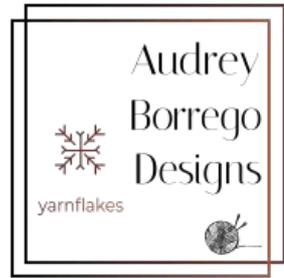


Lenore



Notes

Lenore is a V-neck raglan cardigan with colourwork on the body. Knitted from the top-down, it is joined in the round on the body, then steeked. The small colourwork motifs are intuitive and easy to follow. Short-rows are worked on the back of the hem to make it longer than the fronts'. Optional short-row bust darts are also included in the pattern. The sample used four contrasting colours and held three colours at once on some rounds. The colourwork is very adaptable and can be knitted in various colour combinations. The pattern features three versions of the Chart : a coloured one like the sample, one with a single CC and one to colour in. This allows you to adapt the motifs to be worked with as many or as little colours as desired, per round and overall.

Yarn :

Five colours of heavy fingering or sport weight yarn in the following amounts :

MC : 950 (**1000** / 1100 / **1200** / 1350), **1400** (1500 / **1600** / 1700 / **1850**) meters

1040 (**1095** / 1205 / **1315** / 1480), **1535** (1640 / **1750** / 1860 / **2025**) yards

CC1 : 20 (**30** / 40 / **50** / 65), **75** (85 / **95** / 110 / **120**) meters

25 (**35** / 45 / **55** / 75), **85** (95 / **105** / 120 / **135**) yards

CC2 : 40 (**50** / 60 / **70** / 85), **95** (105 / **115** / 130 / **140**) meters

45 (**55** / 65 / **80** / 95), **105** (115 / **125** / 140 / **155**) yards

CC3 : 15 (**20** / 25 / **35** / 45), **50** (60 / **70** / 85 / **95**) meters

20 (**25** / 30 / **40** / 50), **55** (65 / **80** / 95 / **105**) yards

CC4 : 30 (**40** / 50 / **60** / 75), **85** (95 / **105** / 120 / **130**) meters

35 (**45** / 55 / **65** / 85), **95** (105 / **115** / 135 / **145**) yards

The sample is knit with Manos del Uruguay Alpaca Heather in Toast (MC), Bing Cherry (CC1), Honey Comb (CC2), Cinnamon (CC3) and Bark (CC4).

Needles :

Main Fabric : 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

Ribbing : 3 mm (US 2.5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or sizes required to get gauge

Gauge :

24 sts x 33 rnds per 10 cm – 4" with larger needles in stockinette after blocking

24 sts x 27.5 rnds per 10 cm – 4" with larger needles in stranded knitting after blocking

To swatch in colourwork, CO 40 sts and work the repeat marked in thick borders on the Chart in the round for a minimum of 40 rnds.

Note : Row / Rnd Gauge is important for the raglan and V-neck depth, as well as the colourwork length on the body. If you cannot get close enough, the pattern will instruct you on how to adjust your measurements.

Notions :

Stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors, 4 buttons (sample size 22 mm – ¾")

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold, Row counter recommended

Sewing machine and / or crochet hook of the same size as the main needles for steeking

Techniques used :

Top down raglan cardigan

Upper body knitted flat with simple increases for the raglan and V-neck shaping

Body joined in the round with a steek

Optional German short-rows bust darts (based on Cup size)

Stranded knitting in the round with two and three colours per round (per sample)

Charts provided : sample's colours, single CC and colour-in

German short-rows on the hem for a longer back

2/2 ribbing

Sleeves knitted in the round and tapered with decreases

Picked up neckband worked with buttonholes.


Sizes : 1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5), 6 (7 / 8 / 9 / 10)

All measurements are those of the finished cardigan.

Choose a size with about 5 to 15 cm – 2 to 6" positive ease at bust.

Shown in size 3 on a 90 cm – 35 1/2" bust.

Bust circ. includes 5 cm – 2" for the neckband when closed.

