Welcome to Granny Square Flair!

I love nothing more than sitting down with some yarn and my hook to design new granny squares. I love the problem solving, the Eureka! moment when an idea comes to life, trying out new yarns and colours. It's all so much fun. Granny Square Flair was born from this joyful exploration. I've gathered fifty of my original designs in this book, taking the humble granny square in exciting new directions.

The textbook definition of a granny square is a square piece of fabric textile crocheted while working in rounds from the centre outwards. I prefer to describe them as bite-sized adventures in yarn where you get to play with lots of different stitches and techniques to create little bits of joy. You can then combine them to make all manner of wonderful things.

Making crochet squares is gratifying in so many ways. They give you a sense of achievement, since you can complete a square easily in one sitting. You get to do a little happy dance every time you finish one. There's no boredom caused by working endless rows all the same. Plus, you'll reap the many benefits of keeping your mind and your hands happily occupied creating something beautiful.

If all that isn't enough, granny squares are the perfect portable project. They're great for the daily commute, or for when you're in the passenger seat on road trips. Treat them as a break in your busy day, your "relax and forget about the world" time. If you make a granny square every day or so, you'll have enough for a whole project in no time at all!

The patterns in this book run the gamut from quick and easy to those requiring a little more concentration. I've assumed that you have basic crochet skills. This is not a learn to crochet book, but rather a resource to create your own projects, expanding your skills and confidence as you play with the patterns.

In addition to the patterns for the fifty squares, you'll find complete instructions for eleven beautiful projects you can make with them. But don't limit yourself to these projects. My hope is that you use these patterns in ways that mean something to you, to make what you want. To that end, I've provided guidance on designing your own projects as well.

I hope my book will inspire you to try new techniques, expand your crochet skills and create some crochet wonders you and your loved ones will cherish for years to come.

Now go swing that hook!

Get ready to crochet

What you need to have

Let's have a look at the supplies you'll need to have on hand.

Hooks

While the business end of crochet hooks is fairly standard, their design and construction vary greatly. Some are a simple shaft and hook but others have handles of many shapes and sizes. They can be made of many different materials too, from metals to woods to plastics and combinations of all of these.

If you're going to spend a lot of time crocheting, investing in a good set of hooks can make the experience so much more pleasurable, allowing you to crochet for long periods of time comfortably. The hook you choose will depend on your personal preferences and crochet style. Some suit the overhand/knife hold, while others are best for the underhand/pen hold.

Regardless of hook style, the size I recommend for the patterns in this book is 4 mm/G if you're using 8 ply/DK/light worsted yarn.

Of course you're not bound by this! Experiment!

If you want to use a thicker 10 ply/aran/worsted yarn or a thinner yarn like a 2 or 4 ply/fingering, go for it. Begin with the hook size recommended on the yarn label. If you like the density and drape of the pattern, great! Continue on. If you want a firmer, stiffer fabric, use a smaller hook. Conversely, if you want a lacier fabric with more drape, use a larger hook.

Changing the yarn and hook from what I've recommended can result in squares of a different size. That doesn't matter unless you're making garments or matching my patterns with those from other sources. A blanket is a blanket no matter the size. If you use a heavier weight yarn and larger hook, your end product will be larger, and it will be smaller with a lighter yarn and smaller hook. The amount of yarn required will change a little as well as the size. Do your calculations at the beginning of your project and all will be well.



Yarn

Ah yarn. So much to choose from! There are many factors that will influence your yarn choice.

Fibre

Yarns are constructed from many different fibres; cotton, wool (sheep, alpaca, angora, cashmere, yak), linen, bamboo and man-made fibres like acrylic and nylon. Allergies may exclude some fibres from your selection. Man-made fibres and some yarn processing methods may conflict with your environmental values, excluding others.

Construction

How each yarn is constructed can also impact your choice. A yarn with a low twist may be prone to split making it difficult to crochet with. A more tightly twisted yarn may produce a stiffer, less flexible fabric. A fluffy yarn will hide intricate stitches, whereas a cotton yarn will show each stitch clearly.

Cost

Cost can be a big part of your yarn decision, especially when you consider the quantities of yarn needed for larger projects. It's a good idea to think about the time and love you'll be investing in your project. Investing in a lovely yarn as well will mean loving the end result so much more.

Project

The purpose of your project should influence your yarn choice. If you're making a pet blanket, then an easy-care acrylic may be your go-to yarn. A baby blanket needs to be soft and easy to wash, so a blend may work best. If you're making a bag, you may want to use a mercerised cotton yarn for added durability. What is best for you and your project will depend on your personal preferences. Personally, I love soft, non-mercerised 8 ply/DK/light worsted cotton yarns because I make mostly blankets and I love the soft drape and stitch definition this yarn yields. No one wants to snuggle under a scratchy, stiff blanket!

You'll need to decide what yarn best suits your personal preferences, budget and purpose.

