## NOAH KNIT

Noah Knit is worked bottom-up on circular needles, starting with rib and then stitch pattern. The work is separated at the armholes and worked back and forth from here. Decreases at the armholes shape both the back and the front yoke and the shoulders are shaped working German Short Rows on the front. Once the shoulders have been joined, stitches are picked up to make the ribbed neckline. For the sleeves, stitches are picked up at the armhole and worked in pattern on circular needles, finished in rib.

<p><i>Please bear in mind that the needle sizes given above are only suggestions. The size of the needles you need depends on your personal gauge. If you knit firmly you might need a large needle size, if you knit loosely you might need a smaller needle size.</i></p>

## ABBREVIATIONS

<b>st(s)</b>	: Stitch(es)	<b>LPT</b>	: With right hand needle behind left hand needle, skip the next stitch on left hand needle and purl the 2nd st through the back loop, then knit the skipped stitch in front and slide both stitches from left hand needle.
<b>k</b>	: Knit		
<b>p</b>	: Purl		
<b>p incr</b>	: Purl increase; with your left hand needle lift the chain from behind between the knitted stitch and the next and purl it through the back loop.	<b>seed stitch</b>	: Knit 1, purl 1. On the following row: purl on knit stitches and knit on purl stitches.
<b>k incr</b>	: Knit increase before stitch marker: with your left hand needle lift the chain from behind between the knitted stitches and knit it. ## BODY

Using 3.5 mm circular needles 80 cm long, cast on 216 (228) sts.

Place a stitch marker at the beginning of the round.

*Work rib, k1, p1, until the work measures 7.5 cm from cast on edge.*

*Change to 4 mm circular needles 80 cm long and knit 1 round.*

*Purl the next 2 rounds.*

*Knit the next 2 rounds.*

*Purl the next 2 rounds.*

*Knit 1 round and place a stitch marker after 108 (114) sts. The work has now been separated into two equally sized parts, the first part is the back, the second part is the front.*

Work the next 12 rounds stitch pattern according to chart 1, or use the following description:

**Round 1-2:** K16 (19), \*p3, k24\* repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k8 (11). Repeat once more for the front.

**Round 3-4:** K13 (16), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k5 (8). Repeat once more for the front.

**Round 5-6:** K10 (13), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k8 (11). Repeat once more for the front.

**Round 7-8:** K7 (10), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k11 (14). Repeat once more for the front.

**Round 9-10:** K4 (7), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k14 (17). Repeat once more for the front.

**Round 11-12:** K7 (10), \*p3, k24\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k17 (20). Repeat once more for the front.

*Knit 1 round.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

Work the next 16 rounds in seed stitch like this:

*Round 1: \*K1, p1\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.*

*Round 2: \*P1, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.*

*Repeat these 2 rounds seven times more.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 1 round.*

*Repeat stitch pattern according to chart 1 as before, for the next 12 rounds.*

*Knit 1 round.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 1 round and work 1 knit increase at each side of both front and back; work the increases 2 sts before and after stitch marker.*

The work is now separated at the armholes and the back and front are worked back and forth from here. There are 110 (116) sts for the front and back.

## BACK

Work as below using chart 2 or use the \*description written further down:

**Row 1 (right side):** Work pattern according to chart 2.

Turn work and leave the remaining stitches on a stitch holder or piece of string.

**Row 2 (wrong side):** Work stitches according to chart 2.

82 (88) sts left

Continue working according to chart 2 for the remaining 26 rows.

\*Description of yoke according to chart 2:

**Row 1 (right side):** P2 (5), LPT, p6, \*LT, p6\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 4 (7) sts

before stitch marker, RPT, p2 (5).

Turn work and leave the remaining stitches on a stitch holder or piece of string.