Abbreviations :

- CO : cast-on / BO : bind-off
- st(s) : stitch(es) / rnd(s) : round(s)
- MC : main colour / CC1, 2, 3, 4 : contrast colour 1, 2, 3, 4
- BOR : beginning of round
- RS : right side / WS : wrong side
- m : marker / pm : place marker / sm : slip marker / rm : remove marker
- inc : increase / dec : decrease
- work as est. : work as established, knitting the knit sts and purling the purl sts
- k : knit stitch / p : purl stitch
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- m1R : make 1 right, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from back to front, knit through the front loop (1 inc)
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- ssk : slip the next two sts knitwise separately then knit them together through their back loop (1 dec)
- DS : double stitch for German short rows (counts as only 1 st)
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Colourwork

Catching floats : in sport weight, you can catch floats when skipping more than 6 stitches. You may do it more often if you prefer, just make sure not to catch a float in the same place in two consecutive rounds.

Colour dominance : the CC will form the motifs while MC will be the background colour. To have consistent colour dominance : hold the CC to the left and always carry them under MC without twisting the strands.

On the rnds with multiple CC, choose any order you like between them and maintain it. Place the CC you want to be more dominant on the left, the other CC in the center, and the MC on the right.

Carrying unused colours : instead of cutting CC when they're not used for several rnds, you can carry them along the BOR by loosely twisting them with the MC every 4 rnds.

Reading the Chart

Knitting in the round, always read the Chart from right to left.

Work the first 2 sts of the Chart at the beginning of the round. Then work the 20 sts repeat marked in thick borders 10 (**11** / 12 / **13** / 14), **15** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**) total times, to last 10 sts. Finally, work the last 10 sts of the Chart at the end of the round.

Back neck

With larger needles and MC, CO 57 (**59** / 61 / **63** / 65), **67** (67 / **69** / 71 / **73**) sts using a stretchy cast-on method like the [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

set-up row (WS) : p2, pm, p3, pm, p4, pm, p3, pm, p33 (**35** / 37 / **39** / 41), **43** (43 / **45** / 47 / **49**), pm, p3, pm, p4, pm, p3, pm, p2

Fronts : 2 sts each

Back : 33 (**35** / 37 / **39** / 41), **43** (43 / **45** / 47 / **49**) sts

Sleeves : 4 sts each

Raglan : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 57 (**59** / 61 / **63** / 65), **67** (67 / **69** / 71 / **73**) sts

Raglan

The cardigan now has five main sections : the two fronts, the back and the two sleeves. These sections are separated by the raglan lines.

Adjusting for a different row gauge :

Check the armhole and V-neck depth for your size on the measurements table page 3.

If you reach this measurement before finishing the following section : spread the missing increases in a row to reach the required final st count for each section (sleeves, fronts and back), then skip to the « Separate body and sleeves and adding the steek » section.

If you do not reach this measurement after finishing the following section, continue knitting flat in stockinette (knitting the RS rows and purling the WS rows) until you get to the correct length. This will slightly smooth your V-neck, but it will all blend nicely once the neckband is added.

Part 1 :

You will be increasing along the raglan lines on the body as well as on the sleeves every other row and on the neck edges every 4th row.

row 1 (RS) : k1, m1L, (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to 1 st before end, m1R, k1 (10 inc)

rows 2, 4 (WS) : purl

row 3 (RS) : (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to end (8 inc)

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 11 (**12** / 14 / **16** / 17), **18** (20 / **21** / 22 / **23**) times.

