### DETAILS

Framed by a bold hem, neckline and cuffs, this year's Rhinebeck sweater celebrates traditional handcrafts in a modern pullover. Knit from the bottom up and adorned with puff sleeves, this sweater will be a truly special addition to your handmade wardrobe!



#### SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9)



#### FINISHED CHEST CIRCUMFERENCE

34.5 (39.75, 44.5, 49.5, 54.5)(59.5, 64.25, 69.25, 74.25)"

87.5 (101, 113, 126, 138.5)(151, 163, 176, 189) cm

*Intended to be worn with approx. 4-10"/10 - 25.5 cm positive ease.*

*Sample shown in size 3 with approx. 10"/20.5 cm positive ease on a 5'5"/165 cm tall woman.*



#### YARN

Worsted 100% Superwash Wool in 3 colors

A - 83 (100, 122, 132, 155)(178, 188, 199, 236) g

166 (200, 244, 264, 310)(356, 376, 398, 472) yds

152 (183, 223, 242, 284)(326, 344, 364, 432) m

B - 174 (219, 255, 275, 325)(373, 394, 417, 494) g

348 (438, 510, 550, 650)(746, 788, 834, 988) yds

318 (401, 466, 503, 595)(682, 721, 763, 904) m

C - 138 (174, 203, 219, 259)(297, 314, 332, 390) g

318 (400, 467, 504, 596)(683, 722, 764, 897) yds

290 (366, 427, 461, 545)(625, 661, 698, 820) m



#### SUGGESTED YARN

A - Spinster's Daughter Worsted - 100% American SW Wool (100 g/200 yds/183 m) - 1 (1, 2, 2, 2)(2, 2, 2, 3) skein/s in York (teal)

B - Spinster's Daughter Worsted - 100% American SW Wool (100 g/200 yds/183 m) - 2 (3, 3, 3, 4)(4, 4, 5, 5) skeins in Love Me Like You Used To (grey)

C - Spincycle Yarns Dream State - 100% American SW Wool (65 g/150 yds/137 m) - 3 (3, 4, 4, 4)(5, 5, 6, 6) skein/s in Shades of Earth (multi)



#### SUGGESTED NEEDLES

Main Fabric: US 7/4.5 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular (2 sets for 3 Needle BO) and preferred needles for small circumference knitting for the sleeves.

Ribbing: US 5/3.75 mm - 32-40"/80-100 cm circular and preferred needles for small circumference knitting for cuffs and collar.

*(Use the needle size you need to achieve gauge, going down two US sizes for the ribbing.)*



#### NOTIONS

Stitch markers (2), tapestry needle, spare needle, stitch holders or waste yarn to hold stitches



#### GAUGE

21 sts & 24 rnds = 4"/10 cm

*Measured over stitch pattern (pg. 5) knit in the round using the Main Fabric needle, after blocking.*



## FRAMED

### NOTES

- To pick your size, measure around your full chest, then add or subtract your desired ease to that number. Pick the size closest to that from the *FINISHED CHEST CIRCUMFERENCE* on page 2 - DETAILS.
- This sweater is worked from the bottom up. The body is worked in the round until the divide for the yoke. The remainder is worked flat, shaping the shoulders with German Short Rows and then finishing using the 3 needle bind off. The sleeves are then picked up from the body and knit in the round down to the cuff.
- To adjust the body length of the sweater, I recommend doing it in increments of 13 rounds, so you can complete a full pattern block (1/2 a chart repeat). You will want to do this before separating the front and back for the Yoke, and keep in mind this means you may need to start the yoke chart on a different row so you stay in pattern. Take into account this will affect the amount of yardage used, and there will be some growth in length (approx. 0.5-1"/1-2.5 cm) after blocking.
- Keep an eye on your sleeve gauge! A lot of knitters tighten up when knitting smaller circumferences (as opposed to the body of the sweater) and may need to go up a needle size to keep their gauge consistent. Alternatively, if you would prefer a less oversized sleeve, stick with the same needle size as you used for the body. I went this route and my gauge tightened to about 5.5 sts per 1"/2.5 cm.
- There is no need to break yarn colors as you work, simply carry them up the inside/edge of the sweater.

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### GLOSSARY

**{ }** - Repeat

**BO** - Bind off

**BOR** - Beginning of round

**CO** - Cast on

**CONT** - Continue

**DEC/D** - Decrease/d

**DS** - Double Stitch: move yarn to front between needles, slip stitch from the LHN, pull yarn up and over the top of the needle to the back so that the legs of the lower stitch are pulled up onto the needle - creating the appearance of 2 strands of yarn for the stitch instead of just one. (If purling, return the yarn to the front between the 2 needle tips.)

