Three Shawls: Garter

Three free shawl patterns from Kelbourne Woolens



Specifications

DESIGNER

Kate Gagnon Osborn

YARN

Kelbourne Woolens Silk Blend No. 1 (50% wool, 30% silk, 20% cotton; 202 yds/50 gms): dark gray, 1 skein.

Kelbourne Woolens Harmony (72% Kid mohair, 28% Mulberry silk; 230 yds / 25 gms): 042 shale, 1 skein.

GAUGE

16 sts and 28 rows = 4" (10 cm) in diagonal lace patt, after blocking.

NEEDLES

1 – US 7 (4.5 mm) 24" (60 cm) circular or pair straights.
Check your gauge and adjust needle size(s) accordingly if necessary.

NOTIONS

Tapestry needle.

SIZE

10.5" (26.5 cm) depth, 42.5" (108 cm) at widest point.

SKILLS

Simple lace from charts, increasing, decreasing.

Worthy of Note

This jaunty little shawl is worked in one piece from point to point in a simple diagonal lace pattern from charts.

An I-cord worked simultaneously with the piece makes for a lovely finished edge, but be sure to pay attention to which rows to slip and which rows to knit as you work the diagonal or straight edge.

Directions

Using yarns held together, CO 3 sts.

Next Row (WS): P all sts.

Begin Working From Charts:

Work Rows 1–52 of Chart A – 17 sts.

Work Rows 1–40 of Chart B twice, then Rows 1–18 once more – 42 sts.

Work Rows 1–42 of Chart C, then Rows 3–42 once more – 22 sts.

Work Rows 1–64 of Chart D – 6 sts.

Next Row (RS, Dec): K1, ssk, k3 – 5 sts.

Next Row (WS): Sl 3, p2.

Next Row (Dec): Ssk, k1, k2tog – 3 sts.

BO all sts.

Finishing:

Weave in ends.

Soak in cool water and **Soak wash** and block to measurements.






Chart Key




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Three Shawls: Lace

Three free shawl patterns from Kelbourne Woolens



Specifications

DESIGNER

Katelyn Lovelace

YARN

Kelbourne Woolens Silk Blend No. 1 (50% wool, 30% silk, 20% cotton; 202 yds/50 gms): dark gray, 1 skein.

Kelbourne Woolens Harmony (72% Kid mohair, 28% Mulberry silk; 230 yds /25 gms): 435 steel blue, 1 skein.

GAUGE

16 sts and 20 rows = 4" (10 cm) in lace patt, after blocking.

NEEDLES

1 – US 7 (4.5 mm) 24" (60 cm) circular or pair straights.
Check your gauge and adjust needle size(s) accordingly if necessary.

NOTIONS

Tapestry Needle

SIZE

13.75" (35 cm) depth, 37.75" (96 cm) at widest point.

SKILLS

Lace from charts, I-cord.

Worthy of Note

This triangular shawl combines a bottom up construction with an intricate lace pattern to create a pretty and unique shawl. The repeating motifs offer both challenge and reward, making it ideal for knitters looking to practice their lace skills.

The shawl begins at the bottom point and increases are worked on every row. The lace pattern is worked over a 24 row repeat; make sure you are paying attention as you increase and decrease to maintain proper stitch count.

Directions

Using yarns held together, CO 5 sts.

Set-Up:

Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 7 sts.

Row 2 (WS): P2, yo, p3, yo, p2 – 9 sts.

Row 3: K2, yo, k5, yo, k2 – 11 sts.

Row 4: P2, yo, p7, yo, p2 – 13 sts.

Begin Working from Charts:

Work Rows 1–24 of Lace Chart twice, then Rows 1–20 once more – 149 sts.

Edging:

Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, k to 2 sts rem, yo, k2 – 151 sts.

Row 2 (WS): P2, yo, p to 2 sts rem, yo, p2 – 153 sts.

Row 3: K2, yo, k1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to 3 sts rem, k1, yo, k2 – 155 sts.

Row 4: P2, yo, p to 2 sts rem, yo, p2 – 157 sts.

