Vattenlilja (waterlily) - top

The Vattenlilja top is a cool, summertime, cropped t-shirt with decorative details: cables along the raglan increases, stranded colorwork on the lower part of the body, and a line of wrapped stitches above the ribbing. Equally fine for everyday and parties!

YARN CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Järbo Lin (100% linen, 219 yd/200 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton, 35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 19 sts x 24 rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES - WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L/XL, XL/2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

CHEST Approx. 32¼ (37¾, 43, 48½, 54, 59, 64½) in / 82 (96, 109, 123, 137, 150, 164) cm

TOTAL LENGTH Approx. 16¼ (17¾, 18½, 19¼, 21, 22½, 23¾) in / 41 (45, 47, 49, 53, 57, 60) cm

SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 4 (4¼, 4¾, 5¼, 5½, 6, 6¼) in / 10 (11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16) cm

YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS

Color 1: Approx. 250 (300, 300, 350, 400, 400, 450) g (color 48102, Simply Natural)

Color 2: Approx. 50 (50, 50, 50, 50, 50, 50) g (48113, Pomegranate)

NEEDLES U. S. size 1.5 / 2.5 mm: 16 in / 40 cm circular and U. S. 2.5 / 3 mm: 16, 24, and 32 in / 40, 60, and 80 cm circulars

NOTIONS Cable needle, stitch markers, stitch holder

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY ***

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

BOR: Beginning of row/round.

K2tog: Knit two stitches together = right-leaning decrease.

Ssk (slip, slip, knit): One at a time, sl 2 sts knitwise, place sts back on left needle and k2tog through back loops = left-leaning decrease.

SI 1: Slip 1 stitch from left to right needle as if to purl.

Markers: Place marker between two stitches and slide to right needle as you come to each. Pm = place marker; sl m = slip marker

M1R = make 1 right: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

M1L = make 1 left: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

M1R-p = make 1 right-purl: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and purl into front loop = right-leaning increase.

M1L-p = make 1 left-purl: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and purl into back loop = left-leaning increase.

German Short Rows: Double st (DS): The double stitch or German short rows is a turning method that does not leave holes at each turn. Sl 1 purlwise wyf, pull yarn up firmly over right needle so you flip st and have 2 stitch legs or a double stitch (DS) on the needle; work rem sts on needle.

After working the specified number of short rows, you will join the double sts one at a time. Work to 1st DS, knit/purl it, catching both legs of DS to make 1 st.

CABLE PATTERN: RAGLAN A

Rnd 1: K1, p1, place 3 sts on cable needle and hold in **front** of work, k3, k3 from cable needle.

Rnd 2: Sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1.

Rnd 3: K1, p1, k6, p1, k1.

Rnd 4: Work as for Rnd 2.

Rnd 5: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 6: Work as for Rnd 2.

Repeat Rnds 1-6.

CABLE PATTERN: RAGLAN B

Rnd 1: K1, p1, place 3 sts on cable needle and hold in **back** of work, k3, k3 from cable needle.

Rnd 2: Sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1.

Rnd 3: K1, p1, k6, p1, k1.

Rnd 4: Work as for Rnd 2.

Rnd 5: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 6: Work as for Rnd 2.

Repeat Rnds 1-6.

NECKBAND

With larger size circular and color 1, CO 92 (98, 100, 106, 112, 114, 118) sts. Make sure that the cast-on is not too tight or you may not be able to get the top over your head. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row. Pm for beginning of rnd (BOR). Change to smaller size circular and knit 5 rnds.

Sizes L/XL, XL/2XL, 3XL, 4XL only: Change to larger size circular and knit 1 rnd increasing 12 (16, 32, 38) sts evenly spaced around = 92 (98, 100, 118, 128, 146, 156) sts.

All sizes: Continue with larger size circular and knit 1 rnd.

RAGLAN SET-UP

K9 (10, 11, 16, 17, 21, 23), M1R, pm, sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1, pm, M1L, k8 (8, 8, 8, 10, 12, 12), M1R, pm, sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1, pm, M1L, k18 (21, 22, 31, 34, 41, 46), M1R, pm, sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1, pm, M1L, k8 (8, 8, 8, 10, 12, 12), M1R, pm, sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1, pm, M1L, knit to BOR.

You now have 20 (23, 24, 33, 36, 43, 48) sts for the front and 20 (23, 24, 33, 36, 43, 48) sts for the back, as well as 10 (10, 10, 10, 12, 14, 14) sts for each sleeve and 10 sts for each raglan cable line = 100 (106, 108, 126, 136, 154, 164) sts total.

BACK NECK SHAPING WITH SHORT ROWS

Your top will have a better fit if you raise the back neck a bit. To shape the neck, you'll work short rows back and forth, turning with the German Short Row method. Short rows are worked in stockinette (knit on RS and purl on WS).

NOTE All increases are worked at the side of the marker outside of the 10-st raglan cable panel within parentheses (-).

Row 1 (RS): Knit to first marker, (k1, p1, k6, p1, k1), k7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 9, 9). Turn.

Row 2 (WS): Purl to first marker, (sl 1, k1, p6, k1, sl 1), purl past BOR to next marker, (p1, k1, p6, k1, p1), p7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 9, 9). Turn.

Row 3 (RS): Knit to marker, (sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1), knit past BOR to next marker, M1R, (k1, p1, k6, p1, k1), M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, (k1, p1, k6, p1, k1), M1L, k2. Turn.

Row 4 (WS): Purl to first marker, (sl 1, k1, p6, k1, sl 1), purl to next marker, (sl 1, k1, p6 k1, sl 1), sl m, purl past BOR to next marker, M1R-p, (p1, k1, p6, k1, p1), M1L-p, purl to next marker, M1R-p, (p1, k1, p6, k1, p1), M1L-p. Turn.

Row 5 (RS): Knit to first marker, (sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1), knit to next marker, (sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1), knit past BOR to next marker, M1R, (k1, p1, k6, p1, k1), M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, (k1, p1, k6, p1, k1), M1L, k5 (7, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16). Turn.

Row 6 (WS): Purl to first marker, (sl 1, k1, p6, k1, sl 1), purl to next marker, (sl 1, k1, p6 k1, sl 1), sl m, purl past BOR to next marker, M1R-p, (p1, k1, p6, k1, p1), M1L-p, purl to next marker, M1R-p, (p1, k1, p6, k1, p1), M1L-p, p5 (7, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16). Turn.

Row 7 (RS): Knit to first marker, (sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1), knit to next marker, (sl 1, p1, k6, p1, sl 1), knit to BOR.

Now you are back at the beginning of the round and have 116 (122, 124, 142, 152, 170, 180) sts. The rest of the top is worked in the round in stockinette. Next, you'll work the raglan shaping with a 10-st cable panel between raglan markers.

RAGLAN A AND RAGLAN B

Rnd 1: Knit to first marker, M1R, RAGLAN A, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, RAGLAN B, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, RAGLAN A, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, RAGLAN B, M1L, knit to BOR.

Rnd 2: Knit to first marker, RAGLAN A, knit to next marker, RAGLAN B, knit to next marker, RAGLAN A, knit to next marker, RAGLAN B, knit to BOR.

Rep Rnds 1-2 until you have 236 (282, 324, 358, 400, 442, 476) sts which includes 44 (54, 64, 68, 78, 86, 92) sts for each sleeve and 54 (67, 78, 91, 102, 115, 126) sts each for front and back as well as 10 sts for each raglan cable.

Sizes XS and S only:

Continue with modified Rnds 1 and 2, increasing as follows:

Rnd 1B: Knit to first marker, RAGLAN A, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, RAGLAN B, knit to next marker, RAGLAN A, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, RAGLAN B, knit to BOR.

Rnd 2B: Knit to first marker, RAGLAN A, knit to next marker, RAGLAN B, knit to next marker, RAGLAN A, knit to next marker, RAGLAN B, knit to BOR.

Work a total of 6 (4) rnds with increases = 56 (62) sts for each sleeve and a total of 260 (298) sts.

TIPS FOR ALL SIZES Because row gauge varies from person to person, you might need to make the yoke longer for a perfect fit. Rep Round 2 until you have the desired length. The yoke should be at least 7½ (8¾, 9, 9½, 10¾, 11½, 12¾) in / 19 (22, 23, 24, 27, 29, 32) cm long.

DIVIDE BODY AND SLEEVES

As you divide the body and sleeves, remove markers except for BOR.

Knit to first marker and knit the 10 raglan cable sts (the raglan cable will be part of the body). Place next 56 (62, 64, 68, 78, 86, 92) sts on a holder for right sleeve, CO 4 (4, 6, 6, 8, 8, 10) sts for underarm. Knit across next raglan cable and knit to and over next cable. Place next 56 (62, 64, 68, 78, 86, 92) sts on a holder for left sleeve, CO 4 (4, 6, 6, 8, 8, 10) sts for underarm. Knit across next raglan cable, remove marker, and knit to BOR.

The body should now have 156 (182, 208, 234, 260, 286, 312) sts, Knit around on body until it measures 5½ (6, 6¼, 6¾, 7, 7½, 8) in / 14 (15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20) cm from underarm.

WORK CHARTED PATTERN

Work following chart below, beginning at lower right corner and knitting from right to left, from the bottom up. If necessary to maintain correct gauge for both chart and stockinette, change to needles U. S. size 4 / 3.5 mm. Continue with color 1 but do not cut color 2.

Only for sizes XS, M, XL/2XL, and 4XL: Knit 3 rnds.

Only for sizes S, L/XL, 3XL:

Rnd 1: Knit.

Rnd 2: Knit, increasing 2 sts evenly spaced around.

Rnd 3: Knit.

= 184 (236, 288) sts. Knit 1 rnd.

WRAPPED STITCHES

Now you'll make a decorative border with wrapped stitches at the lower edge, above the ribbing. It can be a little time-consuming but it is not difficult and is absolutely worth the effort. The stitch lifts the top and will make it completely unique!

NOTE Be careful not to draw in the stitches too hard.

With color 1, k4. Place the last 3 sts on cable needle and wrap color 2 three times around the sts on cable needle, beginning on left side and wrapping counterclockwise, move the stitches back to right needle; rep * to * around.

Cut color 2 and knit 2 rnds with MC.

Change to smaller size circular and work 5 rnds in k1, p1 ribbing. BO in ribbing.

SLEEVES

Move the held 56 (62, 64, 68, 78, 86, 92) sleeve sts to larger size circular and join. Pick up and knit 4 (4, 6, 6, 8, 8, 10) sts from underarm cast-on. Also pick up and knit 1 st on each side of the already-picked up sts to avoid holes at each side of underarm. Pm at center of underarm to mark BOR = 62 (68, 72, 76, 88, 96, 104) sts total.

Knit around in stockinette. On every 5th rnd, decrease 2 sts as follows: K1, k2tog, knit until 3 sts rem, ssk, k1.

