a knitting pattern by
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GAUGE

22 stitches/30 rows for 10 cm in stocking stitch, after blocking

NEEDLES

3 mm circular 40 and 80 cm
3.5 mm circular 40 and 80 cm

NOTIONS

Stitch markers
Scrap yarn, holders



SIZES

1 (2 – 3 – 4) 5 – 6 (7 – 8 – 9)

Finished bust measurements, approx.:

92 (100 – 108 – 116) 124 – 132 (140 – 148 – 156) cm.

Choose a size with 5-10 cm of positive ease, or according to your preference.

YARN

De Rerum Natura “Ulysse”:


5 (6 – 6 – 7) 7 – 8 (9 – 10 – 11) skeins of MC, or approx. 985 (1095 – 1200 – 1310) 1420 – 1530 (1640 – 1750 – 1860) yards, shown here in *Iroise*.

1 (1 – 1 – 1) 1 – 1 (2 – 2 – 2) skein(s) of CC1, or approx. 110 (130 – 140 – 155) 175 – 195 (210 – 220 – 230) yards, shown here in *Bouleau*.

1 skein of CC2, or approx. 80 (90 – 100 – 110) 120 – 130 (140 – 155 – 165) yards, shown here in *Potimarron*.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

All measurements are given in cm.

ABBREVIATIONS & TECHNIQUES

st, sts	stitch, stitches
RS	right side
WS	wrong side
k	knit
p	purl
M	marker
PM	place marker
SM	slip marker
1sr	1 short row: after having turned, it's the stitch on which you'll make the maneuver described in the « short row » section below.
k2tog	knit 2 stitches together.
m1L	make one left: lift the loop between the stitches from the front, <u>knit</u> into the back of the loop.
m1R	make one right: lift the loop between the stitches from the back, <u>knit</u> into the front of the loop.

Tubular cast on

For this design I used the tubular cast on, which gives a really neat result. This video by Ysolda is really helpful to understand how to work it.

Short rows

I would recommend using the "german short rows" method. It's easy to work and gives a nice result, particularly on stocking stitch.

Double stitch (DS)

In the short rows, the double stitch is the stitch you've used to work the short row on the previous row.

Tubular sewn bind off

NECKBAND

Using MC, the 3 mm needle and the tubular cast on (see page 3) cast on 120 (120 – 126 – 126) 132 – 132 (140 – 140 – 140) stitches.

Set up row 1: *k1, sl1 with yarn in front* repeat from *to*.

Set up row 2: *k1, sl1 with yarn in front* repeat from *to*.

Join to work in the round and place a marker for the beginning of the round (BRM). The marker is placed in the middle of the back.

Work in 1/1 ribbing (k1, p1) for 12 rounds.

Continue with 3.5 mm needle.

Size 1: *k5, m1L* 24 times.

Size 2: *k3, m1L, k3, m1L, k4, m1L* 12 times.

Size 3: *k3, m1L* 42 times.

Size 4: *k2, m1L, k2, m1L, k3, m1L* 18 times.

Size 5: *k2, m1L, k3, m1L* 26 times, k1, m1L, k1, m1L.

Size 6: *k2, m1L* 66 times.

Sizes 7, 8, 9: *k2, m1L* 70 times.

For sizes 8 and 9 only, knit one round and make increases on the next row.

Size 8: *k17, m1L, k18, m1L* 6 times.

Size 9: *k8, m1L, k9, m1L* 12 times, k6.

You have 144 (156 – 168 – 180) 186 – 198 (210 – 222 – 234) stitches.

YOKE

You will now start the fair isle pattern. Don't hesitate to use a larger needle for this part if it helps to keep a nicer tension.

The chart is on page 6.

The chart is worked 24 (26 – 28 – 30) 31 – 33 (35 – 37 – 39) times on each round. You will make increases on rounds 9, 20 and 27.

After having worked the 39 rounds of the pattern, you have 288 (312 – 336 – 360)

372 – 396 (420 – 444 – 468) stitches. Continue only using MC.

You will now start a series of short rows (see page 3).

Row 1 (RS): k 104 (112 – 120 – 128) 132 – 140 (148 – 156 – 164). Turn.

Row 2 (WS): 1sr, p to M, SM, p 104 (112 – 120 – 128) 132 – 140 (148 – 156 – 164). Turn.

Row 3 (RS): 1sr, k to M, SM, k to the double stitch, knit it, k4. Turn.

Row 4 (WS): 1sr, p to M, SM, p to the double stitch, purl it, p4. Turn.

Work rows 3-4 **4 total times.** K

Next row (RS): 1sr, knit to M.

On the next round, knit and work the double stitches when you come to them.

Continue to knit to 20 (21 – 22 – 23) 24 – 26 (27 – 28 – 29) cm yoke height, measured on the back - *where the marker is placed* - without the neckband.

SEPARATION

You will now separate the body and the sleeves of your sweater.

Knit 45 (49 – 53 – 57) 60 – 64 (69 – 73 – 78) sts. Place the next 54 (58 – 61 – 66) 66 – 70 (72 – 76 – 78) sts on holder for the first sleeve. Cast on 11 (12 – 12 – 14) 17 – 18 (16 – 17 – 16) stitches. Knit 90 (98 – 107 – 114) 120 – 128 (138 – 146 – 156) sts. Place the next 54 (58 – 61 – 66) 66 – 70 (72 – 76 – 78) sts on holder for the second sleeve. Cast on 11 (12 – 12 – 14) 17 – 18 (16 – 17 – 16) stitches. K to M.

You have 202 (220 – 238 – 256) 274 – 292 (308 – 326 – 344) stitches for the body.

BODY

Knit to 29 cm from the armhole, or 5 cm less than the finished desired length.

Continue with 3 mm needle.

Work in 1/1 ribbing (k1/p1) for 5 cm, and make a tubular sewn bind off (page 3).



SLEEVES

Place the 54 (58 – 61 – 66) 66 – 70 (72 – 76 – 78) back on a 3.5 mm needle. Using MC, starting in the middle of the cast on stitches (on the body part) pick up and knit 5 (6 – 6 – 7) 8 – 9 (8 – 8 – 8) sts.

For sizes 1, 3, 5, 8: pick up and knit one more stitch in the little gap before the sleeve stitches.

Knit the 54 (58 – 61 – 66) 66 – 70 (72 – 76 – 78) stitches of the sleeve.

Pick up and knit 6 (6 – 6 – 7) 9 – 9 (8 – 9 – 8) sts on the cast on stitches. PM.

You have 66 (70 – 74 – 80) 84 – 88 (88 – 94 – 94) stitches for the sleeve.

Knit to approx 40 cm from the armhole, or 7 cm less than the finished desired length.

On the next round, decrease for the wrists: *k1, k2tog* **22 (23 – 24 – 26) 28 – 29 (29 – 31 – 31) times**, k 0 (1 – 2 – 2) 0 – 1 (1 – 1 – 1).

You have 44 (47 – 50 – 54) 56 – 59 (59 – 63 – 63) stitches.

For sizes 2, 6, 7, 8, 9: make one more decrease on the first round of the ribbing.

Continue with 3 mm needle.

Work in 1/1 ribbing (k1/p1) for 7 cm, and make a tubular sewn bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends.


Soak your project in a large quantity of lukewarm water, for at least 30 minutes.

Squeeze it gently – without twisting! – between towels to pull out as much water as you can.

Put it in place on a flat surface, and let it dry.

FAIR ISLE CHART

The chart is worked 24 (26 – 28 – 30) 31 – 33 (35 – 37 – 39) times on each row.
 You will make increases on rounds 9, 20 and 27.
