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GREY SHEEP BOBBLE JACKET

┆ Simple ┆ Fast ┆ Stylish ┆

Grey sheep bobble jacket knitting pattern

Grey sheep bobble jacket is above hip length knit with long balloon sleeves and is worked top-down. The jacket has bobbles in the top of both sleeves. Sleeves and the body are worked in Fisherman rib stitch. Sleeves are without cuff and body without hem. Because the sweater body is worked straight it can be easily made longer and of course, more yarns should be purchased. Grey sheep bobble jacket is above hip length fashionable cardigan that fits well with long shirts, dresses, and other comfortable casual clothes.

Sizes: XS (S) M (L) XL (2X) 3X (4X) to be worn with approx 15cm/5.9in positive ease. Shown in size L.

Yarns (4 strands held together):

1. Drops, KidSilk (75% mohair, 25% silk; 25g/0.9oz = 210m/230yds).
2. Drops, KidSilk (75% mohair, 25% silk; 25g/0.9oz = 210m/230yds).
3. Drops, KidSilk (75% mohair, 25% silk; 25g/0.9oz = 210m/230yds).
4. Drops, KidSilk (75% mohair, 25% silk; 25g/0.9oz = 210m/230yds).

Yarn weight:

Needles: 6mm (US10, UK4) 40-100cm (16-39in) circular needles.

Gauges:

- 1) 10cm x 10cm (4'' x 4'') = 13 stitches x 19 rows in Garter stitch.
- 2) 10cm x 10cm (4'' x 4'') = 12 stitches x 24 rows in Fisherman rib stitch.

Notions: 8 closed stitch markers, 2 scrap yarns, tapestry needle.

Abbreviations

K knit

P purl

RLI (Right Lifted Increase) Lift right leg of the stitch below the next stitch on the left-hand needle onto the left-hand needle and knit it. (1 stitch increased)

LLI (Left Lifted Increase) Lift the left leg of the stitch 2 rows below the stitch on right-hand needle onto left-hand needle and knit it through the back loop. (1 stitch increased)

MB (make bobble) [Knit into front and back] twice into next st, then into front again, turn, on these 5 sts work 5 rows in stockinette st starting with purl, then with left hand needle lift 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th sts over first st.

Pm place marker

Sm slip marker

Rm remove marker

K1b knit into the row below

P1b purl into the row below

RS right side

WS wrong side

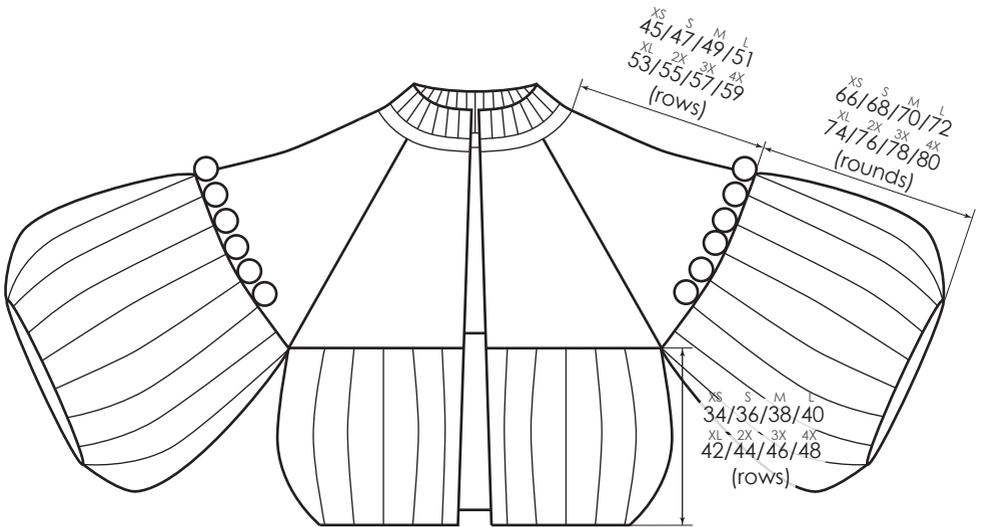
St(s) stitch(es)

Sl slip

K2togR knit next two stitches one at a time so first stitch would be on the top (1 stitch decreased)

Knitting pattern instructions

Neck

Neck is worked in rows using 6mm (US10, UK4) 60-100cm (23-39in) circular needles. This part is worked in rib stitch k2, p2 after that double band is worked in which on the right and wrong sides only knit stitches are visible.

