Frog and Toad

Abbreviations

k: Knit.

K1-f/b: Knit into the front and then the back of the same stitch.

k2tog: Knit 2 stitches together.

M1L: With the left needle, pick up the bar between the last stitch you knit and the one you are about to knit, bringing the needle from front to back. Then knit into the back of this stitch.

M1R: With the left needle, pick up the bar between the last stitch you knit and the one you are about to knit, bringing the needle from back to front. Then knit into the front of this stitch.

p: Purl.

p2tog: Purl 2 stitches together.

pm: Place marker.

sm: Slip marker.

ssk: Slip 2 stitches one at a time knitwise to right needle, insert left needle into the 2 stitches and knit them together.

wrp-t (wrap and turn): With the yarn in back, slip the next stitch purlwise from the left needle to the right needle. Bring the yarn to the front. Return the slipped stitch to the left needle. Turn the work so the other side is facing you. Bring yarn into position for knitting or purling the next stitch.

MATERIALS

Yarn A: 1 skein of Luminous Brooklyn's Dazzling DK (light worsted/ 8 ply), 100% superwash merino in Frog. Each skein is approximately 260 yards (238 meters). Frog requires approximately 65 yards (60 meters).

Yarn B: 1 skein of Luminous Brooklyn's Dazzling DK (light worsted/ 8 ply), 100% superwash merino in Toad. Each skein is approximately 260 yards (238 meters). Toad requires approximately 50 yards (45 meters).

Yarns C, D, E, and F: 1 ball of Jamieson's Shetland Spindrift, 100% pure Shetland Wool in Rye (C), Moss (D), Wren (E), and Burnt Umber (F). Each ball is approximately 114 yards (104 meters). The jacket requires approximately 38 yards of Color F. The bathing suit requires approximately 28 yards of Color C and 20 yards of Color D. The pants require approximately 45 yards of Color E.

A set of US 1 double pointed needles

Stitch markers (including removable stitch markers)

Waste yarn

1 bag of Loops and Threads pellets or 1 bag of PlumEasy Patterns Lavender Scented Ground Walnut Shells

Small amount of black embroidery floss

Sewing needle and white sewing thread

1 size B-1 (2.25 mm) crochet hook (optional)

NOTES

I used a much smaller needle size than is typically recommended for these yarns because the denser fabric allowed me to use pellets as fill and to produce small, weighty creatures. Pellets tend to fall out easily when the knitted fabric is not very dense. Of course you have a great deal of leeway with the yarns and needle sizes you choose, and may experiment with larger sizes (simply by using bigger needles) and fill them as you'd like.

You will start both Frog and Toad from the top of the head and work downward. In the instructions, numbers for Frog are given first, with numbers for Toad in parentheses. Where only one number is given, the instructions apply to both Frog and Toad.

GAUGE

For Frog and Toad: 32 stitches and 40 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch

For Clothing: 36 stitches and 56 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch

SIZES

Finished Dimensions:

Frog: Approximately 9 inches long.

Toad: Approximately 7 inches long.

PATTERN

Frog (Toad)

You may begin with a provisional cast-on and seamlessly graft the top-of-head stitches together with Kitchener stitch at the end, or you may use a regular cast-on and sew the two sides together afterwards. In the images shown, I used a provisional cast-on using a small length of crocheted chain.

Top of Head

With Yarn A (B), using a provisional cast-on, cast on 22 stitches and distribute them over 3 double pointed needles. Note: Again, feel free to use a regular cast-on if you'd like.

Place a marker and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist the stitches.

Round 1: Knit.

Round 2: K5, pm, k11, pm, k6.

Round 3: [Knit to marker, M1L, sm, k1, M1R] twice, knit to end of round. [4 stitches increased]

Round 4: Knit.

Rounds 5-12: Repeat Rounds 3 and 4 four more times. [42 stitches]

Shape Chin

Short Row 1 (RS): K10, place previous 21 stitches on waste yarn, removing all markers, k12, wrp-t.

