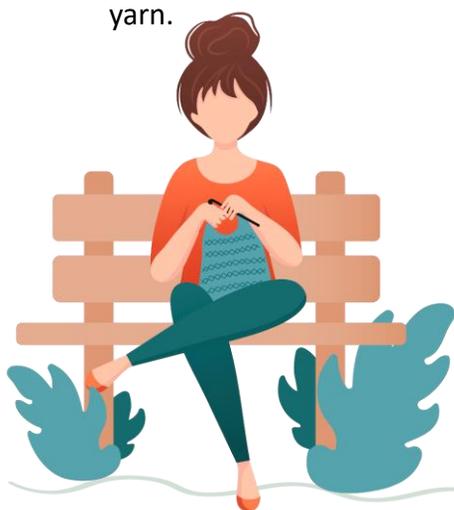

Unauthorized distribution of this pattern is strictly prohibited, just like trying to crochet while wearing mittens. It's not going to end well.

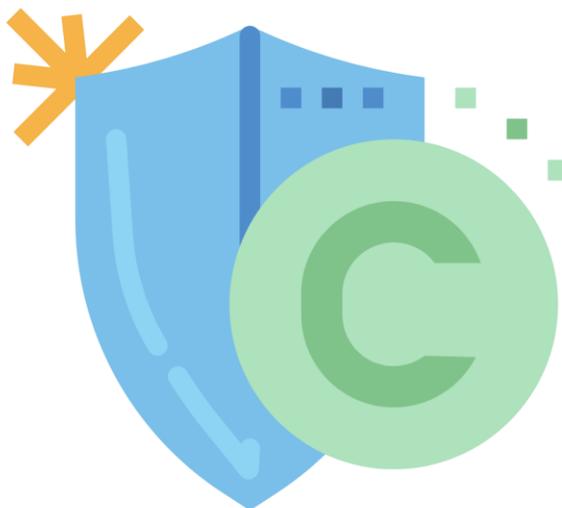
Resale of this pattern is a grave offense, punishable by unraveling all your yarn and confiscating your crochet hooks. Consider yourself warned.

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## MATERIALS



I use **Gazzal Baby Cotton** yarn for my amigurumi projects due to its softness and pleasant texture. **Color: Orange, white, blue, black, brown**

In case Gazzal Baby Cotton is not available, you may consider the following **analogues**: Scheepjes Catona, Drops Safran, Debbie Bliss Eco Baby, Paintbox Yarns Cotton DK, YarnArt Jeans and Katia Cotton 100%. These yarns have a similar thickness, diverse color palette, and are made of high-quality materials.

## Yarn

## Stuffing

For stuffing my amigurumi toys, I use **polyester fiberfill**. This material provides softness, volume, and helps maintain the shape of the toys.

As an **alternative** to polyester fiberfill, you can also consider fillings such as polyfill or cotton batting. They offer similar properties and are widely available for use in crocheting projects.

# ABBREVIATIONS

MR – magic ring

*In this pattern uses US terminology.*

*2 INC means performing 2 increases in a round. This means that you need to make two consecutive increases in the specified part of the work.*

1. Use a smaller hook size than suggested on yarn label
2. Use stitch markers!
3. If the detail looks uneven, then iron it through a thin fabric
4. Change color just before the new color is needed

*Stop crocheting with Color#1 right before the last loop is pulled through. Then, put Color#2 on the hook, and use Color#2 to pull through the last two loops on the hook*

5. Use an invisible decrease

*Instead of inserting your crochet hook all the way through two stitches twice, insert your crochet hook through the front loop only of the two stitches you would like to join together. Then complete your stitch as per normal.*

6. Stuff enough

*My advice for creating amigurumi is to stuff your toy tightly, using as much stuffing as possible. However, if you notice that your crochet stitches are stretching, start removing small pieces of stuffing one by one. The goal is to stuff your amigurumi piece full enough so it holds its shape, but not so much that the stitches begin to stretch.*

7. Do not join every round

*In order to keep your amigurumi as professional-looking as possible, **DO NOT** joining at the end of each round. Joining creates a visible line that can be seen. Instead, work continuously without joining and keep track of your rows using stitch markers or running stitch markers.*

8. Use pins before sewing amigurumi parts together

## V & X-SHAPE STITCH

In my toys, I use an X-shaped stitch. Let me tell you about two interesting methods for making single crochets.

The first method, which is called the "**V-shape stitch**," goes as follows: insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over, pull through, yarn over, pull through both loops. The result is a beautiful V-shape stitch.