**Row 2 (wrong side):** Work pattern.

**Row 3:** P3 (6), \*LPT, p4, RPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 3 (6) sts, p3 (6).

**Row 4:** Work pattern.

**Row 5:** P4 (7), \*LPT, p2, RPT, p2\* repeat from \* to \* to last 2 (5) sts, p2 (5).

**Row 6:** Work pattern.

**Row 7:** P5 (8), \*LPT, RPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 1(4) sts, p1 (4).

**Row 8:** Work pattern.

**Row 9:** P6 (9), \*LT, p6\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 8 (11) sts, LT, p6 (9).

**Row 10:** Work pattern.

**Row 11:** P5 (8), \*RPT, LPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 9 (12) sts, RPT, LPT, p5 (8).

**Row 12:** Work pattern.

**Row 13:** P4 (7), \*RPT, p2, LPT, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 2 (5) sts, p2 (5).

**Row 14:** Work pattern.

**Row 15:** P3 (6), \*RPT, p4, LPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 3 (6) sts, p3 (6).

**Row 16:** Work pattern.

**Row 17:** P3 (6), k1, \*p6, LT\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 10 (13) sts, p6, k1, p3 (6).

**Row 18:** Work pattern.

**Row 19:** P3 (6), \*LPT, p4, RPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 3 (6) sts, p3 (6).

**Row 20:** Work pattern.

**Row 21:** P4 (7), \*LPT, p2, RPT, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 2 (5) sts, p2 (5).

**Row 22:** Work pattern.

**Row 23:** P5 (8), \*LPT, RPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 1 (4) sts, p1 (4).

**Row 24:** Work pattern.

**Row 25:** P6 (9), \*LT, p6\*, repeat from \* to \* to last 0 (3) sts, p0 (3).

**Row 26:** Work pattern.

Continue like this:

**Row 27 (right side):** Knit.

**Row 28:** Purl

**Row 29:** Purl.

**Row 30:** Knit.

Continue in stitch pattern according to chart 1 (remember to add 1 sts each side as there are 110 (116) in total). Or use the description below:

**Row 1:** K17 (20), \*p3, k24\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k9 (12).

**Row 2:** Work pattern.

**Row 3:** K14 (17), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k6 (9).

**Row 4:** Work pattern.

**Row 5:** K11 (14), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k9 (12).

**Row 6:** Work pattern.

**Row 7:** K8 (11), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\*, repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k12 (15).

**Row 8:** Work pattern,

**Row 9:** K5 (8), \*p3, k3, p3, k18\* repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k3, p3, k15 (18).

**Row 10:** Work pattern.

**Row 11:** k8 (11), \*p3, k24\* repeat from \* to \* twice more, p3, k18 (21).

**Row 12:** 6 Work pattern.

**Row 13:** Knit all stitches.

*Next row (wrong side): Work seed stitch, k1, p1.*

*Next row (right side): Work seed stitch, p1, k1.*

*Continue working seed stitch for a total of 16 (20) rows and until the work measures about 54 (56) cm from cast on edge.*

Cast off all stitches.

## FRONT

Work as for the back until 3 (7) rows into the seed stitch section (and the work measures about 48 (50) cm).

### **Work left side of neckline like this:**

*Work 48 (50) sts seed stitch pattern, turn work.*

*Cast off 2 sts and work pattern, turn.*

*Work 46 (48) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Repeat the last 2 rows twice more. There are now 42 (44) sts.*

*Cast off 1 st at the neck and work pattern. Repeat, casting 1 st off at the neck every second row until there are 39 (41) sts left. Work pattern straight up until there are just as many rows of seed stitch as there are for the back.*

### **Now shape the shoulder working German Short Rows, starting from the right side:**

*Work the whole row of 39 (41) sts in seed stitch pattern, turn work.*

*Work 35 (37) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 34 (36) sts pattern.*

*Work 28 (30) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 27 (29) sts pattern.*

*Work 21 (23) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 20 (22) sts pattern.*

*Work 14 (16) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 13 (15) sts pattern.*

*Work 7 (9) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 6 (8) sts pattern*

Cast off all 39 (41) sts.