**EST** - Established

**INC/D** - Increase/d

**K** - Knit

**K1-F/B** - Knit into the front loop and then the back loop of the stitch. [1 st inc'd]

**K2TOG** - Knit 2 stitches together as one. [1 st dec'd]

**LHN** - Left hand needle

**M** - Marker

**M1R-P** - Make 1 Right Purl: pick up the bar between the last stitch you purlled and the one you're about to purl, bringing the needle from the back to the front. Purl thru the front of this stitch. [1 st inc'd]

**P** - Purl

**P2TOG** - Purl 2 stitches together as one. [1 st dec'd]

**P1-F/B** - Purl into the front loop and then the back loop of the stitch. [1 st inc'd]

**REM** - Remain

**REP** - Repeat

**RND/S** - Round/s

**RS** - Right side

**SL** - Slip stitch purlwise

**SS** - Selvedge stitches

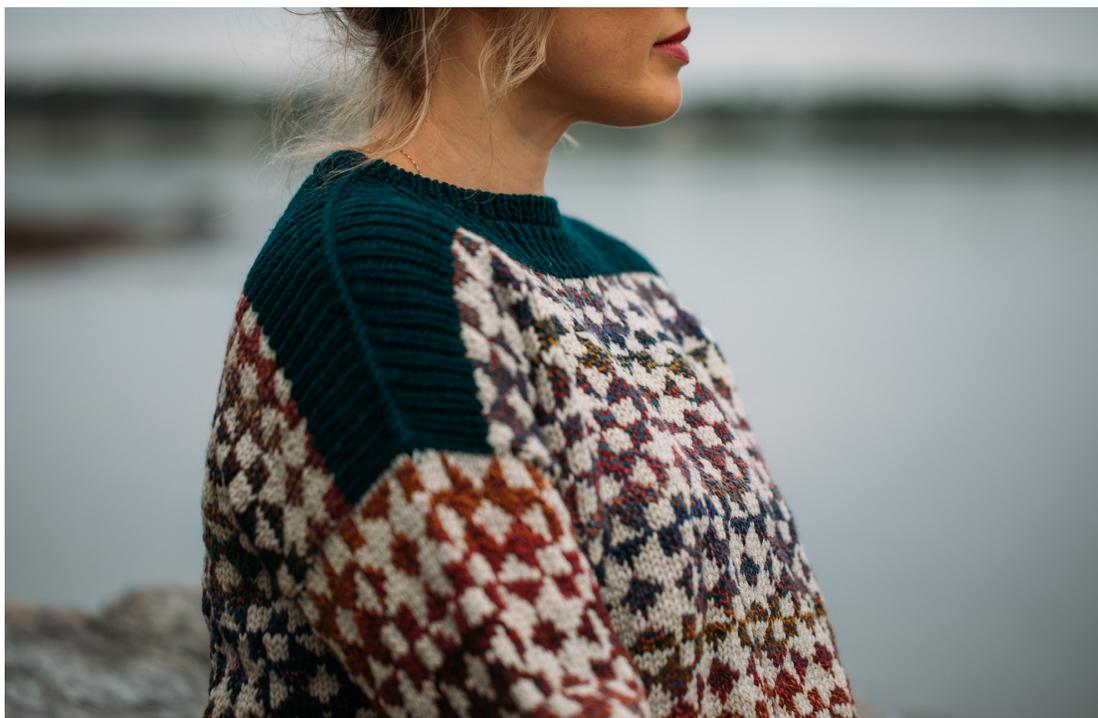
**ST/S** - Stitch/es

**TBL** - Thru the back loop

**WS** - Wrong side

**WYIF** - With yarn in front

**WYIB** - With yarn in back



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### DIRECTIONS

#### HEM

With the Ribbing needle & A, CO 182 (208, 234, 260, 286)(312, 338, 364, 390) sts using the Long Tail Tubular Cast On method. Do not join to work in the rnd. *If you prefer to sub in a different CO method, skip the Tubular setup rows, join to work in the rnd, placing a BOR M and go straight to the Ribbing Rnd.*

**Tubular Setup Row 1 (WS):** {K1-tbl, sl1 wyif} to end.

**Tubular Setup Row 2 (RS):** {K1, sl1 wyif} to end.

Place a BOR marker and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist the sts.

**Ribbing Rnd:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Rep [Ribbing Rnd]** until hem measures 1.5"/4 cm from the CO edge.

#### BODY

Change to Main Fabric needle.

**Setup Rnd:** Using A, knit. Break A.

Join B & C and work from the Body Chart (below), repeating the chart across the rnd.