Decrease the same way on every 5th rnd a total of 1 (2, 2, 2, 2, 4) times = 60 (64, 68, 72, 84, 92, 96) sts rem.

Continue without further decreases until sleeve measures 2¾ (3¼, 3½, 4, 4¼, 4¾, 5¼) in / 7 (8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13) cm or desired length.

Now make a round of wrapped stitches as for body.

With color 1, k4. Place the last 3 sts on cable needle and wrap color 2 three times around the sts on cable needle, beginning on left side and wrapping counterclockwise, move the stitches back to right needle; rep * to * around. Cut color 2 and then knit 2 rnds with color 1. Change to smaller size circular and work 4 rnds in k1, p1 ribbing. BO loosely in ribbing.

Make the second sleeve the same way.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Dampen top and lay flat to dry.

MEASUREMENTS

A $32\frac{1}{4}$ ($37\frac{3}{4}$, 43, $48\frac{1}{2}$, 54, 59, $64\frac{1}{2}$) in / 82 (96, 109, 123, 137, 150, 164) cm

B $16\frac{1}{4}$ ($17\frac{3}{4}$, $18\frac{1}{2}$, $19\frac{1}{4}$, 21, $22\frac{1}{2}$, $23\frac{3}{4}$) in / 41 (45, 47, 49, 53, 57, 60) cm

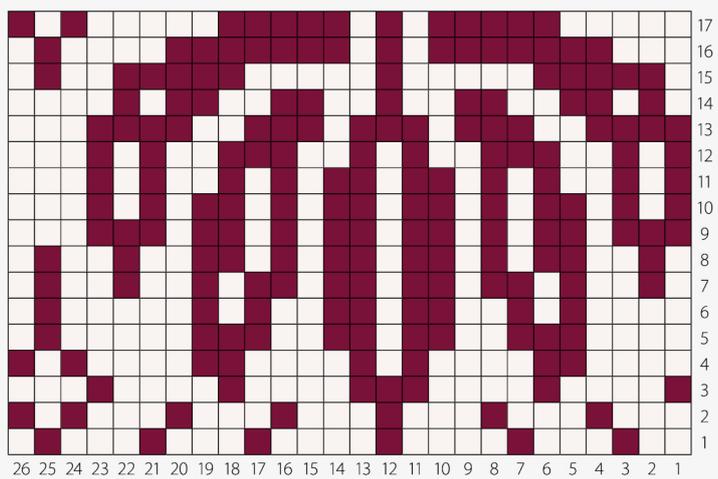
C $7\frac{1}{2}$ ($8\frac{3}{4}$, 9, $9\frac{1}{2}$, $10\frac{3}{4}$, $11\frac{1}{2}$, $12\frac{3}{4}$) in / 19 (22, 23, 24, 27, 29, 32) cm

D $8\frac{3}{4}$ (9, $9\frac{1}{2}$, $9\frac{3}{4}$, $10\frac{1}{4}$, 11, 11) in / 22 (23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 28) cm

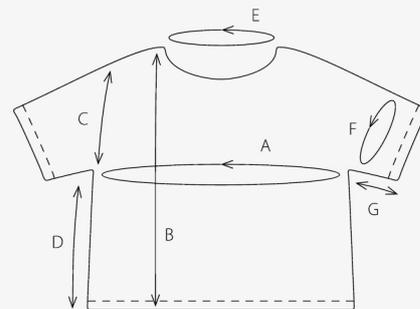
E $18\frac{1}{4}$ ($19\frac{1}{4}$, $19\frac{3}{4}$, 21, 22, $22\frac{1}{2}$, $23\frac{1}{4}$) in 46 (49, 50, 53, 56, 57, 59) cm

Körsbär (cherry) - pullover

The Körsbär pullover, knitted with a soft llama-silk yarn, is a light summer dream with large, pretty cherry branches twined around the yoke. It is knitted from the top down with twisted ribbing around the neck and on the lower edge of the body. The sleeve cuffs are slightly puffed at the wrists and bound off with I-cord.

YARN CYCA #2 (sport), Llama Silk (70% baby llama, 30% mulberry silk, 180 yd/165m / 50 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton (35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 23 sts x 30 rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES - WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

CHEST Approx. 34¼ (37¾, 41, 45¼, 49¼, 53½, 57½, 61½) in / 87 (96, 104, 115, 125, 136, 146, 156) cm

TOTAL LENGTH Approx. 22 (22¾, 23½, 24, 24¾, 26, 26¾, 27½) in / 56 (58, 59.5, 61, 63, 66, 68, 70) cm

SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 15¾ (16¼, 16½, 17, 17, 17¼, 17¼, 17¼) in / 40 (41, 42, 43, 43, 44, 44, 44) cm

YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS

Color 1: Approx. 200 (250, 300, 400, 450, 450, 500, 550) g (color 12202, Linen Beige)

Color 2: Approx. 50 (50, 50, 50, 50, 50, 50, 50) g (color 12217, Purple Violet)

NEEDLES U. S. size 2.5 / 3 mm: 16 and 32 in / 40 and 80 cm circulars and U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm: 16, 24, and 32 in / 40, 60, and 80 cm circulars; set of 5 dpn

NOTIONS Stitch markers, stitch holder

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY **

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

K1tbl: Knit stitch through back loop = twisted knit.

K2tog: Knit two stitches together = right-leaning decrease.

K3tog: Knit three stitches together = right-leaning double decrease.

German Short Rows: Double st (DS): The double stitch or German short rows is a turning method that does not leave holes at each turn. Sl 1 purlwise wyf, pull yarn up firmly over right needle so you flip st and have 2 stitch legs or a double stitch (DS) on the needle; work rem sts on needle.

After working the specified number of short rows, you will join the double sts one at a time. Work to 1st DS, knit/purl it, catching both legs of DS to make 1 st.

NECKBAND

With color 1 and smaller size circular, CO 100 (104, 108, 112, 116, 120, 120, 124) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row. Place marker A for beginning of rnd at center back. Work around in k1tbl, p1 twisted rib for 8 rnds.

YOKE

Change to larger size circular and work first increase rnd: Increase 50 (52, 54, 56, 58, 60, 60, 62) sts by repeating *k2, M1* around = 150 (156, 162, 168, 174, 180, 180, 186) sts.

SHORT ROWS TO RAISE BACK NECK

Your pullover will have a better fit if you raise the back neck a bit. To shape the neck, you'll work short rows back and forth, turning with the German Short Row method. Short rows are worked in stockinette (knit on RS and purl on WS).

Row 1 (RS): K36 (38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 46, 48). Turn.

Row 2 (WS): Purl to marker A + p36 (38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 46, 48). Turn.

Row 3 (RS): Knit 9 sts past turn on previous row. Turn.

Rep Row 3 until you've turned a total of 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5) times on each side. Return to working in the rnd. Knit 10 (10, 11, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7) rnds.

Sizes L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL only:

Knit 1 rnd, increasing - (-, -, 20, 28, 36, 44, 50) sts evenly spaced around = (188, 204, 216, 224, 236) sts. Knit - (-, -, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7) rnds.

All sizes: On the next rnd, increase 12 (24, 36, 28, 30, 36, 46, 52) sts evenly spaced around = 162 (180, 198, 216, 234, 252, 270, 288) sts. Knit 1 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 4) rnds.

WORK CHARTED PATTERN

Now work following chart. Begin at lower right corner and read chart from right to left, from bottom to top. If necessary to maintain a consistent gauge, change to U. S. size 6 / 4 mm needle for the colorwork.

After completing charted pattern, you should have 198 (220, 242, 264, 286, 308, 330, 352) sts. Knit 2 rnds. On the next rnd, increase 18 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32) sts as follows: *k11, M1*; rep * to * around.

= a total of 216 (240, 264, 288, 312, 336, 360, 384) sts. Knit 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7) rnds.

On the next rnd, increase 18 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32) sts as follows: k11, M1, *k12, M1*; rep * to * around until 1 st rem, k1.

= a total of 234 (260, 286, 312, 338, 364, 390, 416) sts. Knit 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7) rnds.

On the next rnd, increase 18 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32) sts as follows: k11, M1, *k13, M1*; rep * to * around until 2 sts rem, k2.

= a total of 252 (280, 308, 336, 364, 392, 420, 448) sts. Knit 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7) rnds.

On the next rnd, increase 18 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32) sts as follows: k11, M1, *k14, M1*; rep * to * around until 3 sts rem, k3.

= a total of 270 (300, 330, 360, 390, 420, 450, 480) sts. Knit around until yoke measures 8¼ (8¾, 8 7/8, 9, 9½, 10¼, 10¾, 11) in / 21 (22, 22.5, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28) cm or desired length to underarms.

DIVIDE FOR BODY AND SLEEVES

K45 (50, 54, 59, 65, 70, 75, 79), place next 45 (50, 57, 62, 65, 70, 75, 82) sts on a holder for right sleeve, CO 10 (10, 12, 14, 14, 16, 18, 22) sts for underarm, k90 (100, 108, 118, 130, 140, 150, 158) sts, place next 45 (50, 57, 62, 65, 70, 75, 82) sts on a holder for left sleeve, CO 10 (10, 12, 14, 14, 16, 18, 22) sts for underarm, knit to end of rnd.

The body now has 200 (220, 240, 264, 288, 312, 336, 360) sts.

BODY

Knit around until body measures 11½ (11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13, 13½, 13¾, 14¼) in / 29 (30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36) cm or desired length from underarms. Change to smaller size circular and work in twisted ribbing, k1tbl, p1 for 2½ in / 6 cm. BO in ribbing.

SLEEVES

Slip the held 45 (50, 57, 62, 65, 70, 75, 82) sleeve sts onto larger size short circular. Pick up and knit 10 (10, 12, 14, 14, 16, 18, 22) sts in the underarm cast-on + 1 extra st at each side of underarm = 12 (12, 14, 16, 16, 18, 20, 24) sts picked up.

= a total of 57 (62, 71, 78, 81, 88, 95, 106) sts for sleeve.

Pm at center of underarm for beginning of rnd. Knit around until sleeve measures 15¾ (16¼, 16½, 17, 17, 17¼, 17¼, 17¼) in / 40 (41, 42, 43, 43, 44, 44, 44) cm or desired length. On the next rnd, decrease 15 (16, 23, 30, 31, 38, 41, 48) sts evenly spaced around = 42 (46, 48, 48, 50, 54, 58) sts rem. Knit 1 rnd.

I-cord Bind-Off: CO 3 new sts at beginning of rnd and place them on left needle. *K2, k2tog tbl, place the 3 sts back onto left needle*; rep * to * until 3 sts rem on needle. K3tog. Cut yarn and draw end through rem st. Make the second sleeve the same way. Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Dampen sweater and lay flat to dry.

