Crochet toy pattern

«Goose»

+ cap and vest for goose



I offer your attention to a goose crochet pattern. The pattern doesn't include any crochet tutorial lessons and it's for those, who can crochet toys and know toy amigurumi technique. The size of the completed toy is 8.58 inches if you use the similar supplies mentioned below. The head and legs are on splint joints.

Supplies:

- ✓ Yarn Drops Nord (170m/50g), color 11 (for beak and legs).

Yarn consumption: less than 1/3 skein.

Yarn Drops Nord (170m/50g), color 01 (main thread color).

Yarn consumption: 1 skein.

You can use any other yarn of the same characteristics (m/g). For example, Alize Baby Wool (175m/50g), Infinity Ideal (175m/50g).

You can use any other yarn, but the size of the completed toy can be different (the thicker yarn, the bigger is toy).

- ✓ A hook by Clover 1.75 mm. Choose a hook suitable for the chosen yarn.

Avoid holes in the process, all stitches must be even;

- ✓ Fiberfill (synthetic insulation);
- ✓ A wooden stick to fill with fiber (a sushi stick);
- ✓ A pair of glass eyes on the leg, 4 mm;
- ✓ Some strong thread to attach the eyes;
- ✓ A tapestry needle;
- ✓ Brown thread color to embroider nostrils (you can use moulinet or sewing thread);
- ✓ The pliers;
- ✓ *For head attachment:*
 - 2 disks 22 mm, T-splint 2*25 mm;
- For wings attachment:*
 - 4 disks 18 mm, 2 T-splint 2*25 mm;
- For legs attachment:*

4 disks 30 mm, 2 T-splints 2*25 mm.

Notice:

Work tightly enough to avoid holes between stitches, the stitches will be even and the toy will be more accurate (BUT it must be comfortable to crochet the toy).

Take disks from plastic or fiber, as they don't bend or break.

Abbreviations:

Ch – chain;

MR – Magic Ring;

Sl st – slip stitch;

sc – single crochet;


hdc – half double crochet;

inc – increase;

dec – decrease;

central inc – 2 increases along a row center.

Notice: it's better to make an invisible dec:



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Respect author's work, please.

Beak and head

Thread color 11

Begin with a beak. The marker is exactly along the head bottom.

1 row. 6 sc in MR

*When the 1st row is ready, place the marker (or thread of another color) in the 1st sc of a row. Check the marker, it must be exactly along the bottom center of the beak and the head. If the marker is shifted, make a shifting sc (i.e. don't crochet the last sc of a row or crochet 1 extra sc) and place the marker there. It's better to crochet shifting sc in even rows.

2 row. 6 inc (12)

3 row. 12 sc

4 row. (1 sc, inc)×6 times (18)

5-8 rows. 18 sc (4 rows)

9 row. 4 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc, 4 sc (22)

10 row. 22 sc

Advice Place the markers in the center of the 9th row. It's the center of beak's top. All central inc must be exactly above this marker.



11 row. 9 sc, 4 inc, 9 sc (26)

12 row. 5 sc, inc, 6 sc, 2 inc, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (30)

13 row. 30 sc

*I've shifted 1 sc ahead.

14 row. 4 sc, inc, 5 sl st, inc, 3 sc, 2 inc, 3 sc, inc, 5 sl st, inc, 4 sc (36)



Change thread color into main one (01).

15 row. 36 sc BLO

BLO - back loop only.



16 row. (5 sc, inc)×3 times, (inc, 5 sc)×3 times (42)

17 row. (6 sc, inc)×3 times, (inc, 6 sc)×3 times (48)

18 row. 48 sc

19 row. 6 sc, inc, 4 sc, inc, 24 sc, inc, 4 sc, inc, 6 sc (52)

20 row. 52 sc Make sure, central head inc are exactly above central beak inc.



21-28 row. 52 sc (8 rows)

*I've shifted the marker 1 sc ahead.

29 row. 15 sc, dec, 7 sc, 2 dec, 7 sc, dec, 15 sc (48)



Take a disk 22 mm and 1 T-splint. Make splint joints, i.e. pull splint through the disk. Insert the joints in the bottom of the head, along its center, between 22 and 23 rows (allocate the disk inside the head and pull splint out).



30 row. 48 sc

31 row. (6 sc, dec)×6 times (42)

32 row. (5 sc, dec)×6 times (36)

33 row. (4 sc, dec)×6 times (30)

34 row. (3 sc, dec)×6 times (24)

35 row. (2 sc, dec)×6 times (18)

Fill the beak and head with fiber tightly enough. Allocate fiber inside with the help of a thin hook.