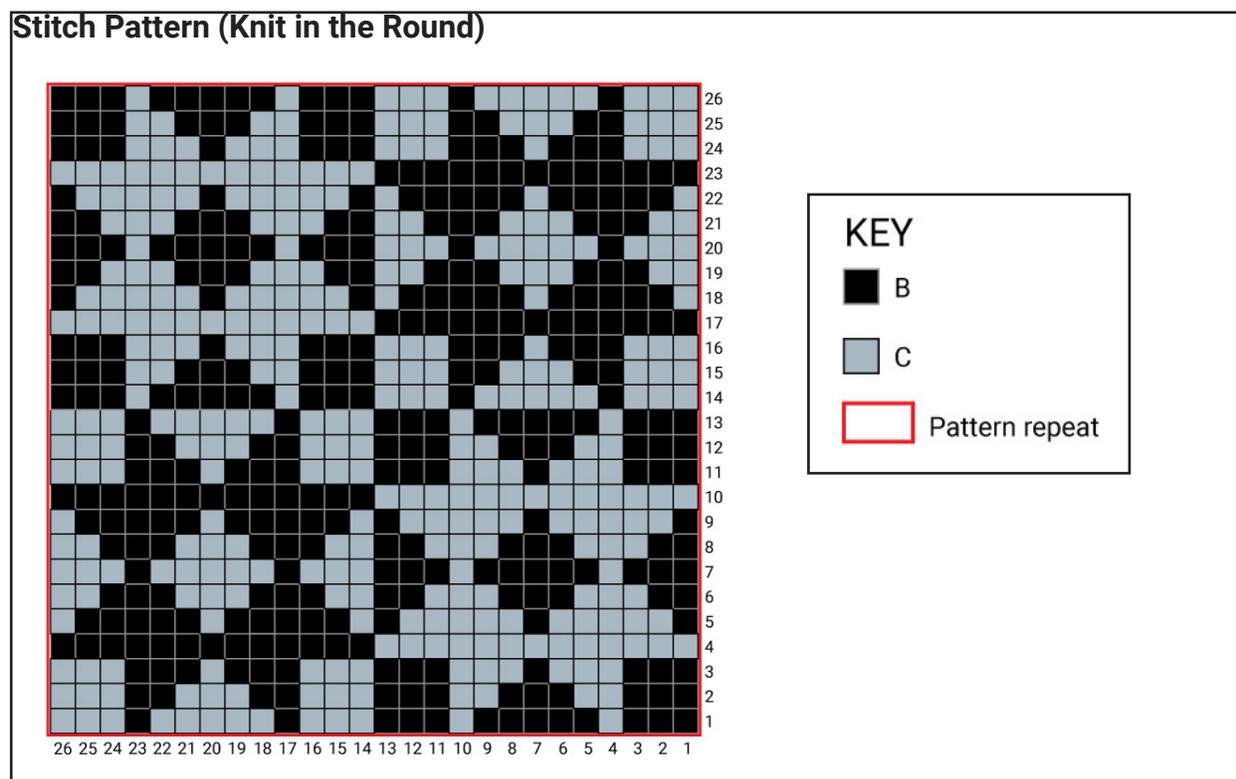
Work two full repeats of [Rnds 1-26] of the chart.

**Size 1 ONLY:** Rep [Rnds 1-6] once more.

**Sizes 6, 7, 8 & 9 ONLY:** Rep Rnds [1-4] once more.

**All sizes proceed to Separate for Yoke on pg. 6.**

#### Stitch Pattern (Knit in the Round)



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### DIRECTIONS

#### SEPARATE FOR YOKE

Remove BOR M, using C and the Cable Cast On Method, CO 2 sts, knit across newly CO sts and 91 (104, 117, 130, 143) (156, 169, 182, 195) Front sts following the Front Yoke Chart for your size on pg. 7, beginning on Row 7 (1, 1, 1, 1)(5, 5, 5, 5), using C and the Backwards Loop Method, CO 2 sts. Turn. The remaining unworked 91 (104, 117, 130, 143)(156, 169, 182, 195) Back sts may be placed on hold using a spare needle or waste yarn while the Front Yoke is finished.  
95 (108, 121, 134, 147)(160, 173, 186, 199) sts on needle for Front.

#### FRONT YOKE PATTERN REPEAT

*The remainder of the Front Yoke will be worked flat, in rows, following the chart for your size on page 7. Knit on RS rows and on purl on WS rows.*

**Size 1 ONLY:** Work [Rows 8-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Sizes 2, 3, & 4 ONLY:** Work [Rows 2-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Size 5 ONLY:** Work [Rows 2-26], followed by [Rows 1-13]. Break B & C.

**Sizes 6, 7, & 8 ONLY:** Work [Rows 6-26], followed by one more repeat of [Rows 1-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Size 9 ONLY:** Work [Rows 6-26], followed by one more repeat of [Rows 1-26] & one more repeat of [Rows 1-13]. Break B & C.

**SIZES 1 (-, 3, -, 5)(-, 7, -, 9) ONLY (WS):** Join A and purl.

**SIZES - (2, -, 4, -)(6, -, 8, -) ONLY (WS/INC):** Join A, p1, m1R-p, purl to end. [1 st inc'd; - (109, -, 135, -)(161, -, 187, -) sts on needle for Front]

#### SHOULDER RIBBING

Change to Ribbing Needle.