Other useful things to have

- A nice sharp pair of scissors
- A tapestry needle
- A tape measure
- Stitch markers (scraps of yarn work just fine)
- Blocking board and pins





What you need to know

Now let's have a look at the technical "how-to's" with a bit of an explanation of how to begin, my seamless crochet tips and tricks, notes about size, playing with colour and how to read my patterns and charts.


How to begin a Square

There are many ways to begin a Granny Square. Most of the time, I recommend you begin with chain 1 and work all round 1 stitches into that 1 chain. After finishing, use the tail to pull the hole in the centre closed as you weave the end in.


However, due to the large number of stitches in the first round of some patterns, it's necessary to make a loop to work the first round stitches into. You can either make a length of chain stitches and join them with a slip stitch to make a loop or use a magic circle. If you do choose to use a magic circle, ensure you weave in the tail very securely as magic circles may come undone with use or washing.

Each pattern states which method to use.


Chain 1

My Seamless Crochet Tips

To help make your crochet look the best it possibly can, use my tips to create seamless joins and easy transitions between colours and rounds. Each of these tips by itself doesn't make much of a difference, but in combination, they go a long way to help create the illusion of seamless crochet.

Starting chain alternative

The traditional way to begin a round of crochet is to start with a number of chain stitches that generally take the place of the first stitch. For example, if a double crochet stitch is needed at the start of a round, it's traditional to chain 3 to take the place of the first stitch. This matches the height of a double stitch and you're at the right place to begin the next stitch i.e. from the top down.

This starting chain can really stand out as different from other stitches when worked in the round, so to make that first stitch blend in I make a false stitch instead.





Here's how to do it.

Pull up a long loop, a little taller than a double crochet stitch (A). Place a finger on the loop on the hook and hold it firmly while moving the hook under, and wrapping the long loop around the hook (B). Yarn over and pull that strand under the wrapped long loop (C), yarn over again and pull through all remaining loops on the hook (D). It may look a little strange, but once you work the next stitches of the round, it will blend in nicely. At the end of the round, when it's time to join, you can join under 2 loops, just as if you were working into a regular stitch (E).

The false stitch is not limited to a double crochet. You can also create a false triple crochet by pulling up a longer loop and wrapping it twice around the hook before finishing the stitch as normal.

It does take some practice to perfect, but the result is well worth the effort.

However, there are times when a starting chain is still the best option. When it's necessary to finish a round with an invisible join, a starting chain is best as the top of the invisible join and the starting chain together create a stitch that looks very much like a normal stitch.



When a half double is required at the beginning of a round, a starting chain of 2 is the easiest option. It's possible to create a false half double, but it's very fiddly to do and not really necessary as the stitch is so short, you can't really notice the difference using a starting chain.

All patterns in this book indicate starting chains, but you have the option to use the false stitch alternative if you wish.

Changing colours

When starting a new colour, it's generally best to attach your new colour to a different stitch or space to where you ended the last round.

Joining methods

I recommend a mix of the following methods to join a new colour.

Slip Stitch

The first is to attach the new colour with a slip stitch, then either make the starting chain or a false stitch, as you prefer.

Standing Stitch

The second is to attach the new colour with a standing stitch. A standing stitch is created by attaching your new colour yarn to your hook with a slip knot then working the stitch as normal.

Attaching with a slip stitch is recommended when there is only one round of that colour, as using a standing stitch will result in having to weave in two ends at the same place at the end of the round. Joining with a slip stitch in this instance means you have one end to weave at the base of the round and one at the top of the round.

Where rounds end and begin


It's quite normal in crochet patterns to have to slip stitch to the corner, to have to work backwards a little to begin the next round, or to begin and end each round in the middle of a side which leaves a visible seam. These options are fine in some patterns, but it can be problematic in others.

Depending on the pattern, the slip stitches can be visible if the stitches you slip stitch into are not worked into in the next round. If they are worked into, it can be more difficult to get your hook into those stitches and it also creates a little more bulk in that section.

To combat the need to slip stitch to the correct place, having to work backwards a little to begin the next round or having a visible seam, my patterns use a technique borrowed from doily patterns.

A lot of doily patterns are made with long chain loops with a single stitch worked into the middle of those long chain loops in the next round. To avoid the need to slip stitch many times to reach the centre of a long chain loop, which would create a much thicker section that would stand out, these patterns are joined with a stitch. For example, if there was a round of 7-chain loops, the last 7-chain loop may be created by chaining 3 then joining with a triple crochet. This places your hook as if it's in the middle of the 7-chain loop, in the right place to make a stitch for the next round. The triple pretends to be the second half of the 7-chain loop.

I use this methodology when designing my squares. In the case of a square with 2-chain corner spaces, the round will end with the instruction to chain 1 and join with a single crochet. That single crochet takes the place of the second chain and places your hook at exactly the right spot to begin the next round, with no need to slip stitch or work backwards. Depending on the pattern, you may be instructed to work a stitch over that joining stitch. Treat the joining stitch as the second chain of the 2-chain corner space and work over it as if it were a chain loop.