MEASUREMENTS

A 3¼ (3¾, 41, 45¼, 49¼, 53½, 57½, 61½) in / 87 (96, 104, 115, 125, 136, 146, 156) cm

B 22 (22¾, 23½, 24, 24¾, 26, 26¾, 27½) in / 56 (58, 59.5, 61, 63, 66, 68, 70) cm

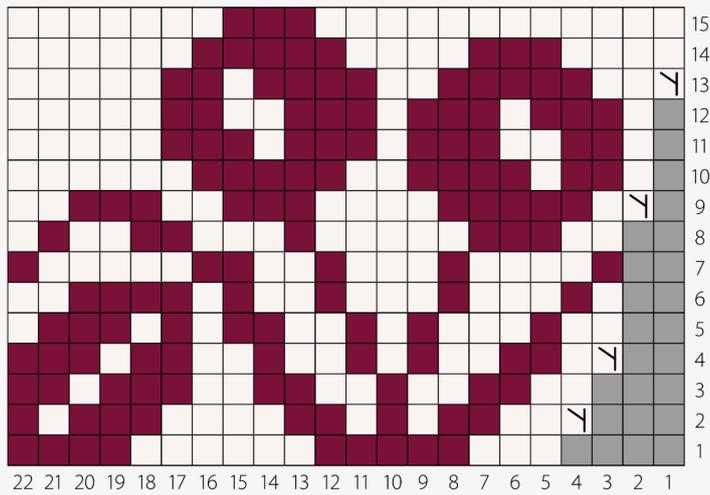

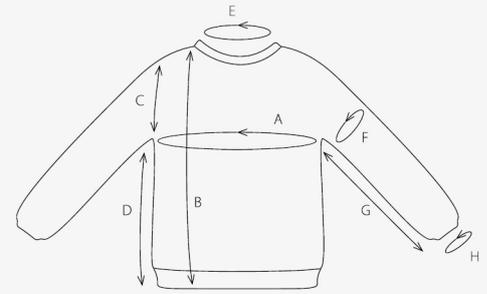

Flora - Brioche pullover

Flora is a seamless pullover knitted from the top down with saddle sleeves and a stylized floral pattern cascading down from the shoulders onto the sleeves. The pattern will entice the experienced knitter into this richly varied and inspiring knitting. It will also be a fun and educational challenge for anyone wanting to step into learning brioche knitting.

YARN CYCA #2 (sport), 2 tr ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 18 sts x 51 rnds on U. S. 6 / 4 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES - WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL, 5XL)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

To fit CHEST Approx. 28¾ (33, 37, 40¼, 44, 48, 52, 56, 59¾) in / 73 (84, 94, 102, 112, 122, 132, 142, 152) cm

GARMENT MEASUREMENTS—CHEST Approx. 36¾ (41, 45, 48, 51½, 56, 59¾, 63¾, 67¾) in / 93 (104, 114, 122, 131, 142, 152, 162, 172) cm

TOTAL LENGTH Approx. 15¾ (16½, 18¼, 18½, 19¼, 20½, 21¾, 22, 22¾) in / 40 (42, 46, 47, 49, 52, 55, 56, 58) cm

NEEDLES Neckband: U. S. size 2.5 and 4, optional 6 / 3, 3.5, opt. 4 mm: 16-24 in / 40- 60 cm (40 in / 100 cm for magic loop) circulars and U. S. 6 / 4 mm: 32 in / 80 cm circular

NOTIONS Stitch markers, stitch holder

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY ***

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

RM: Removeable (locking) marker; **Pm** = place removeable marker

Sl m: Slip marker from left to right needle. **NOTE** Always slip markers as you come to them.

BOR: Beginning of row/round

Brk (brioche knit): Knit the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

Brp (brioche purl): Purl the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

Sl1yo: With yarn held in *front* of work over left needle, slip 1 st purlwise to right needle = a yarnover on the slipped st on right needle.

Brkyobrk: Knit the yarnover and slipped st from previous row together – leave st + yarnover on left needle – yarnover on right needle and knit st into st + yarnover on left needle – drop sts from left needle (increase of 2 sts).

Brk3tog (brioche knit 3 sts together): Knit 3 sts together = decrease of 2 sts.

Ssbrkpssso: (slip, slip, brk1, pssso) slip, slip (knitwise), brk 1, pass the 2 slipped sts over.

Brk4st-inc: (brioche knit 4 st-increase): brk, yo, brk, yo, brk = 5 sts into same st (increase of 4 sts).

Brk4st-dec: (brioche knit 4 st-decrease): decrease of 4 sts (made with 5 sts): slip 1st st knitwise, slip 2nd st knitwise, place 3rd st on a locking marker, and let it hang in front of work. Knit 4th st, and pass 2nd st over the 4th (the one just knitted). Slip last st back to left needle, and pass 5th st over it. Slip it purlwise to right needle, and pass 1st st over it. Now pick up the hanging st, making sure that CC is in front, and place it on left needle. Slip st on right needle purlwise to left needle and pass the middle st over it. Now move the st to right needle.

Elastic bind-off: K1tbl (= twisted knit), p1, slip the 2 sts back to left needle, p2tog, *k1tbl, slip 2 sts from right to left needle, k2tog tbl, p1, slip the 2 sts to left needle, p2tog*; rep * to * until 1 st rem on right needle. Cut yarn and draw end through last st.

The Chart is used for both working back and forth and in the round although it only shows the right side. **NOTE** The row count on the chart will not match the number of rows knitted on the sweater. When you've completed all 76 chart rows, start from the beginning again.

BEGIN

With CC and U. S. 6 / 4 mm circular, CO 81 sts, placing markers as follows: 3+21+33+21+3. All sizes begin the same way. The pullover should fit over your head precisely. If it feels too wide/tight, adjust it by working the ribbing with a larger/smaller size needle.

To create the neck opening, begin by working back and forth.

Beginning Row (RS), MC: P1, sl1yo, p1, sl m, *sl1yo, p1*; rep * to * until 1 st before next marker, sl1yo, sl m, *p1, sl1yo*; rep * to * until 1 st before next marker, p1, sl m, sl1yo, p1*; rep * to * until 1 st before next marker, sl1yo, sl m, p1, sl1yo, p1. Slide sts back to beginning of row.

Increase front/back:

Row 1 (RS), CC: Sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo (8 sts increased).

Row 2 (WS), MC: K1, sl1yo, *brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st, k1.

Row 3 (WS), CC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, sl1yo.

Row 4 (RS), MC: *Brp, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Row 5 (RS), CC: Sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl1yo (12 sts increased).

Row 6 (WS), MC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st, brk.

Row 7 (WS), CC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, sl1yo.

Row 8 (RS), MC: *Brp, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Row 9 (RS), CC: Sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, sl m, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before end of row, brkyobr, sl1yo (12 sts increased). Rep Rows 6-9 2 more times until you have 21+21+53+21+21 = 137 sts on needle.

Cast on stitches for neck:

CO (long-tail method) 11 sts with both colors: hold MC below and make st loop with CC. Now begin working in the round. Cut both yarns and begin rnd back at right shoulder to hide the color change.

Rnd 18 (RS, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Continue increasing on only front/back.

Rnd 19, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep to * to last st on rnd.

Rnd 20, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Rnd 21, CC: Work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

XS-S: Go directly to section, "Work without Increasing."

Rnd 22, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 23, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep to * to last st.

Rnd 24 (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 25 (RS), CC: Work following chart to next marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

XS-S: Now you have 57+21+57+21 =156 sts.

M: Now you have 61+21+61+21 =164 sts.

L: Rep Rnds 22-25 once more until you have 65+21+65+21 =172 sts.

XL: Rep Rnds 22-25, 3 more times until you have 73+21+73+21 =188 sts.

2XL-3XL: Rep Rnds 22-25, 3 more times, until you have 73+21+73+21=188 sts.

4XL-5XL: Rep Rnds 22-25, 4 more times, until you have 77+21+77+21=196 sts.

Work without Increasing (does not apply to sizes XL, 3XL-5XL):

In this section, the top of the body is elongated somewhat for a boxy shape and a little extra width under the sleeves. If you want to change the length of the yoke, you can omit or add rounds without increasing here. (In the larger sizes, the increases occur more frequently after the last section, hence the "empty" rounds).

Rnd 1, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, while working from chart over sleeves.

Rnd 2, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st, while working from chart over sleeves.

XS: Rep Rnds 1-2, 9 more times.

S: Rep Rnds 1-2, 4 more times.

M: Rep Rnds 1-2, 5 more times.

L: Rep Rnds 1-2, 7 more times.

2XL: Rep Rnds 1-2, 1 more time.

SLEEVE INCREASES

On the first increase rnd, Rnd 8, place new markers to indicate where the chart begins and ends.

1. Begin increasing only for the sleeves (does not apply to sizes XL and 4XL):

Rnd 1, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 2, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 3, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Rnd 4, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 5, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 6, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 7, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, brp.

Rnd 8, CC: *Brkyobr, (pm after yarnover; from now on, this indicates the beginning of chart), sl m, work following chart up to last st before marker, brkyobr, (pm after brk you made first; from now on, this indicates end of chart), sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo, sl m; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

5XL: Go to step 4, $77+25+77+25=204$ sts.

Rnds 9-15: Work as for Rnds 1-7.

Rnd 16, CC: Brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

L: Go to step 3, $65+29+65+29=188$ sts.

2XL-3XL: Go to step 3, $73+29+73+29=204$ sts.

Rnds 17-23: Work as for Rnds 1-7.

Rnd 24, CC: Brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo; sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * to last st, sl1yo;brkyobr, sl m, *sl1yo, brk* repeat to 1 sts bef marker, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

XS-S: $57+33+57+33=180$ sts.

M: $61+33+61+33=188$ sts.

2. Begin increasing only on sleeves (sizes XL and 4XL):

Rnd 1, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 2, CC: *Brk, sl1yo, *; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 3, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 4, CC: Brkyobr, (pm after yarnover, this now marks beginning of chart), sl m, work following chart to last st before marker, brkyobr (pm after first brk made to indicate from now on where chart ends), sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo; sl m; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

Rnds 5-7: Work as for Rnds 1-3.

Rnd 8, CC: Brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

4XL: Go to step 4, $77+29+77+29=212$ sts.

Rnds 9-11: Work as for Rnds 1-3.

Rnd 12, CC: Brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 1 st before marker, sl1yo; sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * to last st, sl1yo;brkyobr, sl m, *sl1yo, brk* repeat to 1 sts bef marker, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (8 sts increased).

XL: $73+33+73+33=212$ sts.

3. Increase on sleeves/front/back (XS-XL):

On every 8th rnd, increase on front, back, and both sleeves.

Rnd 1 (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 2 (RS), CC: *Brk, sl1yo, *; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 3, (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 4 (RS), CC: *Brk, sl1yo* rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 5, (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 6 (RS), CC: *Brk, sl1yo* rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 7, (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 8, CC: Brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * to marker, sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m; sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, rep rnd once more (16 sts increased)

XS: Rep Rnds 1-8, 3 more times, until you have 73+49+73+49=244 sts.