Note: The 21 stitches placed on waste yarn includes the 10 stitches just worked plus 11 more, for a total of 21 previous stitches. Your working yarn stays in place as you do this.

Short Row 2 (WS): P3, wrp-t.

Short Row 3: K3, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, k1, wrp-t.

Short Row 4: P5, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, p1, wrp-t.

Short Row 5: K7, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, k1, wrp-t.

Short Row 6: P9, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, p1, wrp-t.

Short Row 7: K11, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, k1, wrp-t.

Short Row 8: P13, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, p1, wrp-t.

Short Row 9: K15, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, k1, wrp-t.

Short Row 10: P17, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, p1, wrp-t.

Short Row 11: K19, work wrapped stitch with its wrap, place 21 held Back stitches onto 2 needles and knit across them; working then across 21 Front stitches, work first wrapped stitch with its wrap, and knit to end of Front stitches. Place marker for new end of round and rejoin for working in the round.

Neck

Knit 4 rounds; pm after 21 stitches on final round.

For Frog only (for Toad, proceed to Divide for Armholes):

Shoulders

Round 1: *[K7, M1] 3 times; repeat from * once more. [48 stitches]

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: *K1, M1R, knit to marker, M1L, sm; repeat from * once more. [4 stitches increased]

Round 4: Knit.

Rounds 5-8: Repeat Rounds 3 and 4 twice more. [60 stitches; 30 stitches each for Back and Front]



Frog and Toad:

Divide for Armholes

Next Row (RS): Knit to marker, remove marker, turn.

Working back and forth on 30 (21) Back stitches only, work 3 more rows in stockinette stitch. Cut yarn.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to Front stitches. Work 4 rows in stockinette stitch.



Abdomen

Next Row (RS): Knit across Front stitches, then knit across Back stitches, distributing stitches on multiple needles as needed. Place marker for end of round and join for working in the round. [60 (42) stitches; 30 (21) stitches each for Front and Back]

Frog only:

Round 1: *K4, k2tog, [k8, k2tog] twice, k4; repeat from * once. [54 stitches]

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: *K4, k2tog, [k7, k2tog] twice, k3; repeat from * once. [48 stitches]

Round 4: Knit.

Round 5: *K3, k2tog, [k6, k2tog] twice, k3; repeat from * once. [42 stitches; 21 stitches each for Front and Back]

Frog and Toad:

Knit 6 rounds

Shape Hips

For Frog only:

Round 1: K1, k2tog, k16, ssk, k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, ssk. [38 stitches]

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: K1, k2tog, k14, ssk, k1, k2tog, knit to last 2 stitches, ssk. [34 stitches]

For Frog and Toad:

Round 1: K8 (10), pm, k17 (21), pm, k9 (11).

Round 2: [Knit to marker, M1L, sm, k1, M1R] twice, knit to end of round. [4 stitches increased]

Round 3: Knit.

Round 4: Repeat Rounds 2 and 3 once more. [42 (50) stitches]

Divide for Legs

Next Round: Knit to marker, remove marker, place previous 21 (25) stitches on waste yarn for Second Leg (removing end-of-round marker).

Knit 1 round of First Leg, rearranging stitches onto 3 needles as follows: Needle A: 7 (8) stitches; Needle B: 7 (9) stitches; Needle C: 7 (8) stitches; pm for new end of round.

First Leg

For Toad only:

Next Round: Needle A: K8; Needle B: K3, k2tog, k4; Needle C: k8. [24 stitches; 8 stitches on each needle]

For Frog and Toad:

Round 1: Needle A: Ssk, knit to end; Needle B: K7 (8); Needle C: Knit to last 2 stitches, k2tog. [2 stitches decreased]

Round 2: Knit.

Rounds 3-10: Repeat Rounds 1 and 2 four more times. [11 (14) stitches; 2 (3) stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 (8) stitches on Needle B.