Fronts : 35 (**38** / 44 / **50** / 53), **56** (62 / **65** / 68 / **71**) sts each

Back : 77 (**83** / 93 / **103** / 109), **115** (123 / **129** / 135 / **141**) sts

Sleeves : 48 (**52** / 60 / **68** / 72), **76** (84 / **88** / 92 / **96**) sts each

Raglan : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 255 (**275** / 313 / **351** / 371), **391** (427 / **447** / 467 / **487**) sts

Sizes 1 to 6 ONLY :

Part 2 :

You will be increasing along the raglan lines on the body, sleeves and on the neck edges every 4th row.

row 1 (RS) : k1, m1L, (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to 1 st before end, m1R, k1 (10 inc)

rows 2, 4 (WS) : purl

row 3 : knit

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 5 (**5** / 3 / **2** / 2), **2** (- / - / - / -) times.

Fronts : 45 (**48** / 50 / **54** / 57), **60** (- / - / - / -) sts each

Back : 87 (**93** / 99 / **107** / 113), **119** (- / - / - / -) sts

Sleeves : 58 (**62** / 66 / **72** / 76), **80** (- / - / - / -) sts each

Raglan : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 305 (**325** / 343 / **371** / 391), **411** (- / - / - / -) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Separate body and sleeves and adding the steek

You will now place the sleeve sts on hold, casting on new sts for each underarm as well as join the two fronts, casting on new sts to create the steek in between and join the work in the round. To do so, you can use the [backwards loop cast-on](#).

(Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

next row (RS) :

knit to m, rm, k3, rm,

place next 58 (**62** / 66 / **72** / 76), **80** (84 / **88** / 92 / **96**) sts on hold,

CO 9 (**13** / 18 / **20** / 24), **28** (34 / **38** / 42 / **46**) sts for the underarm,

rm, k3, rm, knit to m, rm, k3, rm,

place next 58 (**62** / 66 / **72** / 76), **80** (84 / **88** / 92 / **96**) sts on hold,

CO 9 (**13** / 18 / **20** / 24), **28** (34 / **38** / 42 / **46**) sts for the underarm,

rm, k3, rm, knit to end

pm, CO 5 sts for the steek

Join to work in the rnd and **PM for BOR**.

207 (**227** / 247 / **267** / 287), **307** (327 / **347** / 367 / **387**) body sts + 5 steek sts

Body

Bust darts

If you wear a cup size greater than B or your full bust measurement is more than 8 cm – 3 ¼" larger than your upper chest measurement, consider adding bust darts on the body. See instructions on page 9.

body rnd : knit to steek m, sm, p1, k3, p1

Work the body rnd until the body measures about 8 cm – 3 ¼" from the underarm, measuring along the side of the body, or 27 cm – 10 ½" less than desired length.

Per the pattern's row gauge and instructions, the colourwork pattern will measure about 22 cm – 8 ¾", and the ribbed hem 5 cm – 2" at the front.

Adjusting for a different rnd gauge :

If your colourwork rnd gauge is different than the pattern's, adjust the length knitted on the body before starting the Chart to make sure you will end up with the desired total body length.

Here is the formula to calculate how long your Colourwork will be :

Metric : 610 / Your Numbers of Rnds per 10 cm = Length of the Colourwork Motif

Imperial : 244 / Your Numbers of Rnds per 4" = Length of the Colourwork Motif

example : if your colourwork rnd gauge is 27.5 rnds per 10 cm – 4", then

610 / 27.5 = 22

244 / 27.5 = 8.87

The colourwork will be 22 cm – 8 ¾" long.

Colourwork :

Change your needle size if necessary to get the correct colourwork stitch gauge.

To help you keep track of the colourwork repeats, place additional markers as follows :

- after the first 2 sts,
- every 20 sts : 10 (**11** / 12 / **13** / 14), **15** (16 / **17** / 18 / **19**) times.

5 sts remain between the last new marker and the steek marker.

Work the Colourwork Chart once completely (rnds 1 to 61).

See Colourwork and Reading the Chart help on page 4.