S: Rep Rnds 1-6, 5 more times, until you have 81+57+81+57=276 sts.

M: Rep Rnds 1-8, 5 more times, until you have 85+57+85+57=284 sts.

L: Rep Rnds 1-8, 8 more times, until you have 101+65+101+65=332 sts.

XL: Rep Rnds 1-8, 8 more times, until you have 109+69+109+69=356 sts.

Place sleeve sts on holders on the last rnd, (CC); CO 11 (7, 13, 11, 11) sts under each sleeve.

4. Increase on sleeves/front/back (2XL-5XL):

For shorter yoke, work the increases on every fourth rnd instead = 2 (2¼, 2¼, 2½) in / 5 (5.5, 5.5, 6.5) cm shorter yoke (see schematic, measurements C).

On every sixth rnd, increase on front, back, and both sleeves.

Rnd 1 (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 2 (RS), CC: *Brk, sl1yo, *; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 3 (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 4 (RS), CC: *Brk, sl1yo* rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 5, (RS), MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st brp.

Rnd 6, CC: Brkyobr, sl1yo, sl m, work following chart to marker, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, sl m, sl1yo, brkyobr, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * until 2 sts before next marker, brkyobr, sl1yo; rep rnd once more (16 sts decreased).

2XL: Rep Rnds 1-8, 11 more times, until you have 121+77+121+77=396 sts.

3XL: Rep Rnds 1-6, 14 more times, until you have 129+85+129+85=428 sts.

4XL: Rep Rnds 1-8, 15 more times, until you have 137+89+137+89=452 sts.

5XL: Rep Rnds 1-8, 17 more times, until you have 145+93+145+93=476 sts.

Place sleeve sts on holders on the last rnd, (CC); CO 15 (15, 15, 15) sts under each sleeve.

BODY

Move markers 5 sts in towards center of body. Keep BOR marker in place, cut yarn there and place one more marker 5 sts from that point (see below for details).

Move markers as follows, MC:

Sl1yo, brp, work to marker, (rep to end of rnd even if it says to work to marker), prm, work 5 sts, pm. Work until 5 sts before marker, pm, work to marker, prm, work to marker, prm, work 5 sts, pm, work until 5 sts before BOR, pm, Work to BOR.

Rnd 1, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 2, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rep Rnds 1-2 6 more times.

Rnd 15, CC: Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * to marker, sl m, ssbrkpsso, work until 3 sts before next marker, k3tog to last st on rnd. (8 sts decreased).

Rnd 16, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rep Rnds 1-16 4 more times and then rep Rnds 1-2 until body measures 8¼ (8¾, 9, 9½, 10¼, 10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾) in / 21 (22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30) cm from underarm or 1½ in / 4 cm less than desired length. Cut MC and, with CC, work in k1, p1 ribbing for 1½ in / 4 cm. BO with an elastic bind-off method.

SLEEVES

Slip the sts of one sleeve onto larger size circular or dpn. With CC, pick up and knit sts beginning at center of underarm: Pick up 4 (4, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7, 7) sts, work following chart inside markers, pick up and knit 5 (5, 7, 7, 8, 8, 8, 8, 8) more sts. Pm for BOR. = 58 (66, 70, 78, 84, 92, 100, 104, 108) sleeve sts.

Beginning Rnd, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st; and work following chart inside markers.

Rnd 1, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep to last st of rnd, and work following chart inside markers.

Rnd 2, MC: Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st, and work following chart inside markers.

Rep Rnds 1-2 until you reach elbow (about 6 in / 15 cm).

Sleeve Shaping:

Rnd 1, CC: Brk, sl1yo, ssbrkpsso, sl1yo brk*; rep * to * to marker, sl m, rep chart inside markers, sl m, work until 7 sts before end of rnd, sl1yo, k3tog, sl1yo, brk, sl1yo (4 sts decreased).

Rnd 2, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st.

Rnd 3, CC: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep to last st of rnd and work following chart inside markers.

Rnd 4, MC: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * to last st and work following chart inside markers.

Rep Rnds 3-4, 14 (10, 10, 6, 6, 4, 4, 4, 4) more times and then work decrease Rnds 1-2.

Rep the rnds above 3 (5, 5, 7, 8, 11, 12, 12, 13) more times until 38 (38, 42, 42, 44, 44, 44, 48, 48) sts rem and sleeve is approx. 12¾ (13, 13, 13½, 13¾, 13¾, 13¾, 14½, 14½) in / 32 (33, 33, 34, 35, 35, 35, 37, 37) cm long or 1½ in / 4 cm shorter than desired total length.

Cut MC, With CC, and work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 1½ in / 4 cm. BO with an elastic bind-off method. Make the second sleeve the same way.

NECKBAND

With circular U. S. 2.5 (2.5, 4, 6, 6, 6, 6, 6) / 3 (3, 3.5, 4, 4, 4, 4, 4) mm and CC, pick up and knit 100 sts around neck. For foldable ribbing, pick up all BRK sts with a knit st and all BRP with a purl st. Continue in k1, p1 ribbing for 1¼ in / 3 cm. BO with an elastic bind-off method.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Hand wash sweater in lukewarm water with an enzyme-free soap. Carefully squeeze out excess water, roll sweater in a large towel, and press lightly to absorb more water. Lay garment flat to dry. Fold sleeves so the flower pattern lies flat.

Pomona - Brioche pullover

Pomona is a fitted pullover knitted from the bottom up in two-color brioche knitting. The body is worked first and then the sleeves. The pieces are then arranged together and the yoke is worked in one piece. The yoke is worked in brioche with increases and decreases at the same time as the neck is shaped. The inspiration comes from pretty hanging plants and flowers, including chain-of-hearts vine.

YARN CYCA #2 (sport), 2 tr ull (2-Ply Wool) (100% wool, 328 yd/300 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/168 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Ístex Kambgarn (100% Merino wool, 163 yd/150 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 19 sts x 46 rnds in brioche pattern on U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. **NOTE** When the stitch count per row is measured in brioche, every stitch counts as 2 rows.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

TOTAL LENGTH Approx. 21¼ (21¾, 22, 22¾, 23¾, 24½, 25¼, 26) in / 54 (55, 56, 58, 60, 62, 64, 66) cm as measured down center back

SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 17¾ (17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 45 (45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm

YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS

Color 1: Approx. 230 (240, 255, 295, 335, 380, 420, 450 g (color 74102, Natural White)

Color 2: Approx. 200 (210, 215, 245, 275, 330, 360, 390) g (color 74148, Organic Garden)

NEEDLES U. S. size 4 / 3.5 mm: 32-60 in / 80-150 cm (depending on size) and U. S. 6 / 4 mm: 16-24 in / 40-60 cm (for neckband)

NOTIONS Cable needle, stitch markers

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY ***

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

Markers: Pm: Place marker; Sl m: Slip marker from left to right needle. NOTE Always slip markers as you come to them

Brk (brioche knit): Knit the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

Brp (brioche purl): Purl the stitch that was slipped in the previous row together with its yarnover.

Sl1yo: With yarn held in *front* of work, slip 1 st purlwise to right needle and take yarn to back of work. You have now slipped 1 st and, at the same time, made a yarnover to pair with the slipped st = yarn over the slipped st on right needle.

Sl1k2togpssso: Slip 1 st (1 knit together with its yarnover) knitwise with yarn held in back of work; knit 2 sts together (1 purl and 1 knit st with its yarnover); pass the slipped st (with yarnover) over = 2 sts decreased = left-leaning decrease.

Brk4tog (brioche knit 4 sts together; worked with 5 sts): Slip 2 sts knitwise, one at a time, place next (knit) st on a cable needle and hold it in front of work; k1, pass one of the slipped sts over; move st on right needle to left needle and pass next st over it; move st to right needle and pass the second slipped st over; move st on cable needle to left needle; move 1 st from right to left needle and pass st previously on cable needle over it. Move st back to right needle.

Inc 3-in-1 (Increase 3-in-1): Work 3 sts into 1 st as follows: brk but leave st on left needle, yo, brk in same st and slip off left needle. When you come to these new sts on the following row, work into brioche structure = 2 sts increased

Inc 4-in-1 (Increase 4-in-1): This increase is worked over 2 rows.

Row 1 with the dominant color: Wrap yarn 3 times around needle to make 3 yarnovers.

Row 2 with second color: Work 4 sts into the 3 yarnovers: [Slip 1 purlwise + yarnover, p1] 2 times. Work as follows: With yarn in front of work, slip the first yarnover as if to purl and then make a yarnover so that you make yet another one (this will be a slipped st with yarnover) and now you have 2 yarnovers remaining on left needle. Bring yarn to front of work and purl 1 in next yarnover, but do not slip it off.

With yarn in front of work, slip the yarnover as if to purl and make a yarnover so you have made yet another yarnover (this will be a slipped st with yarnover. Now you have 1 yarnover left. Bring yarn to front of work and purl 1 in yarnover. Where there were 3 yarnovers, now you have 4 sts: 1 slipped st + yarnover, 1 purl, 1 slipped st + yarnover, 1 purl = 3 sts increased.

On the next row, continue in brioche as the sts show but make sure to slow down when you come to the increases. At first, it can be difficult to see how the sts should be worked.

BODY

With smaller size circular and the color you want as the dominant color on the right side of the sweater: CO 176 (180, 194, 214, 230, 256, 274, 298) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm.

Now set-up for two-color brioche:

Color 1 (the color you used for the ribbing): *K1, sl1yo*; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in front of work. Now add in color 2. Let the yarn hang on back of work and work as follows: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

From now on, rep the following 2 rnds:

Rnd 1 (color 1): *Brk, sl1yo *; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in front of work.

Rnd 2 (color 2): *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

Rep these 2 rnds until the body measures (including ribbing) 14¼ (14 3/8, 14½, 14 3/8, 14½, 15 3/8, 15½, 16¼) in / 36 (36.5, 37, 36.5, 37, 39, 39.5, 41) cm.

With color 1, bind off for underarms as follows:

Work 40 (40, 44, 48, 52, 60, 64, 70) sts as est, BO 9 sts, work 79 (81, 89, 99, 107, 119, 129, 141) sts, BO 9 sts, work 39 (41, 43, 49, 53, 59, 63, 69) sts = 158 (162, 176, 196, 212, 238, 256, 280) sts rem. (The st before and after the underarm is a slipped st + yo).

Set aside body while you knit the sleeves. Do not cut yarn because you begin the yoke here.

SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn and the color you want as the dominant color on the right side of the sweater: CO 36 (38, 40, 40, 42, 44, 44, 46) sts. Divide sts onto dpn and join; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in p1, k1 ribbing for 2 in / 5 cm. **NOTE** It is important to begin with a purl st.

Now set-up for two-color brioche:

Color 1 (the color you used for the ribbing): *Sl1yo, k1*; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in back of work.

Now add in color 2. Let yarn hang on back of work and work as follows: *Brp, sl1yo*; rep * to * around. Let yarn hang in front of work.

