## Dear knitters!

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### **Abbreviations:**

*mc – magic circle*

*sc – single crochet;*

*dc – double crochet;*

*tc- treble crochet;*

*2 dc inc - (2 dc into the next stitch);*

*2 tc inc – (2 tc into the next stitch);*

*BL – back loop;*

*inc – increase (2 sc in the next stitch);*

*3 sc inc (3sc into the next stitch);*

*dec- decrease (single crochet 2 stitches together);*

*ch – chain stitch;*

*sl st – slip stitch.*

## *Tools and yarn*

### *Yarn:*

*1) Yarn Art Jeans (1.8oz/174yds or 50g/160m) or Alize Cotton Gold (3.5oz/360yds or 100g/330m)*



*Main colour - №07  
A head and paws - №03  
Eyelashes, eyebrows - №53  
Trousers, a collar - №83  
A mouth - №70  
Additional colours for a cap and the trousers  
- №01 and №74*



*Main colour - №71  
A head and paws - №03

1. Crochet hook size 2 mm = US1 (UK1).
2. A needle for sewing the parts of the toy (it is better to take the needle with a blunt tip).
3. A long needle for tightening the muzzle (I take a needle that is used for stitching documents).
4. 12 mm safety eyes.
5. Fiberfill.
6. Scissors.
7. Buttons.

If you follow all the instructions precisely and use the recommended tools and yarn, you'll get a toy of 23 cm (9 inches) height.



## *Head*

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Row 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

Row 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

Row 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

Row 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)

Row 9: 48 sc

Row 10: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)

Row 11: 54 sc

Row 12: (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

Rows 13 – 23: 60 sc – 11 rows

Insert the safety eyes between Rows 17 and 18 of the head at the distance of 11 sc from each other.



Row 24: (8 sc, dec) x 6 (54)

Row 25: (7 sc, dec) x 6 (48)

Row 26: (6 sc, dec) x 6 (42)

Row 27: (5 sc, dec) x 6 (36)

Start stuffing the head with fiberfill.

Row 28: (4 sc, dec) x 6 (30)

Row 29: (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)

Row 30: (6 sc, dec) x 3, sl st (21)

Cut the thread, hide the end.



### *The lower paws (legs)*

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Rows 5 – 7: 24 sc

Row 8: 6 sc, 6 dec, 6 sc (18)

Row 9: 5 sc, 4 dec, 5 sc (14), switch to the body colour

Row 10: 6 sc, 1 dec, 6 sc (13)


Stuff the lower part of the leg tight.

Rows 11 – 26: 13 sc (16 rows)

Stuff the leg up to Row 20, do not stuff it further. Work additionally 4 sc, fold the paw into two halves and work 6 sc through the both sides. Cut the thread, hide the end into the paw. We are going to crochet the paws into the body.



*Colour change*

### ***The upper paws (the arms)***

#### *The first paw*

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Rows 3 – 5: 12 sc

Row 6: dc4tog (a finger), 11 sc

Row 7: (4 sc, dec) x 2 (10)

Work additionally 5 sc (so that the place of colour change is at the back), switch to body colour. Here is the beginning of a new row. Stuff the lower part of the paw tight up to Row 8, do not stuff it further.

Rows 8 – 17: 10 sc (10 rows)

Work additionally 2 sc, fold the paw into two halves and work 5 sc through the both sides. Cut the thread, hide the end.

### *The second paw*

Work Rows 1-6 in the same manner as for the first paw.

Row 7: (4 sc, dec) x 2 (10)

Work additionally 9 sc (so that the place of colour change is at the back), switch to body colour. Here is the beginning of a new row. Stuff the lower part of the paw tight up to Row 8, do not stuff it further.

Rows 8 – 17: 10 sc (10 rows)

Work additionally 2 sc, fold the paw into two halves and work 5 sc through the both sides. Cut the thread, hide the end. We are going to crochet the paws into the body. Thus, you should have two paws. The fingers on the paws should be on the opposite sides. The place of colour change should be at the back of the piece.



### *Tail*

Start with milky colour

Row 1: 8 sc in mc

Rows 2 – 5: 8 sc (4 rows), switch to body colour

Rows 6 – 17: 8 sc (12 rows)

Do not stuff the tail, cut the thread leaving a long end for sewing.



### *Muzzle*

Row 1: Cast on 7 ch, then start working it around.

