FLORENCE SPURLING STUDIO

A creative collaboration with Kokon Yarn, Freya is an easy to wear, relaxed shape tee. Dimensional floral stitches featuring bobbles and lace adorn the front of the pullover. These are later embellished with tactile yarn ‘petals.’ This decorative element can easily be customized to suit a range of design sensibilities.

The pattern includes instructions for both a short sleeve and long sleeve version.

YARN

Main Colour (MC)

KOKON Merino Linen
90% Merino, 10% Linen
Lightweight Fingering
360m / 393yds per 100g / 3.53oz skein

Contrast Colour 1&2 (CC1&CC2) – Used for petal embellishments

KOKON Yarn Chunky Mohair
78% Mohair, 13% Merino, 9% Nylon
Chunky weight
100m / 109yds per 50g / 1.76oz skein

For stitching down the petal embellishments
(See Tools & Materials):

KOKON Kidsilk Mohair
72% Mohair, 28% Silk
Lace weight
210m / 229yds per 25g / 0.88oz skein

GAUGE

25 sts and 38 rows = 10cm / 4” in Stockinette
Stitch using MC and larger needle, after
blocking.

27 sts and 38 rnds = 10cm / 4” in 1x1 Rib using
MC and smaller needle, after blocking.

Always use a needle size that achieves the
correct gauge.

MC – 925 (1100, 1250, 1525, 1725) (1650, 1850, 2025, 2300)m /
1000 (1200, 1375, 1675, 1875) (1800, 2025, 2225, 2525)yds
for short sleeve version.

Add 325 (375, 425, 525, 550) (675, 675, 625, 700)m /
350 (400, 475, 575, 600) (750, 750, 675, 775)yds
for longer sleeves.

CC1* – 6 (11, 11, 11, 11) (16, 16, 16, 16)m /
7 (12, 12, 12, 12) (17, 17, 17, 17)yds

CC2* – 6 (11, 11, 11, 11) (16, 16, 16, 19)m /
7 (12, 12, 12, 12) (17, 17, 17, 21)yds

* Each petal embellishment requires approx 1.7 m /
1.8 yds. Exact amount of CC1 & CC2 will vary based upon
placement and colour arrangement of petals.

TOOLS & MATERIALS

- 3.25mm / US 3, 61cm / 24" or 81cm / 32" circular needle for main body
- 3.25mm / US 3, 40cm / 16" circular needle, or set of double pointed needles, or longer circular needle for Magic Loop for sleeves
- Spare 3.25mm / US 3 needle for 3-Needle bind-off
- 2.75mm / US 2 (or 1 size smaller than main needle), 61cm / 24" or 81cm / 32" circular needle for main body trim, and 40cm / 16" circular needle for collar and sleeve cuffs
- 2 unique stitch markers for the BOR and side, plus 6-14 for the flower stitch placement
- 2.25mm crochet hook (if making bobble stitches with the Crochet Hook Method)
- 3 Stitch holders
- Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

For the petal embellishments:

- 3.25mm crochet hook
- Lace weight kidsilk mohair (or a lace weight yarn in a fibre/texture that blends in with the petal yarn) in the same or similar colour to the petal yarn. This is used to sew the petals down to the knitted surface
- Fine sewing needle with a threading eye large enough for the laceweight yarn used to sew the petals down
- Piece of firm cardboard (e.g. from a cardboard box), cut into a strip measuring approximately 1.8cm / 0.75" x 19cm / 7.75". This cardboard strip will be used to crochet around and create petal loops of the same size
- Pins to secure the petal embellishments in place as they are sewn down

beg: beginning

SIZES

90 (100, 110, 120, 130) (140, 150, 160, 170)cm / 36 (40, 44, 48, 52) (56, 60, 64, 68)"

To fit bust size 70 (80, 90, 100, 110) (120, 130, 140, 150)cm / 28 (32, 36, 40, 44) (48, 52, 56, 60)"

Worn with 15-20cm / 6-8" of positive ease.

Sample shown in 100cm / 40" with approximately 15cm / 6" of positive ease.

