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MOORLAND SHAWL

About this pattern

MOORLAND is a symmetrical triangular shaped shawl. Starting with a garter tab cast on, it is worked top down using increases along the center and both sides of the shawl.

The pattern is written for 2 sizes worked over 7 (large) and 5 (medium) main body repeats, however you can easily modify the pattern and work more or less repeats to achieve your desired measurements.

Yarn

Light grey sample (Large) - Nutiden from [Höner och Eir](#), col. Vagen Hem, held double, 350 grams
Green sample (Medium) - Nutiden from [Höner och Eir](#), col. Grodd, held double, 250 grams

Yarn Substitution

Non-superwash, wooly yarn of approx. worsted weight is recommended for the pattern. If you decide to make the larger version, I would also recommend using lighter yarns (unspun, woolen spun, yarns with addition of mohair or brushed alpaca) to ensure that your shawl is not too heavy

Yardage

4 plates of Nutiden for larger shawl (7 main body repeats)
3 plates of Nutiden for medium shawl (5 main body repeats)
OR

Worsted weight yarn approx. 950 meters / 1039 yards for large size and 650 meters / 711 yards for medium size

Please note that your yarn consumption will depend on your yarn choice, gauge, the size of your finished shawl and any other alterations you might make to the pattern.

Gauge

14 sts / 26 rows per 10 cm / 4 inches in stockinette / garter flat after washing and light blocking

Gauge is not crucial for this pattern however, if it differs considerably, it might affect the final size and yardage of the shawl

This shawl can be worked at a variety of gauges, however please note that if your gauge is significantly different from the one specified in the pattern, it will affect the final size of your shawl and your yarn consumption.

Needles and Crochet hooks

- 5 mm (US 8) circular needles 80-120 cm
- 4 mm (G-6) crochet hook for the leaf stitch and bobbles

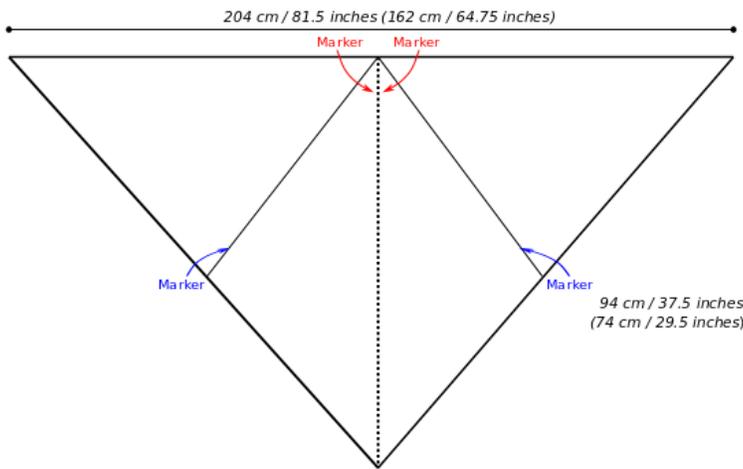
Please note that needle size is just a suggestion, you might need to change the size of your needles to achieve gauge.

Notions

Tapestry needle, measuring tape, 4 stitch markers, cable needle (optional), row counter, scissors.

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Finished Measurements



Abbreviations

[...] repeat

K - knit

M1R - make 1 right (increase by 1 stitch with right lean). Pick up the bar between the last stitch you knit and the one you're about to knit, inserting the needle from back to front, and knit into the front of this stitch.

M1L - make 1 left (increase by 1 stitch with left lean). Pick up the bar between the stitch you knit and the one you're about to knit, inserting the needle from front to back, and knit into the back of this stitch.

P - purl

RS / WS - right side / wrong side

Rep / reps - repeat / repeats

SM - slip marker

St / sts - stitch / stitches

SL - slip stitch with yarn in the back

YO - yarn over

1/1RC - 1-1 Right leaning cable with knit st over knit st

With cable needle: Put the first st from the left needle onto the cable needle and bring behind

your work, k the next st, k 1 st from the cable needle.

