



**Size:** UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size.

Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 6 (8) balls (each ball 50g and 120m) of Incanto yarn (43% Viscose, 34% Wool, 12% Polyester, 11% Polyamide), shade no. 30848

**Needles:** Pair of 7.00mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** 2 stitch-holders. Stitch-markers

A snap fastener

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib - Stocking stitch (st st).

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

13 sts and 21 rows measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 7.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** With 7.00 mm needles cast on 61 (66) sts and, for lower border, work 6 rows in K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 3cm. Cont to work in stocking st. When work measures 44 (48)cm from beg, corresponding to 86 (94) rows from border, cast off.

**Right front:** with 7.00 mm needles cast on 23 (26) sts and, for lower border, work 6 rows in K1, P1 rib, starting with P1, corresponding to 3cm. Cont to work as follows: **1st row:** (P1, K1) 3 times (these 6 sts create opening border 6 m.), place 1 stitch-marker, 1 inc (= into same st work K1 and K1 through back loop), and knit to end. **2nd row:** purl until to stitch-marker, then work (P1, K1) 3 times. **3rd row:** (P1, K1) 3 times and knit to end. **4th row:** purl until to

stitch-marker, then work (P1, K1) 3 times. Rep these 4 rows 10 (11) more times. **Next row:** (P1, K1) 3 times and knit to end. **Next row:** purl until to stitch-marker, then work (P1, K1) 3 times. Rep last 2 rows 4 more times. **Next row:** (P1, K1) 3 times, K2tog, end row with K1. **Next row:** purl until to stitch-marker, then work (P1, K1) 3 times. Rep last 2 rows 13 (15) more times. **Next row:** (P1, K1) 3 times and knit to end. **Next row:** purl until to stitch-marker, then work (P1, K1) 3 times. Rep last 2 rows once (twice) more. When work measures 44 (48)cm from beg, corresponding to 86 (94) rows from border, leave first 6 sts onto a stitch-holder. Cast off rem sts for shoulder. Replace onto a knitting needle the 6 border sts and cont in K1, P1 rib until you reach Back half neckline. Cast off these 6 sts.

**Left front:** work as Right Front, working in mirrored shape.

**Sleeves:** work top down. Sew shoulder seam. Join K1, P1 opening-and-neck borders and sew them along all neckline. For each Sleeve, pick up and K 60 (65) sts and work in stocking st, decreasing 1 st at each end, inside 2 sts, every 5th row 18 times (for dec at beg of row K2tog and at end skip 1 st, K1, pass skip st over K1): 24 (29) sts remain. When Sleeve measures 47(51)cm, corresponding to 98 (106) rows from beg, cont to work, for cuff, 6 rows in K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 3cm. Cast off.

## FINISHING

Sew sleeve and side seams. Sew one of the two parts of snap fastener at increasing ends on either Front, in correspondence.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**How much yarn:** 2 balls (each ball 100g and 950m) of Opera yarn (70% Superkid Mohair, 30% Hand Dyed Silk), shade no. 30929

**Needles:** Pair of 4.50mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** EYELET ZIG-ZAG PATTERN:

(worked on a multiple of 13 sts plus 5 sts)

**Row 1:** 1 selvedge st, \* K1 t.b.l. (= through back loop), P1, K1 t.b.l., P1, yon (= yarn on needle), SKIP (= slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1), K6, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l., 1 selvedge st. **Row 2:** work the sts as they appear. **Row 3:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn (= yarn round needle), P1, SKIP, K5, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 5:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn, P2, K1P, K4, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 7:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn, P3, SKIP, K3, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 9:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn, P4, SKIP, K2, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 11:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn, P5, SKIP, K1, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 13:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, yrn, P5, SKIP, K1, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 15:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K6, K2tog, yfrn (= yarn forward and round needle), P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 17:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K5, K2tog, P1, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 19:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K4, K2tog, P2, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 21:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K3, K2tog, P3, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 23:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K2, K2tog, P4, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 25:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K1, K2tog, P5, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 27:** 1 selvedge st, \*(K1 t.b.l., P1) twice, K2tog, P6, yrn, P1; rep from \* ending with K1 t.b.l., P1, K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. **Row 28:** work the sts as they appear. Rep Rows 1-28 throughout.

## TENSION

20 sts and 23 rows measure 10cm square over eyelet zig-zag pattern with 4.50 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 4.50 mm needles cast on 83 (92) sts and work 1 row K. Cont to work Eyelet zig-zag pattern: for larger size begin from 3rd st of pattern, rep motif 6 times, end with K1 t.b.l. and 1 selvedge st. When work measures 31(33)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then dec 1 st at each end, inside 2 sts, on next and every alternate row 4 times. When armhole measures 18 (20)cm, cast off rem 65(74) sts.

**Front:** with 4.50 mm needles cast on 102 sts and work as Back but set up Eyelet zig-zag pattern as follows: 1 selvedge st, K1, begin from 5th st of pattern, rep motif 6 times ending after the 11th st of pattern, K1 and 1 selvedge st. When work measures 31(33)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 7 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then dec 1 st at each end, inside 2 sts, on next and every alternate row 5 times. When work measures 40(43)cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 26 sts, join another ball of yarn and cont to work separately on either side, casting off on neck side every alternate row: 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st twice. When neck shaping measures 9 (10)cm, cast off rem 15sts on each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** with 4.50 mm needles cast on 70 (74) sts and work 1 row K. Cont to work in Eyelet zig-zag pattern: for larger size, work 2 sts in rev st st inside first and last selvedge st. Decrease 1 st at each end on next and every following 14th (20th) row 7(5) times. There are 56 (64) sts. When work measures 49 (51)cm from beg, shape top: cast off 6 (8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then dec 1 st at each end, inside 2 sts, on next and every alternate row 6 times, then on following 4th row twice and, at last, every alternate row 7 (9) times. When top shaping measures 16(18)cm, cast off rem 14 sts.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**Needles:** A pair of 6.00 mm knitting needles  
A 6.00 mm additional knitting needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** moss stitch (moss st)

MOCK FISHERMAN'S RIB

(worked over a multiple of 4 sts):

**1st row:** \* K2, P1, K1; rep from\* to end. **2nd row:** \* K3, P1; rep from\* to end. Rep these 2 rows throughout.

**TENSIONS** (after work has been steamed)

13 sts and 21 rows measure 10cm square over moss st with 6.00 mm knitting needles. 13 sts and 19 rows measure 10cm square over mock fisherman's rib with 6.00 mm knitting needles. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 6.00 mm needles cast on 60 (66) sts and work in moss st. When Back measures 50 (52)cm from beg, cont to work in mock fisherman's rib, working 1 selvedge st at each end only for larger size. When Back measures 65 (69)cm from beg, cast off.

**Front:** With 6.00 mm needles cast on 60 (66) sts and work in moss st. When Front measures 45 (47)cm from beg, cont to work in mock fisherman's rib,

working 1 selvedge st at each end only for larger size. AT THE SAME TIME, shape V-neck: divide work in half and continue separately on either part, decreasing at neck side 1 st, inside 2 sts, every alternate row 15 (17) times. When Front measures 65 (69)cm from beg, cast off 15 (16) sts for left (when the jumper is worn) shoulder and cont to work first 2 sts on right shoulder for Back neck border, inc 1 st at centre (there are 3 sts) and cast off rem 13 (14) sts of right shoulder. When Back neck border is as long as Back neck-edge cast off the 3 border sts.

**Sleeves:** sew shoulder seams. Join neck border to Back neck-edge and sew end to Front neck edge at left shoulder. For each Sleeve, with 6.00 mm needles pick up 43 (46) sts across Front-and-Back armhole and work in moss st, decreasing 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, every 10th row 5 times: 33 (36) sts remain. When Sleeve measures 32 (34)cm from beg, inc 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following alternate row 6 times, then every 4th row 5 times. There are 55 (58) sts. When Sleeve measures 47 (51)cm from beg, cast off all sts.

**Sleeve border:** with 6.00 mm cast on 18 sts and work short rows (wrap& turn technique) in mock fisherman's rib, picking up 4 sts 3 times and 3 sts twice. When border is as large as Sleeve, cast off on same side 3 sts twice and 4 sts 3 times. No sts remain.

## FINISHING

Sew a sleeve border along lower edge of each sleeve. Then sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the item to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**How much yarn:** 5 (7) balls (each ball 50g and 90m) of Wool Mohair yarn (75% Mohair, 25% Wool) shade no. 14468

**Needles:** A 9.00 mm circular needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Five stitch-markers

Two stitch-holders

## STITCHES

**Using circular needles:** CIRCULAR STOCKING

STITCH: all rows K.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

10 sts and 14.5 rounds measure 10cm square over circular st st with 9.00 mm circular needle. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

The jumper is worked up-down in rounds, starting from neckedge.

With 9.00 mm circular needle cast on 40 (44)sts

plus 1 stitch, slip 1 st from right tip to left tip of circular needle, then pass last st over slipped st to close round. Work one round in circular stocking st, placing markers to divide jumper parts as follows: place 1st stitch-marker to indicate round beg (corresponding to Back center), K7 (8) for first **half Back**, place another stitch-marker, K6 (7) for **Sleeve**, place 3rd stitch-marker, K14 (15) for **Front**, place 4th stitch-marker, K6 (7) for other **Sleeve**, place 5th stitch-marker, K7 for other half **Back**. Cont to work in circular stocking st as follows: **next round:** inc 1 st at either side of each stitch-marker, excluding first stitch-marker at Back center (8 incs made). **Next round:** work in circular stocking st. Rep these 2 rounds 19 more times: there are 200 (204) sts and 41 rounds have been worked. Work other 0 (3) rounds. When work measures 28(30)cm from beg, place the 46 (47)sts of each Sleeve onto a stitch-holder and cont to work together the 108 (110) Back and Front sts for 35 (37)cm in circular stocking st. When work measures 63(67)cm from beg, cast off the Back-and-Front 108(110) sts.

**Sleeves** (make 2): work the 46 (47)sts of each Sleeve in circular stocking st for 40(42)cm, then cast off all sts.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**How much yarn:** 6 (8) balls (each ball 50g and 187m) of Puno yarn (75% Virgin Wool and 25% Alpaca), whose 5 (7) balls shade no. 30804 mustard and 1 ball shade no. 30800 beige

**Needles:** A pair of 3.75mm knitting needles  
A 3.00mm circular needle

A 3.75mm circular needle

A 4.00mm circular needle

A double-pointed (Dp) needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Two stitch-holders

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib - P1, K2 rib

STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

REVERSE STOCKING STITCH (REV ST ST): 1 row P, 1 row K.

CIRCULAR STOCKING STITCH: all rows K.

CIRCULAR REVERSE STOCKING STITCH: all rows P.

MINI CHECK PATTERN: (worked over an even number of sts)

**1st row:** \*P2, K2; rep from \* to end. **2nd row:** work stitches as they appear. **3rd row:** \*K2, P2; rep from \* to end. **4th row:** work stitches as they appear. Rep Rows 1-4 throughout.

MEDALLION CABLE: (work over 16 sts)

**1st row:** K4, P3, K2, P3, K4. **2nd and following even rows:** work stitches as they appear. **3rd and 5th rows:** as 1st row. **7th row:** Cr8L (= 8 Left crossed stitches: place next 4 sts frontside on Dp needle, K4, then P3 and K1 from Dp needle), Cr8R (= 8 Right crossed stitches: place next 4 sts backside on Dp needle, K1, P3, then K4 from Dp needle). **9th and 11th rows:** as 1st row. **12th row:** as 2nd row. Rep Rows 1-12 throughout.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

23 sts and 29 rows measure 10cm square over rev stocking st with 3.75 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Front:** with 3.75 mm needles and beige yarn cast on 121 (130) sts and, for lower border, work (2 rows with beige yarn, 2 rows with mustard yarn) 5 times in P2, K1 rib, increasing 1 (2) st(s) on last row (= 6cm and 20 rows have been worked from beg). There are 122 (132) sts. Continue only with mustard yarn,

as follows: 20 (24) sts mini check patt (starting with K2), 3 sts st st, 2 sts rev st st, 3 sts st st, 25 (26) sts rev stocking st, 16 sts medallion cable, 25 (26) rev stocking st, 3 sts st st, 2 sts rev st st, 3 sts st st, 20 (24) mini check patt. When work measures 45 (49) cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 42 (46) sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on either side, casting off on neck edge every alternate row: 5 sts once, 3 sts twice and 1 st twice. AT THE SAME TIME, when work measures 47 (51) cm from beg, shape shoulders, casting off at outer edges every alternate row: 9 (10) sts 3 times. No sts remain.

**Back:** with 3.75 mm needles and beige yarn cast on 111 (121) sts and, for lower border, work (2 rows with beige yarn, 2 rows with mustard yarn) 5 times in P2, K1rib (= 6cm and 20 rows have been worked from beg). Continue only with mustard yarn in rev stocking st. When work measures 46 (50) cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 41 (45) sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on either side, casting off on neck edge every alternate row: 2 sts 3 times and 1 st twice. Shape shoulders as Front and at the same height.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, with 3.75 mm needles and beige yarn cast on 40 (44) sts and, for cuff, work as Back lower border, increasing 4 sts across last row: there are 44 (48)sts. Cont to work in stocking st, inc 1 st at each end on next and every following 8th row 12(14) times. There are 68(76) sts. When Sleeve measures 45(47)cm from beg, cast off all sts.