The second method, which is referred to as the "**X-shape stitch**," is a bit unconventional. Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn under, pull through, yarn over, pull through both loops. And voila, you'll have a lovely X-shape stitch!

The difference between these two methods lies in the first yarn over. In the **X-shape** stitch method, the first yarn over is done from below, not from above like in the **V-shape** stitch method

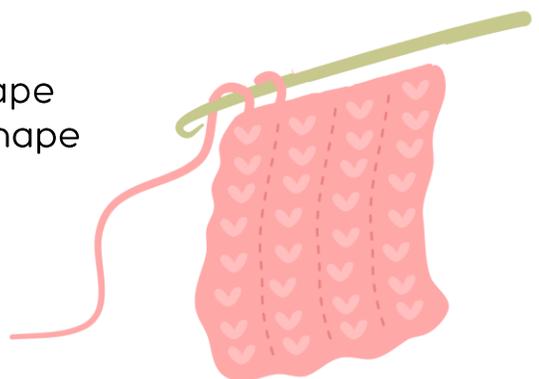
You may notice that the **X-shape** stitch method creates slightly more compact and smaller loops compared to the **V-shape** stitch method.

Therefore, you can experiment with different methods and choose the one that suits you best. Both methods have their own unique characteristics and can be used to create various patterns and textures in crochet projects.

It's important to remember that each method requires some practice to achieve the desired result. Gradually, you will become more confident in your crochet skills and be able to create unique and beautiful works.

So don't be afraid to experiment and explore new crochet techniques. Develop your craftsmanship and enjoy the process of creating stunning crochet pieces!

*Make a chain of 11 chain stitches. Start in 2<sup>nd</sup> loop from hook*

**Rnd 1.** 1 INC, 8 SC, 4 SC in 1 loop, *by other side of foundation chain:* 8 SC, 1 INC (24)

**Rnd 2.** 2 INC, 8 SC, 4 INC, 8 SC, 2 INC (32)

**Rnd 3.** 1 INC, 1 SC, 1 INC, 10 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC, 2 INC, 1 SC, 1 INC, 10 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC, 1 INC (40)

**Rnd 4.** 1 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 10 SC, \*1 INC, 2 SC\* *repeat 3 times*, 1 INC, 10 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC (48)

**Rnd 5.** 1 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC, 1 INC, 12 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC, 1 INC, 12 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC (56)

**Rnd 6.** 2 SC, 1 INC, 4 SC, 1 INC, 12 SC, \*1 INC, 4 SC\* *repeat 3 times*, 1 INC, 12 SC, 1 INC, 4 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC (64)

**Rnd 7.** 2 SC, 1 INC, 5 SC, 1 INC, 14 SC, 1 INC, 5 SC, 1 INC, 4 SC, 1 INC, 5 SC, 1 INC, 14 SC, 1 INC, 5 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC (72)

**Rnds 23-25.** 81 SC

**Rnd 26.** \*25 SC, 1 DEC\* *repeat 3 times* (78)

**Rnd 30.** \*12 SC, 1 DEC, 12 SC\* *repeat 3 times* (75)

**Rnds 31-33.** 75 SC

**Rnd 34.** \*23 SC, 1 DEC\* *repeat 3 times* (72)

**Rnd 38.** \*11 SC, 1 DEC, 11 SC\* repeat 3 times (69)

**Rnds 39-41.** 69 SC

**Rnd 42.** \*21 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times (66)

**Rnd 44.** \*10 SC, 1 DEC, 10 SC\* repeat 3 times (63)

**Rnd 45.** 63 SC

**Rnd 46.** \*19 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times (60)

**Rnd 47.** 60 SC

**Rnd 48.** \*9 SC, 1 DEC, 9 SC\* repeat 3 times (57)

**Rnd 49.** 57 SC

**Rnd 50.** \*17 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times (54)

**Rnd 51.** 54 SC

**Rnd 52.** \*7 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (48)

**Rnd 53.** \*6 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (42)

**Rnd 54.** \*5 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (36)

*To stuff*

**Rnd 55.** \*4 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (30)

**Rnd 56.** \*3 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (24)

**Rnd 57.** \*2 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (18)

**Rnd 58.** \*1 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (12)

**Rnd 59.** 6 DEC

*Close off the hole (pic.1-3)*

**To do this:** cut the yarn. Pull off yarn end through the last stitch. Take the needle and insert into the all front loops. Pull the yarn end to tighten the hole. Hide the end of the yarn inside (watch video 1)

# EYES

## Black yarn

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnd 2.** 6 INC (12)

**Rnd 3.** Crochet in two colors (see below how) \*1 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 6 times (18)

*Insert the hook into the stitch, pull up the loop. You have two black loops on your hook (pic.4)*

