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## Kintra - DK

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- Sizes:** (1, 2, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9, 10)
- Finished chest circumference:** (82, 92, 102, 112, 122) (132, 142, 152, 162, 172) cm / (32.25, 36.25, 40.25, 44, 48) (52, 56, 59.75, 63.75, 67.75) inches
- Gauge:** 20 stitches and 20 rows per 10 cm/4 inches in all-over colourwork  
20 stitches and 24 rows per 10 cm/4 inches in single-colour stockinette stitch
- Suggested Needles:** 4mm (US6) needles, or needles required to get gauge  
*Note: You may require a different needle for gauge in colourwork than in one-colour stockinette.*  
3.5mm (US4) needles, or 0.5mm smaller than above, for ribbing.

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# NOTES

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## About

Kintra is a top-down, round-yoke sweater worked in 1x1 colourwork. The yoke is finished with raglan increases to improve fit and short rows. All sizes can use between 2 and 25 colours for this pattern, making it perfect for advents or scraps! *NOTE: Sizes 1 and 2 should use the modified chart if working all 24 colours.*

The 1x1 makes this a great beginner colourwork sweater as there are no floats to catch and no rows with more than 2 colours used. Charts can be found at the end of this document. *NOTE: The charts do not include the raglan increases, and the colourwork will continue past the chart.*

## Sizing

8-16 cm/3.5-6.25 inches of positive ease is recommended, meaning you should pick a size that is 8-16 cm/3.5-6.25 inches larger than your chest measurement.

### A - Finished Chest Measurement

(82, 92, 102, 112, 122) (132, 142, 152, 162, 172) cm/(32.25, 36.25, 40.25, 44, 48) (52, 56, 59.75, 63.75, 67.75) inches

### B - Bicep Circumference

(29, 31, 34, 36, 39) (42, 46, 50, 53, 55) cm/(11.5, 12.25, 13.5, 14.25, 15.25) (16.5, 18, 19.75, 20.75, 21.75) inches

### Yoke Depth (measured from centre front, not including neckband)



# YARDAGES

## Yarn

The yarn used for the DK samples of this pattern include Sandnes Garn Peer Gynt, Filcolana Peruvian Highland Wool, and By Laxtons Wooltrace DK, along with a fingering-weight advent held double for the yoke.

Any yarn(s) that meet gauge can be used for this pattern. Other yarns used by test knitters include Kelbourne Woolens Germantown, Harrisville Designs Daylights, Berocco Vintage DK, Cascade 220, Drops Karisma, Drops Lima, Camarose Lamatweed and Knitpicks Hawthorne DK.

## Planning colours

Go wild! I used as few as 4 and as many as 24 colours in my sample versions. Try a fade, different textured yarns, a mini skein set, or make it scrappy! I found the increases on the yoke were less visible on my versions with a fade or similar colours in the yoke.

For two of my samples I used the MC in the stripes. I had to change the colour order I was working in for the final two repeats to ensure these weren't worked in MC. There's a blank chart on page 13 - you can use this to plan your colours.

## Yardage

If using fingering held double, you'll need double the amount listed below.

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# TECHNIQUES

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## Abbreviations:

BOR - beginning of round

DS - double stitch (from German short rows)

k - knit

k2tog - knit two stitches together (1 stitch decreased)

M1L - Make one left: insert left-hand needle from front to back under the bar between the stitches, knit this bar through the back loop. (1 stitch increased)

M1Lp - Make one left purl: insert left-hand needle from front to back under the bar between the stitches, purl this bar through the back loop. (1 stitch increased)

M1R - Make one right: insert the left-hand needle from back to front under the bar between the stitches, knit this bar through the front loop. (1 stitch increased)

M1Rp - Make one right purl: insert the left-hand needle from back to front under the bar between the stitches, purl this bar through the front loop. (1 stitch increased)

p - purl

pm - place marker

rm - remove marker

RS - right side

sm - slip marker

ssk - slip, slip, knit (1 stitch decreased)

WS - wrong side

## Colourwork

The chart at the end of the pattern uses 5 contrast colours. There is also a plain chart to print out and colour your own. The colour change happens every 3 rows per colour, and these 3 rows are offset. You can also choose to use your MC as one of the CC.

Most sizes will also work some colourwork after the chart with raglan increases.

## Sizes 1-3 only:

There are two options for the charts for these three sizes. Size 1 has a 20-colour option and sizes 2-3 have a 22-colour option where the colour change happens every 3 rows per colour. There are also two modified charts for these sizes where some colour changes happen every 2 rows in order to fit all 24 colours.