### **Work right side of neckline like this:**

Cast off the central 14 (16) sts of the neckline, then a further 2 sts, i.e. 16 (18) sts in total, and work seed stitch pattern to end of row.

*Wrong side: Work 46 (48) sts seed pattern, turn work.*

*Cast off 2 sts and work pattern, turn.*

*Repeat the last 2 rows twice more. There are now 42 (44) sts.*

*Cast off 1 st at the neck and work pattern, turn.*

*Repeat, casting 1 st off every second row at the neck until there are 39 (41) sts left. Work pattern straight up until there are just as many rows of seed stitch as there are for the back.*

### **Now shape the shoulder working German Short Rows, starting from the right side:**

*Work 35 (37) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 34 (36) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 28 (30) sts pattern.*

*Work 27 (29) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 21 (23) sts pattern.*

*Work 20 (22) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 14 (16) sts pattern.*

*Work 13 (15) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 7 (9) sts pattern, turn work.*

*Work 6 (8) sts pattern.*

Cast off all 39 (41) sts.

### **Shoulders:**

Place the shoulders of the back and front against each other and sew them together as neatly as you can, each shoulder measuring about 22 (24) cm.

### **Neckline:**

Using 3.5 mm circular needle 40 cm long, pick up 28 (30) sts from the back, 20 (24) sts along the side of the front, 14 (16) sts in the middle and 20 (24) sts along the other side of the front. Work rib, k1, p1, until it measures 7 cm. Cast off all stitches loosely in rib or use Italian cast off method as it makes the work extra elastic which comes in handy when sewing it to the back side. Fold the neckline halfway and sew it to the back side as neatly as possible.

Alternatively the folded hem can also be knitted. Look to Youtube for well guided video instructions.

### **Sleeves:**

Using 4 mm circular needle 40 cm long, pick up 72 (78) sts evenly along the edge of the armhole, about 36 (39) sts each side of the sleeve.

Place a stitch marker at the bottom of the armhole; this is the beginning of the round.

### **Work German Short Rows to shape the sleeve:**

*Work seed stitch pattern to 6 sts before stitch marker, turn work.*

*Work seed stitch pattern to 6 sts before stitch marker, turn work.*

*Work seed stitch pattern to 12 sts before stitch marker, turn work.*

*Work seed stitch pattern to 12 sts before stitch marker, turn work and work pattern to stitch marker.*

*From now on work in the round and in seed stitch pattern for the next 12 (15) rounds; decrease 1 st at each side of the stitch marker on the first and sixth round. Work increases 1 st before and 1 st after stitch marker. There are now 68 (74) sts.*

*Purl 1 round and decrease 1 st each side of stitch marker. There are now 66 (72) sts.*

*Purl 1 more round.*

*Knit the next 2 rounds.*

*Purl the next 2 rounds.*

### **Work chart for sleeve or use the description below:**

**Round 1:** P4 (7), \*LT, p6\* repeat from \* to \* to 6 (9) sts before stitch marker, LT, p4 (7).

**Round 2:** Work pattern knitting the knit stitches and purling the purl stitches.

**Round 3:** P3 (6), \*RPT, LPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to 7 (10) sts before stitch marker, RPT, LPT, p3 (6).

**Round 4:** Work pattern.

**Round 5:** P2 (5), \*RPT, p2, LPT, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* to 0 (3) sts before stitch marker, p0 (3).

**Round 6:** Work pattern.

**Round 7:** P1 (4), \*RPT, p4, LPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to 1 (4) sts before stitch marker, p1 (4).

**Round 8:** Work pattern.

**Round 9:** P1 (4) k1, \*p6, LT\*, repeat from \* to \* to 8 (11) sts before stitch marker, p6, k1, p1 (4).

**Round 10:** Work pattern.

**Round 11:** P1 (4), \*LPT, p4, RPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to 1 (4) sts before stitch marker, p1 (4).