Without cable needle: Slip the first st off the left needle and leave it behind your work. Slip the next st off the left needle onto the right needle, pick up the loose st back onto the left needle and return the first st off the right needle back onto the left needle. You have swapped position of the 2 sts. K2.

1/1LC - 1-1 LC Left leaning cable with knit st over knit st

With cable needle: Put the first st from the left needle onto the cable needle and bring it in front of your work, k the next st, k 1 st from the cable needle.

Without cable needle: Sl the first st off your left needle and leave it in front, sl the next st off the left needle onto the right needle, pick up the loose st back onto the left needle, return the first st from the right needle back onto the left needle.

You have swapped positions of the 2 sts. K2.

Special Techniques and Useful links

MAKE BOBBLE

[Crochet bobbles - YouTube](#)

- I like to pull my right hand needle through so that it stays out of the way when making bobbles, but you don't have to
- Insert your crochet hook through the stitch marked as 'Make bobble', front to back, catch working yarn, pull a loop through the stitch but do not drop it off the left hand needle
- [Yarn over the hook, insert the hook into the same stitch, catch working yarn and pull another loop] twice - total 5 loops on the hook. Make sure that the loops are not tight around the hook, otherwise it will be hard to execute the next step
- Drop the original stitch off the left hand needle. Catch the working yarn with the hook and pull it through all the 5 loops on the hook (holding the loops at the bottom with your finger will make this easier)
- Pull another loop through the loop on the hook and then secure the bobble by inserting the hook from back to front one stitch below in the previous row, catching working yarn with the hook and pulling it through both the sts (the one right below the bobble and the one on the hook)
- Transfer the finished bobble on to the right hand needle, tighten the st on the needle slightly if needed and continue working in pattern

MAKE LEAF

[Make leaf - YouTube](#)

- Count to the 5th or 6th stitch (depending on what the pattern calls for) down the column of knit stitches (not counting the stitch on the needle), and insert your crochet hook into this stitch
- Catch working yarn behind the work with the hook and pull a long stitch through. The stitch should be long enough to cover the distance up to the top of your work. Don't make the stitch too long though as it will cause holes to form on the right side of the leaf
- Holding the stitch that you have just pulled through with your finger so that it does not slip off, insert the hook into the next stitch above in the knit stitch column (4th / 5th) and pull through another long loop. This loop will be slightly shorter than the previous one
- Continue the same way until you have pulled elongated stitches through all the knit stitches in the column. Each next stitch will be shorter than the previous one
- Using the hook, knit the stitch on the left needle through the back loop (twisted)
- You now have 6 / 7 stitches on your crochet hook. Insert your left needle into the right-most long stitch on the crochet hook (this is your first and longest stitch), pull it over the remaining stitches and off the hook
- Continue pulling over the remaining stitches until you have only 1 stitch left on the hook. You can now put the last stitch onto the right needle and continue working in pattern
- The leaf is ready. Pull it apart lightly to create more volume

3-3 GATHERED

[3 into 3 gathered stitch - YouTube](#)

k 3 stitches together but do not drop them off the left hand needle. You now have 1 stitch on your right needle, yarn over then k the same 3 stitches on the left needle together again and drop them off the left hand needle. You now have 3 stitches on your right needle coming out of 3 gathered stitches

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Pattern

Garter Tab Cast On

Cast on 3 sts using long tail method. K 10 rows flat in garter stitch (k all rows). Turn work.

K3, pick up and K one st into each of the 5 garter ridges along selvedge edge, pick up and K 3 sts from cast on edge, turn work - You now have 11 sts on your needles.

SET-UP ROW (WS): K3, P1, place **MARKER**, P1, place **MARKER**, P1, place **MARKER**, P1, place **MARKER**, P1, K3

Shawl Body

Notes:

Row count starts from 1 in each section

Large sample (light grey) has been made with 6 reps of section 2 and 1 rep of section 3 - total 7 main body reps.