Row 2: Start with the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch from the hook: 1 inc, 4 sc, 3 sc inc, 5 sc (14)

Row 3: 2 inc, 4 sc, 3 inc, 4 sc, inc (20)

Row 4: (1 sc, inc) x 2, 4 sc, (1 sc, inc) x 3, 5 sc, inc (26)

Row 5: (2 sc, inc) x 2, 4 sc, (2 sc, inc) x 3, 6 sc, inc (32)

Row 6: 32 sc, sl st

Cut the thread leaving a long end for sewing.

### *Ears*

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Row 5: 24 sc

Row 6: (2 sc, dec) x 6 (18)

Fold the piece into two halves and work 8-9 sc through the both sides. Cut the thread leaving a long end for sewing.



### *Body*

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Row 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

Row 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

Row 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

Row 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)

Row 9: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)

Row 10: (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

Row 11: Start crocheting the lower paws into the body in this row (check the photo):

11 sc, 6 sc together with the first paw, 26 sc, 6 sc together with the second paw, 11 sc.

The back of the toy is where there are 26 sc between the paws.



Rows 12 – 14: 60 sc

Row 15: (8 sc, dec) x 6 (54)

Rows 16 – 17: 54 sc

Row 18: (16 sc, dec) x 3 (51)

Row 19: 8 sc, dec, (15 sc, dec) x 2, 7 sc (48)

Row 20: (14 sc, dec) x 3 (45)

Row 21: 7 sc, dec (13 sc, dec) x 2, 6 sc (42)

Row 22: (12 sc, dec) x 3 (39)

Start stuffing the body.

Row 23: 6 sc, dec, (11 sc, dec) x 2, 5 sc (36)

Row 24: (10 sc, dec) x 3 (33)

Row 25: 5 sc, dec, (9 sc, dec) x 2, 4 sc (30)

Row 26: (8 sc, dec) x 3 (27)

Row 27: 4 sc, dec, (7 sc, dec) x 2, 3 sc (24)

Row 28: Start crocheting the arms into the body in this row: 7 sc, 5 sc together with the first arm, 7 sc, 5 sc together with the second arm. Place the arms so that the fingers don't look at the body.



Row 29: (6 sc, dec) x 3 (21)

Row 30: 21 sc, sl st. Cut the thread, hide the end.

## *How to assemble the toy*

1. Sew the head to the body (watch the video - [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WhQZAMjIZgw&ab\\_channel=HappinessbyKris](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WhQZAMjIZgw&ab_channel=HappinessbyKris))

Explanation: Take a long thread of the head colour and tie a big knot on its end. Find the center of the body. Insert the needle into the center of the body and match it with the center of the neck. Start sewing them together stitch into stitch. Stuff the area of the neck tight in the process of sewing the head to the body.



2. Tightening of the eyes (watch the video) -

**Important!** If in the process of tightening the thread runs into the eye (into the sequined patch), it means that you haven't fastened the washer from the inside well enough. There should be no space between the eye and the washer - only in this case the tightening thread will not run into the eye.



3. *Work the hood.* We start working it only now, because it is important that we should try it on the toy in the process of making.

Row 1: 6 sc in mc (6)

Row 2: 6 inc (12)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 6 (18)

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)

Row 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)

Row 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)

Row 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)

Row 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)

Row 9: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)

Row 10: (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)

Rows 11 – 18: 60 sc (8 rows)




***Important!*** The crochet tension and the stuffing thickness can differ, so it is necessary to try the piece on the toy at this stage.

Put it on the head so that there is about 1 cm (0.4 in) distance between the hood and the body. The hood edge at the front should be placed at the level of Rows 6-7 of the head. If this is what you have, keep on working further according to the description.

If the hood edge is placed higher than the level of Rows 6-7 of the head, work some more rows with 60 sc (as many as you need).

If the hood edge is placed lower than the level of Rows 6-7 of the head, undo a row (or some rows).



Row 19: Start shaping the bridge:

26 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, (dc inc) x 2, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 26 sc (62)

Row 20: 28 sc, 2 dc, (tc inc) x 2, 2 dc, 28 sc (64)


Row 21: 30 sc, 1 dc, (tc inc) x 2, 1 dc, 30 sc (68)



Cut the thread leaving a long end for sewing the hood to the head. **Watch the video** – how to sew the hood to the head:

**Expansion:** Put on the hood on the head so that the back part of it touches the body. At the front the bridge of the nose should be finished at the level of Rows 13-14 of the head. The bridge should be right at the center between the eyes. For your convenience fasten the bridge to the head with a pin or a needle so that it won't shift in the process of sewing.



