Project difficulty: **INTERMEDIATE**

MATERIALS

- Black cotton thread (20grs approx) nude (10grs approx) orange (35grs approx)
(I used Revesderecho premium cotton thread)
- 1.5 mm or 2.0 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Tapestry needle
- 5 mm safety eyes
- Stuffing
- Wire (I used galvanized wire N°20)
- Pliers
- Masking tape
- Glue
- Colored pencil or pink make up shadow
- Acrylic or fabric paints in orange, black, white, yellow, red, white, yellow and red colors
- Brush N°1 and N°4 (It's important that they're 2 sizes, 1 coarse and 1 fine) drying cloth, container with water
- Strong glue
- Pins
- Black ballpoint pen or ink pencil (optional)




ABBREVIATIONS (US)

- sc: Single crochet
- mr: Magic ring
- inc: Increase
- dec: Decrease
- ch: Chain
- hdc: Half double crochet
- slst: Slip stitch
- inchdc: Increase of half double crochet



We'll start crocheting the arms of our girl, which we'll reserve to add later. Then we'll continue with the feet, legs, torso and neck (the head will be crocheted separately). We'll include a wire inside to give mobility to the figure, always refer to the photos that accompany this pattern. All the body except the head will be crocheted in rounds, close with slst (not spiral) remember to ch 1 at the end of each rounds to start the next one.

Final size of the figure: 24 cms approx tall.



ARMS X2

Crochet with black cotton thread

Rnd1- ch5, slst, ch1 (5)

Rnd2- sc, inc, 3sc, slst, ch1 (6)

Rnd3- 3sc, triple inc (3 stitches in the same stitch) 2sc, slst, ch1 (8)

Rnd4- 3sc, 2dec, sc, slst, ch1 (6)


Rnd5 to Rnd16- 6sc (close every round with slst and ch1 to start the next round)

Rnd17- 3sc, inc, 2sc, slst, ch1 (7)


Rnd18 to Rnd20- 7sc, slst, ch1 (7)







Fasten off, cut a wire about 18 cm long approx, line the tip and insert it into the arm (then cut the excess).

As it's a thin piece, it's not necessary to stuff it.

Crochet another piece of the same length and put aside.

FOOT/LEG x2

Crochet with black cotton thread

Rnd1- ch4, start in the second ch from the hook and crochet, 2 sc, triple inc (3 stitches in the same stitch) sc, inc, slst, ch1 (8)

Rnd2- inc, sc, 3inc, sc, 2inc, slst, ch1 (14)

Rnd3- 6sc, inc, 7sc, slst, ch1 (15)

Rnd4- 3sc, 4dec, 4sc, slst, ch1 (11)

Rnd5- 4sc, dec, 5sc, slst, ch1 (10)

Rnd6- 3sc, dec, 5sc, slst, ch1 (9)


Rnd7- 9sc, slst, ch1 (9)

Rnd8- 3sc, dec, 4sc, slst, ch1 (8)


Rnd9 to Rnd15- 8sc (close every round with slst and ch1 to start the next round)
Rnd16- 7sc, inc, slst, ch1 (9)
Rnd17 to Rnd20- 9sc (close every round with slst and ch1 to start the next round)
Rnd21- 8sc, inc, slst, ch1 (10)
Rnd22 to Rnd26- 10sc (close every round with slst and ch1 to start the next round)
Fasten off, crochet another piece.





We cut a wire about 25 cm long (later we'll cut the excess), cover the tip with tape and insert the wire.

Repeat the process with the second leg.



We place the legs in position (in front of us, img 26) to start joining them.

Rnd1- Join in the first leg and crochet 5sc (img 27-28) move tot eh second leg and crochet 10sc (img 29-30-31-32) comeback to the first leg and crochet the remaining 5sc (img 33) slst, ch1 (20)

Rnd2- 20sc, slst, ch1 (20)

Rnd3- 20sc, slst, ch1 (20) add stuffing as you go, we can twist our wire for greater convenience (img 35)

Rnd4- 14sc, dec, 4sc, slst, ch1 (19)

Rnd5- sc, dec, 4sc, dec, 10sc, slst, ch1 (17)

Rnd6- 12sc, dec, 3sc, slst, ch1 (16)

Rnd7- 11sc, dec, 3sc, slst, ch1 (15)

Rnd9- 14sc, slst, ch1 (14)