## FINISHING

Sew sleeve seams. With right side facing, 3.00mm circular needle and mustard yarn, starting from a shoulder pick up and K96 (106)sts around neck, slip 1 st from right tip to left tip of circular needle, then pass last st over slipped st to close round and place 1 stitch-marker to indicate round beg. Work in circular stocking st, place another stitch-marker in correspondence of other shoulder and, at either side of each stitch-marker, dec 1 st every 4th round 5 times to shape neck. AT THE SAME TIME work 15 rounds mustard, 2 rounds beige and 12 rounds mustard. Then continue to work 20 rounds in K1, P1 rib with 3.75mm circular needle. Change to 4.00mm circular needle and work 24 rounds in K1, P1 rib and 3 rounds in circular stocking st. Cast off. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.



**Size:** this garment fits from size UK 10 (14) US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Measurements:** approx 184 x 51cm, excluding fringes

**Skill Level:** easy

**How much yarn:** 8 balls (each ball 100g and 180m) of Messico yarn (53% Virgin Wool, 47% Acrylic Fiber), shade no. 30861

**Needles:** A pair of 5.00 mm long knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** A crochet hook to knot fringes

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** GARTER STITCH (G ST): all rows K.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

10 sts and 22 rows measure 10cm square over g st with 5.00 mm knitting needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

The cape is made up of two rectangles worked separately in the same way and then joined to-

gether. For each piece, with 5.00 mm needles cast on 184 sts and work 51cm in garter st. Cast off centre 28 sts for neck-edge and leave unworked first and last 78 sts for shoulders. Then, using a yarn needle, graft shoulder sts in correspondence with darning st.

## FINISHING

Leaving 17cm free for armholes, sew 34cm side seams.

**Fringes:** cut 7 strands approximately 30cm long. Holding the strands together, fold in half, insert your crochet hook through the first st at side seam of Front lower edge, hook the strands through the st and pull up a loop. Thread the loose ends through the loop and pull tight. Repeat this process along Front lower edge every 4cm approx until opposite side seam. Then continue to knot fringes in the same manner along Back lower edge. Lay out on a flat surface and trim the fringe to neaten up.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**1° ferro:** \* 1 m. diritta, 1 m. rovescia \*, ripetere da \* a \* per tutto il ferro. **2° ferro e ferri pari:** lavorare le m. come si presentano. **3° ferro:** \* 1 m. rovescia, 1 m. diritta \*, ripetere da \* a \* per tutto il ferro. Ripetere sempre questi 4 ferri.

#### CAMPIONI - IMPORTANTISSIMI

**PRIMA DI INIZIARE IL CAPO** A lavoro vaporizzato  
cm 10 x 10 a maglia rasata diritta = 15 m. e 24 ferri.  
cm 10 x 10 a grana di riso doppia = 17 m. e 24 ferri.

#### ESECUZIONE

**Dietro:** avviare 90 (98) m. e, per il bordo, lavorare 10 ferri a maglia legaccio (= cm 3). Proseguire a maglia rasata diritta. A partire dal 37° (33°) ferro dopo il bordo diminuire ai lati, all'interno di 2 m., 1 m. ogni 14 (16) ferri per 9 volte (per le diminuzioni a destra lavorare 1 accavallata semplice e per le diminuzioni a sinistra 2 m. insieme a diritto); rimangono 72 (80) m. A cm 69 (75) di altezza totale, pari a 158 (172) ferri dal bordo, per gli scalfi intrecciare ai lati 4 m., quindi diminuire ancora ai lati, all'interno di 2 m., 1 m. ogni 2 ferri per 3 volte [= 58 (66) m.]. A cm 89 (97) di altezza totale, pari a 206 (226) ferri dal bordo, lasciare le m. in sospeso.

**Davanti destro:** avviare 64 (68) m. e, per il bordo, lavorare 25 m. a grana di riso doppia (= bordo d'apertura) e 39 (43) m. a maglia legaccio. A cm 3 di altezza totale, pari a 10 ferri, proseguire impostando la lavorazione nel modo seguente: 25 m. a grana di riso doppia per il bordo d'apertura e 39 (43) m. a maglia rasata diritta. A cm 46 (48) di altezza totale, pari a 102 (108) ferri dal bordo, per l'apertura della tasca, intrecciare le 26 m. a maglia legaccio e lasciare in sospeso le m. ai lati. **Sottotasca:** con i ferri n. 5 e con il lavoro a rovescio, a cm 29 (31) di altezza totale, pari a 62 (68) ferri dal bordo, riprendere 1 m. in ciascuna delle 26 m. corrispondenti alle 26 m. intrecciate; lavorare cm 17 a m. rasata diritta, pari a 41 ferri, terminando con 1 ferro sul diritto. Sul rovescio del lavoro riprendere la lavorazione sulle m. in sospeso inserendo le m. del sottotasca in

corrispondenza delle m. intrecciate e proseguire come impostato in precedenza. **CONTEMPORANEAMENTE**, a cm 50 (54) di altezza totale, pari a 112 (122) ferri dal bordo, per la prima coppia di occhielli, lavorare 1 ferro nel modo seguente: 4 m. a grana di riso doppia, intrecciare le 3 m. seguenti, lavorare 11 m. a grana di riso doppia, intrecciare le 3 m. seguenti, lavorare 4 m. a grana di riso doppia e le rimanenti m. a maglia rasata diritta. Nel ferro seguente avviare a nuovo 3 m. in corrispondenza delle 3 m. intrecciate per ciascun occhiello. Lavorare 16 ferri, quindi eseguire la seconda coppia di occhielli sovrapposta alla precedente. A cm 69 (75) di altezza totale, pari a 158 (172) ferri dal bordo, per lo scalfi intrecciare a sinistra 4 m., quindi diminuire, all'interno di 2 m., 1 m. ogni 2 ferri per 5 volte [= 46 (50) m.]. #### CONFEZIONE

Tenendo le m. della spalla destra del davanti e quelle della spalla destra del dietro diritto contro diritto, in modo che le m. in sospeso dei 2 ferri siano una accanto all'altra, e usando un terzo ferro, intrecciare le m. delle spalle insieme a diritto, prendendo 1 m. del ferro davanti insieme alla m. corrispondente del ferro dietro. Senza tagliare il filo intrecciare le 16 m. seguenti in sospeso del dietro infine unire la spalla sinistra come indicato per la spalla destra. **TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

12 sts and 20 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 6.00 mm knitting needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 4.00 mm needles cast on 72 sts and, for lower border, work 12 rows K1, P1 corresponding to 4cm; then change to 6.00 mm needles and work in st st, increasing 1 st at each end, inside 3 sts, on next and every following alternate row 8 times: there are 88 sts. For increasing 1 stitch, pick up horizontal yarn between last st worked and next st and knit into the back of it (= M1). When Back measures 62cm from beg, corresponding to 116 rows from border, stop working and leave all sts on additional needle.

**Front:** with 4.00 mm needles cast on 72 sts and, for lower border, work 12 rows K1, P1 corresponding to 4cm; then change to 6.00 mm needles and work in st st, increasing 1 st at each end, inside 3 sts, on next and every following alternate row 8 times: there are 88 sts. When Front measures 46cm from beg, corresponding to 84 rows from border, shape

V-neck: divide work in half and continue separately on either part, decreasing at neck side 1 st every row twice, then every alternate row 15 times. When Front measures 62cm from beg, corresponding to 116 rows from border, place on a stitch-holder the rem 27 sts for each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** with 4.00 mm needles cast on 21 sts and, for cuff, work 12 rows K1, P1 corresponding to 4cm; then change to 6.00 mm needles and work in st st, increasing stitches as follows: **1st row:** \* K1, M1 (pick up horizontal yarn between last st worked and next st and knit into the back of it = 1 st increased), rep from \* ending with K1. There are 41 sts. **2nd row:** purl all sts. **3rd row:** K2, \* K2, M1; rep from \* 17 more times, K3. There are 59 sts. Cont to work in stocking stitch. When Sleeve measures 40cm from beg, corresponding to 80 rows from border, cast off all sts.

## FINISHING

Join right sleeve as follows: place onto a 6.00 mm needle first 27 sts of Back and onto other 6.00 mm needle of pair the right shoulder 27 sts of Front, with right sides facing, and with 6.00 mm additional needle, K2 tog (1 st from front needle and 1 st from back needle), \* K2 tog in the same manner (there are 2 sts on right needle), with left needle pass 1st st on right needle over 2nd st and off right needle; rep from \* to end. Do not fasten off, cast off the next neck-edge 27 sts of Back, then join left shoulder as given for right shoulder.

**Neck border:** with 6.00 mm needles pick up 75 sts around neck-edge, starting and ending at Front centre (V lower point) and work 8 rows K1, P1, corresponding to 3cm, beg and end with K1. Cast off knit-wise. Sew border side seam at Front centre, taking a half st every time at on side and, in correspondence, another half st on opposite side, in order to have a knit column at border V centre.

Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**2nd row:** Knit the P sts and purl the K sts. Rep 2nd row throughout.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

10 sts and 17,5 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 6.00 mm circular needle. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Front:** with 6.00 mm circular needle cast on 18 sts, place 1 stitch-marker, cast on 75 sts, place 1 stitch-marker and cast on 18 more sts. Working in forth-and-back rows, for lower border work **3 rows** in moss st. Work 1 row P, then continue as follows: **next row:** 3 sts in moss st for border (= P1, K1, P1), K1, K1 and K1 tbl into same st (= 1 inc), K to last 4 st, 1 inc, K1 and 3 sts in moss st for border. **Following row:** 3 sts in moss st for border, P to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st for border. Rep last 2 rows until to have 38 sts, 1 SM (= stitch-marker), 75 sts, 1 SM, 38 sts. Work **29 rows** in st st on all sts. **30th row:** P38, cast on 20

new sts for a sleeve and leave rem sts unworked. Then work also on just cast-on sts (there are 58 sts on the needle) as follows, placing a SM (= stitch-marker) after the first 3 border sts in moss st and before the last 3 border sts. **Next row:** 3 sts in moss st for border, K55, turn the work. **Following row:** P55, 3 sts in moss st for border. Rep last 2 rows 10 more times. **Next row:** 3 sts in moss st, K1, K2tog (= 1 dec for neck-shaping), K to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st. **Following row:** 3 sts in moss st, P to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st. Rep last 2 rows 12 more times. Cast off rem 45 sts. Complete Front working other sleeve and neck-shaping, in mirrored shape.

**Back:** with 6.00 mm circular needle cast on 20 sts, purl the 75 sts unworked from Front, and cast on 20 sts (= 30th row). Cont as follows, placing a SM (= stitch-marker) after the first 3 border sts in moss st and before the last 3 border sts. **Next row:** 3 sts in moss st for border, K to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st for border. **Following row:** 3 sts in moss st, P to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st. Rep last 2 rows 21 more times. **Next row:** 3 sts in moss st, K to last 3 sts, 3 sts in moss st. **Following row:** 3 sts in moss st, P42, place 1 SM, 25 sts in moss st (= neck border), place 1 SM, P42, 3 sts in moss st. **Next row:** 3 sts in moss st, K42, 25 sts in moss st, K42, 3 sts in moss st. **Following row:** 3 sts in moss st, P42, 25 sts in moss st, P42, 3 sts in moss st. Cast off all sts.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder and sleeve seams, then join in the middle the two parts of Front, leaving free the diagonal sides.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.


**TENSIONS** (after work has been steamed)

12 sts and 17 rows measure 10cm square over P1, K3 rib with 6.00 mm needles. 41 sts in crossed st measure 30cm approx in width with 6.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

measures 59 (66)cm from beg, corresponding to 88 (100) rows from lower border, shape neck: cast off centre 13 (15) sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on either part, casting off on neck edge every alternate row: 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st once. AT THE SAME TIME, at beg of neck shaping, shape shoulders, casting off every alternate row: 7 sts once and 5 (6) sts 3 times.

**Right Front:** with 5.00mm needles cast on 39 (43) sts. Work lower border as Back, with 1 selvedge st at each end. Change to 6.00mm needles and work as follows: 1 selvedge st, 33 sts in crossed st (follow first 33 Chart sts and key), 4 (8) sts in P1, K3 rib starting with K3, end with 1 selvedge st. When Back measures 19cm from beg, corresponding to 20 rows from lower border, work pocket opening border as follows: leave first 11 sts on a stitch-holder, with 5.00mm needles work 7 rows in stocking st only on next 21 sts and cast off these 21 sts knitways on WS of work.

**Inner pocket:** with 6.00mm needles cast on 17 sts (less than the 21 sts of border as these 17 sts are worked in st st) and work 18 rows, corresponding to 10cm, in stocking st. Now join these st to main piece: work first 11 sts from stitch-holder in crossed st, as 21st Chart row, and work the 17 inner pocket sts increasing 4 sts evenly as 21st Chart row, then work last 7 (11) sts before unworked as 21st Chart row. Cont to work in crossed st. When Right Front measures 28 (30)cm from beg, corresponding to 36 (40) rows from lower border, shape neck, decreasing on RH (right hand) side 1 st on next and every following 3rd row 17 (18) times. AT THE SAME TIME, when Right Front measures 59 (66)cm from beg, corresponding to 88 (100) rows from lower border, shape shoulder: cast off on LH (left hand) side, every alternate row: 7 sts once and 5(6) sts 3 times.

**Left Front:** with 5.00mm needles cast on 39 (43) sts. Work lower border as Back, with 1 selvedge st at each end. Change to 6.00mm needles and work as follows: 1 selvedge st, 4 (8) sts in P1, K3 rib, 33 sts in crossed st (begin from 9th st from Chart), end with 1 selvedge st. Cont to work as given for Right Front, reversing shapings.