I-Cord Bind-Off:

CO 3 sts onto LH ndl using cable CO.

Step 1: K2, sl1, k1, pssso, sl 3 sts back onto LH ndl – 1 st BO.

Rep Step 1 until all sts are bound off and 3 sts rem on LH ndl.

Attached I-Cord Edge:

Rotate work in preparation to work an attached I-cord edge along diagonal sides.

Rnd 1: K2, sl1, p/u and k 1 st in edge, pssso, sl 3 sts back onto LH ndl.

Rep Rnd 1 down to center point, and then up to BO edge. BO 3 sts.

Finishing:

Weave in ends.

Soak in cool water and **Soak wash** and block to measurements.




Chart Key

Three Shawls: Crochet

Specifications

DESIGNER

YARN

Kelbourne Woolens Silk Blend No. 1 (50% wool, 30% silk, 20% cotton; 202 yds/50 gms): dark gray, 1 skein.

Kelbourne Woolens Harmony (72% Kid mohair, 28% Mulberry silk; 230 yds /25 gms): 443 sage blue, 1 skein.

GAUGE

3 (dc, ch1) clusters and 4 dc rows = 4" (10 cm) on larger hook, after blocking.

HOOK

1 – US I/9 (5.5mm) hook

1 – US G/6 (4mm) hook

Check your gauge and adjust hook size(s) accordingly if necessary.

NOTIONS

Tapestry needle.

SIZE

19.5" (49.5 cm) depth and 38" (96.5 cm) at widest point.

SKILLS

Double crochet, chain, and half double crochet stitches, crochet from charts (optional).

Worthy of Note

This simple and fun shawl is worked back and forth from the bottom up using either written or charted instructions. Depending on your gauge, you may be able to work more or fewer repeats of the pattern. Be sure to stop with enough yarn to work the double crochet edging before the border.

Directions

Using yarns held together and larger hook, ch4 and join with a sl st to form a ring.

Work Body from Written or Charted instructions:

Written Instructions:

Row 1: Ch3 (counts as 1 dc), 3 dc, ch1, 4 dc in ring.

Row 2: Ch3 (counts as 1 dc), 3 dc in space between 1st and 2nd dc, ch 1, (3 dc, ch1, 3 dc) in ch-1 space, ch 1, 4 dc in space between last 2 dc.

Row 3: Ch3 (counts as 1 dc), 3 dc in space between 1st and 2nd dc, ch 1, 3 dc in ch 1 space between 3dc of prev row, ch 1, (3 dc, ch1, 3 dc) in ch-1 space, ch 1, 3dc in ch 1 space between 3 dc of prev row, ch 1, 4 dc in space between last 2 dc.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), 3 dc in space between 1st and 2nd dc, *ch 1, 3 dc in ch 1 space between 3dc of prev row; rep to ch-1 space, (3 dc, ch1, 3 dc) in ch-1 space, **ch 1, 3dc in ch 1 space between 3dc of prev row; rep from ** to last 2 dc, ch 1, 4 dc in space between last 2 dc. Rep prev 4 rows 14 times more – 144 sts; 36 (dc 3, ch1) clusters.

Next Row: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), work dc in each st on next row – 144 sts.

Charted Instructions:

Work Rows 1–4 of Chart, then rep Row 4 fourteen times more – 144 sts; 36 (dc 3, ch1) clusters.

Next Row: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), work dc in each st on next row – 144 sts.

Work Border:

Cut Silk Blend No. 1 and work border with Harmony.

Rnd 1: Work hdc in each stitch around entire perimeter of shawl, working 2 hdc in each of three corners. The exact stitch count does not matter as long as the sts are worked evenly.

Edging:

Row 1 (RS): Ch1 (counts as 1 sc) *ch4, sk 1 hdc, sc in next hdc; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (WS): Sl st to top of Ch4 loop, *sc, ch2, sc in top of loop, ch 1; rep from * to end.

Finishing:

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Soak in cool water and **Soak wash** and block to measurements.