**Round 12:** Work pattern.

**Round 13:** P2 tog tbl, p0 (3), \*LPT, p2, RPT, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* to 8 (11) sts before stitch marker, LPT, p2, RPT, p0 (3), p2 tog.

**Round 15:** P2 (5), \*LPT, RPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to 6 (9) sts before stitch marker, LPT, RPT, p2 (5).

**Round 16:** Work pattern.

**Round 17:** P3 (6), \*LT, p6\*, repeat from \* to \* to 5 (8) sts before stitch marker, LT, p3 (6).

**Round 18:** Work pattern.

**Round 19:** P2 (5), \*RPT, LPT, p4\*, repeat from \* to \* to 6 (9) sts before stitch marker, RPT, LPT, p2 (5).

**Round 20:** Work pattern.

**Round 21:** P1 (4), \*RPT, p2, LPT, p2\*, repeat from \* to \* to 7 (10) sts before stitch marker, RPT, p2, LPT, p1 (4).

**Round 22:** Work pattern.

**Round 23:** P0 (3), \*RPT, p4, LPT\*, repeat from \* to \* to 0 (3) sts before stitch marker, p0 (3).

**Round 24:** Work pattern.

**Round 25:** P0 (3), k1, p6, \*LT, p6\*, repeat from \* to \* to 1 (4) sts before stitch marker, k1, p0 (3).

**Round 26:** Purl all stitches.

*Purl 1 round and decrease 1 st at each side. There are now 62 (68) sts.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

Decrease 1 st at each side of stitch marker on the next and each 6th following round, a total of 4 times until there are 54 (60) sts left. Then decrease 1 st each side on every 4th (6th) round a total of 5 times until there are 44 (50) sts left. Change to 4 mm circular needle 80 cm long and use Magic Loop method as the stitches are reduced.

**Work pattern as follows:**

Work seed stitch for the next 16 (19) rounds.

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

Work seed stitch for the next 16 (19) rounds.

*Purl 2 rounds.*

*Knit 2 rounds.*

*Purl 2 rounds.*

The sleeve measures about 38 (40) cm from under the armhole.

*Knit 1 round.*

Change to 3.5 mm circular needle 80 cm long and use Magic Loop method to work rib, k1, p1, until the rib measures 8 cm.

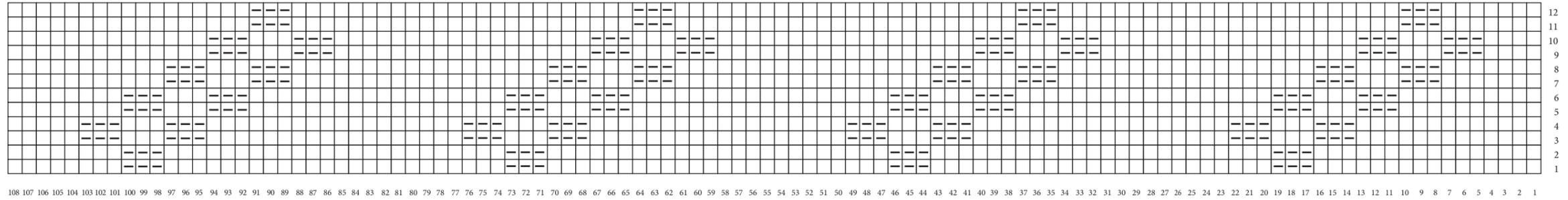
Cast off all sts using Italian Cast off method for a nice finish.

Work the other sleeve the same way.