If the corners of the pattern are larger chain loops, the final number of chains to be worked and the joining stitch will be different. For example, if a round has corners of 4-chain spaces, it may end with chain 1, join with a double crochet. A round with 3-chain spaces may end with chain 1, join with a half double crochet.

To make it easy to see where to place your hook in the next round after joining with a stitch, it may help to place a scrap of yarn in the corner gap before you join. This scrap of yarn shows you where to place your hook if you need to work over a joining stitch and where to work the last stitch/es of the next round.

Joining with a stitch means you're beginning each round, when square, on the diagonal, i.e. half of the first corner is worked, then the four sides and other three corners, then the first corner is finished at the end of the round. Joining at this point eliminates having a visible seam on a side.

Of course, as with most rules, there will be the occasional exception. There are a couple of patterns in this book where a slip stitch is used before beginning a round to avoid over-complicating the pattern.



Size

All patterns in this book measure 15 centimetres/6 inches when made with 8 ply/DK/light worsted yarn and a 4 mm/G hook, if your tension is average.

A small difference in size won't matter unless you're using patterns from this book to match with patterns from other sources. Your end result (blanket, bag, cushion, scarf) could turn out to be a little larger or smaller, but unless you're making garments, it doesn't matter. A small difference in each square, even with the largest blanket won't mean a huge overall different end result. If you're only using a single pattern for an entire project, it won't matter as all your squares will be the same size.

If you use just patterns from this book and the same yarn and hook throughout, your squares are all likely to be about the same size.

However, there may be instances where you may find a square is more than a little different in size to what you need. Let's look at why it may happen and what you can do to correct size issues.

Different yarn

Not all yarns are equal - even among "equivalent" yarns. For example, while the yarn I used for the cream samples and the blue samples are theoretically equivalent, the blue squares were generally a little smaller than the cream squares.



Crochet style

While all my squares resulted in blocked squares measuring 15 centimetres/6 inches, you may find small variations in size due to your crochet style. Take the Deco pattern as an example. This pattern uses mostly triple crochet stitches. These are large stitches and if your tension for triples is different to mine, it could end up a lot larger or smaller. The same may be true for any pattern that uses a lot of one particular stitch.

Ways to match size

If you do need to ensure your squares are the same size, there are a few things you can do to make that happen.

Joining

The process of joining can even out small size differences if a solid join is used.

Blocking

Blocking works well when a square is a little smaller than other squares.

Adjust the pattern

If you need to add size, you can either add a round of single crochet or adjust the type of stitches in the last round to make it larger. For example, if a pattern ends with a round of half double crochet, change it to a round of double crochet to add some size.

If the square is a little too big, there are some patterns where you can leave off the last round without affecting the pattern. Otherwise, you can change the type of stitches in the last round to smaller stitches.

Hook Size

If a square turns out too large, tackling the pattern again using a smaller hook size can be a good option. Conversely, using a larger hook will make the square larger if that is what you need.

A note on hook and square size

While the recommended hook size for 8 ply/DK/light worsted yarn is a 4 mm/G hook, you're not bound by that. The same goes for any recommended yarn weight and hook combinations.

Try a smaller hook for a denser, stiffer fabric or a larger hook for a lacy fabric with more drape. Use the hook size that gives you the result you want. As long as you're consistent, all will be well. Of course the size of your squares will be larger or smaller depending on what you do, but as we've discussed, it doesn't matter.



Colours

All patterns in this book are written with no colour changes, and are shown in Parchment Bendigo Woollen Mills 8 ply Cotton. However, changing colours to suit your preferences is encouraged.

Should you wish to change colours and the round is joined with a stitch as explained in the seamless section, a small alteration to how you end the round will be needed. Simply chain the same number as the other corners/chain loops of the round and join with a slip stitch to the first stitch or starting chain.

As well as the single colour version, each pattern shows at least two of the many ways you can play with colour. Luckily for me, some of my crochet friends from around the world have helped me out by making a square using their favourite colours and yarns. Keep an eye out for these special contributions.



Of course, you can do anything you like when it comes to colour. Each square could be made using any number of colours from one to as many colours as there are rounds. Express yourself by using your favourite colours or colours that match your decor. Experiment and see what you like. Try alternating colours every couple of rounds, or crocheting a rainbow. There really are so many options and each will create a new look for the same pattern.

If you find it hard to choose colours, do a spot of research on colour theory at your local library or online. Just remember there is no right or wrong with colour. There is only what pleases you and what doesn't.

How to read the patterns and charts


Let's have a look at what you'll find on every pattern page.

Pattern Information

Symbols



Difficulty rating - 1 ball and hook is easy, 2 is intermediate, 3 is more advanced



Yarn requirements - the amount of yarn in yards needed to make one square using 8 ply/DK/light worsted yarn and a 4 mm/G hook.



Infinity symbol - this means that the pattern can be repeated endlessly, increasing the number of stitches each round to create a square as large as you desire. Notes to extend these squares are included.