To achieve the same look as the sample, choose a similar amount of positive ease. If between sizes, choose the next larger size for a looser fit, or smaller size for a closer fit.

Please note that due to the drop-shoulder construction, the armhole will fall around the upper arm/bicep. The sleeves are rather fitted, so verify that twice the armhole depth will fit around your upper arm.

FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

Finished Body circumference: 90 (100, 110, 120, 130) (140, 150, 160, 170)cm / 36 (40, 44, 48, 52) (56, 60, 64, 68)"

Back length from hem to shoulder: 48.5 (51.5, 53.5, 55, 56) (59.5, 60.5, 63.5, 68.5)cm / 19 (20.25, 21, 21.75, 22) (23.5, 23.75, 25, 27)"

Hem to armhole: 36 (39, 39, 39, 39) (41.5, 41.5, 43.5, 47.5)cm / 14.25 (15.25, 15.25, 15.25, 15.25) (16.25, 16.25, 17.25, 18.75)"

Armhole depth: 12.5 (12.5, 14.5, 16, 17) (18, 19, 20, 21)cm / 5 (5, 5.75, 6.25, 6.75) (7, 7.5, 7.75, 8.25)"

Neck opening width, with Collar: 22 (22, 25.5, 26, 27) (28, 28.5, 31, 31)cm / 8.75 (8.75, 10, 10.25, 10.75) (11, 11.25, 12.25, 12.25)"

Sleeve length, short sleeve (including cuff): 11cm / 4.25"

Cuff circumference, short sleeve: 25 (26, 26.5, 29.5, 31) (33.5, 35, 35.5, 37)cm / 9.75 (10.25, 10.5, 11.5, 12.25) (13.25, 13.75, 14, 14.5)"


Sleeve length, long sleeve (including cuff): 44 (48, 50, 54.5, 53.5) (59, 57, 50.5, 53)cm / 17.25 (19, 19.75, 21.5, 21) (23.25, 22.5, 20, 20.75)"

Cuff circumference, long sleeve: 15.5 (15.5, 17, 18.5, 20) (20.5, 20, 21.5, 22)cm / 6 (6, 6.75, 7.25, 7.75) (8, 7.75, 8.5, 8.75)"

CONSTRUCTION NOTES

- Body is worked in the round from the bottom up to the armholes.
- At the armholes, work is divided for front and back, then worked flat to shoulders.
- Stitches are picked up around the armhole circumference and the sleeve is worked in the round top down.
- As the sizes increase, so do the number of rows and columns of flower stitches. There is an illustration included with the 'petal embellishment' directions that suggests the petal embellishment placement according to the size. The sweater length and petal embellishment placement can easily be customised to your preferred style.





TECHNIQUES

BOBBLE STITCHES

The Crochet Hook Method is used in the pattern to create bobble stitches. If you prefer to use the knit method for making bobbles, follow the second set of bobble stitch instructions.

CROCHET HOOK METHOD

- Knit to the bobble stitch.
- Insert the crochet hook into the bobble stitch situated on the LH needle and pull the working yarn through.
- [Yarn over, insert the crochet hook into the bobble stitch, pull the working yarn through] 3 times. (There are now 7 loops on the crochet hook.)
- Yarn over, pull the working yarn through all 7 loops.
- Chain 2 stitches.
- Insert the crochet hook into the bobble stitch and pull the working yarn through. There are 2 loops on the crochet hook. Yarn over, pull the working yarn through the 2 loops.
- Slip the original stitch off the LH needle. Slip the stitch from the crochet hook to the RH needle.

KNIT METHOD

- Knit to the bobble stitch.
- In the same stitch: knit 1, knit 1 through the back loop, knit 1, turn. (2 stitches increased)
- Purl 3, turn.
- Knit 3, turn.
- Purl 3, turn.
- Slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slip stitch over. (2 stitches decreased)

GERMAN SHORT ROWS

MAKE DOUBLE STITCH (mds)

Knit Row and Purl Row worked alike:

- Work the number of stitches as specified in the pattern.
- Turn the work, slip 1 st purlwise with yarn in front.
- Tug the yarn up and over the needle. This creates a double stitch (ds). Work the next row as instructed in the pattern.
- (To complete the short row, knit or purl the double stitches together as you encounter them.)

