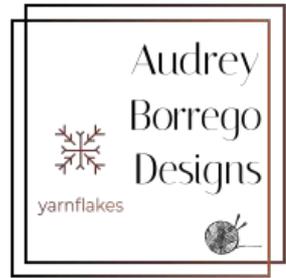


Oceanborn



Notes

Oceanborn is a winter scarf with flowing cables. Simple twists and richly textured details make this is a meditative project that's easily adjustable to any amount of yarn and any desired size.

The first half of the scarf features a fully cabled panel. Then, part of the motifs merge into ribbing for the third quarter of the scarf, before finishing with only ribbing.

The pattern includes charted as well as detailed written instructions.

Yarn :

You will need 950 meters – 1040 yards of DK or Worsted weight yarn.
The wrap's size is easily adjustable for any amount of yarn you have. Just divide your yarn into 4 equal parts.

Sample used Tôt le matin yarns TOT Highland DK in Profondeur.

Needles :

4 mm (US 6) needles

or size required to get gauge

Gauge :

25 sts x 32 rows per 10 cm – 4" in cable motif after blocking.

One cable motif : 38 st x 8 rows = 15 x 2.5 cm after blocking.

Note that a different gauge will affect size and yarn usage.

Size :

200 cm – 78 ¾" long

35 cm – 13 ¾" wide

Notions :

Stitch markers, scissors and tapestry needle

Cable needle (optional)

Row counter recommended

Techniques used :

Simple cable knitting with knit and purl stitches

Slipped stitches

I-cord cast-on, edges and bind-off

Pattern includes charted and written instructions

Abbreviations :

- RS : right side
- WS : wrong side
- st(s) : stitch(es)
- pm : place marker
- sm : slip marker
- k : knit stitch
- p : purl stitch
- slwyif : slip the st purlwise with yarn in front (I-cord edge)
- sl : slip the st purlwise with yarn in back
- C4R : cable 4 right, slip 2 sts onto cable needle and hold in back, k2 then k2 from cable needle.
- C4L : cable 4 left, slip 2 sts onto cable needle and hold in front, k2 then k2 from cable needle
- C4R.p : cable 4 right purl, slip 2 sts onto cable needle and hold in back, k2 then p2 from cable needle.
- C4L.p : cable 4 left purl, slip 2 sts onto cable needle and hold in front, p2 then k2 from cable needle
- C2R : cable 2 right, slip 1 st onto cable needle and hold in back, k1 then k1 from cable needle.
- C2L : cable 2 left, slip 1 st onto cable needle and hold in front, k1 then k1 from cable needle
- k2togtbl : knit the next 2 sts together through their back loop (1 decrease)
- *-* : repeat instructions between asterisks

Reading Charts :

Knitting flat, read the Charts back and forth : RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.

I-cord cast-on and set-up :

Cast-on 3 sts.

I-cord : *slip the st back to left needle, k3*

Work the I-cord for a total of 84 rows.

Turn work 90° clockwise, pick up and k83 from the side of the I-cord.

Bring yarn to front, pick up but don't knit 3 st from cast-on edge (it doesn't need to be precise, just place 3 strands on the needle)

89 sts

set-up row (WS) : k7, pm, *p4, k4, p2, (k1, p1, k1, p4) x 2, k1, p1, k1, p2, k4, p4, k1, pm* to last 6 sts, k3, sl3wyif

Section 1 :

Start working Chart A.

Knit until the scarf measures 100 cm – 39 ¼" or until you have used a maximum of 50% of your yarn. End after a row 8.

Section 2 :

Start working Chart B.

Knit until the scarf measures 150 cm – 59" or until you have used a maximum of 75% of your yarn. End after a row 8.

Section 3 :

Start working Chart C.

Knit until the scarf measures 200 cm – 78 ¾" or until you have about 5 g left for the bind-off. End after a WS row.

Finishing :

I-cord bind off :

Make sure to work the bind-off loosely.

k2, k2togtbl, *slip last 3 st back onto left needle, k2, k2togtbl* to last 3 st (3 st remain on the left needle and 3 on the right)

Graft the remaining six stitches together using [kitchener stitch](#).

(Knitting Help : Kitchener Stitch by Very Pink Knits)

Weave in all ends and block the scarf, flattening the straight edges.






WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS

CHART A

row 1 (RS) : k6, sm, *p1, C4R, p4, k2, (p1, sl1, p1, C2R, C2L) x 2, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, C4L, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 2 and all other WS rows until row 8 : k7, work as established (knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts) to last 6 sts, k3, sl3wyif

row 3 : k6, sm, *p1, k4, p2, C4R.p, (p1, sl1, p1, C2L, C2R) x 2, p1, sl1, p1, C4L.p, p2, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 5 : k6, sm, *p1, C4R x 2, p2, (p1, sl1, p1, C2R, C2L) x 2, p1, sl1, p1, p2, C4L x 2, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 7 : k6, sm, *p1, k2, C4R.p, C4L.p, (p1, sl1, p1, C2L, C2R) x 2, p1, sl1, p1, C4R.p, C4L.p, k2, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

CHART B

row 1 (RS) : k6, sm, *p1, C4R, p4, k2, p1, sl1, p1, k4, p1, sl1, p1, C2R, C2L, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 2 and all other WS rows until row 8 : k7, work as established (knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts) to last 6 sts, k3, sl3wyif

row 3 : k6, sm, *p1, k4, p2, C4R.p, p1, sl1, p1, k4, p1, sl1, p1, C2L, C2R, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 5 : k6, sm, *p1, C4R x 2, p3, sl1, p1, k4, p1, sl1, p1, C2R, C2L, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

row 7 : k6, sm, *p1, k2, C4R.p, C4L.p, p1, sl1, p1, k4, p1, sl1, p1, C2L, C2R, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif

CHART C

row 1 (RS) : k6, sm, *p1, k4, p4, k2, (p1, sl1, p1, k4) x 2, p1, sl1, p1, k2, p4, k4, sm* to last 7 sts, p1, k3, sl3wyif


row 2 (WS) : k7, work as established (knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts) to last 6 sts, k3, sl3wyif