Notes / Special Stitches / Tips

If there is anything unusual about a pattern or a special stitch or technique is used, it will be explained at the top of the pattern page.

Written pattern

Here's an excerpt from a pattern:

R1: ch3 (stch), 2dc, *ch2, 3dc*, rep from * to * 2x, ch1, join with sc to 3rd ch of stch. {12 sts, 4 2-ch sps}

R2: sc over joining sc, *sc in next 3 sts**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st. {5 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

R3: ch3 (stch), dc over joining sc, *2x [dc in next st, ch1, skip 1 st], dc in next st**, (2dc, ch2, 2dc)*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, 2dc in same sp as first sts, ch1, join with sc to 3rd ch of stch. {7 sts, 2 1-ch sps on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

At the start of a round, I tell you how to begin, then you'll see an asterisk. This single asterisk indicates the beginning of a repeat. Ignore it and keep working following the instructions until you get to "rep". That is your cue to go back to the first single asterisk and repeat the stitches after it as instructed. After the repeats are done, I tell you how to finish off the round.

The instructions between a single asterisk and the double asterisks equal one side only. The instructions between the double asterisks and single asterisk equal one corner. So that means the instructions between the first and last single asterisks equal one side and the following corner. This is true of a square pattern but it also works for sections of patterns that begin as other shapes.

In those cases, the instructions between the single asterisks are a full pattern repeat and those from the single asterisk to the double asterisks are a partial repeat.

Brackets

{xxxxx} are stitches and/or chain spaces that are either to be all worked in the one stitch or space as indicated, or a set of stitches and/or chain spaces to be skipped.

[xxxx] indicate a small set of stitches and/or chain spaces to be repeated within a pattern repeat. These brackets will be preceded with a number and x to indicate how many times to work the small repeat. E.g. 2x [xxxxx] means to work the [stitches and/or chain spaces] twice.

{xxxx} contain the stitch count for each round. This states how many stitches are along each side between the corners and describe the corners.

If the pattern begins as a shape with no corners, then it describes how many stitches in total make up that round.

It really does pay to check the stitch count every now and then, especially if you're about to square off a circle. It's important to have the right number of stitches or it just won't work.



NOTE: if there is a number of chain stitches at the start of a round not followed by (stch) they are not counted in the stitch counts. These are not a starting chain, but rather an aid to getting your hook to the right place to begin the round and will be invisible once the round is complete. Slip stitches to join rounds are also not counted in the stitch counts. However, if they are used in a pattern repeat, slip stitches are included in the stitch counts.

Charts

The charts are visual representations of the written patterns. Each stitch of the pattern is represented by a symbol. You'll find a key for all the symbols in the glossary in the references section.

Sometimes it may be best to work with the chart and written pattern in conjunction, especially when stitches are worked into earlier rounds or behind other stitches as it's difficult to show multiple layers in the charts. Conversely, there will be occasions when referring to the chart can make it easier to understand the written pattern.

Other things to note about the written patterns

If you need to skip stitches or chain spaces, it will be specifically stated in the pattern. E.g. skip next 2 sts, or skip (3 sts and 2-ch sp).

If you need to work into rounds other than the previous round, it will be referred to by R#. If no round is stated, then the instructions refer to the previous round only. A pattern may instruct you to work into more than one earlier round in the same round.





Finishing Tips

To help your crochet projects look fantastic, here are a few tips from me, as well as some options for joining and adding a border to your projects.

Blocking

To make your squares sing, blocking is recommended for all of your squares. It's especially good for lacy squares, as it makes the negative space created by the stitches really stand out. It can also help with slight size differences if a square turns out a little bit smaller than others. The joining process will help the straightening process, but blocking first is still recommended.

Here are the most common methods:

Steam blocking

Pin out to size on a foam mat or blocking board and hover your hot iron over your square, squirting it with steam. Leave to dry.

Wet Blocking

Following the care instructions for your yarn, gently hand wash your square, pin out to size on a foam mat or blocking board and leave to dry.

Joining

There are many joining methods in crochet. The internet is full of great examples. Some notable joins are Flat Braid Join, Mattress Join and Whip Stitch Join. The join you choose will depend on the result you're after. I've used the following three methods in this book.

Single Crochet on Back

This join is perfect for squares of the same colour, or if the same colour is used to end each square. It's lovely and flat on the front and it leaves a ridge on the back that is not noticeable.



Hold squares right sides together, attach joining yarn with a standing single crochet to both 2-chain corner spaces on each square at the same time. Work a single crochet into both loops of both squares all the way along, end with a single crochet in both 2-chain corner spaces. Fasten off.

Join the squares into strips, then join the strips as the squares were joined but when you reach the 2-chain corner spaces, work one stitch in each, ignoring the join. This creates a neat square on the front of the work in the 2-chain corner spaces.

To make the joining a little easier, it's possible to join the squares into strips as you make them if you're using the same colour to end each square and know your layout. Here's how:


Complete one square as normal.