Medium sample (green) has been made with 3 reps of section 2 and 2 reps of section 3 - total 5 main body reps. It is however easy to customize the main body and size of the shawl by knitting different number and combination of reps for Sections 2 and 3

The first and the last 3 sts of each row will form a garter border. You can decide to slip the first st of every row (sl as if to purl with yarn in the front) to create a neat selvedge, however it is not specifically mentioned in the instructions below

St count check for Section 1 - 17 rows - 47 sts

St count check for Sections 2 and 3

1 rep - 18 rows - 83 sts
2 reps - 36 rows - 119 sts
3 reps - 54 rows - 155 sts
4 reps - 72 rows - 191 sts
5 reps - 90 rows - 227 sts
6 reps - 108 rows - 263 sts
7 reps - 126 rows - 299 sts

SECTION 1 (SET-UP)

For charted instructions refer to SECTION 1 chart on Page 10

ROW 1 (RS): K3, yo, K1, **SM**, k1, M1R, **SM**, k1, **SM**, M1L, K1, **SM**, K1, yo, K3 - 15 sts

ROW 2 (WS): K3, P to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, K to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K to 1 st before **MARKER**, P1, **SM**, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17 (RS): K3, yo, K to **MARKER**, **SM**, SL1, K to **MARKER**, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, K to 1 st before **MARKER**, SL1, **SM**, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 (WS): same as ROW 2

SECTION 2 (MAIN BODY - SLIPPED STITCH COLUMNS/BRANCHES)

Work 6 reps of Section 2 (**ROWS 1 - 18**) for larger shawl or 3 reps for medium shawl. You can play around with the number and combination of Sections 2 and 3 reps to create your unique shawl. Each rep of Section 2 or 3 will add approx. 10 cm / 5 inches length along the spine of the shawl.

ROW 1 (WS): K3, P to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1 [K8, P1] to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, **SM**, [P1, K8] to 1 st before **MARKER**, P1, **SM**, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 2 (RS): K3, yo, [K6, 3-3 gathered] to 1 st before **MARKER**, K1, **SM**, SL1, [K8, SL1] to **MARKER**, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before **MARKER**, SL1, **SM**, K1, [3-3 gathered, K6] to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 3 (WS): K3, P to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1 [K8, P1] to 1 st before **MARKER**, K1, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K1, [P1, K8] to 1 st before **MARKER**, P1, **SM**, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 4 (RS): K3, yo, K to **MARKER**, **SM**, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 1 st before **MARKER**, K1, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, K1, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before **MARKER**, SL1, **SM**, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

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ROW 5 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 2 sts before MARKER, K2, SM, P1, SM, K2, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 6 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 2 sts before MARKER, K2, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K2, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 7 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 3 sts before MARKER, K3, SM, P1, SM, K3, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 8 (RS): K3, yo, K3, [K3, 3-3 gathered, K3] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 3 sts before MARKER, K3, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K3, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K1, [K3, 3-3 gathered, K3] to last 6 sts, K3, yo, K3

ROW 9 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 4 sts before MARKER, K4, SM, P1, SM, K4, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 10 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 4 sts before MARKER, K4, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K4, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 11 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 5 sts before MARKER, K5, SM, P1, SM, K5, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 12 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 5 sts before MARKER, K5, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K5, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 13 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 6 sts before MARKER, K6, SM, P1, SM, K6, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 14 (RS): K3, yo, K6, [3-3 gathered, K6] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 6 sts before MARKER, K6, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K6, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K1, [K6, 3-3 gathered] to last 9 sts, K6, yo, K3

ROW 15 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 7 sts before MARKER, K7, SM, P1, SM, K7, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 16 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 7 sts before MARKER, K7, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K7, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 17 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 8 sts before MARKER, K8, SM, P1, SM, K8, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 18 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to 8 sts before MARKER, K8, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K8, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

SECTION 3 (MAIN BODY - BRANCHES AND LEAVES)

Work 1 rep of Section 3 (ROWS 1 - 18) for large shawl or 2 reps for medium shawl.