Cut all CC.

next rnd (MC) : knit to steek m, sm, p1, k3, p1

Hem :

Switch to smaller needles.

next rnd : remove BOR m, k2, m1L, knit to steek m (removing all colourwork m), remove steek m, BO next 5 sts (*1 inc*)

208 (228 / 248 / 268 / 288), 308 (328 / 348 / 368 / 388) hem sts

You will now knit the hem ribbing flat. Note that on the first RS row, you already worked the first st as part of the steek bind-off, so simply start with the ribbing repeat.

hem row 1 (RS) : k1, *k2, p2* to last 3 sts, k3

hem row 2 (WS) : p1, *p2, k2* to last 3 sts, p3

Work hem rows 1-2 until the ribbing measures about 4.5 cm – 1 ¾".

You will work some short rows at the back of the hem to make it longer than the front's.

(German short-rows tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

short row 1 (RS) : work as est. to last 37 (**39 / 42 / 45 / 48**), **51** (54 / **57 / 60 / 63**) sts, turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, work as est. to last 37 (**39 / 42 / 45 / 48**), **51** (54 / **57 / 60 / 63**) sts, turn

short row 3 : DS, work as est. to 8 sts before DS, turn

Work short row 3 a total of 6 times.

next row (RS) : DS, work as est. to end, closing the short-rows by knitting or purling the DS normally

next row (WS) : work as est. to end, closing the remaining DS

Resume working hem rows 1-2 until the hem measures about 5 cm – 2" at the front edge or desired length, ending after a WS row.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Steek

Weave in the ends of yarn on the body away from the steek.

You will cut the steek through the middle of the center st.

Firstly, reinforce the steek with a sewing machine or by hand : sew two straight lines on either side of the steek, along the purl sts.

Then create two crochet chains on either side of the center st. Trap each leg of said center st with one leg of the adjacent sts.

Then cut in the center.

Neckband

Left and Right refer to the cardigan once worn.

When picking up sts for the neckband, pick up from the first st on the edges, which is aligned with the first knit st next to the purl st of the steek.

With smaller needles, RS facing and MC, start at the bottom of the right front hem : pick up and knit

2 out of 3 sts along the right front every stitch along the shoulders and back neck cast-on,

2 out of 3 sts along the left front until the bottom hem.

Make sure you pick up a multiple of 4 sts + 2.

neckband row 1 (WS) : *p2, k2* to last 2 sts,
p2
neckband row 2 (RS) : *k2, p2* to last 2 sts,
k2

Work neckband rows 1-2 until the neckband
measures about 2.5 cm – 1".

Buttonholes :

Place 4 markers spaced evenly on the right
side of the neckband, between the bottom of
the cardigan hem and the beginning of the
steak on the V-neck point.

*Note : if you made the body longer or
simply want more buttons, adjust the
number of markers here.*

buttons row 1 : (work as est. until the
button m, BO 2 sts) x 4, work as est. to end
buttons row 2 : (work as est. until the
button hole, CO 2 sts with the [backwards
loop cast-on](#)) x 4, work as est. to end

Resume working neckband rows 1-2 until
the neckband measures about 5 cm – 2",
ending with a WS row.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern, using a
larger needle if necessary.

Sleeves

With larger needles, RS facing and MC,
start at the center of the underarm cast-on
sts :

pick up and knit 5 (7 / 9 / **10** / 12), **14** (17 /
19 / 21 / **23**) sts from the underarm,

pick up 1 extra st in the corner,

knit the 58 (**62** / 66 / **72** / 76), **80** (84 / **88**
/ 92 / **96**) held sleeve sts

pick up and knit 1 extra st again in the
corner,

pick up and knit 4 (6 / 9 / **10** / 12), **14** (17 /
19 / 21 / **23**) from the rest of the underarm.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR.