**Sleeve:** or each sleeve, with 5.00mm needles cast on 35 sts. Work cuff as Back lower border Back, with 1 selvedge st at each end. Change to 6.00mm needles and work as follows: 1 selvedge st, 4 sts in P1, K3 rib, 25 sts in crossed st (follow centre 25 sts from Chart), 4 (sts in P1, K3 rib starting with K3, end with 1 selvedge st. Inc 1 st at each end, inside selvedge sts, on 3rd and (alternatively every 4th and 6th) following row 6 (7) times: work increased sts in P1, K3 rib. There are 59 (63) sts. When Sleeve measures 47 (51)cm from beg, corresponding to 68 (76) rows from cuff, cast off all sts.

## FINISHING

Sew inner pockets to Fronts on WS and pocket border sides on RS. Sew shoulder seams. **Neck-and-opening border:** with RS facing and 5.00mm needles, pick up 203 (227) sts along Front openings and and Back neck-edge, work 22 rows in P1, K3 rib, starting and ending with K3, and 4 rows in tubular st (=11cm). Then cast off all sts with yarn needle in darning stitch. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**1st row and following odd rows:** (wrongside) work in dc. **2nd row and following even rows:** ch1, into each st work as follows: yarn on hook, insert hook into st and draw it through the st (there are 3 loops on hook), then draw 1st loop through rem 2 loops, completing spike st.

**CRAB STITCH:** This is dc worked from left to right. Start at the left-hand end of the row you are working, insert the hook in the first st to the right and complete a dc stitch. Repeat in the next st to the right and continue to the end of the row.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

9 sts measure 10cm in width over spike st with 7.00 mm hook. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Ch52 and, starting with a dc into 2nd ch from hook, work 150cm in spike st. Fasten off. Keeping the right side of the work inside, fold the rectangle obtained in the direction of the height and sew the left side for approx 50 cm, leaving an approx 25cm opening for the neckline: using crochet hook, join the two layers working a row of dc.

## FINISHING

With RS facing and crochet hook, work a border of 42 dc all around opening, then work other 3 rounds of dc and 1 round of crab st. Fasten off. Shape border, folding it inwards diagonally for approx 12cm and secure it with small hidden stitches, made with sewing thread. With crochet hook, complete lower edge and open side of poncho working a row of crab st. Fasten off.

Then work as follows: **1st round:** \* yarn on hook, insert hook in next ch, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook, miss 1 ch, yarn on hook, insert hook in next ch, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook, yarn on hook and pull through the 3 loops on the hook; ch1; rep from \* all round ending with a ss at top of first

tr2tog. There are (tr2tog) 42 motifs. **2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th rounds:** \* yarn on hook, insert hook in next 1ch-space, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook, yarn on hook, insert hook in following 1ch-space, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook, yarn on hook and pull through the 3 loops on the hook; ch1; rep from \* all round ending with a ss at top of first tr2tog. **6th round:** \* 1 tr in next 1ch-space, ch1; rep from \* all round ending with a ss at top of first tr. Rep these 6 rounds 4 more times, in order to work until to armhole height. Now divide work in half and cont separately for Back and Front, working (tr2tog) 21 motifs on each part.

Fasten off.

**Back:** rep 1st row as given in Front 12 times. Fasten off.

**Sleeves:** (make 2) sew shoulder seams. With 4.00mm hook work around each armhole as follows: rep first 6 rounds of Body, starting and ending with a tr and working (tr2tog) 24 motifs. Finish each Sleeve with a round of crab st. Complete Front-and-Back neck-edge in the same manner.

A nacre button 1.5cm in diameter

## STITCHES

Chain (ch) – Slip stitch (ss)

Double crochet (dc) – Treble (tr)

**RIDGE DOUBLE CROCHET FRONT (RDCF):** work 1 dc inserting hook into front loop only of previous row.

**RIDGE DOUBLE CROCHET BACK (RDCB):** work 1 dc inserting hook into back loop only of previous row.

**FANCY STITCH:**

(work over any number of stitches)

**1st row:** (RS) ch1 (that doesn't count as a stitch), 1 dc into each st, turn. **2nd row:** ch1, 1 RdcF into each st, turn. **3rd row:** ch1, 1 RdcB into each st, turn. **From 4th row:** rep last 2 rows throughout.

**FILET STITCH (ON ROWS):**

(work over any number of stitches)

**1st row:** ch3 (= 1st tr), 1 tr into each st, turn.

**2nd row:** ch3, 1 tr into space between 2nd and 3rd tr of previous row, \* 1 tr into space between next 2 trebles; rep from \* ending with 1 tr into space between last tr and beg ch3 of previous row, then work 1 tr into 3rd of these 3 ch, turn. Rep 2nd row throughout, making sure you always have the same number of stitches while you work, bearing in mind any increases and decreases of course.

**FILET STITCH (ON ROUNDS):**

(work over any number of stitches)

**1st round:** ch3 (= 1st tr), 1 tr into each st, ending with a ss at left of beg ch3 (i.e. "winding" these 3 ch). **2nd round:** yarn on hook, insert hook below space between last closing ss of previous round and treble that precedes it (i.e. proceeding backwards), yarn on hook and work 1 tr, \* 1 tr into space between next 2 trebles; rep from \* ending with 1 ss at left of beg treble (i.e. "winding" this tr). Rep 2nd round throughout, making sure you always have the same number of stitches while you work, bearing in mind any increases and decreases of course.

## TENSIONS

14 sts and 12 rows/rounds measure 10cm square over filet stitch with 4.00 mm crochet hook. 12 sts and 12 rows/rounds measure 10cm square over with 4.50 mm crochet hook. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS SKIRT

**Back and front:** work in one piece, up-down, starting from waistedge. With 4.00mm hook ch 96 (112) and work a row of Filet Stitch. Cont to work Filet Stitch on rows, inc 1 st (= work 2 tr into same space) at each end, inside 9 sts, and at either side of centre 20 sts (there are 4 tr increased) on next and every following 2 rows, working increases above previous: there are 108 sts and 4 rows have been worked. End 4th row with a ss at left of beg ch3 (i.e. "winding" these 3 ch) and cont to work Filet Stitch on rounds, increasing 4 sts every round as given before 4 more times: there are 124 (140) sts. When work measures 28 (30)cm from beg, corresponding to 33 (36) rounds/rows, shape skirt flared, increasing as follows: **34th (37th) round:** work 2 (4) sts, [work 9 (10) sts, 1 inc into next st] 12 times, work 2 (4) sts: there are 136 (152) sts. Work in Filet Stitch until to 38th (41st) round without incs, then work as follows: **39th (42nd) round:** [work 9 (10) sts, 1 inc into next st] 13 times, work 5 (8) sts, 1 inc into next st: there are 150 (166) sts. Cont in Filet Stitch until to 44th (47th) round without incs, then work as follows: **45th (48th) round:** [work 9 (10) sts, 1 inc into next st] 15 times, work 0 (1) st: there are 165 (181) sts. Cont in Filet Stitch until to 51st (54th) round without incs. **Note:** from 52nd (54th) round change hook and work with 4.50mm hook. **52nd (55th) round:** [work 9 (10) sts, 1 inc into next st] 16 times, 4 sts, 1 inc into next st: there are 182 (198) sts. Work in Filet Stitch until to 59th (62nd) round without incs, then work as follows: **60th (63rd) round:** [work 9 (10) sts, 1 inc into next st] 18 times, work 2 (0) sts: there are 200 (216) sts. When work measures 80 (87) cm from beg, corresponding to 96 (104) rounds/rows, fasten off.

**Waistband:** work on opposite side of skirt beg chains. With 4.00mm hook, join yarn with a ss to 1st ch on LH (left side) hand, ch4 plus 1 turning ch (for waistband overlap), turn, 1 dc into 2nd ch from hook, 1 dc into each of next 3 ch, then cont to work in Fancy Stitch on opposite side of skirt beg chains: there are 100 (116) sts. Across 3th row open 1 buttonhole on RH (right hand) side of waistband working as follows: work until to last 2 sts, ch1, miss 1 st, work last st of row. When work measures 3cm from beg, cor-

responding to 6 rows, fasten off. Sew button on waistband overlap, to correspond buttonhole.

### INSTRUCTIONS SWEATER

**Back:** with 4.00mm hook ch 56 (63) and work in Filet Stitch on rows. Inc 1 st at each end on 25th (28th) and on 28th (32nd) row: there are 60 (67) sts. When work measures 26(30)cm from beg, corresponding to 31 (36) rows, shape armholes: leave 4 sts unworked at each end of next row, then dec 1 st, inside 1 st, at each end of next 3 rows: to decrease 1 st work **2tr joined together (tr2tog)**: yarn on hook, insert hook in stitch, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook; yarn on hook, insert hook in next stitch, yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook; yarn on hook and pull through the 3 loops on the hook. There are 46 (53) sts. When work measures 40 (46)cm from beg, corresponding to 48 (55) rows, shape neck: don't work centre 26 (29) sts, join another ball of yarn and cont on either side separately. When work measures 43.5 (49.5)cm from beg, corresponding to 52 (59) rows, fasten off.

**Front:** work up down, starting from neckline. With 4.00mm hook ch 77 (83) and work in Filet Stitch on rows as follows: from **1st to 6th (8th) row:** inc 1 st at beg of row, work in Filet Stitch until to centre st, 3 tr into centre st, cont to work in Filet Stitch until to last but one st, 2 tr into last st. At end of 6th row there are 101 (115) sts. Shape armholes: leave first and last 21 (24) sts unworked and cont only on centre 59 (67) sts as follows: from **7th (9th) to 13th (16th) row:** inc 1 st at beg of row, work in Filet Stitch until to centre st, 3 tr into centre st, cont to work in Filet Stitch until to last but one st, 2 tr into last st. At end of 13th (16th) row there are 87 (99) sts. From **14th (17th) to 16th (21st) row:** work 1st st, tr2tog into next 2 spaces (= 1 tr decreased), cont to work in Filet Stitch until to centre st, work 3 tr into centre st, cont in Filet Stitch

until to last 3 sts, tr2tog into next 2 spaces (= 1 tr decreased), work last st (the number of stitches remains unchanged). To shape Front, don't work centre st, join another ball of yarn and continue separately on either side: there are 43 (49) sts on each side. Work in Filet Stitch on first 43 (49) sts (RH side) dec, inside 1 st, 1 st on RH side and 2 sts on LH side every row 13 (15) times; on following row work (tr2tog) twice, non next row work tr2 tog, then fasten off. On last 43 (49) sts (LH side) work as given for RH side, reversing shape.

**Front Lower Border:** with 4.00mm hook work 56 (63) sts along Front lower edge and work 3 rows of Filet Stitch, corresponding to 2.5cm, fasten off.

**Sleeves (make 2):** for each sleeve, with 4.00mm hook ch 36 (43) and, for cuff, work 6 rows in Fancy Stitch, corresponding to 3cm. Cont to work in Filet Stitch on rows, inc 19 sts evenly across 1st row: there are 55 (62) sts. When work measures 28 (33)cm from beg, corresponding to 30 (36) rows, shape top: leave 4 sts unworked at each end of next row and, AT THE SAME TIME, dec 2 sts at each end of every alternate row 8 (9) times, then dec 5 sts evenly on next row. To decrease 2 sts work 3tr joined together (tr3tog). Work 1 row dc. When work measures 42(49)cm from beg, corresponding to 47 (55) rows from cuff, fasten off.

### FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams, pulling the front shoulders slightly to reach measurement from the shoulders of the Back. Finish neck-edge working 2 rounds dc, ending every round with a ss into 1st st and working dc3tog every round in the middle of Front. Fasten off. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams. Finish lower edge of sweater working 2 rounds dc, ending every round with a ss into 1st st. Fasten off.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.



**Size:** UK 8/10 -US 4/6- EU 34/36

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 4 balls (each ball 50g and 200m) of Vip printed yarn (80% Extrafine Merino Wool, 20% Cashmere) shade no. 31003

**Hooks:** A 4.50mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Stitch-markers

## STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss) - Double crochet (dc)  
Treble (tr)

**3TR JOINED TOGETHER (TR3TOG):** yarn on hook, insert hook in a stitch (or ch), yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook; yarn on hook, insert hook in next stitch (or ch), yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook; yarn on hook, insert hook in next stitch (or ch), yarn on hook and pull a loop through, yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook; yarn on hook and pull through the 4 loops on the hook.

**SHELL:** tr3tog into a ch (or space), ch2, tr3tog into next ch (or same space, as given in instructions)

## TENSION

(tr3tog) 5 motifs and 10 rows/rounds measure approx 10cm square with 4.50 hook. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** work in one piece until to armholes. With 4.50mm hook ch102, 1 ss into first ch to make a ring. Then work as follows: **1st round:** tr3tog into next ch, ch2, tr3tog into next ch (= shell, upper centre of first cap sleeve), ch3, miss next 3 ch, (1 tr into each of next 3 ch, ch1, miss next ch) 11 times, ch2, miss 2 ch, tr3tog into next ch, ch2, tr3tog into next ch (= shell, upper centre of other cap sleeve),

ch3, miss next 3 ch, (1 tr into each of next 3 ch, ch1, miss next ch) 11 times, ch2; end this round and the following rounds with a ss at top of first motif. **2nd round:** a shell into ch2-space of next shell, ch3, 1 dc into next 3ch-space, work (ch4,1 dc into next ch1-sp) until to shell of 2nd cap sleeve, ch3, a shell into ch2-space of next shell, ch3, 1 dc into next 3ch-space, work (ch4,1 dc into next ch1-sp) until to shell of 1st cap sleeve, ch3. **3rd round:** a shell into ch2-space of next shell, ch2, 3 tr into next 3ch-sp, work (ch1, 3 tr into next ch4-sp) until to ch3-sp before shell of 2nd cap sleeve, 3 tr into this space, ch2, a shell into next ch2-sp of next shell, ch2, 3 tr into next 3ch-sp, work (ch1, 3 tr into next ch4-sp) until to ch3-sp before shell of 1st cap sleeve, 3 tr into this space, ch2. Rep 2nd and 3rd rounds 8 more times (= 19 rounds from beg) to complete sleeves and shape armholes. Fasten off. Count 7 motifs of tr at either side of each cap sleeve and place a stitch-marker. Place each of 4 stitch-markers into a ch1-sp after tr-group. Cont to work in rounds. Insert hook into 1st ch1-space on the right of a cap sleeve (= 1st stitch-marker) and join yarn with a dc, ch4, 1 dc into 1st ch1-space on the left of this cap sleeve (= 2nd stitch-marker), joining work below sleeve in this manner. Cont to work as follows: **1st round:** \* ch4, 1 dc into next 1ch-space; rep from \* all round and make a joining below 2nd cap sleeve working between 3rd and 4th stitch-markers as given for 1st and 2nd stitch-markers. End round with ch4 and a ss. **2nd round:** 1 ss and 3 tr into next ch4-sp, \* ch1, 3 tr into next ch4-sp; rep from \* all round ending with ch1 and a ss. Rep last 2 rounds until dress is as long as you desire. If you prefer a dress with a softer line, shape hips, inc any sts above previous incs and work 2nd round rep as follows: into ch4-sp work 3 tr and ch1 in addition. Distribute the increases evenly, if necessary make a paper pattern to follow step by step.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.