ROW 1 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1, [K8, P1] to MARKER, SM, P1, SM, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 2 (RS): K3, yo, [K6, 3-3 gathered] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to MARKER, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K1, [3-3 gathered, K6] to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 3 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K7, P2] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, P1, SM, K1, [P2, K7] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 4 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K6, 1/1RC, SL1] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, k1, [SL1, 1/1LC, K6] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 15 (WS): K3, P to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, K8, P1, [K2, P1, K5, P1] to 7 sts before **MARKER**, K2, P1, K4, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K4, P1, K2, [P1, K5, P1, K2] to 10 sts before **MARKER**, P1, K8, P1, **SM**, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 16 (RS): K3, yo, K to **MARKER**, **SM**, SL1, K8, SL1, [K2, 1/1LC, K4, SL1] to 7 sts before **MARKER**, K2, 1/1LC, K3, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, K3, 1/1RC, K2, [SL1, K4, 1/1RC, K2] to 10 sts before **MARKER**, SL1, K8, SL1, **SM**, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 17 (WS): K3, P to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, K8, P1, [K3, P1, K4, P1] to 8 sts before **MARKER**, K3, P1, K4, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K4, P1, K3, [P1, K4, P1, K3] to 10 sts before **MARKER**, P1, K8, P1, **SM**, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 18 (RS): K3, yo, K to **MARKER**, **SM**, SL1, K8, SL1, [K3, **MAKE LEAF, K4, SL1] to 8 sts before **MARKER**, K3, **MAKE LEAF, K4, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, K4, **MAKE LEAF, K3, [SL1, K4, **MAKE LEAF, K3] to 10 sts before **MARKER**, SL1, K8, SL1, **SM**, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

SECTION 4 (BORDER - LEAVES AND BOBBLES):

Work 1 rep of Section 4 (ROWS 1 - 12)

For charted instructions refer to SECTION 4 chart on Page 13
***MAKE LEAF in Section 4 - 5 sts*

Stitch count check:

- Large shawl (7 main body reps) - 323 sts
- Medium shawl (5 main body reps) - 251 sts
- If you worked a different number of reps for the main body - your st count will increase by 24 sts after completing this section

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ROW 1 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1, [K8, P1] to MARKER, SM, P1, SM, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 2 (RS): K3, yo, [K6, 3-3 gathered] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, SL1, [K8, SL1] to MARKER, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, [SL1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K1, [3-3 gathered, K6] to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 3 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 1 st before MARKER, K1, SM, P1, SM, K1, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 4 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, K3 [K4, MAKE BOBBLE, SL1, MAKE BOBBLE, K2] to 7 sts before MARKER, K4, MAKE BOBBLE, SL1, K1, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K1, SL1, MAKE BOBBLE, K4, [K2, MAKE BOBBLE, SL1, MAKE BOBBLE, K4] to 4 sts before MARKER, K3, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 11 (WS): K3, P to MARKER, SM, P1 [K8, P1] to 5 sts before MARKER, K5, SM, P1, SM, K5, [P1, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, P1, SM, P to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 12 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, SM, SL1, [K8, **MAKE LEAF] to 5 sts before MARKER, , K5, M1R, SM, **MAKE LEAF, SM, M1L, K5, [**MAKE LEAF, K8] to 1 st before MARKER, SL1, SM, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

SECTION 5 (BORDER - SLIPPED STITCHES AND GARTER)

Work 1 repeat of Section 5
(ROWS 1-14)

*For charted instructions refer to
SECTION 5 chart on Page 14*

Stitch count check:

- Large shawl (7 main body reps) - 347 sts
- Medium shawl (5 main body reps) - 275 sts
- If you worked a different number of reps for the main body of the shawl - your st count will increase by 24 sts after completing this section

ROW 1 (WS): K to MARKER, remove MARKER, K to MARKER, SM, K1, SM, K to MARKER, remove MARKER, K to end of row

ROWS 2, 4 (RS): K3, yo, K to MARKER, M1R, SM, K1, SM, M1L, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

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ROW 3 (WS): K to **MARKER**, **SM**, K1, **SM**, K to end of row

ROW 5 (WS): K3, [P1, K2] to **MARKER**, **SM**, P1, **SM**, [K2, P1] to last 3 sts, K3

ROW 6 (RS): K3, yo, [SL1, K2] to **MARKER**, M1R, **SM**, SL1, **SM**, M1L, [K2, SL1] to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 7 (WS): K4, [P1, K2] to 1 st to **MARKER**, K1, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K1, [K2, P1] to last 4 sts, K4

