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Heart Chain Sweater

Size : S (M) L (XL) 2XL (3XL)

Bust : 104 (108) 112 (120) 128 (142) cm
 (I recommend picking a size 15-20cm larger than your actual bust measurements)

Total Length : 55 (56) 56 (59) 61 (68) cm

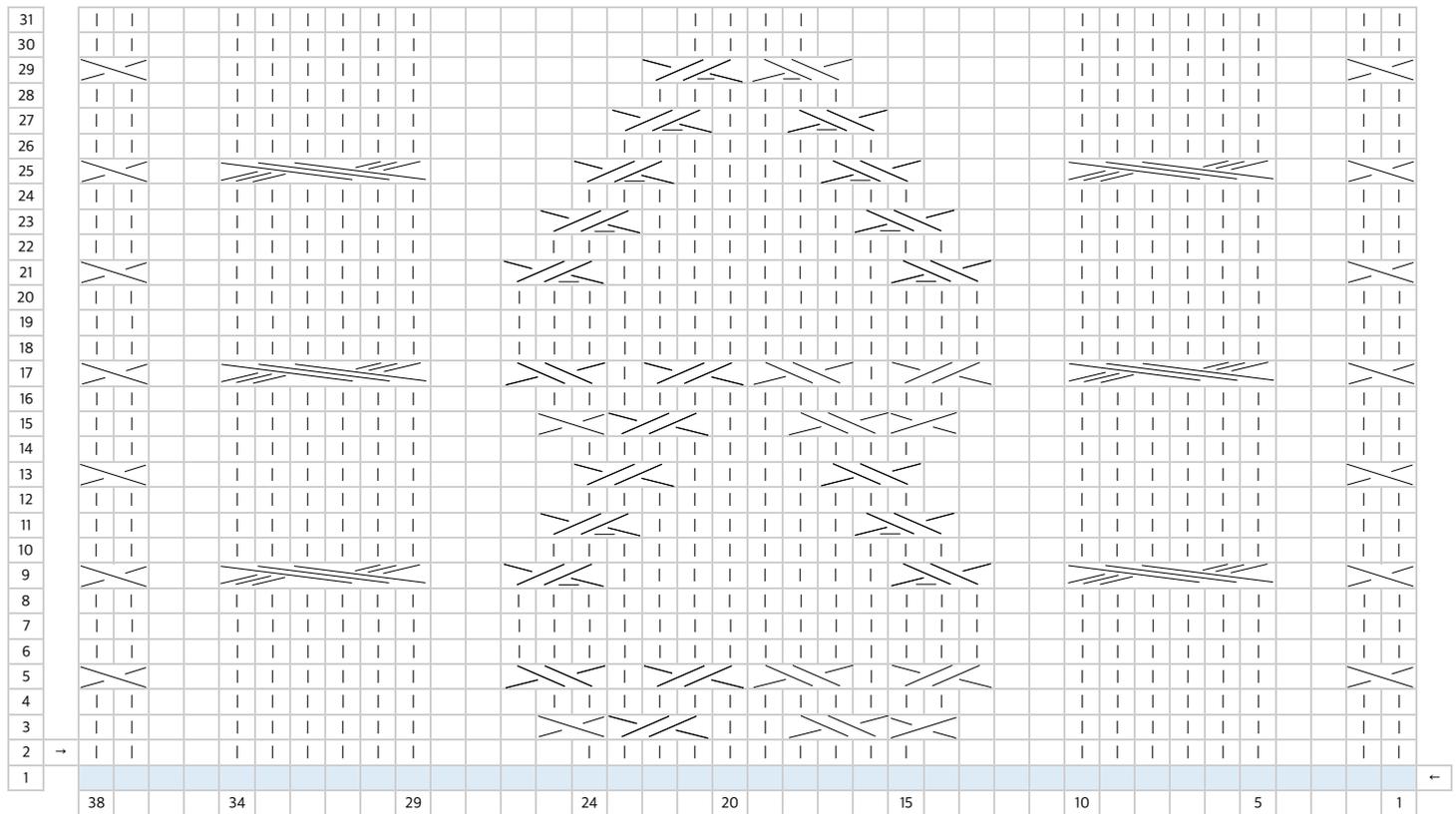
Yarn Used : Banulstory - Creme Cashmere Wool in Oatmeal (250m to 100g)
 2 (2) 2 (2) 3 (3) cone / 1072 (1122) 1155 (1212) 1291 (1530)m / 429 (449) 462 (485) 517 (613)g