Rep these 2 rnds until ¾ in / 2 cm above ribbing.

Next Rnd with color 1 (a rnd with brioche knit): Increase for the first time as follows:

Sl1yo, inc 3-in-1, *sl1yo, brk*; rep * to * around until 1 st rem, inc 3-in-1.

Increase the same way (always on a round with brioche knit and color 1) a total of 5 (4, 4, 6, 8, 11, 11, 12) times with about 3½ (4¾, 4¾, 2¾, 2, 1¼, 1¼, 1½) in / 9 (12, 12, 7, 5, 3.5, 3.5, 4) cm between increase rnds = 56 (54, 56, 64, 74, 88, 88, 94) sts.

On the next rnd with color 1 (a rnd of brioche knit), bind off for underarms as follows:

BO 5 sts, work as est until 4 sts rem, BO 4 sts = 47 (45, 47, 55, 65, 79, 79, 85) sts rem. The rnd begins and ends with a brioche knit.

Set sleeve aside and knit second sleeve the same way.

YOKE

With color 2, first work left side of back up to the armhole. Then knit sts of one sleeve onto the same needle. Continue over the front to the opposite armhole and knit second sleeve. Next, work the right part of back to beginning of rnd =252 (252, 270, 306, 342, 396, 414, 450) sts total.

NOTE The first st after the armhole will have the wrong color but will be worked in a brioche purl as usual.

Work 13 (15, 15, 13, 15, 15, 21, 21) brioche rnds.

Next Rnd (brioche knit with color 1), work in pattern as follows:

Rnd 1: *Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times, brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo*; rep * to * a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times.

Rnds 2-8: Work around in brioche. Don't forget to finish the 4-in-1 increases (3 yarnovers become 4 sts) when you work Rnd 2. Begin and end with color 2.

Rnd 9: *Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo, inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times*; rep * to * a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times.

Rnds 10-16: Work around in brioche. Don't forget to finish the 4-in-1 increases (3 yarnovers become 4 sts) when you work Rnd 10. Begin and end with color 2.

Rep Rnds 1-16 a total of 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) times. After that, work Rnds 1-8. Now begin decreasing.

Continue as follows:

Rnd 1: *Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo, inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers). Brk4tog, sl1yo*; rep * to * a total of 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times = 182 (182, 195, 221, 247, 286, 299, 325) sts rem.

Rnd 2: * [Sl1yo, brp] 4 times, [sl1yo, brp] 2 times in the 3 yarnovers, sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * 14 (14, 15, 17, 19, 22, 23, 25) times = 196 (196, 210, 238, 266, 308, 322, 350) sts rem.

Rnd 3: *Brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * around.

Rnd 4: *Sl1yo, brp*; rep * to * around.

Rnd 5: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 6: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 7: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 8: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 9:

Sizes XS, S, M: *Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), [brk, sl1yo] 3 times, brk4tog, sl1yo, brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * 14 (14, 15) times = 182 (182, 195) sts.

All other sizes: *Inc 4-in-1 (= 3 yarnovers), brk, sl1yo, sl1k2togpssso, sl1yo, brk4tog, sl1yo, brk, sl1yo*; rep * to * 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 187 (209, 242, 253, 275) sts.

Rnd 10:

Sizes XS, S, M: *[Sl1yo, brp] 2 times in yarnover, *[sl1yo, brp] 5 times*; rep * to * around.

All other sizes: *[Sl1yo, brp] 2 times in yarnover, *[sl1yo, brp] 4 times*; rep * to * around.

Rnd 11: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 12: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 13: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 14: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 15: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 16: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 17:

Sizes XS, S, M: *Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 4 times, sl1yo*; rep * to * 14 (14, 15) times = 140 (140, 150) sts.

All other sizes: *Brk4tog, [sl1yo, brk] 3 times, sl1yo*; rep * to * 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 136 (152, 176, 184, 200) sts.

Rnd 18: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 19: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 20: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 21: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 22: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 23: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 24: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 25: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 26: Work as for Rnd 4

Rnd 27:

Sizes XS, S, M: *[Brk, sl1yo] 2 times, brk4tog, sl1yo*; rep * to * 14 (14, 15) times = 84 (84, 90) sts.

All other sizes: Brk, sl1yo, brk4tog, sl1yo*; rep * to * 17 (19, 22, 23, 25) times = 68 (76, 88, 92, 100) sts.

Rnd 28: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 29: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 30: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 31:

Sizes XS, S, L: Continue to NECKBAND below.

All other sizes: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 32: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 33: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 34: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 35:

Sizes M and XL: Continue to NECKBAND below.

Other sizes: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 36: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 37:

Sizes 2XL and 3XL: Continue to NECKBAND below.

Size 4XL: Work as for Rnd 3.

Rnd 38: Work as for Rnd 4.

Rnd 39: Continue to NECKBAND below.

NECKBAND

You should now have 84 (84, 90, 68, 76, 88, 92, 100) sts rem.

Change to larger size circular and knit 1 rnd with color 1.

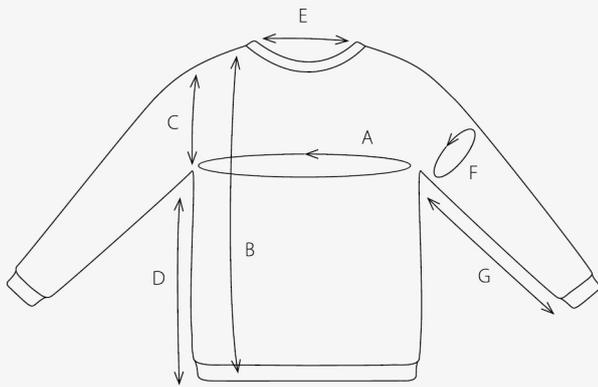
Next Rnd: Knit, decreasing 16 (16, 22, 0, 0, 16, 17, 20) sts evenly spaced around = 68 (68, 68, 68, 72, 72, 75, 80) sts rem.

Continue around in stockinette for a total of 10 rnds.

Fold band and sew sts directly from needle to WS so that the folded neckband will stay elastic.

FINISHING

Seam underarms and weave in all ends neatly on WS. Wash following instructions on ball band and lay sweater flat to dry. If you want a deeper neckline, you can pull it about an inch/a couple of centimeters higher on back neck while sweater is still wet.

This sweater is worked bottom up, with vines showing most visibly on a reverse stockinette background, and as a fine contrast to it, stockinette sleeves. The Colin yarn is a wonderful blend of cotton and linen, beautifully cool for summer's warm days.

YARN CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton, 35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Llama Silk (70% baby llama, 30% mulberry silk, 180 yd/165 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Soft Raggi (65% Premium Micro acrylic, 30% bamboo, 5% polyester, 293 yd/268 m / 100 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 23 sts x 32 rows in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES - WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

CHEST Approx. 34¼ (36¼, 38¼, 41¼, 44½, 48, 52½, 56) in / 87 (92, 97, 106, 113, 122, 133, 142) cm

TOTAL LENGTH Approx. 17¾ (18½, 19¼, 20, 21, 21¾, 22½, 23¼) in / 45 (47, 49, 51, 53, 55, 57, 59) cm

SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 17 (17, 17¼, 17¼, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 43 (43, 44, 44, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm

YARN COLOR AND AMOUNTS

Color 1: Approx. 300 (300, 350, 350, 400, 400, 450, 500) g (color 28108, Soft Lilac Grey)

Color 2: Approx. 50 (50, 50, 50, 50, 50, 50, 50) g (color 12217, Purple Violet)

NEEDLES U. S. size 1.5 / 2.5 mm: 24 in / 60 cm circular (ribbing and neckband); set of 5 dpn and U.S. 4 / 3.5 mm: circulars 16 in / 40 cm (sleeves) and 32 in / 80 cm (body); set of 5 dpn

NOTIONS 7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 8, 8, 8) buttons (5/8 in / 17 mm), removeable stitch markers, stitch holder

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY **

BODY

With smaller size circular, CO 179 (191, 203, 217, 233, 251, 271, 293) sts. Work back and forth in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 (2, 2¼, 2¼, 2 3/8, 2 3/8, 2½, 2½) in / 5 (5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5) cm.

Change to larger size circular. Work back and forth in reverse stockinette and vine pattern as follows: Work 13 sts following chart I, 153 (165, 177, 191, 207, 225, 245, 267) sts reverse stockinette, 13 sts following chart II. Continue in pattern as est until piece measures 10¼ (10¾, 11, 11½, 11¾, 12¼, 12¾, 13) in / 26 (27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33) cm. End with a RS row.

On the next, WS, row, shape armholes as follows: Work 39 (42, 45, 48, 52, 56, 60, 66) sts in pattern, BO the next 8 (8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 12, 12) sts, work 85 (91, 97, 105, 109, 119, 127, 137) sts, BO the next 8 (8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 12, 12) sts, work rem 39 (42, 45, 48, 52, 56, 60, 66) sts in pattern. Set piece aside while you knit the sleeves.

SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn, CO 48 (50, 50, 52, 52, 54, 54, 56) sts. Divide sts to 4 dpn and join. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 (2, 2¼, 2¼, 2 3/8, 2 3/8, 2½, 2½) in / 5 (5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6, 6.5, 6.5) cm.

Change to larger size dpn. Knit around in stockinette as follows: on rnd 1, increase 8 sts evenly spaced around to 56 (58, 58, 60, 60, 62, 62, 64) sts. On rnd 6, increase at beginning and end of rnd with M1: with left needle tip, lift strand between the 1st and 2nd sts from back to front and knit into back loop. When 2 sts rem, M1 as above, between 2nd-to-last and last sts, end k1. Increase the same way on every 6th rnd until 74 (78, 82, 86, 90, 94, 98, 102) sts. Continue without further shaping until sleeve is 17 (17, 17¼, 17¼, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾, 17¾) in / 43 (43, 44, 44, 45, 45, 45, 45) cm long.

On next rnd, shape armhole: BO the first and last 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6) sts. Set sleeve aside while you knit second sleeve the same way.

YOKE

Place all pieces onto larger size circular. Working in pattern as est, work right front, first sleeve, back, second sleeve, left front = 295 (315, 335, 357, 373, 399, 419, 449) sts total.

Work 6 (6, 8, 8, 10, 10, 12, 12) rows back and forth in pattern as est. On the next, RS, row, k2tog at each intersection of body and sleeve as follows: at shift from reverse stockinette to stockinette, join the 2 sts with k2tog and at shift from stockinette to reverse stockinette, join the 2 sts with k2tog tbl. Now 1 st rem at each raglan decrease line which should be purled on WS. Pm in each of the 4 raglan decrease sts.

On the next RS row, work raglan line as follow: knit until 1 st before marked st, slip st before marker to right needle without knitting it, slip marked st from needle and let it hang loosely in front of work, slip st after marked st to right needle without knitting it, place marked st back on left needle, slip the 2 sts from right to left needle and k3tog (= 2 sts decreased).

