To make a sweater in the size: armpit width 55cm / height 56cm

I used 1400m (470m / 100g) yarn 50% merino / 50% acrylic 3 strands, 3mm crochet hook.

One-color sweater made of 100% alpaca wool 167m / 50g - 400g, dimensions - armpit width 55cm / height 60cm.

Read all instructions before starting work.

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# Used stitches




- slip stitch
- + single crochet
- ⌋ half double crochet
- chain
- ⌋ double crochet
- ⌋ two double crochet together
- ⌋ two double crochet in one stitch
- ⌋ three double crochet in one stitch
- ⌋ six double crochet in one stitch
- ⌋ back post double crochet
- ⌋ front post double crochet
- ⌋ two front post double crochet together
- ⌋ two front post double crochet in one stitch
- ⌋ puff yo 5

Work the sweater from top to bottom in rounds, joined with a slip stitch, without turning the piece.

The rounds marked in gray are repetitions, do not work again.


## Size determination



Initial chain divisible by 8.


Every 4 double crochet (one pattern repeating), after the entire pattern has been worked on the yoke, gives 14 double crochet for the body or sleeve.




Initial chain with the number of chains for a given size.


Work 4 rounds ribbed neckline without turning the piece.



The green arrow shows where the puffs and slip stitch are inserted.  
 For convenience, you can make a single crochet instead of a slip stitch



### ROUND 7



1. two front post double crochet in one stitch
2. skip two front post double crochet
3. puff, chain 3, slip stitch (single crochet) in the same stitch as puff, chain 3, second puff in the same stitch as first puff and slip stitch (single crochet)
4. skip two front post double crochet
5. two front post double crochet in one stitch



### ROUND 8


1. two front post double crochet
2. puff in slip stitch (single crochet) between the puffs from the previous round (marked with a green arrow)
3. chain 3
4. slip stitch (single crochet) in the same slip stitch (single crochet) as puff
5. chain 3
6. puff in the same slip stitch (single crochet)
7. two front post double crochet

### ROUND 9

1. front post double crochet
2. two front post double crochet in one stitch
3. puff in slip stitch (single crochet) between the puffs from the previous round (marked with a green arrow)
4. chain 2
5. puff in slip stitch (single crochet) between the puffs from the previous round (marked with a green arrow)
6. front post double crochet
7. two front post double crochet in one stitch

### ROUND 10



1. two front post double crochet in one stitch
2. front post double crochet
3. two front post double crochet in one stitch
4. chain 1
5. puff
6. chain 1
7. two front post double crochet in one stitch
8. front post double crochet
9. two front post double crochet in one stitch





Note for round 14. Three chain stitches alternating every one or two double crochet.



Rounds 14 A and 15 A instead of rounds 14 and 15 version of the sweater without openwork.





## Size control



To enlarge the yoke after round 30, you can make any number of additional rounds with double crochet stitches.

Increasing the width - in additional rows, you can add the appropriate number of stitches evenly, e.g. 1 extra for every 14.

# Sleeve separation




Sew the short section between the sleeves and the body with the slip stitches (7 stitches).

Then work each part (body and sleeves) separately.

Further rounds are double crochet stitches.



# Body




ARMPIT

ARMPIT

For the body, make the number of rounds of the double crochet stitches appropriate for the desired length.

The narrowing of the body can be stopped at any time. Depending on what effect you want to achieve.



## Ribbing

Round 35 should have an even number of stitches.


Make a ribbing from any number of rounds.



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# Sleeves



## ARMPIT



For the sleeves, make the number of rounds appropriate for the desired length.

You can stop the narrowing of the sleeves at any time. Depending on what effect you want to achieve.

There should be an even number of stitches in round 35.

Make a ribbing from any number of rounds.