: Banulstory - Mulberry Silk Mohair in Ivory (210m to 25g)
 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (7) balls / 1021 (1069) 1100 (1154) 1230 (1458)m / 122 (128) 131 (138) 147 (175)g

Needles : 5.5mm, 4.5mm circular needles

Notions : stitch markers, cable needle or stitch holder

Gauge : 18 sts 23 rows in stockinette stitch on 5.5mm needles = 10 x 10cm
 38 sts 27 rows in pattern on 5.5mm needles = 17.5 x 10.5cm (see below for swatch pattern)



◆ Row 1(RS) = cast on, next Row 2 is the wrong side. Proceed by looking at the chart above.

How to proceed

Heart Chain Sweater is worked from the top down. The back panel is work first with German short rows to create shape along the shoulders. Once the back is complete, the stitches are put on hold and you will pick up stitches along the shoulder to begin the front sides which will join together. The body will be worked in the round. Sleeve stitches will be picked up along the armhole. The collar will be picked up along the neckling and ribbed.

Description

This pattern progresses by looking at the full chart and some description. So you must know how to read charts.

Please refer to the description for progress details.

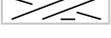
Chart reading

The chart is marked with a pattern visible on the right side(RS).

When knitting back and forth, the wrong side(WS) is worked against the chart.

Odd rows are right side (RS) - even rows are wrong side (WS)

1. Back _____[Chart S:p7 / M:p10 / L:p13 / XL:p16 / 2XL:p19 / 3XL:p22]

Row 1 (RS) : Cast on 100 (104) 108 (114) 122 (134) sts on a 5.5mm circular needle. You will be knitting back and forth starting from Row 2. On Row 2 (WS) place removable stitch markers(/) on the upper stitch of shown green on the chart. This will help you easily pick up for the front panels.

Follow the chart from Row 2(WS) ~ Row 56 (58) 58 (60) 64 (66).

There are now a total of 100 (104) 108 (114) 122 (134) sts on the needle.

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.

2. Front _____[Chart S:p8 / M:p11 / L:p14 / XL:p17 / 2XL:p20 / 3XL:p23]

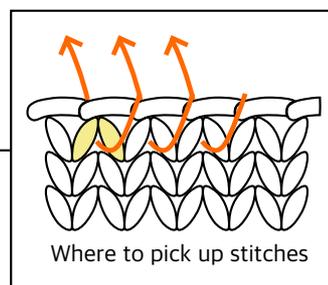
[Left Front]

Row 1(RS) With right side of the back panel facing you, using 5.5mm needles, pick up the left shoulder stitches.

pick up 34 (35) 37 (39) 43 (49) sts along the left side of the back cast-on edge.

The direction of picking up stitches is from the neck(sts marker) along the shoulder.

NB) Pick up the sts between the sts to make sure that the pattern continues on the right side of the back.



Follow the chart from Row 2(WS) ~ Row 32 (32) 32 (32) 32 (32).

There are now a total of 39 (40) 43 (45) 49 (56) sts on the needle.

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.

[Right Front]

Row 1(RS) With right side of the back panel facing you, using 5.5mm needles, pick up the right shoulder stitches.

Pick up 34 (35) 37 (39) 43 (49) sts along the right side of the back cast-on edge until the stitch marker.

The direction of picking up stitches is from the shoulder edge towards the neck.

Follow the chart from Row 2(WS) ~ Row 32 (32) 32 (32) 32 (32).

There are now a total of 39 (40) 43 (45) 49 (56) sts on the needle.

Do not break the yarn and move to the next row.

[Joining the front]

Row 33(RS) Knit across for the right front according to the chart, cast on 22 (24) 22 (24) 24 (22) sts, knit across for the left front.

Work rows 70 (72) 72 (74) 78 (80) of the front chart in knit back and forth.

There are now a total of 100 (104) 108 (114) 122 (134) sts on the needle.

[Joining front and back]

With the Row 71 (73) 73 (75) 79 (81)(RS), knit across for the front according to the chart.

cast on 4 (4) 4 (6) 6 (10) sts using the backwards-loop method, knit across the held sts for the back,

cast on 4 (4) 4 (6) 6 (10) sts using the backwards-loop method, place start marker(PM).