For Toad only:

Next Round: Needle A: Ssk, k1; Needle B: K3, k2tog, k3; Needle C: K1, k2tog. [11 stitches; 2 stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Knit 1 round.

For Frog and Toad:

Shape Kneecap

Short Row 1 (RS): Needle A: K2; Needle B: K4, wrp-t.

Short Row 2 (WS): Needle B: P1, wrp-t.

Short Row 3: Needle B: K1, work wrap together with wrapped stitch, wrp-t.

Short Row 4: Needle B: P2, work wrap together with wrapped stitch, wrp-t.

Short Row 5: Needle B: K3, work wrap together with wrapped stitch, wrp-t.

Short Row 6: Needle B: P4, work wrap together with wrapped stitch, wrp-t.

Short Row 7: Needle B: Knit to last stitch, work wrap together with wrapped stitch; Needle C: K2.

Rejoin for working in the round.



Round 8: Needle A: K2; Needle B: Work wrap together with wrapped stitch, k6; Needle C: M1L, k2. [12 stitches; 2 stitches on Needle A, 7 stitches on Needle B, and 3 stitches on Needle C]

Round 9: Needle A: Knit 2, M1R; Needle B: K7; Needle C: K3. [13 stitches; 3 stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Round 10: Needle A: K3; Needle B: K7; Needle C: M1L, k3. [14 stitches; 3 stitches on Needle A, 7 stitches on Needle B, and 4 stitches on Needle C]

Round 11: Needle A: K3, M1R; Needle B: K7; Needle C: K4. [15 stitches; 4 stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]



For Toad only:

Round 12: Needle A: K4; Needle B: K7; Needle C: M1L, k4. [16 stitches; 4 stitches on Needle A, 7 stitches on Needle B, and 5 stitches on Needle C]

Round 13: Needle A: k4, M1R; Needle B: K7; Needle C: k5. [17 stitches; 5 stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Calf

For Frog and Toad:

K6 (2) rounds.

Round 1: Needle A: Ssk, k2 (3); Needle B: K7; Needle C: K2 (3), k2tog. [13 (15) stitches; 3 (4) stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: Needle A: Ssk, k1 (2); Needle B: K7, Needle C: K1 (2), k2tog. [11 (13) stitches; 2 (3) stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Round 4: Knit.

For Toad only:

Next Round: Needle A: Ssk, k1; Needle B: K7; Needle C: k1, k2tog. [11 stitches; 2 stitches each on Needles A and C, and 7 stitches on Needle B]

Knit 1 round.

For Frog and Toad:

Next Round: Needle A: Ssk; Needle B: K7; Needle C: k2tog. Place all stitches on Needle B, removing marker. [9 stitches]

Change to working back and forth in rows.

Purl 1 WS row.

Ankle

Row 1 (RS): [K2tog] 4 times, k1. [5 stitches]

Row 2: P1, p2tog, p2. [4 stitches]

Row 3: K1, k2tog, k1. [3 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.



Foot

Row 1 (RS): [K1-f/b] 3 times. [6 stitches]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, M1L, k5. [7 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: [P1, k1] 3 times, p1.

Rows 9-18: Repeat Rows 7 and 8 five more times.

Bind off all stitches.



Second Leg

With the Back of the body facing you and starting at crotch, remove waste yarn and arrange stitches onto 3 needles as follows: Needle A: 7 (8) stitches; Needle B: 7 (9) stitches; Needle C: 7 (8) stitches; pm for new end of round.

Rejoin yarn and work as for First Leg.

Arms

Right Arm

With RS facing, beginning at bottom of armhole, and using A (B), pick up and knit 12 stitches evenly around armhole opening. Place a marker and join for working in the round.

Knit 18 rounds.

Next Round: K2tog, k3, k2tog, k3, k2tog. [9 stitches] Place all stitches on one needle, removing marker.

Change to working back and forth in rows.

Purl 1 WS row.

Wrist

Row 1 (RS): [K2tog] 4 times, k1. [5 stitches]

Row 2: P1, p2tog, p2. [4 stitches]

Row 3: K1, k2tog, k1. [3 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.

