ABOUT DESIGN

Milly Cheri bandana is a little kerchief that can be worn in multiple ways. It is a perfect gift and can be a lovely shawl for a little girl.

Milly Cheri was designed with those odd balls and leftover skeins of fingering weight yarn and mohair we all have in our stashes, but the shawl can also be worked in a single strand of DK weight yarn.

With this pattern, you can adapt your own design and knit a long scarf if desire in repeating charts as you want.

YARN

KNITTING FOR OLIVE

one strand of merino held with one strand of soft silk mohair (Cream col.)
1 ball of each

NEEDLES

4mm circular needles > 60cm



NOTIONS

2 stitch markers
1 tapestry needle

GAUGE

24 sts and 24 rounds of cable/lace pattern (needle 4mm) after blocking



CONSTRUCTION

It is started at the tip of the shawl, then increased on every right side row until the full width before decreasing your way back to the other tip. The size can easily be modified by adding more pattern repeats for a larger shawl, scarf. Motif stitches are charted only (with written instructions to start first rows of each section).

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

The shawl measures approximately 120cm in length and width 30cm. These dimensions are given after blocking.

BEGIN PATTERN

SET UP

CO 5 sts with the Long Tail Cast on Method. Do not join in round
FIRST : sl2wyif, knit 1, sl2wyif, turn work and start tip :

SECTION 1

Set-Up Row 1 (RS): K2, yo, K3 (1st inc'd, 6 sts on needles)

Set-Up Row 2 (WS): sl2wyif, K1, K1tbl, sl2wyif

Set-Up Row 3 (RS): K3, yo, K3 (1st inc'd, 7 sts on needles)

Set-Up Row 4 (WS): sl2wyif, K2, K1tbl, sl2wyif

Set-Up Row 5 (RS): K3, yo, K4 (1st inc'd, 8 sts on needles)

Set-Up Row 6 (WS): sl2wyif, K3, K1tbl, sl2wyif

INCREASES

SECTION 2 (chart A) - increasing

Note: the first and last 4 stitches of each row are your borders

Row 1 (RS): K4, pm, work Row 1 of Chart A, pm, K4

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 2 of Chart A, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working Row 3 to Row 28 of Chart A

At the end of this section you will have 22 stitches on your needles, 4 stitches of garter stitch border on each end and 14 stitches between markers.

SECTION 3 (chart C) - increasing

Note: the first and last 4 stitches of each row are your borders

Row 1 (RS): K4, pm, work Row 1 of Chart C, pm, K4

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 2 of Chart C, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working **Row 3 to Row 28** of Chart C x 3 + Row 1 to Row 14 of Chart C

At the end of this section you will have 71 stitches on your needles, 4 stitches of garter stitch border on each end and 63 stitches between markers.

SECTION 4 (chart B)

Note: the first and last 4 stitches of each row are your borders

Row 1 (RS): K4, sm, work Row 15 of Chart B, sm, K4

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 16 of Chart B, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working **Row 17 to Row 28** of Chart B

You still have 71 stitches on your needles

DECREASES

SECTION 5 (charts E + D) - decreasing

Note: the first and last 4 stitches of each row are your borders

decreases are made at the end of RS row : knit in pattern to 5 sts, K2tog, K3

section 5-A - chart E

Row 1 (RS): K4, pm, work Row 1 of Chart E, sm, K3

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 2 of Chart E, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working **Row 3 to Row 14** of Chart E

section 5-B - chart D

Row 1 (RS): K4, pm, work Row 1 of Chart D, sm, K3

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 2 of Chart D, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working **Row 3 to Row 14** of Chart D

REPEAT SECTION 5-A + SECTION 5-B X 2 + SECTION 5-A x 1

At the end of this section you will have 22 stitches on your needles, 4 stitches of garter stitch border on each end and 14 stitches between markers.

SECTION 6 (chart F) - decreasing

*Note: the first and last 4 stitches of each row are your borders
decreases are made at the end of RS row : knit in pattern to 5 sts, K2tog, K3*

Row 1 (RS): K4, pm, work Row 1 of Chart F, sm, K3

Row 2 (WS): **SL2WYIF**, K2, sm, work Row 2 of Chart F, sm, K2, **SL2WYIF**

continue working Row 3 to Row 28 of Chart F

you obtain 8 stitches on your needles

FINISHING

Row 1 (RS): K4, k2tog, remove marker, knit to end. (7 stitches)

Row 2 (WS): sl2wyif, knit to 2 stitches before end, sl2wyif

Row 3 (RS): K3, k2tog, knit to end. (6 stitches)

Row 4 (WS): sl2wyif, knit to 2 stitches before end, sl2wyif

Row 5 (RS): K3, k2tog, knit to end. (5 stitches)

Row 6 (WS): sl2wyif, knit to 2 stitches before end, sl2wyif


Bind off loosely

Weave in all yarn ends neatly. Wet block to measurements

TIPS

You can CO and BO with a 4,5mm needles to have a loosely effect.
M1L can be switch to a M1R, depends on tension you usually give.
It's really important to block your scarf. It will looks smoothy and professional.

ABBREVIATION

BO	Bind off
CO	Cast on
est	Established
K/k	Knit
K2tog	Knit 2 stitches on L needle together (1 stitch decreased; leans right)
L	Left
m	Marker
P/p	Purl
pm	Place a marker
R	Right
rm	Remove marker
RS	Righth Side
sm	Slip marker
st/sts	Stitch/Stitches
ssk	Slip stitch, slip stitch, k2tbl,
WS	Wrong Side
yo	Yarn over

STITCHES

ssk

Slip 1 st purlwise, slip 1 st knitwise, knit 2 stitches together through their back loops

K2tog

Knit 2 stitches together

2/3RC

Slip 3 stitches onto a cable needle and hold in back, k2 then k3 from cable needle.

2/3LC

Slip 2 stitches onto a cable needle and hold in front, k3 then k2 from cable needle.

m1L (make one left)

Insert the left-hand needle from front to back, under the bar between the stitches (thus lifting it onto the left-hand needle). Knit this bar through the back loop (this twists it into a nice little tight loop).