With subsequent squares, end with chain 1, join with single crochet to first stitch or starting chain. Hold this square and completed square, right sides together, single crochet over joining single crochet and into 2-chain corner space of first square at same time, single crochet in all stitches of both squares, single crochet in 2-chain corner spaces of both squares. Fasten off. Repeat until you have a strip long enough for your project. Once you have your second and subsequent strips, you can join them as above.



Single Crochet on Front

For a visible and decorative join, you can use this join as the ridges are on the front. Perfect for joining squares made with different colours. You can use a high contrast colour for a dramatic, framing effect.



Hold squares wrong sides together, attaching joining yarn with a standing single crochet to both 2-chain corner spaces on each square at the same time. Work a single crochet into both loops of both squares all the way along, including the 2-chain corner spaces. Do not end the join after joining two squares, instead continue with the next two squares to be joined and so on until you have joined the entire width. Then join the squares in the other direction. Doing this means there are no breaks in the joining lines on the front.

Note as this join is visible, make sure you work in the same direction vertically and then horizontally as the join will lean slightly to one side. Making sure you do this will mean it looks uniform.

Zipper Join

This join works well for joining squares regardless of what colours are used.

Place two squares right sides up, next to each other. Beginning in the chain stitches, slip stitch through the back loops only of stitches of both squares through the front from the bottom of both squares to the top, ending in the chains. Fasten off.



A word about stitch counts

Most of the fifty patterns in this book have a final stitch count along the sides of 21 or 23 stitches. The rest range from 20 to 27 stitches. It's easy to deal with this difference if you join using the joins I've explained here.

If the stitch counts are different, simply use a stitch on the shorter square twice while using new stitches on the longer square as you join. This can be repeated as many times as needed. Spread the double stitches out a little so they are not all together. For example, if you were joining a 23-stitch square to a 21-stitch square, you'd use the same stitch on the shorter square twice. Make one double stitch on the shorter square a few stitches after starting to join and then the other double stitch near the end of joining. If you were joining a 23-stitch square to a 27-stitch square, you'd use the same stitch twice four times on the shorter square. Space the four double stitches out roughly evenly as you join.

Border

Once you have joined your squares, you'll need to add some kind of border to neatly finish your work. There are entire books devoted to different ways to edge crochet. You can go wild, adding fancy borders or you can keep it simple. If you're wanting to frame your work, a plain border does the job nicely. I used this border on my sampler blankets.

A Simple Border Pattern

R1

Attach main colour yarn with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp and join**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first sc, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R2

sc over joining sc, *sc in each st on side**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R3


ch3 (stch), *dc in each st on side**, (dc, ch2, dc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, dc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to 3rd ch of stch.

R4

sc over joining sc, *sc in each st on side**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R5

sc over joining sc, *sc in each st on side**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off.

R8: sc in same st as ss, *sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next 11 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 3 sts**, (sc, ch2, sc) in next st*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off. {21 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

Hook size

5 mm/H

Pattern

Using the D'Urville pattern on page 44, make 2 squares, extending the pattern.

Stop at the end of R7, rep R6 and R7 3x, increasing the numbers as follows:

R6 "... dc in next #+4 sts of R#+2" {#+4 sts ...}

R7 "... all R#+2, #+1x [...]" {#+2 sts, #+1 2-ch sps ...}

Then add the following rounds:


R14: ch3 (stch), 2dc in same st as ss, *skip (R13 sts and ch sps), dc in next 24 sts of R12, 2dc in next st of R12**, 5dc in next st of R13*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, 2dc in same sp as first sts, join with ss to 3rd ch of stch. {26 sts on each side; 4 5-st cnrs}

R15: sc in same st as ss, *sc in next 2 sts of R14, 7x [2mdc in 2-ch sps of R13 and next sts of R14, sc in next 2 sts of R14]**, (sc, ch2, sc) in next st of R14*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st. {32 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

R16: sc over joining sc, *sc in next 32 sts**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st. {34 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

End the second square with ch1, join with sc to first st.

Hold squares wrong sides together, sc over joining sc and in 2-ch cnr sp of other square, *sc in next 34 sts of both squares**, 3sc in 2-ch cnr sps of both squares*, rep * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same 2-ch cnr sp as first st, ch12, skip 1 ch, sc in each of the 11 ch, turn, ss in next 11 sts, ss to first st of joining round, cut yarn and weave end to secure hanging loop. Fasten off.



Sunshine Cowl



What you'll make

1 cowl, 75 cm/30 inches circumference and 15 cm/6 inches wide

Yarn and amount

White Gum Wool Hand dyed By Briony
5ply/sport/baby 70% Tasmanian merino, 30% silk
1 skein = 100 grams/286 metres/313 yards

- 1 skein of Sunshine, 252 yards used

Hook size

4 mm/G

Pattern

Using the Kruis pattern on page 51, make 5 squares.

Join the squares into a strip, then into a circular cowl using the zipper join.

