# HAWTHORNE



Hawthorne is a light summer top with a high neckline, delicate straps and a lace and cable pattern running down the front and back. Knitted from the top down, fronts and backs are first worked separately flat, then joined to work in the round. The top is finished with a simple ribbed hem and i-cord straps.

The Hawthorne tank is best suited for fingering weight cotton or linen blend yarns with good stitch definition. I recommend choosing a solid color for the lace to show to its best effect.

## SIZES

Measurements given are for the finished garment. This tank is designed to fit with zero ease at the chest. Choose the size closest to the largest measurement around your chest/upper torso. If you are between sizes choose the size slightly smaller than your measurement. Sample pictured is a size 2 on a 34"/ 86.5 cm chest with zero ease. See Schematic on page 6 for full fit details.

## MATERIALS

Yarn:

Ritual Dyes Undine

(fingering weight; 60% Organic Cotton / 40% Linen; 383 yards/350 meters per 100 g skein)

Color used in sample:

Jewelweed

Yardage:

Note - yardage is estimated and may vary depending on yarn used, gauge variations and modification.

512 (575, 644, 713, 777, 846) {909, 978, 1047, 1110} yards  
[468 (526, 589, 652, 710, 773) {831, 894, 957, 1015} meters]

Skeins of Undine: 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3) {3, 3, 3, 3}

Needles:

Note - needle sizes are suggested only. You may need to use a different size to achieve gauge.

Ribbing: US 2/2.75 mm

Main: US 3/3.25 mm

Notions:

Stitch marker(s), scrap yarn or stitch holders, tapestry needle, row counter (optional), cable needle

## GAUGE

Stockinette: 24 sts and 38 rows/rounds = 4"/10 cm on main needle after blocking.

Lace Pattern: 1 lace repeat (27 sts and 30 rows/rounds) measures 4.5"/ 11.5 cm wide and 3"/ 7.5 cm on main needle after blocking

Note - You should always knit your swatch the same way that the pattern is knit—in this case, in the round. Block your swatch as you will your finished garment and allow it to dry fully before measuring.

## DIRECTIONS

### Front Neck

With ribbing needles CO 33 (33, 35, 37, 39, 41) {43, 45, 47, 49} sts using a stretchy cast-on method. Sample uses Long Tail Cast-On. Do not join in the round.

Row 1 (WS): P1, \*k1, p1; repeat from \* to end.

Row 2 (RS): K1, \*p1, k1; repeat from \* to end.

Work Row 1 once more.

### Begin Front Shaping and Lace Pattern

Switch to main needle.

Set Up Row (RS): K2, m1L, k 1 (1, 2, 3, 4, 5) {6, 7, 8, 9} sts, pm, p1, k4, p1, k15, p1, k4, p1, pm, k 1 (1, 2, 3, 4, 5) {6, 7, 8, 9} sts, m1R, k2. 2 sts increased

Next Row (WS): P to m, sm, k1, p4, k1, p15, k1, p4, k1, sm, p to end.

Begin Lace Pattern (flat), following either chart as shown on page 5 or written instructions on page 3, continue to make increases on every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K2, m1L, k to m, sm, work lace pattern, sm, k to last 2 sts, m1R, k2. 2 sts increased.

Row 2 (WS): P to m, sm, work lace pattern, sm, p to m.

Work (Rows 1 & 2) 18 (21, 19, 17, 15, 15) {12, 9, 7, 5} times total, working through all rows of lace pattern until you have 71 (77, 75, 73, 71, 73) {69, 65, 63, 61} sts on the needles, ending after a WS row.

Now begin making increases every row, continuing to work lace pattern as established as follows:

Row 3 (RS): K2, m1L, k to m, sm, work lace pattern, sm, k to last 2 sts, m1R, k2. 2 sts increased.

Row 4 (WS): P2, m1R pw, p to m, work lace pattern, sm, p to last 2 sts, m1L pw, p2. 2 sts increased.

Work (Rows 3 & 4) 4 (5, 9, 12, 16, 18) {22, 26, 29, 33} times total.

Sizes 2, 4, and 9 ONLY:

Work Row 3 once more, then work Row 2 (no increases) once more.

### All Sizes:

87 (99, 111, 123, 135, 145) {157, 169, 181, 193} sts.

You have worked a total of 49 (59, 61, 65, 67, 71) {73, 75, 79, 81} rows from cast on edge. Make a note of which lace pattern row you ended on.

Place front sts and markers on hold and proceed to Back.

Place Front sts and markers on hold.

### Back Neck

Cast on and work the Back Neck the same as the Front Neck. Do not place back sts on hold.

### Join Front and Back.

Leaving back sts on needle, return the front sts to the left side of the needle (positioned with RS facing you so you are ready to work the next row of the back section first).

Continue working lace pattern as established, changing to instructions for working in the round (charted on page 5, written on page 4).