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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## Start here

Using your smaller needles, cast on (80, 88, 96, 96, 96) (104, 112, 112, 120, 120) stitches, place BOR marker, and join in the round.

Round 1: \*K1, p1; repeat from \* to end

Repeat round 1 until neckband measures 8 cm/3 inches (folded collar) or 4 cm/1.5 inches (unfolded).

Change to your larger needles.

Next round:

**Sizes 1-6 and 8 only:** \*K2, LLI; repeat from \* to end.

**Size 7 only:** (K3, LLI) twice, \*k3, LLI, k2, LLI; repeat from \* to last 6 stitches, (k3, LLI) twice.

**Sizes 9 and 10 only:** \*K3, LLI, k2, LLI; repeat from \* to end.

You have increased by (40, 44, 48, 48, 48) (52, 44, 56, 48, 48) stitches and now have (120, 132, 144, 144, 144) (156, 156, 168, 168, 168) stitches on your needles.

You'll now start working the chart, beginning at the right-hand-side of row 1 and increasing using lifted increases as you go, until you complete row (34, 30, 30, 30, 30) (30, 36, 36, 36, 36) of the chart. You may want to place markers between each repeat to keep track.

On the final row of the chart, remove all markers other than your BOR. You have (240, 264, 288, 288, 288) (312, 364, 392, 392, 392) stitches on your needles.

The yoke is finished with raglan increases to ensure a better fit, and these raglan increases will be worked in colourwork. The increase rate for the sleeves and the body will differ. There are some photos at the end of the pattern to show how the colourwork is continued into the raglan increases.

**Sizes 1 only:** You have completed working the colourwork. You will work the rest of the yoke in the MC, as described below.

**Sizes 2-10 only:** You will continue to work in the established pattern, changing colour every 3 rows, as described be. The newly-made stitches will be made and knit in the colour they will be in the stitch pattern. Ignore the colour inside the raglan markers when choosing this colour.

**All sizes:** The next set of increases is divided by size.

## Size 1:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, k48 (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, k70 (*front/back*), pm; repeat from \* once more.

Round 2: Knit.

You have 240 stitches on your needles: 48 sleeve, 70 front and back, and 4 raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 2 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, work 60 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, work 70 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 2: Work all stitches in pattern.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, work in pattern to marker (*sleeve*), sm, k1, sm, M1L, work in pattern to marker (*front/back*), M1R, sm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

# INSTRUCTIONS

Round 4: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work round 3 once more (5 rounds in total).

Work rounds 4 and 3 (in that order) one final time. For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC.

You have 280 stitches on your needles: 60 sleeve, 78 front and the back, and 4 raglans. You have completed working the colourwork. The rest of the yoke will be knit in the MC.

Round 3: Knit all stitches.

You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 3 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, work 60 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, work 82 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), pm; repeat from \* once more.

Round 2: Work all stitches in pattern.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* once more. (8 stitches increased)

Round 4: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work rounds 3 to 4 once more.

For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC. You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 5: \*K1, sm, work to next marker in pattern, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 6: Work all stitches in pattern.

You have 308 stitches: 64 sleeve, 88 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 4 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, work 60 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, work 82 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Rounds 2-4: Work all stitches in pattern.

Round 5: \*K1, sm, work to next marker in pattern, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 6: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work rounds 5 and 6 once more.

Work rounds 5 and 6 one final time. For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC. You have completed working the colourwork.

You have 304 stitches: 60 for each sleeve, 90 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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## Size 5:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, work 60 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, work 82 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 2: Work all stitches in pattern.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, work to next marker in pattern, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 4: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work rounds 3 and 4 once more.

Round 5: \*K1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* once more. (8 stitches increased)

Round 6: \*K1, sm, work to next marker in pattern, sm, k1, sm, M1L, work to next marker in pattern, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work rounds 5 and 6 one more time. For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC. You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 7: \*K1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* once more. (8 stitches increased)

Round 8: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

You have 336 stitches: 66 sleeve, 100 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 6 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, work 72 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, work 82 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 2: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 2 a total of 9 times, taking care to switch from colour 24 to MC when required. You have worked a total of 10 rounds here, including round 1. You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 3 a total of 4 times.

You have 368 stitches: 72 sleeve, 110 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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## Size 7 only:

Round 1: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work round 1 once more.

Then work round 1 two more times (4 total times). For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC. You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 2: \*K1, pm, M1L, k70 (*sleeve*), M1R, pm, k1, pm, M1L, k110 (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (8 stitches increased)

Round 3: Knit.