**Ribbing Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k2, {p1, k1} to the last 2 sts, k2.

**Ribbing Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p2, {k1, p1} to the last 2 sts, p2.

**Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2]** 3 (4, 5, 5, 4)(3, 3, 3, 4) *more times.*

#### RIGHT FRONT SHOULDER - as worn

**Neck BO Row (RS):** Work in the est ribbing for 39 (44, 51, 57, 61)(68, 74, 81, 87) sts, inc into the next st with either a k1-f/b or p1-f/b (to stay in pattern), k1, BO 1 by pulling the new st created by the inc over the st you just knit, BO 15 (19, 17, 19, 23) (23, 23, 23, 23) *more sts knitwise*, cont in the est ribbing to the last 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts, turn.  
[40 (45, 52, 58, 62)(69, 75, 82, 88) sts rem per shoulder]

*The Left Front Shoulder sts may be placed on hold using waste yarn or a spare needle while the Right Front Shoulder is finished.*

**Short Row 2 (WS):** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

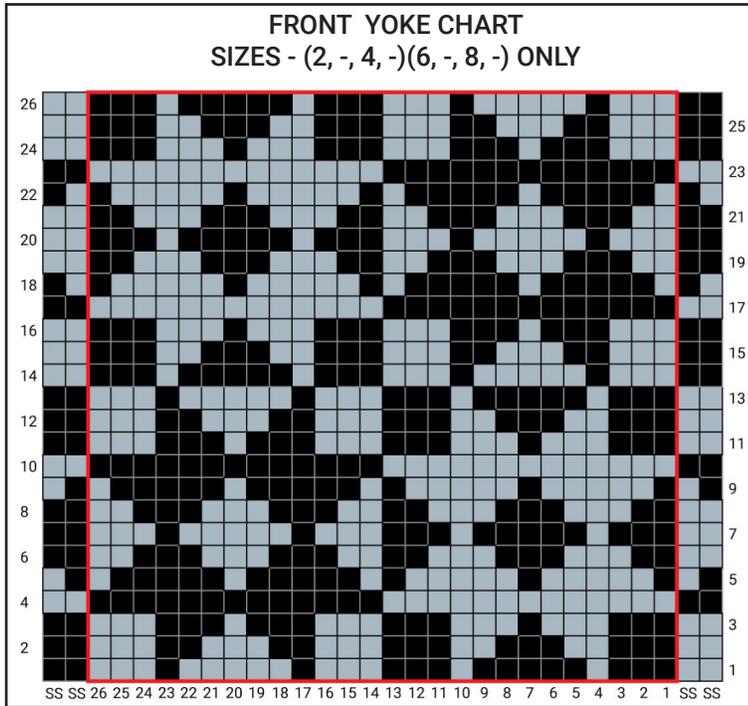
**Short Row 3 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 *more sts knitwise*, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [4 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 4:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.



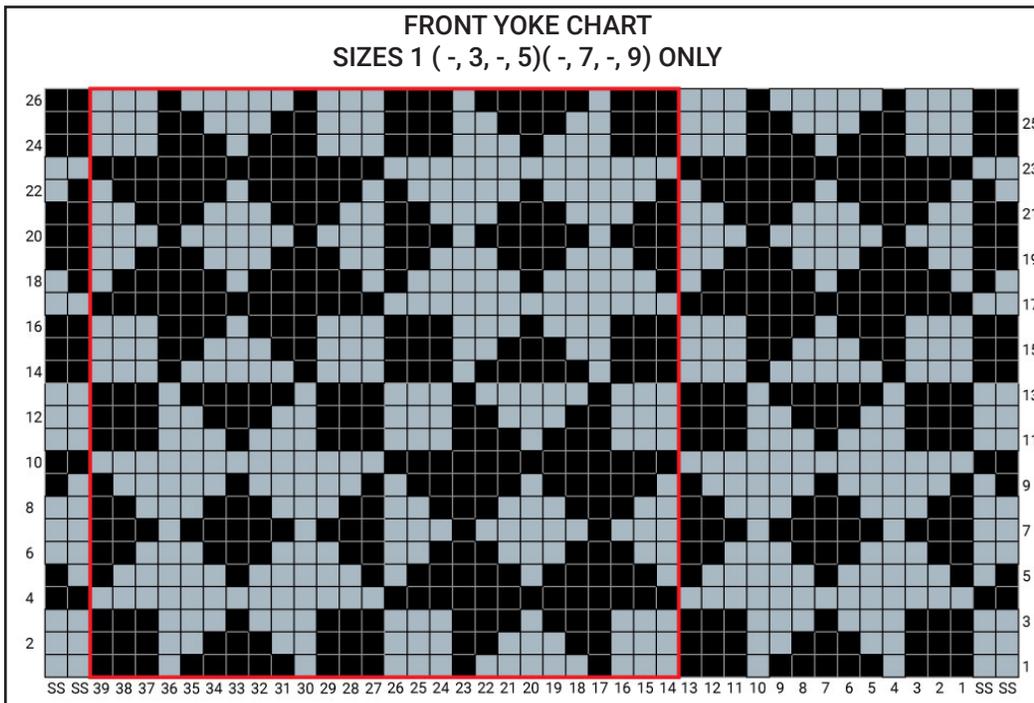
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## FRONT YOKE CHARTS - WORKED FLAT

**Short Row 5 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 more sts knitwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [3 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 6:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 7 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st knitwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [2 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 8:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 9 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [1 st dec'd; 30 (35, 42, 48, 52)(59, 65, 72, 78) sts rem]

**Short Row 10:** DS, work in rib to end.

**Short Row 11:** Sl1 wyib, work in rib to end, resolving the DS as they are encountered by working the 2 strands of the DS as a k2tog or p2tog to stay in pattern.