36 row. (1 sc, dec)× 6 times (12)

37 row. 6 dec

Tighten the hole, fix and hide tail thread.



Head decoration

Mark the head center with another thread color. It will help us to make contractions allocate the eyes in the symmetry. Mark contraction points and eyes allocation: between 18 and 19 rows in the distance of 12 sc from central lines (points 3 and 4).



Take main thread color and a tapestry needle to make contraction. If main thread color isn't strong enough, take some strong thread of the same thread color.

Insert the needle in point 1 and work by the following points 2-3-4-1-2. Points 1 and 2 are holes between 18 and 19 rows above points 3 and 4 in 1 sc.



Now 2 tail threads are in points 1 and 2. Tighten thread and go on making contraction with the help of these 2 tail threads.



Insert the needle with thread in point 5 (the hole between 17 and 18 rows, close to point 2), pull thread out the head bottom in point 6.




Make the same contraction along the opposite side. Pull thread out point 6. Tighten thread, make 2-3 knots and hide tail thread.






Eyes attachment

Insert the eyes in points 3 and 4. Take eyes on legs and some strong thread. Pull thread through the leg and thread the needle. Insert the needle in the eye point and pull it out the back of the head.






Repeat the same action with the 2nd eye. Pull thread in the same point in the back of the head. Fix all thread and make knots. Hide tail thread.



Take brown thread color and a needle. Embroider the nostrils and make a beak contraction. Points allocation: 1 and 2 between 12 and 13 rows in the distance of 5 sc from central line; points 3 and 4 between 11 and 12 rows in the distance of 5 sc from central line. Insert the needle in point 1 and then follow points 2-3-4-1-2. Now both tail threads are in points 1 and 2. Tighten thread a bit and go on working in both sides.



Insert the needle in point 4, pull it out the beak bottom in point 5.

Repeat the same action in the other side. Pull thread in the same point 5.



Make 2-3 knots and hide tail thread.



Wing (2 pieces)

Advice Crochet both pieces in the same day, as your crochet density can differ the other day.

Begin with the bottom. The marker is exactly at the side of the wing. Check the marker. If it's necessary crochet 1 shifting sc.

1 row. 6 sc in MR

2 row. 6 inc (12)

3 row. 12 sc

4 row. (1 sc, inc)×3 times, (inc, 1 sc)×3 times (18)

5-8 rows. 18 sc (4 rows)

*I've shifted the marker in 1 sc ahead.

9 row. 2 sl st, 14 sc, 2 sl st (18)



10 row. inc, 16 sc, inc (20)

11 row. 20 sc

12 row. (inc, 4 sc)×2 times, (4 sc, inc)×2 times (24)

13 row. 24 sc

*I've shifted the marker in 1 sc ahead.

14 row. (inc, 3 sc)×3 times, (3 sc, inc)×3 times (30)



15-28 row. 30 sc (14 rows)



29 row. (dec, 3 sc)×3 times, (3 sc, dec)×3 times (24)

30-34 row. 24 sc (5 rows)

35 row. (2 sc, dec)×6 times (18)

36 row. 18 sc

Don't fill the wing with fiber.

Take a disk 18 mm and 1 T-splint. Make splint joints.

Insert the joints in the hole between 34 and 35 rows along the side center of the wing.

37 row. (1 sc, dec)×6 times (12)

38 row. 6 dec

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.



Crochet the 2nd wing by the same scheme, but insert the joint along the opposite side.



Sew opposite sides of the wing in running stitch between 11 and 12 rows to avoid wing extension (i.e. insert the needle in a stitch in each side).



Legs (2 pieces)

Crochet the foot in thread color 11.

The marker is exactly at the side of the piece. Check the marker, it must be exactly at the side. If it's necessary crochet a shifting sc.

1 row. 6 sc in MR

2 row. 6 inc (12)

3 row. 3 sc, 2 inc, 3 sc, 6 ch, skip 4 sc and crochet the next row.



4 row. 16 sc



5 row. 12 sc, 2 inc, 2 sc (18)

6-7 row. 18 sc (2 rows)

8 row. (2 sc, inc)×6 times (24)

9-14 row. 24 sc (6 times)




Crochet the paws.

Each paw is 8 ch. Crochet round in the rest of stitches (4 sc along one side and 4 sc along the other one). There are 3 paws.

There is a detailed process in the photo.

1st paw:

1 row. 4 sc, 4 sc along the opposite side (8)





2-3 row. 8 sc (2 rows)

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.

**See how to tighten the hole accurately. Pull the needle with tail thread through each FLO (front loop only) of the last row and tighten.



2nd paw:

1 row. 4 sc, 4 sc along the opposite side (8)



2-4 row. 8 sc (3 rows)

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.