Top and bottom edging

Working with the front face up, attach yarn with a ss to the blo of any st, ss in the blo of all sts along edge, join with inv join to first ss. Fasten off. Rep on other edge.

1 scarf, 22 cm/8.5 inches wide and 160 cm/63 inches long

Yarn and amount

Scheepjes Our Tribe
4 ply/fingering 70% merino superwash, 30% polyamide

- 2 balls Haak Maar Raak colour (963), 908 yards used

Hook size

3 mm/D

Pattern

Using the Dahlia pattern on page 36, make 30 squares.

Pattern Difference

Pull the magic circle tight.

Joining

Use the sc on back method to join the squares into 2 strips of 15 squares each, then join the strips to make a 15 x 2 rectangle.

Border

R1: Attach yarn with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp and join**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R2: ch3 (stch), *dc in each st on side**, (dc, ch2, dc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, dc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to 3rd ch of st ch. Fasten off.



Killarney Cushion Topper



What you'll make

A 40 cm/16 inches square cushion topper

Yarn and amount

Great Ocean Road Woollen Mill Loch Ard
8 ply/DK/light worsted 50/50 alpaca/Tarndie
polwarth wool
1 skein = 100 grams/158 metres/173 yards

A: 1 skein of Granite, 154 yards used

B: 1 skein of Sandstone, 126 yards used

Hook size

5 mm/H

You'll also need a 40 cm/16 inches ready-made cushion, sewing thread and needle.

Pattern

Begin with A and change colours every 3 rounds, alternating between A and B.


Using the Killarney Cross pattern on page 46, work R1 to R6, then extend the pattern as follows:

Rep R6 12x, increasing the "... in next # sts ... in next # sts**" by 2 and 2 each time. The stitch count will increase by 4 each round.

R18 will have 69 sts on each side.

R19: Attach A with stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in next 69 sts**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off. {71 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

Place square on front of cushion, hold in place using safety pins at corners and the middle of the sides, hand sew to cushion.



Deco Cushion



What you'll make

A large cushion, 46 cm/18 inches square

Yarn and amount

Bendigo Woollen Mills
8 ply/DK/light worsted cotton
1 ball = 200 grams/485 metres/531 yards

A: 1 ball Storm Cloud (827), 449 yards used

B: 1 ball Glacier (818), 197 yards used

Hook size

4 mm/G

You'll also need an 46 cm/18 inch cushion insert or ready-made cushion.

Pattern

Square 1

Using the Deco pattern on page 22, make 5 circles in A and 4 circles in B, following instructions to the end of R4. Fasten off.

Work R5 and R6 to square off the circles. Attach squaring off colour to same stitch as ss with a stdg tr. Square off the A circles using B and the B circles using A.

Arrange the 9 squares in a checkerboard layout as shown. Join the squares using A with the sc on front join.

Border

Attach A with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp, ignoring the joins**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. {69 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

Square 2

Make one large square to 46 cm by extending the Deco pattern as follows:

Replace R6 with: ch4 (stch), tr in same 2-ch sp, *tr in next 19 sts**, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in 2-ch sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, 2tr in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to 4th ch of stch. {23 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

Rep R6 8x, increasing the "... in next # sts**" by 4 each time. The stitch count will increase by 4 each round.



R14 will have 55 sts on each side.


R15: 2sc over joining sc, *sc in next 55 sts**, (2sc, ch2, 2sc) in 2-ch sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, 2sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off. {59 sts on each side; 4 2-ch cnr sps}

Block both large squares.

Assembling the cushion

Square 1 will have 69 sts on each side and Square 2 will have 59 sts on each side.

Hold the 2 large squares wrong sides together. Attach A with a stdg sc to 2-ch cnr sps of both squares, sc in same 2-ch cnr sps, *9x [sc in both sts of both squares through both loops of next 6 sts, sc in same st on Square 2 just worked and next st of Square 1], sc in both sts of both squares through both loops of next 5 sts, sc in same st on Square 1 just worked and next st of Square 2**, 3sc in 2-ch cnr sps of both squares*, rep from * to * 2x, insert cushion insert, rep from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, join with ss to first st. Fasten off. {69 sts on each side; 4 3-st cnrs}



Melbourne Wrap



What you'll make

A shawl/wrap, 188 cm/74 inches long x 47 cm/18.5 inches wide

Yarn and amount

Scheepjes Our Tribe
4 ply/fingering 70% merino superwash, 30% polyamide
1 ball = 100 grams/420 metres/460 yards

- 4 balls Lilla Bjorn colour (969), 1745 yards used

Hook size

3 mm/D

Pattern

Step 1

Using the Melbourne pattern on page 58, make 32 squares.

Join the squares into an 8 x 4 rectangle using the sc on back join.

Step 2

Make 2 large squares, extending the Melbourne Pattern by repeating R4 to R7 7x.

The numbers in each round will increase as follows:

R4: increasing the "... in next # sts**" by 10 sts each time. The stitch count will also increase by 10 each time.