ROW 8 (RS): K3, yo, K1, [SL1, K2] to 1 st to **MARKER**, K1, M1R, **SM**, SL1, **SM**, M1L, K1, [K2, SL1] to last 4 sts, K1, yo, K3

ROW 9 (WS): K5, [P1, K2] to 2 st to **MARKER**, K2, **SM**, P1, **SM**, K2, [K2, P1] to last 5 sts, K5

ROW 10 (RS): K3, yo, K2, [SL1, K2] to 2 st to **MARKER**, K2, M1R, **SM**, SL1, **SM**, M1L, K2, [K2, SL1] to last 5 sts, K2, yo, K3

ROW 11 (WS): K all

ROW 12 (RS): K3, yo, K to **MARKER**, M1R, **SM**, K1, **SM**, M1L, K to last 3 sts, yo, K3

ROW 13 (WS): K all, removing **MARKERS** as you encounter them

ROW 14 (RS): K all

Loosely bind off knit wise on the wrong side

Finishing

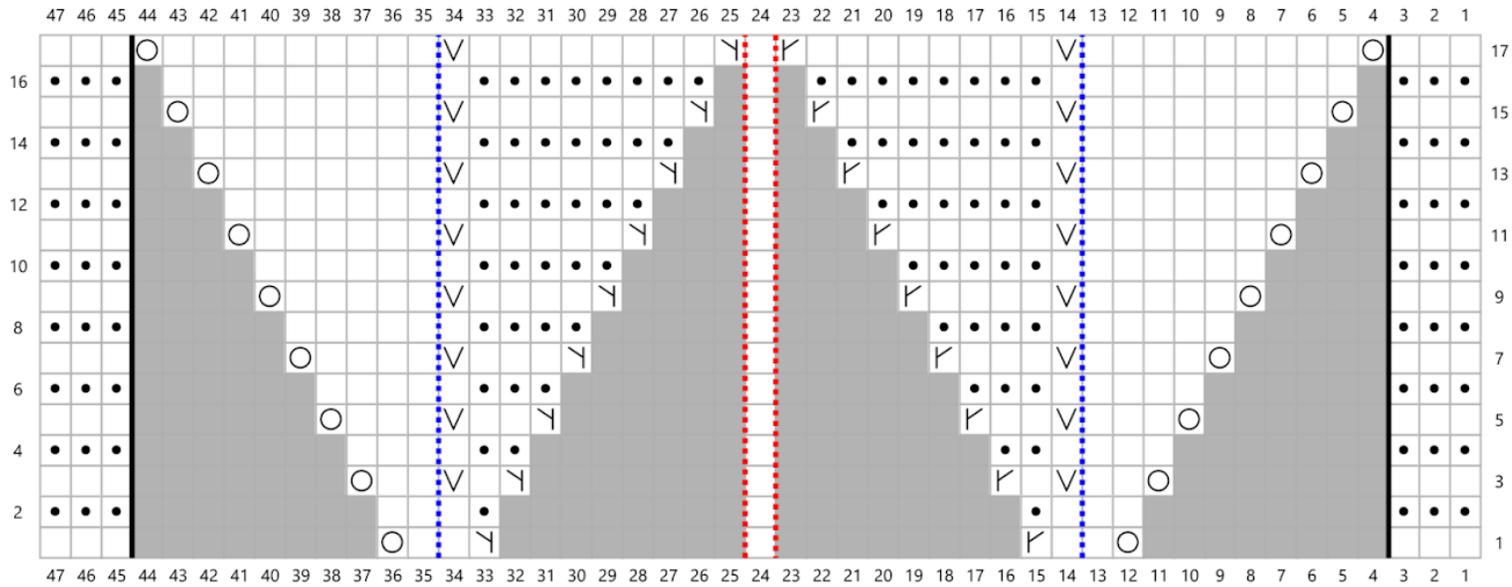
Weave in and trim all the ends. Wash in lukewarm water with mild wool soap and block to measurements.