**Row 12:** Work in rib to end. Break yarn and place Right Shoulder sts on hold.

### LEFT FRONT SHOULDER - as worn

Return held sts for the Left Front Shoulder to the Ribbing needle and join A at the neck edge with WS facing.

**Short Row 1 (WS):** Work in rib to the last 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts, turn.

**Short Row 2 (RS):** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 3 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 3 more sts purlwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [4 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 4:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 5 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 2 more sts purlwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [3 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 6:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 7 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st purlwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [2 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 8:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 9 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [1 st dec'd; 30 (35, 42, 48, 52)(59, 65, 72, 78) sts rem]

**Short Row 10:** DS, work in rib to end.

**Short Row 11:** Work in rib to end, resolving the DS as they are encountered by working the 2 strands of the DS as a k2tog or p2tog to stay in pattern. Leave yarn attached for shoulder bind off and place Left Shoulder sts on hold.

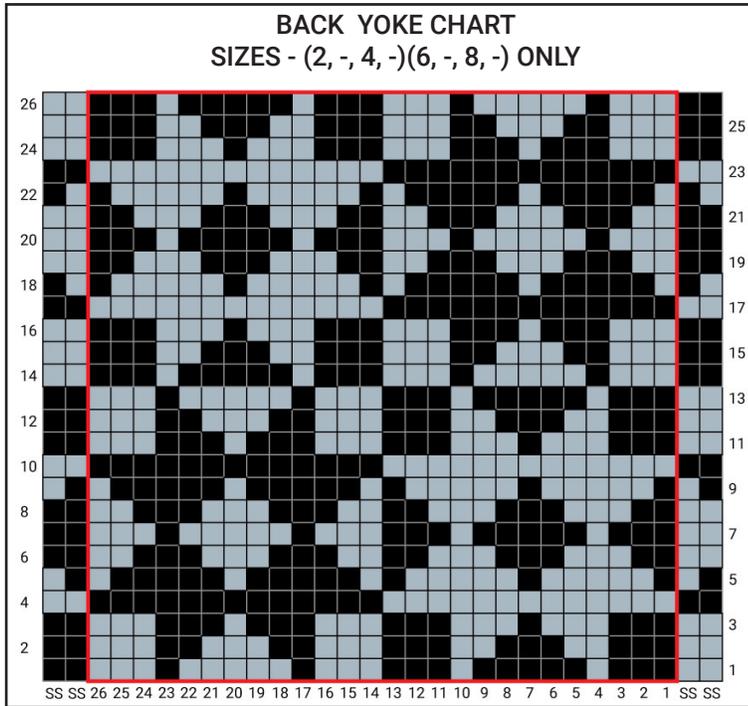
### BACK YOKE

Return held Back sts to the Main Fabric needle and join B & C to the right edge with RS facing. Using C and the Cable Cast On Method, CO 2 sts, knit across newly CO sts and 91 (104, 117, 130, 143)(156, 169, 182, 195) sts following the Back Yoke Chart for your size on pg. 9, beginning on Row 7 (1, 1, 1, 1)(5, 5, 5, 5), using C and the Backwards Loop Method, CO 2 sts. Turn. 95 (108, 121, 134, 147)(160, 173, 186, 199) sts on needle for Back.



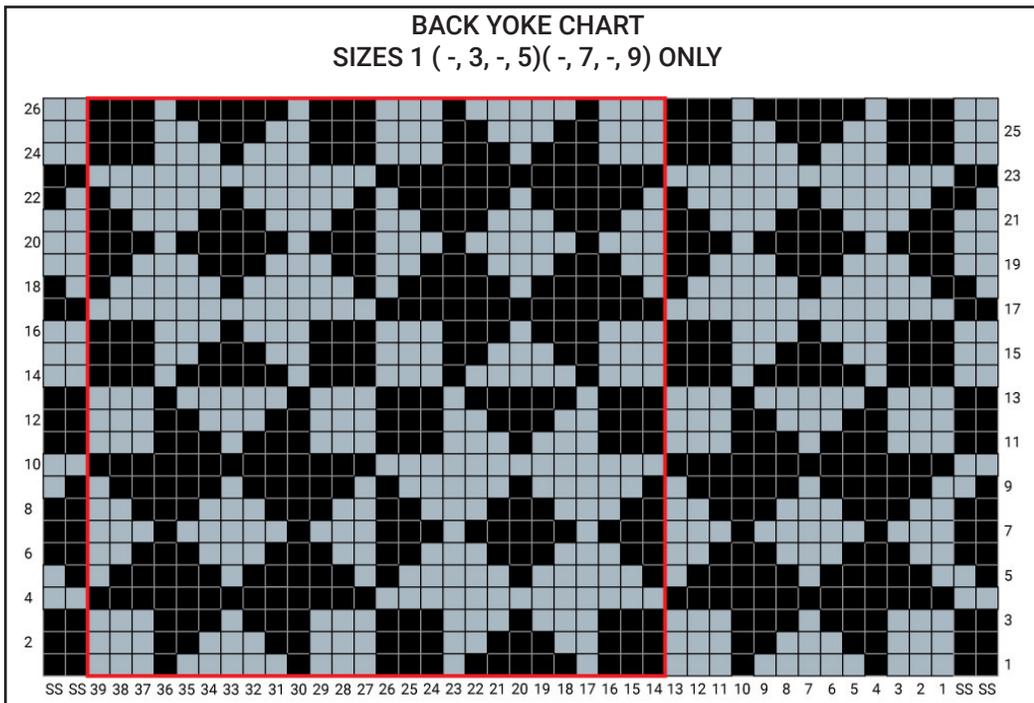
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## BACK YOKE CHARTS - WORKED FLAT