*Yarn over with the white yarn (pic.5)*

*Pull it through the black loops on the hook (pic.6).*

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## EYES

*Cut black yarn, continue crochet with white yarn*

**Rnd 4.** \*1 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC\* repeat 6 times (24)

**Rnd 5.** \*3 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 6 times (30)

*Cut the yarn, leave long end for sewing (pic.8)*

*Pull off yarn end through the last stitch. Take the needle and insert into the all back loops (pic.9) Pull the yarn end to tighten the hole (pic.10)*

*Crochet second eye in the same way (pic.11)*

# EYES

## Orange yarn

Make a chain of 24 chain stitches. Start in 2<sup>nd</sup> loop from hook

Back-and-forth rows. Each row starts in 2<sup>nd</sup> loop from the hook and ends with chain stitch. This chain stitch doesn't count

**Row 1.** 23 SC

**Row 2.** 1 DEC, 19 SC, 1 DEC (21)

**Row 3.** 1 DEC, 17 SC, 1 DEC (19)

**Row 4.** 1 DEC, 15 SC, 1 DEC (17)

**Row 5.** 1 DEC, 13 SC, 1 DEC (15)

**Row 6.** 1 DEC, 11 SC, 1 DEC (13)

Cut the yarn, leave long end for sewing (pic.14)

Pin the eyelid around the eyes (pic.15)

Sew eyelid to eyes (pic.16)

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnd 2.** 1 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC (8)

**Rnd 3.** 1 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC (10)

**Rnd 4.** 2 SC, 1 INC, 4 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC (12)

**Rnd 5.** 2 SC, 1 INC, 5 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC (14)

**Rnd 6.** 3 SC, 1 INC, 6 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC (16)

**Rnd 7.** 3 SC, 1 INC, 7 SC, 1 INC, 4 SC (18)

**Rnd 8.** 3 SC

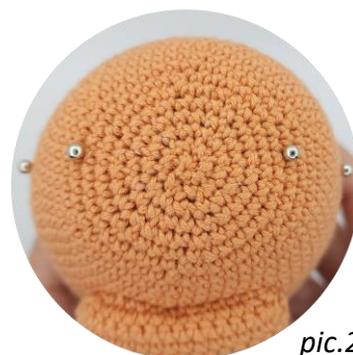

## Orange yarn

Make a chain of 6 chain stitches. Start in 2<sup>nd</sup> loop from hook

**Rnd 1.** 1 INC, 3 SC, 4 SC in 1 loop, by other side of foundation chain: 3 SC, 1 INC (14)

**Rnd 2.** 2 INC, 3 SC, 4 INC, 3 SC, 2 INC (22)

**Rnd 3-12.** /10 rounds/ 22 SC

**Rnd 13.** 3 SC

To stuff. Fold in half. Crochet with SC grabbing both parts (pic.31) Cut the yarn, leave long end for sewing. Crochet second leg in the same way (pic.32)

Sew legs for the 8<sup>th</sup> round of the body (pic.33)

# ARMS

**Orange yarn. Small finger**

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnds 2-3.** 6 SC

*Fasten off in invisible way*

**To do this:** pull the yarn end through the last stitch. Take the needle. Skip one stitch, guide the yarn end through the next stitch. Insert the needle back in the same hole where the yarn comes from. Fasten the stitch. This stitch is called a closing stitch (video 3)

**Orange yarn. Big fingers. 3 details**

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnds 2-6.** /5 rounds/ 6 SC

*Fasten off in invisible way 2 fingers. Don't cut the yarn on the third finger (pic.36)*

**Rnd 7.** Continue to crochet last finger (video 4)

## Brown yarn

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnd 2.** 6 INC

**Rnd 3.** \*1 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 6 times (18)

**Rnd 4.** \*1 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC\* repeat 6 times (24)

*Fasten off in invisible way (pic.46)*

*To stuff. Take the brown circle. Crochet the next round, grabbing a cup and a circle (pic.48)*

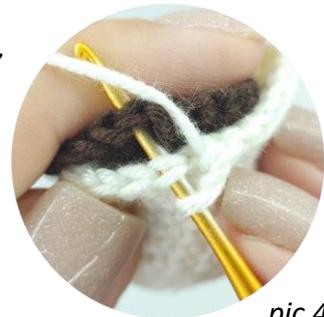
**Rnd 13.** 24 SC (grabbing a cup and a circle) (pic.49)

