st(s) // stitch(es)

r // row

BOR // beginning of round/row

pssso // pass the slipped st over

k2tog // knit 2 sts together

About

Size: a (b) c (d) e (f) g (h).

Your bust circumference: 80 (90) 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) cm.

Total bust width of the sweater: 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) 160 (170) cm.

Positive ease: This sweater has a positive ease at approximately +20 cm, depending on your bust circumference. When deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference. Choose the smaller size if in between sizes for a tighter fit, and the larger size if you're going for an oversized fit.

Full length, measured CF below the neckline: 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 (64) cm.

Gauge: 16 sts x 22 rows = 10 x 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch, at needle size 6 mm.

Needle sizes: 2 different needle sizes are used, whilst knitting the sweater.

Circular needles 5 mm (the lengths 40 and 60 cm are recommended).

Circular needles 6 mm (the lengths 40, 60 and 80 cm are recommended).

Yarn: The sweater is knitted with 2 colours, with 1 thread of merino + 1 thread of silk mohair held together in each colour:

1st thread in colour A (main colour): "Heavy Merino", Knitting For Olive (125 m per 50 g).

2nd thread in colour A (main colour): "Soft Silk Mohair", Knitting For Olive (225 m per 25 g).

1st thread in colour B (chart colour): "Heavy Merino", Knitting For Olive (125 m per 50 g)

2nd thread in colour B (chart colour): "Soft Silk Mohair", Knitting For Olive (225 m per 25 g).

Amount:

1st thread, colour A: 400 (400) 450 (500) 550 (600) 650 (700)g.

2nd thread, colour A: 125 (125) 125 (150) 150 (175) 175 (200)g.

1st thread, colour B: 50 (50) 50 (50) 75 (75) 100 (100)g.

2nd thread, colour B: 25 (25) 25 (25) 50 (50) 50 (50)g.

Method: This sweater is knitted top-down in the round in Stockinette Stitch. The round colourwork yoke is knitted following a chart, to create the bow & garland pattern. All edges of the sweater are knitted in rib, and are double layered.

Before you begin

- Please read the entire pattern before casting on.
- Be sure to make a swatch before beginning, to ensure the right gauge.
- Knitting with dominance: for this sweater, colour B is the dominant colour. When knitting, hold colour B over your index finger, whilst holding color A over both your index- and middle finger. Thereby, colour B becomes the dominant colour, as it is closest to your knitwear.
- In this pattern, the following methods are used: Judys magic cast on, left leaning decreases and increases, 3- needle knitting, rib, Stockinette Stitch.

Pattern

Neckline

With colour A and 2 sets of circular needles 5 mm, cast on 152 (156) 160 (164) 168 (172) 176 (180) sts, using the method "Judy's Magic Cast On" - 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) sts on each set.

Now, knit *k 1, p 1* for the first 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) sts, and then place the following 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) sts on a thread to rest - the resting sts must be used later when the



neckline is folded to become double layered, using the method “3-needle knitting”.

Over the 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) sts which are left on the needle, continue to knit in the rnd in the following way:

Gather work, and place a M between the first and last st = sM1 and BOR.

Knit *k 1, p 1* until the neckline measures 14 cm in total.

Now, the neckline must be folded, and then knitted together using the method “3-needle knitting” to make it double layered.

This is done in the following way:

Starting at BOR, place the 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) resting sts onto a new circular needle 5 mm, and place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the neckline will be knitted together from the RS.

Now, *k2tog* (1 st from each of the 2 needle sets) throughout the rnd.

Change to circular needles 6 mm, and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time evenly increasing 16 (22) 28 (34) 40 (46) 52 (58) sts, using the method “m1L”.

There are now a total of 92 (100) 108 (116) 124 (132) 140 (148) sts on the needle.

Yoke

Join *colour B* to the work.

Starting at BOR, knit all 46 rnds of the *Chart*.