### DIRECTIONS

#### BACK YOKE PATTERN REPEAT

*The remainder of the Back yoke will be worked flat, in rows, following the chart for your size on page 9. Knit on RS rows and purl on WS rows.*

**Size 1 ONLY:** Work [Rows 8-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Sizes 2, 3, & 4 ONLY:** Work [Rows 2-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Size 5 ONLY:** Work [Rows 2-26], followed by [Rows 1-13].

**Sizes 6, 7, & 8 ONLY:** Work [Rows 6-26], followed by one more repeat of [Rows 1-26]. Break B & C and slide sts down so the WS is still facing you.

**Size 9 ONLY:** Work [Rows 6-26], followed by one more repeat of [Rows 1-26] & one more repeat of [Rows 1-13]. Break B & C.

**SIZES 1 (-, 3, -, 5)(-, 7, -, 9) ONLY (WS):** Join A and purl.

**SIZES - (2, -, 4, -)(6, -, 8, -) ONLY (WS/INC):** Join A, p1, m1R-p, purl to end. [1 st inc'd; - (109, -, 135, -)(161, -, 187, -) sts on needle for Back]

#### SHOULDER RIBBING

Change to Ribbing Needle.

**Ribbing Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k2, {p1, k1} to the last 2 sts, k2.

**Ribbing Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p2, {k1, p1} to the last 2 sts, p2.

**Rep [Ribbing Rows 1 & 2]** 3 (4, 5, 5, 4)(3, 3, 3, 4) *more times.*

#### SHOULDER SHAPING

**Short Row 1 (RS):** Work in the est ribbing to the last 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts, turn.

**Short Row 2 (WS):** DS, work in rib to the last 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts, turn.

**Short Row 3:** DS, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the previous DS, turn.

**Rep [Short Row 3]** 3 *more times.*

#### LEFT BACK SHOULDER - as worn

**Short Row 7 (RS/NECK BO):** DS, work in rib for 17 (19, 20, 23, 24)(28, 31, 32, 35) sts, inc into the next st with either a k1-f/b or p1-f/b (to stay in pattern), k1, BO 1 by pulling the new st created by the inc over the st you just knit, BO 29 (33, 31, 33, 37)(37, 37, 37, 37) more sts knitwise, cont in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the previous DS, turn.  
[33 (38, 45, 51, 55)(62, 68, 75, 81) sts rem per shoulder]

*The Right Back Shoulder sts may be placed on hold using waste yarn or a spare needle while the Left Back Shoulder is finished.*

**Short Row 8 (WS):** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 9 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st knitwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [2 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 10:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 11 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, work in rib to end, resolving the DS as they are encountered by working the 2 strands of the DS as a k2tog or p2tog to stay in pattern.

### \_\_\_\_\_ DIRECTIONS \_\_\_\_\_

**Row 12:** Work in rib to end. Break yarn and place Left Shoulder sts on hold.  
[1 st dec'd; 30 (35, 42, 48, 52)(59, 65, 72, 78) sts rem]

#### **RIGHT BACK SHOULDER - as worn**

Return held sts for the Right Back Shoulder to the Ribbing needle and join A at the neck edge with WS facing.

**Short Row 1 (WS):** Work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn.

**Short Row 2 (RS):** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 3 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, BO 1 more st purlwise, work in rib to 4 (5, 7, 8, 9)(10, 11, 13, 14) sts before the prev DS, turn. [2 sts dec'd]

**Short Row 4:** DS, work in rib to 1 st before the neck edge, sl1 wyif.

**Short Row 5 (DEC):** Sl2 wyib, pass the first st over the top of the second and off the needle, work in rib end, resolving the DS as they are encountered by working the 2 strands of the DS as a k2tog or p2tog to stay in pattern. Break yarn and place Right Shoulder sts on hold.

[1 st dec'd; 30 (35, 42, 48, 52)(59, 65, 72, 78) sts rem]

#### **SHOULDER FINISHING**

*You can find a tutorial for the 3 Needle Bind Off in the Notes on pg. 3.*

With the RS facing out (to create an exposed seam), so that the WS of front and back are facing each other, and the front of the sweater facing you, BO the first shoulder using the Three Needle Bind Off as follows:

Line up the shoulder sts from the front and the back of the sweater on parallel needles. Yarn A should still be attached at the Left Front Sleeve edge, if it isn't - attach a new ball now. Using a third needle, insert needle tip knitwise into the first stitch on the front needle and then knitwise into the first stitch on the back needle, and knit them together; \*knit the next stitch from each needle together, slip the first stitch over the second; repeat from \* until 1 stitch remains. Break yarn and pull it through the remaining live stitch to secure.

