



HEDWIG TANK 2.0

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NEEDLES: 4MM

YARN: PICKLES ORGANIC COTTON

SIZE: (XS) S (M) L (XL) 2XL (3XL)


BUST: APROX (80CM) 90CM (100CM) 110CM (120CM) 128CM (135CM)

QUANTITY: (125G) 125G (150G) 150G (200G) (200G) (225G)

GAUGE: 16M = 10CM



The Hedwig Tank is a simple, feminine summer top knit in cooling cotton. It has a cropped waist, seedstitched straps and a flatteringly rouged neckline with a ruffle, creating the perfect top for all outfits!



SIZE/STR	A	B
XS	30cm	4cm
S	30cm	4cm
M	32cm	4cm
L	34cm	4cm

TANK

Cast on (102) 118 (136) 154 (168) 182 (194) st(s) on round needles 4mm.

Place out stitchmarkers at the start of the round, and after (52) 59 (68) 77 (84) 91 (97) st(s). These mark the sides.

Knit a ribbed edge (K1, P1) in the round for 4cm.

Change to stockinette stitch and knit for 5cm. To shape the top, there will now be an increase at the sides. Knit until there is 1 st(s) left until the first SM. Increase 1, K1, move the SM, Increase 1. Repeat at the next SM.

Increase as mentioned above x3 times, every 5cm.

Knit around until the top measures (20) 20 (22) 24 (26) 28 (28) cm, and cast off the stitches on the back. That means all stitches on one half of the top, between the two stitchmarkers. Remember that cotton tends to grow in length after use.

The top will now be knit back and forth. When the backpiece has been cast off, knit out the front-piece.

Turn the knitting around, cast off 2st(s), and purl out the row.

Cast off 1 st(s) at the start of each round until there's been knit 10cm from the backpiece was cast off. If you want a higher neckline – keep knitting until you reach your desired length.

Cast off on the knit-side.



RUFFLE

Pick up st(s) along the front – one for each cast off st(s).

Knit the round.

Purl the round.

K2, increase 1 out the round.

Purl the round.

Knit the round.

Purl the round.

Knit the round.



Switch to knitting a moss-stitch/seed-stitch for 2 rows. Cast off all st(s) on the 3rd row.

STRAPS

The straps are knit by picking up 5 st(s) on the inside of the top, on each front side. Lift the ruffle out of the way before you start. The straps are knit in seed-stitch back and forth.

Cotton yarn expands a bit after use, so these are knit a bit tighter so they will fit once the yarn has finished expanding. That being said, to achieve the best fit for the straps, measure across your own shoulder where the straps will go, and knit until a few cm remains before casting off. As a guide, knit for (20) 20 (22) 24 (26) 28 (28)cm.

Sew the straps onto the backpiece.

ALMOST DONE!

To create a flattering sweetheart neckline the bust of the top is also rouged. This is done by thus;

Thread 20cm of the yarn onto a needle. Find the middle of the bust. Lift the ruffle



out of the way, and thread the needle through from the inside to the outside, at the very top under the ruffle. Approximately 1,5cm further down, thread the needle from the outside to the inside. Repeat for as many centimeters as you want, and finish with both ends of the thread on the inside of the top. Tie the two ends tightly together and fasten them. I recommend trying the top on before fastening the threads so you can adjust the rousing to fit your bust perfectly.

Fasten all loose threads.
