Joo Sweater Light



Sizes

1 (2) 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8)

Chest size

106 (111) 115 (121) 132 (141) 152 (161) cm

Length

56 (57) 58 (59) 60 (61) 62 (62) cm

Recommended needles

Circular needle 3.5 mm (40 cm) Circular
needle 4.5 mm (40 and 80 cm)

Sample

18 sts x 26 rounds with 4.5 mm needle = 10 x 10 cm

Supplies

200 (225) 225 (250) 250 (275) 275 (300) g of Isager Silk
Mohair (25g = 212m) **Or** by Sandnes Garn Tynn Silk Mohair
(25g = 212m) **Or** by Filcolana Tilia (25g = 210m) **Or** from
KFO Soft Silk Mohair (25g = 225m)

*The sweater is worked with 2 threads held together and
the quantity given above is the total quantity of threads
you will need*

BOSS

The Joo Sweater Light is a light and airy sweater, inspired by the hanbok, the traditional Korean costume. It is worked from the top down with raglan increases, and shortened rows at the top of the back that will shape the neckline. The rib stitch of the collar continues all the way along the raglan, before working the rest of the body and the sleeves in stockinette stitch.

Sizes 1 (2) 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8) correspond to chest measurements of approximately 85 (90) 95 (100) 110 (120) 130 (140) cm, and the measurements given at the beginning of the pattern are the finished garment measurements. Joo Sweater Light is worn with approximately 20 cm of positive ease. Start by knitting a swatch to determine the needle size you need for the correct tension. See recommended help videos and size guide at www.novemberknits.com.

Raglan increases

Raglan increases are made before and after the raglan stitches. The raglans of the Joo Sweater Light are worked as an extension of the ribbing pattern on the neck, and are worked from the right side of the work as follows: 'k1, p2, k2, p2, k1'. Note that the raglan stitch pattern is maintained when working from the wrong side of the work.

IncR: Right side of work: Pick up the yarn between the 2 stitches, from back to front with the left needle, then knit the picked up strand through the front strand.

Wrong side of work: Pick up the yarn between the 2 stitches, from front to back with the left needle, then knit the picked up strand purlwise through the front strand.

IncL: Right side of work: Pick up the yarn between the 2 stitches, from front to back with the left needle, then knit the picked up strand through the back strand.

Wrong side of work: Pick up the yarn between the 2 stitches, from back to front with the left needle, then knit the picked up strand purlwise through the back strand.

Collar

Cast on 104 (104) 104 (104) 112 (112) 112 (112) sts on 3.5 mm (40 cm) circular needle. Work in the round for 3.5 cm in 2x2 ribbing (k2, p2), and finish the last round 1 (1) 1 (1) 3 (3) 1 (1) st from the beginning of the round. The beginning of the round has been moved so that the raglan stitches are in the correct position in relation to the 2x2 ribbing.

Yoke

Change needle to 4.5 mm (40 cm) circular needle and work one round in stockinette stitch while placing the markers on each side of the raglans. Note that the raglan stitches are worked as follows: 'knit 1, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, k1' from the right side of the work: 12 (12) 12 (12) 14 (14) 16 (16) sts (right half-sleeve) – 8 raglan sts – 12 (12) 12 (12) 12 (12) 8 (8) sts (right sleeve) - 8 raglan rm – 24 (24) 24 (24) 28 (28)

32 (32) sts (front) – 8 raglan sts – 12 (12) 12 (12) 12 (12) 8 (8) sts (left sleeve) – 8 raglan sts – 12 (12) 12 (12) 14 (14) 16 (16) sts (left half back).

The beginning of the round begins in the middle of the back, between the right half-back and the left half-back. From now on, work raglan increases and at the same time, work short rows at the neck, using the "German short row method":

Rank 1 (work location): Knit the right half back sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the right sleeve sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit 2, turn the work.

Row 2 (back of work): Purl to the beginning of the round. Note: raglan stitches are worked as they appear.

Row 3 (back of work): Knit the left half back sts, inc R, knit the raglan sts, inc L, knit the left sleeve sts, inc R, knit the raglan sts, inc L, knit 2 sts, turn the work.

Row 4 (work area): Knit to the beginning of the round. Note: raglan stitches are worked as they appear.