**Size:** UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** Maxi Soft yarn (100% Extrafine Merino Wool) 3 (4) balls (each ball 50g and 90m) for each of the following 3 colours: dark rose shade no. 14393, turquoise shade no. 14451 and purple no. 10180; 2 (3) balls in cream no. 978; 1 (2) balls in fuchsia no. 5240 and 1 ball in brown no. 13737

**Needles:** A pair of 5.00 mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib.

STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

## TENSION

17 sts and 24 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 5.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with dark rose yarn cast on 81 (89) sts and, for lower border, work 11 rows K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 5cm, and cont in stocking st with "garter st effect" stripes, alternating colours as follows: 3 rows in turquoise, 18 (20) rows in purple, ALWAYS working first row K on WS of work (in order to create a "garter st effect" stripe, always change colour on WS), 14 (16) rows in dark rose, 3 rows with 2 colours (= work in dark rose until to central st and continue in fuchsia), 9 (11) rows in fuchsia, 8 (10) rows in purple, 28 (30) rows in cream, 12 rows in brown, 17 rows with 2 colours (= work in turquoise until to central st, cont to work in purple). When Back measures 57 (61)cm from beg, corresponding to 126 (136) rows from border, cast off.

**Front:** work as Back, until Front measures 49 (52) cm from beg, corresponding to 106 (114) rows from border. Now shape neck. Cast off centre 21 (25) and cont to work separately on either part, casting off 3 sts at neck edge once and , always at neck


edge, dec 1 st on next and every alternate row 3 times. When neck shaping measures 8(9)cm from beg (= center cast off sts) and 20(22) rows have been worked, cast off rem 24 (26) sts on each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, with dark rose yarn cast on 41 (47) sts and, for border, work 15 rows K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 7cm, and cont to work in stocking st, with "garter st effect" stripes as given for Back and changing colours as follows: 24 (26) rows in turquoise, 16 (18) rows in purple, 18 (20) rows in turquoise, 18 (20) rows in dark rose and 24 (26) rows in purple. AT THE SAME TIME inc 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on 1st and every following 10th row 10 (11) times : there are 61 (69) sts. When Sleeve measures 49 (53) cm from beg, corresponding to 100 (110) rows from border, cast off all sts.

## FINISHING

Sew a shoulder seam. **Neck Border:** with dark rose yarn pick up approx 84 (94) sts around Back-and-Front neck edge and work 7 rows K1, P1 rib, then cast off knitways. Sew other shoulder and neck border seam. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

## Stocking stitch

**Size:** UK 10/14 - US 6/10 - EU 36/40

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 11 (14) balls (each ball 50g and 150m) of Eco Cashmere Soft yarn (100% Recycled Cashmere), shade no. 9485, whose 6 (8) balls for sweater and 5 (6) balls for skirt

**Needles:** Pair of 5.00mm knitting needles. A spare needle.

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Tubular elastic cord to size

### STITCHES

**Using needle:** garter stitch (g st)

Stocking stitch (st st) - K1, P1 rib - K3, P1 rib.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed and washed)

18 sts and 24 rows measure 10cm square over stocking st with 5.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

### INSTRUCTIONS SKIRT

**Front:** with 5.00 mm needles cast on 69 (76) sts and, for lower border, work 4 rows (= 1.5cm) in K3, P1 rib, starting and ending first row with K2. Cont to work in st st. When piece measures 15(17) cm from border, inc 1 st (make one st = M1: with tip of needle, lift strand between last st knit and next st on left-hand needle and knit into back of it to increase one stitch) at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following 24th row 4 times. There are 77 (84) sts. Then work 22 (28) rows straight. Now dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following 4th row 3 times, then every alternate row 5 times and every following 4th row twice more. For dec on RH (right hand) side, work as follows: SKIP (= slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1) and on LH (left hand) side K2tog. AT THE SAME TIME as the 4th decrease, for upper border work 7cm in K3, P1 on rem sts, then cast off evenly.


**Back:** commence to work Back separately in two parts, to create central slit. **FIRST (RH SIDE) PART:** cast on 39(42) sts and work 4 rows (=1.5cm) as follows: 35 (38)sts in K3, P1 rib (starting smaller size with K2 and larger size with K1) and 4 sts in K1, P1 rib, starting with P1 for slit border. Cont as follows: 35(38)sts in st st and 4 sts in K1,P1 rib as given. When work measures 15(17)cm from border, leave sts on a spare needle. **SECOND (LH SIDE) PART:** cast on 39 (42) sts and work 4 rows (= 1.5cm) as follows: 4 sts in K1, P1 rib for slit border and 35 (38) sts in K3, P1 rib, starting with P1 for both sizes. Then work as First Part in mirrored shape, starting with 4 sts in K1, P1 and 35(38) sts in st st. When piece measures 15(17)cm from beg, join the two parts as follows: **Next row (RS):** work 35(38)sts from First Part, place next 4 rib sts of First Part in front of corresponding 4 rib sts of Second Part and work (P2tog : a st of First Part with a st of Second Part in correspondence, K2tog: a st of First Part with a st of Second Part in correspondence) twice, work rem 35 (38)sts of Second Part. Cont to work as Front to end, increasing and decreasing in the same manner.

### INSTRUCTIONS SWEATER

**Back:** with 5.00 mm needles cast on 79 (87) sts and, for border, work 8cm K3, P1 rib, starting and ending with K3 for both sizes. Then work 6 rows in garter st. Cont to work in stocking st. When Back measures 44(48)cm from beg, cast off all sts.

**Front:** with 5.00 mm needles cast on 77 (85) sts and, for border, work 8cm K3, P1 rib, starting and ending with K2 for both sizes. Then work 6 rows in garter st. Cont to work in stocking st. When Front measures 38 (40)cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 21(25) sts, join another ball of yarn and work separately each side, casting off on neck-edge every alternate row: 3 sts once and 2 sts once, then dec 1 st every alternate row 3 times. When neck-shaping measures 6(8)cm, cast off rem 20 (22) sts for each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** for each Sleeve, with 5.00 mm needles cast on 46 (50) sts and, for cuff, work 7cm in K3,P1 rib, starting with K2 and ending with K3 for both sizes. Then work 6 rows in garter st. Cont to work in stocking st, increasing 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on 7th (11th)row and every following 16th (14th) row 6 (7) more times: there are 60 (66) sts. When sleeve measures 50(54)cm from beg, cast off all sts.



### FINISHING

**Skirt:** Sew side seams. Insert elastic cord, cut to size, 1cm down upper edge, through K sts (on RS of work) of rib border.

**Sweater:** Sew a shoulder seam. **Polo neck:** with 5.00 mm needles and RS of work facing, pick up 76 (80) sts around back-and-front neck-edge and work in K3, P1 rib, starting with K2 and ending with K3. When neck measures 15cm from beg, cast off evenly. Sew neck and other shoulder seam. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

## Cable

**Size:** UK 10/14 - US 6/10 - EU 36/40

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 10 (14) balls (each ball 50g and 200m) of Vip yarn (80% Extrafine Merino Wool, 20% Cashmere), shade no. 8435, whose 6 (8) balls for sweater and 4 (6) balls for skirt

**Needles:** Pair of 3.00mm knitting needles

A spare needle. A Double-pointed (Dp) needle

**Hook:** A 3.00mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Tubular elastic cord to size

### STITCHES

**Using needle:** tubular stitch (for casting on and casting off) Stocking stitch (st st) - K1, P1 rib.

CABLE: (worked on 10 sts)

**Row 1:** P2, K6, P2. **Row 2 and following even rows:** K2, P6, K2.

**Row 3:** P2, K6, P2. **Row 5:** P2, 6 Left Crossed stitches (= place next 3 sts onto Dp needle, on frontside, K next 3 sts, K3 from Dp needle), P2. **Rows 7 and 9:** P2, K6, P2. **Row 10:** K2, P6, K2. Rep Rows 1- 10 throughout.

**Using hook:** double crochet (dc).

### TENSION

38 sts and 44 rows measure 10cm square over cable patt with 3.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

### INSTRUCTIONS SKIRT

**Back:** with 3.00 mm needles cast on 130 (142) sts and, for lower border, work 4 rows in tubular st and continue in K1, P1 rib, until border measures 2cm from beg. Then work as follows: 4 (6)sts in stocking st, \* 10 sts Cable, 4 (5) sts in stocking st; rep from \* 9 times, ending with 6 sts in st st for last rep of larger size. When work measures 63(66)cm from beg, work 3.5cm in K1, P1 for upper border. Cast off.

**Front:** commence to work Front separately in two parts,


to create central slit. **FIRST (RIGHT HAND SIDE) PART:** cast on 74 (79) sts and work lower border as Back. Then work as follows: 4 (6)sts in stocking st, \* 10 sts Cable, 4 (5) sts in stocking st; rep from \* 3 times, 10 sts Cable, 18 sts in K1, P1 for slit border. When work measures 30(32)cm from beg, leave sts on a spare needle. **SECOND (LEFT HAND SIDE) PART:** cast on 74 (79) sts and work lower border as Back. Then work as First Part in mirrored shape, starting with 18 sts in K1, P1. When work measures 30(32)cm from beg, join the two parts as follows: **Next row (RS):** work 56 (61)sts from First Part, place next 18 rib sts of First Part in front of corresponding 18 rib sts of Second Part and work (K2tog: a st of First Part with a st of Second Part in correspondence, P2tog: a st of First Part with a st of Second Part in correspondence) 9 times, work rem 56 (61)sts of Second Part. Cont to work as Back to end.

### INSTRUCTIONS SWEATER

**Back:** with 3.00 mm needles cast on 130 (142) sts and, for border, work 4 rows in tubular st and continue in K1, P1 rib until border measures 5cm from beg. Cont to work as given for Skirt Back. When Back measures 52(56)cm from beg, shape shoulders: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 14 rows and 2 sts at beg of next 12 rows. Now shape neck: cast off centre 38 (42)sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on each side, dec for neck 1 st on alternate row once and every following 4th row twice. At the same time, for shoulders continue to cast off 2 sts at beg of other 10 (14) rows.

**Front:** work as Back until Front measures 55(59)cm from beg. Continue to shape shoulders as Back and, at the same time, shape neck: cast off centre 16 (20)sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on each side, dec for neck on next and every alternate row: 2 sts 5 times, then 1 st 4 times.

**Sleeves:** for each Sleeve, with 3.00 mm needles cast on 60 (66) sts and, for cuff, work as lower border of Back. Then work as follows: 4 (6) sts in stocking st, \* 10 sts Cable, 4 (5) sts in stocking st; rep from \* 4 times. At each end, inside first and last 2 sts, inc 1 st on next and every following 14th (10th) row 11 (13) times, then every following 16th (18th) row 3 times, working in patt also new sts. There are 88 (98)sts. When Sleeve measures 51(55)cm from beg, cast off all sts.



### FINISHING

**Skirt:** Sew side seams. With crochet hook work a round of dc all around upper border, inserting elastic cord at the same time.

**Sweater:** Sew a shoulder seam.

**Neck-border:** with 3.00 mm needles and RS of work facing, pick up 152 (164) sts around back-and-front neck-edge and work 3cm in K1, P1. Work 4 rows in tubular st. Cast off, grafting in darning st with yarn needle. Sew border and other shoulder seam. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash pieces carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the pieces to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.



**Size:** UK 10/12-12/14 - US 6/8-8/10 - EU 36/40-38/40

**Note:** for each size larger or smaller, calculate approx 2cm more or less in width and height. The stitches added or decreased must be distributed or eliminated in the parts worked in moss stitch. Buy 50g more or less of yarn for each size.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 3 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of Catena Soft yarn (40% Cotton, 37% Extrafine Merino Wool, 23% Baby Alpaca) n. 30534

**Needles:** A pair of 6.50mm needles

A cable needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** moss stitch (moss st)

Stocking stitch (st st) - K2, P2rib

RIGHT CABLE: (work on 10 sts)


**1st and 3rd rows:** P2, K6, P2. **2nd and even rows:** K2, P6, K2. **5th row:** P2, C6B (= slip 3 sts onto cable needle, hold to the back, K3 sts, K3 sts from cable needle), P2. **7th and 9th rows:** P2, K6, P2. **10th row:** K2, P6, K2. Rep these 10 rows throughout.