Repeat for the other shoulder beginning at the neck edge.

### — DIRECTIONS —

#### **SLEEVES (same for both)**

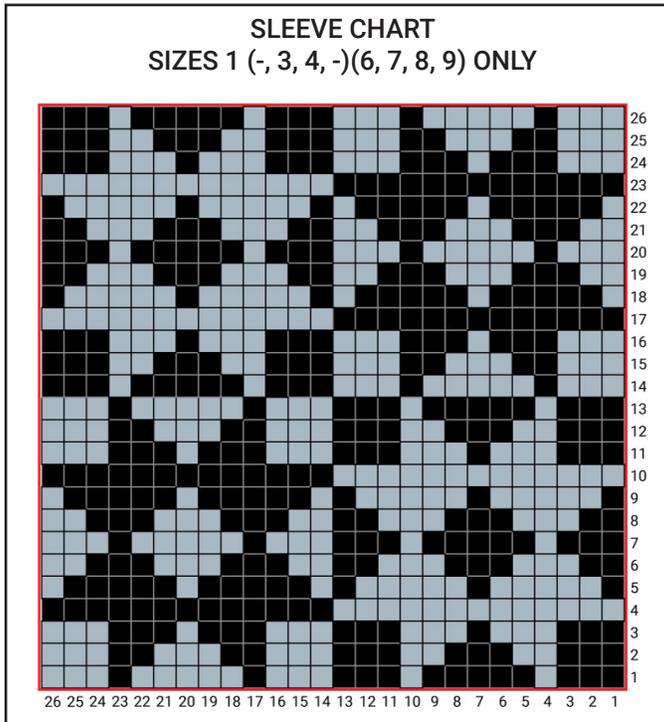
*The sleeves will have approximately 1 1/2.5 cm of growth in length post-blocking. Sizes 2 & 5 will work a modified chart that helps blend the disruption of not having enough sts for a full chart repeat. I love having this puff sleeve land just a bit longer than a 3/4 length sleeve for this sweater, but feel free to try on your sweater and adjust the sleeve length to your liking by adding or subtracting full or half repeats of the chart. Please note, this will affect the total yarn required. Both charts are located on pg. 13.*

Using Main Fabric needle in your preferred method for small circumference knitting, join B at the underarm and pick up and knit 52 (66, 78, 78, 92)(104, 104, 104, 130) sts around the sleeve opening, making sure to pick up sts in the space next to the second SS. Place a BOR M and join to work in the rnd. Join C and work from the Sleeve Chart for your size, working the chart repeat in the red box across the rnd, or between the first & last 7 sts for sizes 2 & 5.

Work two full repeats of [Rnds 1-26] of the chart, followed by one repeat of [Rnds 1-13]. Break B & C.

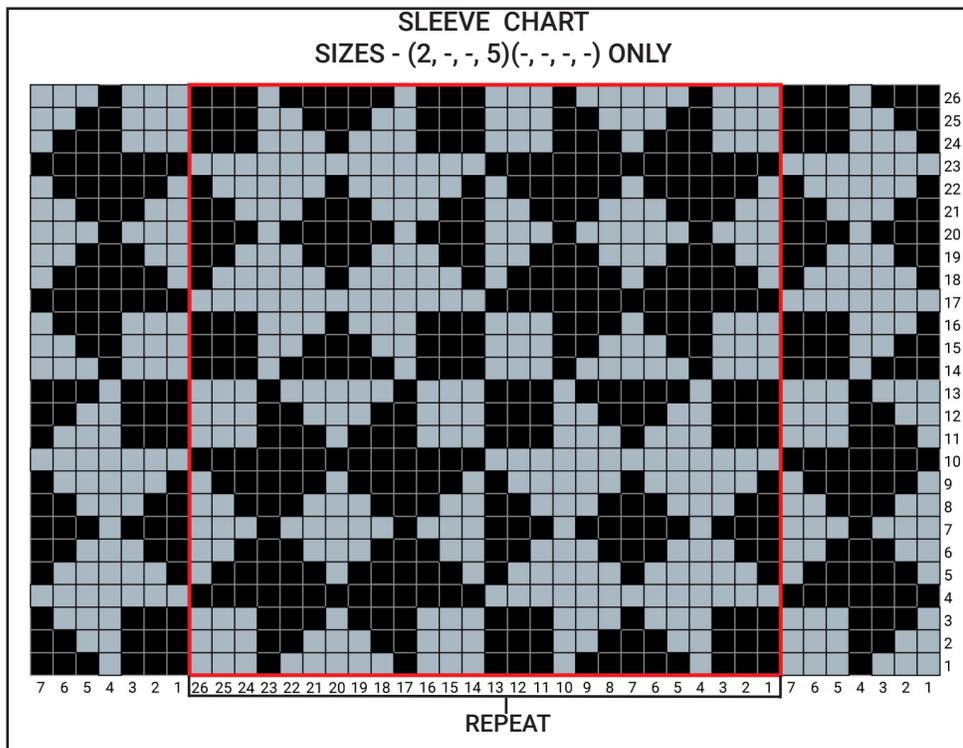

## FRAMED DIRECTIONS

### CUFF

Join A & knit 1 rnd.