R5: increasing the "#x [ch1, skip ...]" by 5 each time. The stitch and chain space counts will increase by 5 each time.

R6: increasing the "#x [sc in next st ...]" by 5. The stitch count will increase by 10 each time.

R7: increasing the "... in next # sts**" by 10 sts each time. The stitch count will also increase by 10 each time.

R35: end with ch2, join with ss to 3rd ch of stch. This round will have 91 sts on each side.

Joining

Note: Use the 2-ch sps and joins of the rectangle made with small squares when joining to the larger squares.

Join the squares together using the sc on back join accommodating the stitch count difference of 4 sts evenly as you join, with the rectangle made of small squares in the middle and the 2 large squares on either end.

Border

R1: Attach yarn with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp and join**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st.

Fringe

Cut 190 lengths of yarn 20 cm/8 inches long and using crochet hook, attach one strand to each st and 2-ch cnr sp on short edges.

Insert your hook into the end st, fold the length of yarn in half and pull the middle of the yarn through with your hook, then pull both ends through the loop. Pull tight.

Using the Cirque pattern on page 38, make 14 circles of each colour following instructions for R1 to R4. Square off each circle using P following instructions for R5 to R7.

Joining

Refer to chart for layout. Join using P and the sc on back join.

Border Pattern

R1: Attach P with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp and join**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to st.

R2: sc over joining sc, *sc in each st on side**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off.

R2: ch3 (stch), *dc in each st on side**, (dc, ch2, dc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, dc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to 3rd ch of stch.

R3: sc over joining sc, *(ch3, skip 1 st, sc) along side, ch3, skip last st**, sc in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, join with ss to first st. Fasten off.


Refer to chart for layout. Join using L and the sc on back join. Bloem and Bulaklak have 21 sts on each side, whereas Pinkie and Solomon have 23 sts. When joining a 23 st square to a 21 st square, use the same stitch twice on the 21 st square, once near the start and once near the end of joining.

Border Pattern

R1: Attach L with a stdg sc to any 2-ch cnr sp, *sc in each st on side, working a sc in each 2-ch sp and join**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R2: sc over joining sc, *sc in each st on side**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2-ch cnr sp*, rep from * to * 2x and from * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch1, join with sc to first st.

R3: sc over joining sc, *sc in next 2 sts, 35x [skip 1 st, dc in next st, (hdc, 2dc) around st just made, sc in next 3 sts]**, (sc, ch2, sc) in 2 ch sp*, rep from * to * 2x and * to ** 1x, sc in same sp as first st, ch2, join with ss to first st. Fasten off.





Heirloom Sampler Blanket



What you'll make

A blanket, 135 cm/53 inches x 114 cm/45 inches

Yarn and amount

Bendigo Woollen Mills

8 ply/DK/light worsted cotton

1 ball = 200 grams/486 metres/532 yards

- 5 balls Parchment (816), 2,527 yards used

Hook size

4 mm/G

Pattern

Make 1 of each of the 50 patterns. Make 6 patterns a second time - choose your favourites.

Arrange the 56 squares in a 7 x 8 grid and join using sc on back join. Order is not important. I placed the more solid squares on the edges and lacy ones inside the outer round.

Add the Simple Border explained in the Finishing Tips section.



Design your own projects

Crochet squares can be used in countless ways. I've given you a few projects, but you can do so many other things.

Follow these steps to come up with your own projects using the patterns in this book.

Decide what you want to make

Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- Use my projects as a guide, changing the patterns used to the ones you like.
- Make a strip of square bunting to decorate your space.
- Scarves and cowls are a simple way to get a taste for a pattern or two.
- Cushions are quick, easy projects.
- Blankets are a great choice and can be really fun. You can make a small blanket for a new baby, a lap blanket to keep you warm at your desk in winter, a snuggle blanket for the couch, all the way up to a king size bedspread.
- The great thing about a blanket is you can make it any size at all. If it's for a bed, decide if you want it to hang over the edges or sit on top. It can be any size that pleases you.



Choose pattern/s and layout

Once you've decided what you're going to make, you'll have a bit of planning to do so you can estimate how much yarn you'll need.

Use grid paper or create a table of squares on your computer to map out your layout. Once you've chosen your pattern/s, this will help decide how many of each square you'll need to make.

Now it's time to choose which patterns you'll use for your project. Here are just a few of the possibilities. I am sure you can come up with many more options as well.

- Use one pattern but use a different colour for each square.
- Use two or more squares of a similar theme or shape. Perhaps a few of the different circle to square patterns, or floral squares.
- Use contrasting squares. Maybe a solid square with a lacy one, or fancy and plain.
- Using just one square in several different colour ways is a great way to use up leftover bits and bobs of yarn as a stash busting project.
- Use one pattern with the same colour progression for every square.
- Use many or all of the patterns in the same colour way for each.
- Use one pattern but make each square in 2 colours, alternating the order.
- Choose a repeating pattern marked with the infinity symbol and, like the traditional granny square blanket, keep going to make a large square blanket. This is shown in the Melbourne Shawl and Killarney Cushion Topper projects.

