



Knitting Pattern

Level: intermediate



This socks are knit from the cuff down. It begins with a tubular cast on and a ribbed cuff. The leg and the foot are knitted with a colourwork pattern. These socks are knit with a short row heel and finished with Kitchener stitch.

SIZING

To determine the size to knit, measure the circumference of the leg above the ankle:

- Size **S** correspond to a leg circumference of 18 to 20 cm ;
- Size **M** correspond to a leg circumference of 21 to 24 cm ;
- Size **L** correspond to a leg circumference of 25 to 28 cm ;

Sample shown in size M.

Leg and foot length can be easily adjusted.

GAUGE (washed and blocked)

30 sts x 40 rounds = 10 x 10 cm (4 inches) in stockinette stitch.

NOTIONS

- Stitch markers
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors
- Ruler

NEEDLES

- For ribbing, heel and toe: US 1 (2,25 mm), 32-inch (80 cm) circular for magic loop, or DPNs or a 9-inch (23 cm) circular needle.
- For colorwork: US 1.5 (2,5 mm), 32-inch (80 cm) circular for magic loop, or DPNs or a 9-inch (23 cm) circular needle.

Or the needle sizes needed to get the right gauge.

ABBREVIATIONS

BOR beginning of round

CC contrasting color

CO cast-on

DS double stitch

K knit

K2tog knit 2 stitches together (*decrease*)

MC main color

MDS make a double stitch

M1L make 1 left (*increase*). *With left needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch worked and the first stitch on the left needle from front to back, then knit the lifted loop through the back to twist it.*

P purl

PM place marker

YARN

Kremke Soul Wool Edelweiss Alpaka (65 % laine, 25 % polyamide, 10% alpaga), 100 m/25 g

COLORS

MC: Pine tree (045), approximately 35 g

CC1: Brown (023), approximately 25 g

CC2: Red (021), approximately 20 g

CC3 : White (050), approximately 15 g

Any fingering-weight sock yarn can be used for this pattern as long as you get the same gauge.

P2tog purl 2 stitches together (*decrease*)

RS right side

Sl1 slip one stitch knitwise on right side and purlwise on wrong side

SM slip marker

SSK slip one stitch knitwise, slip one stitch knitwise, knit the slipped stitches together

St(s) stitch(es)

Tbl through the back loop

WS wrong side

[] work instructions as a group a specified number of times

Cuff

With CC1 and US 1 (2,25 mm) needle, CO 56/64/72 stitches using German twisted method.

Place BOR marker and join for working in the round being careful not to twist your stitches.

Knit 12 rounds [K2tbl, P2] ribbing.

Cut CC1 and join MC.

Then knit 1 round.



Leg

To achieve this part, we will temporarily increase the size of the needle and the number of stitches. If you knit with a tight tension, it may be necessary to increase the needle size even further.

Change for US 1.5 (2,5 mm) needle :

- **Size S:** [K7, M1L] 8 times.
- **Size M:** [K4, M1L] 16 times.
- **Size L:** [K3, M1L] 24 times.

We now have a total of 64/80/96 stitches on our needles.

Work colorwork chart page 6 starting with round 1 and ending with round 18 joining CC2 and CC3 when necessary.

The chart is read from bottom to top and from right to left. You will work the chart 8/10/12 times per round.

Then knit rounds 1 to 17 of colorwork chart once more.

Short row heel

Cut MC and join CC1 to start the heel.

Change needle size to work with US 1 (2,25 mm) needle.

1st part of the heel

From here, we will work flat and knit back and forth across the next 32/40/48 stitches corresponding to the back of the leg. We leave the other stitches hanging out on the cable, ready to be worked after we finish the heel.

Row 1 (RS):

- **Size S:** K3, K2tog, [K6, K2tog] 3 times, K3.
- **Size M:** K2, K2tog, [K3, K2tog] 7 times, K1.
- **Size L:** K1, K2tog, [K2, K2tog], 11 times, K1.

We now have a total of 28/32/36 stitches on our needles.

Row 2 (WS): MDS, P27/31/35. Turn.

Row 3 (RS): MDS, K until the next DS. Turn.

Row 4 (WS): MDS, P until the next DS. Turn.

Knit rows 3 and 4 9/10/11 times for a total of 18/20/22 rows.

We should now have 9/11/13 regular sts in the middle betwin the double sts.

2nd part of the heel

Row 1 (RS) : MDS, K until the next DS, knit the two legs of the ds together. Turn.

Row 2 (WS) : SL1, P until the next DS, knit the two legs of the ds together. Turn.

Row 3 (RS) : SL1, K until the next DS, knit the two legs of the ds together. Turn.

Row 4 (WS) : SL1, P until the next DS, knit the two legs of the ds together. Turn.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until you have knitted all the double sts.

Continue with MC to knit in the round again.

Once again, we will temporarily increase the size of the needle and the number of stitches.

Change for US 1.5 (2,5 mm):

- **Size S:** K4, M1L, [K7, M1L] 3 times, K35.
- **Size M:** K3, M1L, [K4, M1L] 7 times, K41.
- **Size L:** K2, M1L, [K3, M1L] 11 times, K49.

We now have a total of 64/80/96 stitches on our needles.

Foot

Start working colorwork chart page 6 starting with round 1 and ending with round 18.

Continue to repeat colorwork chart until your sock measures approximately 4,5/5/5,5 cm less than your desired finished length.

Make sure to finish after round 9 or round 18.

Toe

Cut MC and continue with CC1.

Knit 1 round.

We will go back to the starting size by making decreases and changing needle size to work with US 1 (2,25 mm) needle.

- **Size S:** [k6, K2tog] 8 times.
- **Size M:** [K3, K2tog] 16 times.
- **Size L:** [K2, K2tog] 24 times.

We now have a total of 56/64/72 stitches on our needles.

We are going to place the markers necessary for the next steps :

Remove the BOR stitch marker and knit 14/16/18 sts. Place the BOR marker after these sts. Knit 14/16/18 sts, PM2, knit 28/32/36 stitches, PM3, knit to the BOR marker.

Knit 1 round and then follow the instructions to shape the toes starting from the BOR stitch marker.

Round 1: K to 3 sts before marker, SSK, K1, SM, K1, K2tog, K to 3 sts before marker, SSK, K1, SM, K1, K2tog, knit to the BOR marker. *(4 sts decreased)*

Round 2: Knit all stitches.

Knit these 2 rounds 8/9/10 times until there are 12/14/16 stitches remaining on each needle (24/28/32 stitches total).



Remove BOR stitch marker and knit 6/7/8 stitches to reach the side of the sock. With 12/14/16 stitches on each needle, cut yarn leaving a 30 cm tail and join the remaining stitches using Kitchener stitch.

For your second sock, follow the same instructions.



Colorwork charts

When working the colorwork part, avoid knitting too tightly. Indeed, it is preferable to adopt a looser tension because the irregularities can be smoothed out at the blocking step. Floats traveling behind worked stitches must be long enough to span the width of those stitches. Personally, I trap floats every 9 stitches. Do not trap floats in the same places on the next row/round to prevent a hole from forming.

If you want to knit your pair of socks in different colors, choose colors with high contrast to make sure the pattern will show up.

Congratulations, your sock is done!