Decrease the same way at each of the 4 marked raglan sts. On WS rows, purl marked sts. Work 3 rows without decreasing but following pattern as est. Rep decrease on next RS row and then on every other row 21 (22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28) times = 107 (119, 131, 145, 153, 171, 183, 205) sts rem.

RAISING BACK NECK

Continue in pattern as est with reverse stockinette and stockinette, **but** without the vine pattern on the front. Decrease at marked sts on right front and back; on left sleeve, stop 8 sts before the marked st on left front.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back of work and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it, work in reverse stockinette and stockinette to right side of work, stop 8 sts before marked st on right front.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back of work and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it, work in pattern with raglan decreases on back; stop on left sleeve when 4 sts after marked st on left side of back.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it, work in pattern of reverse stockinette and stockinette to right side of work, stop on right sleeve when 4 sts after marked st on right side of back.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it, work in pattern without raglan decreases to right side of back, stop on back when 4 sts before marked st on left side of back.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it, knit to right side, stop on back when 4 sts before marked st on right side of back.

Sl 1 st purlwise with yarn in front, take yarn to back and turn. Sl the unworked st with yarn wrapped around it from left to right needle without working it.

Now work in pattern of reverse stockinette and stockinette over all sts to left front edge but **without** the vine pattern on left front and **without** raglan decreases on back but **with** raglan decreases on left front. *At the same time*, the unworked turning sts are each joined with their wrap which is lifted onto the needle.

Change to smaller size circular. Continuing from left side of body, work neckband in k1, p1 ribbing across to right front - don't forget to knit/purl any wrapped sts with their wrap. Also *at the same time*, decrease evenly spaced across 0 (0, 4, 6, 8, 16, 16, 20) sts to 107 (119, 127, 139, 145, 155, 167, 185) sts for a multiple of 2 sts + 1 for the ribbing. Work 9 more rows in ribbing (all sizes). On the next RS row, BO in ribbing until 1 st rem. Continue directly to picking up sts for left front band.

Pick up and knit a total of 107 (113, 119, 125, 131, 137, 145, 151) sts along left front edge, or about 3 sts for every 4 rows. Work 9 rows in k1, p1 ribbing. BO in ribbing.

RIGHT FRONT BAND (including buttonholes)

With smaller size circular, pick up and knit 107 (113, 119, 125, 131, 137, 145, 151) sts along right front edge, or about 3 sts for every 4 rows. Work 3 rows in k1, p1 ribbing.

On row 4, make buttonholes as follows: Work 5 sts in ribbing (all sizes, *BO 1 st, work so there are 15 (16, 17, 18, 16, 17, 18, 19) sts after the bound-off st*; rep * to * 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7) times, BO 1 st and then work rem 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 4, 5, 4) sts in ribbing.

On the next row, work as follows: Work 5 (5, 5, 5, 6, 5, 6, 5) sts in ribbing, *yo, work 15 (16, 17, 18, 16, 17, 18, 19) sts in ribbing*; rep * to * 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7) times, yo and work rem 5 sts in ribbing. Work 4 more rows in ribbing. On next RS row, BO in ribbing.

FINISHING

Seam underarms. Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Carefully wash sweater by hand or in machine on wool setting. Lay flat to dry. Sew buttons onto left front band aligned with buttonholes.

MEASUREMENTS

A 34¼ (36¼, 38¼, 41¾, 44½, 48, 52½, 56) 49¼, 53, 61½) in / 87 (92, 97, 106, 113, 122, 133, 142) cm

B 17¾ (18½, 19¼, 20, 21, 21¾, 22½, 23¼) in / 45 (47, 49, 51, 53, 55, 57, 59) cm

C 7½ (8, 8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾, 10¼) in / 19 (20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26) cm

An easy and cool summer top knitted in 100% linen for those warm summer days. The model is worked from the bottom up in stockinette and finished with a decorative yoke pattern with thin garter-stitch stripes that lie prettily over the shoulders.

YARN CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Järbo Lin (100% linen, 219 yd/200 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton, 35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

Approx. 23 sts x 31 rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

NEEDLES U. S. size 2.5 / 3 mm: 24 in / 60 cm + set of 5 dpn and U. S. size 4 / 3.5 mm: 24 or 32 in / 60 or 80 cm circular

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY **

BODY

With smaller size circular, using long-tail cast-on, CO 200 (214, 228, 242, 264, 286, 308, 324) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 1¾ (1¾, 2, 2, 2¼, 2¼ 2½, 2½) in / 4.5 (4.5, 5, 5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. Pm for side seam halfway around from beginning of rnd. Work in stockinette until body measures 13 (13½, 13¾, 14¼, 14½, 15, 15½, 15¾) in / 33 (34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40) cm.

On the next rnd, shape armhole at each side: BO 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6) sts on each side of each marker. Set body aside while you knit sleeves.

SLEEVES

With smaller size dpn, using long-tail cast-on, CO 76 (80, 84, 88, 92, 96, 100, 104) sts, divide sts onto 4 dpn; join. Work around in k1 p1 ribbing for 1¾ (1¾, 2, 2, 2¼, 2¼ 2½, 2½) in / 4.5 (4.5, 5, 5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6) cm.

Change to larger size circular and stockinette. And, *at the same time*, on the 1st rnd, increase 6 sts evenly spaced around (all sizes) = 82 (86, 90, 94, 98, 102, 106, 110) sts, Knit another 2 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6) rnds in stockinette.

On the next rnd, shape underarm: BO the first and last 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6) sts of rnd.

Cut yarn and set sleeve aside while you make the second sleeve the same way.

YOKE

Place the body and sleeves on larger size circular as follows: working around in stockinette, knit one sleeve, then the front, the second sleeve, and, finally, the back = 340 (362, 376, 398, 420, 450, 472, 496) sts total. Pm for beginning of rnd. Knit 4 (5, 6, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8) more rnds. On the next rnd, increase 40 (42, 36, 38, 40, 50, 52, 56) sts evenly space around = 300 (320, 340, 360, 380, 400, 420, 440) sts.

Now begin working garter stripes against a stockinette background as follows: *Purl 1 rnd, knit 2 rnds*; rep these 3 rnds (* to *) up to the neckline, *at the same time*, decreasing to shape yoke (see below), **NOTE** All the decreases on the yoke are made on the last of the three rnds.

On Rnd 6 (all sizes): Decrease as follows: *K18, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 285 (304, 323, 342, 361, 380, 399, 418) sts rem.

On Rnd 12 (all sizes): Decrease as follows: *K17, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 270 (288, 306, 324, 342, 360, 378, 396) sts rem.

On Rnd 15 (18, 18, 18, 18, 18, 18, 18): Decrease as follows: *K16, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 255 (272, 289, 306, 323, 340, 357, 374) sts rem.

On Rnd 18 (21, 24, 24, 24, 24, 24, 24): Decrease as follows: *K15, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 240 (256, 272, 288, 304, 320, 336, 352) sts rem.

On Rnd 21 (24, 27, 30, 30, 30, 30, 30): Decrease as follows: *K14, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 225 (240, 255, 270, 285, 300, 315, 330) sts rem.

On Rnd 24 (27, 30, 33, 36, 36, 36, 36): Decrease as follows: *K13, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 210 (224, 238, 252, 266, 280, 294, 308) sts rem.

On Rnd 27 (30, 33, 36, 39, 42, 42, 42): Decrease as follows: *K12, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 195 (208, 221, 234, 247, 260, 273, 286) sts rem.

On Rnd 30 (33, 36, 39, 42, 45, 45, 45): Decrease as follows: *K11, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 180 (192, 204, 216, 228, 240, 252, 264) sts rem.

On Rnd 33 (36, 39, 42, 45, 48, 51, 51): Decrease as follows: *K10, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 165 (176, 187, 198, 209, 220, 231, 242) sts rem.

On Rnd 36 (39, 42, 45, 48, 51, 54, 57): Decrease as follows: *K9, k2tog*; rep * to * around = 15 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22) sts decreased = 150 (160, 170, 180, 190, 200, 210, 220) sts rem.

All sizes: Decrease 3 more times on every 3rd rnd with 1 st less between decreases each time = 45 (48, 51, 54, 57, 60, 63, 66) sts decreased = 105 (112, 119, 126, 133, 140, 147, 154) sts rem.

NECKBAND

Change to smaller size circular and work around in k1, p1 ribbing – **NOTE** on sizes XS (M, XL, 3XL) increase 1 st to 106 (120, 134, 148) sts. Continue in ribbing until neckband measures $\frac{3}{4}$ ($\frac{3}{4}$, 1, 1, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$) in / 2 (2, 2.5, 2.5, 3, 3, 3.5, 3.5) cm. BO in ribbing.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Seam underarms with mattress st.

Wash top carefully in machine set to wool program. Lay flat to dry.

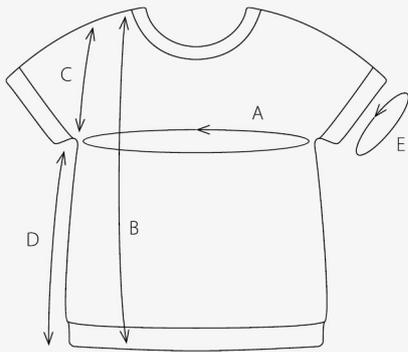

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY **

BODY

With U. S. 2.5 / 3 mm circular, CO 168 (192, 216, 240, 264, 288) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2 (2, 2¼, 2¼, 2½, 2½) in / 5 (5, 5.5, 5.5, 6, 6) cm. Change to U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm circular. Turn piece inside out so the purl side of bottom edge of the ribbing faces out. To avoid a hole at the turn: slip the outermost st from right to left needle, wrap yarn around st, and slip st back to right needle. Now work in stockinette with vertical stripes of purl sts as follows: K1, *p1, k3*; rep * to * until 2 sts rem, k2. Mark the last of the rnd and st 84 (96, 108, 120, 132, 144) for the side sts.

Continue as est for a total of 22 (24, 26, 28, 30, 32) rnds above ribbing.

Continue in stockinette with lines of purl sts, but, now as follows: K5, *p1, k11*; rep from * to * until 7 sts rem, p1, k6. Continue as est until body measures 11½ (11¼, 12¼, 12¾, 13, 13½) in / 29 (30, 31, 32, 33, 34) cm. Now work around in stockinette (knit all sts) until body measures 13½ (13¾, 14¼, 14½, 15, 15½) in / 34 (35, 36, 37, 38, 39) cm, but, *on last rnd*, stop 6 (7, 8, 8, 9, 9) sts before end of rnd.

Now shape armholes: BO 13 (15, 17, 17, 19, 19) sts centered at each side for underarms = BO the last 6 (7, 8, 8, 9, 9) sts at end of rnd as well as the 7 (8, 9, 9, 10, 10) sts at beginning of rnd; knit until 6 (7, 8, 8, 9, 9) sts rem before side marker, BO 13 (15, 17, 17, 19, 19) sts, knit to end of rnd.

