

LONDONER

Size

One size

Approx. 180 cm/71" wide along top edge and 55 cm/22" high.

Yarn

Suzy Parker Yarns, Irish Jig (85% merino, 15% rayon; 400m/437y per 100g); colorway: Perfect Storm (dark blue version); 2 skeins

or

Martin's Lab, Tweed Merino (85% merino, 15% rayon; 400m/437y per 100g); colorway: In My Garden (green version); 2 skeins.

Needles

Size 3.75 mm/US #5 or size needed for gauge; 80 cm/32" circular.

Size 3.5 mm/US #4 or one size smaller than gauge needles; 80 cm/32" circular.

Other

stitch marker, tapestry needle for weaving.

Gauge

21 sts and 44 rows over 10 cm/4" in Garter st with larger needles, after wet blocking.

Abbreviations

BO - bind off; **CO** - cast on; **dec** - decreased; **inc** - increased; **k** - knit; **k2tog** - knit 2 stitches together as one; **kfb** - knit one stitch through the front and back loop to make two stitches; **m** - marker; **p** - purl; **pm** - place marker; **pssso** - pass slipped stitch over; **rem m** - remove; **RS** - right side; **ssk** - slip 2 stitches individually as if to knit, then knit them together through the back loops; **sl** - slip stitch; **st, sts** - stitch, stitches; **WS** - wrong side; **yo** - yarn over.

Pattern Notes

The shawl features an unusual arrow-like construction. At first the shawl body is shaped with increases in every row and a central decrease on RS

rows. Once you reach the middle of the shawl, each RS row still contains the first increase and central decrease, however each WS row ends with an increase, thus maintaining the total number of stitches.

First part of the shawl is worked in Garter stitch then the remainder is worked in a simple yet effective lace pattern.

Directions

Garter

With preferred cast on, CO 5 sts using larger size circular needle.

Knit one row.

Note: Bold font is used to highlight the shawl spine created by a central decrease.

Row 1 (RS): kfb, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, kfb.

Row 2 (WS): k1, kfb, p1, kfb, k1. 7 sts

Row 3 (RS): k1, kfb, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, kfb, k1.

Row 4 (WS): k1, kfb, k1, p1, k1, kfb, k1. 9 sts

Row 5 (RS): k1, kfb, k1, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, k1, kfb, k1.

Row 6 (WS): k1, kfb, k2, p1, k2, kfb, k1. 11 sts

Row 7 (RS): k1, kfb, k2, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, k1, pm, k1, kfb, k1.

Row 8 (WS): k1, kfb, k3, p1, k3, kfb, k1. 13 sts

Note: From this point for the remainder of the garter section there should always be 3 more sts to the right of the marker than to the left (RS facing).

Row 9 (RS): k1, kfb, k to 3 sts before marker, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, rem m, k1, pm, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1.

Row 10 (WS): k1, kfb, k to marker, sm, k1, p1, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. 2 sts *inc*

Repeat previous 2 rows 75 more times. 165 sts

Lace

Change to smaller size needles and work **Rows 1-158** of lace chart, working parts 1, 2 and 3 consecutively.

Chart notes:

- Move the marker 1 st to the left in every RS row as follows: Work to and including central decrease, rem m, work next stitch, pm, work to end of row. 1 st *dec*

- All WS rows are worked as follows: K2, p to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. *1 st inc*
- Every RS row begins with 165 sts and ends with 164 sts; vice versa for WS rows.
- Every RS row begins with 1 more st to the right of the marker and 1 less st to the left of the marker than the previous RS row.

Row 159 (RS): k1, kfb, k to 3 sts before marker, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, rem m, k to end. *164 sts*

Row 160 (WS): k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. *165 sts*

Row 161 (RS): k1, kfb, k to last 4 sts, **sl1, k2tog, pssso**, k1. *164 sts*

Row 162 (WS): ssk, BO all sts knitwise fairly loosely or with a bigger sized needle.

Tassels (optional, make 2)

Hold 2 rectangular pieces of cardboard together (height should be the same as tassel's total length) and sandwich a double stranded length of yarn between them. Wrap yarn around the cardboard lengthwise, then slide the tie-yarn up to the top and tie it tightly, gathering in the yarn loops. Cut the opposite end of the yarn loops and remove the cardboard. Take a length of yarn and wrap it tightly around the upper part of the tassel to form the "head", then secure the end. Trim the bottom evenly, and use the tails from the center cord to attach the tassel to the shawl after blocking.

Finishing

Weave in all loose ends. Block the shawl giving it a triangular shape and making sure to even out the lace.





Lace - part 1