THREE-NEEDLE BIND OFF

- With the 2 pieces of knitting to be joined on the needles, place them with their RS facing and needles parallel and pointing to the right.
- Insert the spare needle knitwise into the 1st st on each needle and knit 2 together using the long tail left for seaming.
- *Knit the next 2 sts together (1 st from each shoulder.)
- Pass the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked.
- Rep from * until 1 st rem. Pull tail through st to secure.

STITCH PATTERN

1X1 RIB

(Multiple of 2 sts)

EVERY RND: *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

DIRECTIONS

BODY

CO 226 (250, 274, 302, 326) (350, 374, 402, 426) sts in MC using the alternating cable cast on for 1x1 Rib method and smaller circular needle. Start with a knit stitch (the slip-knot loop/first loop on your needle will count as a purl stitch).

SETUP RIB ROW: *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Pm at beg of rnd (BOR) and join work in the rnd, being careful not to twist.

Please note the BOR marker will fall to the wearers' right side, meaning you will be working the back side of the garment first, followed by the front side.

RIB & BODY SETUP

Work 9 rnds in 1x1 Rib (see 'Stitch Pattern').

Do not worry if there is a gap between the Setup Rib Row and the remaining Rib Rnds: this will be closed during the finishing stage.

Change to larger circular needle.

Work 8 rnds: Knit all sts. On the final rnd, place markers for the flower motifs and the side seam as follows:

K113 (125, 137, 151, 163) (175, 187, 201, 213) for back, place side m, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [pm, k9 for flower, pm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, pm, k9 for flower, pm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

You can choose to keep the markers for the flower motifs in place throughout the whole garment, or you can choose to remove them after the pattern is clearly established.

FLOWER PATTERN

Work 13 rnds, working RND 1-13 between established flower markers (following the written instructions below or charted instructions and knitting all other sts).

RNDS 1 & 13: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k3, bobble, p1, bobble, k3, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, k3, bobble, p1, bobble, k3, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

RNDS 2 & 12: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k2, p5, k2, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, k2, p5, k2, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

RNDS 3 & 11: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k1, bobble, p5, bobble, k1, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, k1, bobble, p5, bobble, k1, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

RNDS 4, 6, 8 & 10: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k1, p7, k1, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, k1, p7, k1, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

RNDS 5 & 9: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, bobble, p1, (p2tog, yo) x 2, p2, bobble, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, bobble, p1, (p2tog, yo) x 2, p2, bobble, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

RND 7: K to side m, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, bobble, (p2tog, yo) x 3, p1, bobble, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] x 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6), sm, bobble, (p2tog, yo) x 3, p1, bobble, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12) to BOR.

Work 31 (23, 23, 23, 23) (25, 25, 27, 31) rnds: Knit around.

44 (36, 36, 36, 36) (38, 38, 40, 44) rnds since flowers first began.

Repeat these 44 (36, 36, 36, 36) (38, 38, 40, 44) rnds (flower and St) 1 (2, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) more times.

Work RNDs 1-13 one more time.

Work 11 (3, 3, 3, 3) (5, 5, 7, 11) rnds: Knit around.

Garment should measure approx 36 (39, 39, 39, 39) (41.5, 41.5, 43.5, 47.5)cm / 14.25 (15.25, 15.25, 15.25, 15.25) (16.25, 16.25, 17.25, 18.75)” from cast on edge.

UPPER BACK

DIVIDE FOR ARMHOLES

Divide front and back as follows:

Remove BOR. Knit across back 113 (125, 137, 151, 163) (175, 187, 201, 213) sts to side m, remove m, place remaining 113 (125, 137, 151, 163) (175, 187, 201, 213) unworked sts on holder for front.

Turn work, purl across row. Continue back and forth in rows.

ROW 1 & ALL WS ROWS: P to end.

ROW 2 & ALL RS ROWS: K to end.

