Untra - simple ribbed hat

Untra is a very simple and warm hat that can be worn both with a folded cuff and as a more slouchy hat without a cuff. The hat is knitted from the bottom up where you decrease for the top. It is very stretchy and comfortable! You will want to knit one in each color for the whole family.

YARN Svensk ull (100% wool, 100 g = 180 m)

GAUGE Approx 21 stitches and 26 rows in stockinette stitch on 4 mm needles = 10 x 10 cm

SIZES Child(Woman)Man

HEAD CIRCUMFERENCE Approx 50 (55) 60 cm

LENGTH OF HAT Approx 23(25)28 cm with unfolded brim

YARN AMOUNTS

Approx 55 (70) 85 g (color 59015, Bergslagen Dark Blue)

CIRUCLAR NEEDLE 4 mm, 40 cm (or 4 mm, 100 cm for Magic Loop, no need for DPN:s)

DPN:s 4 mm

NOTIONS 1 stitch marker

ABBREVIATIONS

K2tog = Knit 2 stitches together.

P2tog = Purl 2 stitches together.

* - * = Repeat text between stars

Cast on 80(96)108 st and make a circle. Put a marker on the needle that marks the beginning of the round.

Knit rib (K2, P2) til hat measures approx 18(21)23 cm.

Decrease for the top:

1: K2, P1, K2tog, *K1, P1, K2tog* til 3 stitches remains: K1, P2tog.

2: *K2, P1*

3-5: Repeat round 2

6: *K2tog, P1*

7: *K1, P1*

8-10:Repeat round 7

11: K1, then *K2tog* til 1 stitch remains. K that st together with the first st on the next round. Put your stitch marker after the K2tog.

12: Knit all stitches

13: Repeat round 12

14: *K2tog*

15: Knit all stitches

Cut yarn. Pull through the yarn in the remaining stitches. Sew in threads.

Angulus - crocheted blanket

Create a timeless family heirloom in Järbo's Swedish wool; a warming blanket with a clean design that fits into most homes and can be passed onto future generations. If you can work single and double crochet stitches, you can crochet an Angulus! The yarn is cut at the end of each row and tied together to create a fringe, which means there are no loose ends to weave in! The pattern is available in two sizes, a large blanket for the bed or sofa or a small one for the baby's cot or your lap. The blanket is crocheted in two contrasting colors.

YARN Svensk Ull (100 % svensk ull. C. 100 g = 180 m)

ALTERNATIVES

Raggi (70 % wool "superwash", 30 % polyamide. C. 100 g = 150 m)

Alpe (100 % wool. C. 50 g = 100 m)

Astrid (100 % wool "superwash". C. 50 g = 125 m)

Fuga (50 % wool "superwash", 50 % acrylic. C. 50 g = 121 m)

Lady (100 % acrylic. C. 50 g = 125 m)

GAUGE C. 13 dc x 9 rows = 10 x 10 cm

SIZES Blanket (Baby blanket)

MEASUREMENTS C. 190 x 120 (100 x 80) cm

YARDAGE

Color 1: c. 600 (300) g (59002, Gotland Grey)

Color 2: c. 600 (300) g (59007, Buttercup Yellow)

HOOK 5 mm

NOTIONS / ACCESSORIES Stitch markers

DIFFICULTY **

INFORMATION & ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern uses US crochet terms.

The blanket is crocheted in rows back and forth. The rows run along the long edge of the blanket. You turn, cut off the yarn and change color at the end of each row. The yarn ends will form the fringe.

Put a stitch marker in the final stitch of your last row before you put your work down. This will make it easier to see in which corner to begin crocheting when you return to your work.

Begin each row with a slip knot on your hook and a 20 cm long yarn tail (for fringe). **Finish each row** with a chain stitch and cut the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail. Pull out the loop and tighten the last chain stitch to form a small knot. Turn and start the next row with the other color in a slip knot on the hook.

The angled stripes are formed by alternating 10 dc stitches and 10 sc stitches, and shifting these groups of 10 stitches one stitch in one direction every odd numbered row. Odd numbered rows are always worked in color 1.

On even numbered rows, (always worked in color 2), work dc stitches into sc stitches and sc stitches into back loops of dc stitches.

Sc stitches are worked through back loops (bl). Dc stitches are worked through both loops. The first and last stitch of each row, regardless of what stitch it is, is always worked through both loops, for stability.

St / sts: stitch / stitches

Standing single crochet (sc) stitch: instead of crocheting the first sc of the row the way most crochet patterns will have you do, (insert hook in first stitch, pull up a loop, ch 1, sc in first st), begin by putting a slip knot on your hook, insert the hook into the first stitch and then just work a single crochet stitch as normally. This way, the first sc stitch of the row will look identical to the other sc stitches - very neat!

Standing double crochet (dc) stitch: same principle as standing sc; put a slip knot on your hook, then yarn over (hold the two yarn loops in place on your hook with your right (or left if you are left handed) index finger) before inserting the hook into the first stitch and working a dc stitch as normal. This looks much more neat than starting the row with 3 chains to replace the first dc.

Chain / chains (ch): Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop on the hook.

Single crochet (sc): Insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through the stitch (= 2 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through both loops on hook.

Double crochet (dc): Yarn over, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull through the stitch (= 3 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through 2 loops on hook, yarn over and pull through both remaining loops on hook.

Back loop (bl): when working a new stitch, insert the hook under the back loop of the stitch only instead of both loops.

Col 1: color 1

Col 2: color 2

BLANKET

With col 1, put a slip knot on your hook leaving a 20 cm yarn tail, ch 243 (123) loosely. Continue with col 1.