### Joining Round:

K back sts to m, sm, work next round of lace pattern, sm, k to end, cast on 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 6) {6, 6, 6, 6} sts using backwards loop method, k front sts to m, sm, work next round of lace pattern, sm, k to end, cast on 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 6) {6, 6, 6, 6} sts using backwards loop method pm for BOR and join in the round.

182 (206, 230, 254, 278, 302) {326, 350, 374, 398} sts

Round 1: \*K to m, sm, work lace pattern, sm; rep from \* once more, knit to BOR.

Repeat Round 1, working through all rounds of lace pattern chart as many times as needed until body measures 10" / 25.5 cm from underarm or desired length before .75" / 2 cm hem, noting that changing length will impact your yardage requirements. I recommend working to either Round 12 or Round 30 to complete a pattern repeat.

Switch to ribbing needles.

### Hem

Round 1: \*K1, p1; repeat from \* to BOR.

Work (Round 1) 6 times total.

Bind off in pattern using stretchy bind off method. Sample uses Jeny's Surprisingly Stretchy Bind Off.Lace

## Straps

Note: the strap lengths given are just a guideline, your length will depend on your body and fit preference. I recommend pinning a string or ribbon to the shoulders and trying on the tank before knitting the i-cord straps to determine the best length for your preferred fit. It is also a good idea to pin the i-cord in place to try on before attaching the end in place.

With the front of the tank facing you and starting at the top left cast on edge, using the ribbing needles, pick up and knit 3 stitches along the vertical edge of the top neckline ribbing. Work 3 st i-cord until strap measures 4.5 (5, 5, 5, 5, 5) {5.25, 5.5, 5.5, 5.5}"/ 11.5 (13, 13, 13, 13, 13) {13.5, 14, 14, 14} cm or desired length. Bind off and sew neatly to back top back corner.

Work second strap the same as above at the other shoulder but starting with at the back with the back of the tank facing you, finishing by attaching to the top front corner.

## Finishing

Weave in ends and block.

Row 2 (WS): K1, p4, (k1, p1, (p tbl, k1) × 2, p tbl, p1) × 2, k1, p4, k1.

Row 3: P1, k4, p1, k1, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 2, k2tog, p1, ssk, (p1, k tbl) × 2, yo, k1, p1, k4, p1.

Row 4: K1, p4, k1, p2, (p tbl, k1) × 2, (p1, k1) × 2, p tbl, k1, p tbl, p2, k1, p4, k1.

Row 5: P1, k4, p1, k2, yo, k tbl, p1, k tbl, k2tog, p1, ssk, k tbl, p1, k tbl, yo, k2, p1, k4, p1.

Row 6: K1, p4, k1, p3, p tbl, k1, p tbl, p1, k1, p1, p tbl, k1, p tbl, p3, k1, p4, k1.

Row 7: P1, 2/2 RC, p1, k3, yo, k tbl, p1, k2tog, p1, ssk, p1, k tbl, yo, k3, p1, 2/2 LC, p1.

Row 8: (K1, p4) × 2, p tbl, (k1, p1) × 2, k1, p tbl, (p4, k1) × 2.

Row 9: (P1, k4) × 2, yo, k tbl, k2tog, p1, ssk, k tbl, yo, (k4, p1) × 2.

Row 10: K1, p4, k1, p5, p tbl, p1, k1, p1, p tbl, p5, k1, p4, k1.

Row 11: P1, k4, p1, k5, yo, k2tog, p1, ssk, yo, k5, p1, k4, p1.

Row 12: K1, p4, (k1, p7) × 2, k1, p4, k1.

Row 13: P1, 2/2 RC, p1, ssk, k5, yo, p1, yo, k5, k2tog, p1, 2/2 LC, p1.

Row 14: K1, p4, k1, p2tog, p4, yo, k3, yo, p4, ssp, k1, p4, k1.

Row 15: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k3, yo, k1, p3, k1, yo, k3, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Row 16: K1, p4, k1, p2tog, p2, yo, p2, k3, p2, yo, p2, ssp, k1, p4, k1.

Row 17: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k1, yo, p1, k2, p3, k2, p1, yo, k1, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Row 18: K1, p4, k1, p2tog, yo, k2, p2, k3, p2, k2, yo, ssp, k1, p4, k1.

Row 19: P1, 2/2 RC, p1, yo, ssk, p2, yo, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, p2, k2tog, yo, p1, 2/2 LC, p1.

Row 20: K1, p4, k1, p2, k2, k tbl, p2, k1, p2, k tbl, k2, p2, k1, p4, k1.

Row 21: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, yo, ssk, p2, cluster 5 sts, p2, k2tog, yo, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Row 22: K1, p4, k1, p tbl, k1, p1, k2, p2, k1, p2, k2, p1, k1, p tbl, k1, p4, k1.

Row 23: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, p1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k1, yo, p1, yo, k1, ssk, k2tog, yo, p1, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Row 24: K1, p4, k1, p tbl, k1, p4, k tbl, k1, k tbl, p4, k1, p tbl, k1, p4, k1.