Rep Rows 1 & 2, 23 (23, 27, 29, 31) (33, 35, 37, 39) times, for a total of 48 (48, 56, 60, 64) (68, 72, 76, 80) rows since dividing back and front.

Armhole depth should measure approx 12.5 (12.5, 14.5, 16, 17) (18, 19, 20, 21)cm / 5 (5, 5.75, 6.25, 6.75) (7, 7.5, 7.75, 8.25)” at this point.

Please note that if you wish to make the armholes deeper, continue to Rep Rows 1&2 until desired additional depth before the back neck and shoulder shaping occurs. Make sure you mirror this on the front piece, by matching the additional number of rows knitted between the front/back divide to the front neck and shoulder shaping, after the final flower row. This may also affect the circumference of the upper sleeve.

SHAPE BACK NECK & SHOULDERS

SETUP ROW (RS): k33 (39, 45, 51, 57) (63, 69, 75, 81), pm, k47 (47, 47, 49, 49) (49, 49, 51, 51), pm, k33 (39, 45, 51, 57) (63, 69, 75, 81).

The sts between the markers denote those to be bound-off for the centre back neckline in Row 8. Slip markers on Rows 1-7.

ROW 1 (WS): P to end.

ROW 2 (RS): K to last 2 sts, turn and mds.

ROW 3: P to last 2 sts, turn and mds.

ROW 4: K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

ROW 5: P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

ROW 6: K to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

ROW 7: P to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

ROW 8:

- Work across right shoulder to 1 st before the 1st m, then k into the front and back of this st to create an extra st.
- Sl extra st purlwise to LH needle, sl right shoulder sts purlwise to a holder, return extra st back to RH needle.
- Remove m and k the 1st st of the centre back neckline. Pull the extra st over the just-knitted st then continue to BO until you reach the next m.

- Remove m, BO 1 more st then k to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

LEFT BACK NECK & SHOULDER

ROW 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 (WS): P to last st. Sl the last st purlwise, turn.

ROW 9, Size 90cm / 36”: P to last st, turn.

ROW 2 (RS): Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) more sts.
K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[30 (36, 41, 47, 53) (59, 65, 70, 76) sts rem]

ROW 4: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (1, 2, 2, 3) (3, 3, 3, 3) more sts.
K to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[28 (34, 38, 44, 49) (55, 61, 66, 72) sts rem]

ROW 6: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (0, 1, 1, 1) (2, 2, 2, 2) more sts.
K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[27 (33, 36, 42, 47) (52, 58, 63, 69) sts rem]

ROW 8: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 2, 2) more sts.
K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[26 (32, 34, 40, 45) (50, 56, 60, 66) sts rem]

ROW 10: All sizes except 90cm / 36: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (0, 1, 1, 1) more sts.

All sizes: K to end, knitting together ds.
[25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts rem]

ROW 11: P to end.

Place rem 25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts on holder.

Break yarn leaving a tail 3-4 times the width of the shoulder sts for seaming.

RIGHT BACK NECK & SHOULDER

ROW 1 (WS): Place 33 (39, 45, 51, 57) (63, 69, 75, 81) sts back on needle with WS facing. Join yarn and p to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

ROW 2, 4, 6, 8 & 10 (RS): K to last st. Sl the st purlwise, turn.

ROW 10, Size 90cm / 36”: K to last st, turn.

ROW 3: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[30 (36, 41, 47, 53) (59, 65, 70, 76) sts rem]

ROW 5: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (1, 2, 2, 3) (3, 3, 3, 3) more sts.
P to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[28 (34, 38, 44, 49) (55, 61, 66, 72) sts rem]

ROW 7: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (0, 1, 1, 1) (2, 2, 2, 2) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[27 (33, 36, 42, 47) (52, 58, 63, 69) sts rem]

ROW 9: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 2, 2) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[26 (32, 34, 40, 45) (50, 56, 60, 66) sts rem]

ROW 11: All sizes except 90cm / 36: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (0, 1, 1, 1) more sts.

All sizes: P to end, purling together ds.
[25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts]

Place rem 25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts on holder.

Break yarn leaving a tail 3-4 times the width of the shoulder sts for seaming.