Row 1: With col 1, dc in 4th ch from hook (2 dc made), dc in next 8 ch, sc in next 10 ch, *dc in next 10 ch, sc in next 10 ch,* repeat from *-* until the end of the row, ch 1 to finish off, cut the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop on the hook and pull the tail so the final ch forms a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

N.B. From now on, the first stitch of every row is always a standing stitch, see above.

Row 2: With col 2, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, work a dc in every sc and a sc in BLO of every dc to the end of the row. (N.B. the first and last st of every row is always worked through both loops, regardless of the type of stitch.) Finish the row with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

From now on, the pattern repeat shifts by one stitch in every odd numbered row (every row in C1), as follows:

Row 3: With col 1, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, dc in the first 9 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts, *dc in the next 10 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row, dc in the last st of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 4 and all following even numbered rows: as row 2 = 240 (120) sts

Row 5: With col 1, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, dc in the first 8 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts, *dc in the next 10 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row, dc in the last 2 sts of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 7: as row 5, but shift one stitch: dc in the first 7 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts, *dc in the next 10 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row, dc in the last 3 sts of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 9 and all following odd numbered rows up to and including row 59 (39): as row 7, but shift one stitch every odd numbered row = 240 (120) sts

From row 61 (41), the stripes change direction, as the stitch repeat starts to shift one stitch in the *other direction* every odd numbered row, as follows:

Row 61 (41): With col 1, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, sc in bl of the first 10 sts (however, remember to always work the first and last st of the row through both loops), dc in the next 10 sts, *sc in bl of the next 10 sts, dc in the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 63 (43): With col 1, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, dc in the first st, sc in bl of the next 10 sts, *dc in the next 10 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row, dc in the final 9 sts of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 65 (45): With col 1, put a slip knot on the hook leaving a 20 cm long tail, dc in the first 2 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts, *dc in the next 10 sts, sc in bl of the next 10 sts,* repeat from *-* to the end of the row, dc in the final 8 sts of the row. Finish with ch 1, cut off the yarn leaving a 20 cm tail, pull out the loop and pull the tail to tighten the final ch to a little knot, turn. = 240 (120) sts

Row 67 (47) and all following odd numbered rows up to and including row 121 (81): as row 65 (45), but continue to shift the pattern repeat by one stitch every odd numbered row. = 240 (120) sts

Row 121 (81), which is the final row, begins - just like row 1 - with 10 dc and finishes with 10 sc

FRINGE

Tie the yarn ends together in groups of 3 or 4. Cut the fringe evenly to preferred length.

Wash and block the blanket to allow the stitches to fall into place and to soften the wool. Use the handwash/ wool program on your machine and a wool detergent. Shape and dry flat.

Hemtrakt (Home District) – shawl with texture stripes

Hemtrakt is a garter stitch shawl with exciting contrast color texture stripes. The colors and texture are inspired by the most eminently Swedish images, Falu red and timber faded to gray, which Kajsa sees in the windswept timber barns and elaborately painted Falu red houses in her area.

YARN

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Ístex Léttlopi (100% Icelandic wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 16 sts x 32 rows in garter stitch on U. S. size 6 / 4 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Length: approx. 71 in / 180 cm

Width: approx. 19¾ in / 50 cm

YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

Color 1: approx. 200 g (color 59002, Gotland Grey)

Color 2: approx. 70 g (color 59011 Falu Red)

NEEDLES U. S. size 6 / 4 mm: 24-32 in / 60-80 cm circular

NOTIONS Tapestry needle

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY ***

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

Kf&b: Knit front and back: First knit into front of stitch, do not drop from left needle, then knit into back loop of same stitch (1 stitch increased)

K2tog: Knit 2 stitches together (1 stitch decreased, right-leaning decrease).

Cross elongated stitches: With yarn held in back of work, slip the elongated stitch from needle to front of work, slip 2 sts to right needle, slip next elongated stitch from needle to front of work. With left needle, pick up the first elongated stitch, move the 2 slipped stitches to left needle, pick up the second elongated stitch with left needle.

SHAWL

With color 1, CO 3 sts.

Set-up Row (RS): Kf&b, knit to end of row.

GARTER STITCH SECTION

Row 1, WS: Knit across.

Row 2, RS: Kf&b, knit until 2 sts remain, k2tog.

Row 3, WS: Knit across.

Row 4, RS: Kf&b, knit to end of row.

Row 5, WS: Knit across.

Row 6, RS: Kf&b, knit to end of row.

Row 7, WS: Knit across.

Row 8, RS: Kf&b, knit to end of row.

Repeat Rows 1-4 once more = 4 sts increased.

TEXTURE SECTION

Now you'll knit a textured pattern with elongated stitches crossing over bobbles.

NOTE *The outermost stitch at each side in color 1 is left unworked when color 2 is being used.*

Row 1, WS: With color 1, *K3, yo 2 times, k2, yo 2 times*; rep * to * until 3 sts rem, end k3; turn. Do not cut yarn.

Row 2, RS: With color 2, sl 1 purlwise, *(k1, yo, k1, yo, k1) through back loop of next st, sl 1 purlwise, slide double yarnover off needle and pull on slipped st so it is elongated, k2, slide double yarnover off needle, sl 1 purlwise, and pull on slipped st so it is elongated*; rep * to * until 2 sts remain, end (k1, yo, k1, yo, k1) through back loop of next st; turn.

Row 3, WS: With color 2, *K5, slip 1 wyf, p2, sl 1 wyf*; rep * to * until 6 sts rem, k5; turn.

Row 4, RS: With color 2, *P5, sl 1 wyb, k2, sl 1 wyb*; rep * to * until 6 sts rem, p5; turn.