LEFT CABLE: (work on 10 sts)

**1st and 3rd rows:** P2, K6, P2. **2nd and even rows:** K2, P6, K2. **5th row:** P2, C6B (= slip 3 sts onto cable needle, hold to the front, K3 sts, K3 sts from cable needle), P2. **7th and 9th rows:** P2, K6, P2. **10th row:** K2, P6, K2. Rep these 10 rows throughout.

DIAMOND: work over 23 sts, following diagram and key.

## TENSIONS

13 sts and 20 rows measure 10cm square over moss stitch with 6.50 mm knitting needles and 2 strands of yarn held together. The 10 sts of each Cable measure 5cm. Take time to check each tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** work using 2 strands of yarn held together. Cast on 73 sts, work 4 rows in moss st for beginning border (= 2cm), then continue as follows: 10 sts in moss st, 10 sts Right Cable, 5 sts in moss st, 23 sts with Diamond Motif (starting with P1 as shown in diagram), 5 sts in moss st, 10 sts Left Cable, 10 sts in moss st. When poncho measures 55cm from beg, shape Front neck by casting off on left side 2 sts on next and every following 4th row 4 times. Then work 8cm straight and complete neck shaping, always on left side, casting on 2 new sts on next and every following 4th row 4 times (neck shaping measures 20cm from beg). When poncho measures 148cm from beg, work 4 rows in moss st for ending border(=2cm), then cast off. For **Collar**, with RS facing, pick up and K 78 along neckline and work 8cm in K2, P2, then cast off. Sew collar and right side seam, with poncho worn.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.

**Needles:** A pair of 6.00 mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** 4 buttons approx 3cm in diameter

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib

DOUBLE MOSS STITCH:

**1st row:** \*K1, P1; rep from \* to end. **2nd row:** work sts as they appear. **3rd row:** \* P1, K1; rep from \* to end.

**4th row:** work sts as they appear. Rep these 4 rows throughout.

## TENSION

11 sts and 16 rows measure 10cm square over double moss st with 6.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** cast on 55 (60) sts and work in double moss st. When work measures 49(51)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 1 st at each end on next and following alternate row twice. When armhole measures 21(23)cm, cast off rem 45 (50) sts.

**Right front:** cast on 35 (38) sts and work in double moss st. While working **15th (19th)** row [approx 9 (11)cm from beg] open first pair of buttonholes as follows: work 3 sts, cast off 2 sts, work next 8 sts, cast off 2 sts and work in double moss st to end. On **16th (20th)** row cast on sts again in place of previous cast-off sts. Work 2nd pair of buttonhole above 1st pair while working **27th (31st)** row [approx 16(18)cm from beg]. When work measures

49(51)cm from beg, shape armhole on LH (left hand) side: cast off 3 sts, then dec 1 st on next and alternate row [32 (35) sts remain]. When armhole measures 12(13)cm, shape neck on RH (right hand) side: cast off first 15 (16)sts, then dec 1 st, inside 2 sts, on next and following 6th row twice. When neck shaping measures 9(10)cm, cast off rem 15 (17) sts for shoulder.

**Left front:** work as Right Front in mirrored shape without buttonholes.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, cast on 31 (33) sts and work in double moss st. Only for larger size, inc 1 st at each end on 13th row. Then, inc 1 st at each end on 27th (31st) row and every following 12th row 5 times: there are 41 (45) sts. When Sleeve measures 54(57)cm from beg, shape top. Cast off 3 (4) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 2 sts at each end, on next and every following 4th row 3 times, then every alternate row 4 times. When sleeve top measures 14(15)cm from cast-off sts, cast off rem 7 (9) sts.

**Pockets:** (make 2) for each pocket, cast on 17 (19) sts, work 20 (24) rows in double moss st, then, for border, work 3 rows in K1, P1 rib. Cast off.

**Collar:** cast on 47 (49) sts and work 12 (16) rows in double moss st. Cont in double moss st, dec 1 st at each end on next and following alternate row. Then, cast off rem 43 (45) sts.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew collar along the neckline, inside 9 (10) cast-off sts on each Front. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams, creating an approx 8cm cuff on each sleeve, as shown in picture. Sew a pocket on each Front, in correspondence of side seam and approx 5(7)cm from lower edge. Finish buttonholes with blanket st embroidery, then sew buttons to correspond buttonholes.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.



**Size:** fits from UK 8 - US 4 - EU 34 to UK 12 - US 8 - EU 38  
**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 1 ball (100g and 950m) of Opera hand printed yarn (70% Superkid Mohair, 30% Silk) shade no. 30930

**Hooks:** A 3.75mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss) - Double crochet (dc)  
Treble (tr) - Double treble (dtr)

**FRONT POST TREBLE (FPTR):** yarn on hook, insert hook around stem of treble from front to back, yarn on hook and pull through a loop, (yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook) twice.

**BACK POST TREBLE (BPTR):** yarn on hook, insert hook around stem of treble from back to front, yarn on hook and pull through a loop, (yarn on hook and pull through two loops on hook) twice.

**RAISED TREBLE PATTERN:**

(work over a number of sts divisible by 4)

**1st round:** ch3 (= 1st tr, work ch3 instead of first tr for every round), 1 tr into each st; end this round and every following round with 1 ss into 3rd of first 3 ch. **2nd and 3rd rounds:** \* 2 FPtr, 2 BPtr; rep from \* to end.

## TENSION

14 dtr and 4 rows/rounds measure approx 10cm square with 3.75 hook. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tensions to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back an front:** work in one piece until to armholes. With 3.75mm hook ch176, 1 ss into first ch to make a ring. Then, for lower border, work the 3 rounds of Raised treble pattern. Cont to work rounds of dtr, working 4 ch at beg of every round and turning

work at end of each round. When 12 rounds have been worked, divide in half Front and Back and cont separately on each piece, working rows of dtr.

**Front: Next row:** work 88 dtr, then, divide work in half to shape neck and cont separately on either side, decreasing every round on neck-edge (2 sts once and 1 st once) 4 times: 12 sts have been decreased. To dec 2 sts work 3dtr joined together (dtr3tog) and to dec 1 st work 2dtr joined together (dtr2tog). When 8 rows have been worked from neck shaping beg, there are 32 sts on each shoulder. Fasten off.

**Back:** work 21 rows of dtr on rem 88 sts. At end, fasten off.

**Sleeves:** sew shoulder seams. For each Sleeve work around Front-and-Back armhole to create 18 space evenly distributed. **First round:** starting from first st of Front, work \* 1 dc, ch3; rep from \* ending into last st of Back and working 1 dc also into shoulder seam. There are 18 spaces of 3 ch. **Next round:** work 1 dtr into beg dc, into dc corresponding to shoulder seam and into last dc, and work 3 dtr into each ch3-space. There are 57 sts. Work 11 more rounds and, at end of every round, turn work. **Next round:** dec 7 sts evenly spaced: 50 sts remain. **Next round:** \* work 1 tr, miss 1 st; rep from \* all round and inc 7 sts evenly spaced (for each inc, work 2 tr into same st) to have 32 sts. Then work the 3 rounds of Raised treble pattern. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Work a round of dc around Back-and-Front neck. Fasten off.

**Note:** wash garment carefully at low temperatures, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the garment to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging it.



# Sweater with diagonal bands

LANA GATTO®

**Size:** UK 10/12 - US 6/8 - EU 36/38

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 12 balls (each ball 50g and 200m) of Vip yarn (80% Merino Extrafine Wool and 20% Cashmere) whose 4 balls for each of the following 2 colours: dark rose shade no. 14624 and brown shade no. 19034 and 2 balls burnt shade no. 13737

**Needles:** Pair of 3.00mm

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** P1, K1 rib.

Tubular stitch (for casting on and casting off).

HALF FISHERMAN'S RIB:

(work over an odd number of stitches)

**1st row:** (WS) K1, \* P1, K1; rep from \* to end. **2nd row:** P1, \* K1b (= knit 1 stitch in the row below: insert needle through centre of st 1 row below next st and knit, slipping st above off needle at same time), P1; rep from \* to end. Rep these 2 rows throughout.

INTARSIA HALF FISHERMAN'S RIB: When joining colours, work as follows so the yarns twist together on the back of the work. This prevents holes forming between colour changes. When working on RS, drop the old colour, pick up the new colour yarn from underneath the old and work to the next change. When working on WS, drop the old colour, pick up the new yarn from underneath the old yarn and continue working until the next change.

## TENSION

30 sts and 64 rows measure 10cm square over Half Fisherman's Rib with 3.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with brown cast on 145 sts. For border, work 2 rows in tubular st and cont to work in K1, P1 rib until work meas-

ures 4.5cm from beg. Then work in Half Fisherman's rib, placing colours to form diagonal bands as follows: 36 sts with brown, 36 sts with burnt and 73 sts with dark rose. When 4 rows have been worked, move 1 stitch on the left (on following 8th row once, then on next 10th row once) 18 times. When Back measures 55 cm from beg, corresponding to 324 rows from border, cast off all sts, colour on colour.


**Front:** with brown cast on 145 sts and work border as Back. Then work in Half Fisherman's rib, placing colours to form diagonal bands as follows: 73 sts with dark rose, 36 sts with burnt and 36 sts with brown. When 4 rows have been worked, move 1 stitch on the right (on following 8th row once, then on next 10th row once) 18 times. When Front measures 44.5cm from beg, corresponding to 258 rows from border, shape neck: cast off centre 21 sts and continue separately on either side, casting off 2 sts on neck edge on every alternate row 3 times, then dec 1 st on neck edge every alternate row 10 times. When neck shaping measures 10.5cm corresponding to 66 rows, cast off rem 46 sts on either shoulder, colour on colour.

**Right Sleeve:** with brown yarn cast on 73 sts and, for cuff, work 2 rows in tubular st and cont to work in K1, P1 rib until work measures 4.5cm from beg. Then work in Half Fisherman's rib, increasing 1 st at each end on next and every 18th row 16 times. There are 105 sts. When sleeve measures 50 cm from beg, corresponding to 290 rows from cuff, cast off all sts.

**Left Sleeve:** work as Right Sleeve, but with dark rose yarn.

## FINISHING

Sew a shoulder seam. **Neck border:** with brown yarn pick up 172 sts around Back-and-Front neck-edge and work 12 rows K1, P1 rib and 4 rows in tubular st. Grafting sts with yarn needle in darning st. Sew other shoulder and neck border seam. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams.





# Checked cardigan

LANA GATTO®

**Size:** UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** Misina yarn (100% Pure Virgin Wool) 4(5) balls (each ball 50g and 100m) for each of the following 2 colours: dark rose shade no. 14624 and brown shade no. 10040

**Needles:** A pair of 5.00 mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib.

STOCKING STITCH (ST ST): 1 row K, 1 row P.

INTARSIA STOCKING STITCH: When joining colours, knit as follows so the yarns twist together on the back of the work. This prevents holes forming between colour changes. When knitting, drop the old colour, pick up the new colour yarn from underneath the old and knit to the next change. When purling, drop the old colour, pick up the new yarn from underneath the old yarn and continue purling until the next change.

## TENSION

18 sts and 24 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 5.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** cast on 40 (44) sts for each of 2 colours (dark rose for left side and brown for right side). For border, work 14 rows K1, P1 rib (corresponding to 7cm). Then work 50 (54) rows in stocking st, corresponding to 21 (22.5)cm, cont in st st but switching colours (brown on left side and dark rose on right side) When work measures 53 (57) cm from beg, corresponding to 110 (120) rows from border, cast off all sts, colour on colour (i. e. using dark rose yarn for dark rose sts and brown yarn for brown sts).

**Right Front:** with brown cast on 50 (54) sts and work border as Back, starting rib with P1. Cont in st st, working first 9 sts in rib for opening border. Then work 50 (54) rows in stocking st, corresponding to

21 (22.5)cm, cont in st st but with dark rose. AT THE SAME TIME, when work measures 23 (25) cm from beg, corresponding to 38 (44) rows from border, shape neck: dec 1 st, inside opening border, every 6th row 4 times, then every 4th row 12 (13) times: for dec, K2tog. When work measures 53 (57) cm from beg, corresponding to 110 (120) rows from border, cast off 25 (28) sts for shoulder and cont on 9 rib sts until to center of Back neck. The 9 rib sts are in the same colour as corresponding Back side. Cast off.


**Left Front:** work as Right Front, reversing shaping and switching the colours: start with dark rose and continue with brown. For each neck dec, SKIP (= slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1).

**Right Sleeve:** work top down. Sew shoulder seams. Join the 2 parts of opening border, then sew this border along Back neck. With dark rose yarn pick up 56 (64) sts all around Back-and-Front right armhole and work in st st, decreasing 1 st at each end, inside 2 sts, every 20th row 5 times. AT THE SAME TIME, when 56 (60) have been worked, corresponding to 23(25) cm from beg, cont in st st with brown yarn. When sleeve measures 42 (46) cm from beg, corresponding to 102 (110) rows, work 20 rows K1, P1 rib (corresponding to 9cm) for cuff, decreasing 10 (12) sts evenly on 1st row. Cast off rem 36 (42) sts.

**Left Sleeve:** work as Right Sleeve, but switching colours: start with brown yarn and continue with dark rose yarn.

## FINISHING

Sew side and sleeve seams.