69 (77 / 86 / **94** / 102), **110** (120 / **128** /
136 / **144**) sleeve sts

Sizes 1 and 2 ONLY :

next rnd : k1, k2tog, knit to end (1 dec)

68 (**76** / - / - / -), - (- / - / - / -) sleeve sts

Sizes 7 and 8 ONLY :

next rnd : (k1, k2tog) x 2, knit to last 6 sts,
(ssk, k1) x 2 (4 dec)

- (- / - / - / -), - (116 / **124** / - / -) sleeve sts

Work in stockinette, knitting every rnd,
until sleeve measures 7 (**5** / 5 / 7 / 5), **1** (7 /
7 / 4 / **1**) cm – 2 ¾ (**2** / 2 / **2 ¾** / 2), ½ (2
¾ / **2 ¾** / 1 ½ / ½)" from the underarm.

dec rnd : k1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1
(2 dec)

Continue in stockinette, repeating the dec
rnd every

3.5 (**3** / 2 / **1.5** / 1.5), **1.5** (1 / 1 / 1 / 1) cm

1 ½ (**1 ¼** / ¾ / ½ / ½), ½ (½ / ½ / ½ /
½)"

8 (**11** / 16 / **20** / 22), **26** (27 / **31** / 35 / **39**)
more times

48 (**52** / 52 / **52** / 56), **56** (60 / **60** / 64 /
64) sleeve sts

Continue in stockinette, knitting every rnd,
until sleeve measures 42 cm – 16 ½" or 5
cm – 2" less than desired length.

Cuff :

Switch to smaller needles.

cuff rnd : *k2, p2* to end

Work the cuff rnd until the cuff measures 5
cm – 2" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

Finishing

You can sew down the steak edges to the
inside of the cardigan to make them lay flat,
or enclose them by sewing a ribbon over
them.

Weave in remaining ends and block the cardigan.

Buttons :

Sew the buttons on the left side of the neckband in front of the button holes.

Bust darts instructions :

Work the body until it measures 2 cm – 3/4" from the underarm.

CUP C AND D ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 8 cm – 3 1/4" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : k45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to BOR M, sm, k1, p3, k1, sm, p45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 3 : DS, work as est. to 4 (**4** / 5 / **5** / 6), 7 (7 / **8** / 8 / **8**) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, work as est. to 4 (**4** / 5 / **5** / 6), 7 (7 / **8** / 8 / **8**) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short-rows 3-4 two more times.

short row 9 : DS, work as est. to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally.

CUP E AND F ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 12 cm – 4 3/4" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : k45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to BOR M, sm, k1, p3, k1, sm, p45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 3 : DS, work as est. to 3 (**3** / 4 / **4** / 5), **5** (6 / **6** / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

short row 4 : DS, work as est. to 3 (**3** / 4 / **4** / 5), **5** (6 / **6** / 7 / 7) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short-rows 3-4 three more times.

short row 11 : DS, work as est. to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally.

CUP G AND H ONLY

Full bust measurement at least 16 cm – 6 1/4" more than upper chest measurement.

short row 1 (RS) : k45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 2 (WS) : DS, purl to BOR M, sm, k1, p3, k1, sm, p45 (**50** / 55 / **60** / 65), **70** (75 / **80** / 85 / **90**), turn

short row 3 : DS, work as est. to 3 (**3** / 3 / **3** / 4), **4** (5 / **5** / 6 / **6**) sts before last DS, turn

Short row 4 : DS, work as est. to 3 (**3** / 3 / **3** / 4), **4** (5 / **5** / 6 / **6**) sts before last DS, turn

Repeat short-rows 3-4 four more times.


short row 13 : DS, work as est. to end, closing the short-rows by knitting the DS normally.

ALL CUPS RESUME

Work 1 round as est., closing the remaining short-rows by knitting the DS normally.

Continue with the body per main instructions.



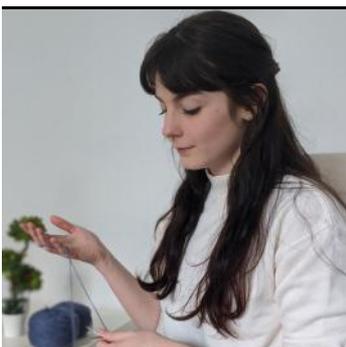