Row 5, WS: With color 2, k2tog, k3tog, pass st from the k2tog over the k3tog, sl 1 wyf, p2, sl 1 wyf*; rep * to * until 6 sts rem, k2tog k3tog, pass st from the k2tog over the k3tog, sl 1; turn. Cut color 2.

Row 6, RS: With color 1, kf&b, k1, *cross elongated sts over bobble (see Stitches and Techniques above), k5*; rep * to * until 2 sts rem, k2.

Knit another garter stitch section followed by a texture section.

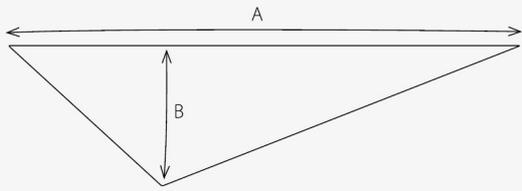
Continue the same way, alternating garter and texture sections until you've knitted a total of 21 garter sections and 21 texture sections. End shawl with one more garter section. BO with *Icelandic Bind-Off*.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Wet block shawl and pin out to finished measurements. Leave flat until completely dry.

Ovansjö - cardigan with pattern panel

Ovansjö is a rustic cardigan, knitted from the top down, with short rows shaping the back neck for a better fit. The striking panel at the lower edge was inspired by the Järbo rose – our symbol. Nordic tradition meets modern styling in the Ovansjö cardigan. A sweet combination for those of you who want to only wear knitwear in the future. You might also find it exciting to know that the district of Järbo lies in Ovansjö parish.

YARN

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Ístex Léttlopi (100% Icelandic wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 21 sts x 28 rows in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle sizes to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES

WOMEN'S XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Chest: approx. 31½ (35½, 39½, 43¼, 47¼, 51¼, 55¼, 59) in / 80 (90, 100, 110, 120, 130, 140, 150) cm

Total Length: approx. 20½ (20½, 20½, 21, 21¼, 21¾, 21¾, 22) in / 52 (52, 52, 53, 54, 55, 55, 56) cm

Sleeve Length: approx. 4¾ (4¾, 4¾, 5¼, 5¼, 5¼, 5¼, 5¼) in / 12 (12, 12, 13.5, 13.5, 13.5, 13.5, 13.5) cm

YARN COLORS AND AMOUNTS

Color 1: approx. 300 (300, 300, 400, 400, 400, 500, 500) g (color 59002 Gotland Grey)

Color 2: approx. 100 (100, 100, 100, 100, 100, 100, 100) g (color 59003 Swedish Black)

NEEDLES U. S. sizes 4 and 6 / 3.5 and 4 mm: 24 in / 60 cm circulars and sets of 5 dpn

NOTIONS 10 buttons (1/2-5/8 in / 13-15 mm), 8 stitch markers

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY ***

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

Short Rows: When working short rows, wrap stitches as follows: Bring yarn to front of work, slip next stitch to right needle. Take yarn to back of work and slip stitch back to left needle. Turn. When you later come to a wrapped stitch, knit/purl the stitch together with its wrap.

w&t: Wrap and turn.

M1 (make 1 = increase 1 stitch): Lift strand between two stitches, twist it and knit into strand.

Tips for color pattern knitting: When knitting the pattern panel, do not twist color 2 on the buttonband edges. Let the yarn hang free while you work the ribbing and then half twist it around color 1 when you want to continue knitting – as for intarsia knitting.

YOKE

Ribbing:

With color 1 and smaller size circular, CO 105 (105, 105, 105, 105, 113, 113, 113) sts. Do not join.

Row 1 (WS): With yarn in front (wyf), sl 1 purlwise, *k1, p1*; repeat * to across.

Row 2 (RS): With yarn in back (wyb), sl 1 knitwise, *p1, k1*; repeat * to across.

Row 3: Work as for Row 1.

Row 4 (Buttonhole row): Work as for Row 2 until 4 sts remain; yo, k2tog, p1, k1.

Row 5: Work as for Row 1.

NOTE Make a new buttonhole the same way on every 14th row, another 9 times.

Row 6: Work as for Row 2.

Row 7: Work as for Row 1. Place 4 markers on this row as follows: between sts 22-23 (22-23, 22-23, 22-23, 22-23, 23-24, 23-24, 23-24) = Marker D;

between sts 34-35 (34-35, 34-35, 34-35, 34-35, 37-38, 37-38, 37-38) = Marker C;

between sts 71-72 (71-72, 71-72, 71-72, 71-72, 76-77, 76-77, 76-77) = Marker B;

between sts 83-84 (83-84, 83-84, 83-84, 83-84, 90-91, 90-91, 90-91) = Marker A.

The ribbing is now complete. Change to larger size circular. Work in stockinette unless otherwise specified.

Row 8 (RS, Short Row): Work first 6 sts as est for ribbing, k1, knit to marker C, sl m, k6, w&t.

Row 9 (WS, Short Row): Purl to marker B, sl m, p6, w&t.

Row 10 (RS, Short Row): Knit to marker D, sl m, w&t. (Pick up and knit wrapped sts as described in Stitches and Techniques above.)

Row 11 (WS, Short Row): Purl to marker A, sl m, w&t. (Pick up and purl wrapped sts as described in Stitches and Techniques above.)

Row 12 (RS, Short Row): Knit until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing as est.

Row 13: Work first 6 sts in ribbing as est, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing as est.

Now begin the raglan shaping. *Don't forget the buttonholes!*

Row 14: Work 6 sts in ribbing, knit until 1 st rem before marker A, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, k10, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st before marker C, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, k10, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 6 sts rem, work 6 sts in ribbing = 113 (113, 113, 113, 113, 121, 121, 121) sts.

Row 15:

XS: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

S-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 16: Work 6 sts in ribbing, k1, knit until 1 st rem before marker A, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st before marker B, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st rem before marker C, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st rem before marker D, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 6 sts rem, work 6 sts in ribbing = 121 (129, 129, 129, 129, 137, 137, 137) sts.