From this point on, work back and forth separately on front and back, with 71 (81, 91, 103, 113, 125) sts for each.

BACK

Begin with purling a WS row. On next, RS, row, shape armholes as follows: K2, sl 1, k1, pssso, knit until 4 sts rem, k2tog, k2. Rep the decreases on every other row a total of 5 times (all sizes). Work without further decreasing until piece measures 21¼ (22½, 23¼, 24, 24¾, 24½) in / 55 (57, 59, 61, 63, 65) cm. On next row, BO the center 29 (37, 45, 55, 63, 73) sts for back neck and work each side separately. BO another 1 st at neck edge. Continue in stockinette until piece measures 22¾ (23¾, 24½, 25¼, 26, 26¾) in / 58 (60, 62, 64, 66, 68) cm. BO rem st. Work the other side to correspond.

FRONT

Work as for back until piece measures 18¼ (18½, 19, 19¼, 19¾, 20) in / 46 (47, 48, 49, 50, 51) cm. On next row, BO the center 9 (17, 25, 35, 43, 53) sts for neck and work each side separately. At neck edge, on every other row, BO 4-3-2-1-1 sts (all sizes).

Continue in stockinette until front is same length as back. BO rem sts. Work the other side to correspond.

FINISHING

Turn work so the reverse stockinette side faces out. Seam shoulders.

NECKBAND

With circular U. S. 1.5 / 2.5 mm, beginning at one shoulder, pick up and knit 148 (154, 160, 168, 178, 190) sts around neck. Pick up approx. 1 st in each st and 3 sts for every 4 rows. Knit 5 rnds, purl 1 rnd (= foldline), knit 5 rnds. BO rather loosely.

ARMHOLE BANDS

With circular U. S. 1.5 / 2.5 mm, beginning center of underarm, pick up and knit 120 (126, 132, 140, 148, 158) sts around neck. Pick up approx. 1 st in each st and 3 sts for every 4 rows. Knit 5 rnds, purl 1 rnd (= foldline), knit 5 rnds. BO rather loosely.

Turn neck/armhole bands at foldline and sew bound-off edges to WS.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Wash skirt gently in machine set on wool program. Lay flat to dry.

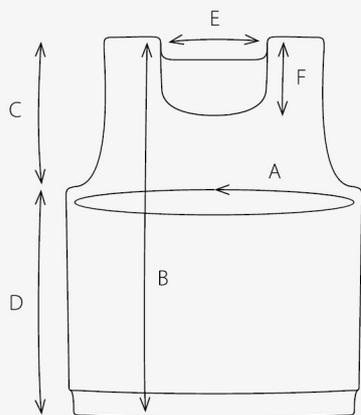

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY *

SKIRT

With U. S. 4 / 3.5 mm circular, CO 312 (336, 360, 384, 408, 432, 456, 480) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Knit 4 rnds and then purl 1 rnd (= foldline), knit 4 rnds (all sizes). On the next rnd, fold the edge down and join live sts to cast-on row: *k2tog joining a live st with corresponding cast-on st below; rep from * all around.

Turn work. To avoid a hole at the turn: sl the outermost st from right to left needle, wrap yarn around st and slip st back to right needle. From this point on, work around in stockinette on WS (= knit around on WS) until piece measures 6 (6¾, 7½, 8¼, 8¾, 9, 9½, 9¾) in / 15 (17, 19, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25) cm.

Now begin working purls against a stockinette background as follows: *P1, k11*; rep from * to * around. Continue as est until skirt measures 13 (13¾, 14½, 15½, 15¾, 16¼, 16½, 17) in / 33 (35, 37, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43) cm.

On the next rnd, add more purl sts as follows: *P1, k3*; rep * to * around. Continue with knit over knit and purl over purl until piece measures 16¼ (17, 17¾, 18½, 19, 19¼, 19¾, 20) in / 41 (43, 45, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51) cm.

Next Rnd: Decrease as follows: *P1, k3tog*; rep * to * around = 156 (168, 180, 192, 204, 216, 228, 240) sts rem.

Change to U. S. 2.5 / 3 mm circular. Work knit over knit and purl over purl (= p1, k1) until piece measures 19 (19¾, 20½, 21¼, 21¾, 22, 22½, 22¾) in / 48 (50, 52, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58) cm. Turn work with reverse stockinette facing out.

To avoid a hole at the turn: sl the outermost st from right to left needle, wrap yarn around st and slip st back to right needle.

Change to U. S. 1.5 / 2.5 mm circular. Knit 15 rnds for waistband, purl 1 rnd (= foldline) and then knit 15 more rnds (all sizes). BO.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends on stockinette side of skirt. Cut waistband elastic to fit waist + a seam allowance. Seam short ends of band. Hold elastic at waistband. Fold waistband to inside so it covers elastic and join bind-off rnd to first stockinette rnd of waistband.

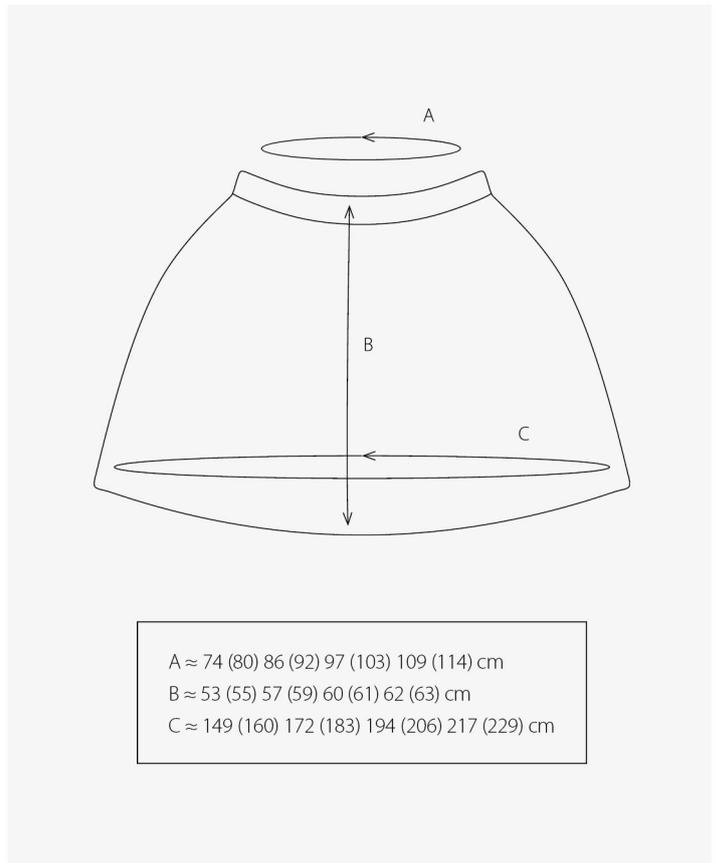
Wash skirt gently in machine set on wool program. Lay flat to dry.

Tips & Shortcuts

To avoid questions: Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

Stitch count: Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

Highlight the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

Charts: It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

Ease: The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

Two-color stranded knitting: When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

Yarn alternative: Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

Tips for hand dyed yarn: Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.

CYCA #2 (sport), Alpaca Solo (100% alpaca, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton, 35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

CYCA #1 (fingering), Junior (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 183 yd/167 m / 50 g)

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

Stockinette in the round: Knit on every round.

RIGHT HALF-GLOVE

With color 1: CO 48 sts. Divide sts evenly onto 4 dpn and join. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 20 rnds.

Knit 2 rnds.

Work in pattern following chart A (sts 1-16, rep 3 times per rnd) and chart rows 1-19.

With color 1: Knit 2 rnds.

Set-up for thumb:

K24; with a strand of smooth, contrast color waste yarn, k8; slip the 8 sts back to left needle and knit again with color 1, knit to end of rnd.

Work 20 rnds in k1, p1 ribbing.

THUMB

Insert one dpn into sts below waste yarn and a second needle into sts above waste yarn. Carefully remove waste yarn.

With color 1: Divide the 16 sts onto 4 dpn and knit 1 rnd, *at the same time*, picking up and knitting 2 new sts after the first 8 sts and 2 more new sts after the next 8 sts = 20 sts total. Work 10 rnds in k1, p1 ribbing.

BO in ribbing. Cut yarn and weave in all ends neatly on WS.

LEFT HALF-GLOVE

Work as for right half-glove, but use chart B instead of A. Insert waste yarn for thumbhole on last 8 sts of rnd (= sts 41-48) instead of right glove's sts 25-32.

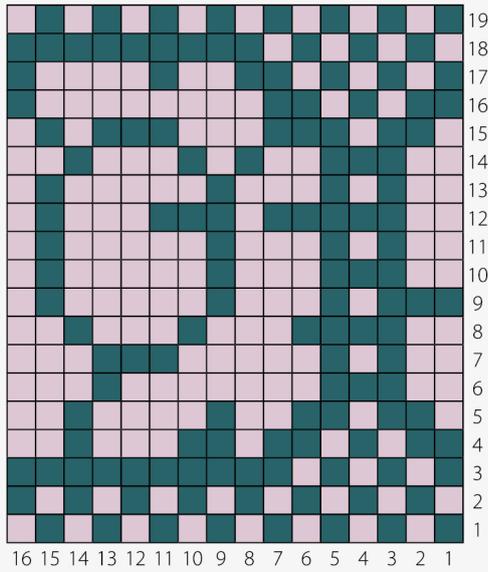
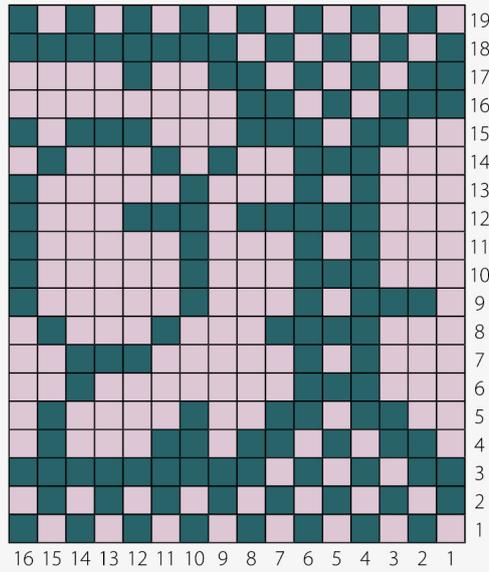
BO in ribbing. Cut yarn and weave in all ends neatly on WS.