Cast on 54 (62) 70 (78) 86 (94) 102 (110) sts

Row 1 (RS) Sl1, *k2, p2; rep from * to end, p last st.

Row 2 (WS) Sl1, *k2, p2; rep from * to end, p last st.

Rep last two rows 2 more times.

Row 7 (RS) Sl1, *yo, k1; rep from * to end, p last st.

Row 8 (WS) Sl1, *sl1, p1 twist; rep from * to end, p last st.

Row 9 (RS) Sl1, *sl1, p1; rep from * to end, p last st.

Row 10 (WS) Sl1, *sl1, p1; rep from * to end, p last st.

Rep last two rows 2 more times.

Row 15 (RS) Sl1, K2togR to end, p last st.

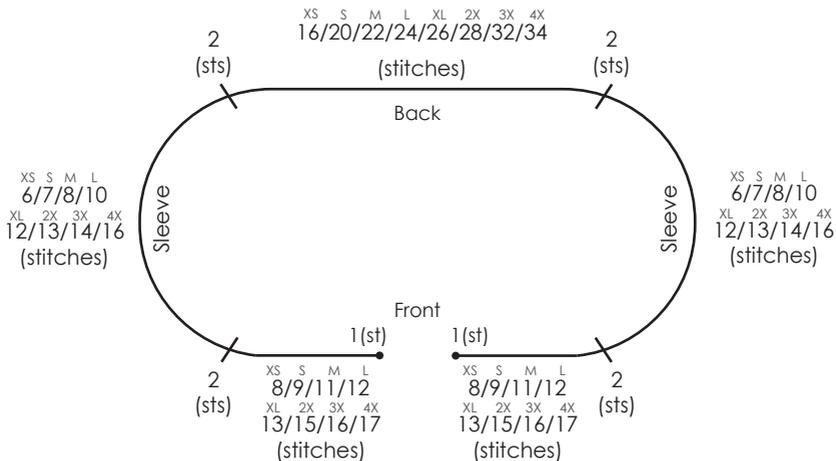

Yoke (from neck to armpit)

Yoke is worked in rows using 6mm (US10, UK4) 60-100cm (23-39in) circular needles in Garter stitch pattern (it means that all right side and wrong side rows must be knitted). This part is worked in Raglan using increases RLI and LLI. Also 8 closed stitch markers are used which separate Raglan stitches. Increases RLI and LLI are worked in every right side row counting from second Yoke row. All Raglan stitches (2 stitches which are between stitch markers) are worked in Stockinette stitch pattern (it means that all Raglan stitches in right side must be knitted and in every wrong side purled). In Yoke part bobbles are worked so follow the pattern.

Row 1 (WS) Sl1, k8 (9) 11 (12) 13 (15) 16 (17), pm, p2, pm, k6 (7) 8 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16), pm, p2, pm, k16 (20) 22 (24) 26 (28) 32 (34), pm, p2, pm, k6 (7) 8 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16), pm, p2, pm, k8 (9) 11 (12) 13 (15) 16 (17), p last st.