UPPER FRONT

Rejoin yarn with RS facing. Slip all markers.

ROW 1 and all RS rows: K to end.

ROW 2 and all WS rows: P to end.

Work ROWS 1 & 2, 10 times, for a total of 20 rows since dividing Front and Back.

Work 13 rows, following Flower written instructions below or charted instructions between established markers. (If working from Flower Chart, read odd-numbered (RS) rows from right to left, and even-numbered (WS) rows from left to right).

ROWS 1 & 13 (RS): K22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k3, bobble, p1, bobble, k3, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, k3, bobble, p1, bobble, k3, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROWS 2 & 12 (WS): P22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, p2, k5, p2, sm, p21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, p2, k5, p2, sm, p22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROWS 3 & 11: K22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, k1, bobble, p5, bobble, k1, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, k1, bobble, p5, bobble, k1, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROWS 4, 6, 8 & 10: P22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, p1, k7, p1, sm, p21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, p1, k7, p1, sm, p22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROWS 5 & 9: K22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, bobble, p1, (p2tog, yo) twice, p2, bobble, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, bobble, p1, (p2tog, yo) twice, p2, bobble, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROW 7: K22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12), [sm, bobble, p2tog, yo, p2tog, yo, p2tog, yo, p1, bobble, sm, k21 (16, 18, 21, 23) (16, 17, 19, 21)] 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) (6, 6, 6, 6) times, sm, bobble, p2tog, yo, p2tog, yo, p2tog, yo, p1, bobble, sm, k22 (8, 10, 11, 13) (8, 11, 12, 12).

ROW 14 & ALL WS ROWS IN REPEATS BELOW: P to end.

ROW 15 & ALL RS ROWS IN REPEATS BELOW: K to end.

Size 170cm / 68" ONLY:

Work ROWS 14 & 15, 15 times, then work ROW 14 one final time.

(31 rows since Flower ROW 13)

Repeat Flower ROWS 1-13.

All sizes: Remove markers as you work ROWS 14 & 15, 7 (7, 11, 13, 15) (17, 19, 21, 1) times after Flower, for a total of 14 (14, 22, 26, 30) (34, 38, 42, 2) rows.

Note: If you added length to the armholes when working the Upper Back, match extra rows worked here.

NEXT ROW (WS): P41 (47, 51, 58, 64) (69, 75, 82, 88), pm, p31 (31, 35, 35, 35) (37, 37, 37, 37), pm, p41 (47, 51, 58, 64) (69, 75, 82, 88).

The sts between the markers denote those to be bound-off for the centre front neckline.

SHAPE NECK & SHOULDERS

SET UP ROW (RS):

- Work across left shoulder to 1 st before the 1st m, then k into the front and back of this st to create 1 extra st.
- Sl extra st purlwise to LH needle, sl right shoulder sts purlwise to a holder, return extra st back to RH needle.
- Remove markers and k the 1st st of the centre front neckline.
- Pull the extra st over the just knitted st then continue to BO until you reach the next m. Remove m, BO 1 more st then k across right shoulder to end.

41 (47, 51, 58, 64) (69, 75, 82, 88) sts rem for each shoulder.

RIGHT FRONT NECKLINE & SHOULDER

ROWS 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 & 17 (WS): P to last st.
Sl the last st purlwise, turn.

ROW 17, Size 90cm / 36": P to last st, turn.

ROW 2 (RS): Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) (2, 3, 3, 3) more sts.

K to last 2 sts, turn and mds.

[38 (44, 48, 55, 61) (66, 71, 78, 84) sts rem]

ROW 4: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 3, 3) more sts.

K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[35 (41, 45, 52, 58) (63, 68, 74, 80) sts rem]

ROW 6: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) more sts.

K to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[33 (39, 42, 49, 55) (60, 65, 71, 77) sts rem]

ROW 8: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 1 (1, 1, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) more sts.

K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[31 (37, 40, 46, 52) (57, 62, 68, 74) sts rem]

ROW 10: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) (1, 1, 2, 2) more sts.

K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[29 (35, 38, 44, 49) (55, 60, 65, 71) sts rem]

ROW 12: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 1 (0, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 1, 1) more sts.