Row 25: P1, 2/2 RC, (p1, k tbl) × 2, yo, ssk, k1, p3, k1, k2tog, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 2, 2/2 LC, p1.

Row 26: K1, p4, (k1, p tbl) × 2, k1, p2, k3, p2, (k1, p tbl) × 2, k1, p4, k1.

Row 27: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, yo, ssk, p3, k2tog, yo, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, k4, p1.

Row 28: Repeat Row 26.

Row 29: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 3, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 3, k4, p1.

Row 30: K1, p4, (k1, p tbl) × 3, (k1, p1) × 2, (k1, p tbl) × 3, k1, p4, k1.

Round 3: P1, k4, p1, k1, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 2, k2tog, p1, ssk, (p1, k tbl) × 2, yo, k1, p1, k4, p1.

Round 4: P1, k4, p1, k2, (k tbl, p1) × 2, (k1, p1) × 2, k tbl, p1, k tbl, k2, p1, k4, p1.

Round 5: P1, k4, p1, k2, yo, k tbl, p1, k tbl, k2tog, p1, ssk, k tbl, p1, k tbl, yo, k2, p1, k4, p1.

Round 6: P1, k4, p1, k3, k tbl, p1, k tbl, k1, p1, k1, k tbl, p1, k tbl, k3, p1, k4, p1.

Round 8: (P1, k4) × 2, k tbl, (p1, k1) × 2, p1, k tbl, (k4, p1) × 2.

Round 9: (P1, k4) × 2, yo, k tbl, k2tog, p1, ssk, k tbl, yo, (k4, p1) × 2.

Round 10: P1, k4, p1, k5, k tbl, k1, p1, k1, k tbl, k5, p1, k4, p1.

Round 11: P1, k4, p1, k5, yo, k2tog, p1, ssk, yo, k5, p1, k4, p1.

Round 12: P1, k4, (p1, k7) × 2, p1, k4, p1.

Round 13: P1, 2/2 RC, p1, ssk, k5, yo, p1, yo, k5, k2tog, p1, 2/2 LC, p1.

Round 14: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k4, yo, p3, yo, k4, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Round 15: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k3, yo, k1, p3, k1, yo, k3, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Round 16: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k2, yo, k2, p3, k2, yo, k2, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Round 17: P1, k4, p1, ssk, k1, yo, p1, k2, p3, k2, p1, yo, k1, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Round 18: P1, k4, p1, ssk, yo, p2, k2, p3, k2, p2, yo, k2tog, p1, k4, p1.

Round 19: P1, 2/2 RC, p1, yo, ssk, p2, yo, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, yo, p2, k2tog, yo, p1, 2/2 LC, p1.

Round 20: P1, k4, p1, k2, p2, p tbl, k2, p1, k2, p tbl, p2, k2, p1, k4, p1.

Round 21: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, yo, ssk, p2, cluster 5 sts, p2, k2tog, yo, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Round 22: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, p1, k1, p2, k2, p1, k2, p2, k1, p1, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Round 23: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, p1, yo, ssk, k2tog, k1, yo, p1, yo, k1, ssk, k2tog, yo, p1, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Round 24: P1, k4, p1, k tbl, p1, k4, p tbl, p1, p tbl, k4, p1, k tbl, p1, k4, p1.

Round 25: P1, 2/2 RC, (p1, k tbl) × 2, yo, ssk, k1, p3, k1, k2tog, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 2, 2/2 LC, p1.

Round 26: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, k2, p3, k2, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, k4, p1.

Round 27: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, yo, ssk, p3, k2tog, yo, (p1, k tbl) × 2, p1, k4, p1.


Round 28: Repeat round 26.

Round 29: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 3, yo, ssk, p1, k2tog, yo, (k tbl, p1) × 3, k4, p1.

Round 30: P1, k4, (p1, k tbl) × 3, (p1, k1) × 2, (p1, k tbl) × 3, p1, k4, p1.





## ABBREVIATIONS

2/2 LC	Slip 2 sts onto CN and hold in front, k2, then k2 from CN
2/2 RC	Slip 2 sts onto CN and hold in back, k2, then k2 from CN
BOR	Beginning of round
Cluster 5 sts	K2, p1, k2; transfer these 5 sts to CN and wrap working yarn around them 3 times, counterclockwise. Transfer the 5 wrapped sts to the right needle.
CN	Cable needle
CO	Cast on
K	knit
k2tog	knit 2 together
K tbl	Knit through the back loop
M	Marker
m1L	Make one left leaning
m1R	Make one right leaning
P	purl
P tbl	Purl through the back loop
P2tog	Purl 2 together
pm	Place marker
pw	Purlwise
RS	Right side
sm	Slip marker
ssk	slip, slip, knit
ssp	slip, slip, purl
st(s)	stitch(es)
WS	Wrong side
yo	Yarn over