When the *Chart* is finished, there are a total of 230 (250) 270 (290) 310 (330) 350 (370) sts on the needle.

Break the yarn in *colour B*, and continue to k in the rnd with *colour A*, until the yoke is 24 (24,5) 25 (25,5) 26 (26,5) 27 (27,5) cm, measured CF below the neckline.

On the next rnd, divide the work for body and sleeves in the following way:

Start at BOR, place the next 55 (55) 60 (60) 65 (65) 70 (70) sts on a stitch holder (1. sleeve), cast on 20 (18) 21 (19) 22 (20) 23 (21) sts (place a M after the 10. (9.) 10. (9.) 11. (10.) 11. (10.) new st = sM1, and let it rest in the work until the sleeve must be knitted), k 60 (70) 75 (85) 90 (100) 105 (115) sts (front), place the next 55 (55) 60 (60) 65 (65) 70 (70) sts on a stitch holder (2. sleeve), cast on 20 (18) 21 (19) 22 (20) 23 (21) sts (place a M after the 10. (9.) 10. (9.) 11. (10.) 11. (10.) new st = sM2, and let it rest in the work until the sleeve must be knitted), k 60 (70) 75 (85) 90 (100) 105 (115) sts (back).

Body

There are now a total of 160 (176) 192 (208) 224 (240) 256 (272) sts for the body.

Continue to k in the rnd with *colour A*, until the sweater is 43 (45) 47 (49) 51 (53) 55 (57) cm (or until 7 cm from being the preferred length), measured CF from below the neckline.

Change to circular needles 5 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time decreasing the stitch count to 152 (168) 184 (200) 216 (232) 248 (264) sts, using the method k2tog.

Now, the finishing rib edge, which is double layered, must be knitted:



Knit 1 rnd of rib (*k 1, p 1*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.
Let M1 stay in the work whilst continue knitting - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts to finish the double layered edge, using the method “3-needle knitting”.

Continue in rib (*k 1, p 1*), until the edge measures 14 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method “3-needle knitting” - this is done in the following way:

With a new set of 5 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 152 (168) 184 (200) 216 (232) 248 (264) along the marked horizontal row.

Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the double layered edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *K2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.
Break the yarn.

Sleeves

Now, the 2 sleeves must be knitted.

Start, by establishing the sts for the first sleeve in the following way:

With needle size 6 mm, and starting at sM1 from the RS, pick up 10 (10) 11 (10) 11 (10) 12 (11) sts along the armhole cast on row (the new sts are left to the sM1).

In continuation hereof, place the resting sleeve sts onto the needle, and finish, by picking up 10 (9) 10 (9) 11 (10) 11 (10) new sts from the armhole cast on row (these sts are right to the sM1).

There are now a total of 75 (73) 81 (79) 87 (85) 93 (91) sts on the needle.
Let the sM1 marker stay in the work, as it marks BOR.

Continue to k in the rnd with *colour A*, until the sleeve is 38 (38) 39 (39) 40 (40) 41 (41) cm (or until 7 cm from being the preferred length), measured from the armhole cast on row and downwards.

Change to circular needles 5 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time decreasing the stitch count to 60 (60) 66 (66) 72 (72) 78 (78) sts, using the method k2tog.

Now, the finishing rib edge, which is doublelayered, must be knitted:

Knit 1 rnd of rib (*k 1, p 1*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.
Let M1 stay in the work whilst continue knitting - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts to finish the double layered edge, using the method “3-needle knitting”.

Continue in rib (*k 1, p 1*), until the edge measures 14 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method “3-needle knitting” - this is done in the following way:

With a new set of 5 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 60 (60) 66 (66) 72 (72) 78 (78) along the marked horizontal row.



Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the double layered edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *K2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.
Break the yarn.


Knit the 2nd sleeve in the same way.

Finishing

- Weave in all ends.
- Steam or rinse the sweater, lay it into shape, and let it dry laying flat.