Round 4: \*K1, sm, M1L, knit to marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1L, sm; repeat from \* to end. (8 stitches increased)

Round 5: Knit.

Work rounds 4 and 5 once more.

You have 388 stitches: 76 sleeve, 116 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 8 only:

Round 1: Work all stitches in pattern.

Work round 1 once more.

For these next two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC.

Round 2: \*K1, pm, work 84 stitches in pattern (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, work 110 stitches in pattern (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 3: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 4: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 4 a total of 6 times.

You have 424 stitches: 84 sleeve, 126 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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## Size 9 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, k84 (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, k110 (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 2: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 2 two more times (for a total of 3 times). For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC.

You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 3 a total of 4 times.

Round 4: \*K1, sm, M1L, knit to marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (8 stitches increased)

Round 5: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work rounds 4 and 5 once more.

You have 448 stitches: 88 sleeve, 134 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

## Size 10 only:

Round 1: \*K1, pm, k84 (*sleeve*), pm, k1, pm, M1L, k110 (*front/back*), M1R, pm; repeat from \* once more. (4 body stitches increased)

Round 2: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 2 two more times (for a total of 3 times). For these final two rounds, your last colour change will be to the MC, meaning you have one CC alternating with the MC.

You have completed working the colourwork.

Round 3: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

Work round 3 a total of 8 times.

Round 4: \*K1, sm, M1L, knit to marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (8 stitches increased)

Round 5: \*K1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm; repeat from \* to end. (4 body stitches increased)

You have 452 stitches: 86 sleeve, 138 front and back, and 4 stitches for the raglans. You can now proceed to **Short Rows** below.

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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## Short rows:

Short rows are worked in the MC to ensure the neckline fits correctly. The main colour is used for the rest of the pattern. The BOR marker is placed 1 stitch (raglan stitch) before the right sleeve. It may be helpful to use a BOR marker that is distinct from the rest of your markers. You will work a total of 8 short rows, plus one row back to the BOR.

*Note: "Raglan increases" are increases to the front, back, and sleeve sections.*

## Size 1 only:

You will work 4 raglan increases whilst working German short rows, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, k2, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 2 (WS): Make DS, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, p2, turn. (5 stitches increased: 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 3: Make DS, knit to BOR, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, k2, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 4: Make DS, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, p2, turn. (5 stitches increased: 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 5: Make DS, knit to BOR, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k4**, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 6 (WS): Make DS, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p4**, turn. (5 stitches increased: 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Work rows 5 and 6 once more.

Row 7 (RS): Make DS, knit to BOR.

## Size 2 only:

You will work 5 body-only increases whilst working German short rows, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, k2, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

Row 2 (WS): Make DS, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, p2, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 back, 1 front)

Row 3: Make DS, knit to BOR, sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, k2, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

Row 4: Make DS, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, p2, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 back, 1 front)

Row 5: Make DS, knit to BOR, sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k4**, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

Row 6: Make DS, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p4**, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 back, 1 front)

Row 7: Make DS, knit to BOR sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS, k4, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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Row 8: Make DS, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS, p4, turn. (4 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 1 front)

Row 9 (RS): Make DS, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to BOR, M1R. (3 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back)

## Size 3 only:

You will work 4 body-only increases whilst working German short rows, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, k2, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

Row 2 (WS): Make DS, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, p2, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 back, 1 front)

Row 3: Make DS, knit to BOR, sm, k1, sm, knit to next marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k4**, turn. (1 stitch increased: 1 front)

Row 4 (WS): Make DS, purl to BOR, sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to next marker, sm, p1, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p4**, turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 back, 1 front)

Work rows 3 and 4 twice more.

Row 5 (RS): Make DS, knit to BOR.

## Sizes 4-10 only:

You will alternate raglan increases with body-only increases (4 each) whilst working German short rows, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, k(-, -, -, 2, 4) (4, 4, 4, 4, 4), turn. (3 stitches increased: 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 2 (WS): Make DS, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, p(-, -, -, 2, 4) (4, 4, 4, 4, 4), turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 3: Make DS, knit to marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, knit to marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to BOR, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k4**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 4: Make DS, purl to marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p4**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 5: Make DS, knit to marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, knit to marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to BOR, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k(-, -, -, 4, 4) (4, 4, 6, 6, 6)**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