**Size Sweater:** UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Hat:** one size - **Skill Level:** intermediate

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes

**How much yarn:** Super Soft yarn (100% Extrafine Merino Wool) - for SWEATER : 3(4) balls (each ball 50g and 125m) for each of the following 2 colours: purple shade no. 14647 and light rose shade no. 13210 and 2 (3) balls for each of the following 4 colours: turquoise shade no. 14608, orange no. 14524, fuchsia no. 14446, ocher no. 9425, pink no. 5285 and green no. 5282 - for HAT: 2 balls in purple shade no. 14647

**Hooks:** A 5.00 mm crochet hook

A 5.50 mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Stitch-markers

Galvanized wire rope for hat brim (optional)

## STITCHES

**Using hook:** chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss)

Double crochet (dc) - Treble (tr) - SHELL STITCH:

(work over a number of ch multiple of 3 plus 1)

**1st row:** ch3 (= 1st tr), 1 tr into first ch (= starting half shell), \* miss 2 ch, 1 shell (= 3 tr) into next ch; rep from \* until to last 3 ch, miss 2 ch and work 2 tr into last ch (last half shell); turn. **2nd row:** ch3 (= 1st tr), 1 shell between half shell and next shell, \* 1 shell between 2 shells of previous row; rep from \* ending with 1 tr into 3rd of 3 ch at beg of previous row. **3rd row:** ch3 (= 1st tr), 1 tr into first ch (= starting half shell), \* 1 shell between 2 shells of previous row; rep from \* ending with 1 half shell into 3rd of 3 ch at beg of previous row. Rep 2nd and 3rd row throughout.

## TENSIONS

5 motifs and 10 rows measure 10cm square over shell st with 5.50 mm hook. 18 sts and 20 rounds measure 10cm square over dc with 5.00 mm hook. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## HAT INSTRUCTIONS

With 5.00 mm hook and purple ch6, join into a ring with a ss into first ch. Into this ring work as follows: **1st round:** ch1, 6 dc, 1 ss into first ch. Place 1 stitch-marker into first ch of each round to indicate beginning and move it to first ch of each round from here forward. Work rounds of dc throughout, starting with 1 ch and ending with 1 ss into first ch. **2nd round:** 1 inc (= work 2 dc into same st) 6 times (there are 12 dc). **3rd round:** (1 dc into next st, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 18 dc). **4th round:** (1 dc into next st, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into next st) 6 times (there are 24 dc). **5th round:** (1 dc into each of next 3 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 30 dc). **6th round:** (1 dc into each of next 2 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 2 sts) 6 times (there are 36 dc). **7th round:** (1 dc into each of next 5 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 42 dc). **8th round:** (1 dc into each of next 3 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts) 6 times (there are 48 dc). **9th round:** (1 dc into each of next 7 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 54 dc). **10th round:** (1 dc into each of next 4 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 4 sts) 6 times (there are 60 dc). **11th round:** (1 dc into each of

next 9 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 66 dc). **12th round:** (1 dc into each of next 5 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 5 sts) 6 times (there are 72 dc). **13th round:** (1 dc into each of next 11 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 78 dc). **14th round:** (1 dc into each of next 6 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 6 sts) 6 times (there are 84 dc). From **15th to 30th round:** 84 dc. **31st round:** (1 dc into each of next 13 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 90 dc). **32nd round:** 90 dc. **33rd round:** (1 dc into each of next 7 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 7 sts) 6 times (there are 96 dc). **34th round:** 96 dc. **35th round:** (1 dc into each of next 15 sts, 1 inc into next st) 6 times (there are 102 dc). **36th round:** 102 dc. **37th round:** (1 dc into each of next 8 sts, 1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 8 sts) 6 times (there are 108 dc). From **38th to 45th round:** 108 dc. Fasten off. **Note:** in order to make the hat edge more solid, work another round, holding galvanized wire rope along sts of previous round and crochet over it as you dc in each st.

## SWEATER INSTRUCTIONS


**Back:** with 5.50mm hook and purple yarn ch 70 (76) and, for lower border, work 11 rows dc corresponding to 5.5cm; then cont to work in Shell stitch, changing colour every row as follows: \* ocher, light rose, fuchsia, orange, turquoise, light rose, purple, green and pink; rep from \* 4 more times, ending with 1 row ocher and 1 row light rose (1 row ocher, 1 row light rose, 1 row fuchsia, 1 row orange and 1 row turquoise). When Back measures 47(51)cm from lower border, with purple work 6 rows dc, corresponding to 2.5cm, for upper border. Cut yarns and weave in ends.

**Front:** work as Back.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, with 5.50mm hook and purple yarn ch 34 (40) and work cuff as lower border of Back. Cont to work in Shell stitch (on 1st row start and end with 1 tr. On 2nd row work beg shell and end shell between 2 shells of previous row), changing colours as made for Back and, at the same time, inc 1 st at each end inside first and last stitch every 7th row 6 times to create 2 new shells. When Sleeve measures 47(51)cm from cuff, fasten off. Cut yarns and weave in ends.

Sew 10(12)cm for each shoulder seam. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

**Note:** wash items carefully at low temperature, with a very little fabric softener. Lay the items to dry on a flat surface, without ever hanging them.

**Needles:** A 3.75mm circular needle. A 4.00mm circular needle. A 4.50mm circular needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Stitch-markers

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** tubular stitch (for beginning)

K1, P1 rib – Stocking stitch (st st)

PEACOCK STITCH:

(work on a number of sts multiple of 23)

**1st row:** K to end. **2nd row:** P to end. **3rd row:** \* (K2tog) 4 times, (yarn forward, K1) 7 times, yarn forward, (K2tog t.b.l.) 4 times; rep from \* to end. **4th rows:** P to end. Rep these 4 rows throughout.

## TENSION

22 sts and 23 rows measure approx 10cm square over peacock stitch with 4.50 mm circular needle and Camel Hair yarn and Paillettes yarn held together. Take time to check each tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**NOTE:** work with Camel Hair yarn and Paillettes yarn held together

**Back:** with 3.75mm circular needle cast on 117 sts and, working in forth-and-back rows, for border work 2 rows in tubular st. Change needles and with 4.00mm needles work 18 rows in K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 7cm approx. Cont to work in peacock st with 4.50mm needles: across 1st row, considering first and last sts as selvedge sts, place 1 stitch marker every 23 sts to have 5 motifs. When work measures approx 47cm from border and 108 rows

have been worked, shape shoulders: cast off 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Now cast off centre 25 sts and continue separately on either side: for each shoulder dec on alternate row: 8 sts once more and 7 sts 3 times. AT THE SAME TIME, shape neck by casting off at each neck edge: 4 sts once, 2 sts once and 2 sts once.

**Front:** work as Back until to 44cm from border and 102 rows have been worked. Shape neck: cast off 19 sts and continue separately on either side, casting off at neck-edge every alternate row: 4 sts once, 3 sts once and 1 st 5 times. AT THE SAME TIME shape shoulders as Back and at the same height.

**Sleeves:** for each Sleeve with 3.75mm circular needle cast on 63 sts and, working in forth-and-back rows, for border work 2 rows in tubular st and 18 rows in K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 7cm approx. Change needles and with 4.50mm needles work in peacock st: across 1st row, considering first and last sts as selvedge sts, place 1 stitch marker every 19 sts to have 3 motifs. When work 3rd row, inc evenly 4 sts for each motif, working as follows: 1 selvedge st, K2, \* K2tog, K2 (yarn forward, K1), 8 times, K1, K2 tog t.b.l.; rep from \* 3 times, K2, 1 selvedge st: there are 75 sts. When Sleeve measures 42cm from beg and 94 rows have been worked, shape top. Cast off 9 sts at beg of next 6 rows and 7 sts at beg of 2 following rows. AT THE SAME TIME, from 97th row cont in peacock st only on central motif and work in stocking st rem side sts, corresponding to 1st and 3rd previous motifs. Cast off rem 13 centre sts.

**Neck Border:** with 3.75mm circular needle cast on 63 sts and, working in forth-and-back rows, work 2 rows in tubular st and 12 rows in K1, P1 rib. Leave sts on needle.

## FINISHING

Using only Camel Hair yarn, sew a shoulder seam. Sew sts, one by one, of Neck border last row, round back and Front neck-edge with backstitch. Sew other shoulder and neck border seam. Set in sleeves, then sleeve and side seams.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 7 (9) balls (each ball 50g and 125m) Camel Hair yarn (60% Extrafine Merino Wool, 40% Camel) shade no. 5401

**Needles:** A pair of 4.50mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K2, P1 rib - K2, P2 rib  
Stocking stitch (st st)

## TENSION

22 sts and 26 rows measure 10cm square over stocking stitch with 4.50 mm knitting needles. Take time to check each tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 4.50mm needles cast on 96 (105) sts and, for border, work 16 rows K2, P1 rib, corresponding to 6cm. Cont to work in stocking st. When work measures 38 (40)cm from beg, shape armholes by casting off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then, work first and last 4 sts K2, P2 rib, and, inside these sts for raglans, dec at each end 2 sts on next and every alternate row 5 (6) times then 1 st every following alternate row 20 (21) times. When armhole measures 20(22)cm and 52 (56) rows have been worked, cast off rem 26 (29) sts.

**Front:** work as Back until to 38 (40)cm from beg.

Now shape armholes by casting off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then, work first and last 4 sts K2, P2rib, and, inside these sts for raglans, dec at each end 2 sts on next and every alternate row 4 (5) times then 1 st every following alternate row 18 (19) times. When armhole measures 17.5(19.5)cm and 46(50) rows have been worked, cast off rem 34(36) sts.


**Right sleeve:** with 4.50mm needles cast on 44 (50) sts and, for border, work 20 rows K2, P1, corresponding to 8cm. Cont to work in stocking st, increasing 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following 6th (4th) row twice (4 times), then every following 8th row 9 times. There are 66(76) sts. When Sleeve measures 40 (42)cm from beg, shape armholes by casting off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Then, work first and last 4 sts K2,P2rib, and, inside these sts for raglans, dec at beg of row (corresponding to Front) 1 st every 4th row 7 (6) times, then 1 st every alternate row 8 (12) times; at the same time, at end of row (corresponding to Back) dec 1 st every 4th row 4 times, then 1 st every alternate row 17 (19) times: 20 (25) sts rem. For shoulder cast off at beg of next and alternate row: 7 (8) sts twice, then rem 6 (9) sts.

**Left sleeve:** work Left Sleeve as given for Right Sleeve, but in mirrored shape.

## FINISHING

Sew raglan seams, leaving .right back raglan open.

**Neck:** with 4.50mm needles pick up 94 (110) sts around Back and Front neck-edge and work 20 rows K2, P2 rib. Cast off in rib. Sew right Back raglan and neck seam. Sew sleeve and side seams.

# Elongated cable jumper

LANA GATTO®

**Size:** oversize UK 10/12 - US 6/8 - EU 36/38

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 11 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of New Baby Alpaca 70 yarn (70% Baby Alpaca, 30% Extrafine Merino Wool) shade no. 30177

**Needles:** A pair of 3.00mm knitting needles  
A pair of 3.25mm knitting needles. A pair of 4.00mm knitting needles. A pair of 4.50mm knitting needles. An additional 4.50mm knitting needles. A double pointed (Dp) needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Red, green and white stitch-markers

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** tubular stitch (for beginning) - K1, P1 rib  
Stocking stitch (st st)- Reverse stocking stitch (rev st st)  
ELONGATED CABLE STITCH: [work on a number of sts multiple of 28 sts (to have 2 motifs) + 14 sts + 2 selvedge sts] **1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th and 9th rows:** 1 selvedge st, \* P2, K10, P2; rep from \* to last st, end with 1 selvedge st. **2nd row and following even rows:** work the sts as they appear. **11th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* P2, C10B (= slip 5 sts onto Dp needle, hold to the back, k5 sts, k5 sts from Dp needle), P4, K10, P2; rep from \* ending with P2, C10B, P2 and 1 selvedge st. **13th, 15th, 17th and 19th rows:** work as 1st row. **21st row:** work as 11th row. **23rd, 25th, 27th and 29th rows:** work as 1st row. **31st row:** 1 selvedge st, \* P2, K10, P4, C10B, P2; rep from \* ending with P2, K10, P2 and 1 selvedge st. **33rd, 35th, 37th and 39th rows:** work as 1st row. **41st row:** work as 31st row. **42nd row:** work the sts as they appear. Rep from 3rd to 42nd row throughout.

## TENSION

Take time to check each tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success. Before starting work, knit an about 15x15cm sample with 4.50mm needles and ELONGATED CABLE STITCH, at end cast off and wash it. Then, based on the resulting stitches and rows, make any changes to the cast-on stitches and centimetres in height.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 3.00mm needles cast on 128 sts and work 2 rows in tubular st, Change needles and with 4.00mm needles work 6cm in K1, P1 rib. Cont to work in elongated cable st with 4.50mm needles: across 1st row, considering first and last sts as selvedge sts, place 1 stitch marker every 14 sts to have 9 motifs. When work measures approx 58cm from beg (checking tension on a washed sample, as indicated) place stitch-markers on RH (right hand) side of work: (red) for first shoulder and (green) for first neck-edge: (count 9 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker) 4 times, count 8 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker, (count 2 sts and place 1 green stitch-marker) twice, (count 3 sts and place 1 green stitch-marker) twice, count 10 sts and place 1 white stitch-marker (only to highlight center of work). Working in elongated cable st, cont with "wrap and turn short rows" to shape first shoulder and neck-edge RH side: **1st row:** work all sts until to last green stitch-marker, remove stitch-marker which won't be needed anymore, yarn on front, slip next st to right needle, yarn on back (= 1 slipped st), turn. **Note:** Every time you reach a stitch marker, pass it to the right needle. **2nd row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work until to last red stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. **3rd row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work until to last green stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. **4th row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work until to last red stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. Always rep 3rd and 4th rows until you have removed all green stitch-markers and 4 of the 5 red stitch-markers. **Following row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work until to last red stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. **Following row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, replace red stitch-marker (to delimit

shoulder sts), work to end. Turn work and replace stitch-markers on LH (left hand) side of work, (red) for other shoulder and (green) for other neck-edge: (count 9 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker) 4 times, count 8 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker, (count 2 sts and place 1 green stitch-marker) twice, (count 3 sts and place 1 green stitch-marker) twice. Working in elongated cable st, cont with "wrap and turn short rows" to shape second shoulder and neck-edge LH side as given for RH side, then leave sts on an additional needle.