There are now a total of 208 (216) 224 (240) 256 (288) sts on the needle.

3. Body

Work rows 72 (74) 74 (76) 80 (82) ~ 126 (128) 128 (130) 134 (152) of the body chart in round. (The rows is based on the front chart.)

There are now a total of 208 (216) 224 (240) 256 (288) sts on the needle.

[Body Rib]

Change to 4.5mm needles and work on 2x2 rib to guideline at the top of the chart.

S, L size - PM, p1, *k2, p2*, repeat from * to * until 3 sts left, k2, p1

M, 3XL size - PM, k1, *p2, k2*, repeat from * to * until 3 sts left, p2, k1

XL, 2XL size - PM, *k2, p2* repeat

Work ribbing for 6 cm or As much as you want in knit round. Bind-off using the tubular bind-off for 2x2 rib.

* Ribbing Guide: The start of the ribbing varies slightly depending on the size. Since I like the line to match up with the body pattern, I created guide. For sizes S, M, L, 3XL, Bind-off from one stitch before or after the marker. Or you can finish as you like.

4. Sleeves _____[Chart S:p9 / M:p12 / L:p15 / XL:p18 / 2XL:p21 / 3XL:p24]

[Right Sleeve]

Place the resting sleeves sts on 5.5 mm circular needles, then start from the center of underarm.

Row 1 Using 5.5mm needles, attach new working yarn

Pick up and knit 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (5) stitches at the underarm. Pick up and knit 1 stitch at the corner. Pick up and knit 29 (30) 30 (31) 34 (36) stitches with 2 stitches for every 3 rows along back panel. Pick up and knit 45 (48) 48 (49) 52 (52) stitches with 2 stitches for every 3 rows along front panel. Pick up and knit 1 stitch at the corner. Pick up and knit 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (5) stitches at the underarm.

Place a marker for the beginning of round.

There are now a total of 80 (84) 84 (88) 94 (100) sts on the needle.

Row 2	Size S, M, L	k1, ssk, work in pattern to the last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1, PM (decrease 2 sts)
	Size XL, 2XL	k2, ssk, work in pattern to the last 4 stitches, k2tog, k2, PM (decrease 2 sts)
	Size 3XL	k4, ssk, work in pattern to the last 6 stitches, k2tog, k4, PM (decrease 2 sts)

Work rows 3 ~ 91 (89) 87 (83) 77 (74) of the sleeve chart.

There are now a total of 56 (60) 60 (60) 64 (64) sts on the needle.

[Left Sleeve]

Place the resting sleeves sts on 5.5 mm circular needles, then start from the center of underarm.

Row 1 Using 5.5mm needles, attach new working yarn

Pick up and knit 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (5) stitches at the underarm. Pick up and knit 1 stitch at the corner. Pick up and knit 45 (48) 48 (49) 52 (52) stitches with 2 stitches for every 3 rows along front panel. Pick up and knit 29 (30) 30 (31) 34 (36) stitches with 2 stitches for every 3 rows along back panel. Pick up and knit 1 stitch at the corner. Pick up and knit 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 (5) stitches at the underarm.

Place a marker for the beginning of round.

There are now a total of 80 (84) 84 (88) 94 (100) sts on the needle.

Row 2	Size S, M, L	k1, ssk, work in pattern to the last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1, PM (decrease 2 sts)
	Size XL, 2XL	k2, ssk, work in pattern to the last 4 stitches, k2tog, k2, PM (decrease 2 sts)
	Size 3XL	k4, ssk, work in pattern to the last 6 stitches, k2tog, k4, PM (decrease 2 sts)

Work rows 3 ~ 91 (89) 87 (83) 77 (74) of the sleeve chart.

There are now a total of 56 (60) 60 (60) 64 (64) sts on the needle.

[Sleeves Rib]

Change to 4.5mm needles and work on 2x2 rib to guideline at the top of the sleeves chart.

S, 2XL, 3XL size - PM, p1, *k2, p2*, repeat from * to * until 3 sts left, k2, p1

M, L, XL size - PM, k1, *p2, k2*, repeat from * to * until 3 sts left, p2, k1

Work ribbing for 5 cm or As much as you want in knit round. Bind-off using the tubular bind-off for 2x2 rib.

* Sleeves ribbing guide is the same as the body ribbing guide.

5. Neck

[Neck Rib]

Using 4.5mm needles, attach new working yarn. then pick up sts from the right of back panel to left.