In the next round we'll join the arms

Rnd15- Crochet 6sc on the arm (img 38) skip 1 stitch of the arm and 1 stitch of the body (img 39-40) continue with 6sc on the body (img 41-42) then 6sc on the second arm (img 42) skip 1 stitch of the arm and 1 stitch of the body, finish with 7sc on the body, slst, ch1 (25) (img 45)

Rnd16- 25sc, slst, ch1 (25)

Add stuffing and join the wires, we can also cover this joint for greater comfort. (img 46)

Rnd17- (3sc, dec) x5, slst, ch1 (20)

Rnd18- (2sc, dec) x5, slst, ch1 (15)

Rnd19- (sc, dec) x5, slst, ch1 (10)

Rnd20- (sc, dec) x3, sc, slst, ch1 (7)

Change to nude color

Rnd21 to Rnd27- 7sc (close every round with slst and ch1 to start the next round)

Fasten off and leave a long tail.

Cut the wire and cover the tip, close the opening. (img 48-49-50-51)





HEAD

We'll make the head movable and then

Insert it into the neck.

Crochet with nude cotton thread, in spiral.

Rnd1- 6sc inside mr (6)

Rnd2- 6inc (12)

Rnd3- (sc, inc) x6 (18)

Rnd4- (2sc, inc) x6 (24)

Rnd5- (3sc, inc) x6 (30)

Rnd6- (4sc, inc) x6 (36)

Rnd7 to Rnd12- 36sc

Rnd13- 10sc, 2dec, 6sc, 2dec, 12sc (32)

Rnd14- 10sc, 3inc, 5sc, 3inc, 11sc (38)

Rnd15 to Rnd17- 38sc

Rnd18- (4sc, dec) x6, 2sc (32)

insert the safety eyes between

rounds 13 and 14, with 7 stitches of separation (img 53-54)

Rnd19- (3sc, dec) x6, 2sc (26)

Rnd20- (2sc, dec) x6, 2sc (20) add stuffing, we leave in the center a space of the thickness of the handle of our hook to then turn the "false neck" that we'll make where we'll insert the body (img 55-56)



This part of the piece I recommend you to make it as loose as possible, this will help to make it easier to turn it over once it is finished.

Rnd21- (sc, dec) x6, 2sc (14), in the next round crochet only through the back loops.

Rnd22- (3sc, dec) x2, 2sc, dec (11) continue working "normally" (through both loops)

Rnd23- dec, 9sc (10)

Rnd24 to Rnd28- 10sc

Rnd29- 5dec, this "false neck" will not be stuffed as it'll be flipped over. (img 57)

Close the opening and put it inside the space we created to insert the neck (img 60-61-62)

Once our head is finished, we'll proceed to insert it to the body. What we'll do is to take a long double thread (img 65) with a tapestry needle we'll go through the neck (img 66) we take out the needle, we leave the thread at the same height and we put back our needle (the 4 threads together, img 67-68) we pass the needle through the hole that we created in the head, we take out the needle from the top until we leave the head inserted (img 69-70-71-72). Now we fasten off at the top of the head and lose the thread, with this technique we'll be able to move the head in all directions (img 73-74-75-76)

Crochet with orange cotton thread, in spiral

Rnd1- 6sc inside mr (6)

Rnd2- 6inc (12)

Rnd3- (sc, inc) x6 (18)

Rnd4- (2sc, inc) x6 (24)

Rnd5- (3sc, inc) x6 (30)

Rnd6- (4sc, inc) x6 (36)

Rnd7- (10sc, inc) x3, 2sc (39)

Rnd8 to Rnd13- 39sc

Rnd14- 14sc, ch30, start in the second ch from the hook and crochet (img 79) 3slst, 26sc, hdc on the base (img 81) ch25, start in the second ch from the hook and crochet (img 83) 3slst, 21sc, sc on the base (img 84) 23sc (92)




WINGS

The wings will be divided into upper and lower, in some rows crochet only up to the middle of the row and in others crochet the entire row, be guided at all times of the photos that accompany the pattern.


Also, in some rows we'll ch1 to start the next row, this chains will **not** count as a stitch.
Crochet in rows, with orange cotton thread





Row13- Start in the third ch from the hook and crochet, 6hdc, 3sc, slst, 2hdc, 9sc, 5slst, ch1, turn (26)

Row14- 5slst, 5sc, 15hdc, inchdc, ch3, turn (27)

Row15- Start in the third chain from the hook and crochet, 17hdc, 6sc, 5slst, ch1, turn (28)

Row16- 6slst, 5sc, 8hdc, 8sc, inc, ch2, turn (29)

Row17- Start in the second ch from the hook and crochet, 7sc, 11hdc, 5sc, 7slst, ch1 (30)

Without cutting the thread, crochet around the piece so that it's uniform, crochet sc until you reach the upper corner, here we'll crochet 3hdc together (img 116-117-118) in this way we'll get a more pronounced corner, continue with sc until the end of the wing.







