 2: 2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 3: 3) times, w&t.

Row 11 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 12 (RS): K1 (2: 2: 1: 2: 2: 7: 1: 2: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the last st, K wrap together with wrapped st as it appears, K1.

Row 13 (WS): P to the end of row.

Sizes S1, M1, M2, L1, L2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 14 (RS): K- (-: 1: -: 7: 7: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the end of row.

Row 15 (WS): P to the end of row.

Sizes L2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 16 (RS): K- (-: -: -: -: -: 1: 2: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the last st, K1.

Row 17 (WS): P to the end of row.

All sizes:

Shaping the left front neckline:

Row 1 – Inc Row (RS): K2, LLI, K0 (1: 0: 0: 0: 0: 7: 0: 1: 0), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 2 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 3 (RS): K2 (1: 2: 2: 2: 2: 7: 2: 1: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 4 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 5 – Inc Row (RS): K2, LLI, K1 (0: 1: 1: 7: 7: 0: 1: 0: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 6 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 7 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 8 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 9 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

38 (39: 41: 42: 43: 45: 46: 48: 49: 50) sts

Sizes XS1, XS2, S1, L2 only:

Row 10 – Inc Row (WS): P to the last 2 sts, RLPI, P2.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 1.

Row 12 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 10.

Size L2 only:

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 10.

Sizes S2, M1, M2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 10 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 12 – Inc Row (WS): P to the last 2 sts, RLPI, P2.

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 1.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 12.

Sizes XL1, XL2 only:

Row 15 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 16 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 12.

Size L1 only:

Row 10 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 12 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): P to the last 2 sts, RLPI, P2.

Row 15 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 1.

Row 16 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 14.

41 (42: 44: 46: 47: 49: 51: 53: 55: 56) sts

Break yarn, and slip the stitches of the Left front onto a spare needle or waste yarn.

Right front

With RS of Back facing, using larger circular needle or a dpn pick up and knit 33 (34: 36: 37: 38: 40: 41: 43: 44: 45) sts from the cast on edge of the right shoulder, pick up and knit 1 more st from between the marked st and the next st (this will be the inner edge st), remove marker.

34 (35: 37: 38: 39: 41: 42: 44: 45: 46) sts

Shaping the right shoulder with short rows:

Row 1 (WS): P8 (9: 9: 8: 9: 9: 8: 8: 9: 10), w&t.

Row 2 (RS): K1, [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 3 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 4 (RS): As Row 2.

Row 5 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 6 (RS): As Row 2.

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Row 7 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t.

Row 8 (RS): As Row 2.

Row 9 (WS): P to the wrapped st, P wrap together with wrapped st, P4 (4: 4: 4: 4: 4: 6: 6: 6: 6), w&t..

Row 10 (RS): As Row 2.

Row 11 (WS): P to the end of row, P wrap together with wrapped st as it appears.

Row 12 (RS): K2, [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 13 (WS): P to the end of row.

Sizes S1, M1, M2, L1, L2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 14 (RS): K1, [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 15 (WS): P to the end of row.

Sizes L2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 16 (RS): K2, [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 17 (WS): P to the end of row.

All sizes:

Shaping the right front neckline:

Row 1 – Inc Row (RS): K0 (0: 1: 0: 0: 1: 1: 1: 0: 0: 0), [K1, K1 below] to the last 2 (3: 2: 2: 2: 2: 3: 2: 3: 2) sts, K0 (1: 0: 0: 0: 0: 1: 0: 1: 0), RLI, K2.

Row 2 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 3 (RS): K2 (2: 1: 2: 1: 1: 1: 2: 2: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 4 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 5 – Inc Row (RS): K0 (0: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1: 1: 0: 0: 0), [K1, K1 below] to the last 3 (2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 2: 3: 2: 3) sts, K1 (0: 1: 1: 1: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1), RLI, K2.

Row 6 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 7 – Inc Row (RS): K1 (1: 0: 1: 0: 0: 0: 1: 1: 1), [K1, K1 below] to the last 3 (2: 3: 3: 3: 3: 2: 3: 2: 3) sts, K1 (0: 1: 1: 1: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1), RLI, K2.

Row 8 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 9 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

38 (39: 41: 42: 43: 45: 46: 48: 49: 50) sts

Sizes XS1, XS2, S1, L2 only:

Row 10 – Inc Row (WS): P2, LLPI, P to the end of row.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): K1 (1: 0: –: –: –: –: 1: –: –), [K1, K1 below] to the last 2 (3: 2: –: –: –: –: 2: –: –) sts, K0 (1: 0: –: –: –: –: 0: –: –), RLI, K2.

