Dear crochet lovers,

My name is Ekaterina, and I welcome you to my Amigurumi world!

Thank you for purchasing my pattern! I hope you find this pattern easy and enjoy the whole process of crocheting. There are many other amigurumi toys in my collection, which you can find on **Instagram: @kb_loveknitting**

Today, I invite you to **crochet a funny onion** toy using only one hook. You will make a funny toy by following this crochet pattern.

The finished product, using the materials stated in this pattern, measures 15 cm (5.9 inches) without leaves, and the height of the leaves ranges from 10 to 15 cm (3.9 inches).

This crochet pattern provides detailed written instructions for creating the toy, including the body, arms, legs, and leaves.

Please note that the glasses are a decorative element and are not included in the pattern; you can purchase them separately at any craft store.

The pattern consists of 14 pages and is accompanied by more than 20 photographs.





The onion's body is crocheted in continuous spirals as one piece. The legs and arms are made from a wireframe, which we sew onto the body. The leaves are crocheted separately and then sewn on.

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THE REQUIRED MATERIALS:

1.Yarn

YarnArt Ideal (50g – 170m, 100% cotton), color **228** skin- 1 skein for the body;

YarnArt Ideal (50g – 170m, 100% cotton), color **235** green- 1 skein for the leaves;

YarnArt Ideal (50g – 170m, 100% cotton), color **222** milky- 1 skein for the boots;

YarnArt Iris (25g – 150m, 100% mercerized cotton), white – for the whites of the eyes and brown for embroidering the laces, eyebrows, and legs;

2. 1.5 mm crochet hook;

3. Stuffing material (fiberfill);

4. Stitch marker, tapestry needle, scissors, rouge, wire (2 mm), and double-sided adhesive tape;

5. Safety eyes D=10 mm;

6. Decorative eyes (I purchased them in the craft store)

ABBREVIATIONS (US):

MR – magic ring

ch - chain

dec – decrease (2 sc together)


inc – increase (2 sc in one stitch)

sc - single crochet

sl st - slip stitch

* - repeat as instructed

The number in the brackets is the number of stitches in the round.



ONION

The toy is crocheted in continuous spirals without turning chains with a skin YarnArt Ideal and a 1.5 mm crochet hook. The arms, legs, and leaves are crocheted separately. We will attach them to the body later.

Body

Crochet in spirals with a skin color and a 1.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rnd 2: 12 inc (12)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc)*6 (18)

Rnd 4: (2sc, inc)*6 (24)

Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc)*6 (30)

Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc)*6 (36)

Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc)*6 (42)

Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc)*6 (48)

Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc)*6 (54)

Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc)*6 (60)

Rnd 11: (9 sc, inc)*6 (66)

Rnd 12: (10 sc, inc)*6 (72)

Rnd 13: (11 sc, inc)*6 (78)

Rnd 14: (12 sc, inc)*6 (84)

Rnds 15-22: 84 sc (84) – 8 rounds

Rnd 23: (12 sc, dec)*6 (78)

Rnd 24: 78 sc (78)

Rnd 25: (11 sc, dec)*6 (72)

Rnd 26: 72 sc (72)

Rnd 27: (10 sc, dec)*6 (66)

Rnd 28: 64 sc (64)

Stuff with fiberfill.

Rnd 29: (9 sc, dec)*6 (60)

Rnd 30: (8 sc, dec)*6 (54)

Rnd 31: (7 sc, dec)*6 (48)

Rnd 32: (6 sc, dec)*6 (42)

Rnd 33: (5 sc, dec)*6 (36)

Rnd 34: 36 sc (36)

Rnd 35: (4 sc, dec)*6 (30)

Rnd 36: 30 sc (30)



Do not forget to stuff with fiberfill.

Rnd 37: (3 sc, dec)*6 (24)

Rnd 38: 24 sc (24)

Rnds 39-43: 24 sc (24)

Rnd 44: 24 inc (48)

Rnds 45-46: 48 sc (48)

Complete stuffing.

Break yarn, secure it, and hide the tail.



Leaves (make 4)

Crochet in spirals with green yarn and a 1.5 mm crochet hook.

Do not stuff.

Small leaf.

Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rnds 2-3: 6 sc (6) – 2 rounds

Rnd 4: 2 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc (8)

Rounds 5-28: 8 sc (8) – 24 rounds

Break yarn and secure it. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Middle leaf (make 2)


Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rounds 2-3: 6 sc (6) – 2 rounds

Rnd 4: 2 sc, inc, 2 sc, inc (8)

Rounds 5-34: 8 sc (8) – 30 rounds

Break yarn and secure it. Leave a long tail for sewing.



Big leaf

Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rnds 2-3: 6 sc (6) – 2 rounds

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, 1 sc, inc, 1 sc, inc (9)

Rnds 5-44: 9 sc (9) – 40 rounds

Break yarn and secure it. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Make the wireframe (d=2 mm). Cut 4 pieces of wire.

The length of the 1st wire is 10 cm (3.9 inches).

The length of the 2 middle pieces is 15 cm (5.9 inches).

The length of the 4th wire is 20 cm (7.8 inches).

Wrap double-sided tape around the ends of each wire and insert the wireframe into the leaves.

Then, wrap the yarn tail around the end of the wireframe with the tape and cut off the excess wire.



Insert the wireframe with the leaves into the hole at the top of the body and sew them using the yarn tails. Cut the tails. Shape the leaves outward.



Legs (make 2)

Crochet with a milk color and a 1.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: chain 5 and start crocheting in the second chain from hook: 3 sc, 3 sc in the last chain and continue crocheting on the other side of the chain foundation 2 sc, inc (10)

Continue crocheting around.