Row 17:

XS-S: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

M-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 18: Work 6 sts in ribbing, k1, knit until 1 st rem before marker A, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st before marker B, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st rem before marker C, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st rem before marker D, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 6 sts rem, work 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 19:

XS-S: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

M-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 20: Work as for Row 18.

Row 21:

XS-M: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

L-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 22: Work as for Row 18.

Row 23: Work as for Row 21.

Row 24: Work as for Row 18.

Row 25:

XS-M: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

L-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 26: Work as for Row 18.

Row 27:

XS-L: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

XL-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 28: Work as for Row 18.

Row 29: Work as for Row 27.

Row 30: Work as for Row 18.

Row 31:

XS-XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

2XL-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 32: Work as for Row 18.

Row 33:

XS-2XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

3XL-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 34: Work as for Row 18.

Row 35:

XS-2XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

3XL-4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 36: Work as for Row 18.

Row 37:

XS-3XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

4XL: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 1 st before marker D, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker C, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker B, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 1 st before marker A, M1, p1, sl m, p1, M1, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 38: Work as for Row 18.

Row 39: Work as for Row 37.

Row 40: Work as for Row 18.

Row 41: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 42: Work as for Row 18.

Row 43: Work as for Row 37.

Row 44: Work as for Row 18.

Row 45: Work as for Row 37.

Row 46: Work as for Row 18.

Row 47: Work as for Row 37.

Row 48: Work as for Row 18

Row 49: Work as for Row 37.

Row 50: Work as for Row 18.

Row 51: Work as for Row 37.

Row 52: Work as for Row 18.

Row 53: Work as for Row 37.

The raglan increases for sizes XL-4XL are now finished. A total of 28 (XL), 29 (2XL), 31 (3XL), 33 (4XL) increase rows have been made = 329 sts (XL), 345 sts (2XL) 361 sts (3XL), 377 sts (4XL).

XS-L:

Row 54: Work as for Row 18.

Row 55: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

The raglan increases for size L are now finished. A total of 27 increase rows have been made = 321 sts.

XS-M:

Row 56: Work as for Row 18.

Row 57: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 58: Work as for Row 18.

Row 59: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

The raglan increases for size M are now finished. A total of 26 increase rows have been made = 313 sts.

XS-S:

Row 60: Work as for Row 18.

Row 61: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

The raglan increases for size XS-S are now finished. A total of 24 (XS) and 25 (S) increase rows have been made = 297 sts (XS), 305 sts (S).

Continue increasing for the body by repeating Rows 1-2 below a total of 1 (4, 7, 10, 13, 14, 15, 16) times.

Row 1: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, knit until 1 st before marker A, M1, k1, sl m, knit to marker B, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 1 st before marker C, M1, k1, sl m, knit to until 1 marker D, sl m, k1, M1, knit until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 2: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

When all the increases have been made, there should be a total of 301 (321, 341, 361, 381, 401, 421, 441) sts.

DIVIDE FOR BODY AND SLEEVES

Row 1: Work 46 (50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 69, 72) sts as est, including ribbing (right front), sl m (now a side marker), place next 62 (64, 66, 68, 70, 72, 76, 80) sts on a holder (right sleeve), k85 (93, 101, 109, 117, 125, 131, 137) (back), sl sm (now a side marker), place next 62 (64, 66, 68, 70, 72, 76, 80) sts on a holder (left sleeve), remove marker, work 46 (50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 69, 72) sts as est, including ribbing (left front) = 177 (193, 209, 225, 241, 257, 269, 281) sts for body.

Row 2: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

BODY

Row 1: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, knit until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Row 2: Work first 6 sts in ribbing, purl until 6 sts rem, work last 6 sts in ribbing.

Rep Rows 1-2 until body measures 3¼ in / 8 cm from dividing for body and sleeves. End with a WS row.

Now work in pattern following chart rows 1-31, continuing ribbing on first and last 6 sts of each row.

NOTE Begin pattern at the following sts on chart and repeat pattern to end of row: st 24 (16, 23, 15, 22, 29, 23, 17). Read chart from right to left on RS and left to right on WS.

With color 1: Finish with two rows stockinette and ribbing as est.

Change to smaller size circular and beginning each row with sl 1 as est, work in k1, p1 ribbing, for 2 in / 5 cm. End with a WS row. BO in ribbing.

SLEEVES

Divide the 62 (64, 66, 68, 70, 72, 76, 80) sts of one sleeve onto 4 larger size dpn. Attach yarn, picking up and knitting 1 st at underarm, k62 (64, 66, 68, 70, 72, 76, 80), pick up and knit 1 st at underarm, pm for beginning of rnd = k64 (66, 68, 70, 72, 74, 78, 82) sts.

XS-M: Work 15 rnds in stockinette.

Decrease Rnd: Decrease 10 sts evenly spaced around. Change to smaller size dpn. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2½ in / 6 cm. BO in ribbing.

L-4XL: Work 19 rnds in stockinette.

Decrease Rnd: Decrease 8 sts evenly spaced around. Change to smaller size dpn. Work around in k1, p1 ribbing for 2½ in / 6 cm. BO in ribbing.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Sew on buttons. Wet block sweater.