Row 12 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 10.

Size L2 only:

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 10.

Sizes S2, M1, M2, XL1, XL2 only:

Row 10 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 7.

Row 12 – Inc Row (WS): P2, LLPI, P to the end of row.

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 1.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 12.

Sizes XL1, XL2 only:

Row 15 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 7.

Row 16 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 12.

Size L1 only:

Row 10 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 11 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 7.

Row 12 (WS): As Row 2.

Row 13 – Inc Row (RS): As Row 5.

Row 14 – Inc Row (WS): P2, LLPI, P to the end of row.

Row 15 – Inc Row (RS): [K1, K1 below] to the last 3 sts, K1, RLI, K2.

Row 16 – Inc Row (WS): As Row 14.

All sizes:

41 (42: 44: 46: 47: 49: 51: 53: 55: 56) sts

Joining Row (RS): K1 (1: 2: 2: 1: 1: 2: 2: 1: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1, cast on 13 (15: 15: 15: 17: 17: 17: 17: 17: 19) sts, knit the first st of the Left Front from the spare needle, K0 (1: 0: 0: 0: 0: 1: 0: 1: 0: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Next Row (WS): Purl to 1 st before the first cast-on st, p2tog, P11 (13: 13: 13: 15: 15: 15: 15: 15: 17), ssp, P to the end of row.

93 (97: 101: 105: 109: 113: 117: 121: 125: 129) sts

Setting up the stitch pattern:

Row 1 (RS): K2 (2: 1: 1: 2: 2: 1: 2: 2), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 2 (WS): P to the end of row.

Row 3 (RS): K1 (1: 2: 2: 1: 1: 2: 2: 1: 1), [K1 below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1.

Row 4 (WS): P to the end of row.

These last 4 rows establish textured stitch pattern.

Continue to work as established, work 26 (28: 28: 30: 30: 32: 34: 38: 38: 40) more rows, ending with a WS row. Front should measure approx. 13.5 (14: 14.5: 15.5: 16: 16.5: 17.5: 18.5: 19: 19.5) cm / 5¼ (5½: 5¾: 6: 6¼: 6½: 7: 7¼: 7½: 7¾) inches from the pick up edge measured along the side of the piece. Do not break yarn.

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BODY

Joining Rnd: K1 (2: 1: 2: 7: 2: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1, place blue marker; work across the sts of the Back from the spare needle as follows: K1 (2: 1: 2: 7: 2: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1below, K1] to the EOR / Lst+K1, place red marker for beginning of round.

Shaping the underarm gusset:

Rnd 1 – Double Dec Rnd: *K1, k3tog, K to 4 sts before the marker, sssk, K1, slip marker; repeat from * once more. (8 stitches decreased)

Rnd 2: *K2 (1: 2: 1: 2: 7: 7: 1: 2: 1), [K1below, K1] to the marker / Lstbm+K1, slip marker; repeat from * once more.

Rnd 3 – Double Dec Rnd: As Rnd 1.

Rnd 4: *K1 (2: 1: 2: 7: 2: 2: 2: 1: 2), [K1below, K1] to the marker / Lstbm+K1, slip marker; repeat from * once more.

Rnd 5 – Double Dec Rnd: As Rnd 1.

Rnd 6: As Rnd 2.

Rnd 7 – Dec Rnd: *K1, k2tog, K to 3 sts before the marker, ssk, K1, slip marker; repeat from * once more.

Rnd 8: As Rnd 2.

Rnd 9: K to the end of round.

Rnd 10: As Rnd 4.

Rnd 11 – Dec Rnd: As Rnd 7.

Next Rnd: S11 wyib, *K0 (1: 0: 1: 0: 7: 7: 1: 0: 1), [K1below, K1] to 2 (1: 2: 1: 2: 7: 7: 1: 2: 1) st(s) before the marker, K1below (-: K1below: -: -: -: K1below: -)*, slip the next st purlwise from the left needle onto the right needle, remove blue marker, slip back the st onto the left needle, k2tog; repeat from * to * once more, slip the next st purlwise from the left needle onto the right needle, remove red marker, slip back the st onto the left needle, replace red marker and place a removable marker, or fasten a piece of scrap yarn into the last st.

Next Rnd: K2tog, K to the end of round.