Start Hand

Row 1 (RS): [K1-f/b] 3 times. [6 stitches]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, M1L, k5. [7 stitches]

Row 4: [P1, k1] 3 times, p1.

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: Repeat Row 4.

Row 7: K7, pick up and knit 1 stitch from side of hand. [8 stitches]

Row 8: Purl.



Row 7, Right Hand

Make Fingers

You will create fingers using a picot bind-off.

Bind-Off Row (RS): *Cast on 2 stitches using a knitted cast-on, bind off 4 stitches (the 2 newly made stitches plus 2 more), slip stitch from right needle back to left needle; repeat from * until all stitches have been bound off. Note: For the last repeat you will bind off 3 stitches, not 4. [4 fingers made]

Break yarn and weave in tail to complete the last finger.



Left Arm

Work as for Right Arm through end of Wrist section.

Start Hand

Row 1 (RS): [K1-f/b] 3 times. [6 stitches]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, M1L, k5. [7 stitches]

Row 4: [P1, k1] 3 times, p1.

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: Repeat Row 4.

Row 7: Pick up and knit 1 stitch alongside of hand, knit to end. [8 stitches]

Row 8: Purl.



Row 7, Left Hand

Make Fingers

Bind off all stitches as for Right Hand.

Eyes (make 2)

With 2 strands of Yarn C held together (or a small amount of cream-colored yarn the same weight as Yarn A), loosely cast on 1 stitch.

Next Row (RS): (K1-f/b) 3 times into same stitch. [6 stitches].


Bind off all stitches purlwise, leaving a long tail.

With RS facing you, thread tail into bottom of first stitch and pull together to create a circle. Secure join with an additional stitch or two. Weave ends in on wrong side.

With black embroidery floss and sewing needle, stitch pupils (see photos). Note: Every time I make eyes for Frog or Toad, they look slightly different, and I have found that this adds character and varying expressions. No two creatures will be exactly alike.



Eye Sockets (make 2)



With removable stitch markers, mark 2 stitches approximately ½ inch down from top of head and ½ inch over from both Right and Left sides of head, making sure that the two marked stitches fall on the same row to keep the eyes even.

Cut center of marked stitch, shown here lifted up by the tip of a knitting needle.

Gently unravel 2 stitches on either side and place 4 stitches onto one (top) needle and 4 stitches onto another (bottom) needle.



Bottom Lid

Join Yarn A (B) to bottom 4 stitches and bind off all stitches.

Top Lid

With RS facing, join Yarn A (B) to top 4 stitches.


Row 1 (RS): K1, M1L, k2, M1R, k1. [6 stitches]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, M1L, k4, M1R, k1. [8 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.

Bind off all stitches. Tuck all loose ends into socket. With tapestry needle and tails, sew sides in place, sewing lower corners to corresponding outer edges of bottom lid.



Attach eyes by placing them in the sockets (making sure the pupils are in the correct orientation) and using needle and thread to sew them in place. Note: It is helpful (and looks perhaps neatest) to sew the pupils in place along the inner bind off edges of the sockets, pulling the stitches of your thread rather tightly to hide the stitches well.



FINISHING

Close any gaps at wrists, ankles, side of kneecaps, and crotch. Weave in ends. Block as desired.

Fill with pellets to desired firmness (pushing down with fingers or the end of a pencil/chopstick to get fill into legs, body, arms and head. You will have a chance when filling to locate any remaining gaps and to sew those gaps shut with a tapestry needle and yarn.

Unzip provisional cast on at top of head, evenly place 11 front stitches on one needle and 11 back stitches on another and graft the stitches together. If you did not use a provisional cast-on at the outset, sew the top of the head together.

Mouth

With black embroidery floss, create mouth using backstitch. Starting at side of head, follow the curve created by the short row shaping.



Bathing Suit (for Toad)

With Yarn D, using a provisional cast-on, cast on 52 stitches and distribute them over 3 double pointed needles. Note: You may use a regular cast-on if you choose.