Row 6: Make DS, purl to marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p(-, -, -, 4, 4) (4, 4, 6, 6, 6)**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 7: Make DS, knit to marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, knit to marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to BOR, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit until DS, knit DS stitch, **k(-, -, -, 4, 4) (4, 6, 6, 6, 6)**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 right sleeve, 1 front)

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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Row 8: Make DS, purl to marker, M1Lp, sm, p1, sm, purl to BOR, \*sm, M1Rp, purl to next marker, M1Lp, sm, p1; repeat from \* once, sm, M1Rp, purl until DS, purl DS stitch, **p(-, -, -, 4, 4) (4, 6, 6, 6, 6)**, turn. (6 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back, 2 left sleeve, 1 front)

Row 9 (RS): Make DS, knit to marker, M1R, sm, k1, sm, knit to marker, sm, k1, sm, M1L, knit to BOR, M1R. (3 stitches increased: 1 front, 2 back)

## All sizes:

You now have (272, 300, 324, 352, 384) (416, 436, 472, 496, 500) stitches on your needles. (78, 88, 96, 106, 116) (126, 132, 142, 150, 154) for the front and back, 4 raglan stitches, and (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) (80, 84, 92, 96, 94) for the sleeves.

On the next round you will split the body from the sleeves.

## Body

Next Round: Sm, k1, rm, place (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) (80, 84, 92, 96, 94) stitches on hold, cast on (2, 2, 4, 4, 4) (4, 8, 8, 10, 16) stitches using the backwards-loop cast-on method, rm, k1, rm, work to next marker (resolving any DS as you go), rm, k1, rm, place (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) (80, 84, 92, 96, 94) stitches on hold, cast on (2, 2, 4, 4, 4) (4, 8, 8, 10, 16) stitches using the backwards-loop cast-on method, rm, k1, rm, work to BOR.

You have (164, 184, 204, 224, 244) (264, 284, 304, 324, 344) stitches on your needles.

Continue working the body in stockinette until it measures 28 cm/11 inches from the underarm, or your desired body length minus 4 cm/1.5 inches. Change to your smaller needles and work one round.

Next round: \*K1, p1; repeat from \* to end.

Work ribbing for 4 cm/1.5 inches, or to desired length.

Bind off in pattern or using your preferred bind-off method.

## Sleeves

Using your larger sized needles and MC yarn, starting in the middle of the underarm cast-on stitches, pick up and knit (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) (2, 4, 4, 5, 8) stitch(es) in pattern, knit across the held sleeve stitches, pick up and knit (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) (2, 4, 4, 5, 8) stitch(es). Place BOR marker.

You now have (58, 62, 68, 72, 78) (84, 92, 100, 106, 110) stitches on your needles.

Continue working the sleeve in stockinette until it measures 39 cm/15.25 inches whilst **also** working a decrease round every (14th, 11th, 9th, 8th, 7th) (6th, 5th, 4th, 4th, 4th) round a total of (6, 4, 4, 7, 6) (9, 12, 21, 15, 15) times as follows *and then* every (-, 10th, 8th, 7th, 6th) (5th, 4th, -, 3rd, 3rd) round a total of (-, 4, 6, 4, 7) (6, 6, -, 8, 8) times:

Decrease round: K1, ssk, work in stockinette stitch until 3 stitches remain, k2tog, k1. (2 stitches decreased)

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# INSTRUCTIONS

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*Note: If your row gauge is different from the pattern, or you wish to have a different length sleeve, you will need to adjust the frequency of these decreases accordingly.*

You have worked a total of (6, 8, 10, 11, 13) (15, 18, 21, 23, 23) decrease rounds, and you now have (46, 46, 48, 50, 52) (54, 56, 58, 60, 64) stitches on your needles.

Continue working the sleeve in stockinette stitch until it measures 39 cm/15.25 inches or 4 cm/1.5 inches shorter than your desired sleeve length.

Change to your smaller needle and knit one round.

Next round: \*K1, p1; repeat from to end.

Repeat the above round until cuff measures 4 cm/1.5 inches. Bind off in pattern or using your preferred bind-off method.

Repeat for second sleeve.


## **Collar**

Sew down collar with scrap yarn. If desired, you can thread elastic through the folded collar to ensure it maintains its shape.






Size 1: up to 24 colours









# RAGLANS - PHOTOS



The colour inside the raglan markers changes every 3 rows (DK) or every 5 rows (fingering).

The colours outside of the raglan follow the colour next to it. If your colours are red and blue, and you work a red stitch just before the raglan, then your increase stitch will be blue.

You may have some points with two of the same colour next to each other - this is completely fine.