4. Sew the muzzle between Rows 17 - 25 of the head  
(watch the video - [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LMA9Sk2Vcy0&ab\\_channel=HappinessbyKris](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LMA9Sk2Vcy0&ab_channel=HappinessbyKris))

Stuff the muzzle tight in the process of sewing.



5. Embroider the eyelids with the thread of head colour. (Watch the video - <https://www.youtube.com/shorts/18biinupvAU>)



6. Embroider the eyelashes and the eyebrows (at the level of Row 13 of the head). (For doing it, I separate the thread of Yarn art jeans yarn into strands and use only one of them).



7. *Decorate the bottoms of the eyes (I make 1 stitch of body colour).*



8. *Tighten the muzzle (watch the video - <https://www.youtube.com/shorts/s5FM9Qwabk4>)*



*9. Embroider the nostrils.*

Make 5-6 stitches with the thread of head colour between the last and one before the last Rows of the muzzle.

*10. Embroider the mouth (as it is shown on the photo).*



*11. Sew the ears.*

Place them on the head so that the upper part of the ear is at the level of Row 17 of the head, and the lower part is at the level of Row 20 of the hood. Take the eyes of the toy into account: the lower part of the ear should be placed at the same level as the bottom of the eyes.



*12. Sew the tail between Rows 10 and 11 of the body.*



***Your monkey is done!***



### *Collar*

Row 1: Cast on 24 chain. Then work back and forth rows. Start each row with 1 ch.

Row 2: Start from the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch from the hook: 3 sc inc x 23 times

Row 3: 69 dc.

Cut the thread leaving a long tail for sewing.



### *Trousers*

Row 1: Cast on 57 ch, join into a circle. Then work in rounds, **do not** work any ch or sl st at the beginning or at the end of the rows!

Rows 2 – 9: 56 sc (8 rows)



Row 10: Start making a hole for the tail in this Row: work 54 sc (do not work the last 2 sc), work 4 ch, miss 4 sc, insert the hook into the 5<sup>th</sup> stitch and start working Row 11.



Row 11: 54 sc. When you finish this row you have to be at the middle of the tail hole.



Rows 12 – 15: 56 sc (4 rows)

Now start working the bridge (it consists of 6 sc), keep working: 2 sc, turn the piece, 1 ch, 6 sc and so on. Work back and forth rows with 6 sc starting each row with 1ch. You have to make 10 rows in total. Cut the thread leaving a long tail for sewing.



Each trouser leg is 22 stitches. So, you have to count 22 stitches (to any side), find the 6 central stitches on the opposite side of the trousers and sew the bridge to these stitches. Cut the thread, hide the end.



Then work the trouser legs: join the thread of some other colour to the back side of the leg (check the photo). Start working the leg in rounds with 2sc inc (22 increases + 10 increases along the bridge). You should get 64 stitches in total.

Change the colour of the yarn at the end of the row and work 64 sc. Change the colour again and work the last row with 64 sc. Cut the thread, hide the end. Tie all the ends together and hide them.



Work the second trouser leg in the same manner.



Straps: 31 ch. Turn the piece and start from the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch from the hook: 30 sc. Cut the thread leaving a long tail for sewing.



Put on the collar and sew it at the back through the both sides.



### *Party hat*

First, work the bottom (use the same colour as the last row of the hat should be, the same colour as in Row 3).

Row 1: 9 sc in mc

Row 2: 9 inc (18)

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 9 (27)

Row 4: 27 sc, sl st. Cut the thread, hide the end.



### Party hat

Row 1: Start with white colour: 4 sc in mc

Row 2: (1 sc, inc) x 2 (6), change the yarn colour

Row 3: (1 sc, inc) x 3 (9), change the yarn colour

Row 4: (2 sc, inc) x 3 (12), change the yarn colour

Row 5: (3 sc, inc) x 3 (15), change the yarn colour

Row 6: (4 sc, inc) x 3 (18), change the yarn colour

Row 7: (5 sc, inc) x 3 (21), change the yarn colour

Row 8: (6 sc, inc) x 3 (24), change the yarn colour

Row 9: (7 sc, inc) x 3 (27), change the yarn colour



Match the hat with the bottom and work through the both pieces at the same time:  
27 sc. Stuff the hat with fiberfill in the process of making.

Do not cut the thread, work the first strap: 60 ch.

Cut the thread, tie a knot at the end of the strap. Make the second strap on the  
opposite side of the hat in the same manner.





Put the party hat on the monkey`s head, cross the straps at the front under the chin, wind them around the neck and tie them at the back.

Your monkey is done!