Sizes XS1, S1, M1, XL1 only:

Rnd 1: [K1below, K1] to the end of round.

Rnd 2: K to the end of round.

Rnd 3: [K1, K1below] to the end of round.

Rnd 4: K to the end of round.

Sizes XS2, S2, M2, L1, L2, XL2 only:

Rnd 1: [K1, K1below] to the end of round.

Rnd 2: K to the end of round.

Rnd 3: [K1below, K1] to the end of round.

Rnd 4: K to the end of round.

All sizes:

These last 4 rounds establish textured stitch pattern.

Continue to work as established, work 98 (98: 100: 100: 102: 102: 104: 104: 106: 106) more rounds, ending with a knit round.

Body should measure approx. 29 (29: 29.5: 29.5: 30: 30: 30.5: 30.5: 31: 31) cm / 11¼ (11¼: 11½: 11½: 11¾: 11¾: 12: 12: 12¼: 12¼) inches from the removable marker at the underarm.

Remove marker.

If you want a longer body, continue to work in the established pattern until body measures approx. 6 cm / 2½" less than the desired length, ending with a knit round.

Change to smaller needle.

Front hem:

Sizes XS1, XS2, XL1 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K1, [P1, K1] 2 (3: -: -: -: -: -: 3: -) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1] 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * 3 (3: -: -: -: -: -: : 5: -) more times, **K1, [P1, K1] 2 times, LLPI; repeat from ** once more, ***K1, [P1, K1] 3 times, LLPI; repeat from *** 3 (3: -: -: -: -: -: 5: -) more times, K1, [P1, K1] 3 (4: -: -: -: -: -: 4: -) times, K1tbl.

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Sizes S1, S2, XL2 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K1, [P1, K1] – (–: 3: 4: –: –: –: –: –: 3) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * – (–: 9: 9: –: –: –: –: –: 13) more times, K1, [P1, K1] – (–: 4: 5: –: –: –: –: –: 4) times, K1tbl.

Sizes M1, M2, L1, L2 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K1, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 2: 3: 4: 4: –: –) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * 4 more times, [K1, P1] – (–: –: –: 3: 3: 3: 4: –: –) times, LLI, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 3: 3: 3: 4: –: –) times, LLPI, **K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from ** 4 more times, K1, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 3: 4: 5: 5: –: –) times, K1tbl.

All sizes:

Place a blue removable marker (or fasten a piece of scrap yarn) into the first stitch on the left needle and turn work. Insert a safety pin into the first 6 stitches just worked on your left needle. The safety pin will hang on the WS of your work.

Row 1 (WS): Sl1 wyif, [P1, K1] to the last st before the red marker, P1, remove red marker, K1, P1, sl1 wyif.

Insert a safety pin into the last 6 stitches just worked on your right needle. Place a red removable marker into the first stitch on the left needle and turn work. Work will continue on the Front only (between the marked stitches), slip the remaining sts of the Back onto a spare needle or waste yarn.

93 (97: 101: 105: 111: 115: 119: 123: 129: 133) sts

Row 2 (RS): K2, [P1, K1] to the last st, K1tbl.

Row 3 (WS): Sl1 wyif, [P1, K1] to the last 2 sts, P1, sl1 wyif.

These last 2 rows establish rib pattern.

Work in rib pattern for 16 more rows, ending with a WS row.

Ribbing should measure approx. 6 cm / 2½".

Bind off all stitches in pattern, or using the 1x1 Tubular Bind Off Method (see the description on page 10).

Back hem:

Slip the remaining stitches of the Back onto the working needle. With RS of Back facing remove the red removable marker from the first stitch on the right needle and insert the right needle tip into the 6 stitches on the safety pin (you can pull the safety pin a little), lifting them up onto the right needle. Remove the safety pin.

Turn work and with WS of Back facing remove the blue removable marker from the first stitch on the right needle. Insert the right needle tip into the 6 stitches on the other safety pin (you can pull

the safety pin a little), lifting them up onto the right needle.

Remove the safety pin.

Turn work again and with RS of Back facing, join yarn.

Sizes XS1, XS2, XL1 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K2, [P1, K1] 3 (4: –: –: –: –: –: 4: –) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1] 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * 3 (3: –: –: –: –: –: 5: –) more times, **K1, [P1, K1] 2 times, LLPI; repeat from ** once more, ***K1, [P1, K1] 3 times, LLPI; repeat from *** 3 (3: –: –: –: –: 5: –) more times, K1, [P1, K1] 3 (4: –: –: –: –: 4: –) times, K1tbl.