K to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[28 (34, 36, 42, 47) (53, 58, 63, 69) sts rem]

ROW 14: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (1, 1, 1, 1) more sts.

K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[27 (33, 35, 41, 46) (51, 56, 61, 67) sts rem]

ROW 16: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (0, 0, 1, 1) more sts.

K to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[26 (32, 34, 40, 45) (50, 55, 59, 65) sts rem]

ROW 18: All sizes except 90cm / 36: Sl the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

All sizes: K to end, knitting together ds.

[25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts rem]

Place rem 25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts back on holder. Break yarn.

LEFT FRONT NECKLINE & SHOULDER

Place 41 (47, 51, 58, 64) (69, 75, 82, 88) Left Front sts back on needle.

Rejoin yarn with WS facing.

ROW 1 (WS): P to end.

ROWS 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 & 18 (RS): K to last st. Sl the last st purlwise, turn.

ROW 18, Size 90cm / 36": K to last st, turn.

ROW 3: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) (2, 3, 3, 3) more sts.

P to last 2 sts, turn and mds.

[38 (44, 48, 55, 61) (66, 71, 78, 84) sts rem]

ROW 5: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 2 (2, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 3, 3) more sts.

P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[35 (41, 45, 52, 58) (63, 68, 74, 80) sts rem]

ROW 7: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.

BO 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) more st.

P to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.

[33 (39, 42, 49, 55) (60, 65, 71, 77) sts rem]

ROW 9: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (1, 1, 2, 2) (2, 2, 2, 2) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[31 (37, 40, 46, 52) (57, 62, 68, 74) sts rem]

ROW 11: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) (1, 1, 2, 2) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[29 (35, 38, 44, 49) (55, 60, 65, 71) sts rem]

ROW 13: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 1 (0, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 1, 1) more sts.
P to 3 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[28 (34, 36, 42, 47) (53, 58, 63, 69) sts rem]

ROW 15: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (1, 1, 1, 1) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[27 (33, 35, 41, 46) (51, 56, 61, 67) sts rem]

ROW 17: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1. BO 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (0, 0, 1, 1) more sts.
P to 2 sts before previous ds, turn and mds.
[26 (32, 34, 40, 45) (50, 55, 59, 65) sts rem]

ROW 19: All sizes except 90cm / 36: Slip the 1st 2 sts purlwise. Pull the 1st st on the RH needle over the st just worked to BO 1.
All sizes: P to end, purling together ds.
[25 (31, 33, 39, 44) (49, 54, 58, 64) sts rem]

Keep sts on the needle and break yarn.

SEAMING & COLLAR

SHOULDER SEAMING

Match the shoulders (Left Front to Left Back, Right Front to Right Back), assuring that they are not twisted, before binding off each pair.

Join Left shoulders using a 3-Needle bind off (see 'Techniques') with spare needle.

Rep to seam Right Shoulder.

COLLAR

Using smaller circular needle and starting at left shoulder, pick up and k19 (19, 21, 21, 23) (23, 25, 25, 25) sts down left front neckline, k31 (31, 35, 35, 35) (37, 37, 37, 37) sts across the front neck bind-off (1 in every bound-off st), k19 (19, 21, 21, 23) (23, 25, 25, 25) sts up right front neckline, k11 (11, 15, 15, 15) (17, 19, 19, 19) sts down back right neck, k47 (47, 47, 49, 49) (49, 49, 51, 51) sts across the back neck bind-off, and k11 (11, 15, 15, 15) (17, 19, 19, 19) sts up left back neck.

Total 138 (138, 154, 156, 160) (166, 174, 176, 176) sts.

Exact stitch count is not important but count needs to be an even number and matched on left and right sides so that it is symmetrical.

RNDS 1-4, 1x1 Rib: *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

BO in pattern.

SLEEVES

Using larger 40cm / 16" circular needle or double pointed needles and starting at underarm, pick up and knit 84 (88, 94, 102, 112) (120, 126, 134, 140) sts. Pm for BOR.