3rd paw:

1 row. 4 sc, 4 sc along the opposite side (8)



2-3 row. 8 sc (2 rows)

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.



Go on crocheting the leg (6 sc along the foot front – stitches along the chain in the 3rd row and 4 sc along the back of the foot, skipped in the 3rd row). Place the marker in the beginning of row – along the center in the back of the foot, it's the 3rd sc of 4 (see the photo).

Attach thread, 1 ch, 1 sc in the same 1st sc of the row. The 1st sc of the 1st row is ready (begin to count again), 1 sc



6 sc (along the foot front), 2 sc (along the back of the foot) (10)



2-4 row. 10 sc (3 rows)

5 row. 4 sc, 2 inc, 4 sc (12)

Make sure the marker is exactly along the center in the back.



6-10 row. 12 sc (5 rows)

Fill the bottom of the leg with fiber.

Change thread color in main one, 01.

11 row. (1 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (18)



12 row. (2 sc, inc)×6 times (24)

13 row. 24 sc

14 row. 11 sc, 2 inc, 11 sc (26)

15 row. inc, 24 sc, inc (28)

16 row. 13 sc, 2 inc, 13 sc (30)

17 row. 30 sc

18 row. 14 sc, 2 inc, 14 sc (32)

19 row. inc, 30 sc, inc (34)

20 row. 16 sc, 2 inc, 16 sc (36)

21-26 row. 36 sc (6 rows)

27 row. (4 sc, dec)×6 times (30)

28 row. 30 sc

29 row. (3 sc, dec)×6 times (24)

Fill the leg with fiber tightly enough. Take a disk 30 mm and 1 T-splint. Make splint joints. Insert the joints in the hole between 24 and 25 rows along the center at the side.



30 row. (2 sc, dec)×6 times (18)

31 row. (1 sc, dec)×6 times (12)

Fill the top of the leg with fiber.

32 row. 6 dec

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.

Crochet the 2nd leg by the same scheme, but insert the joints along the opposite side.



Body, attachment

The marker is exactly along the center in the back. Check the marker!

1 row. 6 sc in MR

2 row. 6 inc (12)

3 row. (1 sc, inc)×6 times (18)

4 row. (2 sc, inc)×6 times (24)

5 row. (3 sc, inc)×6 times (30)

6-7 row. 30 sc (2 rows)

8 row. 14 sc, 2 inc, 14 sc (32)

9-10 row. 32 sc (2 rows)

11 row. (7 sc, inc)×2 times, (inc, 7 sc)×2 times (36)

12-13 row. 36 sc (2 rows)

14 row. 17 sc, 2 inc, 17 sc (38)

15 row. 38 sc

16 row. 18 sc, 2 inc, 18 sc (40)

17 row. 9 sc, inc, 20 sc, inc, 9 sc (42)

18 row. 42 sc

19 row. 20 sc, 2 inc, 20 sc (44)

20 row. 5 sc, inc, 6 sc, inc, 18 sc, inc, 6 sc, inc, 5 sc (48)



Take a disk, 22 mm and goose head. Insert the splint of the head between 1 and 2 rows of the center of the body. Bend the neck to make attachment process easier. Pull splint through the disk inside the body. Fix splint ends with the pliers.



21 row. 23 sc, 2 inc, 23 sc (50)

22-23 row. 50 sc (2 rows)

24 row. 11 sc, inc, 12 sc, 2 inc, 12 sc, inc, 11 sc (54)

25-26 row. 54 sc (2 rows)

27 row. (inc, 8 sc)×3 times, (8 sc, inc)×3 times (60)

28-29 row. 60 sc (2 rows)

Take wings and find them the most symmetrical attachment points. In my case, attachment points are between 17 and 18 rows in the distance of about 10 sc from the marker. Take 2 disks 18 mm and the pliers. Attach the wings at the sides in the holes. Pull splints through the disks inside the body and fix them with the pliers.





Check the marker, it must be exactly along the center in the back.

30-36 row. 60 sc (7 rows)

37 row. inc, 58 sc, inc (62)

38 row. 3 sc, inc, 54 sc, inc, 3 sc (64)

39 row. 64 sc

40 row. inc, 62 sc, inc (66)

41 row. 5 sc, inc, 54 sc, inc, 5 sc (68)

42 row. 68 sc

43 row. inc, 66 sc, inc (70)

44 row. 7 sc, inc, 54 sc, inc, 7 sc (72)



45 row. 9 sc, (7 sc, dec)×2 times, 6 sc, dec, 2 sc, dec, 6 sc, (dec, 7 sc)×2 times, 12 ch, skip 18 sc (the hole for the tail), 1 sc



There is a hole for the tail. Place the marker to the crocheted sc. Next rows must begin from this point (from blue marker). The previous marker is for the tail.