Sizes S1, S2, XL2 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K2, [P1, K1] – (–: 4: 5: –: –: –: –: 4) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * – (–: 9: 9: –: –: –: –: –: 13) more times, K1, [P1, K1] – (–: 4: 5: –: –: –: –: 4) times, K1tbl.

Sizes M1, M2, L1, L2 only:

Rib Set-up Row (RS): K2, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 3: 4: 5: 5: –: –) times, LLPI, *K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from * 4 more times, [K1, P1] – (–: –: –: 3: 3: 3: 4: –: –) times, LLI, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 3: 3: 3: 4: –: –) times, LLPI, **K1, [P1, K1], 3 times, LLPI; repeat from ** 4 more times, K1, [P1, K1] – (–: –: –: 3: 4: 5: 5: –: –) times, K1tbl.

All sizes:

93 (97: 101: 105: 111: 115: 119: 123: 129: 133) sts

Row 1 (WS): Sl1 wyif, [P1, K1] to the last 2 sts, P1, sl1 wyif.

Row 2 (RS): K2, [P1, K1] to the last st, K1tbl.

These last 2 rows establish rib pattern.

Work in rib pattern for 17 more rows, ending with a WS row.

Ribbing should measure approx. 6 cm / 2½".

Bind off all stitches in pattern, or using the 1x1 Tubular Bind Off Method.

SLEEVES

(Both alike)

Stockinette stitch version:

With the larger needle (long or short circular or dpns for working small circumference in the round) pick up and knit 48 (51: 53: 55: 58: 60: 64: 67: 69: 71) sts around the armhole opening (1 st for every 2 rows), and place marker for beginning of round.

Continue to work in the round in stockinette stitch (knit every rnd), work 24 (20: 22: 14: 12: 12: 10: 10: 8) rnds.

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Dec Rnd: K2, k2tog, K to 4 sts before marker, ssk, K2. (2 stitches decreased)

Repeat **Dec Rnd** on following 22nd (16th: 16th: 14th: 12th: 10th: 10th: 8th: 10th: 8th) rnd 2 (3: 3: 4: 5: 6: 4: 8: 1: 7) more times, then on following 0th (0th: 0th: 0th: 0th: 0th: 8th: 0th: 8th: 6th) rnd 0 (0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 3: 0: 7: 2) times.

42 (43: 45: 45: 46: 46: 48: 49: 51: 51) sts

Continue to work in the round in stockinette stitch until sleeve measures approx. 34 (34: 35: 35: 35.5: 35.5: 36.5: 36.5: 37.5: 37.5) cm / 13½ (13½: 13¾: 13¾: 14: 14: 14½: 14½: 14¾: 14¾) inches or approx. 6 cm / 2½ inches less than the desired length, measured from the pick up round.

Change to smaller needle.

Sizes XS1, M1, M2, L1 only:

Rib Set-up Rnd: [K1, P1] to the end of round.

Sizes XS2, S1, S2, L2, XL1, XL2 only:

Rib Set-up Rnd: [K1, P1] to the last st, K1, LLPI.

All sizes:

42 (44: 46: 46: 46: 46: 48: 50: 52: 52) sts

Next Rnd: [K1, P1] to the end of round.

Repeat this last round until ribbing measures approx. 6 cm / 2½ inches, then bind off all stitches in pattern, or using the 1x1 Tubular Bind Off Method.

Ribbed version:

With the larger needle (long or short circular or dpns for working small circumference in the round) pick up and knit 54 (56: 60: 62: 64: 68: 72: 74: 76: 78) sts around the armhole opening (approx. 3 sts from 5 rows, then 3 sts from 6 rows; repeat), and place marker for beginning of round.

Rnd 1: [K1, P1] to the end of round.

This last round establish rib pattern.

Continue to work as established, work 34 (34: 26: 26: 24: 18: 20: 16: 16: 16) rnds.

Double Dec Rnd: K1, DDR, work in pattern to 6 sts before marker, DDL, K1, P1. (4 stitches decreased)

Repeat **Double Dec Rnd** on following 34th (34th: 22nd: 22nd: 24th: 18th: 18th: 16th: 16th: 16th) rnd 1 (1: 2: 2: 2: 3: 3: 1: 2: 2)

more time(s), then on following 0th (0th: 0th: 0th: 0th: 0th: 0th: 14th: 14th: 14th) rnd 0 (0: 0: 0: 0: 0: 3: 3: 3) times.