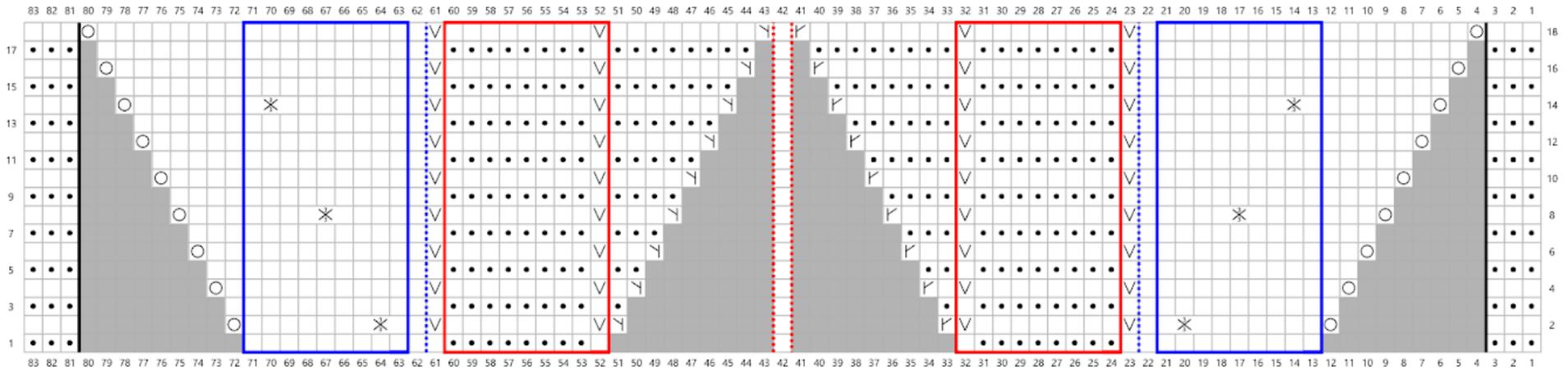

Notes for Sections 2 and 3:

Working Section 2 for the first time - work each pattern rep (blue and red squares) once per row.

Working section 2 for the second time - work each rep (blue and red squares) twice per row, etc. Each subsequent time you work the section adds 1 rep of each pattern per row.

You can work as many or as few reps of this section (and Section 3) as you want depending on the desired final size of the shawl.

Light grey sample is shown with 6 reps of Section 2 and 1 rep of Section 3

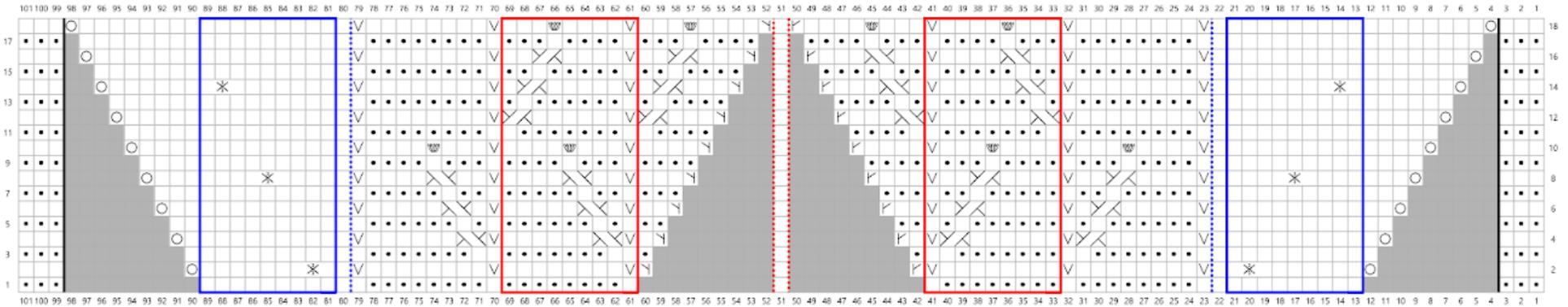
Green sample is shown with 3 reps of Section 2 and 2 reps of Section 3

Each rep of either section 2 or 3 will add approx. 10 cm / 5 inches to the length of the shawl along the spine