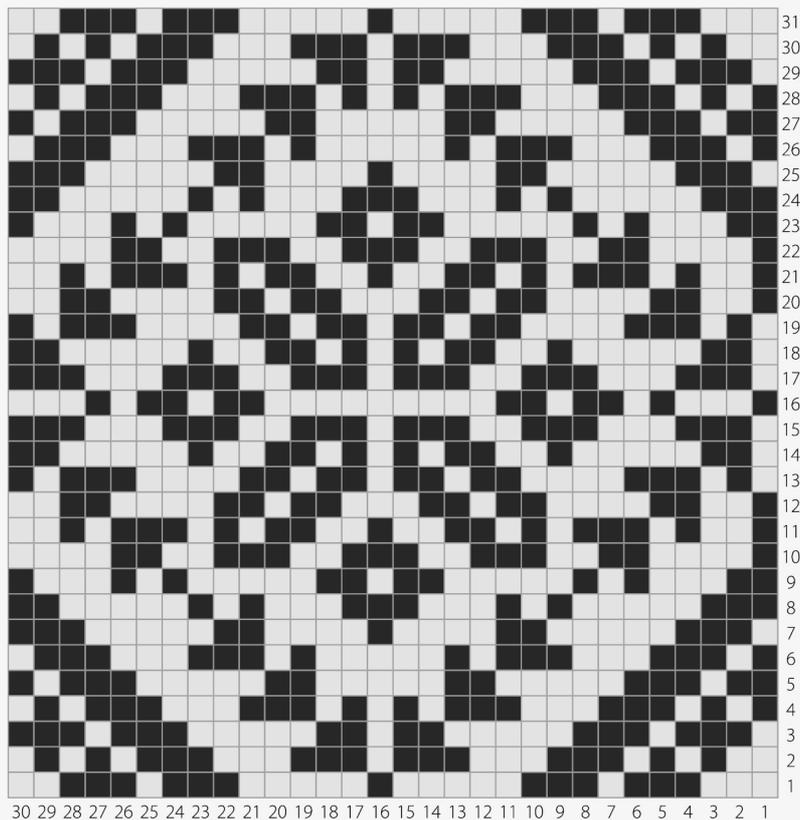

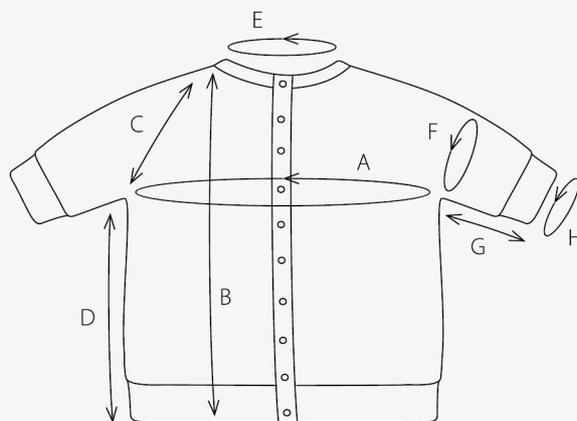

Something pretty can include charm and simplicity. Why argue with that? Swedish wool and ribbing combine for the best effect. Simple ribbing flows from a cable on each cuff to make pretty Folklig mittens to suit many hands.

YARN

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Ístex Léttlopi (100% Icelandic wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

GAUGE

Approx. 18 sts x 24 rnds in ribbing on U. S. size 4 / 6 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES M (L)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Mitten Circumference: approx. 8¾ (10¼) in / 22 (26) cm

Mitten Length: approx. 9½ (11½) in / 24 (29) cm

YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

approx. 60 (70) g (color 59002 Gotland Grey)

NEEDLES U. S. size 6 / 4 mm: set of 5 dpn or 24-32 in / 60-80 cm circular for magic loop

NOTIONS 2 stitch markers, cable needle, stitch holder and tapestry needle

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY *

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

Ssk (slip, slip, knit): Slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip 1 stitch knitwise; move stitches back to left needle and knit them together through back loops = 1 stitch decreased, left-leaning.

Sl m: When you come to it, slip marker to right needle.

1/1 LC (One over one left cross): The stitch leans to the left over a knit stitch. Slip 1 stitch to cable needle and hold in front of work, knit 1, knit 1 from cable needle.

1/1 LPC (One over one left purl cross): The stitch leans to the left over a purl stitch. Slip 1 stitch to cable needle and hold in front of work, purl 1, knit 1 from cable needle.

1/1 RPC (One over one right purl cross): The stitch leans to the right over a purl stitch. Slip 1 stitch to cable needle and hold in back of work, knit 1, purl 1 from cable needle.

CUFF

CO 40 (48) sts. Divide sts evenly onto 4 dpn and join. Place marker for beginning of round. Work in the round and slip marker to right needle when you come to it.

Rnd: K1, *p2, k2*; repeat * to * until 3 sts remain, end p2, k1.

Repeat this round another 4 (5) times.

Now work the section with crossed stitches/cables.

Work chart rows 1-6, repeating chart over whole round.

Continue as follows:

Rnd: K1, *p2, k2*; repeat * to * until 3 sts remain, end p2, k1.

Repeat round until mitten is 4 (4¾) in / 10 (12) cm from cast-on row.

THUMBHOLE – RIGHT-HAND MITTEN

Work right-hand mitten as follows:

Rnd 1: K1, move next 6 sts to holder, CO 6 new sts over thumbhole using *Backwards Loop Cast-on*; work as est to end of round.

Rnd 2: K1, *p2, k2*; repeat * to * until 3 sts remain, end p2, k1.

THUMBHOLE – LEFT-HAND MITTEN

Work left-hand mitten as follows:

Rnd 1: Work 13 (17) sts as est, move next 6 sts to holder, CO 6 new sts over thumbhole using *Backwards Loop Cast-on*; work as est to end of round.

Rnd 2: K1, *p2, k2*; repeat * to * until 3 sts remain, end p2, k1.

RIGHT- / LEFT-HAND MITTEN

Work as est until mitten measures 4¼ (5½) in / 11 (14) cm above thumbhole.