**Front:** work as Back until you have worked 20 rows less than when you started working Back "wrap and turn short rows". Commence to work Elongated cable stitch starting from 21st row (without crossing stitches for cables across this row). Place with stitch-marker at center of work and green stitch-marker for neck-edge on RH side: count 7 sts from white central stitch-marker, place 1 green stitch-marker, count 3 sts (place 1 green stitch-marker, count 2 sts) twice, place 1 green stitch-marker, count 1 st, place last green stitch-marker. Work as follows: **1st row:** work all sts until to last green stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. **2nd row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work to end, turn. Always rep 1st and 2nd rows until remaining with only 1 green stitch-marker, ending with a row on WS of work. Place the red stitch-markers for right shoulder and other green stitch-markers to complete neck shaping: (count 9 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker) 4 times, count 8 sts and place 1 red stitch-marker; (count 1 st, place 1 green stitch-marker) 4 times, count 1 st thus arriving at the green stitch-marker left previously. Working in Elongated cable st, cont with "wrap and turn short rows" to shape 1st shoulder and neck-edge RH side, working as given for Back and ending with a row on WS of work. Now work a row on the 128 sts of Front. Turn work (= WS), place the green stitch-markers for neck-edge LH side and continue as given for first side, until remaining with only 1 green stitch-marker. Now place the red stitch-markers for left shoulder and other green stitch-markers to complete neck shaping, as given for first side. Working in Elongated cable st, continue with "wrap and turn short rows" to shape 2nd shoulder and neck-edge LH side, working as given for 1st side.

**Sleeve:** with 3.00mm needles cast on 62 sts and work 2 rows in tubular st. Change needles and with 3.25mm needles work 18 rows K1, P1, inc 6 sts evenly across last row. Change needles and continue with 4.50mm needles as follows: 1 selvedge st, 3 sts in stocking st, 2 sts in rev stocking st, 56 sts in Elongated cable st, 2 sts in rev stocking st, 3 sts in stocking st, 1 selvedge st. Dec 1 st at each end on next and every following 10th row 9 times, working increased sts in Elongated cable patt. When Sleeve measures 42cm from beg, shape top. Starting from RH side place 1 green stitch-marker every 9 sts 4 times, then, starting from LH side place 1 red stitch-marker every 9 sts 4 times: 14 sts remain at center. Working in Elongated cable st, continue with "wrap and turn short rows" to shape sleeve. **1st row:** work all sts until to last red stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. **2nd row:** with yarn on front slip 1st st to right needle, work until to last green stitch-marker, remove it, 1 slipped st, turn. Always rep 1st and 2nd rows until all the stitch-markers have been removed, complete last row, then cast off.

**Neck border:** with 3.00mm needles cast on 90 sts and work 2 rows in tubular st. Change needles and with 3.25mm needles work 10 rows K1, P1. Leave all sts on needle.

## FINISHING

Join shoulder seams, from side edge to red stitch-marker, using 3 needle cast off technique (= hold the needles with RS towards each other. Use a third needle and knit 1 st on each needle together, knit two more together and then slip 1st st over the next. Repeat knitting 2 tog and then cast off), after having joined the 2nd shoulder, cast off all sts left on needle on Back and Front neck-edge. Sew Neck border around neck-edge in darning st. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams.

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib - Stocking stitch (st st)

**Using hook:** double crochet (dc)

## TENSION

10 sts and 16 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 6.50 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS


**Back:** with 6.50 mm needles cast on 43 (47) sts. For border, work 8cm K1,P1. Cont to work in stocking st. When work measures 20(22)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last

2 sts, on next and alternate row: 33 (37) sts remain. When armholes measures 20(22)cm shape shoulders: dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 3 sts, on next and every alternate row 10 (11) times. AT THE SAME TIME as last dec, inc 1 st into first and last st (for inc work K1 and K1 tbl into same st), work 5 more rows in stocking st, then cast off.

**Front:** work as Back.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder and roll neck seams. Sew side seams, leaving borders open to create slits. With crochet hook work a round of dc all around each armhole. Fasten off.

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib - Stocking stitch (st st)

**CABLE:** (work over 18 sts)

**1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th and 9th rows:** P3, K12, P3. **2nd and following even rows:** work sts as they appear.

**11th row:** P3, C12F (= slip 6 sts onto Dp needle, hold to the front, K6 sts, K6 sts from Dp needle), P3. **13th, 15th, 17th and 19th row:** P3, K12, P3. **20th row:** work sts as they appear. Rep these 20 rows throughout.

**TENSION** (after work has been steamed)

16 sts and 22 rows measure 10cm square over st st with 6.00 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS


**Back:** with 6.00 mm needles cast on 75(83) sts. For border, work 6cm K1, P1. Cont to work in stocking st. When work measures 34(36)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows and 2 sts at beg of following 2 rows, then dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last 2 sts, on next and every following alternate row 5(6) times. When armholes measures 19(21) cm cast off rem 55 (61) sts.

**Front:** cast on 76 (84) sts and, for border, work 6cm K1, P1 rib. Then work as follows: 29 (33) sts in stocking st, 18 sts Cable, 29 (33) sts in stocking st. When work measures 34(36)cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows and 2 sts at beg of following 2 rows, then dec 1 st inside first and last 2 sts on next and every alternate row 4 (5) times. When work measures 46(49)cm from beg, shape neck: cast off centre 14 (16)sts and cont separately on either side. On neck edge cast off 4 sts once, then dec 1 st, inside 2 sts, on next and every alternate row 5 times. When neck shaping measures 7(8)cm cast off rem 13(15)sts on each shoulder.

## FINISHING

Sew a shoulder seam. **Neck:** with RS of work facing, pick up approx 68 (80) sts around Front and Back neck edge, work 10cm K1, P1, then cast off. Sew other shoulder and neck seam.

**Armhole borders:** for each border, with RS of work facing pick up approx 68 (78) sts around each armhole, work 2 rows K1, P1, then work 3rd row dec 2 sts at each end inside first and last 2 sts (for dec, K3 tog) to shape border. Work another row K1, P1, then cast off. Sew side and armhole border seams.

A 7.00 mm Tunisian hook

**Needles:** A pair of 6.00mm knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib

**Using hook:** Chain (ch) – Slip stitch (ss)

Double crochet (dc) – Half treble (htr)

**DOUBLE CHAIN (FOR BEGINNING):** ch2, insert hook in the leftmost loop of the 2nd ch from hook. Yarn over, pull a loop through that same leftmost loop: there are 2 loops on the hook. Yarn over once again. Pull through both loops on the hook, completing one double chain stitch. \* Insert hook under the leftmost loop of previous stitch. Yarn over. Draw up a loop: there are 2 loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook, completing the double chain stitch. Rep from \* to obtain desired number of sts.

**CROCHET MOSS STITCH:**

(work over an odd number of stitches)

**1st row:** ch2 (corresponding to 1 htr), \* 1 htr inserting hook, from the front, into the horizontal bar under the closure of the st of the previous row (so the closure of the st will be in relief on the back), 1 half double st inserting the crochet hook, from the back, into the horizontal bar under the closure of the st of the previous row (so the closure of the st will be in relief on the front); rep from \* to end, turn. Rep 1st row throughout.

**TUNISIAN RIB STITCH:** (each round is made up of a forward row and a return row)

**1st forward row:** insert hook into 1st st, yarn over hook and draw a loop, \* insert hook from front to back and from right to left, around bar made up of next htr (or side stitch, while picking up sts for sleeves), yarn over hook and draw a loop; rep from \* to end. There are on hook as many loops as there are the stitches underneath.

**1st return row:** do not turn and work as follows: yarn on hook and draw through first loop on hook (first st closed), \* yarn on hook and draw through next 2 loops on hook; rep from \* to end. Only a loop remains. First round is finished.

**2nd forward row:** \* yarn on hook, insert hook into front vertical bar of next 2 sts, yarn on hook and draw a loop; rep from \* to end.

**2nd return row:** do not turn and work as follows: yarn on hook and draw through first loop on hook (first st closed), \* yarn on hook and draw through next 2 loops on hook; rep from \* to end. Only a loop remains. 2nd round is finished.

**3rd forward row:** \* yarn on hook, miss first vertical bar, (first bar is on backside), insert hook into front vertical bar of next 2 sts (first bar is on frontside and 2nd bar is on backside), yarn on hook and draw a loop; miss next vertical bar (the bar is on backside), rep from \* to end, yarn on hook, insert hook into last st and draw a loop.

**3rd return row:** do not turn and work as follows: yarn on hook and draw through first loop on hook (first st closed), \* yarn on hook and draw through next 2 loops on hook; rep from \* to end. Only a loop remains. Third round is finished. Rep 3rd round (3rd forward row and 3rd return row) throughout, creating a vertical rib, very similar to K1, P1 rib in the knitting work.

## TENSION

13 sts and 13 rounds (= 13 forward rows and 13 return rows) measure 10cm square over Tunisian rib stitch with 7.00 mm Tunisian crochet hook. Take time to check each tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 4.50mm hook ch 69 (77) using Double chain method for beg and, for border, work 14 rows (corresponding to 10cm) of Crochet Moss Stitch. Fasten off. With 7.00 mm Tunisian hook pick up the 69 (77) sts on last row of moss st border and work in Tunisian Rib Stitch, dec 7 sts evenly across first row: there are 62 (70) sts. When 45 (53) rounds in Tunisian Rib Stitch have been worked, corresponding to 35(41)cm, fasten off.

**Front:** with 4.50mm hook ch 69 (77) using Double chain method for beg and, for border, work 14 rows (corresponding to 10cm) of Crochet Moss Stitch. Fasten off. With 7.00 mm Tunisian hook pick up the 69 (77) sts on last row of moss st border and work in Tunisian Rib Stitch, dec 7 sts evenly across first row: there are 62 (70) sts. When 35 (43) rounds in Tunisian Rib Stitch have been worked, corresponding to 27(33)cm, omit to work 18 (20) centre sts and continue separately on either side, dec 1 st

every round (i.e. 2 rows: forward and return) on neck-edge 5 times. When 45 (53) rounds in Tunisian Rib Stitch have been worked, corresponding to 35(41)cm, fasten off. 17 (20) sts remain on either shoulder.

**Right sleeve:** sew right shoulder seam. For Sleeve, with 7.00 mm Tunisian hook pick up 48 (56) sts around right armhole, whose 24 (28) sts around Back and 24 (28) sts around Front. Work in Tunisian rib stitch, dec 1 st at each end on 8th and every following 9th (10th) round 7 times. When 68 (74) rounds in Tunisian Rib Stitch have been worked, corresponding to 52(56)cm, fasten off. 34 (42) sts remain.


**Cuff:** with 4.50mm hook pick up the 34 (42) sts on Sleeve last round and work a row of htr, inserting hook under horizontal sts of Rib stitch and, from Front to Back and from Right to Left, around bars created by V-sts, increasing 4 sts evenly across this row: there are 38 (46) sts. Cont to work in crochet moss st. When Cuff measures 6cm and 8 rows have been worked, work a row dc, then fasten off.

**Neck:** with 4.50mm hook pick up 69 (73) sts around neck-edge and work a row dc, then pick up all 69 (73) sts with 6.00mm knitting needles and work 22cm in K1, P1 rib. Cast off loosely. Sew Left shoulder and neck seam, sewing on RS last 11cm of Neck to fold it, as shown in picture.

**Left sleeve:** work Left Sleeve as given for Right Sleeve.

## FINISHING

Sew sleeve and side seams.





# Openwork jumper

LANA GATTO®

**Size:** UK 10 (14) - US 6 (10) - EU 36 (40)

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 7 (8) balls (each ball 50g and 233m) of Perlata d'Australia yarn (100% Merino Pure New Wool) shade no. 14594

**Hook:** A 3.00 mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using hook:** chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss)

Double crochet (dc) - Treble (tr) - Double treble (dtr)

CHECKERED STITCH:

(work over a multiple of 5 plus 1 plus 1 turning ch)

**1st row:** into 2nd ch from hook work a group (= 1 dc, ch3 and 3 tr), \* miss 4 ch, 1 group into next ch; rep from \* ending with a dc into last ch, turn. **2nd row:** ch4, 2 tr into first dc, \* a group into 3ch-sp of next group; rep from \* to last group, into 3ch-sp of last group work: 1 dc, ch3, 1 tr and 1 dtr closed tog; turn. **3rd row:** ch1 (that doesn't count as stitch throughout), 1 dc into (tr and dtr) closure, ch3, 3 tr into next 3ch-sp, \* a group into 3ch-sp of next group; rep from \* ending with 1 dc into 4th beg ch of previous row, turn. Rep 2nd and 3rd rows throughout.

**Note:** to even out the checkered stitch, before starting the openwork stitch, work the last 2 rows in the following way (the last-but-one row can be worked on any row of the checkered stitch). **Last-but-one row:** ch1 and 1 dc into first st, \* ch4, 1 dc into next 3ch-sp, rep from \* ending with ch4 and 1 dc into last st; turn. **Last row:** 1 dc into each st and 4 dc into each 4ch-sp, to obtain same number of sts as 1st row.