FOR SHORT SLEEVES:

Knit 3 (2, 2, 2, 1) (1, 1, 1, 1) rnds.

DECREASE RND: K2tog, k to last 2 sts, ssk.

[2 sts dec, 82 (86, 92, 100, 110) (118, 124, 132, 138) sts rem]

Knit 3 (3, 2, 2, 2) (2, 2, 1, 1) rnds.

Rep Decrease Rnd every 4 (4, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 2, 2) rnds, 6 (7, 9, 9, 8) (5, 3, 10, 10) more times then rep Decrease Rnd every 0 (0, 0, 0, 2) (2, 2, 1, 1) rnd(s), 0 (0, 0, 0, 4) (8, 11, 7, 8) more times.

[70 (72, 74, 82, 86) (92, 96, 98, 102) sts rem]

Rep Decrease Rnd once more. [68 (70, 72, 80, 84) (90, 94, 96, 100) sts rem]

Work 3 (1, 3, 2, 0) (0, 0, 3, 3) rnds without decreases, or until sleeve measures 9.5cm / 3.75" from pickup rnd (or desired length; cuff will add 1.5cm / 0.5").

SHORT SLEEVE CUFF

Switch to smaller smaller 40cm / 16" circular needle or double pointed needles.

RND 1-5, 1x1 RIB: *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

BO in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

FOR LONG SLEEVES

Knit 8 rnds.

DECREASE RND: K2tog, k to last 2 sts, ssk.

(2 sts dec, 82 (86, 92, 100, 110) (118, 124, 132, 136) sts rem)

Knit 7 (7, 7, 7, 6) (6, 5, 4, 4) rnds.

Repeat Decrease Round every 8 (8, 8, 8, 7) (7, 6, 5, 5) rnds 20 (22, 23, 25, 28) (31, 35, 37, 39) more times. [40 (44, 46, 50, 56) (62, 70, 74, 78) sts dec'd, 42 (42, 46, 50, 54) (56, 54, 58, 60) sts rem]

Work 8 rnds without decreases, or until sleeve measures 42.5 (46.5, 48.5, 53, 52) (57.5, 55.5, 49, 51.5) cm / 16.75 (18.25, 19, 20.75, 20.5) (22.75, 21.75, 19.25, 20.25)" (or desired length; cuff will add 5cm / 2").

LONG SLEEVE CUFF

Switch to smaller smaller 40cm / 16" circular needle or double pointed needles.

RNDS 1-18, 1x1 RIB: *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

BO in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

FINISHING

Thread the cast on tail through a tapestry needle and use it to cover the gap between the Setup Rib Row and the remaining Rib Rnds.

Weave in and secure all ends.

Wash and gently block to schematic measurements.

Add petal embellishments.

PETAL EMBELLISHMENTS

Make a slip knot 15cm / 6" from the end of CC1/CC2 and place it onto the crochet hook.

STEP 1: Wrap main end of yarn around the cardboard strip from front to back and chain 1. (This creates the 1st loop).

STEP 2: Chain 1.

Rep Steps 1&2, 18 times then complete Step 1 once more. (19 loops on the cardboard strip)

Cut the yarn, leaving a 15cm / 6" tail. Remove from the cardboard strip and pull the tail through the last chain to secure.

When laid flat, the petal embellishment should measure approximately 16cm / 6.25" long.

Thread the beginning tail onto a tapestry needle and pull it through the last chain so that the petal embellishment connects into a circle. Continue threading the tail through a few chains to secure. Repeat with the ending tail.


To check the size, place the petal embellishment over a knitted flower. You can ease the embellishment a little if needed, but if the size seems too far off you may need to create fewer or more loops.

Create 3 (6, 6, 6, 6) (9, 9, 9, 9) petal embellishments in CC1 and (3, 6, 6, 6, 6) (9, 9, 9, 11) CC2.

Pin the petal embellishments in place so that they are held secure as you sew them down to the knitted surface.

Once in place, thread laceweight yarn through the fine sewing needle and sew each petal embellishment in place. Use a small running stitch and follow the line of the 'crochet chain' within the petal embellishment.

Weave in any additional ends.