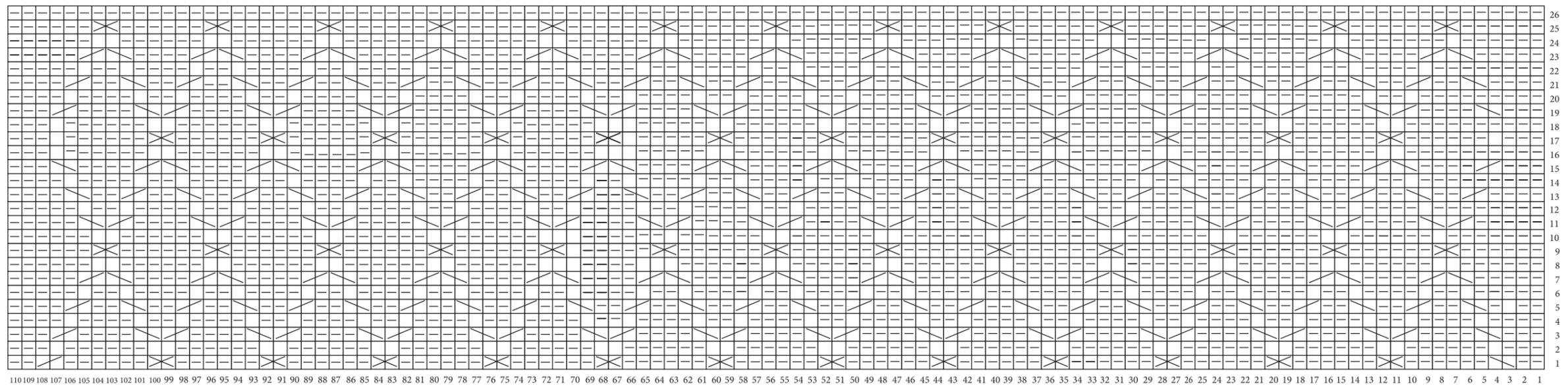
Weave in all ends. Give the sweater a delicate rinse using a good wool detergent to make it go extra fluffy and the wet block it.