Place marker on left side of mitten as follows: work 20 (24) sts as est, place marker, work as est to end of round.

SHAPE MITTEN TOP

Decrease Rnd: Ssk, work as est until 2 sts before marker, k2tog. Sl m, ssk, work as est until 2 sts before next marker, k2tog (4 sts decreased).

Repeat Decrease Rnd until 8 sts remain. Continue as follows:

Rnd 1: Ssk, k2tog, sl m, ssk, k2tog (4 sts decreased).

Rnd 2: Ssk, sl m, ssk (2 sts decreased).

Cut yarn and draw end through remaining stitches; tighten.

THUMB

Work thumb as follows:

Rnd 1: Move the 6 held thumb sts to a dpn and work them in est ribbing; pick up and knit 1 st at side of thumbhole; place marker for right side, pick up and knit 1 st at side; pick up 6 sts from top of thumbhole and work them in est ribbing, pick up and knit 1 st at side of thumbhole; place marker for beginning of round here, pick up and knit another st on side of thumbhole but place it on the left needle (= total of 16 sts).

Rnd 2: K1, work in ribbing as est to end of rnd.

Repeat Rnd 2 until thumb measures 2½ (2¾) in / 6 (7) cm or desired length.

Decrease Rnd: Shape top of thumb as for top of mitten. Cut yarn and draw end through remaining stitches; tighten.

Make the second mitten the same way but place thumbhole as described above for left-hand mitten.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Gently hand-wash mittens with wool-safe soap, block to given measurements.

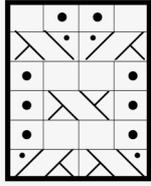

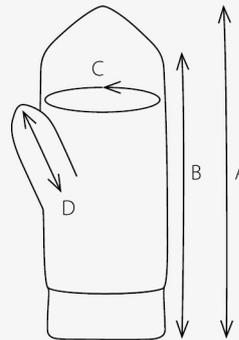

CYCA #5 (bulky), Llama Soft (85% soft baby llama, 15% polyamide wool, 164 yd/150 m / 50 g)

GAUGE Approx. 15 sts x 26 rnds in texture pattern on U. S. size 4 / 6 needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm (worked in the round, after blocking).

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY **

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

M1L (Make 1 left – left-leaning increase): with left needle, pick up strand between two stitches from front to back and knit into back loop.

M1R (Make 1 right – right-leaning increase): with left needle, pick up strand between two stitches from back to front and knit into loop.

M1Lp (Make 1 left purl – left-leaning increase): with left needle, pick up strand between two stitches from front to back and purl into back loop.

M1Rp (Make 1 right purl – right-leaning increase): with left needle, pick up strand between two stitches from back to front and purl into loop.

BACK

The piece is worked back and forth.

Slip markers from left to right needle when you come to them.

With U. S. 8 / 5 mm circular, CO (with Knitted cast-on) 65 (73, 77, 81, 85, 89, 93, 97, 101) sts.

Now work a horizontal Vikkel Braid across the back neck and shoulders:

With yarn held in back, insert needle from back to front and knit the second st on left needle through back loop; knit the first st, drop both sts off needle. Move the last knitted st back to left needle. Repeat * to * until 2 sts remain on left needle. With yarn held in back, knit second st from the back through back loop, knit the first st. Drop both sts from needle; turn work.

Change to U. S. 6 / 4 mm needles.

Now work as follows:

Row 1, WS: K1, *p1, k1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 2, RS: P1, *yo, slip 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 3, WS: K1, *purl next st together with yarnover, k1*; repeat * to * across. turn.

Repeat Rows 2-3 until piece measures 6¼ (6¼, 6¼, 6¾, 6¾, 6¾, 7, 7½, 7½) in / 16 (16, 16, 17, 17, 17, 18, 19, 19) cm, ending with a WS row.

Increase to shape armholes as follows:

Using the *Backwards Loop Cast-on*, add new sts:

Row 1, RS: CO 1 new st on left needle and knit it, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 2, WS: CO 1 new st on left needle and purl it, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 3, WS: CO 1 new st on left needle and purl it, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 4, RS: CO 1 new st on left needle and knit it, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

= 69 (77, 81, 85, 89, 93, 97, 101, 105) sts.

Cut yarn and place sts on a holder while you work front.

LEFT FRONT

With RS of back facing you and the cast-on edge upwards, beginning 17 (21, 23, 25, 25, 27, 27, 29, 31) sts in towards the center, and working outward to the edge / armhole, pick up and knit 17 (21, 23, 25, 25, 27, 27, 29, 31) sts on left side of cast-on row.

Row 1, WS: K1, *p1, k1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 2, RS: P1, *yo, slip 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 3, WS: K1, *purl next st tog with yarnover, k1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Repeat Rows 2-3 another 4 times.

Now continue as follows:

Row 1, RS: P1, yo, slip 1 purlwise, pm, M1L, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 2, WS: Work as est until 1 st before marker, p1, sl m, p2tog with next st and yarnover, k1; turn.

Row 3, RS: P1, yo, slip 1 purlwise, sl m, M1Lp, work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 4, WS: Work as est until 1 st before marker, k1, sl m, p2tog with next st and yarnover, k1; turn.

Repeat Rows 1-4 another 7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 8, 9, 9, 9) times.

Cut yarn and let sts rest.

= 33 (37, 39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49, 51) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

With RS of back facing you and the cast-on edge upwards, beginning at outer edge and working inwards, pick up and knit 17 (21, 23, 25, 25, 27, 27, 29, 31) sts on right side of cast-on row.

Row 1, WS: K1, *p1, k1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 2, RS: P1, *yo, slip 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * to end of row; turn.

Row 3, WS: K1, *purl next st together with yarnover, k1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Repeat Rows 2-3 another 4 times.