Pick up and knit 32 (34) 34 (36) 36 (36) sts at the back panel. Pick up and knit 21 (21) 22 (22) 22 (23) sts with 2 sts for every 3 rows along left front. Pick up and knit 22 (24) 22 (24) 24 (22) sts along the cast-on edge between the front left and right. Pick up and knit 21 (21) 22 (22) 22 (23) sts with 2 sts for every 3 rows along right front. Place a BOR marker(PM).

There are now a total of 96 (100) 100 (104) 104 (104) sts on the needle. (Or pick up sts to multiples of 4.)

PM, *k2, p2*, repeat between * to * until the end of the round.

1. Work 21 rounds in ribbing. (sample)

Fold the neckband over towards the wrong side of your sweater. Knit the stitches on your needle together with the stitches from the corresponding picked-up edge whilst at the same time binding off.

2. Work ribbing for 4~5 cm or As much as you want in knit round and Bind-off.

* If you would like the ribbing to match the front pattern, I suggest checking the placement of your ribbing before you begin.

* Please see the notes for the Body Ribbing Guide.

Work ribbing for 5 cm or As much as you want in knit round. Bind-off using the tubular bind-off for 2x2 rib.

* Sleeves ribbing guide is the same as the body ribbing guide.

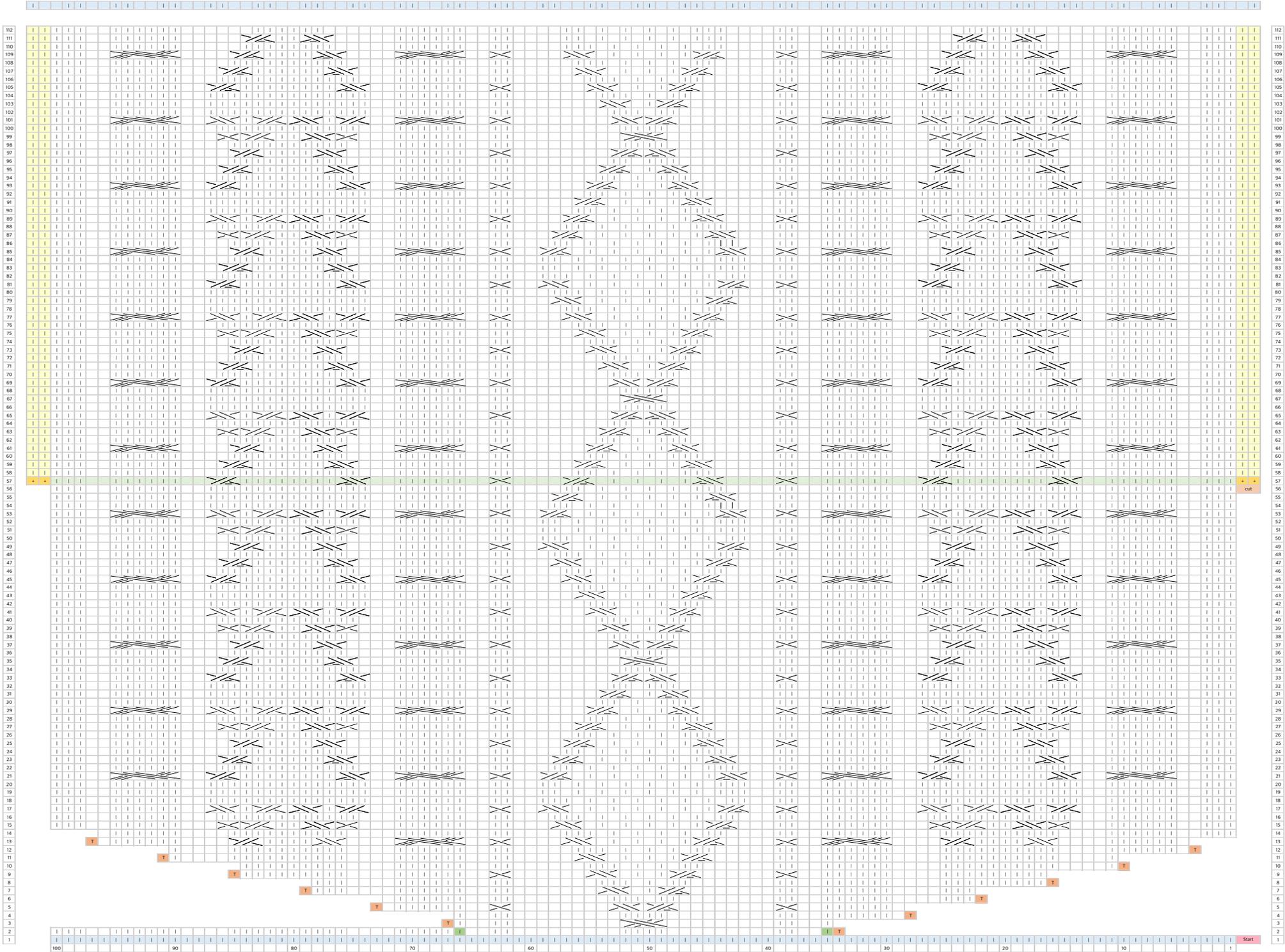
6. Finish

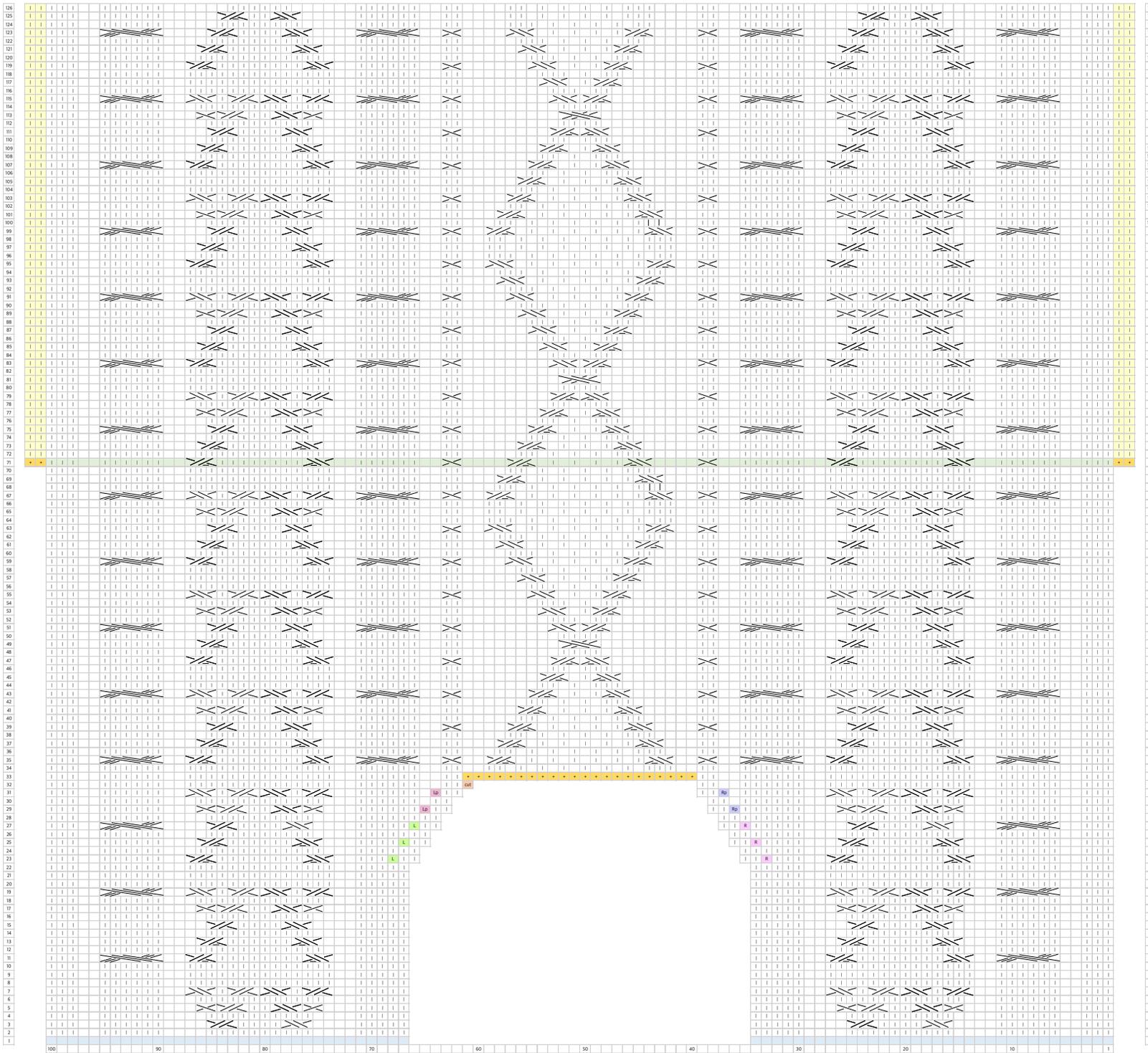
Weave in all ends.