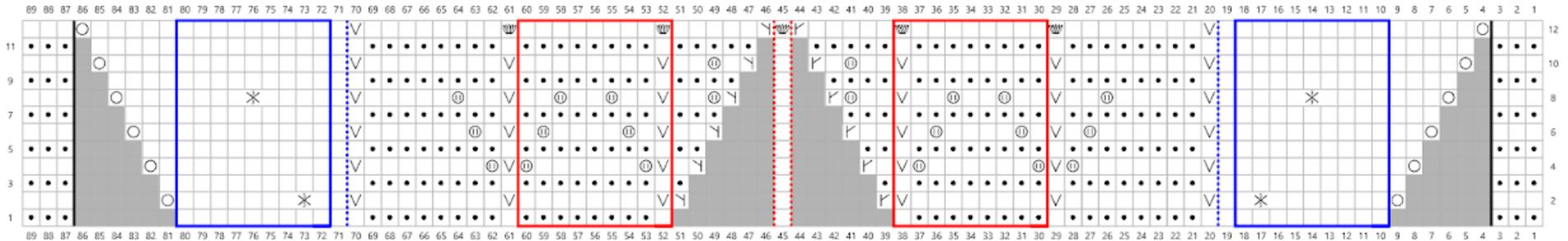

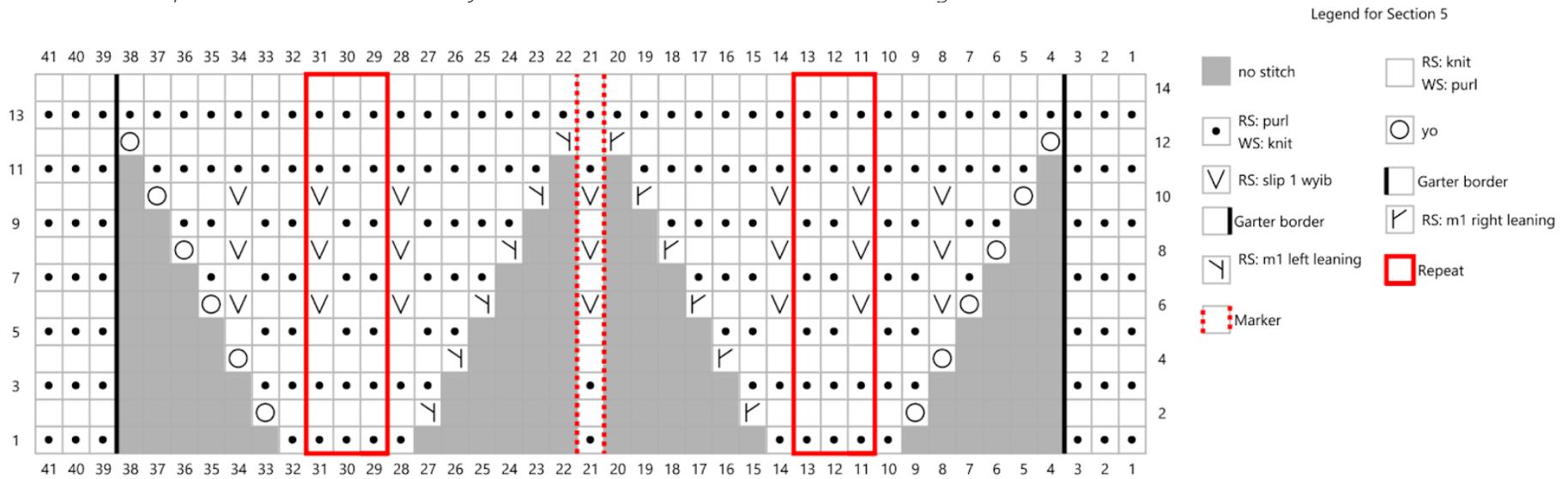
SECTION 5 (BORDER - SLIPPED STITCHES AND GARTER)

Read RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right

Section 5 starts with WS row and ends with RS row

Remove **MARKERS** (at the outer sides of the shawl) when working the first row and **MARKERS** (around the center st) when working row 13

On completion of Section 5 loosely bind off the shawl knitwise on the wrong side