Now continue as follows:

Row 1, RS: Work as est until 2 sts rem, M1R, pm, yo, slip 1 purlwise, p1; turn (1 st increased).

Row 2, WS: K1, p2tog with next st and yarnover, sl m, p1, work as est to end of row; turn.

Row 3, RS: Work as est to marker, M1Rp, sl m, yo, sl 1 knitwise, p1; turn (1 st increased).

Row 4, WS: K1, p2tog with next st and yarnover, sl m, k1, work as est to end of row; turn.

Repeat Rows 1-4 another 7 (7, 7, 7, 8, 8, 9, 9, 9) times.

= 33 (37, 39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49, 51) sts.

JOINING FRONT PIECES

Now join the left and right sides of front. Move held sts of left front to same needles as sts of right front.

Row 1, RS: Work 32 (36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48, 50) sts as est, join right and left fronts with p2tog, work to end of row as est; turn (1 st decreased).

Row 2, WS: Work as est; turn.

Row 3, RS: Work 31 (35, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45, 47, 49) sts as est, sl 2 knitwise at the same time, k1, pssso, work as est to end of row; turn (2 sts decreased).

= 63 (71, 75, 79, 83, 87, 91, 95, 99) sts.

Continue working back and forth in pattern as est until front measures 7 (7, 7, 7½, 7½, 7½, 8, 8¼, 8¼) in / 18 (18, 18, 19, 19, 19, 20, 21, 21) cm from cast-on edge. End with a WS row.

Increase at armholes as follows:

Row 1, RS: CO 1 st on left needle and knit it; work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 2, WS: CO 1 st on left needle and purl it; work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 3, RS: CO 1 st on left needle and purl it; work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

Row 4, WS: CO 1 st on left needle and knit it; work as est to end of row; turn (1 st increased).

= 67 (75, 79, 83, 87, 91, 95, 99, 103) sts.

BODY

Now join front and back for body.

Next Row, RS: Work sts of front as est, CO 3 (3, 3, 5, 5, 5, 7, 9, 11) new sts, slip back sts to needle, and work them as est, CO 3 (3, 3, 5, 5, 5, 7, 9, 11) new sts; pm for beginning of rnd = total of 142 (158, 166, 178, 186, 194, 206, 218, 230) sts.

Begin working in the round.

Next Rnd: **P1, *knit next st together with yarnover, p1*; rep * to * to cast-on sts at underarm, k1, *p1, k1*; repeat * to * 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1, 2, 3, 4) times. **

Repeat ** to ** once more.

Now continue as follows:

Rnd 1: *P1, yo, sl 1 purlwise*; repeat * to * around.

Rnd 2: *P1, knit next st together with yarnover*; repeat * to * around.

Repeat Rnd 1-2 until body measures 8 (8¾, 8¾, 8¾, 8¾, 9½, 9½, 10¼, 10¼) in / 20 (22, 22, 22, 22, 24, 24, 26, 26) cm from underarm. End with Rnd 2.

SPLIT HEM

Now divide for split hem at sides of front and back. Each side is now worked separately, back and forth. Work 67 (75, 79, 83, 87, 91, 95, 99, 103) sts as est; turn. Slip remaining 75 (83, 87, 95, 99, 103, 111, 119, 127) sts to a holder (length of smooth yarn) while you work front hem.

Split Hem, front:

Row 1, WS: K1, *purl next st together with yarnover, k1*; repeat to * across; turn.

Row 2, RS: P1, *yo, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Repeat Rows 1-2 until front measures 2 in / 5 cm from split. End with Row 1, WS.

Now work 2 finishing rows as follows:

Row 1, RS: P1, *with yarn in back, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Row 2, WS: K1, p1, *with yarn in back, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * until 1 st remains, k1; turn.

Cut yarn, leaving an end 3 times as long as the last row. Bind off using the *Tubular Bind-Off method*.

Split Hem, back:

Slip the held 75 (83, 87, 95, 99, 103, 111, 119, 127) sts onto needle.

Continue, beginning on RS, as follows:

Next Row, RS: Pick up and purl 1 st in the gap between back and front, work in pattern as est to end of row, pick and purl 1 st in the gap between back and front; turn.

= 77 (85, 89, 97, 101, 105, 113, 121, 129) sts.

Continue as follows:

Row 1, WS: K1, *purl next st together with yarnover, k1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Row 2, RS: P1, *yo, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Repeat Rows 1-2 until front measures 3½ in / 9 cm from split. End with Row 1, WS.

Now work 2 finishing rows as follows:

Row 1, RS: P1, *with yarn in back, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * across; turn.

Row 2, WS: K1, p1, *with yarn in back, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * until 1 st remains, k1; turn.

Cut yarn, leaving an end 3 times as long as the last row. Bind off using the *Tubular Bind-Off method*.

SLEEVES

With U. S. 6 / 4 mm circular, beginning at center of underarm, pick up and knit 56 (58, 58, 64, 64, 64, 68, 74, 76) sts around armhole. Next, pick up and knit 1 st in each cast-on st = approx. 1 st in every other row along armhole and then 1 st in each cast-on st.

Pm for beginning of rnd here.

Work around as follows:

Rnd 1: *Yo, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * around.

Rnd 2: *Knit next st together with yarnover, p1*; repeat * to * around.

Repeat Rnds 1-2 until sleeve is 4¾ in / 12 cm long, ending with Rnd 1.

Continue as follows:

Decrease Rnd: Knit next st together with yarnover, p1, k3tog, including yarnover, *p1, knit next st together with yarnover*; repeat * to * until 4 sts remain, sl 1 with adjoining yarnover knitwise, knit next st together with yarnover, pssso, p1 (= 4 sts decreased).