OPENWORK STITCH: (work over an odd number of sts)

**1st row:** ch4 (corresponding to 1 tr and 1 ch), miss 1 st, 1 tr into next st, \* ch1, miss 1 st, 1 tr into next st; rep from \* to end, turn. **2nd row:** ch4, (corresponding to 1 tr and 1 ch), miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next st, \* ch1, miss 1 ch, 1 tr into next st; rep from \* to end, turn. **Following rows:** work as 2nd row. **Last row:** 1 dc into each st and into each ch of previous row.

## TENSIONS

34 sts and 16 rows measure 10cm square over checkered st with 3.00 mm hook. 5 rows measure approx 11cm in height over openwork st with 3.00 mm hook. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** ch132 (152) and work as follows: \* 12 rows in checkered st decreasing 9 (11) sts evenly across last row, 5 rows in openwork st increasing 9 (11) sts evenly across last row; rep from \* to end of Back. When work measures 35(40)cm from beg, corresponding to 55 (64) rows, shape armholes: omit to work 5 sts at beg and at end of next 2 rows: 112 (132) rows remain. **Note:** the st count al-


ways refers to the checkered st work and, consequently, to the number of beginning chains. In the decreases for the neckline, if done in the openwork stitch, 9 (11) sts less than those indicated must be considered [example: if for the central decreases of the neckline it is indicated to omit work on 50 (56) sts, the actual sts will be 41 (45)]. When work measures 51 (58)cm from beg, corresponding to 81 (93) rows, shape neck: omit to work centre 50(56) sts and cont to work separately on either part, decreasing on neck edge 2 sts every row twice. When work measures 54 (61)cm from beg, corresponding to 85 (97) rows, fasten off: 27(34) sts remain on each shoulder.

**Front:** ch142 (162) and work as follows: \* 12 rows in checkered st decreasing 11 (13) sts evenly across last row, 5 rows in openwork st increasing 11 (13) sts evenly across last row; rep from \* to end of Front. When work measures 35(40)cm from beg, corresponding to 55 (64) rows, shape armholes: omit to work 5 sts at beg and at end of next 2 rows: 122 (142) rows remain. **Note:** see previous Note for Back; for the decreases made in the openwork stitch, consider 11 (13) sts less than those indicated [example: if for the central decreases of the neckline it is indicated to omit work on 68 (74) sts, the actual sts to suspend will be 57 (61)]. When work measures 46 (53)cm from beg, corresponding to 74 (86) rows, shape neck: omit to work centre 68 (74)sts and cont to work separately on either part. When work measures 54 (61)cm from beg, corresponding to 85 (97) rows, fasten off: 27 (34) sts remain on each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** for each Sleeve, ch77 (92) and work as follows: \* 12 rows in checkered st, dec 8 (11) sts evenly across last row, 5 rows in openwork st, inc 8 (11) sts evenly across last row; rep from \* to end of Sleeve. Inc 1 st at each end on 5th and every following 4th row 10 times: there are 97 (112) sts. When work measures 43 (47)cm from beg, corresponding to 68 (75) rows, shape sleeve top: omit to work 5 sts at beg and at end of next row, then dec at each end every row: 2 sts 16(19) times, then 1 st 6 times: 11 (14) sts remain. When work measures 57 (63) cm from beg, corresponding to 91 (101) rows, fasten off.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. **Neck border:** work 2 rounds dc all round neck edge. Fasten off. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams.

**Note:** figures in brackets ( ) refer to larger size. Where only one figure is given this refers to both sizes.

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 11 (13) balls (each ball 50g and 140m) of Feeling yarn (70% Extrafine Merino Wool, 20% Silk, 10% Cashmere) shade no. 19022

**Hook:** A 3.75 mm crochet hook

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

**Other items:** Rope knitting mill

## STITCHES

**Using hook:** chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss)

Double crochet (dc) - Half treble (htr) - Treble (tr)

FANCY STITCH: (work over a multiple of 3 sts plus 2 ch)

**1st row (WS of work):** ch3 (corresponding to 1st treble), 1 tr into each st to end, turn. **2nd row:** (RS of work) ch3 (corresponding to 1st treble), miss 1 st, \* 3 tr into next st (= shell), miss 2 sts; rep from \* until to last 3 sts, work 3 tr into next st, miss following st, 1 tr into last st, turn. **3rd row:** rep 1st row. **Note:** while working, keep in mind that the treble row will always be on WS, while the tr3-shell row will always be on RS.

## TENSION

19 sts and 11 rows measure 10cm square over fancy st with 3.75 mm hook. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Right back bodice:** work widthwise, starting from Back center. Ch83 (92) and work in fancy st. When work measures 8 (10)cm corresponding to 9 (11) rows, shape armhole as follows: **10th (12th) row:** 1 ss into each of first 20 (22) sts (= armhole decreased sts), cont to work in fancy st, using htr (instead of tr) for first 2 shells; at end, turn. **11th (13th) row:** work in fancy st until to last 8 sts (= armhole decreased sts), turn. **12th (14th) row:** 1 ss into each of first 4 sts (=armhole decreased sts), cont to work in fancy st to end, turn. **13th and 14th (15th and 16th) rows:** work in fancy st decreasing 2 sts every row on right side: 47(54) sts remain. When work measures 15 (17) cm from beg, corresponding to 17 (19) rows, fasten off.

**Left back bodice:** work as Right Back Bodice, in mirrored shape.

**Back skirt:** work on lower edge of Left and Right Back bodice parts. Before starting work, join two Back bodice parts with a chain as follows: join yarn with a ss to lower left corner of Right Back, ch 7 (10), 1 ss into lower right corner of Left Back. Fasten off. Now work along Back lower edge. Work 29(32) tr on Right Back edge, 7 (10) tr on new chains, 29 (32) tr on Left Back edge: there are 65 (74) sts. Cont to work in fancy st, inc 1 st at each end on next and every alternate row 5(7) times and 1 st at each end every row 8 (6) times: there are 91 (100) sts. When

Skirt measures 23(26)cm, corresponding to 25 (29) rows, dec 1 st at each end on next and every following 8th row 3 times. When Skirt measures 45 (50)cm, corresponding to 50 (55) rows, fasten off. There are 85 (94) sts.

**Front bodice:** ch65 (74) and work in fancy st, inc 1 st at each end on 3rd and every following alternate row 10 times: there are 85 (94) sts. When work measures 25 (28)cm from beg, corresponding to 26 (31) rows, shape armholes: omit 5 sts at each end once, then dec 1 st at each end every row 4 times: 67 (76) sts remain. When work measures 38 (43) from beg, corresponding to 42 (47) rows, shape neck: leave unworked the centre 29 (32) sts, join another ball of yarn and continue separately on either side, dec 1 st at neck edge on alternate row once: 18(21) sts remain on each shoulder. When work measures 43,5 (48,5)cm from beg, corresponding to 46 (51) rows, fasten off.


**Front skirt:** with RS facing, work 65 (74) dc on opposite side of Front Bodice foundation chains and work as given for Back Skirt.

**Sleeves:** for each Sleeve, ch41 (50) and work in fancy st, inc 1 st at each end on 5th and every following 5th row 9 times: there are 59 (68) sts. When work measures 45 (49) cm from beg, corresponding to 50 (54) rows, shape top: leave unworked first and last 5 sts and, AT THE SAME TIME, at each end dec 1 st every row 13(16) times, then dec 2 sts every row 3 times: 11 (14) sts remain. When work measures 60 (66)cm from beg, corresponding to 66 (73) rows, fasten off.

**Cord:** with working yarn and rope knitting mill make a cord approx 260cm long.

## FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams (the front shoulder stitches correspond to the sides of the back rows, so they may have slightly different measurements, to be "evened out" during sewing, to make the difference invisible). Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve and side seams. Insert Cord, crossing it between the shells on 2nd row of either Back part, starting from lower edge up to desired height: approx 25(28)cm.





# Ribbing dress

LANA GATTO®

**Size:** UK 10 - US 6 - EU 36

**Skill Level:** intermediate

**How much yarn:** 11 balls (each ball 50g and 170m) of Mini Soft yarn (100% Extrafine Merino Wool Machine Washable) shade no. 19034

**Needles:** A pair of 3.00mm

**Hook:** A 2.75mm crochet hook, knitting needles

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** tubular stitch (for beginning) K1, P1 rib.

**Using hook:** double crochet (dc).

## TENSION

47 sts and 42 rows measure approx 10cm square over K1, P1 rib (without stretching ribs) with 3.00 mm knitting needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Back:** with 3.00mm needles cast on 131 sts. For small border, work 2 rows in tubular st and cont in K1, P1 rib, starting and ending with K1. When Back measures 45cm from beg, dec 1 st at each end, inside first and last st, on next and following 18th row (127 sts remain), then every following 16th row 3 times (121 sts rem). When Back measures 85cm from beg, shape armholes: cast off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then work a dec row (RS) as follows: (K1, P1) 3 times, K3(=K1, P1, K1)tog (= 2 decs made), work in rib until to last 9 sts, K3(=K1, P1, K1)tog (= 2 decs made), (P1, K1) 3 times. Work 11 rows K1, P1 rib, then work a dec row as previous (109 sts rem). When armholes measures 18cm, shape shoulders: cast off 5 sts at beg of next 4 rows and 4 sts at beg of following 6 rows. Cast off for neck rem centre 65 sts.


**Front:** work as Back until Front measures 85cm from beg. Shape armholes as Back but, when armhole measures 2cm, at the same time shape neck by casting off centre 49 sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on either side, de-

creasing 2 sts on neck edge (as given for Back) inside 6 sts on next and every following 8th row 3 times then every following 10th row once. Shape shoulders as Back at the same height.

**Sleeves:** for each sleeve, with 3.00mm needles cast on 61 sts. For small border, work 2 rows in tubular st and cont in K1, P1 rib, starting and ending with K1. Inc 1 st at each end, inside first and last st, on next and every following 10th row 18 times: there are 97 sts. When Sleeve measures 50cm from beg, shape top: cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then dec 2 sts (=K3tog as given for Back) at each end, inside 6 sts, on next and every alternate row 3 times, every following 4th row 13 times and every following alternate row twice. When sleeve top measures 15cm, cast off rem 19 sts.

## FINISHING

Using yarn needle sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew sleeve seams, then sew side seams, leaving 25cm open on left side, with dress worn, to create slit. With crochet hook work a round of dc around neck edge. Fasten off.





**Size:** UK 10 - US 6 - EU 36

**Skill Level:** advanced

**How much yarn:** 8 balls (each ball 25g and 212m) of Silk Mohair yarn (75% Superkid Mohair, 25% Silk) shade no. 30140

**Needles:** A pair of 4.50mm knitting needles  
A 4.50mm circular needle

**Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

## STITCHES

**Using needles:** K1, P1 rib.

EYELET STITCH:

(work over a multiple of 20 sts plus 2 sts)

**1st row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K7, K3tog, yarn forward (= yfd), K2tog, K5, yfd, K3, yfd; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **2nd row and following even rows:** work P to end. **3rd row:** 1 selvedge st, \* yfd, K7, K3tog, yfd, K2tog, K3, yfd, K5; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **5th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K1, yfd, K7, K3tog, yfd, K2tog, K1, yfd, K6; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **7th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* yfd, K1, yfd, K7, K3tog, yfd, K6, K2tog, K1; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **9th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* (K1, yfd) twice, K7, K2tog, K5, K2tog, K2; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **11th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K2, yfd, K1, yfd, K7, K2tog, K3, K2tog, K3; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **13th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K3, yfd, K1, yfd, K7, K2tog, K1, K2tog, K4; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **15th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K2, yfd, K3, yfd, K5, K2tog, yfd, K3tog, K5; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **17th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K1, yfd, K5, yfd, K3, K2tog, yfd, K3tog, K6; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **19th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* yfd, K7, yfd, K1, K2tog, yfd, K3tog, K7; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **21st row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K1, yfd, K1, K2tog, K6, yfd, K3tog, K7, yfd; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **23rd row:** 1 selvedge st, \* yfd, K3, K2tog, K5, K2tog, K7, yfd, K1; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **25th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K5, K2tog, K3, K2tog, K7, yfd, K1, yfd; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st.

**27th row:** 1 selvedge st, \* K6, K2tog, K1, K2tog, K7, (yfd, K1) twice; rep from \* ending with 1 selvedge st. **28th row:** work P to end. Rep these 28 rows throughout.

## TENSION

19 sts and 23 rows measure 10cm square over Eyelet stitch with 4.50 mm knitting needles and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** work in one piece with two strands of yarn held together throughout. With 4.50mm needles cast on 82 sts. For border, work 4 rows in K1, P1 rib, corresponding to 2cm. Cont to work in Eyelet Stitch. When work measures 39cm from beg, create sleeves: cast on 20 new sts at end of next 10 rows. AT THE SAME TIME, when work measures 49cm from beg shape neck: cast off centre 18 sts, join another ball of yarn and cont separately on either side, casting off at neck edge on every following alternate row: 3 sts once and 2 sts 6 times. When work measures 55cm from beg (= middle of work), cast on at neck edge on every following alternate row: 3 new sts 5 times, then cast on 18 new sts at centre, rejoining the two parts of work. Shape sleeves when work measures 67cm from beg, by casting off 20 sts at end of next 10 rows. When work measures 108cm from beg, work 4 rows in K1, P1 rib for border, then cast off.

## FINISHING

**Cuffs (make 2):** for each cuff, with 4.50mm needles and RS of work facing pick up and K approx 34 sts along sleeve edge and work 7 rows in K1, P1 rib, then cast off.

**Neck border:** with 4.50mm circular needle and RS of work facing pick up and K approx 108 sts all around neck edge and work 5 rows in K1, P1 rib, then cast off. Sew side and sleeve seams.