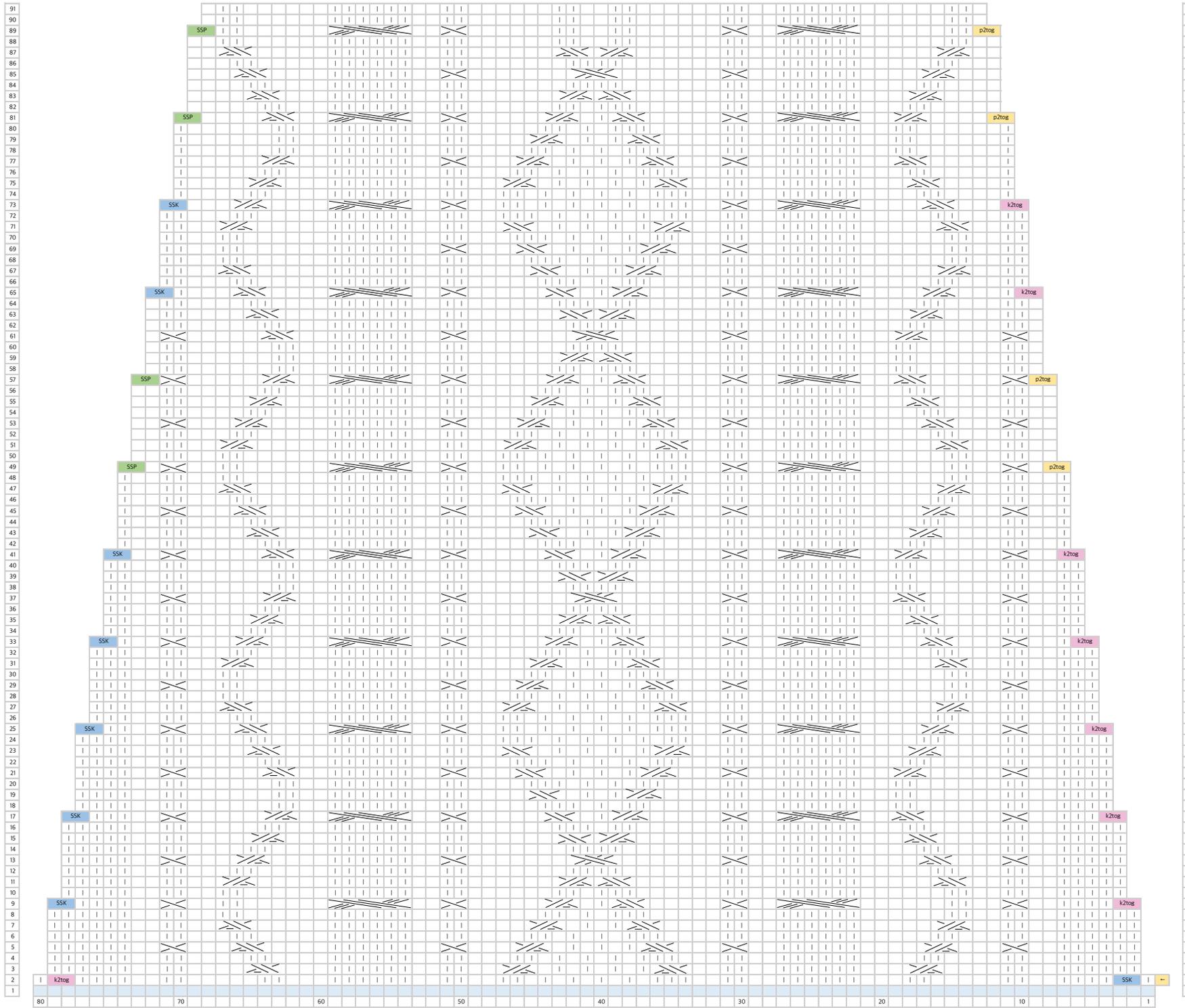
