About

Size: a (b) c (d) e (f) g (h).

Your bust circumference: 80 (90) 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) cm.

The bust width of the sweater: 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) 160 (170) cm.

Positive ease: This sweater has a positive ease at approximately 20 cm, depending on your bust circumference. When deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference.

Full length, measured CF below the neckline: 47 (49) 51 (53) 55 (57) 59 (61) cm.

Gauge: 22 sts x 32 rows = 10 x 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch, at needle size 4 mm (after washing).

Needle size(s): 2 different needle sizes are used, whilst knitting this sweater.

- 2 sets of circular needles 3,5 mm (the lengths 40 and 60 cm are recommended).

- 1 set of circular needle 4 mm (the lengths 40, 60 and 80 cm are recommended).

Yarn: The sweater is knitted with 2 threads held together, in each of the 6 colours used.

- *1st thread:* "Organic Wool 1", Krea Deluxe (150m per 50g).

- *2nd thread:* "Deluxe Silk Mohair", Krea Deluxe (240m per 20g).

Amount: Below, you will find the yarn amount for each of the 2 threads, in each of the 6 colours.

- *Colour A ("Crossaint, 53"):* Organic Wool 1: 400 (450) 500 (550) 600 (650) 700 (750)g.

Deluxe Silk Mohair: 100 (120) 120 (140) 160 (160) 180 (180)g.

- *Colour B ("Rød, 35"):* 50g Organic Wool 1 in all sizes // 20g Deluxe Silk Mohair in all sizes.

- *Colour C ("Creme, 02"):* 50g Organic Wool 1 in all sizes // 20g Deluxe Silk Mohair in all sizes.

- *Colour D ("Armygrøn, 36"):* 50g Organic Wool 1 in all sizes // 20g Deluxe Silk Mohair in all sizes.

- *Colour E ("Mørkebrun, 29"):* 50g Organic Wool 1 in all sizes // 20g Deluxe Silk Mohair in all sizes.

- *Colour F ("Lyseblå, 25"):* 50g Organic Wool 1 in all sizes // 20g Deluxe Silk Mohair in all sizes.

Method: The sweater is knitted top-down in the round in Stockinette Stitch. The yoke is knitted following a multicoloured chart, and all edges are in double layered twisted rib.

Before you begin

- Please read the entire pattern before casting on.

- Be sure to make a swatch before beginning, to ensure the right gauge.

- In this pattern, the following methods are used: Judy's Magic Cast On, twisted rib (k 1 tbl, p 1), Stockinette Stitch, right- and left leaning decreases and increases, 3-needle knitting.

Pattern

Neckline

With *colour A* and 2 sets of circular needles 3,5 mm, cast on 216 (224) 232 (240) 248 (256) 264 (272) sts, using the method Judy's Magic Cast On - 108 (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) sts on each of the needles.

Now, knit *k 1 tbl, p 1* for the first 108 (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) sts, and then place the following 108 (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) sts on a thread to rest - the resting sts must later be used when the neckline is folded to become double layered.

Over the 108 (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) sts which are left on the needle, continue to knit in the rnd in the following way:



Gather work, and place a M between the first and last st = sM1 and BOR.

Knit *k 1 tbl, p 1* until the neckline measures 12 cm in total.

Now, the neckline must be folded, and then knitted together using the method 3-needle knitting. This is done in the following way:

Starting at BOR, place the 108 (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) resting sts onto a new circular needle 3,5 mm, and place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the neckline will be knitted together from the RS.

Now, *k2tog* (1 st from each of the 2 needle sets) throughout the rnd.

Change to circular needle 4 mm, and K 1 rnd, whilst at the same time evenly increasing 12 (18) 24 (30) 36 (42) 48 (54) sts, using the method m1L.

There is now a total of 120 (130) 140 (150) 160 (170) 180 (190) sts on the needle.

Yoke

At the next rnd, the multicoloured yoke begins:
Beginning at BOR, and knit *Chart 1*, which is 53 rows in height.