Place a marker and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist the stitches.

Knit 8 rounds. Cut yarn.

Join Yarn C.

Round 1: *K1, M1R, k25, M1L; repeat from * once. [56 stitches]

Round 2: Lift stitch below first stitch and place it on needle, k2tog (first stitch and lifted stitch together; this avoids the color jog in the stripes), knit to end of round.

Round 3: *K1, M1R, k27, M1L; repeat from * once. [60 stitches]

Round 4: Knit.

Divide Legs

Next Round: K30 and place the previous 30 stitches on waste yarn for Second Leg (removing end-of-round marker), then knit to end. [30 stitches for First Leg]

First Leg

Distribute remaining 30 stitches evenly over 3 needles, pm and join for working in the round; knit 4 more rounds. [8 total rounds in Yarn C to complete stripe]

Note: In the following rounds there is no need to cut the yarn when changing stripe colors, you may simply carry the yarn up on the WS as you go.

Join and work * 8 rounds in Yarn D, then 8 rounds in Yarn C, lifting stitch below first stitch and working k2tog at beginning of second round in new color to avoid color jog; repeat from * once more. [6 stripes total].

Bind off all stitches.

Second Leg

With RS facing and finished leg on right, starting at crotch, remove waste yarn and distribute stitches evenly over 3 needles. Rejoin Yarn C and complete as for First Leg.

Bathing Suit Top

Undo provisional cast-on and evenly distribute stitches over 3 needles. Note: If you began with a regular cast-on, with Yarn C and beginning at cast-on tail, pick up and knit 52 stitches evenly around top edge. Join for working in the round.

With Yarn C, knit 1 round.

Divide for Back and Front

Next Row (RS): K26 and place on waste yarn for Back, knit to end. [26 stitches for Front]

Front

Change to working back and forth in rows.

Purl 1 WS row.

Left Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): K6, bind off the next 14 stitches, knit to end.

Row 2: Working on 6 left shoulder stitches only, p6.

Row 3: K1, k2tog, k3. [5 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1, k2tog, k2. [4 stitches]

Row 6: Purl.

Cut Yarn C and join Yarn D.

Work 8 rows in stockinette stitch, starting with a knit row.

Bind off all stitches.

Right Shoulder

With WS facing, rejoin Yarn C to remaining 6 stitches.

Purl 1 WS row.

Row 1 (RS): K3, ssk, k1. [5 stitches]

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K2, ssk, k1. [4 stitches]

Row 4: Purl.

Cut Yarn C and join Yarn D.

Work 8 rows in stockinette stitch.

Bind off all stitches.

Back

With WS facing, remove waste yarn and place remaining 26 stitches for Back on needle. Rejoin Yarn C.

Work 7 rows in stockinette stitch. Bind off all stitches.

Sew edges of front shoulders to outer top edges of Back.

FINISHING

Neckband

With Yarn C and right side facing, pick up and knit 2 stitches around neck opening, pass the second stitch on right needle over the last stitch to bind off 1 stitch, *pick up and knit 1 stitch, bind off 1 stitch; repeat from * loosely around entire neck opening. Fasten off. Note: If you prefer, you may work 1 round of slip-stitch crochet in Yarn C.

Armhole Edging

With Yarn C, work as for Neckband around armholes.



Weave in ends. Block as desired.

Pants (for Frog)

With Yarn E, cast on 60 stitches and distribute them evenly over 3 double pointed needles. Place marker and join for working in the round, being careful not to twist the stitches.

Round 1: P1, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, pm, [p1, k2] 10 times.

Rounds 2-16: Repeat Round 1.

Round 17: P1, M1R, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, M1L, sm, p1, M1R, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, M1L. [64 stitches]

Round 18: P2, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, p1, sm, p2, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, p1.

Round 19: P2, M1R, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, M1L, p1, sm, p1, M1R, p1, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, M1L, p1. [68 stitches]

Round 20: P3, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, p2, sm, p3, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, p2.