Row 2 (RS) S11, k8 (9) 11 (12) 13 (15) 16 (17), RLI, sm, k2, sm, LLI, k6 (7) 8 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16), RLI, sm, k2, sm, LLI, k16 (20) 22 (24) 26 (28) 32 (34), RLI, sm, k2, sm, LLI, k6 (7) 8 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16), RLI, sm, k2, sm, LLI, k8 (9) 11 (12) 13 (15) 16 (17), p last st. Row 3 (WS) S11, k9 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16) 17 (18), sm, p2, sm, k8 (9) 10 (12) 14 (15) 16 (18), sm, p2, sm, k18 (22) 24 (26) 28 (30) 34 (36), sm, p2, sm, k8 (9) 10 (12) 14 (15) 16 (18), sm, p2, sm, k9 (10) 12 (13) 14 (16) 17 (18), p last st. Continue work with last two rows until 45 (47) 49 (51) 53 (55) 57 (59) rows have been worked counting from first Yoke row and make bobbles in 42 (44) 46 (48) 50 (52) 54 (56) rows (right side). How to work row with bobbles written below. Every right side row knit and work with increases RLI and LLI as it was done in Row 2. Every wrong side row knit and all Raglan stitches purl as it was done in Row 3.

Row 42 (44) 46 (48) 50 (52) 54 (56) (RS) Work front, back and raglan parts in established pattern, also RLI, LLI increases are made. Sleeve: k11 (11) 11 (11) 10 (10) 10 (11), *k1, MB, k1; rep from * 8 (9) 10 (11) 13 (14) 15 (16) more times, k10 (10) 10 (11) 10 (10) 10 (10).

Total amount of stitches after working the Yoke: left front – 31 (33) 36 (38) 40 (43) 45 (47) sts, 2 raglan sts, left sleeve – 50 (53) 56 (60) 64 (67) 70 (74) sts, 2 raglan sts, back – 60 (66) 70 (74) 78 (82) 88 (92) sts, 2 raglan sts, right sleeve – 50 (53) 56 (60) 64 (67) 70 (74) sts, 2 raglan sts, right front – 31 (33) 36 (38) 40 (43) 45 (47) sts.



Body (from armpit to bottom)

Body is worked in rows using 6mm (US10, UK4) 60-100cm (23-39in) circular needles in Fisherman rib stitch pattern. This part is worked straight to the end. In the first Body row continue work in knit stitches and place 50 (53) 56 (60) 64 (67) 70 (74) sleeve stitches on holder on each side while finishing the body. Raglan stitches must be added to the body.

Total amount of stitches after working first Body row: 130 (140) 150 (158) 166 (176) 186 (194) sts.

Row 2 (WS) S11, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 1 st, p last st.

Row 3 (RS) S11, *k1b, p1; rep from * to last 1 st, p last st.

Row 4 (WS) S11, *k1b, p1; rep from * to last 1 st, p last st.

Last two rows form a Fisherman rib stitch pattern working in rows.

Continue work in Fisherman rib stitch pattern until 34 (36) 38 (40) 42 (44) 46 (48) rows have been worked counting from the first body row.

Cast off: *k3tog and cast off at the same time, k2tog and cast off at the same time; rep from * to end.

Sleeve (from armpit to end)

Sleeve is worked in rounds using 6mm (US10, UK4) 40-60cm (16-24in) circular needles (60cm (24in) circular needles are recommended for: XL, 2X, 3X and 4X sizes). Move sleeve stitches on needle from holder. Beginning and end of this round will be in the middle of armpit where sleeve stitches join together (it means that you must place stitch marker between these stitches). Sleeve is worked in Fisherman rib stitch pattern straight to the end. In the first sleeve round continue work in knit stitches. **Note: for sizes S and 2X in first round last two stitches are worked k2tog, one decrease.**

Total amount of stitches: 50 (52) 56 (60) 64 (66) 70 (74) sts.

Round 2 *K1, p1; rep from * to end, sm.

Round 3 *K1b, p1; rep from * to end, sm.

Round 4 *K1, p1b; rep from * to end, sm.

Last two rounds form a Fisherman rib stitch pattern working in rounds.

Continue work in Fisherman rib stitch pattern until 66 (68) 70 (72) 74 (76) 78 (80) rounds have been worked counting from the first sleeve round.

Cast off: k3tog and cast off at the same time to end.

Repeat the same knitting steps with other sleeve.



Finishing

Sew-in snap fastener in front of collar. Weave in all yarn endings.