When the chart has been knitted, there are a total of 336 (364) 392 (420) 448 (476) 504 (532) sts on the needle.

From this point onwards, the sweater is only knitted in *Colour A*.

Continue to k in the rnd without any increases, until the yoke is 24 (24,5) 25 (25,5) 26 (26,5) 27 (27,5) cm, measured CF from below the neckline and downwards.

On the next rnd, divide the work for body and sleeves In the following way:

Start at BOR, place the first 74 (78) 82 (86) 90 (94) 98 (102) sts on a thread to rest (1st sleeve).
Cast on 16 (16) 18 (18) 20 (20) 22 (22) sts and place a M after the 8. (8.) 9. (9.) 10. (10.) 11. (11.)
new st = sM1.
K 94 (104) 114 (124) 134 (144) 154 (164) sts (front).
Place the next 74 (78) 82 (86) 90 (94) 98 (102) sts on a thread to rest (2nd sleeve).
Cast on 16 (16) 18 (18) 20 (20) 22 (22) sts and place a M after the 8. (8.) 9. (9.) 10. (10.) 11. (11.)
new st = sM2.
K 94 (104) 114 (124) 134 (144) 154 (164) sts (back).

Body

There are now a total of 220 (240) 264 (284) 308 (328) 352 (372) sts on the needle for the body.

Continue to k in the rnd with *Colour A*, until the sweater is 44 (46) 48 (50) 52 (54) 56 (58) cm (or 6 cm from being the preferred length), measured CF below the neckline.

Change to circular needles 3,5 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time decreasing 10 sts evenly, using the method k2tog.

There is now a total of 210 (230) 254 (274) 298 (318) 342 (362) sts on the needle.



Now, the finishing rib edge, which is double layered, must be knitted:

Knit 1 rnd of twisted rib (*k 1 tbl, p 1*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.
Let M1 stay in the work whilst continue knitting - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts to finish the double layered edge, using the method “3-needle knitting”.

Continue in twisted rib (*k 1 tbl, p 1*), until the edge measures 12 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method “3-needle knitting” - this is done in the following way:

With a new set of 3,5 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 210 (230) 254 (274) 298 (318) 342 (362) along the marked horizontal row.
Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the double layered edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *K2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn.

Sleeves

Now, the 2 sleeves must be knitted.

Start, by establishing the sts for the first sleeve in the following way:

With needle size 4 mm, and starting at sM1 from the RS, pick up 8 (8) 9 (9) 10 (10) 11 (11) sts along the armhole cast on row (the new sts are left to the sM1).

In continuation hereof, place the resting sleeve sts onto the needle, and finish, by picking up 8 (8) 9 (9) 10 (10) 11 (11) new sts from the armhole cast on row (these sts are right to the sM1).

There are now a total of 90 (94) 100 (104) 110 (114) 120 (124) sts on the needle.

Let the sM1 marker stay in the work, as it marks BOR.

Continue to k in the rnd with *colour A*, until the sleeve is 38 (38) 39 (39) 40 (40) 41 (41) cm (or until 6 cm from being the preferred length), measured from the armhole cast on row and downwards.

Change to circular needles 3,5 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time decreasing the stitch count to 68 (72) 78 (82) 88 (92) 98 (102) sts, using the method k2tog.

Now, the finishing rib edge, which is doublelayered, must be knitted:

Knit 1 rnd of twisted rib (*k 1 tbl, p 1*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.
Let M1 stay in the work whilst continue knitting - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts to finish the double layered edge, using the method “3-needle knitting”.

Continue in twisted rib (*k 1 tbl, p 1*), until the edge measures 12 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method “3-needle knitting” - this is done in the following way:



With a new set of 3,5 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 68 (72) 78 (82) 88 (92) 98 (102) sts along the marked horizontal row.

Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the double layered edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *K2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn.

Knit the 2nd sleeve in the same way.


Finishing

- Weave in all ends.

- Rinse the sweater in lukewarm water with wool soap, lay it into shape, and let it dry laying flat.
