

Milotté scarf

About the Milotté Scarf

The Milotté Scarf is knitted back and forth in stockinette stitch, with a chart that creates a beautiful and simple eyelet pattern. The shawl is knitted with two strands – alpaca and thin mohair – which together create a warm and soft texture. If you want a longer scarf that can be wrapped twice around your neck, you can easily knit additional repeats of the pattern.

Size: One size, can be knitted to desired length.

Garment measurements: Width approx. 10 cm, length 132 cm.

Gauge: 20 stitches = 10 cm.

Yarn suggestion: Alpaca from Sandnes Garn (50 g = 110 m) + thin Silk Mohair (25 g = 212 m) or Vilja from Filcolana (50 g = 165 m) + Tilia mohair thread (25 g = 210 m).

Recommended needles: Circular needles 3.5 mm, 40 cm (knitted back and forth, so the length of the circular needle can be adjusted as needed).

Tips for a Neat Edge

To achieve a smooth edge when knitting back and forth, always knit the last stitch on each row, regardless of whether you're on the right or wrong side. When you turn your work, bring the yarn to the front and slip the first stitch purlwise.

How to start

Cast on 22 stitches using double-stranded yarn on 3.5 mm needles. Knit 1 row purlwise, 1 row knitwise, and then 1 row purlwise. Now, begin the pattern chart. (Row 1 in the chart is knitted on the right side). Follow the chart and continue knitting the pattern back and forth until the shawl measures approximately 108 cm. If you don't block the shawl, knit until it measures about 132 cm, or your desired length. Finish by completing the pattern chart and bind off the stitches loosely.

Blocking

Soak the shawl in lukewarm water with a detergent suitable for wool. Let it sit for about 30 minutes, then rinse the soap out thoroughly. Lay the shawl flat on a towel, roll it up, and gently press to remove excess water. Pin the shawl in your desired shape (for example, on an ironing board or a blocking mat) and allow it to dry completely. After blocking, the shawl (shown on the photos) will measure approximately 132 cm.




Be Creative

Feel free to experiment with different yarn qualities and needle sizes. If you use a thinner yarn, you can go down a needle size, and vice versa.

If you want a wider shawl, you can easily add the desired number of stitches on each side. The chart will be followed as usual.

Legend for chart

-  = Knit on the right side, purl on the wrong side.
-  = Knit 2 together.
-  = Slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit 1, pass the slipped stitch over.
-  = Make a yarn over between two stitches (this creates the hole).