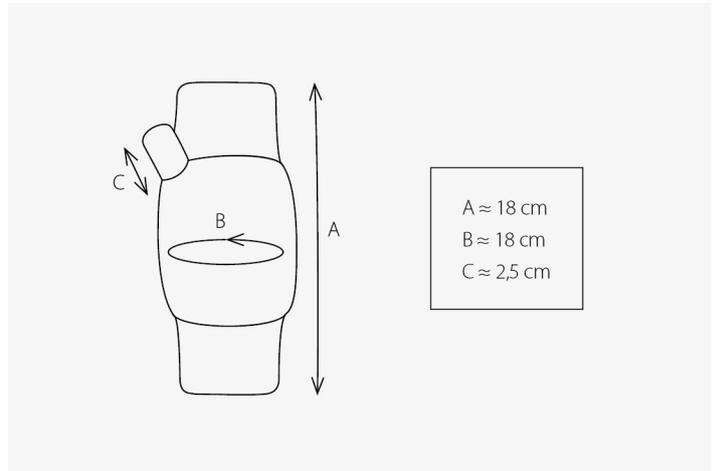

Rosenmalva (rose mallow) - crocheted summer top

An airy, easy-to-wear V-neck top with the crisp feel, shining luster, and flowing drape that only linen can give. The model is worked with chain stitches, single and double crochet in a simple pattern that provides just enough structure to bring out linen's characteristics and let the yarn's quality speak for itself. The top is crocheted from the bottom up in two pieces and crocheted together at the shoulders and sides.

YARN CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Järbo Lin (100% linen, 219 yd/200 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #1 (fingering), Colin (65% cotton, 35% linen, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

CYCA #2 (sport), Elise (60% cotton, 40% acrylic, 184 yd/170 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 18 sc x 22 rows with hook U. S. E-4 / 3.5 mm = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

/ Approx. 17 dc (8.5 V-sts) x 10 rows with hook U. S. E-4 / 3.5 mm = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm

Adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY *

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

To bring out the fine drape and silky feel of linen, it is important to hand wash and dry the garment flat before wearing it. At first, linen might feel unfamiliar and a little tricky to crochet with. You'll need a bit of patience and practice before the work goes smoothly. You might need to try several crochet hooks or hold the hook a new way. In compensation, the pattern only uses simple stitches and you'll have a classic and useful result which is well worth any trouble!

Rows with V-stitches begin with 2 chain stitches to substitute for (and count as) 1 double crochet. To make it easier, place a marker in the second of the two chain stitches so you can see where the last stitch on the next row should be placed. Be careful not to work the chain stitches too tightly because that will draw the sides in.

NOTE U. S. crochet terms are used throughout pattern.

Chain stitch (ch st): Make a slip knot to begin and bring the yarn through the loop. *Yarn around hook and through loop on hook. Rep from *.

Slip stitch (sl st): Insert hook into a st of previous row/rnd, yarn around hook and through st and loop on hook.

Single crochet (sc; = British double crochet): Insert hook into a st of previous row/rnd, yarn around hook and bring yarn through (= 2 loops on hook). Yarn around hook and through the 2 loops on hook.

Double crochet (dc; = British treble crochet): Yarn around hook, insert hook into a st of previous row/rnd, yarn around hook, and bring yarn through (= 3 loops on hook). Yarn around hook and through first 2 loops on hook. Yarn around hook and through rem 2 loops on hook.

V-stitch/V-stitches (V-st): Work 2 dc into same stitch.

Tc: Turning chain = the chain sts at beginning of a new row.

FRONT

Lower edge in single crochet:

Ch 74 (82, 90, 98, 106, 118, 130, 138).

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each of the following ch; turn = 73 (81, 89, 97, 105, 117, 129, 137) sc.

Rows 2-7: Ch 1 (do not count s st), work 1 sc in each st across; turn = 73 (81, 89, 97, 105, 117, 129, 137) sc.

The rest of the top is worked in V-stitches:

Row 1: Ch 2 (= 1st dc), skip next st, *2 dc in next st (= 1 V), skip next st*; rep * to * across, dc in last st (= in top of turning ch 2); turn: = 35 (39, 43, 47, 51, 57, 63, 67) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Rows 2-30 (30, 33, 34, 38, 41, 46, 48): Ch 2 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * across, ending with 1 dc in last st (= in top of turning ch 2); turn = 35 (39, 43, 47, 51, 57, 63, 67) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Pm in V-st at center of row 30 (30, 33, 34, 38, 41, 46, 48). Do not cut yarn but proceed to next steps below.

Neck Shaping – left side:

Left, Row 1: Ch 2 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * marker at center of front, dc in marked st; turn = 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 28, 31, 33) V-sts + 1 dc at each side. Leave maker in place.

Left, Row 2: Sl st to first V-st, ch 3 (= 1st dc), dc in same V-st (ch 3 + dc = first V-st of row), *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * across, 1 dc in top of tc; turn = 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 28, 31, 33) V-sts + 1 dc at one side.

Left, Row 3: Ch 2 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * last V-st (= ch 3 + 1 dc), dc in last V-st; turn = 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 27, 30, 32) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Left, Row 4: Work as for Row 2 = 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 27, 30, 32) V-sts + 1 dc at one side.

Repeat Left Rows 3-4 7 more times (= a total of 18 decrease rows for all sizes) = 9 (11, 13, 15, 17, 20, 23, 25) V-sts + 1 dc at each side. Cut yarn and fasten off.

Neck Shaping – right side:

Right, Row 1: Beginning at center of front at marked st, attach yarn and ch 3 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * across, dc in last st (= top of tc) = 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 28, 31, 33) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Right, Row 2: Ch 2 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * last V-st, turn (= 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 28, 31, 33) V-sts + 1 dc at one side.

Right, Row 3: Sl st to space in center of first V-st, ch 3 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * across, 1 dc in top of tc; turn = 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 27, 30, 32) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Right, Row 4: Work as for Row 2 = 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 27, 30, 32) V-sts + 1 dc at one side.

Repeat Right Rows 3-4 7 more times. (= a total of 18 decrease rows for all sizes) = 9 (11, 13, 15, 17, 20, 23, 25) V-sts + 1 dc at each side. Cut yarn and fasten off.

BACK

Lower edge in single crochet:

Ch 74 (82, 90, 98, 106, 118, 130, 138).

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each of the following ch; turn = 73 (81, 89, 97, 105, 117, 129, 137) sc.

Rows 2-15: Ch 1 (do not count as st), work 1 sc in each st across; turn = 73 (81, 89, 97, 105, 117, 129, 137) sc.

The rest of the top is worked in V-stitches:

Row 1: Ch 2 (= 1st dc), skip next st, *2 dc in next st (= 1 V), skip next st*; rep * to * across, dc in last st (= in top of tc); turn: = 35 (39, 43, 47, 51, 57, 63, 67) V-sts + 1 dc at each side.

Rows 2-47 (47, 50, 51, 55, 58, 63 65): Ch 2 (= 1st dc), 2 dc in space between the 2 dc of next V-st, *V-st in V-st*; rep * to * across, ending with 1 dc in last st (= in top of tc); turn = 35 (39, 43, 47, 51, 57, 63, 67) V-sts + 1 dc at each side. Cut yarn and fasten off.

FINISHING

Crochet shoulders together:

Now it's time to join the front and back by crocheting the shoulders together. Lay the front and back in front of you, with both pieces right side facing up, so that the shoulders of the front (**1 in sketch**) meet the shoulders of back (**2 in sketch**). Place the front with the neck up/facing away from you and the back upside down with the shoulder down /facing you (**see sketch**).

Beginning in the outermost dc in top corner of front (**see arrow on sketch**), insert hook, bring yarn through and ch 1 (do not count as a stitch), 1 sc, ch 2, 1 sc in opposite dc in top corner of back, ch 2, 1 sc in first V-st on front, ch 2, 1 sc in first V-st on back *ch 2, 1 sc in next V-st on front, ch 2, 1 sc in corresponding V-st of back*; rep * to * in towards front neck until you have worked sc in all the V-sts on top of front. Cut yarn and fasten off.

Repeat for right shoulder but turn the piece 180° so you can begin in the outermost dc of corner on **back** instead and work in towards front neck.

Crochet sides together:

Right side: Arrange front and back with right sides facing out. Beginning on 4th V-st row from bottom edge of back, insert hook around dc furthest out on edge on this row, bring yarn through and ch 1 (does not count as a st), 1 sc, ch 2, 1 sc around corresponding dc on front (in other words, the edge dc on 4th V-st row on front).

Ch 2, 1 sc around edge dc in 5th V-st row of back, ch 2, 1 sc around corresponding dc of front; rep * to * through V-st row 30 (29, 31, 31, 33, 34, 38, 39) from bottom edge, in both front and back, or until you have a long enough armhole. Cut yarn and fasten off.

Left side: Work as for right side but begin in 4th V-st row of front.

SLEEVES

Beginning at center of underarm, work 7 rows sc around armhole. End each row with a sl st into 1st sc and turn after each row so the edging will have the same look as on lower edge of top. Each row begins with ch 1 (do not count as a stitch). Alternately work 1 sc and 2 sc along side of the V-st rows. At both shoulder seam and at center of underarm, work 4 sc = 59 (62, 65, 68, 74, 80, 83, 86) sc around sleeve. Cut yarn and fasten off. Work both sleeves the same way.

NECK EDGING

Work sc around neckline. With RS facing you, insert hook between the dc of a V-st on back neck, bring yarn through and ch 1 (do not count as a stitch), work 2 sc in each V-st along back neck, work 4 sc in each shoulder seam, alternate 2 then 3 sc per row along V-neck, end row with a sl st into 1st sc. An exact stitch count is not important – just make sure that the edging looks nice. Cut yarn and fasten off.

SPLIT HEM EDGING

Your top will look especially nice if you work a row of sc all along the lower edge of the top, including the split hem. Begin at a corner of lower edge of back. Work sc in each st on lower edge of back and front. When rounding a corner, work 3 sc in the corner. On the split hem, work about 1 sc on the side of each row of sc and 2 sc on the side of each V-st row. End with a sl st into 1st sc. An exact stitch count is not important – just make sure that the edging looks nice. If the edging draws in, you need more sts; the edge will be wavy if you have too many sts. Cut yarn and fasten off.

Hand wash top and lay flat to dry.

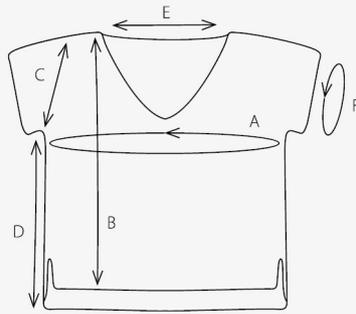
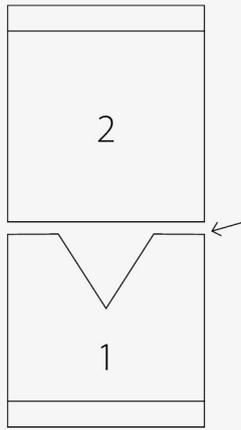

Tips & Shortcuts

To avoid questions: Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

Stitch count: Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

Highlight the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

Charts: It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

Ease: The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

Two-color stranded knitting: When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

Yarn alternative: Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

Tips for hand dyed yarn: Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