Repeat the short rows above 2 more times, where you turn the work, 3 sts after the stitch where you turned in the previous row. For example, row 1 of the next round is worked as follows: Knit the right half-back stitches, incR, knit the raglan stitches, incL, knit the right sleeve stitches, incR, knit the raglan stitches, incL, knit to the double stitch from the previous row, knit 3 more sts, turn the work. You have worked 3 raglan increases in total (=128 (128) 128 (128) 136 (136) 136 (136) sts).

The short rows are finished. Work in the round and in stockinette stitch, and at the same time, work the raglan increases every 2 rounds, as follows:

Round 1: Knit the right half back sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the right sleeve sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the front sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the left sleeve sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the half-left back to end.

Round 2: Knit 1 round. Note: raglan stitches are worked as presented.

Work the above 2 rounds 23 (25) 26 (26) 27 (27) 29 (29) times, until a total of 26 (28) 29 (29) 30 (30) 32 (32) raglan increases have been worked (=312 (328) 336 (336) 352 (352) 368 (368) sts).

For sizes 3-8, work raglan increases again for the front and back, but **not** at sleeve level. The increases are worked **at each** turn (not every 2 turns like previously), as follows: *Knit the right half back sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, knit the right sleeve sts, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the front sts, incR, knit the raglan sts, knit the left sleeve sts, knit the raglan sts, incL, knit the left half back sts*; repeat from * to

* 0 (0) 1 (3) 5 (9) 9 (13) times, until a total of 0 (0) 30 (32) 35 (39) 41 (45) raglan increases have been worked.

You have a total of 312 (328) 340 (348) 372 (388) 404 (420) sts on the needle, and the distribution of the stitches is divided, as follows: 38 (40) 42 (44) 49 (53) 57 (61) sts (right half back) – 8 raglan sts – 64 (68) 70 (70) 72 (72) 72 (72) sts (right sleeve) – 8 raglan sts – 76 (80) 84 (88) 98 (106) 114 (122) sts (front) – 8 raglan sts – 64 (68) 70 (70) 72 (72) 72 (72) sts (left sleeve) – 8 raglan sts - 38 (40) 42 (44) 49 (53) 57 (61) m (left half back).

Body

The raglan increases are completed, and then the raglan stitches and body stitches are worked in stockinette stitch. From now on, the sts for the body and sleeves are separated, and at the same time, sts are cast on at the bottom of the armholes of each sleeve, as follows: Knit the right half back, knit the raglan sts, put the sts of the right sleeve on hold, cast on 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 7 (7) sts with a loop cast on, knit the raglan sts, knit the front sts, knit the raglan sts, put the sts of the left sleeve on hold, cast on 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 7 (7) sts with a loop cast on, knit the raglan sts, knit the left half back (=192 (200) 208 (218) 238 (254) 274 (290) sts).

The beginning of the round begins at the center of the back, between the right half-back and the left half-back. Work in the round and in stockinette stitch, until the piece measures 56 (57) 58 (59) 60 (61) 62 (62) cm, from the center of the back or the desired finished length.

Cast off the knit stitches. Be careful to follow the stockinette stitch pattern as closely as possible so that the cast-off stitches are neither too tight nor too loose (otherwise the edge will roll). See the "videos" link on novembreknits.com for an alternative cast-off method.

Sleeves

The sleeves are worked on a 4.5 mm circular needle (40 cm).

Pick up 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) 7 (7) sts at the bottom of the armhole (=68 (72) 74 (75) 77 (77) 79 (79) sts). The round starts after the 2th(2th) 2th(3th) 3th(3th) 4th(4th) st raised. Work 6 (7) 7 (7) 8 (8) 8 (8) rounds in stockinette stitch.

* Knit 1, inc L, knit to 1 st before end of round, inc R, knit 1, knit 6 (7) 7 (7) 8 (8) 8 (8) rounds*; repeat from * to * 4 (4) 4 (4) 3 (3) 3 (3) times, and until you have a total of 76 (80) 82 (83) 83 (83) 85 (85) sts on the needle.

Work in the round and in stockinette stitch, until the inside of the sleeve measures 38 (39) 40 (41) 41 (42) 42 (43) cm or the desired length. Cast off the stitches. Be careful to follow the stockinette stitch pattern as closely as possible so that the cast-off stitches are neither too tight nor too loose (otherwise the edge will roll). See the "videos" link on novembreknits.com for an alternative casting-off method.

Finishing

It is recommended to sew an elastic thread into the edge of the collar to maintain the fit and prevent it from widening.