*Close off the hole (pic.51)*

*Sew the handle onto the cup (pic.52)*

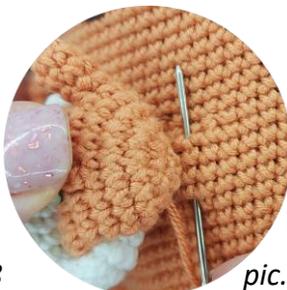
*Wrap the hand around the handle of the cup. Take orange yarn and sew fingers to the hand (pic.53-55)*



*Bend the fingers on the second hand and sew the fingers to the hand (pic.56-57)*



*Sew the arms to the body with orange yarn (pic.58-60)*

**Rnd 1.** 6 SC in MR

**Rnd 2.** 6 INC

**Rnd 3.** \*1 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 6 times (18)

**Rnd 4.** \*1 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC\* repeat 6 times (24)

**Rnd 5.** \*3 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 6 times (30)

**Rnds 6-10.** /5 rounds/ 30 SC

**Rnd 11.** \*8 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times (27)

**Rnds 12-16.** /5 rounds/ 27 SC

**Rnd 17.** \*7 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times (24)

**Rnds 18-22.** /5 rounds/ 24 SC

**Rnd 23.** \*6 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3 times  
(21)

**Rnds 24-28.** /5 rounds/ 21 SC

**Rnd 29.** \*5 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 3  
times (18)

**Rnds 30-34.** /5 rounds/ 18 SC

*To stuff. Fold in half, crochet with SC grabbing both parts (pic.61). Cut the yarn, leave long end for sewing (pic.62)*

*Sew the tail to the side of the body (pic.63-67)*



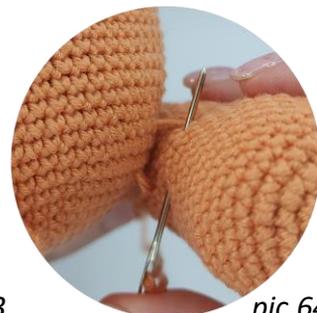

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## SLIPPERS

### White yarn

Make a chain of 11 chain stitches. Start in 2<sup>nd</sup> loop from hook

**Rnd 1.** 9 SC, 3 SC in 1 loop, by other side of foundation chain: 8 SC, 1 INC (22)

**Rnd 2.** 1 INC, 8 SC, 3 INC, 8 SC, 2 INC (28)

**Rnd 3.** 2 INC, 8 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC, 1 INC, 8 SC, 1 INC, 3 SC (34)

**Rnd 4.** 2 SC, 1 INC, 10 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC, 10 SC, 1 INC, 2 SC, 1 INC (40)

Fasten off in invisible way (pic.68) Make second detail in the same way

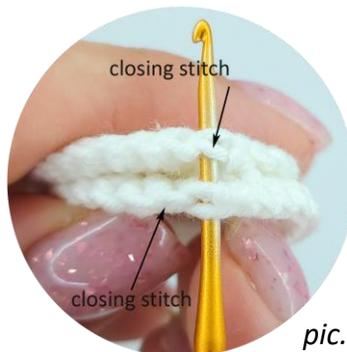
Connect the two details from wrong side to wrong side (pic.69)

Take white yarn (pic.70)

Crochet 40 slip stitches, grabbing both parts  
Cut the yarn. Pull the yarn end through the first stitch (pic.71)

**Row 3.** \*1 SC, 1 INC\* repeat 5 times (15)

**Row 4.** \*1 SC, 1 INC, 1 SC\* repeat 5 times (20)

**Rows 5-10.** /6 rows/ 20 SC

*Cut the yarn, leave long end for sewing (pic.73)*

*Sew slip stitches of the sole and the last stitches of the rows of the upper of the slipper (pic.74)*

*The center of the upper should line up with the center of the sole (pic.75-76)*

**Rnd 9.** 1 DEC, 6 SC, 2 DEC, 6 SC (15)

**Rnd 10.** 5 SC, 2 DEC, 4 SC, 1 DEC (12)

**Rnd 11.** 12 SC

**Rnd 12.** 5 SC, 2 INC, 4 SC, 1 INC (15)

**Rnd 13.** 15 SC

**Rnd 14.** 6 SC, 2 INC, 6 SC, 1 INC (18)

**Rnd 15-19.** /5 rounds/ 18 SC

**Rnd 20.** \*1 SC, 1 DEC\* repeat 6 times (12)

**Rnd 21.** 6 DEC

*Close off the hole. Fold in half (pic.81)*

*Crochet a chain of chain stitches or use the rope crochet video 5. Rope length 20 cm (~7,9") (pic.82)*

*Sew the rope on the sides of the mask (pic.83)*
