PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Lucy Pattern features a comfortable, slightly over-sized sweater made entirely using double crochet stitches. To create this sweater, you'll also need to know slip stitch, single crochet, and back loop techniques.

The design involves minimal seaming, making it a quick and enjoyable project. Plus, it's easily adaptable to different sizes, ensuring a perfect fit for everyone. The pattern does not contain any increases or decreases for the different sizes, making it simple and straightforward to follow. The original version of the sweater was made using a 3.5 mm crochet hook and 2 mm recycled cotton yarn, which gives it a soft, eco-friendly touch. You will find size measurements in centimeters to help you crochet the sweater using a different type of yarn.

The pattern is written to guide you step by step through the creation process, with the help of clear diagrams and images for better understanding. Whether you're crafting your first sweater or looking for a relaxing project, the Lucy Pattern is a great choice!

GAUGE

To check if your yarn is similar to the one used in the pattern, crochet the square as instructed. If the measurements match, you can follow the stitch count and repetitions provided in the pattern or in the "Sizes Chart" section. If you're using a different yarn, refer to the measurements in centimeters, also provided in the same section, to calculate the appropriate number of stitches and repetitions.


- Single crochet back loop only worked in rounds (never stop from round to round, use a marker to count them)






LET'S START

The following instructions refer to S/M size (S oversized as in pictures / M regular fit). For other sizes look at the chart at the end of the pattern. Each time you see * in the text it means you have to look at the chart to find instructions for your specific size. The fit of this sweater is oversized and it fits as shown in the pictures. If you prefer a more fitted sweater, you can opt for one size smaller than your usual. For any adjustment refer to the measurements in centimeters indicated for each section at page 24.

Important:

- The step-by-step pictures and crochet charts are provided as samples of the sweater. For accurate measurements and the correct stitch counts, always refer to the instructions in the text and the charts.
- Use markers as stitches counter to obtain straight edges

SECTION 1



Step 1

A1*: Start from Y and chain 170 (90 cm)

Note: The chain should run from your belly to your back, passing over your shoulder; this will determine the length of the sweater. In case you want a longer sweater just add a few chains to A1. In any case, the number of chains must be even.



Step 1.2

S1*: Now work this sequence composed by 2 rows for 9 times (width 18 cm) going back and forward from H to Y side.

Step 1.2.1

FIRST ROW
(CROSSED DOUBLE CROCHET -
FROM H TO Y SIDE)

- First 6 stitches single crochet back loop only (in the very first row of the first sequence you will work in both loops because you have the start chain below, from the second repetition you will work back loop only)
- Crossed double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches single crochet back loop only as at the beginning of the row



Step 1.2.2

SECOND ROW
(DOUBLE CROCHET - FROM Y TO H SIDE)

- Chain 2 (this is the first double crochet stitch of the row, if you want to be sure of the count of the stitches put a marker in the second chain)





- 5 stitches more double crochet back loop only (in total 6 with the first 2 chains)
- Double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches double crochet back loop only

Notes:

1. Repeat the first and second row sequence for 8 times. Always use the marker to recognize the first stitch of every new row and be sure you do not skip stitches.
2. The beginning and the end of each row are crocheted differently to create the edge.

Once you are finished with this section you will end up at H1 and A2 will be composed by 170 stitches (90 cm).

Step 1.3

BEFORE STARTING WITH SECTION 2
PERFORM THE FOLLOWING

To calculate A3.1 and A3.2:


$$170 (A2) - 34 (\text{from } X1 \text{ to } X2) = 136$$

$$136 \div 2 = 68$$

*A3.1 and A3.2 are composed by 68 stitches (36 cm)

Count 68 stitches from Y1 to X1 and from H1 to X2. Then mark the stitches at X1 and X2 on both front and back side.

Now you are ready to start section 2.



Step 2.2

SECOND ROW
(DOUBLE CROCHET - FROM X TO H)

- Chain 2 (this is the first double crochet stitch of the row, put a marker in the second chain)
- Double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches double crochet back loop only





Notes:

3. Repeat the sequence for 11 times more and always use the marker to recognize the first stitch of every new row and be sure you do not skip stitches.

At the end of the 12 rows, you will reach H2. Do not cut the yarn; leave the yarn ball attached to H2, as we will return to this point later to begin section 4.

SECTION 3



Step 3

Crochet now section 3, the back side of the sweater.

A3.2*: Only 68 stitches are involved (36 cm)

In this section only the bottom side of the work (from Y1 to Y2) is crocheted differently to create the edge of the sweater.

S3*: Starting from X1 and heading to Y1 crochet this sequence of 68 stitches composed by 2 rows for 12 times (width 23 cm)



Step 3.1

FIRST ROW
(CROSSED DOUBLE CROCHET -
FROM X TO Y SIDE)

- Insert the hook, pull the thread and chain 2 in stitch number 2
- Double crochet in the previous stitch which is number 1, the one marked in violet (now you have the first couple of crossed double crochet stitches)
- Crossed double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches single crochet back loop only



Step 3.2


SECOND ROW
(DOUBLE CROCHET - FROM Y TO X SIDE)

- Chain 2 (this is the first double crochet stitch of the row)
- 5 more double crochet stitches back loop only
- Double crochet until the end of the row


Notes:

4. Repeat the sequence for 11 times more. Always use the marker to recognize the first stitch of every new row to be sure you do not skip stitches.