**Size 1 ONLY (DEC):** K2, {k2tog, k3} to end.  
[10 sts dec'd; 42 sts rem]

**Size 2 ONLY (DEC):** {K2tog, k2} 2 times,  
{k2tog, k3} 10 times, {k2tog, k2} 2 times.  
[14 sts dec'd; 52 sts rem]

**Sizes 3 & 4 ONLY (DEC):** K2tog, {k2,  
k2tog} to end. [20 sts dec'd; 58 sts rem]

**Size 5 ONLY (DEC):** {K2tog, k1} 2 times,  
{k2tog, k2} 20 times, {k2tog, k1} 2 times.  
[24 sts dec'd; 58 sts rem]

**Sizes 6, 7 & 8 ONLY (DEC):** K2, {k2tog, k1}  
to end. [34 sts dec'd; 70 sts rem]

**Size 9 ONLY (DEC):** {K2tog, k1, k2tog} to  
end. [52 sts dec'd; 78 sts rem]

Change to Ribbing needle.

**Ribbing Pattern:** {K1, p1} to end of rnd.  
Cont in the est ribbing pattern for 1.5"/4  
cm. *(If you prefer not to do a Tubular BO,  
work one more ribbing row and then bind  
off using your preferred method.)*

**Tubular BO Rnd 1:** {K1, sl1 wyif} to end of  
rnd.

**Tubular BO Rnd 2:** {Sl1 wyib, p1} to end of  
rnd.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit  
sts onto the working needle and the  
purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference  
the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle  
Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip  
this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length  
of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts  
using the Kitchener stitch.

Repeat for the other sleeve.

### COLLAR

Using the Ribbing needle, join A at the  
right edge of the Back Neck and pick up  
and knit 88 (96, 96, 96, 104)(104, 104, 104,  
104) sts around the neck. *(You can pick  
up more or fewer sts, as long as your final  
stitch count is divisible by 2.)* Place a BOR  
M and join to work in the round.

**Ribbing Rnd:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end of  
rnd.

**Rep [Ribbing Rnd]** 2 more times.

*(If you prefer not to do a Tubular BO, work  
one more ribbing row and then bind off  
using your preferred method.)*

**Tubular BO Rnd 1:** {K1, sl1 wyif} to end of  
rnd.

**Tubular BO Rnd 2:** {Sl1 wyib, p1} to end of  
rnd.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit  
sts onto the working needle and the  
purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference  
the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle  
Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip  
this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length  
of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts  
using the Kitchener stitch.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends and wet block sweater  
by letting it soak in lukewarm bath with  
wool wash for at least 15 minutes. Gently  
squeeze the excess water from your  
sweater. Sandwich sweater between clean  
towels and step on top to remove as much  
moisture as possible. Repeat with fresh  
towels if necessary.

Lay sweater flat to dry using the  
schematic to help achieve the desired  
shape and measurements. Trim yarn tails  
and wear!

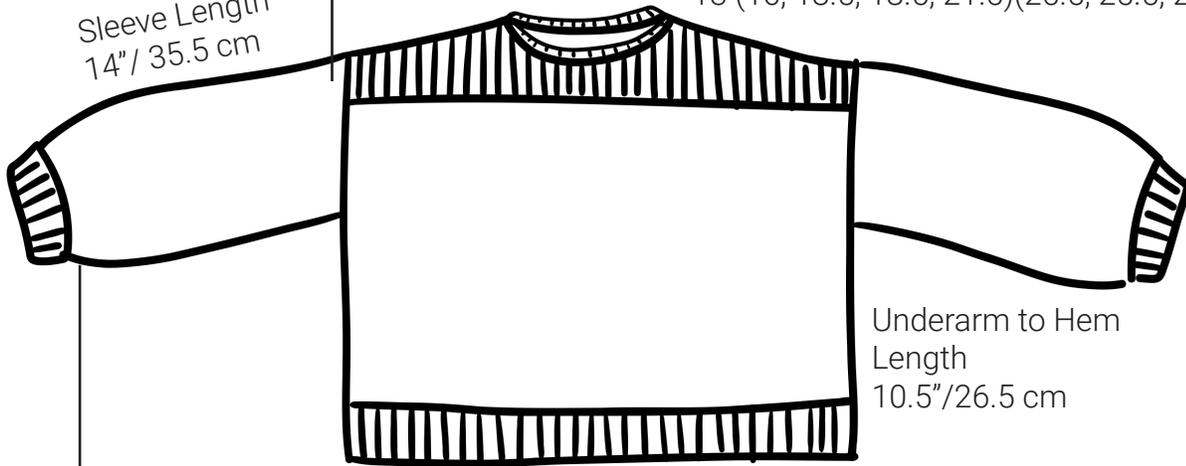