Sizes XXS-2XL:

Repeat Rnds 1-2 another 8 times, work 1 decrease rnd. Repeat * to * 4 more times.

Sizes 3XL and 4XL:

Repeat Rnds 1-2 another 7 times, work 1 decrease rnd. Repeat * to * 5 more times.

= 32 (34, 34, 40, 40, 40, 44, 46, 48) sts remain.

All Sizes:

Repeat Rnds 1-2 until sleeve is 17¾ in / 45 cm long or desired length.

Now work as follows to finish sleeve:

Rnd 1: *K1, with yarn in front, sl 1 purlwise*; repeat * to * around.

Rnd 2: *With yarn in back, sl 1 purlwise, p1*; repeat * to * around.

Cut yarn, leaving an end 3 times as long as the last round of cuff. Bind off using the *Tubular Bind-Off method*.

Make the second sleeve the same way.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS. Wet block to given measurements.

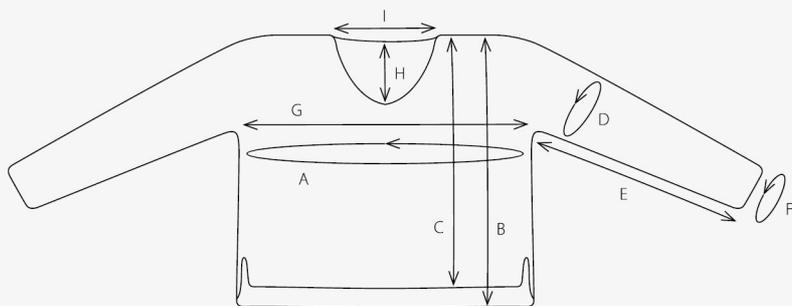

Åttersta - garter stitch mittens

Åttersta are practical everyday mittens with fine details in a classic design. Thanks to wool's characteristic warming ability and the garter stitch structure, these mittens will keep the cold and dampness out all winter. Åttersta is a town near Gävle north of Stockholm, Sweden.

YARN CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Svensk Ull (Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 197 yd/180 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

CYCA #3 (DK, light worsted), Alpe (100% wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Raggi (70% superwash wool, 30% polyamide, 165 yd/151 m / 100 g)

CYCA #4 (worsted, Afghan, Aran), Ístex Léttlopi (100% Icelandic wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

GAUGE Approx. 20 sts x 20 rnds in garter stitch in the round on U. S. size 6 / 4 mm needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZE Women's

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Mitten Length: approx. 10¼ in / 26 cm

Mitten Width: approx. 4 in / 10 cm

YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS approx. 70 g (color 59005 April Sun)

NEEDLES U. S. sizes 4 and 6 / 3.5 and 4 mm: sets of 5 dpn

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY *

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

RLI (right-lifted increase): Insert right needle into stitch below next stitch on left needle, pick up loop knitwise and lift onto left needle; knit into front loop of new stitch. Now knit original stitch on left needle.

Garter stitch in the round: Alternate knit 1 round, purl 1 round.

RIGHT-HAND MITTEN

CUFF

With smaller size dpn, CO 40 sts. Divide sts evenly onto 4 dpn and join. Knit around in k1, p1 ribbing for 3¼ in / 8 cm.

HAND

Change to larger size dpn.

Rnd 1: Knit.

Rnd 2: *K1, p19*; rep * to * once more.

Repeat Rnds 1-2 another 3 times.

THUMB GUSSET

Increase Rnd 1: Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 5th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Increase Rnd 2: Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 7th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Increase Rnd 3: Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 9th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Increase Rnd 4: Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 11th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Increase Rnd 5 : Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 13th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Increase Rnd 6: Knit to needle 3, RLI in the 3rd and 15th sts. Knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, without any increases, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Next Rnd: K22, slip next 15 sts for thumb gusset to a holder. CO 3 new sts over gap and knit to end of rnd.

Purl 1 rnd, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

HAND, CONTINUATION

Rnd 1: Knit.

Rnd 2: *K1, p19*; rep * to * once more.

Repeat Rnds 1-2 until mitten is 9 in / 23 cm long.

MITTEN TOP

Decrease Rnd: *K1, k2tog, knit until 2 sts remain on needle 2, k2tog*; rep * to * once more.

Next Rnd: Purl without decreasing, but, with k1 at beginning of needles 1 and 3 as est.

Continuing in garter stitch in the round as est, decrease on every other round (knit rounds) until 8 sts remain. Cut yarn and draw end through remaining stitches; tighten.

THUMB

Divide the 15 thumb gusset sts onto 4 dpn; pick up and knit 3 sts over cast-on sts "behind" thumb = 18 sts.

Work around in garter stitch until thumb is 2 in / 5 cm long.

Decrease Rnd: *K2tog*; rep * to * around = 9 sts remain. Cut yarn and draw end through remaining stitches; tighten. Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

LEFT-HAND MITTEN

Work as for right-hand mitten but place thumb gusset as follows: Begin thumb gusset in the 3rd and 5th sts as counted back from end of needle 4. Increase as for right-hand mitten, counting back from end of needle 4 instead of beginning of needle 3.

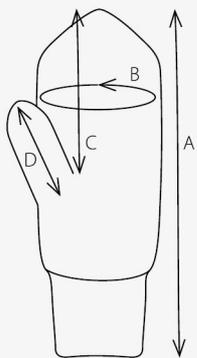

Tips & Shortcuts

To avoid questions: Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

Stitch count: Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

Highlight the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

Charts: It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

Ease: The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

Two-color stranded knitting: When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

Yarn alternative: Please be aware that the gauge (tension), yarn quantity and the shape of the work varies if you use another yarn (even in the same yarn group).

Tips för hand dyed yarn: Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