Once you are finished with Section 3 you will end up at X3. Cut the yarn and close the row, then continue with Section 4 at H2.



SECTION 4



Step 4

Section 4 has the function to join section 2 and 3. Section 3 ends at X3. Now, return to H2, where you completed Section 2, and continue crocheting from there.

Step 4.1

JOINING ROW FROM H2 TO Y2

*(A4.1 68 stitches + from X4 to X3 34 stitches + A4.2 68 stitches = 170 stitches)

- Along A4.1: First 6 stitches single crochet back loop only (you don't have to chain one at the beginning of the row, work in the very first stitch and put a marker in it) / Crossed double crochet stitches until you reach stitch number 68 which is at X4*



- From X4 to X3 chain 34* (17 x 2 which is the number of stitches we left for the neck hole)





- Along A4.2 : to join with section 3 yarn over the hook and double crochet in the second stitch of section 3 (stitch 104*)



- Then double crochet in the first stitch (stitch 103*). Now continue with crossed double crochet all along the row.



- Last 6 stitches single crochet back loop only until you reach Y2



Step 4.2

FIRST ROW
(DOUBLE CROCHET FROM - Y TO H SIDE)

- Chain 2 (this is the first double crochet stitch of the row, put a marker in the second chain)
- 5 stitches double crochet back loop only
- Double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches double crochet back loop only



Step 4.3


SECOND ROW
(CROSSED DOUBLE CROCHET - FROM H TO Y SIDE)

- First 6 stitches single crochet back loop only (you don't have to ch,2
ain one at the beginning of the row, work in the very first stitch and put a marker in it)
- Crossed double crochet stitches all along the row
- Last 6 stitches single crochet back loop only



REPEAT 4.2 e 4.3 for 8 times more*.


Then overlap the front and the back side, so you are ready for section 5.



SECTION 5: Laterals and Sleeves

Step 5


Important: Before starting the sleeves and neckline, ensure your sweater is facing the right way. The stitch used for these sections has two sides, so make sure it is positioned with the front facing outward, as shown in the picture.



Step 5.1 : Laterals


A6*: 50 lateral stitches to join front and back side – 27 cm

Sew from H to Q1 and from H3 to Q2 going through the front loop of the back side and the back loop of the front side and work back and forth without crossing the yarn.


Step 5.2 : Sleeves



A7*: 35 stitches left free for the sleeves – 18 cm
 Attach the sewing thread to a new yarn ball and start crocheting the sleeves from Q1 and Q2 working in rounds.

- Work a first round of single crochet stitches and close with a slip stitch.
- To crochet A8* work for 16 times the following 2 round sequence as indicated in steps 5.2.1 and 5.2.2.

● MEANS CLOSE THE ROUND WITH A SLIP STITCH



Step 5.2.1

FIRST ROUND
 (DOUBLE CROCHET)

- Chain 3 (this is the first double crochet stitch /mark chain number 3) / double crochet around the entire round / close the round with a slip stitch inside chain number 3

Step 5.2.2

SECOND ROUND
 (CROSSED DOUBLE CROCHET)

- Yarn over and double crochet in the second stitch /double crochet now in the first stitch /crossed double crochet stitch around the entire round / close with a slip stitch


Important: make sure to work in the same direction for both the right and left sleeve to avoid differences.



Step 5.2.3 : Sleeves Edges

SINGLE CROCHET BACK LOOP

A9*: To finish the sleeves, work 7 rounds of single crochet back loop only (4 cm width) without stopping from round to round (use a marker to count the rounds). Close with a slip stitch the last round, hide the thread in the inner side of the sweater, fix it and cut it.




SECTION 6: Neck

Step 6

The neck of the sweater is worked in rounds. You start and finish every round at W.

The circumference will be composed by 140 stitches:
 - *The sections from X1 to X2 and X3 to X4 are composed each of 34 stitches (18 cm).
 - *The sections from X1 to X3 and X2 to X4 are composed each by 36 stitches (23 cm) (2 stitches for every double crochet row below and 1 stitch for every crossed double crochet row below)




Step 6.1

Start from W and crochet 1 round of single crochet stitches. Close with a slip stitch.

Step 6.2

A10*: Neck Width = 7 rounds (4 cm)

Crochet 6 more rounds single crochet stitches back loop only without stopping from round to round. Use a marker to keep track of the number of rounds. Close the last round with a slip stitch, cut the yarn, hide it through the neck and close it with a knot using the yarn tail at the beginning of the first round at W.



Congratulations!
Your Lucy Sweater is now ready to wear!



SIZES CHART

YARN REQUIRED FOR SIZE

(only if you are using yarn with the same features as the one indicated at the beginning of the pattern - page 3)

XS: 500 g / S: 600 g / M: 700 g / L: 750-800 g / XL: 850 g / XXL: 900 g

SIZE ADJUSTMENT AND TIPS

- If you're using yarn as the one specified in the pattern, you can follow the stitch counts and repetitions provided. If using a different yarn, refer to the size measurements for the best fit. Size guidelines are general, and adjustments may be needed for a personalized fit.
- Factors like stitch tension, yarn type, and personal preferences can affect fit, so check your gauge and make adjustments, especially for length, width, and sleeve fit. Crochet garments are flexible, and with careful changes, you can ensure a comfortable, flattering fit.
- To adjust the neckline, modify sections S2 and S3 by increasing or decreasing the number of repetitions. For sweater length, adjust A1 by increasing or decreasing the starting chains, ensuring the number remains even.