Divide for Legs

First Leg

Place previous 34 stitches on waste yarn for Second Leg. Distribute remaining 34 stitches over 3 needles. Place marker and join for working in the round.

Round 1: P1, p2tog, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2, p2tog. [32 stitches]

Round 2: Work in pattern as established.

Round 3: P2tog, [k2, p1] 10 times. [31 stitches]

Round 4: Work in pattern to last stitch, slip stitch to right needle, remove marker, slip stitch back to left needle, place marker for new end of round.

Round 5: P2tog, [k2, p1] 9 times, k2. [30 stitches]

Work in pattern for 3 inches.

Loosely bind off all stitches.

Second Leg

With RS facing, remove waste yarn and distribute remaining 34 stitches over 3 needles for Second Leg. Rejoin Yarn E and complete as for First Leg.

Weave in ends. Block as desired.



Jacket (for Frog)

Back

With Yarn F, using a provisional cast-on, cast on 24 stitches. Note: If you don't mind having a seam, you may use a regular cast-on.

Work 12 rows in stockinette stitch.

Armhole Shaping

Row 1 (RS): K2, M1L, knit to last 2 stitches, M1R, k2. [2 stitches increased]

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 twice more. [30 stitches]

Break yarn and place stitches on waste yarn.



Fronts

Undo provisional cast-on and place 24 stitches on needle. Note: If you began with a regular cast-on, with Yarn F pick up and knit 24 stitches along cast-on edge.

With RS facing, rejoin Yarn F.

Row 1 (RS): K5, place next 19 stitches on waste yarn for Left Front.

Right Front

Working on Right Front stitches only, work 5 rows in stockinette stitch, starting with a purl row.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (RS): Knit to last stitch, M1L, k1. [1 stitch increased]

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 twice more. [8 stitches]

Shape Neck and Armhole

Row 7: K2, M1L, knit to end. [1 stitch increased]

Row 8: Using knitted cast-on, cast on 5 stitches, purl to end. [14 stitches]

Row 9: Repeat Row 7 once.

Row 10: Purl.

Rows 11 and 12: Repeat Rows 9 and 10 once more. [16 stitches]

Break yarn and place stitches on waste yarn.

Left Front

With RS facing, remove waste yarn and place remaining 19 stitches on needle for Left Front. Rejoin Yarn F.

Next Row (RS): Bind off 14 stitches, knit to end. [5 stitches]

Work 5 rows in stockinette stitch, starting with a purl row.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (RS): K1, M1R, knit to end. [1 stitch increased]

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 twice more. [8 stitches]

Shape Neck and Armhole

Row 7 (RS): Using a knitted cast-on, cast on 5 stitches, knit to last 2 stitches, M1R, k2. [14 stitches]

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: Knit to last 2 stitches, M1R, k2. [15 stitches]

Row 10: Purl

Rows 11-12: Repeat Rows 9 and 10 once more [16 stitches]

Join Fronts and Back



With RS facing, place 5 Back stitches onto your needle (to the left of your Left Front stitches), place next 20 Back stitches onto another needle, then place remaining Back stitches and Right Front stitches onto another needle.

Knit across Left Front, Back, then Right Front stitches. [62 stitches]

Continue in stockinette stitch for 1½ inches. Bind off all stitches.

Sleeves

With RS facing, using Yarn F, pick up and knit 18 stitches evenly around armhole opening. Place marker and join for working in the round.

Work in stockinette stitch for 2 inches. Bind off all stitches.

FINISHING

Jacket Edging

With Yarn F, beginning at right shoulder and with right side facing, pick up and knit 2 stitches, pass the second stitch on right needle over the last stitch to bind off 1 stitch, *pick up and knit 1 stitch, bind off 1 stitch; repeat from * loosely around entire outer edge of Jacket. Fasten off. Note: If you prefer, you may work 1 round of slip-stitch crochet in Yarn F.

Weave in ends. Block as desired.
