





Snowy Slopes Headband

by 10 Hours or Less™

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

18" circumference x 4.5" depth at back, to fit head size 20-23"; meant to be worn with 2-5" negative ease

YARN

Swish Pops (DK weight, 100% Fine Superwash Merino Wool; 246 yards/100g): MC, 1 hank
Swish (DK weight, 100% Fine Superwash Merino Wool; 123 yards/50g): CC, 1 skein
Version 1: MC Bubble Trance 61088, CC Black 27225
Version 2: MC Power Pop 61151, CC Crush 28640

NEEDLES

US 2 (2.75mm) 16" circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge

US 4 (3.5mm) 16" circular needles or two sizes larger than size needed to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Three Stitch Markers (one unique)

GAUGE

18 sts and 56 rnds = 4" in Brioche Stockinette Pattern in the round, washed and blocked

Snowy Slopes Headband

Notes:

Greet the great outdoors with a sleek and stylish headband! Ideal for hand-painted yarn with short color changes, the alternating stitches of Brioche Stockinette soften the transition from one color to the next. Trimmed with contrasting purl piping, it's a sporty choice to chase away the chills. And since it's made seamlessly from start to finish, there's no sewing required.

Headband is worked in rounds from bottom up with back shaped by short rows.

Headband requires approx 95 yards total, 65 yards of MC and 30 yards of CC.

Chart is worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

BRK (Brioche Knit)

Knit next stitch together with its yarnover.

BRP (Brioche Purl)

Purl next stitch together with its yarnover.

Sl1YO (Slip 1 and Yarnover)

Bring yarn to front of work between needles, then simultaneously slip next stitch purl-wise and bring yarn over RH needle to back of work to create a yarnover on top of the slipped stitch.

Hem St (Hem Stitch)

Sl1 K-wise WYIB, knit the purl bump of corresponding st six rows below; pass slipped st over the knit st and off RH needle.

Directions

With larger needles and CC, loosely CO 81 sts. Join to work in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts; PM using unique M for BOR.

Bottom Piping

Rnd 1 (RS): K all.

Rnds 2-6: P all.

After Rnd 6, change to smaller needles and MC.

Rnd 7: (Hem St) to end.

After Rnd 7, move to Back Shaping.

Back Shaping

Back sts only are worked back and forth, while remaining sts stay unworked on needles.

Short Row 1 (RS): (Sl1YO, K1) five times, turn.

Short Row 2 (WS): PM, (Sl1YO, BRP) to BOR M, SM, (Sl1YO, P1) five times, turn.

Short Row 3: PM, (Sl1YO, BRK) to BOR M, SM, (Sl1YO, BRK) to M, remove M, Sl1YO, K1, turn.

Short Row 4: PM, (Sl1YO, BRP) to BOR M, SM, (Sl1YO, BRP) to M, remove M, Sl1YO, P1, turn.

Short Rows 5-24: Rep Rows 3-4 ten times.

Short Row 25: PM, (Sl1YO, BRK) to BOR M.

After Short Row 25, move to Crown.

Crown

Work resumes in the rnd.

Setup Rnd (RS): (Sl1YO, BRK) to first M, remove M, Sl1YO, (K1, Sl1YO) to second M, remove M, (BRK, Sl1YO) to end.

Work Brioche Stockinette Pattern from chart or written instructions until back measures 4" from bottom of piping, ending after Rnd 2 of pattern.

After last rnd, change to larger needles and CC, then move to Top Piping.

Brioche Stockinette Pattern (in the round over an odd number of sts)

Rnd 1: BRK, (Sl1YO, BRK) to end.

Rnd 2: Sl1YO (BRK, Sl1YO) to end.

Rep Rnds 1-2 for pattern.

Top Piping

Rnd 1 (RS): BRK, (K1, BRK) to end.

Rnd 2: K all.

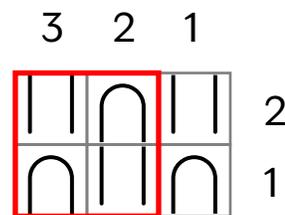
Rnds 3-7: P all.

After Rnd 7, loosely BO, working (Hem St) to end.

Finishing

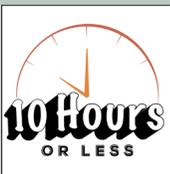
Weave in ends. Wash and block to finished measurements.

Brioche Stockinette



LEGEND

-  Brioche Knit (BRK)
Knit next stitch together with its yarnover
-  Slip 1 YO (Sl1YO)
Bring yarn to front of work between needles, then simultaneously slip next stitch purl-wise and bring yarn over right hand needle to back of work to create a yarnover on top of the slipped stitch
-  Pattern Repeat
