Knitted beanie hat pattern

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About the project

Mix it up Beanie is a hat with a structural pattern, knitted in the round.

Firstly, stitches are cast on for the ribbing, and then the individual patterns are worked, separated by a chain stitch pattern. Finally, the top of the hat is gathered and then sewn, to achieve the effect of a loose beanie hat.



Inspiration

The inspiration for this hat came from the Mix it up Scarf designed by Pascuali.

The structure of the hat allows for any modifications of its length and ribbing part, so you can adjust it to your preferences.

The hat was knitted using the continental method.



Yarn and notions

1. **Pascuali Sayama** 3 x 50 g hanks
(50 g = 112 m | 1.76 oz = 122 yds)
or
Pascuali Tibetan 2 x 50 g skeins
(50 g = 125 m | 1.76 oz = 136 yds)
2. **Knitting needles 3 mm | 2.5 US**
and 3,5 mm | 4 US with a 40 cm |
16" or 80 cm | 32" cable, if you
prefer working with the magic
loop method
3. Stitch marker, tapestry needle
and scissors

The pattern is designed for a **one-size adult hat**,
fitting a head circumference of approximately
53–57 cm.

Hat **width**: approximately 21 cm

Hat **height**: approximately 22 cm

Gauge

Gauge should be knitted in the round.

Gauge measurements are taken after washing and drying it flat, without stretching.

Knitted in "interrupted rib pattern" with 3.5 mm | 4 US needles:
30 stitches x 35 rounds = 10 cm | 4" square

Knitted in stockinette stitch with 3.5 mm | 4 US needles:
22 stitches x 30 rounds = 10 cm | 4" square



Interrupted rib pattern

rnd 1 - 2: *k1, p1*

rnd 3 - 4: knit all stitches

rnd 5 - 6: *p1, k1*

rnd 7 - 8: knit all stitches

Abbreviations

k - knit

p - purl

rnd- round

****** - repeat from * to *

Start

Using any non-elastic method (e.g., long tail cast on), **cast on 132 stitches on 3 mm | 2.5 US needles.**

Join the round, making sure that the stitches are not twisted. Place a marker at the beginning of the round. Then, knit as described below.

Ribbing

Rnd 1 - 10: *k1, p1*

Chain pattern

Switch to 3.5 mm | 4 US needles.

Rnd 1 - 2: knit all stitches

Rnd 3 - 4: *p1, slip 1 stitch to the right hand needle as if to purl with yarn in front*

Rnd 5 - 6: knit all stitches

Repeat rounds 3 - 6 one more time.



Interrupted rib pattern

Rnd 1 - 2: *k1, p1*

Rnd 3 - 4: knit all stitches

Rnd 5 - 6: *p1, k1*

Rnd 7 - 8: knit all stitches

Repeat rounds 1 - 8 one more time.

Chain pattern

Rnd 1 - 2: *p1, slip 1 stitch to the right hand needle as if to purl with yarn in front*

Rnd 3 - 4: knit all stitches

Repeat rounds 1 - 4 one more time.

Woven stitch

Rnd 1 - 2: knit all stitches

Rnd 3 - 6: *p4, k2*

Rnd 7 - 8: knit all stitches

Rnd 9 - 12: p1, *k2, p4* until 5 stitches before the end of the round, k2, p3

Repeat rounds 1 - 12 one more time.



Chain pattern

Rnd 1 - 4: knit all stitches

Rnd 5 - 6: *p1, slip 1 stitch to the right hand needle as if to purl with yarn in front*

Rnd 7 - 8: knit all stitches

Repeat rounds 5 - 8 one more time.

Garter stitch rib

Rnd 1: knit all atitches

Rnd 2: *k1, p3*

Repeat rounds 1 - 2 five more times.

Chain pattern

Rnd 1 - 4: knit all stitches

Rnd 5 - 6: *p1, slip 1 stitch to the right hand needle as if to purl with yarn in front*

Rnd 7 - 8: knit all stitches

Repeat rounds 5-8 one more time.

Stokinette stitch

Rnd 1 - 6: knit all stitches



Finishing

Cut the yarn, leaving a length approximately twice the circumference of the hat. Thread it through a needle and transfer all the stitches from the needles to the yarn needle.

Then, pull the yarn with the stitches tightly to close the top of the hat (like a gym bag 😊), making sure not to break the yarn. There should be a small hole about the size of a finger. Turn the hat inside out and sew it closed (this will make the seam invisible, and create a nice "twisted" closure on the right side). Weave in all ends.

Finally, wash the finished hat and lay it flat to dry.