Without cutting the thread, crochet around the piece so that it's uniform.

We make another piece, with the difference that once Row 17 is finished, we turn the piece over to make the sc edge, this way this edge will be on the right side (img 135)

Once the 4 wings have been made, cover them with glue on both sides and let them dry (img 139)

I suggest leaving them to dry overnight hanging to dry on both sides, by putting glue on them we'll get much firmer and flatter wings.

Once our wings are dry, they will be completely firm, ready to start painting them, following the reference photos.

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PAINTING UPPER WINGS

We'll place the wings on a clean surface, we must have brushes, a container with water to clean our brush, a drying cloth and a mixer or a sheet of paper.

We'll begin shading with our thickest brush the yellow color from the beginning of the wing to the middle of it, here it's important that the brush is with little paint to get this effect (img 2-3) we repeat in the second wing (remember to be painted in "mirror" effect the second wing)





Now we'll go to the black color, if you wish you can make a guide line with a pen to make it easier to paint (img 5) we paint the border as in the photos (img 6-7-8)

We'll use our finest brush to make the "veins", we make the main one that will reach the beginning of the wing (img 9-10)

Then 3 smaller ones that will go down the side (img 11-12-13-14)

We continue filling the small "triangles" that were left on the side of the "veins" with black paint (img 15-16-17)

Now we'll make 4 small spots above our main "vein" with yellow color. (img 19-20)

We change to orange to make 3 elongated spots above the yellow ones (img 21-22-23)



We now move to white to make the small spots at the top (img 24-25), then along the side of our "veins" (img 26-27) and finally a second row of spots all along the side (img 28)

Finally, we'll shade each half-circle of our "veins" with red color (only the area near the black border, img 30-31-32)

We repeat this painting process on the reverse side of our upper wings

PAINTING LOWER WINGS

As with the upper ones, we'll start shading with our thicker brush the yellow color from the beginning of the wing to the middle of it, we'll repeat the steps in the second wing, but in "mirror" effect (img 33-34) Now we'll move to the black color, if you want you can make a guide line with a pen to make it easier to paint, we paint the border as in the photos (img 35-36)

With a fine brush we make the shape that you can see in the img 38 in the center of our wing, this will be our main "vein", we also make it in the second wing (img 39-40)

We continue painting the other "veins", first one vertically under our main "vein" (img 41) then one on each side of this last one (img 42) then 2 more a little higher (img 43) and if you have space you can add 2 more (img 44)

We'll soften the line coming out of each edge, each beginning of the "vein" to make it more curved, just as we did with the upper wings (img 46-47-48)

We'll shade each half-circle of our "veins" with red color (only the area near the black border, img 49-50-51)

We finish the painting process by making two rows of white spots along the curved edge of our wings (img 52-53-54)

We repeat this painting process on the reverse side of our upper wings. Once the painting process is finished, let them dry well before handling them. We take advantage of this time to make the endings of the girl.

With a long black thread, we sew the open stitches that we leave free under the arms (img 55-56)

With an orange thread we make her eyebrows (img 57-58)

With a long nude color thread, we make her nose (img 59-60-61-62)

WINGS ASSEMBLY

We return to our wings, already dry.

What we'll do is first take our lower wings and we'll sew them at the height of the waist of our girl, we can use pins (img 64-65-66) It may be a little difficult to sew the wing (as it has glue) for this I recommend a very fine tapestry needle.

Now we'll place the upper wings and sew them to the back of our girl (img 69-70) so that the wings are not open, we can give a few stitches with orange thread in the sector where the upper wing meets the lower wing, this step can also be done with strong glue (recommended) (img 71-72-73) Repeat the process with the second wing (img 74)

DETAILS

With a pink pencil or makeup, we shade the cheeks and above the nose (img 75)

With white paint we'll make small spots on the shoulders (img 76-77)

We cut 2 pieces of wire about 4 cm long, we bend the tip, we insert them to the head (I suggest using strong glue) and paint them black (img 78-79-80-81-82)