46 (48: 48: 50: 52: 52: 54: 54: 56: 58) sts

Continue to work as established until sleeve measures approx. 34 (34: 35: 35: 35.5: 35.5: 36.5: 36.5: 37.5: 37.5) cm / 13½ (13½: 13¾: 13¾: 14: 14: 14½: 14½: 14¾: 14¾) inches or approx. 6 cm / 2½ inches less than the desired length, measured from the pick up round.

Change to smaller needle and work 6 cm / 2½ inches in the established rib pattern, then bind off all stitches in pattern, or using the 1x1 Tubular Bind Off Method.

FINISHING

Collar

With RS facing, using the smaller needle (long or short circular or dpns for working small circumference in the round) and beginning at the inner edge of the left „shoulder seam”, pick up and knit 13 (13: 14: 14: 15: 15: 16: 16: 17: 17) sts down left side of the neck (1 st for every 2 rows), 13 (15: 15: 15: 17: 17: 17: 17: 19) sts from the front, 13 (13: 14: 14: 15: 15: 16: 16: 17: 17) sts up right side of the neck (1 st for every 2 rows), and 27 (29: 29: 31: 33: 33: 35: 35: 37: 39) sts from the back, and place marker for beginning of round.

66 (70: 72: 74: 80: 80: 84: 84: 88: 92) sts.

Rnd 1: [K1, P1] to the end of round.

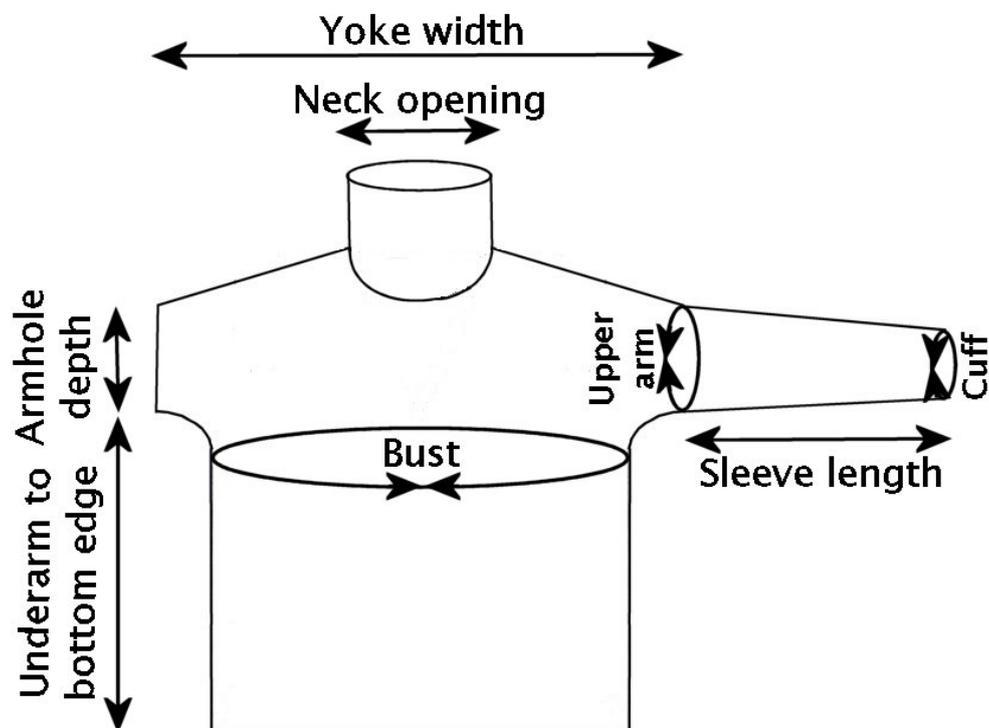
This last round establish rib pattern.

Continue to work as established until collar measures approx. 10 cm / 4 inches, measured from the pick up round.

Change to larger needle and continue to work in the established rib pattern until collar measures approx. 20 cm / 8 inches, measured from the pick up round, then bind off all stitches in pattern, or using the 1x1 Tubular Bind Off Method.

Block the pullover to the finished measurements given in the table below and weave in ends.

Tubular bind off

(A helpful video:

Separate the knit and purl stitches from each other onto 2 separate needles as follows: hold the right working needle and the smallest needle parallel, with the working needle in front of the smallest needle; slip the first 2 K stitches onto the working needle (front) and pass the first st over the second st, slip the next P stitch purlwise onto the smallest needle (back), *slip the next K stitch purlwise onto the working needle, slip the next P stitch purlwise onto the smallest needle; repeat from * to the last 2 sts, slip the second st on the left needle over the first st, then slip this last st onto the right working needle -> every K st is on the working needle and every P st is on the smallest needle.