Rnd 2: inc, 3 sc, 2 inc, 3 sc, inc (14)

Rnd 3: sc, inc, 4 sc, inc, sc, inc, 4 sc, inc (18)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc)*6 (24)

Rounds 5-14: 24 sc (10 rounds)

Rnd 15: 1 dec, 10 sc, 1 dec, 10 sc (22)

Rnd 16: 22 sc (22)

Rnd 17: 1 dec, 9 sc, 1 dec, 9 sc (20)

Rnd 18: 20 sc (20)

Rnd 19: 1 dec, 8 sc, 1 dec, 8 sc (18)

Rounds 20-21: 18 sc (18)

Stuff gently.

Rnd 22: 1 dec, 7 sc, 1 dec, 7 sc (16)

Rnd 23: (2 sc, dec)*4 (12)

Rnd 24: (sc, dec)*4 (8)

Rnd 25: 4 dec (4)

Break yarn, leaving a long tail (about 50 cm (19.6 inches) long). Sew the hole on the heel. Do not cut the yarn tail. Pull it through the foot and draw it out to the middle on the top of the foot (between rounds 20 and 21).

Edge of the boot (make 2)

Crochet with a milk color yarn and a 1.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rnds 2-20: 6 sc (6) – 18 rounds

Break yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Join the edges of the part and sew them through both loops with the tapestry needle.

Pin the ready part to the foot (in the middle close to the end of the foot) and sew it in a circle.

Fasten off, cut yarn, and hide the tail inside.



Crochet the second boot similarly.



Creating the wireframes for the legs.

1. Cut two pieces of wire, each measuring 8 to 10 cm (approximately 3.9 inches) long.
2. Wrap double-sided tape around both ends of each wire piece.
3. Insert one end of the wire into the center of the boot, positioning it between rounds 20 and 22.
4. Take the yarn tail that you pulled to the center and wrap it around the wireframe until you reach the other end. Be sure to wrap it around the double-sided tape as well, securing the yarn tail in place.
5. Ensure that the wireframe is fastened tightly and does not move.

6. Repeat the process to create the second leg in the same manner.



Thread the needle with brown thread and insert the needle into the foot. Pull it out in the middle of the foot and **embroider three stripes**.

Pull the thread through the foot and draw it out close to the wireframe. Wrap brown thread around the wireframe; this step is optional. If you prefer, you can simply secure the thread and leave the legs white. Finally, tie the end of the thread into a knot.

The leg is ready.

Insert the wireframes for the legs into the body between rounds 4 and 5. Ensure that the distance between the legs is 8 stitches. See the photo below. Tie the yarn tail into a knot through the stitch of the body that is close to the wireframe, making sure the leg is fastened securely. Once you have attached the second leg, cut off any excess threads.





Arms (make 2)

Crochet in a circle with a skin color and a 1.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: 6 sc into MR (6)

Rnd 2: 6 inc (12)

Rnd 3: (2 sc, inc)* 4 (16)

Rnds 4-6: 16 sc (16) – 3 rounds

Rnd 7: Left arm sc, Puff st – 5 DC together cluster, 2 sl sts, 12 sc (16)

Right arm sc, 2 sl sts, Puff st – 5 DC together cluster, 12 sc (16)

Rnd 8: 15 sc (do not crochet into the Puff st)

Rnd 9: 15 sc

Stuff the palm with fiberfill gently.

Rnd 10: (3 sc, dec) x 3 (12)

Rnd 11: 12 sc (12)

Rnd 12: 6 dec (6)

Break yarn, leaving a long tail (50 cm) for sewing.





Make the wireframe for the arms.

1. Cut two pieces of wire (d=2mm), each measuring 10 cm (3.9 inches) in length;
2. Wrap double-sided tape around both ends of each wire;
3. Attach a yarn tail to one end of the wire by wrapping it around the wire securely;
4. Insert the wireframe into the arm and wrap the yarn tail around the wire for about 5 cm;
5. Secure the tail around the double-sided tape on the opposite end of the wire;
6. ***Insert the wireframe inside the arm at the 20th round of the body;***
7. Tie the yarn tail to the stitch on the body close to the wireframe, ensuring the tail is hidden inside the body.
8. Make sure that the arm is firmly attached and does not move.
9. Follow the same procedure to attach the second arm to the body.

Eyes (whites) - make 2

Crochet with white yarn and a 2.25 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: 8 into MR (8)

Tighten the ring loosely. Insert the stem of the eye into the hole of the white and complete tightening, as shown in the photos below.

Break yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Crochet the second eye. Install the eyes with the whites to the body (about the 26th round) and glue the eyes if needed. Sew the whites with the yarn tail and hide the tail.



Assembly

Install the eyes. If you haven't done so already, refer to page 12 for instructions on how to make the eyes.

Install the eyes with the whites to the body (about the 26th round) and glue the eyes if needed. Sew the whites with the yarn tail and hide the tail.

Embroider the nose under the eyes between rounds 24 and 25.

Embroider the eyebrows above the eyes. Make 1 stitch at an angle with a thin brown thread (the length of the eyebrow is 2-3 stitches), as shown in the photo.

Pull the thread down to the bottom of the body and embroider a smile following the design shown in the photo. Once finished, secure the thread and hide it within the body.

Apply pink rouge on the cheeks and draw the spots on the cheeks (freckles) with a brown pencil.

Put on the glasses.

Your onion is now complete!