Choose your yarn

Choose a yarn that suits your personal preference, budget and purpose. Consider trying a thinner or bulkier yarn than 8 ply/DK/light worsted for a completely different look.


Choose your hook

Don't be afraid to try a hook size other than what is recommended for your yarn. Experiment and see which end result you like best.

Choose your colours

Use the colours that make you happy. You're not bound by where I've changed colour. Mix it up and find combinations that please you.





Calculate yardage

The yardage stated for each pattern is for 8 ply/DK/light worsted yarn made in a single colour using a 4 mm/G hook. Using a different yarn and/or hook will change the amount of yarn required.

Once you have decided what yarn, hook and colours you're going to use, make a sample square using your yarn of choice. Then use one of the following methods to see how much yarn you need for one square.

Method 1 - Weight

Calculate how many yards of yarn in 1 gram.

e.g. a 200 gram ball of BWM 8 ply cotton is 530 yards, so, 530 divided by 200 equals 2.65 yards per gram.

e.g. a 200 gram ball of BWM 4 ply cotton is 733 yards, so, 733 divided by 200 equals 3.67 yards per gram.

Make your square in your chosen colours. Using accurate scales that measure to 1 gram at least, weigh the square as you finish each colour, noting the weight.

e.g. R1 to R2 of colour 1 = 4 grams. R3 to R4 of colour 2 = 9 grams. So you need 4 grams of colour 1 and 5 grams of colour 2 for one square. Calculate how much of each colour you used for the whole square.

Multiply the grams for each colour by your 1 gram calculation.

e.g. Using the BWM 8 ply cotton, I'd multiply 2.65 x 4 to work out how much I needed to complete R1 to R2. So I would need 10.6 yards of that colour for each square. Repeat this for each colour used in your square.

Method 2 - Measure

Make a square using your chosen colours, but do not weave in the ends.

Unravel the square and measure each colour by measuring 1 yard then folding it on itself until you have a shorter length remaining. Count the number of 1-yard strands and measure the shorter length, adding that to your yards calculation.

Calculate your total yarn needs

No matter which method you use, the next step is to work out how much yarn you need for your whole project. Once you know how much yarn of each colour is required for one square, it's a simple matter of multiplying your results by the number of squares you need for your project. Repeat this process if you're using different square patterns.

Allow extra yarn for joining your project and adding a border. As an example, the Heirloom Sampler Blanket needed an extra 382 yards approximately to join and add the simple border.




Glossary

This list describes all the abbreviations, stitches and techniques used in this book. Abbreviations are simply words that have been shortened. Stitches are complete stitches you'll need to know. Techniques describe how particular stitches are made. Rather than explain all the variations that occur with these things combined, each abbreviation, stitch and technique is described on its own. You'll combine them all to create your squares.







	blo	back loop only	Insert hook into the back loop only of the st indicated.
	flo	front loop only	Insert hook into the front loop only of the st indicated.
	bp	back post	Insert hook around the post of the st indicated from the back.
	fp	front post	Insert hook around the post of the st indicated from the front.
	cl	cluster	Numerous sts worked together in the same st or sp. Could be any number of any kind of st. e.g. 4dccl, 5trcl, 3hdcl.
	inv join	invisible join	Cut yarn after completing last st of round. Pull tail up through the last st, thread tail onto needle, insert needle under "v" of first true st of the round and back through the centre of the last st, and through the lbv of the last st. Pull tight enough to form a "v" on top of the stch, weave end away.
	lbv	loop behind v	The third loop or back bump of a st on the back. It's located under the back loop of a st.
	mc	magic circle	Method used to begin a square. Wrap yarn around a few fingers, forming a loop, insert your hook into the centre and pull the working yarn through, ch1 to secure. Work R1 sts into the ring, pull the tail to close the ring once all sts have been made and secure by weaving the end in well.
	pc	popcorn	A group of sts worked in the same st or sp, gathered together once all sts are made by removing hook, inserting it into the first st of the group and joining it to the last st of the group with a ss. If not specified, 5dc sts are used to make a pc. Otherwise, the number of sts required will be stated. e.g. 4dpc, 3dpc.
	picot	picot stitch	ch3, ss into first ch.
	puff	puff stitch	Insert hook into st or sp indicated, 5x [yo, pull loop to front] (11 loops on hook), yo, pull through all loops on hook.
	spike	spike st	Insert hook into st or sp indicated, usually in a round more than 1 round prior to the current round, pull up a long loop level with the current round and work st as normal. Can be any st e.g. spike sc, spike dc.
	tog	together	Numerous sts worked together. Work the specified number of sts up to just before the last step, end with a yo and pull through all loops on hook. "tog" will be followed by "over next # sts". It can be done with different numbers and types of sts. e.g. dc5tog over next 5 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts.