Cut the working yarn approximately 3.5–4 times the length of the total width of the piece. Thread the yarn onto a blunt tapestry needle.

Sew together the live stitches with the Kitchener Stitch method as follows:

Step 1: Insert tapestry needle into the first K stitch on the working needle as if to purl and pull the yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Step 2: Insert tapestry needle into the first P stitch on the smallest needle as if to knit and pull yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Step 3: Insert tapestry needle into the first K stitch on the working needle as if to knit, and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 4: Insert tapestry needle into the next K stitch on the working needle as if to purl and pull the yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Step 5: Insert tapestry needle into the first P stitch on the smallest needle as if to purl, and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 6: Insert tapestry needle into the next P stitch on the smallest needle as if to knit and pull yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Repeat the last 4 steps (Step 3 to 6) until 1–1 stitch remains on each needle.

Finishing steps:

Step 1: Insert tapestry needle into the last P stitch on the smallest needle as if to purl, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 2: Insert tapestry needle into the last K stitch on the working needle as if to knit, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle. Fasten off.

Tubular bind off in the round

Separate the knit and purl stitches from each other onto 2 separate needles as follows: hold the right working needle and the smallest needle parallel, with the working needle in front of the smallest needle; *slip the next K stitch purlwise onto the working needle (front), slip the next P stitch purlwise onto the smallest needle (back); repeat from * to the end of round -> every K st is on the working needle and every P st is on the smallest needle.

Place 1–1 removable marker (or a safety pin) into the first K and P st.

Cut the working yarn approximately 3.5–4 times the length of the total circumference. Thread the yarn onto a blunt tapestry needle. Sew together the live stitches with the Kitchener Stitch method as follows:

Step 1: Insert tapestry needle into the first K stitch on the working needle as if to knit, and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 2: Insert tapestry needle into the next K stitch on the working needle as if to purl and pull the yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Step 3: Insert tapestry needle into the first P stitch on the smallest needle as if to purl, and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 4: Insert tapestry needle into the next P stitch on the smallest needle as if to knit and pull yarn through this stitch, tugging it gently.

Repeat these 4 steps until 1–1 stitch remains on each needle.

Finishing steps:

Step 1: Insert tapestry needle into the last K stitch on the working needle as if to knit, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 2: Insert the left working needle from front to back into the first K stitch of the round with the marker, lifting this stitch up onto the left needle, remove marker. Insert tapestry needle into the lifted K stitch as if to purl, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 3: Insert tapestry needle into the last P stitch on the smallest needle as if to purl, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle.

Step 4: Insert the left smallest needle from front to back into the first P stitch of the round with the marker, lifting this stitch up onto the left needle, remove marker. Insert tapestry needle into the lifted P stitch on the smallest needle as if to knit, pull the yarn through and slip this stitch from the needle. Fasten off.

Fiery Temper

Abbreviations:

K – knit
k2tog – knit two stitches together (right slanting decrease)
k3tog – knit 3 stitches together (right slanting double decrease)
LLI – left leaning lifted increase: knit into the st 2 rows below the st just worked (first st on the right needle)
LLPI – left leaning lifted purl increase: purl into the st 2 rows below the st just worked (first st on the right needle)
P – purl
p2tog – purl two stitches together (right slanting decrease on RS)
RLI – right leaning lifted increase: knit into the st below the next st
RLPI – right leaning lifted purl increase: purl into the st below the next st
rnd, rnds – round, rounds
RS – right side
sl1 wyib – slip 1 st purlwise with yarn in back from the left needle onto the right needle
sl1 wyif – slip 1 st purlwise with yarn in front from the left needle onto the right needle
ssk – slip 2 sts knitwise individually, insert left needle into slipped sts from left to right and knit these 2 sts together (left slanting decrease)
sssk – slip 3 sts knitwise individually, insert left needle into slipped sts from left to right and knit these 3 sts together (left slanting double decrease)
ssp – slip 2 sts knitwise individually, and slip them back to the left needle, insert right needle into slipped sts from left to right and purl them together through the back loops (left slanting decrease on RS)
st, sts – stitch, stitches
WS – wrong side
w&t – wrap & turn (see Tips & Techniques below)