XS/S CHART 1

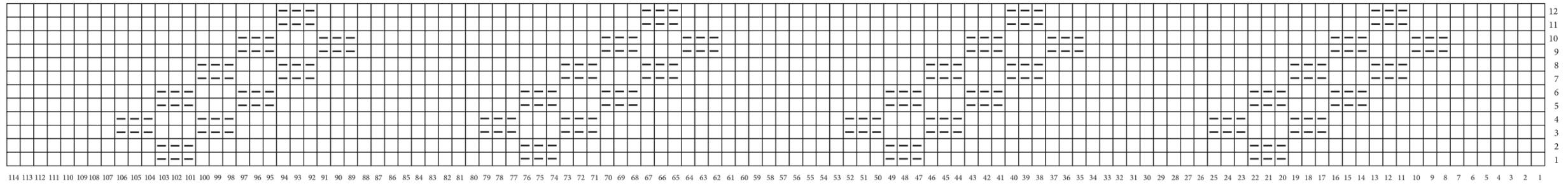


XS/S CHART 2

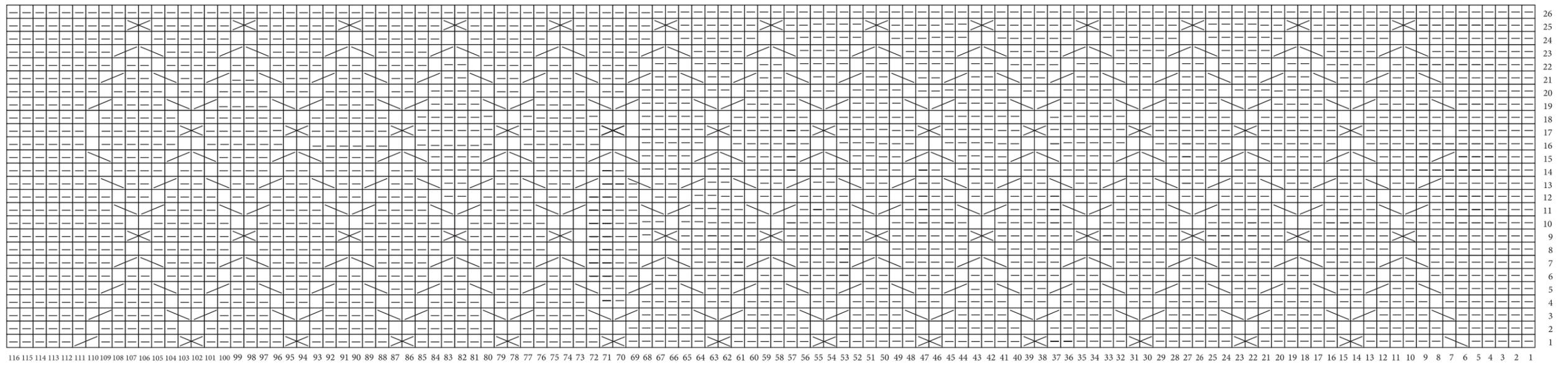

M/L CHART 1

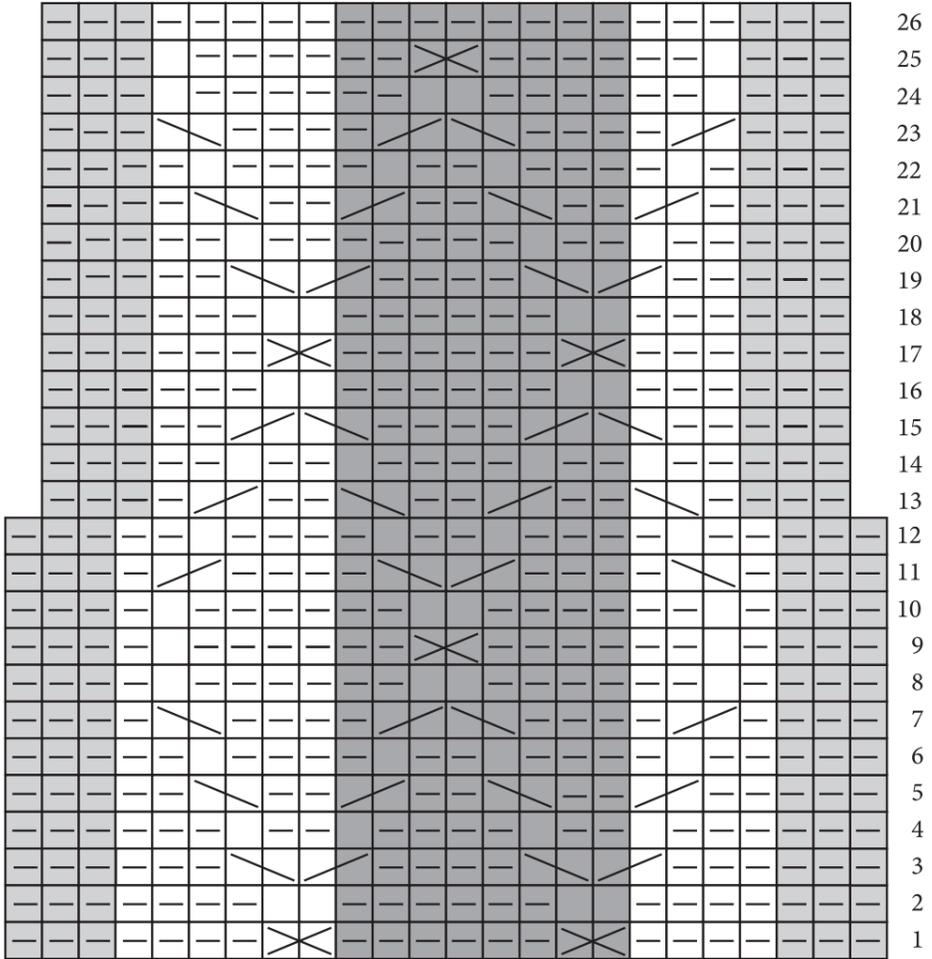


M/L CHART 2
