

flurry sweater

ullen knitwear



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gauge: 16 sts x 18 rows in colourwork after blocking on 6 mm needles measures 10 cm x 10 cm.

needle: 6 and 5.5 mm

sizes: 1 (2) 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8) 9 (10) 11 (12)

bust measurements: 75 (80) 85 (90) 95 (100) 105 (110) 115 (120) 125 (130) cm

sweater circumference: 120 (125) 130 (135) 140 (145) 150 (155) 160 (165) 170 (175) cm

length: 66 (67) 68 (69) 70 (71) 72 (73) 74 (75) 76 (77) cm

yarn: main colour: 300 (350) 350 (350) 400 (400) 450 (450) 450 (500) 500 (550) eco soft by isager yarn held together with 75 (75) 75 (100) 100 (100) 125 (125) 125 (150) 150 (150) isager silk mohair

contrast colour: 150 (150) 200 (200) 200 (250) 250 (250) 300 (300) 300 (350) eco soft by isager yarn held together with 75 (75) 75 (100) 100 (100) 125 (125) 125 (150) 150 (150) isager silk mohair

difficulty: beginner

explanations

increases: m1l: put the right needle through the back between two stitches, and lift onto left needle. knit through the back loop.

m1r: put the right needle through the front between two stitches, and lift onto the left needle. knit as usual.

decreases: d1l: slip one knit-wise, knit 1, and slide the slip-stitch over the knitted stitch.

d1r: knit 1, put it on your left needle and slide an unknitted stitch over the knitted from your left needle. slide onto right needle.

abbreviations

stitch: st(s), **row:** r, **round:** rnd, **knit:** k, **purl:** p, **stitch marker:** stm, **main colour:** mc,

contrast colour: cc

construction

flurry sweater is knit top-down in the round. stitches are cast on for the neck and worked as a tube. the yoke is then worked with raglan increases and colourwork. after this, the sweater is divided into body and sleeves. the sleeves are worked in stockinette stitch with decreases and

finished with a long ribbed cuff. the body is worked in the same manner as the sleeves.

sizing

flurry sweater is an oversized sweater and has a positive ease of around 45 cm. measure your own breast circumference, add 45 cm and this will tell you what size to knit. the sweater in the picture is knit in size 3, and the model has a bust circumference of 85 cm.

dominant colour

when you knit a pattern, "dominant colour" is an important term. the dominant color is the one that is closest to your knitwear when you knit, and the color that will stand out the most in the pattern. here you can choose to use the main color or the contrasting color, depending on which expression you want on the sweater, but what is important is to make a conscious choice and stick to it throughout the work. it will give an even and consistent result on the pattern of your entire sweater.

pattern

neck

with the main colour, cast on 80 sts for all sizes for the neck on a 5.5 mm needle. *k 1, p 1* and repeat * to* across the entire round.

knit for about 22 rounds until the neck measures 9 cm.

yoke

switch to a 6 mm needle. now the yoke is knitted in stockinette and colourwork. the round begins at the raglan sts between the front and right sleeve. place 8 stm as follows: at the start, 2 st, stm, 23 sts, stm, 2 sts, stm, 13 sts, stm, 2 sts, stm, 23 sts, stm, 2 sts, stm, 13 sts.

you have now divided the yoke. now you are going to work with two strands of yarn, where the main colour will be referred to as mc, and contrast colour will be referred to as cc. the 8 raglan sts are always knit in the main colour, and raglan increases are always made using the contrast colour- this creates the pattern in the fabric. each time you do a raglan increase row, the pattern

made in the fabric will shift. we knit increases and start doing the colourwork as follows:

1st round: *k 2 in mc, stm, m1l in cc, knit 1 mc, 1 cc interchangeably until the next stm, m1r with cc, stm*. repeat from * to * until you reach the last stitch, m1r in cc.

2nd round: knit mc over mc and cc over cc.

do these two rounds 32 (33) 34 (35) 36 (37) 38 (39) 40 (41) 42 (43) times. then, do the 1st round once more. you now have 344 (352) 360 (368) 376 (384) 392 (400) 408 (416) 424 (432) stitches on the needle with a distribution of 89 (91) 93 (95) 97 (99) 101 (103) 105 (107) 109 (111) sts on the front and back and 79 (81) 83 (85) 87 (89) 91 (93) 95 (97) 99 (101) sts on each of the sleeves, as well as 8 raglan sts.

sleeves

now knit the sleeves. knit the right sleeve first, which are the stitches between the eighth and first stm and put the rest of the sts on hold. the raglan stitches belong to the body.

cast on 7 (9) 11 (13) 15 (17) 19 (21) 23 (25) 27 (29) sts for the underarm. put a stitch marker after 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8) 9 (10) 11 (12) 13 (14) sts you just cast on to mark the beginning of round. you now have 86 (90) 94 (98) 102 (106) 110 (114) 118 (122) 126 (130) stitches for the sleeves.

knit one round where you knit mc over mc and cc over cc, and for the underarms do the following: keep following the pattern of 1 mc and 1 cc until 1 st before the stm. *k 1 mc, stm, k 1 mc*, and mirror the pattern before the stm, e.g. if your last stitch was in the mc before ** our first stitch after the ** should be in mc, and vice versa. when you knit the sleeve, you should have a stripe going downwards in mc in the st before and the st after the stm.

your round begins after the cast in sts. keep doing one round where you knit the main colour over the contrast colour and opposite, and one round where you do the same colour for every stitch as the round before.

simultaneously, you decrease every 4 (3) 3 (2.5) 2.5 (2) 2 (1.5) 1 (1) 1 cm like this:

decrease round: d1l with mc, knit pattern as before until 2 sts until the stm, d1r with mc

keep knitting and decreasing until the arm measures about 30 (29) 28 (27) 26 (25) 24 (23) 22 (21) 20 cm from the underarm. you should now have about 70 (70) 74 (76) 80 (80) 84 (84) 88 (80) 86 (92) sts on the needles.

switch to a 5.5 mm needle. then knit the ribbing in mc as follows:

1 round: *k 1, p 1*. repeat from * to * across the round.

knit this round about 22 times until the cuff measures 9 cm.

cast off like this: knit one stitch, *knit one stitch, put the first stitch over the second stitch* and repeat from * until * for the entire round.

repeat the process on the other sleeve, which are the sts between the third and fourth stm.

body

now we knit the body in the round. put all sts on you needles, and start at the first stm.

k the front, pick up 7 (9) 11 (13) 15 (17) 19 (21) 23 (25) 27 (29) stitches in the pattern including the 2 mc stitches in the middle of the underarm, knit the back, pick up 7 (9) 11 (13) 15 (17) 19 (21) 23 (25) 27 (29) stitches in the pattern including the 2 mc stitches in the middle of the underarm. you now have 200 (208) 216 (224) 232 (240) 248 (256) 264 (272) 280 (288) sts on your needles.

then knit the body in stockinette and colourwork until it measures 28 (27) 26 (25) 24 (23) 22 (21) 20 (19) 18 (17) cm from the end of the raglan.

switch to a 5.5 mm needle. then knit the ribbing in mc as follows:

1 round: *k 1, p 1*. repeat from * to * across the round.

knit this round about 22 times until the cuff measures 9 cm.

cast off like this: knit one stitch, *knit one stitch, put the first stitch over the second stitch*.
repeat from * until * for the entire round.

block the sweater to even out the knitting. you can fold the collar and sew it down if you like.