Crochet the bottom of the body, always skip tail hole.

46 row. (8 sc, dec)×6 times (54)





47 row. (7 sc, dec)×6 times (48)


48 row. (6 sc, dec)×6 times (42)

49 row. (5 sc, dec)×6 times (36)



Fill the body with fiber before leg attachment. Mark central line along the front to find the best position for the legs. Check their symmetry. In my case, the legs are attached between 41 and 42 rows in the distance of about 16 sc from the central line.

Pull fiber out the bottom of the body. Take 2 disks 30 mm and the pliers. Attach the legs to the body.





Don't cut thread. You'll finish the body when the tail is ready.

Tail. Attach thread to the 1st sc of the skipped ones in the 45th row, 9 sc until the marker. Tail rows begins from the marker. Crochet round.



1 row. inc, 8 sc, 6 dec (along the tail bottom), 8 sc, inc (26)



2 row. 9 sc, dec, 4 sc, dec, 9 sc (24)

3 row. (2 sc, dec)×3 times, (dec, 2 sc)×3 times (18)

4 row. (1 sc, dec)×6 times (12)

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.

**See how accurately the hole is tightened. Thread the needle and pull the needle through each FLO of the last row, tighten the hole.

Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.

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Go on crocheting the body.

50 row. (4 sc, dec)×6 times (30)

51 row. (3 sc, dec)×6 times (24)

52 row. (2 sc, dec)×6 times (18)

Fill the body with fiber.

53 row. (1 sc, dec)×6 times (12)

54 row. 6 dec

Tighten the hole, fix and cut thread. Hide tail thread.

Goose is ready!



The cap

Supplies:


- yarn Drops Nord (170m/50g), color 16 (blue) or color 19 (green);
- hook 1.75 mm.

1 row. 6 sc in MR

2 row. 6 inc (12)

3 row. 12 sc BLO

BLO (back loop only)



4 row. 6 dec BLO (6)

5 row. 6 inc (12)

6 row. (1 sc, inc)×6 times (18)



7 row. (2 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (24)

8 row. (3 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (30)

9 row. (4 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (36)

10 row. (5 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (42)

11 row. (6 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (48)

12 row. (7 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (54)

13 row. (8 sc, inc)×6 times BLO (60)

14-16 row. 60 sc BLO (3 rows)




17 row. 18 sc, (2 sc, dec)×3 times, (dec, 2 sc)×3 times, 18 sc BLO (54)

18 row. 18 sc BLO, (2 hdc, inc)×3 times, (inc, 2 hdc)×3 times FLO, 18 sc BLO (60)

*Inc in the row is crocheted as 2 hdc in 1 sc.

FLO - front loop only



19 row. 18 sc BLO, 24 hdc in both sides of the stitch, 18 sc BLO (60)

Fix and cut thread.



Goose vest

Supplies:


- yarn Drops Nord (170m/50g), color 16 (blue);
- a hook 1.75 mm;
- button 6 mm.

Try the vest on the goose in the process.

9 ch

1 row. Turn the work, from the 2nd ch – 8 sc, turn the work

*crochet in turning rows, FLO (see the pic)



1 turning ch in the beginning of each row

2 row. inc, 6 sc, inc in FLO (10)

3 row. 10 sc FLO

4 row. inc, 8 sc, inc in FLO (12)

5 row. 12 sc FLO

6 row. inc, 10 sc, inc in FLO (14)

7 row. 14 sc FLO

8 row. inc, 12 sc, inc in FLO (16)

9 row. 4 sc FLO, turn the work, don't finish the row

10-14 row. 4 sc FLO (5 rows)

15 row. 4 sc FLO, 11 ch, 1 sc in the last sc of the 8th row in FLO (see the photo)



16-28 row. 16 sc FLO (13 rows)



29 row. 4 sc FLO, turn the work, don't finish the row

30-34 row. 4 sc FLO (5 rows)

35 row. 4 sc FLO, 11 ch, 1 sc in the last sc of the 28th row in FLO (see the photo)



36 row. 16 sc FLO

37 row. dec, 12 sc, dec in FLO (14)

38 row. 14 sc FLO

39 row. dec, 10 sc, dec in FLO (12)

40 row. 12 sc FLO

41 row. dec, 8 sc, dec in FLO (10)

42 row. 10 sc FLO

43 row. dec, 6 sc, dec in FLO (8)

1 ch, bind off all vest edges in sc. 1 turning ch when you begin a new edge and making buttonhole (5 ch)



Fix and cut thread, hide tail thread.



Ready!

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Enjoy the process!
